THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



PLAYER

Marland Smith, G • Jr., 6-2, 175 • Little Rock, Ark. • Southeast Missouri

Smith was named OVC Player of the Week after averaging 21.5 points, 5.0 assists, 1.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists/game last week and hitting 57.9 percent (11-of-19) from 3-point range and 58.3 percent (14-of-24) from the field. Smith started the week by scoring a career-high 22 points in a home loss to SMU. The junior hit 4-of-9 shots from 3-point range and dished out five assists against the Mustangs. In a road win at Sacramento State (which snapped the Redhawks nine-game road losing streak dating back to last season) Smith made his first six 3-point attempts and had 18 points in the first nine minutes of the game; the guard would finish the contest with 21 points on 7-of-10 shooting from behind the arc. The seven made 3-pointers is the most by an OVC player in a game this season; he also dished out five assists and had three rebounds in the victory. Smith has now scored 20 or more points in three-straight games.

CO-NEWCOMER

Tyler Stone, F • R-So., 6-8, 230 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Stone was named OVC Newcomer of the Week for the fourth time this season after averaging 13.5 points, 9.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists/game in a pair of Southeast Missouri State games. The transfer from Missouri had 11 points and 10 rebounds, his second double-double of the season, in a home game against SMU to begin the week. In that game he hit 5-of-10 shots, blocked three shots and had a steal. He ended the week by helping the Redhawks to a road victory over Sacramento State, snapping the team's nine-game road losing streak dating back to last year. In that game Stone hit 8-of-15 shots (53.3%) on his way to 16 points (12 of which came in the second half). He also pulled down nine rebounds, dished out two assists and blocked a shot. For the week he hit 52 percent (13-of-25) from the field. Stone currently ranks sixth in the OVC in scoring (14.7 points/game) and fourth in rebounding (7.5/game).

CO-NEWCOMER

Jordan Cyphers, G • R-Jr., 6-4, 179 • Wichita, Kan. • Tennessee State

Cyphers, the transfer from Utah, averaged 17.0 points and 1.5 rebounds/game last week in leading Tennessee State to a pair of victories. The junior hit 55 percent (11-of-20) from the field, 53.8 percent (7-of-13) from 3-point range and was a perfect 5-of-5 from the free throw line. He started the week by scoring 19 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the field, including 5-of-10 from 3-point range, in just 19 minutes of action in a victory over LeMoyne-Owen. In a win over Alabama A&M, Cyphers hit 4-of-7 shots and 2-of-3 3-point attempts to tally 15 points. The games marked his first back-to-back double figure scoring efforts of the season. The two wins gave Tennessee State a 7-6 record at the holiday break, its first winning record at the break for the team since the 1994-95 season.

FRESHMAN

Myles Taylor, F • Fr., 6-7, 250 • Little Rock, Ark. • UT Martin

Taylor earned the Freshman of the Week award for the third-straight week and fourth time overall this season after scoring 22 points in UT Martin's loss at No. 22 Murray State last week. The 22 points tied Taylor's career-high, as he hit 7-of-14 (50%) from the field and 8-of-9 (88.9%) at the free throw line; 17 of his 22 points came in the second half of the contest. The forward also had a rebound and an assist for the Skyhawks. Taylor is currently the leading freshman scorer in the OVC (12.2 points/game) and has averaged 20.5 points/game over his last four contests.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: OVC teams wrapped up the majority of non-conference play last week (although 10 games plus the entire BracketBusters series remain), as Conference play begins full tilt this week...So far two OVC games have been played as Eastern Kentucky and Murray State are off to early 1-0 records in league play...Murray State is one of six Division I teams who are currently undefeated on the season (that number is down from seven a week ago); the others are Baylor, Indiana, Louisville, Missouri and Syracuse...As of Monday only Murray State, Syracuse and UNLV have reached 13 victories on the season in Division I basketball...The Racers climbed up two spots to No. 20 in the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 poll and moved up one spot to No. 21 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25...The Racers are the first OVC team to be ranked for three-straight weeks in the AP poll since the 1970-71 season (Western Kentucky was ranked in all 16 polls of that season)...Murray State is also ranked No. 2 in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 last week (behind Creighton); the new poll (Dec. 26) will be released later on Monday...Murray State's 13-0 start is the second-best in school history and is one of just five 10-0 or better starts in OVC history...Murray State has a 13-game home court winning streak which currently ranks in the Top 20 nationally...Entering the week the Racers are No. 16 in the RPI (RPIRatings.com) and No. 19 in the Sagarin Power Rankings...Murray State's Isaiah Canaan and Tennessee State's Robert Covington are each poised to enter the 1,000-Point Club this week as each enter the week with 990 career points; there are currently only three active OVC players who have scored 1,000 or more career points...Tennessee Tech's Kevin Murphy is just 402 points away from becoming the 16th member of the OVC 2,000-Point Club; including the remaining 17 regular season games and at least one postseason contest, he would need to average 22.3 points/game the rest of the way to make that exclusive club.

Murray State No. 20 in AP Poll, No. 21 in ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Poll: After a 13-0 start to the season Murray State finds itself ranked No. 20 in this week's Associated Press (AP) Top 25 and No. 21 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 polls. The Racers cracked the Top 25 on Dec. 12, coming in at No. 24 in the AP poll, and debuted in the Coaches Poll on Dec. 19. When Murray State first cracked the Top 25 it marked the first time an OVC team had been nationally-ranked since Murray State was No. 25 in the final AP poll of the 1997-98 season (which was released at the end of the regular season). Murray State is the first OVC team to be ranked for three-straight weeks in the AP poll since the 1970-71 season (Western Kentucky was ranked in all 16 polls of that year).

NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders released on Dec. 19 (the next set of leaders will not be released until Jan. 2), Murray State ranks seventh in 3-point percentage (42.6%), 11th in free throw percentage (76.7%) and 13th in steals (9.9/game). Eastern Kentucky ranks seventh in fewest turnovers (10.5/game). Individually Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** is third in field goal percentage (74.6%) while Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy** is 15th in scoring (21.0 points/game) and teammate **Zac Swansey** is 16th in steals (2.6/game). Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** is 11th in 3-point percentage (48.1%), 14th in 3-pointers made/game (3.3) and 32nd in scoring (19.3 points/game).

13-0 Start for Murray State One of Just Five in OVC History: Murray State's 13-0 start to begin this season is one of just five instances of an OVC school beginning the year 10-0 or better since the league was formed in 1948. It is the first since Western Kentucky started the year 21-0 in 1953-54. The other teams to start a season at least 10-0 are Western Kentucky in 1948-49 (15-0) and Murray State in each 1950-51 (12-0) and 1951-52 (11-0).

Murray State Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In the Dec. 19 CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll Murray State was ranked second and received five first-place votes. The new poll (Dec. 26) was not yet available. The Racers first moved into the Top 25 on Nov. 28 of this season and moved up to 10th on Dec. 5 before its win at Memphis. Following the win over Memphis, the Racers jumped to second where they have been the last two weeks. Now in its 13th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

OVC Teams Beating Ranked Teams: Although the OVC has had recent success against nationally-ranked teams in the NCAA Tournament (Murray State beat No. 21 Vanderbilt in 2010 and Morehead State beat No. 14 Louisville last year), prior to Murray State's win over No. 20/21 Memphis on Dec. 11, it had been 14 years since an OVC team had beat a nationally-ranked opponent during the regular season. That was when Murray State beat No. 12 Arkansas 94-83 on Dec. 25, 1997 in Puerto Rico.

OVC Against the SEC: Between the beginning of the 2000-01 season (when Tennessee Tech beat South Carolina) and the 2010 NCAA Tournament (when Murray State beat Vanderbilt) the OVC lost 71-straight games to SEC opponents. A year ago OVC teams were 0-8 against that league but this season has been different with OVC teams going 2-3 against SEC foes. That includes Tennessee State's win at South Carolina on Nov. 20 and Austin Peay's victory at Tennessee on Dec. 10.

TSU's Peters on Bob Cousy Watch List: Tennessee State's **Wil Peters** is one of 59 players on the 2012 Bob Cousy Award Watch List. The award is given to the top point guard in college basketball. The list of candidates will be narrowed down to 20 by Jan. 10, 10 by Feb. 1 and a final five by March 1.

OVC One of Just 10 Conferences (4 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Three Seasons: The OVC is one of just 10 Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past three years and one of just four non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10, Horizon and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

Postseason Success: Not since the late 1980s has the OVC experienced the kind of NCAA Tournament success the program has had in the last three years. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. Last season it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got

2012 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held Feb. 29 - March 3 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 2 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 3 is at 1 p.m. and televised live on ESPN or ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 2 (televised on OVCsports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 3 at 4:30 p.m. (TV is TBD).

This marks the 18th time in 19 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the third year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 27 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. It marked the third time in OVC history that teams had won NCAA Tournament games in three consecutive seasons (1960-61-62, 1987-88-89 and 2009-10-11). The OVC has never won at least one NCAA Tournament game in four-straight years.

Regular Season Schedule Takes Slightly Different Format This Season: For the past six seasons and for 61 of the 63 years that basketball has been played in the OVC, the men's basketball schedule has been a double-round robin, meaning every league team played every other league team twice. That changes this year with the addition of SIUE to the regular season slate as the 11-team OVC will play a 16-game schedule instead of a 20-game round robin (which the league played from 2005-06 through 2007-08). With the 16-game schedule a team will play every other OVC school once, and play six of the 10 other schools twice (home and away) during the season. Each year there are only four teams that each school is not playing on a home and away basis. Several factors contributed to the switch to a 16-game schedule including creating more opportunity to schedule non-conference games and to have fewer games played during the month of December. The schedule's makeup (i.e. which teams played what teams twice) was determined by several factors including historical and traditional rivalries and geography/proximity of the teams. The only other previous seasons the league did not play a full round robin schedule were in 2003-04 and 2004-05 (the seasons after Jacksonville State and Samford first joined the league). The schedule could potentially see more changes next season when the league expands to 12 teams to include Belmont.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 22nd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 354 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 436 for his career.

Murray State Wins Great Alaska Shootout: Murray State traveled to Anchorage, Alaska the week of Thanksgiving and captured the championship at the 34th annual Great Alaska Shootout. The Racers topped host Alaska-Anchorage, San Francisco and Southern Miss on its way to the title. Junior Isaiah Canaan was named MVP of the event after averaging 25.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals/game at the event. Canaan scored 36 points (hitting 6-of-11 from 3-point range) in the overtime victory over Southern Miss in the title game. The 36 points was the ninth-best in Great Alaska Shootout history.

Canaan Named to Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** has been named to the 2011-12 Lou Henson Preseason All-America team by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team leads to The Lou Henson Award at the end of the season, which is presented to the top mid-major player in NCAA D-I basketball. The award is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State. He is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

OVC Tournament Format and Home Enters Year No. 2: After debuting a new format and home for the OVC Tournament in 2011, the tournament will once again return to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville this year. Once again the top eight men's and women's teams will qualify for the tournament and advance to play in Nashville (as opposed to playing first round games in campus sites) under a merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to last year's championship were upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

The OVC Welcomes Two New Head Coaches: The OVC has two new head coaches this season, both of whom moved from assistant roles to the head spot on their respective teams. Murray State welcomes first-year head coach **Steve Prohm** to the top spot after he spent five years as an assistant coach with the Racers under Billy Kennedy. Long-time Tennessee Tech associate head coach **Steve Payne** moved to the head spot with the Golden Eagles after nine seasons under head coach Mike Sutton who retired after the end of the 2010-11 season. Prohm and Payne are two of the 25 new coaches at the Division I level who are head coaches for the first time (at any level) this season.

SIUE Ready for Full OVC Schedule This Season: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. This season marks the first for the Cougars playing a full (16-game) OVC schedule. SIUE is eligible for the OVC Regular Season Championship but since they have one year left in the reclassification process to Division I, are ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments until next season.

Addition of Belmont Gives OVC Record 12 Schools in 2012-13: On May 13, 2011, Belmont University accepted an invitation to join the Ohio Valley Conference on July 1, 2012. Belmont, located just nine miles north of the OVC headquarters, will play its final year in the Atlantic Sun Conference this season. The Bruins men's basketball team has made four NCAA Tournament appearances in the past six seasons, including finishing 30-5 (one of nine Division I teams with at least 30 wins) and earning a No. 13 seed in 2010-11. The addition of Belmont (and SIUE's eligibility for postseason play next year) will give the OVC a record 12 schools for the 2012-13 season.

OVC to Host NCAA Tournament 2nd/3rd Rounds in March: The Ohio Valley Conference will serve as the host of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship Second/Third Rounds at Bridgestone Arena this March. The games will be played on Friday, March 16 and Sunday, March 18. The pairings will be announced on Sunday, March 12 at 5 p.m. CT on CBS. Tickets for the games went on sale to the public in October.

OVC Teams to Compete in ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: For the seventh-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN Sears BracketBusters series (on Feb. 18). Now it's its 10th year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 142 teams from 16 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 13 nationally-televvised games. The matchups will be announced on Monday, January 30. In the OVC Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Murray State and SIUE will serve as host institutions while Morehead State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin will play road contests. OVC schools are 25-41 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

A Record Four OVC Teams in Postseason: For the first time in OVC history in 2010-11, four different men's basketball teams competed in postseason play. Morehead State won the OVC Tournament and played in the NCAA Tournament, regular season champion Murray State participated in the NIT, Austin Peay played in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) and Tennessee Tech participated in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). It also marked the third-straight season that three or more OVC teams have participated in postseason competition, also a first for the league.

Four OVC Teams Reach 20 Wins in Same Season for First Time in 2011: In 2010 (Murray State, Morehead State, Eastern Kentucky) and 2011 (Morehead State, Murray State, Austin Peay, Tennessee Tech) the OVC had three or more teams reach 20 or more wins in the same season, marking the first time in league history that had happened in back-to-back years. Last season the league had four teams win 20 or more games for the first-time ever (and each of those teams played in the postseason). Morehead State finished the year with 25 victories, Murray State had 23 and Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech had 20 wins apiece.

Former OVC Players in the NBA/NBDL: Entering the season there is current one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his rookie season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. There are also five former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League including former Jacksonville State players **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants), who has been a D-League All-Star, and **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy), Tennessee State's **Bruce Price** (Dakota Wizards), Tennessee Tech's **Willie Jenkins** (Idaho Stampede) and UT Martin's **Reuben Clayton** (Reno Bighorns).

The 2011-12 Season: The 2011-12 season marks the 64th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 63 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Austin Peay Picked as Preseason Favorites: In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Austin Peay received 10 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2011-12 season. It marks the first time since the 2007-08 season that the Governors have been picked as the preseason favorite (the team went on to win the OVC Championship that year). Austin Peay received 185 total points, which was four points ahead of Tennessee Tech, who received eight total first-place votes and were picked second. Defending regular season champion Murray State picked up three first-place votes and was picked third (169), Tennessee State was picked fourth (145), defending tournament champion Morehead State received the other first-place vote and was tabbed fifth (128) and was followed by Southeast Missouri (106), Eastern Kentucky (90), UT Martin (73), Eastern Illinois (67), Jacksonville State (40) and SIUE (27).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite always a good thing? Over the past 32 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly picked the eventual OVC regular season champion 62.5 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the past 32 years. Over the past 11 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner six times. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State to win the regular season championship, which it did. It marked the first time in the last decade that the preseason poll had predicted the champion correctly in back-to-back years.

Tennessee Tech's Murphy Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2011-12 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Tennessee Tech senior **Kevin Murphy**, who was a first-team All-OVC selection a season ago. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Murray State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech having two selections apiece. Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, three players who were second-team selections and four players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. Murphy's 17.0 points/game last season ranked third in the league and helped the high-powered Tennessee Tech offense lead the OVC in scoring (74.6 points/game). His play helped the Golden Eagles to 20 victories for the first time since 2002-03

and a berth in the OVC Tournament Championship game. Although TTU came up short in that game, they were invited to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, marking the first postseason play for the program since 2001-02. Murphy also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 47.8 percent from the field in 33 total contests. In addition to Murphy, Austin Peay's **TyShwan Edmondson** and Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year were Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** and Tennessee State's **Robert Covington** and **Kenny Moore**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell**, Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger**, Murray State's **Ivan Aska** and Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey**.

Westwood One to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the third consecutive season, the 2012 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Westwood One serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Westwood One provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Westwood One is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Five: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVCsports.TV: For the sixth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

NATIONAL POLLS

Murray State entered the AP Top 25 at No. 24 on Dec. 12, becoming the first OVC team to be ranked since the Racers were No. 25 in the final regular season poll of the 1997-98 season.

MOREHEAD STATE EAGLES (6-7, 0-0)

Team Notes

Morehead State won a pair of non-conference games last week, winning at Binghamton and topping Ball State at home... The key to the victories was the Eagles ability to force turnovers, as MSU forced Binghamton into 21 miscues and Ball State into 24; Morehead State is now 5-0 on the season when forcing at least 20 turnovers in a game this year... The Eagles rank second in the OVC in steals (9.2/game) and third in turnover margin (+2.1/game)... Senior Terrance Hill averaged 16.5 points, 3.0 steals, 2.5 assists and 1.5 rebounds/game in the two wins last week; Hill connected on 40 percent (9-of-22) from the field and was a perfect 11-of-11 from the charity stripe... MSU has played with a balanced lineup this year and have eight players averaging double figure minutes so far this season; overall the team has used seven different starting lineups through 13 contests this season... Morehead State ranks third in the OVC in free throw percentage (73.5%) on the season and over its last three games that mark is 79 percent (60-of-76)... Morehead State's six victories this year have come by an average of 21.0 points... Morehead State, the defending OVC Tournament Champions, open OVC play on Wednesday at Southeast Missouri... The week will conclude with the Eagles hosting preseason favorite Austin Peay in a game that will be seen on ESPNU... Following Saturday's home game, the Eagles will play its next three OVC games on the road, not playing again at Johnson Arena until Jan. 14.



MURRAY STATE RACERS (13-0, 1-0)

Team Notes

Murray State ran its record to a perfect 13-0 on the season with a 78-54 defeat of UT Martin in the OVC opener for both teams last Wednesday... It is the second-best start ever for the Racers, behind only a 16-0 start in the 1935-36 season (prior to the OVC forming in 1948... The team's longest winning streak of all-time is 17-straight games in the 2009-10 season... It also marked the 13th-straight home win for the Racers, the 19th-longest streak nationally... Murray State is now 100-18 (84.7%) in 14 seasons all-time at the CFSB Center... The Racers are currently one of six teams in Division I to be undefeated... In this week's national polls MSU moved up to 20th in the AP poll and 21st in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll... MSU is the first OVC team to be ranked in the Top 25 for three consecutive weeks since WKU was ranked in all 16 polls of the 1970-71 season... Against the Skyhawks, the Racers committed a season-high 24 turnovers but shot 68.3 percent (28-of-41) from the field for the game, including 72.2 percent (13-of-18) in the second half, that was never in doubt... Donte Poole led the way with 15 points on 5-of-6 shooting while Ivan Aska added 12 points and seven rebounds and Isaiah Canaan had 10 points and seven assists... Canaan now has 990 career points and needs just 10 more to become the 38th member of the Racers 1,000-Point Club... Murray State is now 32-5 in OVC play over the past three seasons... The team returns to the floor on Friday night at Eastern Illinois (ESPN3); the Panthers handed MSU one of its two home losses a season ago.

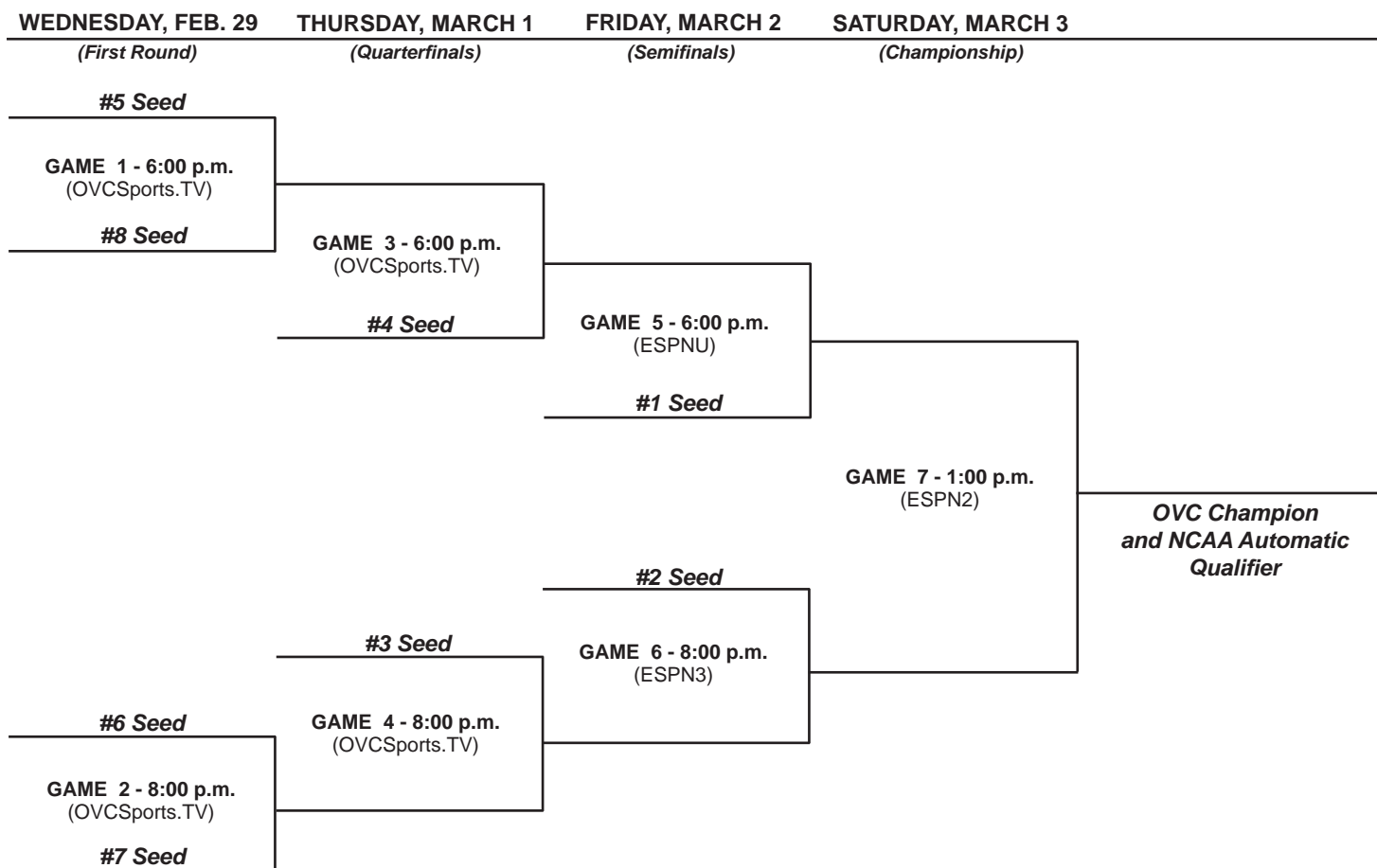
