THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

After two weeks ago where several OVC teams were on byes, all 10 teams returned to action this past weekend as the OVC race officially reached the midway point...Eastern Kentucky remained perfect in the OVC with a 4-0 mark (5-2 overall, with both losses coming to FBS schools) and in a tie with undefeated Tennessee State (2-0 in OVC play); the Colonels cracked one national Top 25 poll last week and should move make an appearance in every poll this week when they are released on Monday afternoon...Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State both won road contests to improve to 3-1 and remain in the thick of the OVC race and the automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs...only one other team - Austin Peay - is currently at .500 or better in OVC play (2-2)...UT Martin scored a 31-21 home victory over Samford to snap a six-game losing streak to begin the season; the Skyhawks had lost three straight games by three points...This week's games are highlighted by a matchup of undefeated OVC teams when Tennessee State travels to Richmond to play Eastern Kentucky; the winner of the game will have the inside-track at the OVC Championship...The week also features a matchup of last year's co-champions, as UT Martin travels to Eastern Illinois; last season UT Martin topped EIU in Martin...UT Martin senior RB Don Chapman set the OVC record for career rushing attempts (930) in last week's win over Samford; he broke the record previously held by ECU's Jimmie Brooks (1968-71)...Another storyline pits a matchup between former co-workers, as Rick Christophel and Austin Peay travel to Samford to battle Pat Sullivan's squad; the two coaches were assistants at UAB last season under head coach Watson Brown (who is now the head coach at Tennessee Tech)...Eastern Kentucky moved up to No. 21 in two of the three major Top 25 polls and is the highest-ranked team; Eastern Illinois is ranked as high as No. 24 in one national poll while Jacksonville State is receiving votes.

Corey Reed, LB • Jr., 6-0, 220 • Memphis, Tenn. • Tennessee Tech

Reed led Tennessee Tech with a career-high 15 tackles, including four tackles-for-loss, in a 45-28 home loss to Tennessee State. Reed was credited with six solo tackles and nine assists.

Zach Walden, P • Jr., 5-10, 180 • Dallas, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Walden averaged 48.5 yards on a pair of punts and pinned both of his punts inside the 20-yard line in Jacksonville State's 42-9 victory at Austin Peay. He has pinned six of his last eight punts overall inside the 20-yard line. Walden has 13 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line this season, which is tops in the OVC.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCsports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV (formerly XOS Technologies) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In seven weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 537 kickoffs in 48 games and only 27 of those went for touchbacks (5.0%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 416 kickoffs and 52 touchbacks (12.5%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Now 3rd in OVC History in Rushing Yards and 1st in Rushes: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman now ranks third all-time in OVC history (4,454), and is just 695 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list. After rushing the ball 24 times in a win over Samford on Oct. 13, Chapman increased his career rushes total to 930, putting him first in OVC history in that category. He broke the record previously held by Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71) of Eastern Kentucky.

The League of Extraordinary Rushers: If there is one thing the OVC has excelled at so far this season it is running the football. Through seven weeks there are currently two individuals who rank in the top 10 nationally in rushing (and three in the top 13) - Tennessee Tech's **Derek White** (8th) and Southeast Missouri's **Timmy Holloman** (10th), while Austin Peay's **Chris Fletcher** ranks just outside the top 10 in 13th. There is only one other FCS Conference who currently has two players in the top 10 (the Colonial, who has the 3rd and 9th leading rushers nationally). From top to bottom as a Conference, the OVC has rushed the ball well by team as well, with seven teams in the top 38 and eight teams in the top 47 nationally - something none of the other 13 FCS Conference can claim. All 10 OVC teams rank in the top 71 overall nationally.

National Leaders: The OVC current has two individuals and three teams who are at the top of a statistical category in the FCS national leaders. Jacksonville State's **Gavin Halford** currently leads the nation in field goals/game (2.67), while Austin Peay's **Terrence Holt** is the national leader in punt returns (16.25 yards/return). On the team side, Eastern Kentucky is first in passes intercepted (12), Eastern Illinois is first in passes had intercepted (0) and Samford is the national leader in sacks allowed per game (0.40).

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record; Now 4th in OVC History for Receptions, 8th in Receiving Yardage: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks fourth in OVC history for career receptions (170). Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he now has 2,463 career receiving yards which is eighth, and he is only 25 yards out of seventh place. Shipp has caught a pass in all 39 career games, as has Samford's **Jeff Moore**, which is believed to be an OVC record.

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will be the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

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The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After five of the six games in the series, Tennessee State (2-0) is the only team without a defeat in the series. Austin Peay has played all three of its games and finished at 2-1, Tennessee Tech played all three games and finished 1-2 and UT Martin is 0-2 with one more game to play. The final game in the series is Nov. 17, when Tennessee State hosts UT Martin. A win by TSU would give them the inaugural trophy out-right, while a loss would mean that TSU would share the trophy with Austin Peay.

Holland Named National Offensive Player of the Week; He Becomes 5th OVC Player to Earn That Honor This Season: Eastern Kentucky junior QB **Allan Holland** became the fifth OVC player to earn National Player of the Week honors on Oct. 8, as he was named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (CSN). Holland completed 30-of-44 passes for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns in the Colonels 28-21 win at No. 16 Eastern Illinois. His first touchdown came with one second left in the first half and put ECU up 15-14; the other came late in the game to increase his team's lead to two scores. Both came after Holland scrambled out of the pocket, avoided would-be tacklers and found an open receiver. The other OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this season include a pair of Jacksonville State players - **Maurice Dupree** on Special Teams (Oct.1) and LB **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 10). Also included in the list is Austin Peay LB **Daniel Becker** (Sept. 16) and Samford kicker **Mark Prevost** (Sept. 23).

Eastern Kentucky Named National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com: Following its 28-21 victory at No. 16 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels were named the Division I FCS National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com. With the win, ECU improved to 4-2 overall and 3-0 in the OVC, which puts them atop the Conference standings. The Colonels only losses of the season have come at FBS schools Kentucky and Western Kentucky. In the win over Eastern Illinois, junior quarterback Allan Holland threw for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC and National Offensive Player of the Week honors. Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 19th OVC Championship this season and its first since the 1997 season, which was also the last time the program advanced to the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs.

No. 2 and No. 3 Active FCS Rushers Face Off: When Austin Peay claimed a 17-14 victory over UT Martin on Sept. 22, the game featured two of the top three active career rushers in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) - **Don Chapman** of UT Martin and **Chris Fletcher** of Austin Peay. Chapman entered the matchup as the No. 2 active career rusher while Fletcher entered the game third overall. Fletcher won the individual battle (107 yards to 46 yards) and also led his team to victory. Fletcher, a senior from Clarksville, has 25 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second most among active players (behind Drake's Scott Phaydavong) while Chapman, a senior from Marietta, Ga., has 20 100-yard games, the third most among active players at the FCS level. Chapman became the all-time leading rusher in UTM history this season while Fletcher broke the Austin Peay career rushing record as a junior in 2006.

Dupree Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: For the fourth time in five weeks of play this season, the OVC has another National Player of the Week. This time it is Jacksonville State return specialist **Maurice Dupree**, who earned National Special Teams Player of the Week from each the Sports Network, College Sporting News (CSN) and SME Network. Dupree finished the Murray State victory with 316 total return yards, 212 coming on four kickoffs and 104 on three punt returns. He was just three yards shy of breaking the OVC all-time record for kickoff return yardage in a game (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin) and he did set the JSU record in the process. Dupree returned a punt 88 yards in the second quarter to set-up a Gamecocks touchdown and later returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The punt return was the second longest in JSU's Division I history (trailing a 93-yarder) and the kickoff return for a touchdown was the first time JSU had accomplished that since the 2005 season and was the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest: When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Champion-

ship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyrone Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10th year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the squad's 28-22 win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game: Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time an woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

Prevost Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: Samford freshman kicker **Mark Prevost** was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Football Gazette on Sept. 26 after leading Samford to a 26-21 victory over Southeast Missouri. Prevost kicked four second-half field goals, after missing his lone attempt in the first half, to lead Samford to the come-from-behind victory (the Bulldogs trailed 21-10 at one point). Prevost kicked field goals of 47, 37, 41 and 34 yards. The 47-yarder was the career-long for the freshman.

Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week: For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network and the Football Gazette after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS at that point of the season.

Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Jacksonville State linebacker **Drew Robinson** was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chattanooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Tennessee Tech senior running back **Derek White** has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record also held by Austin Peay's Daniel Williams (1996) and Youngstown State's Patrick Wicks (1981).

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Jax State Keeps Interception Likely an NCAA Record: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was been **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The steak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored

three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Hallford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks; Owns JSU Career Field Goals Made Mark: It is not rare to see a kicker make a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Hallford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Hallford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Hallford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). Hallford now has 37 career made field goals, which is the most in school history. He has been named OVC Specialist of the Week three times this season.

Three OVC Players on Payton & Buchanan Watch Lists: Three OVC players were on the preseason watch lists for *The Sports Network's* Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan Awards given to the nation's top offensive and defensive player respectively. Tennessee-Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** was one of 16 players on the Payton Watch List while Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie** were two of the 16 players named to the Buchanan Watch List. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. There will be updates to the Watch Lists Payton and Buchanan watch in October and November before a final ballot is settled on. Ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

That's A Crowd: OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds this season. When Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game. On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic; that crowd was the largest to see a FCS football game this year (the Jackson State crowd is the third largest FCS crowd this year).

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 82 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 71 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (49) and UT Martin (30). ALL-TIME FCS PLAYOFF APPEARANCES

The FCS playoffs began in 1978, when four teams competed for the national championship. The OVC did not have a team in the playoffs that season but have in 28 years since then. No team has made more playoff appearances than Eastern Kentucky, who won national championships in 1979 and 1982. The Colonels have been in 17 playoffs (tied with Montana), last appearing in 1997. Eastern Illinois is 10th all-time (11 appearances) while Murray State is 27th (5 trips).

CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 30th consecutive winning season in 2007. The Colonels have not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 overall in 1977 (the second longest streak in Division I). You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (that streak is also second in Division I).

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: After just four weeks of the 2007 season, the three new OVC head football coaches have combined to go 10-5 overall. **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of September 24, 10 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is one who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the New-comer of the Year award.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

NCAA ACTIVE RUSHING LEADERS

This season two OVC running backs are near the top of the active career rushing leaders at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Don Chapman of UT Martin and Chris Fletcher of Austin Peay currently rank No. 2 and No. 3 nationally in that category, only trailing Scott Phaydavong of Drake.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

GAME NOTES: Saturday's matchup will be a chance for one of these teams to pick up their first OVC victory of the season, while one team will fall to 0-4 in the Conference. The regional rivals are no strangers to each other, as they have played 41 times since 1926. Also the Racers have controlled the series overall, the Redhawks have had Murray's number the past two seasons, winning 52-21 in 2005 and 24-17 a year ago. Those wins ended a 12-year winning streak in the series for the Racers. The game will be Homecoming for Southeast Missouri.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State lost its third straight game and fell to 0-3 in OVC play but did so with a valiant effort, falling 27-24 at home to No. 23 Eastern Illinois. RB Charlie Jordan had a career-day, setting career-highs with 22 carries and 127 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He scored on runs of 35 and 5 yards and became the first Racer back to rush for more than 100 yards since his 111-yard performance against Indiana State in Sept. 2006. WR Rod Harper extended his streak of games with a reception to 22; he finished the game with 69 receiving yards, which snapped a streak of 100-yard receiving games at three straight. Senior CB Derrick Parrott, the lone senior among the defensive starters, recorded 12 tackles (11 solo) and also forced and recovered a fumble on the one-yard line. Sophomore WR Derrick Townsel had a pair of tackles on special teams, both of which resulted in EIU fumbles and MSU fumble recoveries. Redshirt freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt was 23-for-37 with 192 yards and a touchdown against the Panthers. He finished the game going 5-for-6 with 105 yards of passing in 20 seconds in leading the team to a late score.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri lost its third straight game, all OVC contests, falling at league-leader Eastern Kentucky on Saturday. The Redhawks played their first game without RB Timmy Holloman, the nation's No. 8 rusher, who has been suspended indefinitely due to unspecified reasons. In his place, true freshman Mike Jones got the start and led the team with 64 yards on 15 carries. Overall the team rushed for 230 total yards, as four backs had six or more carries on the day. Punter/kicker Doug Spada continued his excellent season, punting the ball seven times for 280 yards (an average of 40 yards/punt) and downing five inside the 20-yard line. QB Victor Anderson completed 8-of-18 passes for 55 yards and rushed the ball 11 times for 47 yards and a touchdown in the loss to EIU. Southeast Missouri does lead the OVC in rushing as a team (219.5 yards/game). Senior LB Adam Casper leads the OVC in tackles (11.4/game).

GAME NOTES: Saturday's matchup between UT Martin and Eastern Illinois pits last season's OVC co-champions. UT Martin claimed the OVC's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs after topping the Panthers in the regular season last season. That marked only the second win for the Skyhawks in 12 regular season meetings with EIU; both have come in the last three years (2004, 2006). The meeting will have a different look than last year's key showdown did; although Eastern Illinois is just a loss behind in standings, UTM finds itself in eighth place after four weeks of OVC play.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: The Skyhawks finally broke into the win column on Saturday, scoring a 31-21 Homecoming victory over Samford. The loss snapped a seven-game losing streak dating back to the last game of the 2006 season. It also ended a streak of three-straight losses by three points each. Despite being 1-3 in the OVC, the Skyhawks have outscored their opponents by a single point now after the 10-point win over the Bulldogs. Senior RB Don Chapman notched his 20th career 100-plus yard rushing game, going for 113 yards on 24 carries. Those carries increased his career rushes total to 930, which broke a 36-year old OVC record previously held by EIU's Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71). Chapman will have to average 110 yards per contest over his last four games of the season to reach the 1,000-yard plateau for the fourth consecutive season (only 12 other players have achieved that feat at the Division I level). QB Dexter Anoka rushed for two touchdowns and tossed another one in the 31-21 win. The completed 10-of-17 passes for 123 yards and rushed the ball six times for 20 yards. His passing touchdown came on a 50-yard strike to Jessie Burton. The UTM defense also played well, limiting Samford to 30 yards on 26 total carries.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois held on to top Murray State 27-24 in a road contest this past week. The Panthers remained in the hunt for their third straight OVC Championship, and are just one loss behind co-leaders Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State (who meet this weekend in Richmond). Despite the victory the Panthers fell out of the Sports Network Top 25 poll, slipping from 24th to unofficially 26th in the poll. They remained ranked 24th in the FCS Coaches Poll. Senior WR Micah Rucker had a career-best 11 receptions for 153 yards in the win over the Racers. The 11 grabs were the ninth most in a single game in Eastern Illinois history. It marked the fourth time Rucker has had more than 150 yards receiving in a game at EIU. Senior RB Ademola Adeniji carried the bulk of the work load again this week, rushing 35 times for 197 yards and scoring three touchdowns. He would have had a quartet of touchdowns had he not been stripped while stretching the ball towards the end zone. The 197 yards was a career-high and it moved him into 13th place on the Panthers career rushing list. Junior SS KeAndre Sams made eight tackles (7 solo) and had an interception in the win.

GAME NOTES: Each team, led by a new head coach this season, is coming off a loss and will use this game as a measuring stick of what to expect for the rest of the season. Samford controls the all-time series, leading 8-0. This could be the last chance for Austin Peay to win a game in the series, as Samford will move to the Southern Conference following the season. The game picks APSU head coach Rick Christophel against Samford head coach Pat Sullivan; the two were assistant coaches on Watson Brown's (now head coach at Tennessee Tech) staff at UAB a season ago. The game is the annual Homecoming contest for Samford.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is coming off a Thursday night loss to Jacksonville State. That loss evened the Govs record at 2-2 overall in the OVC after they were picked to finish last in a preseason poll of coaches and sports information directors. Sophomore QB Gary Orr made his first career start, but after completing his first pass was intercepted on his second attempt. He finished the game 5-of-13 for 54 yards; Mark Cunningham also saw action in the game. APSU had thrown only two interceptions all season until throwing two alone in the game on Thursday. Senior RB Chris Fletcher carried the ball 18 times for 74 yards and scored the Governors lone touchdown of the day. It marked his first rushing touchdown in four games; Fletcher is APSU's career touchdown record holder. The 74 yards marked only the second time this season (and in as many weeks) that he had less than 100 yards in a game; his 25 career 100-yard rushing games is currently second nationally among active players. One of the key stats in the game was third-down conversions; APSU was 3-of-11 while JSU was 11-of-16. Austin Peay was led defensively by sophomore LB's Chris Haynes and Kit Hartsfield, who had 10 and 12 tackles respectively. Hartsfield leads the team with 62 tackles on the season.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: Samford fell below .500 in OVC play for the first time this season after suffering a 31-21 loss at UT Martin. The Bulldogs are a perfect 3-0 at home this season but are winless (0-3) on the road in 2007. The team will look to extend its home winning streak with its annual Homecoming game this week. The squad has not played at home since Sept. 22 when they topped Southeast Missouri 26-21. Senior WR Jeff Moore caught eight passes for 124 yards and a touchdown (a 25-yard score). Moore has now caught a pass in 39 straight games, tied with Tennessee Tech's Larry Shipp for the longest active streak in the OVC. Moore is currently seventh in OVC history in receptions (160) and needs just five more catches to move into sixth place. He also has 2,181 career receiving yards, which is just 209 yards away from 10th place in Conference history. After being shutout for over 55 minutes against UT Martin, the Bulldogs responded with 21 points in the final 4:06 of the game. QB Jefferson Adcock finished the game 20-of-37 for 192 yards and a touchdown.

GAME NOTES: The highlighted game of week No. 8 features the only two undefeated teams in Conference play and could go a long way towards determining who wins the OVC Championship this season. ECU has already played four OVC games and beaten two teams who are currently tied for second in the standings. Tennessee State is currently 2-0 in OVC play and has five games left including this week's matchup. The teams have played 20 times previously, with ECU winning 18 of those games including the last eight in the series. The team's met on the last weekend of the regular season last year and ECU won 20-3.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State is coming off a win at Tennessee Tech in which they scored three first quarter touchdowns and never looked back on the way to the 17-point victory. The Tigers outrushed the Golden Eagles 320 to 131 on the ground as a pair of TSU players broke the 100-yard plateau. Tennessee State's Javaris Williams had his 12th career 100-yard game, as he netted 101 yards on 15 carries (6.7 yards/carry). Junior QB Antonio Heffner was the rushing leader, gaining 139 yards on 14 carries (9.9 yards/carry); he also passed for 138 yards and tossed three touchdowns passes. Heffner completed his 20 passes to just three different receivers (Kwame Patrick, Brandon Belvin and Chris Johnson), each of whom scored on a touchdown reception. With the victory over Tennessee Tech, the Tigers put themselves into the driver's seat in the Sgt. York Trophy series. The inaugural trophy will go to the Tigers outright if they are able to beat UT Martin in the season finale on Nov. 17. A loss to the Skyhawks in that game will give the Tigers a share of the title with Austin Peay (who they defeated earlier this season in overtime).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky moved to 4-0 in the OVC for the first time since 1997 with a 44-17 victory over Southeast Missouri on Saturday. The 1997 season was the last time the Colonels qualified for the FCS Playoffs; the Colonels own the FCS record with 17 all-time playoff appearances. The team is also getting a little more respect from the pollsters, as they moved up to No. 21 in the Sports Network Poll and jumped to No. 21 in the FCS Coaches Poll after not being ranked in that one a week ago. ECU won the game with another impressive performance from QB Allan Holland and a defense that held Southeast Missouri to 0-of-11 on third-down conversions. Holland, who was the OVC Offensive Player of the Week a week ago, actually bettered his performance from that award-winning week by throwing for a career-high 361 yards in the win. He completed passes of 57, 48, 38 and 37 yards in the victory without throwing an interception. He did not throw a touchdown pass but did run for a score. RB's Bobby Washington and Mark Dunn combined for 93 yards and four touchdowns (2 apiece). The multiple touchdown game for Dunn was the eighth of his career; ECU is 8-0 over the last two years when Dunn scores a touchdown. Senior LB Justin Curry finished the game with a team-high nine tackles. He also forced and recovered a fumble on SEMO's 6-yard line that led to the Colonels first score of the game.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech travels to Jacksonville State for the 11th meeting in the history of the programs. JSU has won the last two, including an overtime contest a season ago. The game marks the return for TTU head coach Watson Brown to Jacksonville. Brown was an assistant coach under Jim Fuller (who is now the JSU athletics director) in the 1976 and 1977 seasons. The Gamecocks posted a 17-7 record in that time period and were the NCAA Division II national runners-up in 1977. The game is Homecoming for JSU; the team is 51-8-2 all-time in Homecoming contests, including 5-2 under head coach Jack Crowe.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech dropped its second straight game, falling 45-28 last Thursday at home to Tennessee State. The loss dropped the Golden Eagles to 1-2 this season in Sgt. York Trophy games, ending the team's hopes of winning the trophy in its inaugural season. Already without its first and second string quarterbacks, Tech lost Cass Barnes, its third stringer, to an injury before half-time. That forced junior WR Steven Brown into action, as he played the entire second half as the signal caller. Brown did admirably, going 9-for-14 for 105 yards and a touchdown and rushed for another touchdown. All-purpose back Henry Sailes accounted for 212 total yards on the night on just six total plays. He had three rushes for 98 yards, a catch for 23 yards and two kickoff returns of 45 and 46 yards. Corey Reed was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after a 15-tackle effort in the loss; Reed also added four tackles-for-loss in the game. Xavier Purdy added a career-high 10 tackles in the contest. Derek White was held to only 39 net yards on 18 carries in the loss to TSU; he needs 103 yards to reach 1,000 for the season. White still ranks in the Top 10 nationally in rushing yards/game.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: For the first time since the pre-season, Jacksonville State is receiving votes in the national polls again. Jacksonville State won its third straight game and remained just one game out of the top spot in the OVC with a 42-9 victory over Jacksonville State in a game that was telecast on ESPNU. QB Cedric Johnson was a big part of the win as he rushed for four touchdowns, becoming the first player in school history to do that in a single game. He finished the night 10-for-13 passing for 139 yards and carried the ball eight times for 94 yards, meaning that half the time he rushed the ball he scored a touchdown. He was named both the OVC Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week, marking the first time since the last week of last season that a player had won both awards (then it was TTU's Lee Sweeney). Johnson now leads JSU in both rushing and passing. Senior WR Taurean Rhetta extended his school-record for consecutive games with a catch to 28 in the victory; he now has 1,433 career receiving yards, which is just outside of seventh place in school history. Junior punter Zach Walden was named OVC Specialist of the Week after averaging 48.5 yards per punt and pinning both punts inside the Austin Peay 20-yard line; six of his last eight punts overall have been inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Alexander Henderson intercepted a pass on APSU's third play from scrimmage; he is the seventh different JSU player to intercept a pass this season.
