THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

After a slow start in the opening week of the year, week No. 2 of the football season saw six Conference teams come away with victories, including a road victory and a neutral site win...The four losses included two losses to Football Bowl Subdivision teams (one of which was nationally-ranked) and a ranked Football Championship Subdivision team...This week's matchups include six home contests and the second OVC matchup of the season when Tennessee State travels to Clarksville to play Austin Peay on Saturday...That matchup is the first in the inaugural "Sgt. York Trophy" series, which is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee and awarded to the team with the best overall record in the quadrangular series...All six home matchups can be seen live on OVCSports.TV...One of the matchups features a pair of ranked teams as Illinois State (No. 15 in this week's FCS Coaches Poll) travels to Charleston to battle Eastern Illinois (ranked No. 13 in this week's SME Broadcasters Poll)...UT Martin senior RB Don Chapman is poised to make history this week as he needs just 10 yards to become the Skyhawk's all-time leading rusher...EKU senior RB Mark Dunn rushed for 122 yards in the Colonels win over Western Carolina last week and surpassed the 2,000-yard plateau (2,074) for his career in the process...JSU kicker Gavin Hallford earned OVC Specialist of the Week for the second straight week after tying his school record of four field goals for the second week in a row; after setting a new school record of 13 points in week No. 1, he scored 14 points in week No. 2 to establish a new record...Hallford currently ranked No. 1 nationally in field goals per game (4.00) and 10th in scoring (14 points/game)...His Gamecocks squad enters this week first nationally in turnover margin (+4.00), turnovers gained (9) and fumbles lost (0)...Austin Peay currently ranks first nationally in sacks allowed/game (0.00) and tackles for loss allowed/game (1.50)...Eastern Illinois is the only OVC team ranked this week, as UT Martin fell out of the polls after an 0-2 start; in the latest Sports Network poll, UT Martin fell to receiving votes but now three others teams - Eastern Kentucky, Austin Peay and Tennessee State - are receiving votes.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Derek White, RB • Sr., 5-9, 203 • Senoia, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

White posted the league's top rushing and top all-purpose game of the 2007 season in Tennessee Tech's 45-21 win over Cumberland. He rushed for 213 yards and one touchdown on 22 carries, an average of 9.7 yards per carry. He also caught four passes for 58 yards, giving him 271 all-purpose yards. He averaged 10.4 yards per touch. His totals included the sixth-highest rushing game in school history and the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history.

DEFENSIVE

Drew Robinson, LB • Sr., 6-2, 220 • Cedartown, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Robinson finished the day with two interceptions (one for a touchdown), one fumble recovery and 108 yards in interception returns in Jacksonville State's 33-19 win over Chattanooga. His 63-yard interception return from the end zone in the third quarter was his second career pick, ended a potential UTC scoring drive and led to a 35-yard field goal from to cut the Mocs lead to 16-9. His second interception was returned 45 yards for a touchdown to extend JSU's lead to 32-19 late in the game. Robinson's 108 yards in interception returns was more than any running back or receiver from either team.

SPECIALIST

Gavin Hallford, K • Jr., 6-1, 210 • Phenix City, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Hallford tied his own school record with four field goals, matching a record he set just one week again in earning Specialist honors for the second straight week. He hit from 29, 33, 35 and 36 yards. Hallford also broke his own school record (also set last week) for points in a single game by a kicker with 14, in helping the Gamecocks to a 33-19 win over Chattanooga.

CO-NEWCOMER

Kevin Cook, P • R-Fr., 6-2, 184 • Libertyville, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Cook was a standout on special teams for Eastern Illinois in the team's 52-6 loss at Purdue on Saturday. He had seven punts, averaging 47.7 yards per punt with a long punt of 61 yards. He had one punt downed inside the 20 and two long punts for touchbacks as the Panthers kicked away from the Boilermakers' All-American candidate Dorian Bryant. For the year Cook is averaging 47.3 yards per punt after two games.

CO-NEWCOMER

Justin Kraemer, P/K • Fr., 5-7, 170 • Smyrna, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

Kraemer averaged 42.5 yards per punt and also scored nine points by kicking a 46-yard field goal and all six of his PAT attempts. He handled all of Tech's kicking duties in a 45-21 win over Cumberland. He punted four times and averaged 42.5 yards with a long of 60 and two downed inside the Bulldogs' 20-yard line. He made a career-long 46-yard field goal, and he averaged 54.1 yards on eight kickoffs.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Sports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVC Sports.TV. The venture with XOS Technologies allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season. In just two weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 225 kickoffs in two games and only 14 of those went for touchbacks (6.2%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 152 kickoffs and 16 touchbacks (10.5%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list (152). He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks eighth in OVC history for career receptions.

Fletcher Ties Austin Peay Mark: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Hallford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks: It is not rare to see a kicker made a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Hallford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Hallford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Hallford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). After two weeks Hallford, who has earned OVC Specialist of the Week twice this season, is 10th nationally in scoring (14 points/game) among all position players (second among kickers-only) and first in field goals per game (4.00).

Jax State Keeps Interception Streak Alive: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, ranking first nationally in turnover margin (+4) and third in passes intercepted (5) among other defensive stats. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU has intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and possibly an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and this season it has been **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga).

Chapman Just 10 Yards Away from UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss and 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is just 10 yards away from tying the Skyhawk all-time rushing record (4,033) currently held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman currently has 4,023 yards, which is seventh all-time in OVC history, and is just 1,126 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list. He will have a shot to

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break the UTM all-time record on Sept. 15 when UT Martin plays at Central Arkansas.

Three OVC Players on Payton & Buchanan Watch Lists: Three OVC players were on the preseason watch lists for *The Sports Network's* Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan Awards given to the nation's top offensive and defensive player respectively. Tennessee-Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** was one of 16 players on the Payton Watch List while Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** were two of the 16 players named to the Buchanan Watch List. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. There will be updates to the Watch Lists Payton and Buchanan watch in October and November before a final ballot is settled on. Ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

That's A Crowd: OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds this season. When Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game. On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic.

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team with the best record against

the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of September 1, nine former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is one who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the Newcomer of the Year award.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

Tiebreaker Procedures: The participants in the 2007 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 18. In the event of a tie for the OVC Championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties and to determine the league's NCAA playoff representative.

TWO-WAY TIES

- 1.) A two-way tie shall exist only if the tied teams have the same number of losses.
- 2.) Should two teams have the same number of losses, and the two teams played each other during the regular season, the winner of the head-to-head contest shall be the league's postseason representative.
- 3.) If the two tied teams have the same number of losses, but did not play each other during the regular season, the following procedure shall be utilized to break the tie:
 - 3a.) A comparison of each team's head-to-head record against the team occupying the highest position in the regular-season standings that each team has played. If one team won its game against that team, the winning team shall be declared the representative.
 - 3b.) Should the procedure outlined in Item a. fail to break the tie, the process will continue to the next-place team and beyond until the tie is broken.
 - 3c.) When arriving at another group of tied teams, composite records between the tying teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.
 - 4.) If the procedures described previously fail to break the tie, the representative shall be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

- 1.) A multiple tie (three or more teams) shall exist only if the tied teams have the same number of losses.
- 2.) If all of the teams involved in the multiple tie played each other during the regular season, then the composite records among the tied teams shall be compared to break the tie.
- 3.) If the process outlined in Step 2 reduces the tie to a tie among two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula shall then be utilized.
- 4.) If not all of the tied teams played each other during the regular season, or if step 2 does not break or reduce the tie, the following procedure shall be utilized:
 - 4a.) A comparison of each of the tied teams' head-to-head record against the team occupying the highest position in the regular-season standings that each team has played. If one team won its game against that team, the winning team shall be declared the representative.
 - 4b.) Should the procedure outlined in Item a. fail to break the tie, the process will continue to the next-place team and beyond until the tie is broken.
 - 4c.) When arriving at another group of tied teams, composite records between the tying teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.
 - 5.) If the procedures described previously fail to break the tie, the representative shall be determined by a blind drawing.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 76 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 66 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (43) and Tennessee Tech (38). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

CHAPMANLOOKSTO MAKE HISTORY

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech continues its favorable early season schedule, with the second of three straight home games (and four of five in a row at home). The Golden Eagles are also playing for a Thursday night for the third straight week; the team opens the season with five straight games on Thursday night. The meeting between the two teams is the first-ever, as Concordia is only in its third year of football.

SCOUTING CONCORDIA: Concordia, located in Selma, Ala., is only in its third season of football, having started the program in 2005. The Hornets, a historically black college, compete as an independent school in the NAIA ranks. The team has already played three games this season, losing 30-14 at Stillman College in week No. 1, topping Belhaven College 32-19 on Sept. 1 and losing to a good West Alabama squad (28-21) last Saturday. The team will only play two home games this season, Sept. 22 vs. Morehouse and Oct. 13 against Webber International.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: The Golden Eagles opened the home season with a 45-21 win over Cumberland University in Watson Brown's debut at Tucker Stadium. It was quite the offensive performance for Brown's team who lost in week one at Eastern Illinois. Senior RB Derek White put up the OVC's top rushing (213) and all-purpose (271) game of the season. White carried the ball 22 times and averaged 9.7 yards per carry while scoring a touchdown. He also caught four passes for 58 yards and averaged 10.4 yards per offensive touch. He had the sixth-highest single-game rushing total in school history and the fifth-best single-game all-purpose total. It marked White's sixth career 100-yard plus rushing game; Tech is 5-1 all-time when he hits the century mark. He was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts. He wasn't the only Golden Eagle, however, to put up impressive offensive numbers. Senior WR Larry Shipp created excitement from the start, returning the opening kickoff 87 yards for a touchdown; it marked the first time in 215 games (a span of 20 years), that Tech had returned a kickoff for a touchdown. In all, Shipp scored three touchdowns and finished with 215 all-purpose yards (132 on kick returns, and four catches for 83 yards). Shipp has now caught a pass in 34 consecutive games, and is eighth in OVC history in career receptions (152). QB Lee Sweeney had his seventh 200-yard plus passing game of his career, finishing with 214 yards and a pair of scores. With all the offense, freshman kicker Justin Kraemer was busy, and his performance earned him Co-Newcomer of the Week honors. Kraemer, who is also the team's punter, averaged 42.5 yards per punt (including a long of 60), made all six of his PAT tries and hit a 46-yard field goal. Junior DB Maurice Smith led TTU in tackles for the second week in a row, netting 11 stops including a tackle for loss.

GAME NOTES: In a battle of coaches in the first year at their respective programs, Samford and Presbyterian will do battle for the first time in 73 years when the teams battle on Thursday night. The squads played in each 1933 and 1934 with the Bulldogs outscoring the Blue Hose by a combined 56-19. The two teams are scheduled to meet next year in Clinton, S.C. Samford is 123-6-4 all-time at Seibert Stadium.

SCOUTING PRESBYTERIAN: The Blue Hose are in their first year as a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) squad; the team will eventually be a full member of the Big South Conference. Already accepted by the conference, the team will play a full Big South schedule but will not be eligible for a conference championship until they reach full Division I status, which will happen at the beginning of the 2011 season. After a season-opening loss at nationally-ranked Furman, the Blue Hose dominated lower-division Pikeville College last week, winning 58-7. The 51-point victory was the ninth largest margin in school history and the squad set or tied five different team records during the contest.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: After opening the season and the Pat Sullivan Era with a victory, the Bulldogs faced a tough task last week in FBS No. 21 Georgia Tech. The Ramblin Wreck showed why it is one of the nation's top programs in winning 69-14. The game marked the first time in the program's history than Samford had played a nationally-ranked FBS opponent. Through two games a pair of Bulldogs players have put up good numbers and are moving up Samford's all-time statistical leaders chart. QB Jefferson Adcock currently ranks eighth in total offense (4,066 yards) and WR Jeff Moore is third in receiving (142 receptions). Moore had six catches for 90 yards worth of offense against Tech; he caught a 34-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter as Samford extended its streak of consecutive scoring games to 67. Defensively, junior LB Rodney Shephard is making the tackles when needed, as he currently leads all FCS players with 9.50 solo tackles per game. He had yet to make an assisted tackle this season. As a team Samford has been able to stop the pass, allowing only 82 yards of passing per game, the fourth best total nationally.

GAME NOTES: The "Battle of the Bluegrass" takes place for the 83rd time on Saturday when the two rivals meet in Bowling Green. Since 1946 the teams have played at least once in every season except for the 2001 and 2002 seasons, including many fierce OVC battles with WKU was a member of the Conference (1948-81, 1999-00). That could change once Western is a full member of the Sun Belt Conference (2009), as SBC rules will not allow one of their teams to play a road game at a FCS team. Eastern came out on top last season (26-21) in Richmond, snapping a four-game losing streak in the series. The Colonels last won in Bowling Green in the 1998 season (27-16). Both teams lost to FBS teams from the Southeastern Conference in week one and each evened its record with a victory during week No. 2. WKU will be trying to break an attendance record at Smith Stadium; the previous high was 20,428 for an EKV-WKU game, which occurred during the first year after the stadium was built.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: After a season-opening loss to Kentucky, the Colonels regrouped last week with 326 yards rushing in a 45-21 win over Western Carolina, the most in five years under head coach Danny Hope. Bobby Washington rushed for a career-high 133 yards and scored twice on only 17 carries (7.6 yards/carry) and finished the game with 212 all-purpose yards. He took a lateral 67 yards for EKV's first score and later returned a kickoff 49 yards and caught a swing pass for 33 yards. Working as a duo, the team's other RB, Mark Dunn, rushed for 122 yards on the night and eclipsed the 2,000-yard career rushing mark with an 8-yard carry in the second quarter; he now has 2,074 yards for his career. It marked the first time since the 2003 season that the Colonels had two players with more than 100 yards rushing in the same game; that year Terry Ennis (123) and C.J. Hudson (113) did so in a game against Murray State. The squad did go to a new signal-caller, as Allan Holland took the start at quarterback and was 8-of-12 for 101 yards and a touchdown as well as rushing for 28 yards. It marked the first time since Nov. 20, 2004 (a string of 23 games) that Josh Greco had not been the starting QB. Greco did make an appearance and was 1-of-6 for seven yards. Defensively, junior safety Zach Denton picked off two passes against Western Carolina, marking the fourth time in the past five games he has had at least one interception. One of his picks ended up leading to an EKV touchdown. He also blocked a Western Carolina field goal attempt and finished the game with six tackles. As a team, the Colonels rank third nationally in interceptions (5).

SCOUTING WESTERN KENTUCKY: Western Kentucky enters its first year in the reclassification process from Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) to a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team. The Hilltoppers will be full member of the Sun Belt Conference in 2009 but will play as an independent in the meantime. After a 49-0 loss to nationally-ranked Florida to start the season, the team took a step back and beat NAIA foe West Virginia Tech 87-0. The 'Toppers scored a FBS-record 49 points in the first quarter as well as setting school records for points in a game and margin of victory. The squad was just three yards shy of the WKU record for fewest yards allowed (WVU Tech was limited to just 15 yards on the day).

GAME NOTES: Saturday's contest, the 96th meeting between the in-state rivals, should be a good game and one of the best among FCS teams this week. The matchup features a pair of nationally-ranked teams and a lot of emotion involved as Illinois State topped Eastern Illinois twice last season, including eliminated the Panthers from the playoffs with a 24-13 win in Charleston in the first round. ISU has won five in a row in the series dating back to the 2003 season; EIU last won in 2002, a 45-10 home victory. The series dates back to 1901, a 28-0 Eastern Illinois victory.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE: The Redbirds are fresh off a 43-17 victory over another OVC school last week, as Illinois State topped Murray State in Normal. ISU has played its first two games of the season at home (they lost to Drake in the season-opener) and will make its road debut this week. Against the Racers, senior RB Rafael Rice (106) and sophomore RB Parrish Fisher (103) each had over 100 yards on the ground, becoming the first ISU duo to accomplish that feat in three seasons. Rice, who scored two touchdowns, has hit the 100-yard plateau in both games this season. Illinois State is ranked No. 15 in this week's FCS Coaches Poll.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois, ranked No. 13 in this week's SME Broadcasters poll, stepped out of FCS competition last to battle FBS Purdue, the alma mater of Panther head coach Bob Spoo. Despite not having a great offensive output against the Boilermakers, redshirt freshman Kevin Cook had another outstanding game in earning OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week honors. Cook punted seven times against Purdue, averaging 47.7 yards per punt with a long of 61 yards. He downed one inside the 20-yard line and had two other long punts go for touchbacks. After just two games this season he is averaging 47.3 yards per punt, which puts him fourth nationally among FCS players. Senior LB Donald Thomas, the reigning OVC Defensive Player of the Year, made 10 tackles at Purdue, including seven solo stops. He had two goal line tackles during an EIU stand and was credited with a pass break-up. WR Micah Rucker caught six passes for 74 yards on Saturday. After two contests he ranks fifth nationally in receiving yards/game (121.50), third in total receiving yards (143) and 11th in receptions per game (7.50). EIU, which is ranked in all the major polls this week, has been ranked for 22 straight weeks dating back to the 2005 season.

GAME NOTES: Indiana State plays its second OVC opponent in as many weeks, this time challenging Southeast Missouri on Saturday night. The Redhawks play their second straight home game and were 38-17 winners of Southwest Baptist in last week's home-opener. The meeting is the sixth in the all-time series but first in eight seasons. The Sycamores were 34-13 winners the last time the teams played (Oct. 16, 1999). Southeast defensive coordinator Tim McGuire is a former Indiana State head coach (1998-2004). Redhawks center Paul McGuire, Coach McGuire's son, played at Indiana State previously.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE: The Sycamores lost to another OVC school, Austin Peay, last week by a 32-17 margin at home. That came one week after losing to FBS Indiana on the road. ISU had an early lead on the Governors but could not hold on in falling to 1-23 in three years under head coach Lou West. QB Reilly Murphy was 13-of-25 through the air for 164 yards and a touchdown. He was intercepted once and sacked once and rushed for 43 yards on 12 carries.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: After a tough game with Cincinnati in their opener, the Redhawks played Division II Southwest Baptist this past week and got in the win column after rolling to a 38-17 victory. Junior RB Timmy Holloman carried the ball 19 times for 203 yards (10.7 yards per carry) and scored three touchdowns (from 20, 66 and 31 yards). But the highlight of the game came from sophomore defensive back Eddie Calvin, who picked off a Southwest Baptist pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. The 100-yard return set a Southeast Missouri record and tied the OVC record which had been accomplished two other times. Calvin became the 26th person in FCS history to return an interception 100 yards for a score. He also made seven tackles and had three pass break-ups. Sophomore kicker/punter Doug Spada kicked a career-long 49-yard field goal and punted the ball five times for an average of 38 yards. Redshirt freshman Chris Nelson made five tackles, including a tackle for loss of 10 yards, forced a fumble and had two interceptions in his second collegiate game. Junior QB Victor Anderson was 4-of-8 for 55 yards and a touchdown through the air and rushed the ball 16 times for 90 yards; however, he was sacked six times and finished the game with 29 net rushing yards.

GAME NOTES: Murray State renews an old rivalry this weekend when it battles Lambuth for the first time in 72 years. The squads first played in 1924 and played for 11 consecutive seasons before discontinuing the rivalry; Murray has won all 11 previous meetings. It will be the home opener for the Racers at Stewart Stadium and first for the program on the stadium's brand new FieldTurf playing surface.

SCOUTING LAMBUTH: Lambuth, a member of the NAIA, lost to NAIA preseason No. 5 Saint Xavier in the opening week of the season before winning a thrilling 48-44 game at Union College over the weekend. The two teams combined for 800 yards of total offense in addition to 440 yards on kick returns. The Eagles racked up 451 yards of offense, with backup QB Mark Kelly throwing for 207 yards (12-of-18, 2 touchdowns).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: After starting the season at FBS No. 10 Louisville, the Racers had to play their second ranked team, this time at the FCS level, this past week, losing 43-17 at No. 17 Illinois State. In that game sophomore safety Taylor Lanigan had 13 tackles (7 solo) to lead the way for Murray State. Offensively, redshirt freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt paced the offense, completing 21-of-36 passes for 237 yards and a touchdown. He was also the Racers leading rusher, scampering for 57 yards on 22 carries. Ehrhardt has not thrown an interception in eight quarters this season and finished the ISU game with 294 all-purpose yards. Despite losing, the Racers did out-gain the Redbirds in total yards (422 to 318). WR Rod Harper has now caught a pass in 18 consecutive games, and has 11 career touchdowns as a Racer.

GAME NOTES: The Tigers and Governors will meet on Saturday in the second OVC matchup of the season and in the inaugural Sgt. York Trophy matchup; the trophy is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee and will go to the team with the best record in the quadrangular series during the year. The two teams have played nine times previously but not since the 1996 season, the last year Austin Peay was in the OVC before taking a 10-year hiatus and re-joining the league this year. It will be Austin Peay's first OVC game in 3,892 days. Tennessee State won the last matchup and the Tigers enjoy a 6-3 lead in the all-time series. With a win, Austin Peay would start a season 3-0 for the first time since 1983.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: After a loss in week No. 1, Tennessee State regrouped and defeated Jackson State 16-13 in the Southern Heritage Classic played at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. Junior kicker Eric Benson booted the game-winning field goal as time expired to lift the Tigers to the victory. QB Antonio Heffner was named MVP of the Classic after completing 18-of-31 passes for 232 yards and a touchdown; he also rushed for 54 yards on 12 attempts. He led the Tigers on the fourth quarter drive that resulted in Benson's kick to win the game. LB Kellen Woodward, a transfer from Western Michigan, had nine tackles (three solo) and a tackle for loss in the game. Another LB - Remond Willis - finished with eight tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and three quarterback hurries. Senior All-American Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie was not given credit but for one tackle, but he did place a 22-yard field goal attempt in the fourth quarter help lead TSU to the victory; Jackson State's kicker had hit from 50-yards out in the third quarter.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay remained the only OVC team unbeaten on the season, winning 32-17 at Indiana State. The Govs are now 2-0 for the first time since the 2002 season. In that contest senior RB Chris Fletcher continued to impress, as he ran the ball 23 times for 160 yards (7.0 yards/carry) and scored three touchdowns. His first score of the game put him at the top of the APSU career touchdowns and points scored lists. He has now topped 100 yards in eight straight games dating back to last season. Fletcher currently ranks seventh nationally in rushing yards per game (145.50) and fifth in scoring (15 points/game). Senior QB Mark Cunningham continues to be efficient, as he now ranks eighth nationally in passing efficiency (172.50). He was 13-of-21 for 140 yards and a touchdown against Indiana State. The team's offensive line has been going a great job protecting Cunningham and Fletcher, as APSU ranks first nationally in sacks allowed/game (0.00) and tackles for loss allowed/game (1.50). First-year head coach Rick Christophel is the first Austin Peay coach to start his career 2-0 since Emory Hale in 1918. Defensively, Josh Hackett picked off two ISU passes last week, also made six tackles (four solo) and had two tackles for loss. The Governors offense has now amassed 400 or more yards in both games this season.

GAME NOTES: UT Martin will travel to Conway, Ark. to battle Central Arkansas for the 11th time in school history and second time in three years. The teams played every year from 1958 to 1966 and the rivalry was renewed to years ago when the Skyhawks came out on top of an exciting game, 35-34.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: The Skyhawks fell to 0-2 on the season and dropped out of the Top 25 with a 51-44 loss to Missouri State last Thursday night. It marked the first time since 2004 that the team had opened the season with back-to-back losses and the team is now 41-34-3 in season home openers. UTM scored 24 points in the fourth quarter, including a field goal with 55 seconds left, but could not recover the final on-sides kick attempt. The 44 points was the most UT Martin had ever scored in a loss. Senior RB Don Chapman rushed for 111 yards on 23 carries (4.8 per carry) and is now just 10 yards away from the Skyhawk all-time rushing record. The 100-plus yard effort was the 16th of his career. All-purpose back Jessie Burton continued to be a threat on all sides of the ball, as he once again played wide receiver, defensive back and kick returner. Burton racked up 267 all-purpose yards on the night (the second highest total in the OVC this season). Burton had a rush attempt for 19 yards, two catches for 19 yards, 229 yards on nine kickoff returns and made two solo and one assisted tackle on defense. Burton currently ranks ninth nationally in all-purpose yards per game (199.00). Junior kicker Tom Hansen also had another good game, hitting three field goals (17, 19 and 32 yards) and making three extra point attempts. He is a perfect 5-for-5 on field goals this season. Junior DB Dante Harrold made 12 tackles (8 solo) in the contest. Sophomore Dexter Anoka made his second start of the season and was 19-of-29 for 274 yards. It marked the first time since the 2004 season that a UTM quarterback had more than 200 yards passing in a single game. Anoka is now in the top 40 nationally in total offense (230.50 yards/game).

SCOUTING CENTRAL ARKANSAS: The Bears, who are reclassifying from Division II to Division I, are in their first seasons as members of the Southland Conference. The team opened the season with a 28-7 loss to FBS school Louisiana Tech and were nearly winners a week ago, falling by three points (31-28) at Northwestern State in its inaugural Southland contest. UCA led 21-7 at halftime but Northwestern State scored on three of its first four possessions of the second half and nailed a 35-yard field goal as time expired. QB Nathan Brown completed 12-of-18 passes for 157 yards and the running back tandem of Leonard Ceasar and Brent Grimes combined for 147 yards rushing.

GAME NOTES: The Gamecocks and Tigers will be doing battle on Saturday for the first time in 70 years. The teams have not played since Memphis bested Jax State 46-0 on Oct. 29, 1937. The matchup marks the second straight week an OVC school has played in the Liberty Bowl Stadium; Tennessee State played a neutral site contest there a week ago. JSU head coach Jack Crowe and Memphis head coach Tommy West were assistant coaches together at Clemson from 1986-88. There Crowe served as the offensive coordinator while West was the outside linebackers coach; the duo was part of three straight ACC Championships and three bowl appearances. Jacksonville State is 3-9 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams. The team topped Northeast Louisiana (later named Louisiana-Monroe) in 1994, Louisiana-Lafayette in 2000, Arkansas State in 2001. The program has lost its last four games to FBS squads.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: The Gamecocks were 33-19 winners a week ago in their home opener, topping Chattanooga. With the win the squad improved to 41-18-3 all-time in home openers and 6-2 in home openers under Jack Crowe. The team also improved to 27-4 under Crowe when scoring 3 or more points. Junior kicker Gavin Halford continued his great start to the season by tying the school record for field goal in a game (4) that he sat a week ago; Halford also established a new record for points by a kicker in a game (14), topping a record he had set the previous week (13). Halford ranks first nationally in field goal per game (4.00) and is 10th in scoring (14 points/game). He was named OVC Specialist of the Week for the second straight week for his accomplishment. Drew Robinson was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after intercepting two passes - one of which he returned for a touchdown, recovering a fumble and picking up 108 yards in interception returns. Robinson intercepted one pass in the UTC end zone and returned it 63 yards (it led to a JSU field goal) and later returned a second interception 45 yards for a touchdown to ice the game. His 108 yards in interception returns was more yards of offense than any running back or receiver on either team produced all day. Jax State has now returned an interception for a touchdown in four straight games dating back to last season. JSU's ranks first nationally in turnover margin (+4), turnovers gained (9) and fumbles lost (0) and is fourth in fumbles recovered (4). The team will be without the services of WR Tauren Rhetta, who is almost certainly out after suffering an injury in the UTC matchup. The team has decided to start junior QB Cedric Johnson over Matt Hardin this week.

SCOUTING MEMPHIS: The Tigers opened the season with a 23-21 loss to Ole Miss. The squad was scheduled to play at Arkansas State a week ago, but after nearly a three hour inclement weather delay, the game was postponed until later this month. The Tigers are led by QB Martin Hankins, a transfer from Southeastern Louisiana in his second year with the program, who completed 41-of-60 passes for 343 and a touchdown in the loss to Ole Miss.
