THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



CO-PLAYER

Jeremy Granger, G • Sr., 6-2, 175 • Elgin, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Granger averaged 19.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game last week as Eastern Illinois won two home games to improve to 5-2 on the season, the program's best start to a season since 2000-01. The senior hit 42.9 percent (12-of-28) from the field, 40 percent (2-of-5) from 3-point range and 86.7 percent (13-of-15) from the free throw line in the two victories. Granger started the week by scoring 14 points, grabbing five rebounds and dishing out a season-high eight assists in an overtime victory over Maine. In the overtime session, he scored all nine of EIU's points. The guard concluded the week by scoring 25 points, grabbing seven rebounds and dishing out six assists in a victory over Stony Brook. Granger currently ranks third in the OVC in scoring (18.1 points/game) and second in assists (4.3/game). Entering the season the Panthers had not had an OVC Player of the Week since March 3, 2008; however, Granger has now won the award twice in four weeks this season.

CO-PLAYER

Isaiah Canaan, G • Jr., 6-0, 193 • Biloxi, Miss. • Murray State

Canaan earned the OVC Player of the Week award for the second-straight week after averaging 19.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists/game while also hitting 52.2 percent (12-of-23) from the field, 58.3 percent (7-of-12) from 3-point range and 88.9 percent (8-of-9) from the free throw line. Canaan led the Racers to a road win over Western Kentucky and a home victory over Dayton to help the team to a 9-0 start, its best start since 1998-99; with the start the Racers are now receiving votes in both major Top 25 polls. The junior hit 5-of-10 shots and scored 18 points in the 70-59 road win at WKU; in that contest he had five rebounds and two assists in 36 minutes of action. Three days later he hit 5-of-8 (62.5%) from 3-point range in scoring 21 points in a 75-58 win over Dayton; he also added three rebounds and five assists in that game. Canaan currently leads the OVC in scoring (20.3 points/game) and 3-pointers made (3.3/game).

NEWCOMER

Tyler Stone, F • R-So., 6-8, 230 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Stone earned his second OVC Newcomer of the Week award of the season after averaging 14.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 1.0 steals/game last week as Southeast Missouri lost at Arkansas State and topped Southeastern Louisiana in overtime at home. After coming off the bench at ASU to score 10 points and pull down five rebounds, Stone got the starting nod against Southeastern Louisiana, scoring 18 points and pulling down 17 rebounds, the most by a player in the OVC this season. Stone, a transfer from Missouri, hit 7-of-13 shots (53.8%) and 4-of-5 (80%) free throws to go along with two steals. The sophomore had 12 points and 12 rebounds in the first half alone and came up big when his team needed him, scoring the game-winning basket with four seconds left in overtime. Stone currently ranks fifth in the OVC in rebounding (6.8/game) and ninth in scoring (13.4 points/game).

FRESHMAN

Eric Stutz, F • Fr., 6-8, 225 • Newburgh, Ind. • Eastern Kentucky

Stutz was named OVC Freshman of the Week for the second time this season after averaging 17.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists/game as Eastern Kentucky lost at Delaware State and topped Brescia in its first home game of the season. The forward led the Colonels in scoring in each game, including scoring 13 points to start the week at Delaware State. In that game Stutz added four rebounds and an assist in 21 minutes of action. He concluded the week with a season-high 22 points in a 107-43 win over Brescia, the team's first home game of the season after playing its first eight contests of the year away from home. In that game he hit 9-of-14 shots (64.3%) while also adding eight rebounds (5 offensive) and four assists. For the week Stutz hit 63.6 percent (14-of-22) from the field).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Murray State is one of 15 Division I teams who is currently undefeated on the season (that number is down from 27 a week ago); the Racers nine wins on the season is tied for the most nationally with Tulane (six other teams have eight wins this season)...Murray State will try to become the first OVC team since 1953-54 to start the season 10-0 (that season Western Kentucky opened the year 21-0)...Murray State is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Top 25 polls...Eastern Illinois won two games last week to improve to 5-2 on the season, the program's best start since beginning the 2000-01 season 6-2 (on its way to the OVC Tournament Championship)...Southeast Missouri State is currently the only other OVC team with a .500 or better record (4-4); the Redhawks have won four-straight non-conference home games for the first time since 2003-04...Preseason favorite Austin Peay is still searching for its first victory of the season; the Govs are 0-9 and off to the worst start in school history.

NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the first set of NCAA statistical leaders released on Dec. 5, Murray State ranks fourth nationally in free throw percentage (79.5%), 16th in 3-point percentage (43.1%), 18th in 3-point percentage defense (25.0%) and 23rd in steals (9.6/game). Eastern Kentucky ranks seventh in fewest turnovers (10.0/game) while Eastern Illinois is 16th in assists (16.7/game). Individually Eastern Kentucky's **Mike DiNunno** is third in free throw percentage (96.0%) while Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey** is 19th in steals (2.7/game). Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** is 23rd in scoring (20.3/game), 14th in 3-pointers made (3.3/game) and 16th in 3-point percentage (50.8%).

Murray State Receiving Votes in AP and ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Polls: After starting the season 9-0, as of Dec. 5, Murray State is now receiving votes in both the Associated Press (AP) and ESPN/USA Today Top 25 polls. The Racers picked up two total points in the AP poll and eight points in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll.

Murray State Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In the latest CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll (Nov. 28 - the Dec. 5 poll is not yet available) Murray State is ranked 19th. The Racers first moved into the Top 25 on Nov. 28 and should move up this week after starting the season 9-0. Now in its 13th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

OVC One of Just 10 Conferences (4 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Three Seasons: The OVC is one of just 10 Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past three years and one of just four non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10, Horizon and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

Postseason Success: Not since the late 1980s has the OVC experienced the kind of NCAA Tournament success the program has had in the last three years. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. Last season it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. It marked the third time in OVC history that teams had won NCAA Tournament games in three consecutive seasons (1960-61-62, 1987-88-89 and 2009-10-11). The OVC has never won at least one NCAA Tournament game in four-straight years.

Regular Season Schedule Takes Slightly Different Format This Season: For the past six seasons and for 61 of the 63 years that basketball has been played in the OVC, the men's basketball schedule has been a double-round robin, meaning every league team played every other league team twice. That changes this year with the addition of SIUE to the regular season slate as the 11-team OVC will play a 16-game schedule instead of a 20-game round robin (which the league played from 2005-06 through 2007-08). With the 16-game schedule a team will play every other OVC school once, and play six of the 10 other schools twice (home and away) during the season. Each year there are only four teams that each school is not playing on a home and away basis. Several factors contributed to the switch to a 16-game schedule including creating more opportunity to schedule non-conference games and to have fewer games played during the month of December. The schedule's makeup (i.e. which teams played what teams twice) was determined by several factors including historical and traditional rivalries and geography/proximity of the teams. The only other previous seasons the league did not play a full round robin schedule were in 2003-04 and 2004-05 (the seasons after Jacksonville State and Samford first joined the league). The schedule could potentially see more changes next season when the league expands to 12 teams to include Belmont.

Former OVC Players in the NBA/NBDL: Entering the season there is current one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his rookie season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. There are also four former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League including former Jacksonville State players **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants), who has been a D-League All-Star, and **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy), as well as Tennessee Tech's **Willie Jenkins** (Idaho Stampede) and UT Martin's **Reuben Clayton** (Reno Bighorns).

Murray State Wins Great Alaska Shootout: Murray State traveled to Anchorage, Alaska the week of Thanksgiving and captured the championship at the 34th annual Great Alaska Shootout. The Racers topped host Alaska-Anchorage, San Francisco and Southern Miss on its way to the title. Junior Isaiah Canaan was named MVP of the event after averaging 25.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals/game at the event. Canaan scored 36 points (hitting 6-of-11 from 3-point range) in the overtime victory over Southern Miss in the title game. The 36 points was the ninth-best in Great Alaska Shootout history.

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

During the regular season a monthly teleconference featuring the league's 10 head coaches will be held on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. Central Time. The initial teleconference will take place Jan. 3 with the next call following on Jan. 31 (women's coaches calls will be held on Wednesday's - Jan. 11 and Feb. 8). On Monday, Feb. 27 a call featuring the men's & women's coaches who make the 8-team OVC Tournament field will be held at 10 a.m. (schedule to be announced). 2012 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held Feb. 29 - March 3 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 2 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 3 is at 1 p.m. and televised live on ESPN or ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 2 (televised on OVCsports.TV) and the women's championship game is set for March 3 at 4:00 p.m. (TV is TBD).

This marks the 18th time in 19 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the third year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 27 at Noon.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



Canaan Named to Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** has been named to the 2011-12 Lou Henson Preseason All-America team by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team leads to The Lou Henson Award at the end of the season, which is presented to the top mid-major player in NCAA D-I basketball. The award is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State. He is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

OVC Tournament Format and Home Enters Year No. 2: After debuting a new format and home for the OVC Tournament in 2011, the tournament will once again return to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville this year. Once again the top eight men's and women's teams will qualify for the tournament and advance to play in Nashville (as opposed to playing first round games in campus sites) under a merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to last year's championship were upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

The OVC Welcomes Two New Head Coaches: The OVC has two new head coaches this season, both of whom moved from assistant roles to the head spot on their respective teams. Murray State welcomes first-year head coach **Steve Prohm** to the top spot after he spent five years as an assistant coach with the Racers under Billy Kennedy. Long-time Tennessee Tech associate head coach **Steve Payne** moved to the head spot with the Golden Eagles after nine seasons under head coach Mike Sutton who retired after the end of the 2010-11 season. Prohm and Payne are two of the 25 new coaches at the Division I level who are head coaches for the first time (at any level) this season.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 22nd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 351 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 433 for his career.

SIUE Ready for Full OVC Schedule This Season: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. This season marks the first for the Cougars playing a full (16-game) OVC schedule. SIUE is eligible for the OVC Regular Season Championship but since they have one year left in the reclassification process to Division I, are ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments until next season.

Addition of Belmont Gives OVC Record 12 Schools in 2012-13: On May 13, 2011, Belmont University accepted an invitation to join the Ohio Valley Conference on July 1, 2012. Belmont, located just nine miles north of the OVC headquarters, will play its final year in the Atlantic Sun Conference this season. The Bruins men's basketball team has made four NCAA Tournament appearances in the past six seasons, including finishing 30-5 (one of nine Division I teams with at least 30 wins) and earning a No. 13 seed in 2010-11. The addition of Belmont (and SIUE's eligibility for postseason play next year) will give the OVC a record 12 schools for the 2012-13 season.

OVC to Host NCAA Tournament 2nd/3rd Rounds in March: The Ohio Valley Conference will serve as the host of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship Second/Third Rounds at Bridgestone Arena this March. The games will be played on Friday, March 16 and Sunday, March 18. The pairings will be announced on Sunday, March 12 at 5 p.m. CT on CBS. Tickets for the games went on sale to the public in October.

OVC Teams to Compete in ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: For the seventh-straight season every OVC team will compete in the ESPN Sears BracketBusters series (on Feb. 18). Now it its 10th year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that was tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 142 teams from 16 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games. The matchups will be announced on Monday, January 30. In the OVC Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Murray State and SIUE will serve as host institutions while Morehead State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin will play road contests. OVC schools are 25-41 all-time in the BracketBusters event.

A Record Four OVC Teams in Postseason: For the first time in OVC history in 2010-11, four different men's basketball teams competed in postseason play. Morehead State won the OVC Tournament and played in the NCAA Tournament, regular season champion Murray State participated in the NIT, Austin Peay played in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) and Tennessee Tech participated in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). It also marked the third-straight season that three or more OVC teams have participated in postseason competition, also a first for the league.

Four OVC Teams Reach 20 Wins in Same Season for First Time in 2011: In 2010 (Murray State, Morehead State, Eastern Kentucky) and 2011 (Morehead State, Murray State, Austin Peay, Tennessee Tech) the OVC had three or more teams reach 20 or more wins in the same season, marking the first time in league history that had happened in back-to-back years. Last season the league had four

teams win 20 or more games for the first-time ever (and each of those teams played in the postseason). Morehead State finished the year with 25 victories, Murray State had 23 and Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech had 20 wins apiece.

The 2011-12 Season: The 2011-12 season marks the 64th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 63 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Austin Peay Picked as Preseason Favorites: In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Austin Peay received 10 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2011-12 season. It marks the first time since the 2007-08 season that the Governors have been picked as the preseason favorite (the team went on to win the OVC Championship that year). Austin Peay received 185 total points, which was four points ahead of Tennessee Tech, who received eight total first-place votes and were picked second. Defending regular season champion Murray State picked up three first-place votes and was picked third (169), Tennessee State was picked fourth (145), defending tournament champion Morehead State received the other first-place vote and was tabbed fifth (128) and was followed by Southeast Missouri (106), Eastern Kentucky (90), UT Martin (73), Eastern Illinois (67), Jacksonville State (40) and SIUE (27).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite always a good thing? Over the past 32 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly picked the eventual OVC regular season champion 62.5 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the past 32 years. Over the past 11 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner six times. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State to win the regular season championship, which it did. It marked the first time in the last decade that the preseason poll had predicted the champion correctly in back-to-back years.

Tennessee Tech's Murphy Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2011-12 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Tennessee Tech senior **Kevin Murphy**, who was a first-team All-OVC selection a season ago. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Murray State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech having two selections apiece. Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, three players who were second-team selections and four players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. Murphy's 17.0 points/game last season ranked third in the league and helped the high-powered Tennessee Tech offense lead the OVC in scoring (74.6 points/game). His play helped the Golden Eagles to 20 victories for the first time since 2002-03 and a berth in the OVC Tournament Championship game. Although TTU came up short in that game, they were invited to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, marking the first postseason play for the program since 2001-02. Murphy also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 47.8 percent from the field in 33 total contests. In addition to Murphy, Austin Peay's **TyShwan Edmondson** and Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year were Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** and Tennessee State's **Robert Covington** and **Kenny Moore**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell**, Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger**, Murray State's **Ivan Aska** and Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey**.

Westwood One to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the third consecutive season, the 2012 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Westwood One serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Westwood One provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Westwood One is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Five: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of court-side replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVCSports.TV: For the sixth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

Austin Peay played a pair of in-state foes last week, losing at Lipscomb and also falling at nationally-ranked Memphis...The two losses dropped APSU to 0-9 on the season, the worst start ever for the program which was tabbed as the OVC preseason favorites...The team has been without senior center John Fraley since he suffered a concussion in the first game of the season; Fraley finally returned to non-contact practice drills last Thursday and limited contact work on Sunday...The Gobs shot just 39 percent against Lipscomb and 33.3 percent at Memphis, making it seven out of nine games this season they have shot 40 percent or worse in a game; the team ranks 10th in the OVC in field goal percentage (39.5%) and 11th in 3-point field goal percentage (23.5%)...Against No. 21 Memphis last Saturday, APSU head coach Dave Loos used his fifth different starting lineup of the season; a season ago the team used just seven different starting lineups the entire season...The team has shot free throws better lately, hitting 78.3 percent over the last three games after starting the season hitting just 59.4 percent through the first six games of the year...In the loss to Memphis Melvin Baker scored 15 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the field; he has averaged 15.3 points and 7.5 rebounds/game over his last four contests...This week Austin Peay will play only its second home game of the season, hosting Arkansas State on Monday night...That game will be followed on Saturday with a matchup against Tennessee (CSS/ESPN3).

After winning two more games last week Eastern Illinois is off to a 5-2 start, its best since beginning the 2000-01 season 6-2 overall; that season the Panthers who the OVC Tournament championship and made its second NCAA Tournament appearance...EIU started the week with an 85-80 overtime victory over Maine and followed that with a 72-69 victory over Stony Brook...The main overtime game followed one with Central Arkansas, marking the first back-to-back overtime games for EIU since the 1998 season...After starting the season with a loss the team has won five of its last six overall...Senior guard Jeremy Granger was named OVC Player of the Week for the second time in four total weeks this season after averaging 19.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game in the two victories...In the victory over Maine Granger tallied 14 points, but more importantly scored all nine of his team's points in the overtime period...He followed that with 25 points, seven rebounds and six assists in the win over Stony Brook...Granger currently ranks third in the OVC in scoring (18.0 points/game) and second in assists (4.3/game)...Freshman Joey Miller continued his fine play during his rookie season, averaging 16.0 points and 4.0 assists last week; Miller scored 19 points against Maine and 13 against Stony Brook...Miller currently ranks first in the OVC among freshmen in assists (3.3/game) and second among freshmen in scoring (10.9 points/game)...Sophomore Alfonzo McKinnie scored 24 points and had 14 rebounds in the Maine game...As a team EIU ranks 16th nationally in assists (16.7/game)...EIU also currently leads the OVC in scoring (77.7 points/game) and rebounding (37.3/game)...This week the Panthers will host Oakland City on Wednesday night and travel to in-state rival Western Illinois for a Saturday contest.

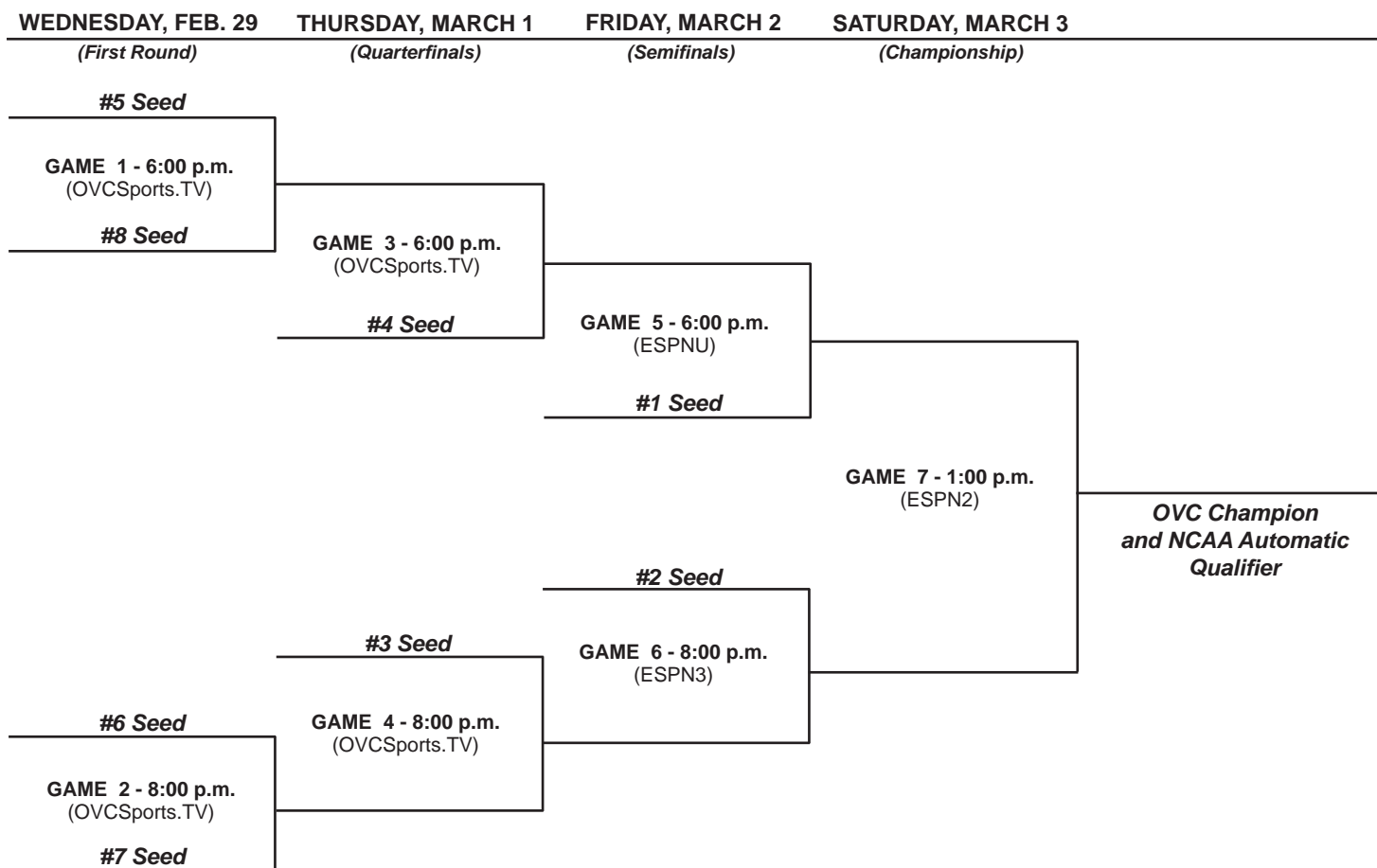
