THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Isaiah Canaan, G • Jr., 6-3, 193 • Biloxi, Miss. • Murray State

Canaan won his sixth OVC Player of the Week honor of the season after averaging 21.0 points, 4.0 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals/game while hitting 52 percent (13-of-25) from the field, 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from 3-point range and a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line. In helping Murray State avenge its only loss of the season at Tennessee State last Thursday, Canaan hit 5-of-7 3-pointers and scored 24 points as MSU won 80-62 and ended TSU's nine-game winning streak. The junior also had three rebounds, four assists and a steal in the victory. He capped the week by scoring 18 points, dishing out four assists, grabbing three rebounds and netting two steals in a win at Tennessee Tech. The two wins helped the Racers improve to 13-0 in true road games this year, the most of any Division I team; Murray State is the only team undefeated on the road this season.

CO-NEWCOMER

Ronnie Boggs, G • Jr., 6-3, 170 • Kansas City, Mo. • Jacksonville State

Boggs was named OVC Newcomer of the Week for the second time this season after averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game and hitting 57.9 percent (11-of-19) from the field and 5-of-6 (83.3%) from the free throw line in a pair of Jacksonville State victories. Boggs had 13 points, six rebounds and two steals in the team's win over Southeast Missouri and added 14 points (10 in the second half), seven rebounds, six assists, a block and a steal in Saturday's victory over UT Martin. The two wins propelled the Gamecocks into the OVC Tournament, its first trip to the neutral site in Nashville since 2006.

CO-FRESHMAN

Herdie Lawrence, G • Fr., 6-0, 170 • Lawrenceville, Ga. • Austin Peay

In two games last week Lawrence averaged 11.0 points, 5.0 assists, 1.0 steals and 1.0 rebounds/game while hitting 58.3 percent (7-of-12) from the field and 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range. The freshman came off the bench against UT Martin to hit 7-of-9 field goal attempts (4-of-5 from 3-point range) and score a career-high 19 points while also dishing out five assists in 28 minutes of action. That performance earned him a start in the team's Saturday win over Southeast Missouri where he once against dished out five assists.

CO-FRESHMAN

Darion Rackley, G • Fr., 6-2, 160 • St. Louis, Mo. • Jacksonville State

Rackley was named OVC Freshman of the Week for the second week in a row and third time in the last five weeks after averaging 11.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.0 blocks/game in a pair of Jacksonville State victories. On Saturday he scored 11 of his 14 points in the second half as Jax State topped UT Martin and clinched a spot in the OVC Tournament field. He also added five rebounds, four assists and a block in the victory. Rackley began the week by with nine points, three rebounds, three assists and a block in a victory over Southeast Missouri.



NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: This week marks the 49th OVC Men's Basketball Tournament and for the second year in a row (and ninth year overall) it is being held at Municipal Auditorium in downtown Nashville...It's the seventh time overall the combined men's and women's tournament has been held at the venue...This year marks the 18th time in the last 19 years the OVC Tournament has been held in Nashville...Murray State, who won its third-straight and 23rd overall OVC regular season championship, is the No. 1 seed while Tennessee State, the only team to defeat Murray State this year, is the No. 2 seed; those two teams will receive double byes into Friday night's semifinal round...Defending champion Morehead State (No. 3 seed) and Tennessee Tech (No. 4 seed) each received one bye into Thursday's quarterfinal round...Wednesday's first round will matchup No. 5 Southeast Missouri and No. 8 Eastern Kentucky (a rematch from last year's first round) and No. 6 Austin Peay and No. 7 Jacksonville State...Murray State wrapped up an undefeated road record for the season (13-0) with a pair of road victories last week, including avenging its only loss of the year in beating Tennessee State (and ending the Tigers nine-game winning streak); Murray State is the only Division I team to be undefeated in true road games this season and the 13 road wins are the most of any team nationally (one more than Wagner's 12 road victories)...Murray State is 4-0 this season against Top 100 RPI teams and enters this week ranked No. 29 in the RPI (RPIRatings.com)...Murray State is currently ranked 9 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 and No. 12 in the AP Poll...After climbing to as high as No. 7 in the national polls this season, Murray State was the first OVC team to be ranked in the Top 10 since Western Kentucky in the 1970-71 season; the Racers have now been ranked in the Top 25 for 12-straight weeks...If Murray State would not win the OVC Tournament, the Racers are likely to gain an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, marking only the second time in OVC history the league would have put two teams in the event in the same year (in 1987 Austin Peay earned the automatic bid and Middle Tennessee was an at-large selection)...The Tennessee Tech duo of Kevin Murphy (20.6 points/game) and Jud Dillard (18.0 points/game) currently rank third nationally among top teammate scoring tandems...Murphy has 1,959 career points, just 41 away from becoming the 16th player in OVC history with 2,000 career points.

2012 All-OVC Teams Announced on Tuesday: The announcement of the 2012 All-OVC Basketball Teams along with the Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year and Coach of the Year awards will be announced on Tuesday, February 28. The announcement will come first via Twitter (@OVCsports), between Noon and 1 p.m. CT. A formal press release and posting on OVCsports.com will come after 1 p.m.

Murray State Wins 2012 OVC Regular Season Championship: Murray State finished the Conference season 15-1 and won the 2012 OVC Regular Season Championship, its 23rd overall title and third in a row, and earned No. 1 seed for the OVC Tournament. MSU has also won OVC Regular Season titles in 1951, 1954, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1988, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010 and 2011. The 23 titles are the most in OVC history; former member Western Kentucky has the second-most titles (19), while Morehead State's nine titles are the next most among active members.

OVC Tournament Format and Home Enters Year No. 2: After debuting a new format and home for the OVC Tournament in 2011, the tournament will once again return to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville this year. Once again the top eight men's and women's teams will qualify for the tournament and advance to play in Nashville (as opposed to playing first round games in campus sites) under a merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed.

More on Municipal Auditorium: As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to last year's championship were upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

OVC One of Just 10 Conferences (4 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Three Seasons: The OVC is one of just 10 Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past three years and one of just four non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10, Horizon and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

Postseason Success: Not since the late 1980s has the OVC experienced the kind of NCAA Tournament success the program has had in the last three years. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. Last season it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. It marked the third time in OVC history that teams had won NCAA Tournament games in three consecutive seasons (1960-61-62, 1987-88-89 and 2009-10-11). The OVC has never won at least one NCAA Tournament game in four-straight years.

At-Large Bids: Should Murray State not win the OVC Tournament this week, the Racers are very likely to gain an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament (RPI of 29, 4-0 vs. Top 100 teams, undefeated on the road). If that were to happen and the OVC would get two teams into the NCAA Tournament field, it would mark only the second time in OVC history that would have occurred. In 1987 Middle Tennessee won the regular season championship but was topped by Austin Peay in the semifinals and APSU would go on to win the tournament and earn the automatic selection to the NAAs. Middle Tennessee, however, would earn an at-large berth (and No. 12 seed) in the tournament and lose to Notre Dame in the first round. Austin Peay, seeded 15th, would go on to top No. 3 seed Illinois 68-67 before falling to No. 6 seed Providence (a team that would go onto the Final Four with Billy Donovan and head coach Rick Pitino) in overtime in the second round.

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

During the regular season a monthly teleconference featuring the league's 10 head coaches will be held on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. Central Time. The initial teleconference will take place Jan. 3 with the next call following on Jan. 31 (women's coaches calls will be held on Wednesday's - Jan. 11 and Feb. 8). On Monday, Feb. 27 a call featuring the men's & women's coaches who make the 8-team OVC Tournament field will be held at 10 a.m. (schedule to be announced). 2012 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held Feb. 29 - March 3 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 2 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 3 is at 1 p.m. and televised live on ESPN or ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 2 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is set for March 3 at 4:30 p.m. (ESPN3).

This marks the 18th time in 19 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the third year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, FEB. 27 at 1 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



Murray State Last Unbeaten in Division I in 2011-12: Murray State was the last undefeated team in Division I this season, going 23-0 before falling to Tennessee State on Feb. 9. The 23-game winning streak is the longest by a Division I team this season.

Murray State Only Team Undefeated on the Road: Murray State is currently the only Division I team who is undefeated on the road. The Racers finished the road portion of its season 13-0 in true road games.

Murray State Has Most Road Wins Nationally: As of Monday (Feb. 27), Murray State's 13 true road victories this season are the most of any Division I team.

Murray State No. 9 in ESPN/USA Today Top 25, No. 12 in AP Poll: After starting the season 23-0 Murray State climbed to as high as No. 7 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll and No. 9 in the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 on Feb. 6. It marked the first Top 10 ranking for an OVC team since Western Kentucky was No. 7 in the final poll of the 1970-71 season and the team was in the Top 10 for four total weeks. The Racers suffered its first loss of the season on Feb. 9 (72-68 to Tennessee State) and fell to No. 14 in the Coaches Poll and No. 16 in the AP Poll. This week the team checks in at No. 9 in the Coaches Poll and No. 12 in the AP Poll. The Racers cracked the Top 25 on Dec. 12, coming in at No. 24 in the AP poll, and debuted in the Coaches Poll on Dec. 19. When Murray State cracked the Top 25 it marked the first time an OVC team had been nationally-ranked since Murray State was No. 25 in the final AP poll of the 1997-98 season (which was released at the end of the regular season). Murray State is the first OVC team to be ranked for 12-straight weeks since the 1970-71 season (Western Kentucky was ranked in all 16 polls of that year). Murray State's No. 7 ranking on Feb. 6 was the highest in school history (its previous high was 16th, accomplished in both the 1950-51 and 1951-52 seasons). The highest ranking ever earned by an OVC men's basketball team is No. 3, accomplished by Western Kentucky in the 1948-49, 1953-54 and 1966-67 seasons.

OVC Teams Beating Ranked Teams: Although the OVC has had recent success against nationally-ranked teams in the NCAA Tournament (Murray State beat No. 21 Vanderbilt in 2010 and Morehead State beat No. 14 Louisville last year), prior to Murray State's win over No. 20/21 Memphis on Dec. 11, it had been 14 years since an OVC team had beat a nationally-ranked opponent during the regular season. That was when Murray State beat No. 12 Arkansas 94-83 on Dec. 25, 1997 in Puerto Rico. Murray State made it 2-0 against Top 25 teams this season when on Feb. 18 when the then No. 14-ranked Racers topped No. 16 Saint Mary's in the BracketBusters series.

NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders released on Feb. 27, Murray State ranks fourth in 3-point percentage (41.5%), 11th in scoring margin (+13.1), 19th in 3-point percentage defense (29.2%) and 22nd in field goal percentage (47.8%). Eastern Illinois ranks 16th in free throw percentage (75.7%), Eastern Kentucky is 17th in fewest turnovers allowed (11.0/game) and Morehead State is 22nd in steals (8.5/game). Individually Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy** ranks 12th in scoring (20.6 points/game) while teammate **Zac Swansey** is 21st in assists (5.9/game) and 22nd in steals (2.2/game). Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** is third in 3-point percentage (48.4%), seventh in 3-pointers made/game (3.2) and 22nd in scoring (19.4 points/game).

Murray State Sets OVC Record for Longest Winning Streak in OVC History: Murray State 23-game winning streak this season (from the beginning of the year until Feb. 9) was the longest streak in OVC history. It bested a pair of 21-game streaks by Western Kentucky in each the 1953-54 and 1966-67 seasons. Below is a list of all winning streak of 15 games or longer in OVC history.

23-0 Start for Murray State Best in OVC History: Before losing its first game on Feb. 9, Murray State began the season 23-0 which was the best in OVC history and one of just five instances of an OVC school beginning the year 10-0 or better since the league was formed in 1948. It is the first since Western Kentucky started the year 21-0 in 1953-54 (that was the previous best start to a season for an OVC team). The other teams to start a season at least 10-0 are Western Kentucky in 1948-49 (15-0) and Murray State in each 1950-51 (12-0) and 1951-52 (11-0).

Tennessee Tech's Murphy Scores 50: Tennessee Tech senior guard **Kevin Murphy** had a night to remember on Jan. 30 against SIUE. Murphy hit 16-of-21 field goals (6-of-9 from 3-point range) and was 12-of-14 at the free throw line for a school record 50 points. The 50 points are the most by any Division I player this season (and most since Jimmer Fredette scored 52 on March 11, 2011) and is one of just 11 50-plus point games in OVC history. It marked the first 50-point performance in the OVC since the 1991-92 season (20 years) and was just five points off the OVC single-game scoring record. Murray State No. 1 in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll; Tennessee State Debuts at No. 25: In the Feb. 20 CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll (the Feb. 27 poll was not yet available) Murray State remained No. 1 overall for the eighth-straight week, receiving 23 of a possible 31 first-place votes. The Racers are the first OVC team to ever be ranked No. 1 in that poll. Tennessee State debuted at No. 25 on Feb. 13 and remained there this week. The Racers first vaulted into the Mid-Major Top 25 on Nov. 28 of this season and moved up to 10th on Dec. 5 before its win at Memphis. Following the win over Memphis, the Racers jumped to second where they were for three weeks before becoming No. 1 on Jan. 2. Now in its 13th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Canaan Named to Midseason Oscar Robertson Trophy Watch List by USBWA: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 20 players on the Oscar Robertson Trophy Watch List released on Feb. 6. The award is presented by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) and is given to the National College Player of the Year. The award will be presented on March 30 at the Final Four. Canaan is one of three players from non-BCS leagues on the list (the others are Creighton's Doug McDermott and Weber State's Damian Lillard).

Canaan Named to Bob Cousy Watch List: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 11 finalists for the 2012 Bob Cousy Award, given to the top collegiate point guard by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The list had 60-plus candidates at the beginning of the season (including Tennessee State's **Wil Peters**) but has been narrowed to 11 candidates now. The current group of 11 will be narrowed to five players on March 8 and the winner announced at the Final Four in April.

Prohm Has Third-Best Start Ever for a First-Year Head Coach: In his first year as a collegiate head coach **Steve Prohm** is in some good company for best starts. Prohm started his career 23-0 this season with the Racers which is the third-best start for a Division I coach in his first season as a head coach. OVC to Host NCAA Tournament 2nd/3rd Rounds in March: The Ohio Valley Conference will serve as the host of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship Second/Third Rounds at Bridgestone Arena this March. The games will be played on Friday, March 16 and Sunday, March 18. The pairings will be announced on Sunday, March 12 at 5 p.m. CT on CBS. Tickets for the games went on sale to the public in October.

OVC Announces Divisional Play for 2012-13: On Feb. 16 the OVC announced the plan for divisional play for men's and women's basketball beginning with the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 will give the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The sports of softball and volleyball will use schedules based on a divisional format but have yet to determine if those sports will formally recognize divisions. The sports of baseball, women's soccer and men's and women's tennis will not use divisional play because those sports currently have less than 12 participating teams. The East Division will include Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division will include Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. Some of the factors in determining the divisions included geography and balance while also being mindful of matchups and rivalries (both current and future). The final piece of divisional play will be to determine tournament seeding and bracketing. The OVC Championships sub-committee is studying those issues now and the Directors of Athletics will make a decision soon.

OVC Teams Finish 7-4 in ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: OVC teams performed better than they ever had in the 10th annual Sears BracketBusters series this season. The 11 teams combined for a 7-4 overall record, the best in the seven years that every OVC team has competed in the series. It surpassed the previous best mark of 6-4 set a season ago. Nationally-ranked Murray State topped No. 16 Saint Mary's in a game that aired on ESPN (with Dick Vitale calling the game) and Austin Peay (Youngstown State), Eastern Kentucky (IPFW), Jacksonville State (Presbyterian), SIUE (Northern Illinois), Tennessee State (Miami (Ohio)) and Tennessee Tech (Coastal Carolina) also picked up victories. Now it's its 10th year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that has been tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there were 142 teams from 16 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games.

Regular Season Schedule Takes Slightly Different Format This Season: For the past six seasons and for 61 of the 63 years that basketball has been played in the OVC, the men's basketball schedule has been a double-round robin, meaning every league team played every other league team twice. That changes this year with the addition of SIUE to the regular season slate as the 11-team OVC will play a 16-game schedule instead of a 20-game round robin (which the league played from 2005-06 through 2007-08). With the 16-game schedule a team will play every other OVC school once, and play six of the 10 other schools twice (home and away) during the season. Each year there are only four teams that each school is not playing on a home and away basis. Several factors contributed to the switch to a 16-game schedule including creating more opportunity to schedule non-conference games and to have

fewer games played during the month of December. The schedule's makeup (i.e. which teams played what teams twice) was determined by several factors including historical and traditional rivalries and geography/proximity of the teams. The only other previous seasons the league did not play a full round robin schedule were in 2003-04 and 2004-05 (the seasons after Jacksonville State and Samford first joined the league).

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 22nd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 363 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 445 for his career.

Proffitt Named to Capitol One Academic All-District® Team: Morehead State's **Ty Proffitt** has been named to the Capitol One Academic All-District® first-team for the second-straight year. A senior with a 3.82 grade point average in finance, Proffitt will now move on to the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-America® honors. To be eligible, student-athletes have to have a least a 3.30 GPA and have been at their institution for at least one year.

Prohm Named CollegeInsider.com Hugh Durham Mid-Season Coach of the Year: After leading Murray State to its best start in 75 years, Murray State Head Coach **Steve Prohm** was honored by CollegeInsider.com with recognition as the mid-season Hugh Durham Award honoree. The Hugh Durham award is presented annually to the top mid-major coach in NCAA D-I basketball. The award is named after Hugh Durham who was an icon in the game with coaching stops at Florida State, Georgia and Jacksonville. Prohm is in his first season as head coach, replacing Billy Kennedy who is now the head coach at Texas A&M. Kennedy was a finalist for the Durham Award in 2010. The Hugh Durham award is named after the first and only coach in the history of NCAA Division I basketball to lead two different schools to the NCAA Final Four for the first and only time in each school's history (Florida State University in 1972 and University of Georgia in 1983). Durham is the only coach in NCAA Division I history to be the all-time winningest coach at three different schools (Florida State, Georgia, and Jacksonville). He finished his career with 634 wins. The winner of the 2012 Hugh Durham Award will be announced on March 30 in New Orleans, site of the NCAA men's basketball championship.

OVC Against the SEC: Between the beginning of the 2000-01 season (when Tennessee Tech beat South Carolina) and the 2010 NCAA Tournament (when Murray State beat Vanderbilt) the OVC lost 71-straight games to SEC opponents. A year ago OVC teams were 0-8 against that league but this season has been different with OVC teams going 2-3 against SEC foes. That includes Tennessee State's win at South Carolina on Nov. 20 and Austin Peay's victory at Tennessee on Dec. 10.

Murray State Wins Great Alaska Shootout: Murray State traveled to Anchorage, Alaska the week of Thanksgiving and captured the championship at the 34th annual Great Alaska Shootout. The Racers topped host Alaska-Anchorage, San Francisco and Southern Miss on its way to the title. Junior Isaiah Canaan was named MVP of the event after averaging 25.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals/game at the event. Canaan scored 36 points (hitting 6-of-11 from 3-point range) in the overtime victory over Southern Miss in the title game. The 36 points was the ninth-best in Great Alaska Shootout history.

Canaan Named to Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** has been named to the 2011-12 Lou Henson Preseason All-America team by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team leads to The Lou Henson Award at the end of the season, which is presented to the top mid-major player in NCAA D-I basketball. The award is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State. He is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

The OVC Welcomes Two New Head Coaches: The OVC has two new head coaches this season, both of whom moved from assistant roles to the head spot on their respective teams. Murray State welcomes first-year head coach **Steve Prohm** to the top spot after he spent five years as an assistant coach with the Racers under Billy Kennedy. Long-time Tennessee Tech associate head coach **Steve Payne** moved to the head spot with the Golden Eagles after nine seasons under head coach Mike Sutton who retired after the end of the 2010-11 season. Prohm and Payne are two of the 25 new coaches at the Division I level who are head coaches for the first time (at any level) this season.

SIUE Ready for Full OVC Schedule This Season: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. This season marks the first for the Cougars playing a full (16-game) OVC schedule. SIUE is eligible for the OVC Regular Season Championship but since they have one year left in the reclassification process to Division I, are ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments until next season.

Addition of Belmont Gives OVC Record 12 Schools in 2012-13: On May 13, 2011, Belmont University accepted an invitation to join the Ohio Valley Conference on July 1, 2012. Belmont, located just nine miles north of the OVC headquarters, will play its final year in the Atlantic Sun Conference this season. The Bruins men's basketball team has made four NCAA Tournament appearances in the past six seasons, including finishing 30-5 (one of nine Division I teams with at least 30 wins) and earning a No. 13 seed in 2010-11. The addition of Belmont (and SIUE's eligibility for postseason play next year) will give the OVC a record 12 schools for the 2012-13 season.

A Record Four OVC Teams in Postseason: For the first time in OVC history in 2010-11, four different men's basketball teams competed in postseason play. Morehead State won the OVC Tournament and played in the NCAA Tournament, regular season champion Murray State participated in the NIT, Austin Peay played in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) and Tennessee Tech participated in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). It also marked the third-straight season that three or more OVC teams have participated in postseason competition, also a first for the league.

Four OVC Teams Reach 20 Wins in Same Season for First Time in 2011: In 2010 (Murray State, Morehead State, Eastern Kentucky) and 2011 (Morehead State, Murray State, Austin Peay, Tennessee Tech) the OVC had three or more teams reach 20 or more wins in the same season, marking the first time in league history that had happened in back-to-back years. Last season the league had four teams win 20 or more games for the first-time ever (and each of those teams played in the postseason). Morehead State finished the year with 25 victories, Murray State had 23 and Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech had

Former OVC Players in the NBA/NBDL: Entering the season there was only one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his rookie season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. On Jan. 20, former Jacksonville State standout **Walker Russell** got the call up from the NBDL, going from the Fort Wayne Mad Ants to the Detroit Pistons. Russell was a NBDL All-Star a season ago. There are also four former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League including former Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy), Tennessee State's **Bruce Price** (Dakota Wizards), Tennessee Tech's **Willie Jenkins** (Idaho Stampede) and UT Martin's **Reuben Clayton** (Reno Bighorns).

The 2011-12 Season: The 2011-12 season marks the 64th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 63 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Tennessee Tech's Murphy Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2011-12 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Tennessee Tech senior **Kevin Murphy**, who was a first-team All-OVC selection a season ago. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Murray State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech having two selections apiece. Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, three players who were second-team selections and four players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. Murphy's 17.0 points/game last season ranked third in the league and helped the high-powered Tennessee Tech offense lead the OVC in scoring (74.6 points/game). His play helped the Golden Eagles to 20 victories for the first time since 2002-03 and a berth in the OVC Tournament Championship game. Although TTU came up short in that game, they were invited to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, marking the first postseason play for the program since 2001-02. Murphy also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 47.8 percent from the field in 33 total contests. In addition to Murphy, Austin Peay's **TyShwan Edmondson** and Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year were Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** and Tennessee State's **Robert Covington** and **Kenny Moore**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell**, Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger**, Murray State's **Ivan Aska** and Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey**.

Austin Peay Picked as Preseason Favorites: In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Austin Peay received 10 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2011-12 season. It marks the first time since the 2007-08 season that the Governors have been picked as the preseason favorite (the team went on to win the OVC Championship that year). Austin Peay received 185 total points, which was four points ahead of Tennessee Tech, who received eight total first-place votes and were picked second. Defending regular season champion Murray State picked up three first-place votes and was picked third (169), Tennessee State was picked fourth (145), defending tournament champion Morehead State received the other first-place vote and was tabbed fifth (128) and was followed by Southeast Missouri (106), Eastern Kentucky (90), UT Martin (73), Eastern Illinois (67), Jacksonville State (40) and SIUE (27).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite always a good thing? Over the past 32 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly picked the eventual OVC regular season champion 60.6 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the past 33 years. Over the past 12 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner six times. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State to win the regular season championship, which it did. That marked the first time in the last decade that the preseason poll had predicted the champion correctly in back-to-back years. This year the poll predicted Austin Peay, but Murray State won the championship.

Westwood One's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more. Through its Metro Traffic division, Westwood One provides traffic reporting and local news, sports and weather to approximately 2,300 radio and TV stations. Westwood One also provides digital and other cross-platform delivery of its network and Metro content.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year Five: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of court-side replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVCsports.TV: For the sixth consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVC-Sports.TV. The venture with NeuLion (formerly JumpTV Sports) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of conference matchups (excluding only national television games which are not available) on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and has streamed over 1,000 events in its first four years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball events and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonal, monthly or per-event basis.

After having a four-game OVC losing streak in late January/early February, Austin Peay rebounded down the stretch to win its final two OVC games last week (which was part of a three-game overall streak) to secure a berth in the OVC Tournament field as the No. 6 seed...The Governors will open OVC Tournament play on Wednesday when they play No. 7 seed Jacksonville State...Earlier this season the Gobs topped the Gamecocks 60-57 in Clarksville (Jan. 14)...APSU finished the year 8-8 in league play, marking the 19th-straight year the team has been .500 or better in OVC play...Senior TyShwan Edmondson hit 7-of-9 (77.8%) from 3-point range in two games last week, including knocking down 5-of-6 trifectas on his way to 25 points against Southeast Missouri...In the team's win over UT Martin, freshman Herdie Lawrence came off the bench to score a career-high 19 points, hitting 4-of-5 3-pointers and also dishing out five assists in the road victory...Senior John Fraley had 10 rebounds in the regular season finale, giving him 759 for his career (most among active OVC players), which moved him into sixth place in APSU history...Austin Peay ranks third in the OVC in blocks (3.6/game) and fourth in field goal percentage (44.2%) and rebounding (33.7/game); the Gobs are next-to-last in the OVC in each scoring, field goal defense, 3-point field goal defense and rebounding defense...The Governors are in search of its fifth OVC Tournament championship and first since the 2008 season.

Team Notes

Tennessee State played just once last week, hosting No. 12 Murray State at the Gentry Center last Thursday...The Tigers could not complete the season sweep of the Racers as they lost 80-62 in front of 10,125 fans, the largest basketball crowd in the building's history...The loss snapped the team's nine-game winning streak...TSU did finish the OVC season with an 11-5 record, which placed them second in the league and gives them a double bye to Friday night's semifinals...Overall Tennessee State is 19-11 overall, its best season since 1993-94; the team has clinched its first winning season overall since 1994-95...With one more win the Tigers will reach the 20-win plateau for the first time since the 1978-79 campaign...The team is searching for its first OVC Tournament title since winning back-to-back championships in 1993 and 1994...In the team's lone game last week junior Robert Covington scored 24 points and pulled down 15 rebounds against nationally-ranked Murray State; it marked the ninth double-double of the season for Covington (the most in the OVC) and the 19th of his three-year career...Covington ranks second in the OVC in rebounding (8.1/game), third in scoring (18.1/game), fourth in blocks (1.3/game), fifth in steals (1.6/game) and sixth in field goal percentage (52.6%)...Tennessee State ranks second in the OVC in rebounding (34.4/game) and third in scoring margin (+1.8) and rebounding margin (+2.5)...Should TSU appear in some type of postseason play after the OVC Tournament, it would be the first time the program has done that since 1993-94.

Team Notes

In its lone game of the week on Saturday, Tennessee Tech lost 69-64 at No. 12 Murray State at the Eblen Center...The loss left Tennessee Tech 9-7 in OVC play this season, which tied them for fourth with Southeast Missouri...After the tiebreaker the Golden Eagles earned the No. 4 seed and a bye to Thursday's quarterfinals where they will matchup with Southeast Missouri or Eastern Kentucky...The Golden Eagles were also the No. 4 seed a season ago when they won two games (including beating regular season champion Murray State) before losing to Morehead State in the championship game...Tech is in search of its first OVC Tournament Championship since the 1967 season (when the tournament was held in the middle of the season instead of at the end); that tournament was also held at Municipal Auditorium...Senior Kevin Murphy hit 7-of-12 3-pointers and scored 26 points in the loss to Murray State...In the process Murphy tied the TTU record for career games played (125) a mark he will break on Thursday night...Murphy is just 43 points away from becoming the 16th player in OVC history to score 2,000 points for a career...Murphy and junior Jud Dillard combine to averaged 38.6 points/game, which ranks third nationally among teammate duos...Murphy leads the OVC in scoring (20.6 points/game), Dillard leads the league in rebounding (8.7/game) and senior Zac Swansey leads the OVC in assists (5.9/game) and steals (2.2/game)...As a team Tennessee Tech leads the OVC in rebounding margin (+2.6) and ranks second in scoring (72.9/game), assists (13.7/game), scoring margin (+1.8) and rebounding defense (31.3/game).

UT Martin closed out the 2011-12 season by losing a pair of games last week, falling 85-67 in its home finale against Austin Peay and losing 77-46 at Jacksonville State...That left the Skyhawks with an 0-16 OVC record for the season, making them just the eighth OVC team to go winless in Conference play during a season (and first since Southeast Missouri was 0-18 in 2008-09...Sophomore Mike Liabo completed a solid sophomore season by averaging 23.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists/game after hitting 7-of-13 from 3-point range; Liabo had a career-high 27 points in the team's game at Austin Peay and 20 points against Jax State...Liabo finished the season leading the team in scoring at 15.3 points/game (a mark that was seventh-best in the OVC through the end of the regular season)...Liabo knocked down 68 3-pointers during the season, just one of two players on the UTM team with double-digit trifectas on the season...Freshman Myles Taylor ended the year averaging 13.7 points and 5.2 rebounds/game, both of which led all freshman players in the OVC...The Skyhawks graduate just one player from this year's team, senior Dane Smith.
