THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



PLAYER

Isaiah Canaan, G • Jr., 6-3, 193 • Biloxi, Miss. • Murray State

Canaan won his sixth OVC Player of the Week honor of the season after averaging 21.0 points, 4.0 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals/game while hitting 52 percent (13-of-25) from the field, 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from 3-point range and a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line. In helping Murray State avenge its only loss of the season at Tennessee State last Thursday, Canaan hit 5-of-7 3-pointers and scored 24 points as MSU won 80-62 and ended TSU's nine-game winning streak. The junior also had three rebounds, four assists and a steal in the victory. He capped the week by scoring 18 points, dishing out four assists, grabbing three rebounds and netting two steals in a win at Tennessee Tech. The two wins helped the Racers improve to 13-0 in true road games this year, the most of any Division I team; Murray State is the only team undefeated on the road this season.

CO-NEWCOMER

Ronnie Boggs, G • Jr., 6-3, 170 • Kansas City, Mo. • Jacksonville State

Boggs was named OVC Newcomer of the Week for the second time this season after averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game and hitting 57.9 percent (11-of-19) from the field and 5-of-6 (83.3%) from the free throw line in a pair of Jacksonville State victories. Boggs had 13 points, six rebounds and two steals in the team's win over Southeast Missouri and added 14 points (10 in the second half), seven rebounds, six assists, a block and a steal in Saturday's victory over UT Martin. The two wins propelled the Gamecocks into the OVC Tournament, its first trip to the neutral site in Nashville since 2006.

CO-FRESHMAN

Herdie Lawrence, G • Fr., 6-0, 170 • Lawrenceville, Ga. • Austin Peay

In two games last week Lawrence averaged 11.0 points, 5.0 assists, 1.0 steals and 1.0 rebounds/game while hitting 58.3 percent (7-of-12) from the field and 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range. The freshman came off the bench against UT Martin to hit 7-of-9 field goal attempts (4-of-5 from 3-point range) and score a career-high 19 points while also dishing out five assists in 28 minutes of action. That performance earned him a start in the team's Saturday win over Southeast Missouri where he once against dished out five assists.

CO-FRESHMAN

Darion Rackley, G • Fr., 6-2, 160 • St. Louis, Mo. • Jacksonville State

Rackley was named OVC Freshman of the Week for the second week in a row and third time in the last five weeks after averaging 11.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.0 blocks/game in a pair of Jacksonville State victories. On Saturday he scored 11 of his 14 points in the second half as Jax State topped UT Martin and clinched a spot in the OVC Tournament field. He also added five rebounds, four assists and a block in the victory. Rackley began the week by with nine points, three rebounds, three assists and a block in a victory over Southeast Missouri.



NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Wins NCAA Tournament Game for Fourth-Year in a Row: For the fourth year in a row the OVC won an NCAA Tournament game, as No. 6 seed Murray State topped No. 11 seed Colorado State by a 58-41 margin. The victories in four-straight NCAA Tournaments is a first in OVC history (which dates back to 1948) and follows wins by Morehead State (2009), Murray State (2010) and Morehead State (2011). OVC teams are 24-64 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

OVC One of Just 9 Conferences (3 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Four Seasons: The OVC is one of just nine (9) Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past four years and one of just three non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10 and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

Postseason Success: The four-year winning streak in NCAA Tournament play is unprecedented in OVC history. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. In 2011 it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. This season it was Murray State who once again won, knocking off Colorado State 58-41 in the second round in a game played in Louisville.

Murray State Earns Highest Ever NCAA Tournament Seed for OVC School; Becomes First OVC Team to Be Higher Seed in Tournament Since Seeding Began in 1979: By earning a No. 6 seed in this year's NCAA Tournament, Murray State earned the highest-ever seed for an OVC team since the NCAA started seeding teams in 1979. Prior to this season the Racers No. 9 seed in the 1998 NCAA Tournament was the highest (the Racers lost to a Lamar Odom-led Rhode Island team in the tournament). With the No. 6 seed, it marks the first time since the seeding process began that the OVC has had a higher seed than its opponent in the NCAA Tournament and wore white jerseys.

The OVC All-Time in the CIT: Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each participated in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) this season. Last season Tennessee Tech played Western Michigan while Austin Peay took on Bradley in the 2009 event. This year Tennessee State lost at Mercer and Tennessee Tech lost at Georgia State. OVC teams are 0-4 all-time in CIT games. The CIT was established in 2009 with 16 teams in the field and that was expanded to 24 teams last season and to 32 teams this year.

Murray State Wins 2012 OVC Tournament Championship: Murray State won its 15th OVC Tournament Championship this season, knocking off No. 4 seed Tennessee Tech in the semifinals and besting No. 2 seed Tennessee State for the second time in as many weeks in the Championship Game. It marked the second title in the last three years for the Racers. MSU has also won OVC Tournament titles in 1951, 1964, 1988, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2010.

Record Crowds Come to 2012 OVC Tournament: The 2012 OVC Tournament saw the largest neutral site crowds ever in Nashville and the second-largest championship game attendance ever at a neutral site this year. For the semifinal games this year 5,142 fans attended the Murray State/Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State/Morehead State games. A day later 6,454 fans attended the Murray State/Tennessee State Championship game. That crowd was the largest ever for a neutral site OVC Tournament game in Nashville and the second-largest neutral site championship crowd ever (trailing only the 8,145 fans who saw the 1993 Championship in Rupp Arena in Lexington, Ky.) After debuting a new format and home for the OVC Tournament in 2011, the tournament once again returned to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville this year with the top eight men's and women's teams playing in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to last year's championship were upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

Murray State Wins 2012 OVC Regular Season Championship: Murray State finished the Conference season 15-1 and won the 2012 OVC Regular Season Championship, its 23rd overall title and third in a row, and earned No. 1 seed for the OVC Tournament. MSU has also won OVC Regular Season titles in 1951, 1954, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1988, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010 and 2011. The 23 titles are the most in OVC history; former member Western Kentucky has the second-most titles (19), while Morehead State's nine titles are the next most among active members.

Canaan Named Wooden All-American: Murray State junior **Isaiah Canaan** was one of just 10 players named to the prestigious John R. Wooden All-American Team following the season. Canaan was joined on the team by Marquette's Jae Crowder, Kentucky's Anthony Davis, Missouri's Marcus Denmon, Michigan State's Draymond Green, West Virginia's Kevin Jones, Creighton's Doug McDermott, Kansas' Thomas Robinson, Ohio State's Jared Sullinger and North Carolina's Tyler Zeller.

Canaan Named First-Team All-American by Sporting News: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was named a first-team All-American by the Sporting News following the regular season. Canaan, the OVC Player of the Year, was joined on the first-team by Kentucky's Anthony Davis, Michigan State's Draymond Green, Kansas' Thomas Robinson and Ohio State's Jared Sullinger.

Canaan Named Second-Team All-American by USBWA: For the second-straight year, the OVC has placed a player on the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-American second-team. Morehead State's Kenneth Faried was a selection last year and Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the team this season. He is one of just 10 total selections by the USBWA across the two teams.

The 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held Feb. 29 - March 3 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on OVCsports.TV. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 2 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 3 is at 1 p.m. and televised live on ESPN or ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 2 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is set for March 3 at 4:30 p.m. (ESPN3).

This marks the 18th time in 19 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

Canaan One of Five Finalists For Bob Cousy Award: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of five (5) finalists for the 2012 Bob Cousy Award, given to the top collegiate point guard by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The list had 60-plus candidates at the beginning of the season (including Tennessee State's **Wil Peters**) but was then narrowed to 11 candidates in February and to five in early March. The other finalists were North Carolina's Kendall Marshall (the eventual winner), Saint Mary's Matthew Dellavedova, Weber State's Damian Lillard and Kansas' Tyshawn Taylor.

Prohm Named Basketball Times National Coach of the Year: First-year Murray State head coach **Steve Prohm** was named the *Basketball Times* National Coach of the Year after leading Murray State to 31 victories, an OVC regular season and tournament championship and a Top 10 national ranking in his rookie season with the team.

Prohm Wins Inaugural Joe B. Hall Award: Murray State head coach **Steve Prohm** was named the winner of the inaugural Joe B. Hall Award by CollegeInsider.com. The award is given to the top first-year head coach at the Division I level. Prohm led Murray State to a 31-2 record, Top 10 national ranking, OVC regular season and tournament championship and NCAA Tournament appearance in his first year as MSU's head coach.

OVC Serves as Host for NCAA Tournament 2nd/3rd Rounds: The Ohio Valley Conference served as the host of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship Second/Third Rounds at Bridgestone Arena this March. The games were played on Friday, March 16 and Sunday, March 18. The eight teams who played in Nashville were Cincinnati, Florida State, Michigan, Ohio, St. Bonaventure, South Florida, Temple and Texas.

Murray State Ties OVC Record for Wins in a Season: Murray State finished the season with 31 victories, tying its own OVC record for most wins in a season set during the 2009-10 season.

Murray State Last Unbeaten in Division I in 2011-12: Murray State was the last undefeated team in Division I this season, going 23-0 before falling to Tennessee State on Feb. 9. The 23-game winning streak is the second longest by a Division I team this season (behind only Kentucky's 24-game streak).

Murray State Only Team Undefeated on the Road: Murray State was the only Division I team to go undefeated on the road this season. The Racers finished the road portion of its season 13-0 in true road games.

Murray State Had Most Road Wins Nationally During Regular Season: Murray State's 13 true road victories this season were the most of any Division I team during the regular season. Overall the 13 wins were second nationally to Robert Morris' 14 wins (RMU won 2 NEC Tournament games and 2 CIT games on the road during the postseason).

Murray State Finishes Season Ranked No. 12 in AP Poll, No. 16 in ESPN/USA Today Top 25: After starting the season 23-0 Murray State climbed to as high as No. 7 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll and No. 9 in the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 on Feb. 6. It marked the first Top 10 ranking for an OVC team since Western Kentucky was No. 7 in the final poll of the 1970-71 season; MSU was in the Top 10 for four total weeks. The Racers suffered its first loss of the season on Feb. 9 (72-68 to Tennessee State) and fell to No. 14 in the Coaches Poll and No. 16 in the AP Poll. The Racers climbed back into the Top 10 for three additional weeks at the end of the season before finishing the year No. 12 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25. The Racers cracked the Top 25 on Dec. 12, coming in at No. 24 in the AP poll, and debuted in the Coaches Poll on Dec. 19. When Murray State cracked the Top 25 it marked the first time an OVC team had been nationally-ranked since Murray State was No. 25 in the final AP poll of the 1997-98 season (which was released at the end of the regular season). Murray State is the first OVC team to be ranked for 15-straight weeks since the 1970-71 season (Western Kentucky was ranked in all 16 polls of that year). Murray State's No. 7 ranking on Feb. 6 was the highest in school history (its previous high was 16th, accomplished in both the 1950-51 and 1951-52 seasons). The highest ranking ever earned by an OVC men's basketball team is No. 3, accomplished by Western Kentucky in the 1948-49, 1953-54 and 1966-67 seasons.

OVC Teams Beating Ranked Teams: Although the OVC has had recent success against nationally-ranked teams in the NCAA Tournament (Murray State beat No. 21 Vanderbilt in 2010 and Morehead State beat No. 14 Louisville in 2011), prior to Murray State's win over No. 20/21 Memphis on Dec. 11, it had been 14 years since an OVC team had beat a nationally-ranked opponent during the regular season. That was when Murray State beat No. 12 Arkansas 94-83 on Dec. 25, 1997 in Puerto Rico. Murray State made it 2-0 against Top 25 teams this season when on Feb. 18 when the then No. 14-ranked Racers topped No. 16 Saint Mary's in the BracketBusters series. In addition Tennessee State topped Murray State on Feb. 9 when it was ranked No. 7; that was the first-ever victory over a Top 25 team for TSU at the Division I level.

Murray State Sets OVC Record for Longest Winning Streak in OVC History: Murray State 23-game winning streak this season (from the beginning of the year until Feb. 9) was the longest streak in OVC history. It bested a pair of 21-game streaks by Western Kentucky in each the 1953-54 and 1966-67 seasons. Below is a list of all winning streak of 15 games or longer in OVC history.

23-0 Start for Murray State Best in OVC History: Before losing its first game on Feb. 9, Murray State began the season 23-0 which was the best in OVC history and one of just five instances of an OVC school beginning the year 10-0 or better since the league was formed in 1948. It is the first since Western Kentucky started the year 21-0 in 1953-54 (that was the previous best start to a season for an OVC team). The other teams to start a season at least 10-0 are Western Kentucky in 1948-49 (15-0) and Murray State in each

Murray State Finishes Season No. 1 in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In the final CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll of the season Murray State remained No. 1 overall for the 12th-straight week, receiving 27 of a possible 31 first-place votes. The Racers are the first OVC team to ever be ranked No. 1 in that poll. The Racers first vaulted into the Mid-Major Top 25 on Nov. 28 of this season and moved up to 10th on Dec. 5 before its win at Memphis. Following the win over Memphis, the Racers jumped to second where they were for three weeks before becoming No. 1 on Jan. 2. Now in its 13th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Murray State's Canaan Named OVC Player of the Year, Prohm Coach of the Year and Long Defensive Player of the Year: Following the end of the regular season Murray State took home three of the four major OVC postseason awards. Junior **Isaiah Canaan** was named OVC Player of the Year after being the Freshman of the Year two years ago and a first-team selection last season. He is the 12th different Murray State player to earn that honor and first since 2003-04. Racers head coach **Steve Prohm** was named OVC Coach of the Year after leading the Racers to a national ranking and OVC Championship. It marks the third-straight year a Murray State coach has won the honor (Billy Kennedy won it each of the last two years). Murray State senior **Jewuan Long** was named Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the first Racer to earn that honor. The only non-Murray State player to win one of the four major awards was UT Martin's **Myles Taylor** who was named OVC Freshman of the Year.

Canaan Named to Midseason Oscar Robertson Trophy Watch List by USBWA: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of 20 players on the Oscar Robertson Trophy Watch List released on Feb. 6. The award is presented by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) and is given to the National College Player of the Year. Canaan was one of three players from non-BCS leagues on the list (the others were Creighton's Doug McDermott and Weber State's Damian Lillard).

Prohm Has Third-Best Start Ever for a First-Year Head Coach: In his first year as a collegiate head coach **Steve Prohm** was in some good company for best starts. Prohm started his career 23-0 this season with the Racers which is the third-best start for a Division I coach in his first season as a head coach. Prohm Named USBWA District Coach of the Year; Canaan Named to All-District Team: Murray State head coach **Steve Prohm** was named the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IV Coach of the Year. District IV includes all Division I schools in the state of Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida. In addition MSU junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was named 1 of 10 players to the USBWA All-District IV team.

Murray State's Prohm, TSU's Cooper Finalists for Jim Phelan & Hugh Durham Awards: Murray State head coach **Steve Prohm** and Tennessee State head coach **John Cooper** were two of 16 finalists for the 2012 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award and two of 21 finalists for the 2012 Hugh Durham Coach of the Year Award. Both awards are presented by CollegeInsider.com. The Jim Phelan award is given to the top coach nationally, and named after the legendary former coach at Mt. St. Mary's, while the Durham Award is given to the top Mid-Major Coach in the country and named after the legendary former Georgia coach. Prohm led Murray State to 23-straight wins, a national ranking and an OVC regular season and tournament championship this season. Cooper led TSU to 20 wins for the first time since 1978-79 this year.

Tennessee Tech's Murphy Scores 50: Tennessee Tech senior guard **Kevin Murphy** had a night to remember on Jan. 30 against SIUE. Murphy hit 16-of-21 field goals (6-of-9 from 3-point range) and was 12-of-14 at the free throw line for a school record 50 points. The 50 points are the most by any Division I player this season (and most since Jimmer Fredette scored 52 on March 11, 2011) and is one of just 11 50-plus point games in OVC history. It marked the first 50-point performance in the OVC since the 1991-92 season (20 years) and was just five points off the OVC single-game scoring record. Murphy Reaches 2,000-Point Plateau: During the OVC Tournament Tennessee Tech senior guard **Kevin Murphy** became just the 16th player in OVC history to score 2,000 or more points in a career. He reached the mark in the semifinals against Murray State and finished his career with 2,019 points, which was tied for 14th in OVC history.

TTU's Murphy and Dillard Third Nationally Among Top Scoring Duos: The Tennessee Tech duo of senior **Kevin Murphy** and junior **Jud Dillard** ranked third nationally as a scoring tandem in Division I basketball this season. Murphy led the OVC (and ranked 10th nationally) in scoring at 20.6 points/game while Dillard was third in the OVC (and 63rd nationally) at 17.3 points/game. Murray State ranked ninth in scoring margin (+12.5), ninth in 3-point percentage defense (29.2%), 11th in 3-point percentage (39.6%) and 21st in steals/game (8.4). Eastern Illinois ranked 18th in free throw percentage (75.7%), Eastern Kentucky was 15th in fewest turnovers allowed (10.8/game) and Morehead State was 13th in steals (8.5/game). Individually Tennessee Tech's **Kevin Murphy** ranked 10th in scoring (20.6 points/game) while teammate **Zac Swaney** was 24th in both assists (5.7/game) and steals (2.18/game). Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** was sixth in 3-point percentage (45.6%), 13th in 3-pointers made/game (2.97) and 24th in scoring (19.0 points/game).

SIUE Earns OVC Team Sportsmanship Award for Men's Basketball: SIUE was named the recipient of the 2011-12 Team Sportsmanship Award for both men's and women's basketball following the season. Voted on by the student-athletes and coaches of the respective sports, the team awards are bestowed upon the Conference squads deemed to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical behavior as outlined by the OVC and NCAA. Included in the areas for evaluation are the conduct of student-athletes, coaches, staff and administrators and fans. The 2011-12 school year marks the seventh year the team sportsmanship honors have been awarded. This marks the first award for the either SIUE basketball program and the second year in a row (and third overall) that a school has swept the awards.

OVC Announces Divisional Play for 2012-13: On Feb. 16 the OVC announced the plan for divisional play for men's and women's basketball beginning with the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 will give the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The sports of softball and volleyball will use schedules based on a divisional format but have yet to determine if those sports will formally recognize divisions. The sports of baseball, women's soccer and men's and women's tennis will not use divisional play because those sports currently have less than 12 participating teams. The East Division will include Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division will include Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. Some of the factors in determining the divisions included geography and balance while also being mindful of matchups and rivalries (both current and future). The final piece of divisional play will be to determine tournament seeding and bracketing. The OVC Championships sub-committee is studying those issues now and the Directors of Athletics will make a decision soon.

OVC Teams Finish 7-4 in ESPN Sears BracketBusters Series: OVC teams performed better than they ever had in the 10th annual Sears BracketBusters series this season. The 11 teams combined for a 7-4 overall record, the best in the seven years that every OVC team has competed in the series. It surpassed the previous best mark of 6-4 set a season ago. Nationally-ranked Murray State topped No. 16 Saint Mary's in a game that aired on ESPN (with Dick Vitale calling the game) and Austin Peay (Youngstown State), Eastern Kentucky (IPFW), Jacksonville State (Presbyterian), SIUE (Northern Illinois), Tennessee State (Miami (Ohio)) and Tennessee Tech (Coastal Carolina) also picked up victories. Now it's 10th year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that has been tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there were 142 teams from 16 conferences in the pool of teams that were selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games.

Regular Season Schedule Takes Slightly Different Format This Season: For the past six seasons and for 61 of the 63 years that basketball has been played in the OVC, the men's basketball schedule has been a double-round robin, meaning every league team played every other league team twice. That changes this year with the addition of SIUE to the regular season slate as the 11-team OVC will play a 16-game schedule instead of a 20-game round robin (which the league played from 2005-06 through 2007-08). With the 16-game schedule a team will play every other OVC school once, and play six of the 10 other schools twice (home and away) during the season. Each year there are only four teams that each school is not playing on a home and away basis. Several factors contributed to the switch to a 16-game schedule including creating more opportunity to schedule non-conference games and to have fewer games played during the month of December. The schedule's makeup (i.e. which teams played what teams twice) was determined by several factors including historical and traditional rivalries and geography/proximity of the teams. The only other previous seasons the league did not play a full round robin schedule were in 2003-04 and 2004-05 (the seasons after Jacksonville State and Samford first joined the league).

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 22nd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 363 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 445 for his career.

Proffitt Named to Capitol One Academic All-District® Team: Morehead State's **Ty Proffitt** has been named to the Capitol One Academic All-District® first-team for the second-straight year. A senior with a 3.82 grade point average in finance, Proffitt will now move on to the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-America® honors. To be eligible, student-athletes have to have a least a 3.30 GPA and have been at their institution for at least one year.

Prohm Named CollegeInsider.com Hugh Durham Mid-Season Coach of the Year: After leading Murray State to its best start in 75 years, Murray State Head Coach **Steve Prohm** was honored by CollegeInsider.com with recognition as the mid-season Hugh Durham Award honoree. The Hugh Durham award is presented annually to the top mid-major coach in NCAA D-I basketball. The award is named after Hugh Durham who was an icon in the game with coaching stops at Florida State, Georgia and Jacksonville. Prohm is in his first season as head coach, replacing Billy Kennedy who is now the head coach at Texas A&M. Kennedy was a finalist for the Durham Award in 2010. The Hugh Durham award is named after the first and only coach in the history of NCAA Division I basketball to lead two different schools to the NCAA Final Four for the first and only time in each school's history (Florida State University in 1972 and University of Georgia in 1983). Durham is the only coach in NCAA Division I history to be the all-time winningest coach at three different schools (Florida State, Georgia, and Jacksonville). He finished his career with 634 wins. The winner of the 2012 Hugh Durham Award will be announced on March 30 in New Orleans, site of the NCAA men's basketball championship.

OVC Against the SEC: Between the beginning of the 2000-01 season (when Tennessee Tech beat South Carolina) and the 2010 NCAA Tournament (when Murray State beat Vanderbilt) the OVC lost 71-straight games to SEC opponents. A year ago OVC teams were 0-8 against that league but this season has been different with OVC teams going 2-3 against SEC foes. That includes Tennessee State's win at South Carolina on Nov. 20 and Austin Peay's victory at Tennessee on Dec. 10.

Murray State Wins Great Alaska Shootout: Murray State traveled to Anchorage, Alaska the week of Thanksgiving and captured the championship at the 34th annual Great Alaska Shootout. The Racers topped host Alaska-Anchorage, San Francisco and Southern Miss on its way to the title. Junior Isaiah Canaan was named MVP of the event after averaging 25.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals/game at the event. Canaan scored 36 points (hitting 6-of-11 from 3-point range) in the overtime victory over Southern Miss in the title game. The 36 points was the ninth-best in Great Alaska Shootout history.

Canaan Named to Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team: Murray State junior guard **Isaiah Canaan** has been named to the 2011-12 Lou Henson Preseason All-America team by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Preseason All-American Team leads to The Lou Henson Award at the end of the season, which is presented to the top mid-major player in NCAA D-I basketball. The award is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State. He is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

The OVC Welcomes Two New Head Coaches: The OVC has two new head coaches this season, both of whom moved from assistant roles to the head spot on their respective teams. Murray State welcomes first-year head coach **Steve Prohm** to the top spot after he spent five years as an assistant coach with the Racers under Billy Kennedy. Long-time Tennessee Tech associate head coach **Steve Payne** moved to the head spot with the Golden Eagles after nine seasons under head coach Mike Sutton who retired after the end of the 2010-11 season. Prohm and Payne are two of the 25 new coaches at the Division I level who are head coaches for the first time (at any level) this season.

SIUE Ready for Full OVC Schedule This Season: On July 1, 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. This season marks the first for the Cougars playing a full (16-game) OVC schedule. SIUE is eligible for the OVC Regular Season Championship but since they have one year left in the reclassification process to Division I, are ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments until next season.

Addition of Belmont Gives OVC Record 12 Schools in 2012-13: On May 13, 2011, Belmont University accepted an invitation to join the Ohio Valley Conference on July 1, 2012. Belmont, located just nine miles north of the OVC headquarters, will play its final year in the Atlantic Sun Conference this season. The Bruins men's basketball team has made four NCAA Tournament appearances in the past six seasons, including finishing 30-5 (one of nine Division I teams with at least 30 wins) and earning a No. 13 seed in 2010-11. The addition of Belmont (and SIUE's eligibility for postseason play next year) will give the OVC a record 12 schools for the 2012-13 season.

The 2011-12 Season: The 2011-12 season marked the 64th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 63 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Former OVC Players in the NBA/NBDL: Entering the season there was only one former OVC player on a NBA roster. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his rookie season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. On Jan. 20, former Jacksonville State standout **Walker Russell** got the call up from the NBDL, going from the Fort Wayne Mad Ants to the Detroit Pistons. Russell was a NBDL All-Star a season ago. In April both **Lester Hudson** (UT Martin) and **James Singleton** (Murray State) had signed NBA contracts. There are also four former OVC players playing in the NBA Development League including former Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy), Tennessee State's **Bruce Price** (Dakota Wizards), Tennessee Tech's **Willie Jenkins** (Idaho Stampede) and UT Martin's **Reuben Clayton** (Reno Bighorns).

Tennessee Tech's Murphy Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2011-12 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Tennessee Tech senior **Kevin Murphy**, who was a first-team All-OVC selection a season ago. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Murray State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech having two selections apiece. Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, three players who were second-team selections and four players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. Murphy's 17.0 points/game last season ranked third in the league and helped the high-powered Tennessee Tech offense lead the OVC in scoring (74.6 points/game). His play helped the Golden Eagles to 20 victories for the first time since 2002-03 and a berth in the OVC Tournament Championship game. Although TTU came up short in that game, they were invited to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, marking the first postseason play for the program since 2001-02. Murphy also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 47.8 percent from the field in 33 total contests. In addition to Murphy, Austin Peay's **TyShwan Edmondson** and Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year were Southeast Missouri's **Leon Powell** and Tennessee State's **Robert Covington** and **Kenny Moore**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by Austin Peay's **Anthony Campbell**, Eastern Illinois' **Jeremy Granger**, Murray State's **Ivan Aska** and Tennessee Tech's **Zac Swansey**.

Austin Peay Picked as Preseason Favorites: In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Austin Peay received 10 first-place votes and was picked as the favorite for the 2011-12 season. It marks the first time since the 2007-08 season that the Governors have been picked as the preseason favorite (the team went on to win the OVC Championship that year). Austin Peay received 185 total points, which was four points ahead of Tennessee Tech, who received eight total first-place votes and were picked second. Defending regular season champion Murray State picked up three first-place votes and was picked third (169), Tennessee State was picked fourth (145), defending tournament champion Morehead State received the other first-place vote and was tabbed fifth (128) and was followed by Southeast Missouri (106), Eastern Kentucky (90), UT Martin (73), Eastern Illinois (67), Jacksonville State (40) and SIUE (27).

Preseason Predictions: Is being picked the preseason favorite always a good thing? Over the past 32 years of preseason polls that were available, the league's head coaches and sports information directors correctly picked the eventual OVC regular season champion 60.6 percent of the time, picking the correct winner 20 times over the past 33 years. Over the past 12 years, the preseason poll has correctly picked the winner six times. Last season the poll tabbed Murray State to win the regular season championship, which is did. That marked the first time in the last decade that the preseason poll had predicted the champion correctly in back-to-back years. This year the poll predicted Austin Peay, but Murray State won the championship.

Eastern Illinois concluded the 2011-12 season by losing a pair of games in the final week of the regular season...The Panthers started the week with a 75-39 loss at Morehead State but still had a shot at making the OVC Tournament field when the squad played at Eastern Kentucky on Saturday...A win over the Colonels would have put the Panthers in the field (and the Colonels out) but EIU came up short in the 86-74 loss...Senior Jeremy Granger finished his career in a Panthers uniform by averaging 21.0 points and 3.0 rebounds/game and hitting 60.7 percent (17-of-28) from the field and 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range...Granger finished his four-year career by connecting on 319-of-367 free throw attempts; his 86.9% ranks the fifth-best in OVC history...After starting the Conference season 2-1, EIU finished the year 3-10 in OVC games and missed the tournament field for the second year in a row (after advancing to the OVC semifinals three years ago)...As a team Eastern Illinois led the OVC in free throw percentage (75.7%) and ranked third in assists (13.2/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.0)...On Monday Eastern Illinois announced that Mike Miller's contract, which ends at the end of April, would not be renewed...EIU introduced Jay Spoonhour as its new head coach on April 9; Spoonhour is the son of legendary college coach Charlie Spoonhour.

After starting the OVC season 2-3 in league play, MSU closed the year by winning eight of its final 11 contests including four OVC games in a row...The Eagles did all of that after losing leading scorer Terrance Hill for the season due to injury against Austin Peay on Dec. 31...It proved to be one of the better coaching jobs for head coach Donnie Tyndall who had to replace NBA player Kenneth Faried and scorer Demonte Harper from last year's NCAA Tournament team but still managed to win 18 games overall...In the final week of the regular season MSU topped Eastern Illinois 75-39, its largest victory over a Division I opponent since beating Jax State by 40 points in Jan. 2010...Sophomore Drew Kelly finished the season by averaging 10.2 points/game (13.1 points/game in OVC play) which was tops on the team after Hill was lost for the season; overall Kelly had four 20-point outing on the season, and has scored in double figures in 13 of his last 15 games...Nationally the Eagles ranked 13th nationally in steals (8.5/game) and 29th nationally in free throw percentage (74.5%)...The Eagles finished the year ranked first in the OVC in rebounding defense (28.4/game), steals (8.5/game) and rebounding margin (+2.6).

Team Notes

In what proved to be a dream season, Murray State tied its own OVC record with 31 victories, won both the OVC regular season (its 23rd) and tournament (its 15th) championships, and spent 15 weeks in the national Top 25 including climbing as high as No. 7 in the nation polls (after beginning the year 23-0)...After avenging its only regular season loss of the season (to Tennessee State) by topping the Tigers at the end of the regular season and in the OVC Tournament, the Racers earned a No. 6 seed for the NCAA Tournament, which was the highest seed ever for an OVC team since the seeding process began in 1979...MSU topped No. 11 seed Colorado State in the NCAA Second Round which marked the fourth-straight win for an OVC team in the NCAAAs (and second for the Racers in the last three years)...The Racers season came to an end two days later with a loss to No. 3 seed Marquette...Murray State was 13-0 in true road games on the year, making them the only Division I team to go undefeated in road games in 2011-12...MSU finished the year ranked No. 12 in the AP and No. 16 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 polls...Isaiah Canaan, the OVC Player of the Year, was named an All-American by every outlet, including a first-team honor by The Sporting News and also being one of only 10 players named to the Wooden All-American Team...Following the year Canaan announced he would return to the Racers for his senior season in 2012-13...First-year head coach Steve Prohm was named Basketball Times National Coach of the Year and won the Joe B. Hall Award for top first-year head coach nationally.

Southeast Missouri finished the regular season 9-7 in OVC play which tied them with Tennessee Tech for fourth place, but after a tiebreaker the Redhawks earned the No. 5 seed for the OVC Tournament...Southeast went on to top No. 8 seed Eastern Kentucky 75-65 in the first round but saw its season come to an end with a 77-73 loss to Tennessee Tech in the quarterfinals...Southeast Missouri is now 8-10 all-time in OVC Tournament games...Tyler Stone, the transfer from Missouri, was named a second-team All-OVC selection as well as a OVC All-Newcomer selection following the season...Stone averaged 14.7 points and 7.3 rebounds/game during the season which ranked him ninth and third respectively in those categories...Nationally Stone ranked 39th in field goal percentage (53.0%) and finished the year with six double-doubles (fourth-most in the OVC)...Teammate Leon Powell tied for second in the OVC with eight double-doubles and ended his career with a 61.3% percent (298-of-486) field goal percentage, which ranked sixth all-time in OVC history...As a team the Redhawks ranked first in the OVC in field goal percentage (47.5%), rebounding (35.2/game), assists (14.9/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.1), second in rebounding margin (+2.5) and third in scoring (70.7 points/game), 3-point percentage (36.9%) and field goal percentage defense (43.9%).

Team Notes

Tennessee State was the only team in the country to defeat Murray State during the regular season, handing the Racers a 72-68 loss on Feb. 9 at the CFSB Center in Murray...The Tigers finished the regular season with an 11-5 OVC record which was second-best in the league...TSU topped Morehead State in the OVC Tournament semifinals but came up two points short of Murray State in the Championship after Robert Covington's last-second 3-point attempt just missed...Despite not making the NCAA Tournament the Tigers received a bid to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament and lost 68-60 at Mercer in the event, which was the team's first postseason appearance since 1993-94...TSU finished the year with 20 victories, marking the first time since the 1978-79 season the squad won 20 games during a year...Junior Robert Covington was named a first-team All-OVC selection after ranking second in the OVC in rebounding (7.9/game), third in scoring (17.8/game), third in 3-point percentage (44.8%), fourth in blocks (1.4/game), fifth in steals (1.5/game), seventh in field goal percentage (52.6%) and ninth in 3-pointers made (2.0/game)...In the team's home finale against Murray State, there were 10,125 fans at the Gentry Center, marking the largest basketball crowd in the building's history... Following the year head coach John Cooper resigned to take the head coaching job at Miami (Ohio); assistant coach Travis Williams was named the 16th head coach in Tennessee State history on April 13.

Tennessee Tech finished the year with a 9-7 record in OVC play, which tied them for fourth with Southeast Missouri...After the tiebreaker the Golden Eagles earned the No. 4 seed and a bye to the quarterfinals where in the OVC Tournament...Tech topped Southeast Missouri 77-73 in its first game in the event but was unable to upset Murray State for the second-straight year, losing to the eventual champions in the semifinals...Despite the loss TTU earned a postseason bid to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) for the second-straight year and lost at Georgia State in the first round of that event...Senior Kevin Murphy and junior Jud Dillard were each first-team All-OVC selections following the season...Murphy finished his career with 2,019 points which ranks tied for 14th in OVC history; Murphy is one of just 16 total OVC players to score more than 2,000 points in a career...Following the season he was selected to play in the Reese's College All-Star Game at the Final Four...Murphy finished the year ranked 10th nationally in scoring (20.6/game), including scoring 50 points in a game against SIUE (the most points by a DI player this season and one of just 11 50-point games in OVC history), while Dillard ranked 63rd in scoring (17.3) and 65th in rebounding (8.5)...The duo combined to average 37.9 points/game, which was the third-highest total by a teammate tandem nationally...Senior Zac Swansey finished the year ranked 24th nationally in both assists (5.8/game) and steals (2.18/game).
