THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

After five full weeks of competition that has seen each OVC school play five games so far, week No. 6 of the 2007 season will feature a much lighter schedule...Only six of the 10 OVC schools will be in competition this week, as three league games are featured...One of the games pits the two teams on top of the OVC standings with perfect 2-0 records when Eastern Kentucky travels to two-time defending champion Eastern Illinois in a game that could go a long way in determining the OVC Champions...The all-time series between the two teams is tied at 7-7, although Eastern Illinois has won the last two meetings...The week also features UT Martin at Jacksonville State as the Skyhawks search for its first victory of the season and Austin Peay at Tennessee Tech in a Sgt. York Trophy series matchup...The Sgt. York Trophy (which is in its first year and contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee) race is currently being led by Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech, who are each 1-0 in the series...Jacksonville State kicker Gavin Hallford kicked four more field goals this past week and continues to lead the country in field goals per game (2.80); Hallford has 14 field goal already this season, which is the JSU record, and needs just eight more in the final six games to tie the OVC all-time mark...JSU return specialist Maurice Dupree was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Sports Network and the College Sporting News, making him the fourth OVC player in five weeks of the season to earn the award...The OVC has two running backs - TTU's Derek White (6th) and SEMO's Timmy Holloman (8th) - in the top 10 in rushing nationally, and are one of only two conference (the MEAC is the other) to currently achieve that feat; as a whole, the OVC has eight teams who rank in the top 50 in team rushing nationally, the only FCS conference who can lay claim to that at this point in the season...Eastern Illinois moved up to No. 16 in the latest national polls after a win at Southeast Missouri; no other OVC teams are ranked but Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee Tech are also receiving votes.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Antonio Heffner, QB • Jr., 6-2, 195 • Memphis, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Heffner was 12-for-22 for 309 yards, a touchdown and no interceptions in the Tigers 18-17 loss to Florida A&M in the Georgia Dome at the Atlanta Classic. Heffner also rushed for 67 yards and a touchdown to account for 376 yards of total offense on the day. He completed passes to seven different receivers, including two passes of 55 yards each. Heffner led TSU on a drive starting from his own 5-yard line to FAMU's 5-yard line in the last 53 seconds of the game to set-up a potential game-winning 22-yard field goal with nine remaining. The kick failed but Heffner was named TSU's MVP of the game at the classic.

DEFENSIVE

Carnell Clark, CB • So., 6-2, 183 • Birmingham, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Clark led the Gamecock defense with 12 tackles, including 11 solo in JSU's 40-24 win at Murray State. He also added an interception (which he returned nine yards), a forced fumble and two pass break-ups. It was a career-high day for the Birmingham, Ala., native as the Gamecocks forced two turnovers in the game.

CO-SPECIALIST

Maurice Dupree, RS • Jr., 5-10, 180 • Centre, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Dupree finished the Murray State game with six returns for 316 yards, including 212 yards on four kickoffs and 104 on a three punt returns. Dupree was just three yards away from breaking the OVC record for kickoff return yardage (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin), and did set a new JSU school record. Dupree returned a Murray State punt 88 yards late in the second quarter to set-up the Gamecocks first touchdown in the 40-24 win. It was the longest punt return for the Gamecocks under head coach Jack Crowe and the second longest punt return in JSU's Division I history (it was the longest punt return since Craig Agee returned a punt 79 yards against Murray State on Oct. 2, 2004; the JSU Division I record is 93 yards). With 3:54 left in the third quarter, Dupree returned a kickoff 89 yards for a Gamecock touchdown. It was the first time Jax State returned a kickoff for a touchdown since Oct. 2005 (Darren Williams, 76 yards vs. Tennessee Tech) and the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

CO-SPECIALIST

Gavin Hallford, K • Jr., 6-1, 210 • Phenix City, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Hallford, who won the award for the third time this season, broke his own school record for points scored with 16 (set twice already this season), hitting four field goals (23, 37, 27 and 41 yards) and connecting on four extra points in the team's 40-24 road win over Murray State. He also tied a record he has set twice this season by making the four field goals. Through five games this year, Hallford has made 14 field goals, which has already set the Jax State school record, passing the old mark of 13 by Joe Nix in 1974 (the OVC single-season record is 22). He entered the game ranked ninth nationally in field goals made. Hallford also finished with nine kickoffs for a 64.2 yard average and added three touchbacks.

NEWCOMER

Rashad Haynes, DB • RS-Fr., 5-11, 164 • Rockledge, Fla. • Eastern Illinois

Haynes picked off his third and fourth interceptions of the season in the Panthers victory at Southeast Missouri on Saturday. He picked off one pass in the first quarter with the score tied and then his second pass in the fourth quarter, a pick that he returned 86 yards from the EIU 13-yard line to the SEMO 12-yard line. That pick came with EIU up 12 points, and five plays later they added a field goal to put the game away.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCSports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with XOS Technologies allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In five weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 450 kickoffs in 40 games and only 24 of those went for touchbacks (5.3%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 332 kickoffs and 42 touchbacks (12.7%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

The League of Extraordinary Rushers: If there is one thing the OVC has excelled at so far this season it is running the football. Through five weeks there are currently two individuals who rank in the top 10 nationally in rushing - Tennessee Tech's **Derek White** (6th) and Southeast Missouri's **Timmy Holloman** (8th). There is only one other FCS Conference who currently has two players in the top 10 (the MEAC, who has the 5th and 9th leading rushers nationally). From top to bottom as a Conference, the OVC has rushed the ball well by team as well, with seven teams in the top 37 and eight teams in the top 50 nationally - something none of the other 13 FCS Conference can claim. All 10 OVC teams rank in the top 80 overall nationally. Another OVC back - Austin Peay's **Chris Fletcher** - was in the top 10 nationally last week but is now just outside the top 10 in 15th place.

But Don't Forget About the Receivers: While running backs have dominated the OVC this season, there are some wide receivers that are making noise. Tennessee State's **Chris Johnson** (469 yards, 4th), Murray State's **Rod Harper** (452 yards, 5th) and Eastern Illinois' **Micah Rucker** (435, 8th yards) currently among the national leaders in total receiving yards at the FCS level.

National Leaders: The OVC current has one individual and two teams who are at the top of a statistical category in the FCS national leaders. Jacksonville State's **Gavin Halford** currently leads the nation in field goals/game (2.80), while Eastern Kentucky is first in passes intercepted (12) and Eastern Illinois is first in passes had intercepted (0). Among other individuals who rank high nationally are JSU's **Maurice Dupree** (2nd in kickoff returns, 40.86 yards/return), EIU's **Rashad Haynes** and ECU's **Derrick Huff** (tied for 2nd in interceptions, 0.80/game) and ECU's **Zach Denton** (tied for 2nd in interceptions, 0.80/game, & 3rd in passes defended, 2.00/game).

Dupree Named National Special Teams Player of the Week, Becoming 4th OVC Player This Year to Earn National Honor: For the fourth time in five weeks of play this season, the OVC has another National Player of the Week. This time it is Jacksonville State return specialist **Maurice Dupree**, who earned National Special Teams Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News (CSN). Dupree finished the Murray State victory with 316 total return yards, 212 coming on four kickoffs and 104 on three punt returns. He was just three yards shy of breaking the OVC all-time record for kickoff return yardage in a game (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin) and he did set the JSU record in the process. Dupree returned a punt 88 yards in the second quarter to set-up a Gamecocks touchdown and later returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The punt return was the second longest in JSU's Division I history (trailing a 93-yarder) and the kickoff return for a touchdown was the first time JSU had accomplished that since the 2005 season and was the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history. He is the second Jax State player to earn National Player of the Week honors this season, as linebacker **Drew Robinson** did on Sept. 10. The other OVC players to earn the honor include Austin Peay linebacker **Daniel Becker** and Samford kicker **Mark Prevost**.

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Now 4th in OVC History in Rushing Yards and 2nd in Rushes: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman

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now ranks fourth all-time in OVC history (4,270), and is just 879 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list. Chapman currently has 906 career rushes, which is only 15 away from setting the OVC all-time record, which is currently 920 by Eastern Kentucky's Jimmie Brooks (1968-71).

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record; Now 6th in OVC History for Receptions, 10th in Receiving Yardage: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks sixth in OVC history for career receptions (161); he is only five catches out of fourth place all-time. Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he now has 2,359 career receiving yards.

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team with the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After three games in the series, Tennessee State (1-0) and Tennessee Tech (1-0) are atop the Sgt. York Standings. Austin Peay is currently 1-1 (with a win over UT Martin) while UT Martin is 0-2 (after losses to Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech). The next game in the series is Thursday, Oct. 6, when Tennessee Tech hosts Austin Peay.

No. 2 and No. 3 Active FCS Rushers Face Off: When Austin Peay claimed a 17-14 victory over UT Martin on Sept. 22, the game featured two of the top three active career rushers in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) - **Don Chapman** of UT Martin and **Chris Fletcher** of Austin Peay. Chapman entered the matchup as the No. 2 active career rusher while Fletcher entered the game third overall. Fletcher won the individual battle (107 yards to 46 yards) and also led his team to victory. Fletcher, a senior from Clarksville, has 24 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second most among active players (behind Drake's Scott Phaydavong) while Chapman, a senior from Marietta, Ga., has 19 100-yard games, the third most among active players at the FCS level. Chapman became the all-time leading rusher in UTM history this season while Fletcher broke the Austin Peay career rushing record as a junior in 2006.

History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest: When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyrone Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10th year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the squad's 28-22

win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game: Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time an woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

Prevost Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: Samford freshman kicker **Mark Prevost** was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Football Gazette on Sept. 26 after leading Samford to a 26-21 victory over Southeast Missouri. Prevost kicked four second-half field goals, after missing his lone attempt in the first half, to lead Samford to the come-from-behind victory (the Bulldogs trailed 21-10 at one point). Prevost kicked field goals of 47, 37, 41 and 34 yards. The 47-yarder was the career-long for the freshman. He is the third OVC player to win a National Player of the Week award this season.

Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week: For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network and the Football Gazette after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS at that point of the season.

Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Jacksonville State linebacker **Drew Robinson** was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chattanooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Tennessee Tech senior running back **Derek White** has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record also held by Austin Peay's Daniel Williams (1996) and Youngstown State's Patrick Wicks (1981).

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Jax State Keeps Interception Likely an NCAA Record: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was been **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The steak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Halford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks: It is not rare to see a kicker made a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Halford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Halford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Halford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). Halford has been named OVC Specialist of the Week three times this season.

Three OVC Players on Payton & Buchanan Watch Lists: Three OVC players were on the preseason watch lists for *The Sports Network's* Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan Awards given to the nation's top offensive and defensive player respectively. Tennessee-Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** was one of 16 players on the Payton Watch List while Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** were two of the 16 players named to the Buchanan Watch List. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. There will be updates to the Watch Lists Payton and Buchanan watch in October and November before a final ballot is settled on. Ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

That's A Crowd: OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds this season. When Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game. On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic.

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: After just four weeks of the 2007 season, the three new OVC head football coaches have combined to go 10-5 overall. **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 76 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 66 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (43) and Tennessee Tech (38). No team has made more playoff appearances than Eastern Kentucky, who won national championships in 1979 and 1982. The Colonels have been in 17 playoffs (tied with Montana), last appearing in 1997. Eastern Illinois is 10th all-time (11 appearances) while Murray State is 27th (5 trips).

CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 30th consecutive winning season in 2007. The Colonels have not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 overall in 1977 (the second longest streak in Division I). You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (that streak is also second in Division I).

Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of September 24, 10 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is one who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the Newcomer of the Year award.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

NCAA ACTIVE RUSHING LEADERS

This season two OVC running backs are near the top of the active career rushing leaders at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

GAME NOTES: The matchup between the Skyhawks and Gamecocks looms large for both teams. UT Martin, the defending OVC champions, have not won this season and do not want to begin the season 0-3 in Conference play, as that would end any chance they have to repeat as champions. JSU also has an early-season Conference loss and will look to improve to 2-1 in the OVC. The teams are meeting for the 29th time overall, and Jax State has controlled the all-time series, winning 23 times. But it was UT Martin who came through last season, winning 24-14 at home to end a five-game JSU winning streak in the series. UTM head coach Jason Simpson was an assistant coach at JSU from 1997-99.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin lost for the fifth time this season last week, dropping a 3-point home decision to Tennessee Tech. The Skyhawks are now 0-5 on the year, the first time they have been 0-5 to start a year since 1998. UTM started the game with Tech strong, as Jessie Burton returned the opening kickoff 90 yards to take a quick 7-0 lead; it was the third kickoff return for touchdown of Burton's career and the second straight season he had done that against TTU. Burton is currently 27th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (148.20). Tech tied the game right before halftime and later hit a field goal in the third quarter to seal the victory, in what proved to be a defensive struggle between the two teams who usually put up big offensive numbers. The 'Hawks were stopped on 3rd-and-1 and 4th-and-1 from the TTU 20-yard line late in the fourth quarter; that stop ended a 19-play drive that covered 79 yards and ate up 10 minutes of play clock. Senior RB Don Chapman rushed for 97 yards and is now 880 yards away from tying the OVC's all-time record (he'll need to average 146 yards/game the rest of the way to break the record). The matchup was the second in the Sgt. York Trophy series for UTM; UT Martin is 0-2 in the standings.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State topped Murray State 40-24 on the road thanks to big efforts from their special teams and defense. Junior Maurice Dupree was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week (and National Special Teams Player of the Week from Sports Network and College Sporting News) after racking up 316 yards in kick returns (212 on kickoffs, 104 on punts). He was just three yards shy of the OVC record for kickoff return yardage in a game (he did set the JSU record) and returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown. He also returned a punt 88 yards to set up a touchdown in the second quarter. Dupree shared to Co-Specialist award with teammate kicker Gavin Hallford who kicked four field goals (23, 37, 27, 41 - tying his own school record) and set a new school record for points (16). He has 14 field goals already this season, which is a new JSU record and eight away from the OVC all-time mark. Carnell Clark was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after recording 12 tackles (11 solo), intercepting a pass, forcing a fumble and making two pass break-ups. Junior Ronald Murray played on both sides of the ball, rushing for 53 yards as a RB and on defense, recording two tackles and netting a pass break-up. Senior Taurean Rhetta blocked a pair of punts in the game, including one that was returned for a touchdown by a teammate; Rhetta now has seven career blocked punts, second in NCAA history behind Sam Houston State's Trey Woods (8 from 1992-95). Junior RB Anthony Jones finished the day with 74 yards and a touchdown. It was a career-high for the Troy University transfer.

GAME NOTES: With both teams still alive in the OVC title hunt, several interesting storylines will come into play Saturday in Cookeville. The meeting is the 40th all-time between the two schools but first in 10 years; the squads have played only once (1997) since Austin Peay left the OVC following the 1996 season (and re-joined just this year). It also marks the first time this season TTU has played on a Saturday; the team's previous five games were all on Thursday night. Most intriguing is the matchup of Tech first-year head coach Watson Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay in 1979-80 (compiling a record of 14-8). TTU is 3-0 at home this season and averaging 49.0 points per game at Tucker Stadium.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay led early but ended up falling in a non-conference game at Gardner-Webb last week. The game was senior RB Chris Fletcher come up short of the 100-yard rushing plateau for the first time in 11 games; his 10-game streak that was snapped dated back to last season. In replace of QB Mark Cunningham, backup and freshman Trent Caffee tossed his first career touchdown, hooking up with Adrian Mines in the second quarter. Mines finished the game with 87 yards and a season-high eight receptions. On defense, Kit Hartsfield led the Gobs with 10 tackles and a pair of interceptions, becoming the second APSU player to have two picks in the same game this season (Josh Hackett was the other). Freshman punter Ryan Key had a season-high eight punts, including six in the second half; he averaged 36.6 yards/punt. Freshman kicker Isaac Zilokowski connected on a pair of field goals and his now 5-of-6 on the season. Despite setting 2007 single-game highs in completions (16), attempts (33) and passing yards (188), Austin Peay was only 2-of-18 in third down opportunities against GWU.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech, who is now receiving votes in the national polls, won its fourth in a row last week, topping UT Martin 13-10 on the road. The 4-1 overall start is the first for the program since the 2000 season; a 5-1 start has not happened since 1999. Senior RB Derek White rushed for 115 yards (and had 149 all-purpose yards), his fourth 100-yard game of the season (and ninth of his career). Junior QB Josh Lowery was 16-for-28 for 133 yards and a touchdown in his first start in place of injured signal caller Lee Sweeney. Senior WR Larry Shipp caught four passes for 51 yards and has at least one catch in all 37 career games at TTU; he has caught four or more passes in 28 of his 37 career contests. Freshman kicker/punter Justin Kraemer kicked a pair of field goals (40, 34) that proved to be the game-winner; he is 6-for-6 in field goal attempts this season. He also punted seven times for a 46.3 average. Sophomore Taron Ryce came up big for the Golden Eagles, tallying two interceptions, including one in the final minute of the game to seal the Tech victory. Tech's defense also came up big at the 5:27 mark, when it stopped UTM on a 4th-and-1 play, when the Skyhawks decided to go for it on the Tech 20-yard line instead of going for the game-tying field goal.

GAME NOTES: The battle of the "Eastern's" will go a long way in determining this year's OVC champion. The winner of this Saturday's contest will be 3-0 in the Conference with five games remaining, although the losing team will still be in the thick of the hunt. The two teams have played 14 times previously with both sides winning seven. EIU has controlled the series the last two seasons, winning 53-22 in Charleston in 2005 and 28-21 last season in Richmond.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky improved to 2-0 in the Conference for the second time in three years (and 3-0 this season against FCS competition this season) with a big 43-20 win over Samford last Saturday. The Colonels success this season has been turnovers. EKU is third nationally in turnover margin (+2.2 turnovers per game), first in passes intercepted (12), second in turnovers gained (16) and 10th in turnovers lost (5). Individually, Derrick Huff and Zach Denton are tied (along with EIU's Rashad Haynes) for second nationally in interceptions (0.80/game) and Denton is third nationally in passes defended (2.00/game). In the Samford victory, EKU forced five turnovers, the most since a Nov. 2005 game against UT Martin. Denton finished the game with two interceptions (his second multiple interception game of the year) and added five tackles and a pass break-up in the win. Junior QB Allan Holland accounted for three touchdowns on the day (1 rushing, 2 passing). He had his two longest completions of the year (58 and 64 yards) in the game, including a 64-yard scoring strike to Garnett Phelps in the third quarter. Holland completed 68.8 percent (11-of-16) of his attempts and equaled a career-high with 197 passing yards. The Colonels are once again receiving votes in the national polls.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: The Panthers moved up to No. 16 in the national polls following a 31-16 victory at Southeast Missouri. The Panthers did it with solid offense and timely defense. Freshman DB Rashad Haynes was named OVC Newcomer of the Week after recording his third and fourth interceptions of the season. He picked off one pass in the first quarter with the score tied and his second interception came in the fourth quarter. He returned that pick 86 yards, going from the EIU 13-yard line to the SEMO 12-yard line and setting up a Panther field goal. Offensively, sophomore RB Ron Jordan rushed for a career-high 115 yards, becoming the first Panther back to crack the 100-yard plateau in nine games. Ademola Adeniji added 97 yards and a touchdown on the ground. In his second straight start at QB, Bodie Reeder completed 13-of-28 passes for 159 yards and three touchdowns. One of those touchdowns went to Micah Rucker, who hauled in three catches for 60 yards, including the 45-yard field goal.
