THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Week three of the football season saw the second Conference game of the season, as Austin Peay and Tennessee State renewed a rivalry that had been dormant since 1996...In what was the inaugural Sgt. York Trophy game, Tennessee State blocked a point-after attempt in overtime and later scored and kicked an extra point to top the Governors in thrilling fashion, 33-32...Tennessee State now sits atop the OVC standings with Eastern Illinois (1-0)...EIU suffered a 24-21 loss to No. 15 Illinois State on Saturday...Murray State picked up its first win of the season, topping Lambuth 48-13 at home...Southeast Missouri won for the second week in a row and is now 2-1 overall, the same record that Austin Peay, Samford, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech also have after three weeks of play...Austin Peay sophomore LB Daniel Becker was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network after his outstanding performance last week in a 1-point loss to Tennessee State; Becker had a career-high 19 tackles, forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a tackle-for-loss during the game...Tennessee Tech senior RB Derek White tied the OVC record for rushing touchdowns in a game, scoring five last week in a win over Concordia...UT Martin senior RB Don Chapman became his school's all-time rushing leader at Central Arkansas last week; he now has 4,127 career rushing yards and has an outside chance of setting the OVC all-time rushing record this season (he needs 1,022 more yards)...This week's games features three OVC matchups, including Eastern Kentucky at Jacksonville State, Southeast Missouri at Samford and UT Martin at Austin Peay (in another Sgt. York battle)...EIU and TSU will play road non-conference contests...Eastern Illinois remains the only team ranked in this week's national polls; the Panthers are No. 20 in the Sports Network and SME Network Broadcasters polls and No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll...Tennessee State received votes in the Sports Network poll and was the only other OVC school getting votes this week.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Derek White, RB • Sr., 5-9, 203 • Senoia, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

White tied the OVC record and set two school records when he scored five rushing touchdowns in Tennessee Tech's 55-7 win over Concordia College on Thursday. The senior tailback rushed for 194 yards on 23 carries and also caught five passes for 42 yards, finishing the game with 236 all-purpose yards. He scored two touchdowns from the one-yard line, two from the two and once on a 46-yard run. The OVC record he matched had been done twice previously, but not since the 1996 season. He also set the TTU record for most touchdowns rushing and most points scored (30). It was his seventh career 100-yard rushing game and his fourth 200-yard all-purpose game. This marks the second straight week White has earned the Player of the Week award.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Daniel Becker, LB • So., 6-3, 241 • Brentwood, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Becker recorded a career-best 19 tackles, including 13 solo stops, in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Saturday. In addition, he forced one fumble and recovered another. Becker also had a tackle for loss for three yards. The 19 tackles were the most in the OVC so far this season.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Shaun Richardson, DE • Sr., 6-3, 250 • St. Louis, Mo. • Tennessee State

Despite playing with a strep t throat, Richardson made huge impact in Tennessee State's 33-32 overtime victory over Austin Peay. He finished with five tackles (4 solo), two sacks (for a loss of 16 yards), four tackles for a loss of 20 yards, had one quarterback hurry, forced two fumbles and returned a fumble recovery for a 73-yard touchdown. On one single play, Richardson forced the fumble, recovered it and outraced everyone for the 73-yard touchdown to put TSU up 10-7 in first half.

SPECIALIST

Eric Benson, K • Jr., 5-10, 189 • Rowlett, Texas • Tennessee State

For second straight week, Benson's foot makes the difference for Tennessee State. A week after kicking the game-winning field goal as time expired against Jackson State, Benson was 2-of-3 in PAT kicks and 2-of-2 in field goal attempts in the Tigers 33-32 overtime victory over Conference foe Austin Peay. His career-best 43-yard field goal with nine seconds remaining in regulation tied the game at 26 and forced overtime. His PAT kick in overtime proved to be the game-winner.

NEWCOMER

Chris Evans, RB • RS-Fr., 6-0, 197 • Alexandria, Ala. • Samford

Evans rushed for a career-high 174 yards on 20 carries in Samford's 34-24 win over Presbyterian on Thursday night. He averaged 8.7 yards per carry. Evans, a transfer from UAB, sealed the win for the Bulldogs with a career-long 51-yard touchdown run with 3:46 to go in the fourth quarter.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCSports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with XOS Technologies allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In just three weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 316 kickoffs in 28 games and only 16 of those went for touchbacks (5.1%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 239 kickoffs and 29 touchbacks (12.1%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest: When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyronne Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10th year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the squad's 28-22 win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game: Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time a woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week: For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS this season, trailing only the 26 that Matt Loucks of Fordham recorded on Sept. 8. Becker is currently tied for fifth nationally in solo tackles (21) and is 14th in total tackles (35). Jacksonville State's Drew Robinson earned National Defensive Player of the Week honors from a trio of outlets on Sept. 10.

White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Tennessee Tech senior running back Derek White has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four

passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record also held by Austin Peay's Daniel Williams (1996) and Youngstown State's Patrick Wicks (1981).

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history (4,127). He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman now ranks seventh all-time in OVC history, and is just 1,022 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list.

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Jax State Keeps Interception Most Likely an NCAA Record: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The steak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list (152). He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks eighth in OVC history for career receptions.

Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Halford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks: It is not rare to see a kicker made a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Halford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Halford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Halford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). After two weeks Halford, who has earned OVC Specialist of the Week twice this season, is 10th nationally in scoring (14 points/game) among all position players (second among kickers-only) and first in field goals per game (4.00).

Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Jacksonville State linebacker was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chattanooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception

back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

Three OVC Players on Payton & Buchanan Watch Lists: Three OVC players were on the preseason watch lists for *The Sports Network's* Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan Awards given to the nation's top offensive and defensive player respectively. Tennessee-Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** was one of 16 players on the Payton Watch List while Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** were two of the 16 players named to the Buchanan Watch List. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. There will be updates to the Watch Lists Payton and Buchanan watch in October and November before a final ballot is settled on. Ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

That's A Crowd: OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds this season. When Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game. On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic.

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team with the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After one game in the series, Tennessee State (1-0) sets atop the Sgt. York Standings, after a one-point win at Austin Peay.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup oc-

curred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Govs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of September 13, 10 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is one who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the Newcomer of the Year award.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 76 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 66 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (43) and Tennessee Tech (38). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

TTU has won the last two in the series with the Racers, with Murray State last winning in 2004. Tech has won six of the last 10 in the series and the home team has won five of the last six meetings. Murray State's last win at Tennessee Tech came in 1999. Both teams put up a lot of points last week in non-conference games against non-Division I teams; the squads combined for 103 points, 55 from Tennessee Tech and 48 from Murray State as both teams won their games. With a win, Tech would have three straight wins overall for the first time since 2004.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State scored its first victory of the season last week, topping Lambuth 48-13 in its home debut. Despite trailing at halftime, the Racers ran off 36 unanswered points to win easily. The 48 points was the most in a string of 36 games, dating back to the season-opener in 2004 (56 points vs. Glenville State). After not having an interception in its first two games, Murray picked off five Lambuth passes; the five interceptions came from five different Racer defenders. Linebacker Tamar Butler had a good game, netting 11 tackles, two sacks and three tackles for loss. Offensively, redshirt freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt tossed four touchdown passes, becoming the first Murray State player to accomplish that since Justin Fuente did against Kentucky Wesleyan eight years ago (1999). Senior WR Rod Harper caught nine passes for 127 yards and two touchdowns; he has now caught a pass in every one of the 19 games he has played in a Racer uniform.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech enjoys playing on Thursday nights, as this marks fourth game in as many weeks to be played on Thursday; the team will play six Thursday games in total this year. The Eagles soared to a second straight home blowout victory last week, topping Concordia 55-7. For the second straight week, senior WR Larry Shipp started the game off with a bang, returning a kickoff for a touchdown; this week it was a 97-yarder. And for the second straight week senior RB Derek White was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after tying the OVC record for rushing touchdowns in a game (5); white had 236 all-purpose yards in the contest and set TTU records for rushing touchdowns and points scored (30). It was his seventh 100-yard rushing game of his career. White was going along so well that TTU did not even attempt a pass in the second half. After forcing no turnovers in its first two games, the TTU defense forced six last week. Maurice Smith had 10 tackles and his sixth career interception while Broderick Jamison had the first two interceptions of his career. Redshirt freshman Kelechi Ordu led Tech with 13 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Junior Corey Reed added 12 tackles and John Jackson blocked two field goal attempts.

GAME NOTES: The two teams are meeting for the fifth time since Jacksonville State joined the Conference in 2003. Three of the four affairs have been one-sided (decided by two or more touchdowns) with the exception being a 30-23 JSU win in 2004. The road team has won each of the last three meetings in the series. This game will be crucial for each team, as both teams would like to start 1-0 in OVC play and neither teams wants to be 1-3 overall after the game. The matchup pits the two teams that have been the best in the Conference over the past four years. Since JSU joined the OVC, they are 25-7 in OVC play, best in the Conference and just ahead of EKU's 24-8 mark. JSU is 4-0 in OVC openers. EKU is 1-3 in OVC openers under Danny Hope; the Colonels had won 19 OVC openers in a row until the 2000 season saw that streak come to an end.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky slipped to 1-2 on the season following a 26-6 loss at Western Kentucky, the squad's second Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent of the season. Despite not mustering much offense (the team was held below 100 yards passing for the second time in three games this season), the Colonels were led defensively by junior SS Brandon Gathof who equaled his career-high with 12 tackles. He had a tackle for loss and an interception on the day. After three games Eastern has a +6 turnover margin and has not lost a fumble. EKU is ninth nationally in turnover margin while their opponent this week is third nationally. Senior RB Bobby Washington needs just 73 yards to tally 1,000 for his career while senior WR Kyle Barber is just 42 yards shy of 1,000. Junior QB could be the third player to hit 1,000 yards soon, as he needs just 160 more passing yards to reach that mark for his career.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State did not intercept a pass and return it for a touchdown for the first time this season (and first time in five games dating back to last season) in a 35-14 loss at Memphis last week. The Gamecocks had intercepted a pass in and returned it for a score in a NCAA record four straight games. The team does have at least one interception in 11 straight games, dating back to last season. Junior transfer QB Cedric Johnson made his first start for JSU and completed 23-of-39 passes for 214 yards and rushed for 71 yards on 13 carries (5.5 yards/carry). His 71 rushing yards was the most by a Gamecock so far this season. Junior K Gavin Hallford missed his first field goal attempt of the season (after starting 8-for-8), missing a 37-yarder in the first quarter. He still ranks first nationally in field goals made per game (2.67/game). Junior RB Anthony Jones, a transfer from Troy, scored his team's first rushing touchdown of the season against Memphis. Freshman FB Alphonso Freaney would later add a rushing touchdown, marking the first time this season that the JSU offense had scored multiple touchdowns in a game. Jax State currently ranks second nationally in turnover margin (2.67/game). The Gamecocks have scored in 78 straight games dating back to the 2000 season.

GAME NOTES: Old rivals will meet for the 81st time on Saturday in a series that Eastern Illinois leads by two victories (39-37-4). Eastern Illinois has won the last two in the series, nine of the last 11 and 15 of the last 20 overall. Indiana State scored victories in 2003 (23-7) and 2004 (33-30 in overtime) but the other games in recent times have been all in favor of the Panthers. The first meeting in the series came in 1902. EIU will be look to even its overall record before heading back into OVC play. The Panthers are currently at the top of the Conference standings at 1-0.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: The Panthers enter the week at No. 20 in the Sports Network and SME Network polls and No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll despite losing two games in a row (one at FBS Purdue and another at a nationally-ranked FCS team). Eastern Illinois lost a 24-21 decision to No. 15 Illinois State at home last week, fumbling away the ball with just 26 seconds left after the team had driven to the Illinois State 20-yard line. EIU has now lost six straight to the Redbirds, including three times in the past two seasons. Junior FB Chip Keys was a force rushing the ball on Saturday, as he churned out 58 yards on only seven carries (8.3 yards/carry). He scored one of Eastern's two rushing touchdowns and had a long run of 32 yards. On defense, junior SS Adrian Arrington tied for the team lead with 10 tackles. He had eight solo stops, a tackle for loss and an interception. Arrington is tied for third on the team with 21 tackles through three games this season. Redshirt freshman CB Rashad Haynes also added 10 tackles (6 solo) and had a pass break-up. Junior specialist Quinten Ponius returned five kicks for 90 yards (18 yards/return). He had a long return of 22 yards, caught a pass for 15 yards and rushed the ball once for 18 yards. Redshirt freshman punter Kevin Cook continues to have an impressive season, as he is averaging 44.86 yards per kick, which is third nationally. If he keeps this pace up he would break the EIU single-season record, which is currently 43.0 yards by Jeff Gossett in 1977; Gossett went on to play 16 seasons in the NFL.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE: Indiana State will play its third OVC opponent of the season on Saturday. The Sycamores lost 32-17 at home to Austin Peay two weeks ago and fell 13-10 at Southeast Missouri this past weekend. QB Reilly Murphy continues to take on the majority of his team's workload, as he was 13-of-27 for 203 yards and a touchdown against Southeast Missouri, and also rushed the ball 17 times for 77 yards in the three-point road loss. He is the only signal caller to see action for ISU this season and is the team's leading rusher after three contests (2.5 yards per carry). Indiana State was been outscored 100-34 this season, out-gained 1,305 to 780 yards and is -4 in turnover margin.

GAME NOTES: Saturday's matchup is the eighth all-time between the schools and fifth since the Bulldogs became a member of the Ohio Valley Conference. Southeast Missouri scored a 19-14 victory a season ago. No team has won two in a row during the past six meetings. The rivalry dates back to 1991, when the teams played in back-to-back years; that was the first season that Southeast Missouri was a member of the OVC. The Bulldogs are 1-3 all-time in OVC openers.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri State enters the week having come off a pair of home victories after losing its season-opener at Cincinnati. The Redhawks started last season 3-1 after a 19-14 win over Samford and can match that start again this year. Last week the team topped Indiana State 13-10. Junior RB Timmy Holloman rushed the ball 33 times for 141 yards (4.3 yards/carry). He was held to 28 yards in the first half but exploded for 113 yards in the second frame. Junior QB Houston Lillard completed 13-of-18 passes for 159 yards and a touchdown. His scoring strike came with just two seconds left in the first half. Defensively sophomore LB Jared Goodson made a game-high 14 tackles and had a sack. He also recovered a key fumble at the 3-yard line that stopped an Indiana State drive in the second half. Kicker/punter Doug Spada had another solid outing, making field goals from 25 and 38 yards and punting six times for an average of 43.8 yards. One of his punts was downed inside the 20 and he had a long punt of 49 yards. The Redhawks are currently second in the OVC in rushing, averaging 213.3 yards per contest; Holloman is third in the OVC in individual rushing.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: Samford surged back above .500 on the season with a 34-24 victory over at home over Presbyterian College last Thursday. For the second year in a row the team is 2-1 after three weeks. The Bulldogs offensive attack was bolstered by redshirt freshman RB Chris Evans who earned OVC Newcomer of the Week honors with his play. Evans carried the ball 20 times for a career-high 174 yards (8.7 yards/carry) in the victory. The transfer from UAB (the former school of current coach Pat Sullivan) sealed Samford's victory with a 51-yard touchdown run with 3:46 to go in the fourth quarter. The Bulldogs defense was keyed by Jay McCurty who returned an interception 36 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. McCurty added six tackles, three tackles for loss and had three quarterback hurries.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Southern renew a long-standing rivalry that has not taken place in 11 years. The squads will meet in Baton Rouge on Saturday in the 37th meeting in the all-time series. The Jaguars will return the favor by playing in Nashville next season, as part of the John Merritt Classic.

GAME NOTES: A rivalry that dates back to before UT Martin was a senior college continues on Saturday. The game is the 56th in the series (44th since UTM became a senior college) but first that will count in the OVC standings since 1996 (when Austin Peay left the league for 10 years to play non-scholarship football). The Governors won that contest 55-24 but have lost four straight to the Skyhawks since that date. Since 1987, UT Martin has dominated the series, winning 10 of 13 overall. The game is the second in the Sgt. York Trophy series, which pits the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee against each other. The school with the best overall record in the quadrangular series this season will be awarded the inaugural Sgt. York Trophy. Tennessee State claimed the initial victory in the series by topping Austin Peay last week.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: The Tigers are 2-1 for the second year in a row after topping Austin Peay 33-32 in overtime in an exciting OVC opener for both squads last week. TSU is receiving votes in the Sports Network poll this week and are No. 8 in the American Sports Wire Black College Football Poll. They had two players earn OVC Player of the Week honors for their performances in the overtime affair with the Govs. Senior DE Shaun Richardson battled strep throat but still had five tackles (4 solo), two sacks, four tackles for loss, had a quarterback hurry, forced two fumbles and recovered a fumble which he returned 73 yards for a touchdown. That score put TSU up 10-7 in the first half and earned him Defensive Player of the Week honors. Junior kicker Eric Benson earned Specialist of the Week honors after using his leg to best an opponent for the second straight week. Two weeks ago he kicked the game-winning field goal as time expired to beat Jackson State. This past week he was 2-of-3 in PAT attempts and 2-of-2 in field goal attempts. That includes a 43-yard field goal with just nine seconds left in regulation to tie the game at 26 and force overtime. After APSU scored and failed on the extra point (thanks to a block by Tiger All-American Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie), Benson's extra point after a score ended the game. The game not only put the Tigers on top of the OVC standings with a 1-0 record, it also put them on top in the Sgt. York Trophy Standings, as the contest with Austin Peay was the first in the series which is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee. TSU will play in the Atlanta Classic against Florida A&M next weekend before taking the following weekend off and then preparing for a full slate of OVC games to close the season.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: The Skyhawks have been on the wrong end of a tough early season schedule and find themselves 0-3 after three weeks of the season, the first time since 1998 they have started a season 0-3. Last season the team lost in week No. 1 and then won eight in a row. UTM has played an FBS team (Southern Miss), an up-and-coming Gateway squad (Missouri State) and a road game at Central Arkansas. But the team has not lost any ground in its chase to repeat as OVC champions, as they are still 0-0 in the conference race entering this week. Senior RB Don Chapman made school history by setting the Skyhawk all-time rushing mark on Saturday at UCA. Chapman carried the ball 13 times for 104 yards and a touchdown and now has 4,127 career rushing yards which bested the record of 4,033 which had stood since 1959. The 100-yard effort was the 19th of his career. Junior WR E.J. Daniel caught a season-high eight passes for 151 yards and two scores in the Central Arkansas contest. Sophomore WR Roren Thomas had eight catches for 103 yards, marking the first time UT Martin had dual 100-yard receiving games since 2000. Sophomore QB Dexter Anoka continues to develop, as the completed 17-of-32 passes for 219 yards and two touchdowns. Junior Dante Harrold had 12 tackles (6 solo) in the contest.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN: The Jags enter this week a perfect 3-0 overall and already 2-0 in the SWAC. Southern enters the week No. 4 on the American Sports Wire Black College Football Poll. The squad won a pair of neutral sites games to start the season (Florida A&M and Mississippi Valley State) before topping Prairie View A&M 12-2 last week in its home opener. Southern has a balanced rushing attack, with Darren Coates (226 yards, 7.3 per carry, 2 TD's) and Brian Threat (113 yards, 6.6 per carry, 1 TD). Quarterback Bryant Lee is 60-of-93 (64.5%) for 565 yards and five touchdowns and he has not seen picked off this season.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay made its return to the OVC with a hard fought 1-point loss to Tennessee State last week. The squad led until just nine seconds left in regulation before TSU tied the game up and eventually won 33-32 in overtime. The Governors were led by sophomore LB Daniel Becker who earned OVC and National Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance. Becker had 19 tackles (13 solo), forced a fumble and recovered another fumble. His 19 tackles are the second most in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) this season. Four other Govs had double-digit tackles in the contest including Kit Hartsfield (16), JayR Harper (15), Josh Hackett (11) and Tremayne Townsend (10). APSU's three starting linebackers combined for an amazing 46 tackles in the game as well as three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Offensively, senior RB Chris Fletcher recorded his ninth-straight 100-yard plus rushing effort by running for 116 yards and two scores. He now has 23 100-yard rushing games for his career at Austin Peay. He currently ranks seventh nationally in scoring (14 points/game). Freshman KR Terrence Holt continued to be a force, as he returned a punt 67 yards for a touchdown and had five kickoff returns for 87 yards. He also caught a 12-yard pass to help set up APSU's score in overtime. Extra point attempt doomed the team, as the Govs failed to convert on three of five attempts, including one in overtime.
