THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Last week saw only three Conference games as three teams (Austin Peay, Jacksonville State, Southeast Missouri) were on byes...In each the winning team snapped a losing streak with the victory...Eastern Illinois held off a late rally from Tennessee Tech as did Eastern Kentucky who topped UT Martin...Tennessee State fell from the ranks of the unbeatens in OVC play, as TSU lost 9-6 to Murray State at home...That leaves Eastern Kentucky, Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State in a three-way tie for first place, as each have only one Conference loss...Eastern Kentucky defensive back Patrick McClellan picked off two passes, recovered a fumble that led to a Colonel score and had seven tackles in his team's win over UT Martin; that performance earned him National Defensive Player of the Week honors by each the Sports Network and College Sporting News...It marks the third straight week the OVC has had the National Defensive Player of the Week...The Sports Network released its updated Payton and Buchanan Award Watch Lists on Friday, and JSU quarterback Ryan Perrilloux and Murray State defensive lineman Austen Lane remained on their respective lists; both were on the initial watch lists released in the preseason...In the latest national polls, three OVC teams are ranked for the fifth-straight week; Jacksonville State is now No. 12, Eastern Kentucky is No. 20 and Eastern Illinois is No. 24...After not having two ranked teams match off with each other in nearly three years until nationally-ranked ECU and EIU played earlier this season, the OVC will see it again this week as No. 24 Eastern Illinois travels to No. 12 Jacksonville State on Saturday...Jax State's ranking is tied for the best in Division I school history...Eastern Kentucky will travel to Austin Peay, Murray State heads to UT Martin and Tennessee Tech hosts Southeast Missouri.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Garnett Phelps, WR • Sr., 5-10, 170 • Louisville, Ky. • Eastern Kentucky

Phelps had career-highs in both receptions (7) and receiving yards (118) as No. 23 Eastern Kentucky topped UT Martin 31-25 on Saturday. Phelps also hauled in two more catches for 12 yards that were ruled laterals and counted towards his rushing total and not his receiving stats. In the first quarter he pulled in a pass from T.J. Pryor and went 45-yards for a touchdown to put ECU up 14-0. For the day, five of his seven receptions resulted in Colonel first downs. He is the first wide receiver named OVC Offensive Player of the Week since Oct. 5 of last season.

DEFENSIVE

Patrick McClellan, DB • So., 6-3, 204 • Maineville, Ohio • Eastern Kentucky

McClellan was involved in three of Eastern Kentucky's five takeaways in the nationally-ranked Colonels 31-25 win over UT Martin. That included netting his first two collegiate interceptions, including one at his team's own 14-yard line in the third quarter. His other interception came in the first quarter as ECU built a 14-0 advantage. Late in the fourth quarter McClellan recovered a fumble on a muffed Skyhawk punt, grabbing the ball at the UTM four-yard line and setting up the team's final (and game-winning) score. McClellan also added a season-high seven tackles.

SPECIALIST

Kienan Cullen, P/K • So., 6-3, 224 • Louisville, Ky. • Murray State

Cullen accounted for all nine points in Murray State's 9-6 road victory over Tennessee State on Saturday. He hit a 36-yarder on the team's opening drive and later added a 24-yard field goal in the second quarter. His most important field goal of the night came with 2:29 left in the game, as he nailed a 40-yarder to seal the victory. Cullen also handled punting duties, punting six times for an average of 34.3 yards, including a pair of punts that were downed at the TSU two and six-yard line. He had a long punt of 51 yards in the fourth quarter.

NEWCOMER

T.J. Pryor, QB • R-Fr., 6-2, 181 • Louisville, Ky. • Eastern Kentucky

Pryor completed 19-of-33 passes for 235 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions in leading No. 23 Eastern Kentucky to a 31-25 victory over UT Martin on Saturday. Pryor led the Colonels on a scoring drive to open the game, connecting on a 12-yard touchdown pass with Shannon Davis. Later in the quarter he hit Garnett Phelps for a 45-yard touchdown to put ECU up 14-0. On the day Pryor completed passes to seven different receivers as Eastern jumped back into a tie for first place in the OVC. Pryor ranks 27th nationally in passing efficiency (140.90) and 40th nationally in total offense (220.83 yards/game). It marks the second time he has been named Newcomer of the Week this season (Oct. 4 was the other time).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Three OVC Teams Ranked For Fifth Straight Week; Jacksonville State Equals Highest Ranking Ever: For the fifth straight week, three OVC teams are ranked in the national polls. In this week's FCS Coaches Poll Jacksonville State is No. 12, Eastern Kentucky is No. 20 and Eastern Illinois is No. 24. In the Sports Network poll Jacksonville State is No. 13, Eastern Kentucky is No. 21 and Eastern Illinois is No. 25. The OVC is one of just five Conferences to have three or more ranked teams in the poll. The No. 12 nationally ranking for Jacksonville State matches its highest ranking since joining the FCS/I-AA ranks in 1995. The Gamecocks were also ranked 12th on Oct. 18, 2004 (a year they went on to win the OVC Championship). It is the highest an OVC team has been ranked since Eastern Kentucky was No. 9 in the Nov. 19, 2007 Sports Network poll.

Two Ranked OVC Foes to Square Off This Week (Second Time It Has Happened This Season): For the second time this season two nationally-ranked OVC foes will square off on the gridiron. This week is it No. 24 Eastern Illinois traveling to No. 12 Jacksonville State for a 1 p.m. CT kickoff. Earlier this season it was No. 18 Eastern Kentucky who went to Charleston, Ill. and topped No. 23 Eastern Illinois 36-31 on Oct. 3. The very competitive game saw EIU lead 16-7 early and EIU come back to take a 24-16 in the third quarter. But the Colonels would eventually pull ahead and hold off a late Panther rally to secure the victory. Prior to this season two OVC ranked foes had not squared off against each other since Oct. 28, 2006 (when No. 12 UT Martin topped No. 14 Eastern Illinois 15-9).

Jacksonville State/Eastern Illinois Game to Be Featured as FCS Game of the Week Radio Broadcast: In a change from the original schedule, this week's game between Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State has been selected for the FCS Game of the Week radio broadcast as announced by David Brody, president and co-founder of Broadcaster Marketing Services. This marks the fourth year for the FCS Game of the Week series. The games are brought to the public by Clear Channel Communications, Gino Communications and Broadcaster Marketing Services and heard on the 50,000-watt WCKY AM 1530 out of Cincinnati (on a delayed basis at 9 p.m. CT the night of the game and online at www.1530homer.com). Frank Santore returns for his fourth year as play-by-play voice and will be joined by Chris Goforth. The broadcast was originally to be Murray State at UT Martin, but due to some logistics issues, the game was switched to EIU/JSU.

EKU's McClellan Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 19): Eastern Kentucky defensive back **Patrick McClellan** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and a National All-Star by College Sporting News on Oct. 19 after his outing in the Colonels win over UT Martin. McClellan was involved in three of Eastern Kentucky's five takeaways against the Skyhawks, including netting his first two collegiate interceptions. One pick came on his team's own 14-yard line in the third quarter and the other interception came in the first quarter as EIU built a 14-0 advantage. Late in the fourth quarter McClellan recovered a fumble on a muffed Skyhawk punt, grabbing the ball at the UTM four-yard line and setting up the team's final (and game-winning) score. McClellan also added a season-high seven tackles. It marks the third straight week the OVC has had the National Defensive Player of the Week.

EIU Retires Tony Romo's No. 17: Eastern Illinois retired **Tony Romo's** No. 17 jersey on Oct. 17 in a game against Tennessee Tech. Romo, the two-time All Pro quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys, was on-hand in Charleston for the Hall of Fame weekend during his bye week with the Cowboys. He was the first EIU football player to have his number retired. Romo was the Panthers starting quarterback from 2000-02, leading the team to three straight FCS playoff berths and winning three straight OVC Player of the Year awards. In 2002 he was named the Walter Payton Award winner (top Offensive Player in FCS/I-AA) and finished his OVC career with 85 touchdown passes.

JSU's Perrilloux Remains on Updated Walter Payton Award Watch List: Jacksonville State senior quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** was one of 20 players named to the updated Walter Payton Award Watch List released on Oct. 16. He was also on the preseason watch list for the award which is presented to the FCS Offensive Player of the Year. Perrilloux ranks first nationally in passing efficiency and points responsible for and has been named OVC Offensive Player of the Week four straight weeks in 2009, becoming the first player in OVC history to accomplish that feat. In 2008 Perrilloux completed 187-of-297 for 2,318 yards on his way to second-team All-OVC honors. The LaPlace, La, native was named OVC Player or Newcomer of the Week seven times during the 2008 season after he led the Gamecocks to an 8-3 record. The watch list will be revised again in November before the final ballot is announced. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night prior to the NCAA Division I championship game. The Eddie Robinson Award (top FCS Coach) and Buck Buchanan Award (top FCS Defensive Player) will also be presented that night.

Murray State's Lane Remains on Buck Buchanan Award Watch Lists: Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** is one of 20 players named to the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List on Oct. 16. He was also on the preseason watch list for the award which honors the best defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Lane ranks in the Top 10 nationally in both sacks and tackles-for-loss per game this season. Last season Lane has garnered national attention after putting together a 2008 campaign that consisted of school records in sacks (12.0) and tackles-for-loss (22.0), both of which ranked among the national leaders. The efforts earned him Sporting News Fabulous 50 All-America honors, as well as Third-Team All-America honors from the *Associated Press*. The award, established in 1995, is named after Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame, defensive lineman who played for Grambling State from 1959 through 1962. He was selected to the NFL's All-Time Roster, indicative of his standing as one of the greatest football players of all time. Buchanan died of cancer July 16, 1992. His uniform number, 86, was retired by Kansas City in 1992. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. 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NCAA Division I championship game. The Walter Payton Award and the Eddie Robinson Award will also be presented that night.

APSU's White Nets Third-Highest Rushing Game in FCS This Season: Austin Peay sophomore **Ryan White** rushed for a career-best 228 yards on 32 carries in the Governors win at Southeast Missouri on Oct. 10. The output was the second-highest in APSU history (trailing only a 244-yard effort by Floyd Jones in 1981) and is the third highest among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) players in 2009. The only two performances better than White's so far this season is a 273-yard outing by Southern Illinois' Deji Karim and a 229-yard effort by Savannah State's Justin Babb. White also rushed for 210 yards earlier this season against Newberry, the sixth-highest total among FCS players this year. White now has five 100-plus yard rushing games in his two-year career, tied for most among active OVC rushers.

Perrilloux Becomes Mr. Efficient: Jacksonville State quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** has a 195.13 passing efficiency this season, which is tops at the Division I level (both FCS and FBS). In his five starts he has completed 71-of-116 passes for 15 touchdowns and just one interception. His 277.63 passing efficiency rating against UT Martin on Oct. 3 was the highest in the OVC since Jax State joined the league in 2003 and fifth-highest in FCS football this season (and second-highest against FCS opponents this year).

NCAA Stat Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical rankings Jacksonville State quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** continues to rank first nationally in passing efficiency (195.13), a mark that leads all of Division I (FCS and FBS). He also ranks first in points responsible for (21.60/game) and 10th in total offense (291.80 yards/game). Austin Peay running back/return specialist **Terrence Holt** is second nationally in all-purpose yards (207.33/game) while his teammate and backfield mate, sophomore running back **Ryan White**, is fourth nationally in rushing (116.3 yards/game). Jacksonville State defensive back **T.J. Heath** is first nationally in passes defended (2.00/game) and third nationally in interceptions (0.83/game). Eastern Kentucky defensive back **Jeremy Caldwell** is second nationally in interceptions (1.00 interceptions/game) and fifth in passes defended (1.83/game). Murray State's **Austen Lane** is seventh in sacks (1.00/game) and fourth in tackles-for-loss (1.92/game) while his teammate **Derrick Townsel** ranks fourth in punt returns (20.13 yards/return) and fellow teammate **Marcus Harris** is eighth in kickoffs (29.33 yards/return). In national team rankings Jacksonville State is fourth in scoring offense (37.33 points/game), fourth in turnover margin (+2.00/game), second in fumbles recovered (12), third in interceptions thrown (2), seventh in turnovers gained (18) and second in passing efficiency (173.49). Eastern Kentucky is fifth in rushing defense (74.33 yards/game) and ninth in tackles for loss (8.00/game). Murray State ranks sixth in kick returns (19.13 yards/return), second in punt returns (22.27 yards/game) and seventh in red zone offense (92%). Eastern Illinois is fourth in third down conversions (47.87%) and third in fumbles recovered (11).

Spoo Now Fifth All-Time in OVC Wins: With a victory over Austin Peay on Sept. 26, Eastern Illinois head coach **Bob Spoo** moved into fifth place on the OVC all-time career Conference victory list. Spoo has won 62 OVC games in his tenure at EIU, which has spanned the school's entire time in the OVC (1996 through the present, although he was not on the sidelines for the 2006 season). Spoo trails only Roy Kidd (207 OVC wins at EKU), Boots Donnelly (102 wins at Austin Peay and Middle Tennessee), Charles Murphy (73 wins at Middle Tennessee) and Jimmy Feix (67 wins at Western Kentucky) on the all-time list.

2009 Marks Third Season For Sgt. York Trophy; Tennessee Tech Takes Early Lead: The 2009 season marks the third season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York

play in 2009 to claim its second trophy; the Tigers are 5-1 all-time in Sgt. York games. The first Sgt. York contest of 2009 was on Oct. 3 when Tennessee Tech topped Austin Peay 31-23 and that was followed by a 35-28 win by Tennessee Tech over UT Martin. Tennessee Tech is now 2-0 in the competition and can clinch the title on Oct. 31 when they host Tennessee Tech.

OVC Teams Against FBS Opponents: OVC schools are 0-8 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) opponents, although two of those games went down to the wire with a chance for the OVC team to pull off a win. In week No. 1 Eastern Kentucky had the ball on Indiana's 5-yard line before a fumble ended what looked like to be a for-sure scoring drive. IU held on for a 19-13 victory. During week No. 2 Jacksonville State led Florida State 9-7 for most of the contest before the Seminoles came up with two scores in the final 35 seconds to win 19-9. All-time the OVC is 17-128-1 against FBS opponents. The last time an OVC team knocked off a FBS school was during the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. The next games (and final ones of the season) against an FBS school for an OVC team is Nov. 7 when Eastern Kentucky is at Kentucky and Tennessee Tech is at Georgia.

Crowd of 104,488 Witnesses Eastern Illinois/Penn State Game: When Eastern Illinois played at Penn State on Oct. 10, a crowd of 104,488 witnessed the game. That marked the largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play football besting the previous mark of 85,754 that saw Tennessee Tech play at Auburn during the 200 season. Several other OVC teams have played in front of big crowds this season, including Jacksonville State who played in front of 71,420 fans at Florida State on Sept. 12. That is the sixth largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play. On that same day Murray State played in front of 55,510 at N.C. State and on Sept. 26 Tennessee State played Florida A&M in front of 51,950 at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta.

Two of the Longest Tenured Division I Coaches Meet: When Eastern Illinois played at Penn State on Oct. 10, the matchup showcased two of the top five longest tenured coaches with the same school at the Division I level. Penn State coach **Joe Paterno** is the longest tenured active coach in Division I (at the same school), having been at Penn State since 1966. Eastern Illinois coach **Bob Spoo** is the fifth longest tenured coach, having been at Eastern Illinois since 1987. The two coaches have combined for over 500 victories. Penn State won the game 52-3.

Dillehay Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 12): Tennessee Tech junior defensive back **Dustin Dillehay** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and a National All-Star by College Sporting News on Oct. 12 after his outing against UT Martin. Dillehay had 14 tackles (10 solo) and intercepted a pass that he returned 41 yards for what proved to be the game-winning touchdown in the Golden Eagles 35-28 road victory. With his team leading 28-21, Dillehay picked off UTM quarterback Cade Thompson and returned the ball 41 yards for a score to put the Golden Eagles up 35-21 with 8:11 to play. It marks the second straight week the OVC has had the National Defensive Player of the Week.

Heath Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 5): Jacksonville State defensive back **T.J. Heath** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 5 after a three interception performance against UT Martin. On the fourth play from scrimmage, the junior intercepted UT Martin quarterback Cade Thompson and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown. Just eight plays later Heath did the same thing, this time taking it 55 yards for a touchdown making the score 14-0 before Jacksonville State even ran an offensive play from scrimmage. He added his third interception in the fourth quarter and finished the game with three tackles and a pass break-up. The three interceptions was the most by a JSU player in the school's Division I era.

Caldwell Named National All-Star By College Sporting News (Oct. 5): Eastern Kentucky defensive back **Jeremy Caldwell** was named a National All-Star (Defensive Player of the Week) after his performance in the Colonels road win over nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois. The sophomore intercepted two passes, including returning one for a touchdown in what proved to be the game-winning score, and forced a fumble at the end of the game to preserve the 36-31 victory. Caldwell picked off a pass in the third quarter, an interception that led to an EKU score as the Colonels trimmed the EIU lead to 24-23. With 11 minutes to play in the game, he picked off another pass and returned it 10 yards for a touchdown. With 12 seconds left in the game he forced Panther quarterback Jake Christensen to fumble as EKU recovered and took a knee to end the game. Caldwell added seven tackles, a pass break-up and 78 kickoff return yards in the game.

JSU's Perrilloux Named National Weekly All-Star By College Sporting News (Sept. 28): Jacksonville State's Ryan Perrilloux was named a National Weekly All-Star by the College Sporting News on Sept. 28. In the return to his native Louisiana, Perrilloux accounted for five touchdowns (four passing, one rushing) for the second straight week as Jacksonville State pounded Nicholls State 60-10. He finished the game 14-of-22 for 250 yards and four touchdowns (of 17, 44, 14 and 6 yards) and added 58 rushing yards and a score (38 yard rush) to account for 308 total yards of offense in just three quarters of play (he sat out the fourth quarter). He finished with a passing efficiency of 219.09, the third best total in school history. He became the first Gamecock to post back-to-back five-touchdown games in school history.

Murray State's Harris Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 7): Murray State junior **Marcus Harris** was honored by The Sports Network on Sept. 7 as the FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week. Harris was honored after becoming the first Racer to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game. He accomplished the task by taking a kickoff back 86 yards with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter to put the Racers ahead 52-10. After hauling in a 13-yard touchdown reception on the next Racers' possession, Harris fielded a punt on his own 25 and raced untouched up the middle for the 75-yard touchdown. Harris finished the game with 83 yards on two punt returns and 125 yards on two kickoff returns. He added 17 yard receiving and finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards.

The Safety Dance: No we are not talking about the Men Without Hats song, but the Murray State defense. In the Racers season-opening victory over Kentucky Wesleyan, the defense recorded

two safeties which tied the OVC (and Murray State) single-game record done three other times (most recently in 1996 by Middle Tennessee). To put it into perspective on how rare that is, only two OVC schools have had two safeties during an entire season over the last four years.

Three OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for Campbell Trophy: Three Ohio Valley Conference student-athletes have been named semifinalists for the 20th Anniversary William V. Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced Thursday. The three student-athletes are **Daniel Becker** (Austin Peay), **Derek Hardman** (Eastern Kentucky) and **Josh Cain** (Jacksonville State). The three are among 154 semifinals for the Campbell Trophy (formerly known as the Draddy Trophy), endowed by HealthSouth, and are three of just 37 candidates from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their respective schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in his final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first-team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed this fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship. The NFF Awards Committee will select and announce up to 15 finalists, Oct. 29. Each finalist will be recognized as part of the 2009 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, receiving an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The Campbell Trophy winner, who will have his scholarship increased to \$25,000, will be announced live at the NFF's Annual Awards Dinner, Dec. 8 at the prestigious Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. A total distribution of \$277,000 in scholarships will be awarded that evening.

From Navy Pilot to Assistant Coach: Austin Peay's new offensive graduate assistant coach **Craig Candeto** has spent the last six years in the Navy as a fighter pilot, a member of Strike Fighter Squadron 106 "Gladiators" stationed in Virginia Beach, Va., flying T-34, T-45 and F/A-18 jets. The former lieutenant retired from the Navy earlier this year and now is going from piloting a \$57 million Super Hornet aircraft to taking flight as the Governors quarterbacks coach. But before his military career, Candeto was a sports star in his own right who shares an NCAA record. The Deland, Fla., native was a two-sport prep star, earning the 1999 6A Florida State High School Player of the Year award. He earned an appointment to the Naval Academy, where he enjoyed a storied athletic career. It was at quarterback where Candeto achieved his greatest stardom. In 2002, he rushed for six touchdowns in Navy's 58-12 win against Army—those six rushing TDs matched the NCAA record for rushing TDs by a quarterback. In total, he accounted for seven TDs in the game. Candeto is one of just 26 FBS quarterback to have rushed and pass for 1,000 or more yards, respectively. He earned the 2002 and 2003 Rubino Memorial Silver Helmet award as the Outstanding Football Player at the Naval Academy. As co-captain in 2003, he quarterbacked a Navy football team that won three games in the previous three seasons and guided it to an 8-5 record and its first bowl appearance in seven years. That same Navy team led the nation in rushing. Candeto also is a member of the Navy Athletic Hall of Fame.

Jacksonville State Ineligible for OVC Championship/Postseason Play: In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State University received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship. Jacksonville State will still play a full Conference schedule in 2009 with wins and losses counting for both teams. They will just not be eligible for the title and will be listed at the bottom of the standings with an asterisk.

Eastern Kentucky Tabbed Preseason Favorite: In what was one of the most balanced votes in the history of preseason OVC balloting (five different teams got at least one first-place votes), defending champion Eastern Kentucky was tabbed the preseason favorite by the league head coaches and sports information directors. EKU received 10 of the 18 first-place votes followed by UT Martin (4 first-place votes), Eastern Illinois (2), Tennessee State (1) and Murray State (1). It marks the 17th time that the Colonels have been picked to win the OVC Championship in the preseason poll. But is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 30 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (40.0%). In each of the last six years, the predicted champion has failed to claim the regular season title. The last time the preseason predicted champion went on to win the title was in 2002 when Eastern Illinois accomplished the feat (EIU also did that same thing in 2001).

Thompson and Lane Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: UT Martin senior quarterback **Cade Thompson**, the 2008 OVC Offensive Player, was tabbed the Preseason Player of the Year this season after throwing for 2,680 yards and 24 touchdowns as a junior. Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** was picked as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in both sacks (1.0) and tackles-for-loss (1.83) per game last season. Those two players led the selections of this season's Preseason All-OVC Teams. Murray State had six selections to the team, the most of any OVC school. The Racers were followed by UT Martin who had five selections and Jacksonville State who had four picks. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (8 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2008. Of the 26 total selections, 21 were seniors (including the entire offensive unit), four were juniors and there was one sophomore pick. All nine teams had at least one player appear on the squad.

Head Coaches All Return: For the first time since the 2004 season, every head coach in the OVC

CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Eastern Kentucky is looking for its 32nd consecutive winning season in 2009. The Colonels have not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 overall in 1977 (the second longest streak in Division I). You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (now the longest streak in Division I after Michigan had a losing season in 2008).

returns to coach the same team they did last season. All nine coaches are back including the Dean of OVC Coaches, **Bob Spoo** of Eastern Illinois. Spoo is beginning his 22nd season on the sidelines with the Panthers in 2009 (23rd season overall after missing 2006 with an illness). Spoo is the fifth longest active tenured head coach at the Division I level (tied with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer) and trails only Joe Paterno (at Penn State since 1966), Bob Ford (at Albany since 1973), Bobby Bowden (at Florida State since 1976) and Andy Talley (at Villanova since 1985).

Six OVC Schools Have Former FBS Quarterbacks Under Center This Season: This season there are currently six OVC schools with at least one former Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) quarterback competing for the starting job. Three of the quarterbacks are for sure the starter, including **Ryan Perrilloux** (LSU) starting for the second year at Jacksonville State and 2008 OVC Player of the Year **Cade Thompson** (South Carolina) starting for the third year at UT Martin. Two other schools have a pair of former FBS signal callers on the depth chart. That includes Eastern Illinois who has **Jake Christensen** (Iowa) as the starter and **Bodie Reeder** (Wyoming) as the backup while Tennessee Tech who has **Lee Sweeney** (Louisville) as the starter with **Clint Brewster** (Minnesota) on the bench. At Tennessee State **Dominic Grooms** (Missouri) is in the mix at quarterback while **T.C. Jennings** (Arkansas State) is the backup at Austin Peay.

FCS Playoffs: For the 13th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 18 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 28 and continue with second round games on Dec. 5 and semifinal contests on Dec. 11/Dec. 12 before the title game. This will mark the final year under the 16-team playoff format. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved a new budget for the Division I Football Championships, which allowed the postseason bracket to expand from 16 to 20 teams beginning in the 2010 season. It marks the first expansion since the playoff field grew from 12 to 16 in 1997. In 2010, the field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8 now) and 10 at-large berths (up from 8 now).

FCS Playoffs - Part 2: The OVC will be looking to get multiple teams into the FCS Playoffs for the third time in four years this season. Last year marked the first time since 2005 that just one OVC team (league champion Eastern Kentucky) made the 16-team playoff field. Two other teams (Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) finished with eight Division I victories but did not receive an at-large bid. It marked the first time since the playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986 that an OVC team with eight Division I teams did not receive an at-large bid. ECU lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round last season.

Eastern Kentucky Searches For 32nd Consecutive Winning Season, 37th Consecutive Non-Losing Season: Eastern Kentucky enters the 2009 season looking for its 32nd consecutive winning season. The team's current streak of 31 consecutive winning season is second in Division I only to the 32-straight by Florida State. Eastern has not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 in 1977. The Colonels also have now had 36 consecutive non-losing seasons, as you have to go back all the way to 1972 to find a year ECU had a losing season (they were 5-6 that year, the only time in the last 42 years they have had a losing season). That streak is currently the longest in all of Division I, as the team overtook Michigan who suffered a losing season for the first time in 41 years in 2008.

The 62nd Season of Football: The 62nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football is underway this season. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2009. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the OVC have claimed at least one championship.

A Look Back at the 2008 Season: For the first time in 61 years of competition, the OVC finished the 2008 season with four teams with eight overall victories. The OVC was one of just two FCS conferences to have four or more teams with eight wins (the CAA was the other, who had five teams reach eight or more wins; each of those five CAA teams made the playoffs while only one OVC school made the field). Eastern Kentucky claimed its 20th OVC Championship (the second most crowns in FCS history trailing only the CAA's UMass who has 21; however, ECU's 16 outright conference crowns are the most in FCS history) and second in a row. The Colonels made their 19th FCS Playoff berth (tied for most all-time with Montana) and lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC and SportsUnlimited Announce Launch of OVC Football Magazine: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced the launch and production of "Ohio Valley Conference Football 2009" a full-color, limited edition football magazine that previews the 2009 football season. The venture with SportsUnlimited ships in late August. Detailed feature articles on all nine OVC teams are included in the publication. For the first time, OVC football will be featured in a full-color magazine dedicated to its nine schools and suitable for display on your coffee table year round. To order your copy log onto www.collegesportsmags.com. The cost of the publication is \$4.99 plus tax and shipping.

OVCsports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first three seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2009 season, 15 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the season (12 active, 2 practice squad members, one IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout **Tony Romo**, who is the starting quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys and two-time Pro Bowl pick, defensive back **Cortland Finnegan** (Samford) who was a Pro Bowl selection with the Tennessee Titans last year and Tennessee State's **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who was a starter with the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII in February. There is one player on a NFL roster who played in the OVC last season, **Pierre Walters** (Eastern Illinois) who is with the Kansas City Chiefs. **Javarris Williams** (Tennessee State) is also with the Chiefs but as a member of the practice squad to start the season, as is former Tennessee State offensive lineman **Cecil Newton** who is on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad.. Six of nine current OVC schools have at least one player on a NFL roster with Southeast Missouri State leading the way with three. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - **Brad Childress** (Minnesota) and **Sean Payton** (New Orleans). Another EIU alumni - **Mike Shanahan** - is out of coaching this year but should be back with a team in 2010. UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach **Jerry Reese** made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to the Super Bowl XLII Championship in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2009 season marks the third of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games.

GAME NOTES: Two nationally-ranked OVC foes will square off this week in Jacksonville, marking the second time in the OVC this season two ranked teams have matched up against each other. Eastern Illinois is coming off a victory over Tennessee Tech, which ended a two-game skid, while Jacksonville State, winners of four in a row, is coming off a bye week. Since Jax State joined the OVC in 2003, this series has been deadlocked, as each team has won three of the six meetings. Last season the Gamecocks snapped a three-game losing streak in the series with a 23-10 win over then No. 20-ranked EIU in Charleston. JSU scored the first 23 points of the game in pulling away from the Panthers. Ryan Perrilloux completed 20-of-25 passes for 281 yards and a touchdown and pushed for 19 yards and two more scores. On the day the Gamecocks had 201 rushing yards while holding EIU to just 20 net yards on the ground.

GAME NOTES: Coming off a bye week Southeast Missouri State travels to Cookeville to battle Tennessee Tech. The two teams have played 17 times over the years with the last six meetings being some of the most exciting in the series. Those six games have been decided by a combined 25 points (average margin of victory 4.2 points) with no game being decided by more than a touchdown (and an overtime game in the mix). Tennessee Tech has won the last three, which have come after Southeast Missouri won three straight. Last year's meeting, which was televised on ESPNU, was a back-and-forth affair with the game being decided in the fourth quarter when Derrian Waters scored from 2-yards out to put TTU on top 29-27. The game also included a 63-yard touchdown run by Tech's Henry Sailes, a play that made SportsCenter's Top 10 that day. Sailes finished the game with 113 yards rushing and 51 yards receiving. Lee Sweeney threw for 229 yards for the Golden Eagles.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: After a home loss to nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky and a road loss to nationally-ranked FBS foe Penn State, Eastern Illinois got back in the win column with a 23-15 victory at home over Tennessee Tech. On a day the Panthers retired Tony Romo's No. 17, the football team jumped out to a 20-0 lead late in the third quarter and held off a Golden Eagle rally attempt. Eastern rushed for 166 yards as a team, with Mon Williams leading the way with 81 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Jake Christensen tossed for 182 yards and a touchdown and rushed nine times for 40 additional yards. Defensive back CJ James intercepted a pass and returned it 27 yards while also adding four tackles and a pass break-up. One key to the game was third down efficiency, as EIU converted on 7-of-16 attempts (44%) while limiting TTU to just 2-of-13 (15%). Eastern has been good all season on third down, averaging 47.87 percent, which ranks fourth nationally. EIU is once again ranked in both national polls after being ranked in only the FCS Coaches poll last week. The Panthers are No. 24 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 25 in the Sports Network poll.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri is coming off a bye week. The Redhawks were last in action on Oct. 10 when they hosted their Homecoming game against Austin Peay. The first half saw Henry Harris run for a touchdown in the second quarter as SEMO held a 7-3 advantage at halftime. In the third quarter Bryan Blanford picked off a pass and returned it 69 yards for a touchdown to put the Redhawks up 14-3 with 5:57 to play in that quarter. But the Redhawks defense was unable to hold off the Govs, who scored three fourth quarter touchdowns to pull ahead and win 24-14. The Southeast passing attack netted just 29 yards, while the Redhawks did manage 125 rushing yards, with Mike Jones leading the way with 54 yards. Philip Klaproth had 14 tackles while Eddie Calvin and Blanford added 10 apiece. Justin Woodlief and Aris Bowen also added picks for the Redhawks.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Despite a 23-15 road loss to nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois on Saturday, Tennessee Tech finds itself at 3-3 overall and 2-2 in the league after six games. Despite getting down 20-0 late in the third quarter, the Golden Eagles fought back to tie the game near the end of the contest. After the score was 20-0, TTU got a safety near the end of the third quarter. On the ensuing possession Lee Sweeney hooked up with Alden Olverson for a 29-yard touchdown to make the score 20-8. With 3:54 to go Sweeney found Colin Allen for an 11-yard score to pull Tech within five points. EIU added a field goal to increase the margin to eight. On the next kickoff Maurice Wallace took the kick 81 yards to the EIU 18-yard line. Sweeney completed one pass for four yards but a fourth down pass from the 14-yard line was incomplete and ended the game. Sweeney completed 19 passes for 198 yards and two scores while Allen hauling in six catches for 80 yards. Kelechi Ordu had 12 tackles while Taron Ryce added eight tackles, an interception, a sack and three pass breakups.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State had last week to rest and get healthy as the team's bye week came after a 41-7 road victory over Murray State. The Gamecocks offense continues to be potent, as they rank fourth nationally in scoring offense (37.33 points/game). Over the last four games the team has averaged 49.5 points a contest, not scoring less than 41 points in any of those games. JSU is also 10th nationally in total offense, averaging 434.83 yards/game. Quarterback Ryan Perrilloux continues to be efficient, as he is first nationally in each passing efficiency (195.13) and points responsible for (21.60/game). Against Murray State two weeks ago he completed 18-of-29 passes for 323 yards and three touchdowns. The Gamecocks also got the rushing game going against the Racers, netting 254 yards as a team. Jamal Young led the way by rushing for 72 yards and two touchdowns. Defensive back T.J. Heath had two interceptions in the win over the Racers, which followed a three-interception performance against UT Martin the week prior. Heath now ranks third nationally in interceptions (0.83/game). The Gamecocks continue to be ranked No. 12 nationally, which equals the program's highest ranking since joining the Division I ranks (they were also No. 12 in 2004).

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky and Austin Peay matchup for the 42nd time on the gridiron on Saturday in Clarksville. EKU has dominated the series, winning 38 of the 41 contests, including the last 22 in a row. Austin Peay has not topped the Colonels since winning 20-17 in 1977. The teams have only played twice since Austin Peay re-joined the league in 2007, and both have been close games. EKU won 28-14 in Clarksville in 2007 and 13-10 in overtime in Richmond a season ago. In that game EKU led 10-0 before a third quarter Austin Peay touchdown narrowed the margin and an Issac Ziolkowski 43-yard field goal with one second left in regulation knotted the game at 10. APSU got the first chance in overtime but a Ziolkowski 36-yard field goal attempt was wide right. Eastern then moved the ball to the 10-yard line and Taylor Long kicked a 27-yard field goal to end the game.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Coming off a home loss to Tennessee State, Eastern Kentucky got back on the winning track with a 31-25 Homecoming victory over UT Martin. On a day where the program honored its All-Century Football Team, the Colonels forced five turnovers which led to 14 points. For the season Eastern has forced 17 turnovers (12th nationally) and rank 16th nationally in turnover margin (+1.00/game). Sophomore Patrick McClellan played a big part of that, picking off two passes and recovering a fumble (which led to an EKU score). He also had seven tackles and was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News. Fellow sophomore Jeremy Caldwell, who was National Defensive Player of the Week three weeks ago, also picked off two passes and now has six interceptions on the season (which ranks second nationally). T.J. Pryor completed 19-of-33 passes for 235 yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC Newcomer of the Week honors. Senior wideout Garnett Phelps was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after pulling down seven catches for 118 yards and a 45-yard score. With the win the Colonels improved to 20-0 all-time against the Skyhawks. During the game Eastern blocked another kick; the Colonels have blocked seven kicks this season. Eastern Kentucky is now No. 20 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 21 in the Sports Network poll.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Fresh off a bye week Austin Peay brings the momentum of a 24-14 come-from-behind victory over Southeast Missouri State two weeks ago. Trailing 14-3 entering the fourth quarter, the Gobs scored three times to snap a four-game losing streak. Throwing for just 93 yards on the night, it was the rushing attack that carried the team, as Terrence Holt scored twice and Ryan White added another touchdown in that fourth quarter. White had a career-day, netting 228 yards (7.1 ypc), the third-highest single-game total in FCS football this season. White had 162 of those yards in the second half, including 97 in the fourth quarter. On the game-sealing touchdown drive, White accounted for 34 yards on the 13-play drive. Holt added 100 yards on the night, marking the second time this season the duo has rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game. Austin Peay also dominated the time of possession, holding the ball for 37:26 of the 60 minutes. Freshman safety Jeremy Ross was named OVC Newcomer of the Week after recovering a fumble and interception a pass, both of which led to APSU scores.

GAME NOTES: Murray State and UT Martin will battle on Saturday night for the 49th time in the series that dates back to 1924. The Racers hold a 34-13-1 advantage all-time and had won 13 in a row in the series before the Skyhawks won each of the last four seasons. Those four wins over the last four seasons have come by an average margin of victory of 31 points, with no game closer than 25 points (which was the margin in last year's 63-38 victory). Two years ago UTM won 76-34 in Murray. Last year's game saw Cade Thompson pass for 250 yards and four touchdowns while Brandyn Young rushed for 86 yards and a score. Defensive back Dontrell Miller returned both an interception and fumble recovery for defensive touchdowns. Murray State's Jeff Ehrhardt passes for 375 yards and four touchdowns while Derrick Townsel had nine catches for 161 yards and a score. Current Murray State coach Matt Griffin spent three seasons as head coach at UT Martin prior to taking over the Racers program.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State went on the road and topped previously undefeated in league play Tennessee State 9-6 on Saturday. The hero of the game was sophomore kicker/punter Kienan Cullen who accounted for all of his team's points in the contest. He hit a 36-yarder on his team's opening drive, a 24-yarder in the second quarter and a 40-yard attempt with 2:29 to play in the game to seal the victory. He also punted six times, pinning TSU inside its own 6-yard line twice and having a long punt of 51 yards (which came in the fourth quarter). Charlie Jordan led the rushing attack, carrying the ball 29 times for 97 yards. Senior All-American defensive lineman Austen Lane had six tackles, including 3.5 tackles-for-loss, and a sack in the victory. He now has 45.5 career tackles-for-loss, which established a new Murray State career record. Lane now ranks fourth nationally in tackles-for-loss (1.92/game) and seventh in sacks (1.00/game).

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin went on the road and lost 31-25 at No. 23 Eastern Kentucky on Saturday. It was the third straight loss for the Skyhawks who are now 1-3 in OVC games this season. Despite throwing four interceptions, Cade Thompson did complete 30-of-44 passes for 334 yards and three touchdowns, his best offensive output of the year. He connected with seven different receivers in the game and also rushed for a one-yard touchdown. Junior newcomer Bryant Milligan caught five passes for 85 yards and a touchdown. UTM is now 0-20 all-time against Eastern Kentucky, although the last three meetings have been decided by a total of 11 points. Josh Bey had 11 tackles for the Skyhawks. He now ranks 23rd nationally in tackles/game (9.86) and 22nd in sacks (0.79/game). Jamar Lawrence also added 11 tackles.
