THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Tennessee State remained the only undefeated team in OVC play with a 37-34 victory over in-state rival Austin Peay on Saturday night...Kicker Eric Benson capped off a perfect night with a 29-yard field goal with two seconds left to lift the Tigers to the victory; Benson was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week for his efforts in pushing TSU to 3-0 in OVC play (6-1 overall) on the season...UT Martin scored a 35-7 road victory over Tennessee Tech on Thursday night to improve to 4-1 in the OVC this season; the Skyhawks Dontrell Miller scored his fifth defensive touchdown of the season in the game, a mark that is believed to be a NCAA record...Jacksonville State rebounded following a loss to Eastern Kentucky last week and defeated Murray State 31-21 at home; the Gamecocks improved to 3-1 (5-2 overall) in OVC play on the season...UT Martin and Jacksonville State will square off in a huge game on Thursday night in Martin, with the winner remaining one of the possible two 1-loss teams in the league; the game can be seen nationally on ESPNU (DirecTV Ch. 614/Dish Network Ch. 148) at 6:30 p.m....The only other one-loss team in the league is Eastern Kentucky who is coming off a bye week; EKU returns to action with a home game against Eastern Illinois...Eastern Illinois, who has been in the FCS playoffs in each of the last three seasons, scored its first OVC victory of the season (improving to 1-2 in league play) by topping Southeast Missouri 24-21 on Saturday; freshman running back Desmin Ward scored three touchdowns and was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week...The other OVC Player of the Week awards went to Jacksonville State, as Ryan Perrilloux was named Player and Co-Newcomer of the Week, Alexander Henderson was named Defensive Player of the Week and Gavin Hallford shared OVC Specialist of the Week honors.

OFFENSIVE

Ryan Perrilloux, QB • Jr., 6-3, 223 • LaPlace, La. • Jacksonville State

Perrilloux was near perfect in completing 18-of-20 passes for 189 yards and four touchdowns in Jacksonville State's 31-21 victory over Murray State on Saturday. The 90 percent completion percentage tied the JSU school record and is the highest for all Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) players this season. He had touchdown passes of 3, 10, 21 and 49 yards on the night and passed the 1,400-yard passing yard mark on the season. He became the first Gamecock player with four touchdown passes in a game since the 1999 season. Perrilloux, who has been named OVC Player of the Week twice and OVC Newcomer of the Week four times this season, was a perfect 13-of-13 to start the game until missing on a pass attempt in the third quarter.

DEFENSIVE

Alexander Henderson, LB • Jr., 6-1, 212 • Mobile, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Henderson became just the second player in Jacksonville State's Division I history to have more than 20 tackles in a game when he registered 21 in the Gamecocks 31-21 victory over Murray State on Saturday. That total included an impressive 16 solo stops for the game. He also forced a fumble and had two tackles-for-loss. The 21 tackles were the most for a Jax State player since an 18-tackle performance in 2000.

CO-SPECIALIST

Gavin Hallford, K • Sr., 6-1, 225 • Phenix City, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Hallford set the Ohio Valley Conference record for career scoring by a kicker by netting seven points in the Gamecocks 31-21 win over Murray State. Hallford hit a 45-yard field goal (which tied a career long) and added four extra points to increase his career total to 287, passing Middle Tennessee's Garth Petrilli who had 280 points from 1991-94.

CO-SPECIALIST

Eric Benson, K • Sr., 5-10, 180 • Rowlett, Texas • Tennessee State

Benson was perfect on the night, including hitting the game-winner with two seconds left in Tennessee State's 37-34 victory over Austin Peay on Saturday night. Benson hit on field goals from 26, 31 and 29 (the game-winner) yards and was also 4-for-4 on extra point attempts as Tennessee State remained undefeated in OVC play.

CO-NEWCOMER

Desmin Ward, RB • Fr., 6-0, 223 • Milwaukee, Wis. • Eastern Illinois

Ward carried the ball only six times but scored all three Eastern Illinois touchdowns in the Panthers 24-21 home victory over Southeast Missouri State. Ward scored on runs of 1, 3 and 4 yards to total 15 total rushing yards on the afternoon. Ward now has five rushing touchdowns on the season.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Dontrell Miller Records Fifth Defensive Touchdown of the Season: UT Martin junior safety **Dontrell Miller** now has five defensive touchdowns on the season. Although no official record exists, it believes that the five defensive touchdowns by one player in a season is a NCAA record. Previously the record for fumble returns for a touchdown by a team (not an individual) is three by Texas State in 2000. Miller returned fumbles for touchdowns against South Florida (64 yards), Murray State (32 yards) and Tennessee Tech (60 yards). He intercepted passes and returned them for touchdowns against Murray State (10 yards) and Tennessee State (25 yards).

Perrilloux's 90 Percent Completion Percentage Tops Among FCS Players: In Jacksonville State's 31-21 victory over Murray State on Oct. 18, junior quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** completed 18-of-20 passes (90%). That mark tied the JSU single-game record for completion percentage and is the top performance this season by a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) player.

Four OVC Individuals Lead National Stat Categories: Through games on Oct. 18, there were four football student-athletes who are currently leading a category among FCS nationally statistical leaders. Eastern Kentucky's **Taylor Long** is first nationally in field goals (2.00/game), Southeast Missouri's **Doug Spada** is first nationally in punting (45.29 yards/punt), Austin Peay's **Kevis Buckley** is first nationally in interceptions (0.86/game) and Murray State's **Nathan Williams** is first nationally in tackles (15.00/game).

Nathan Williams on Updated Sports Network Buchanan Watch Lists: Murray State senior linebacker **Nathan Williams** was the only OVC player on the updated watch lists for the Sports Network's Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan awards, which was released in mid-October. Williams currently leads all FCS players with 15.00 tackles/game including a game earlier this season where he had 23 tackles. The original lists were released in August and at that time Tennessee State senior running back **Javaris Williams** was on the Payton list while Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** was on the Buchanan list; both fell off this updated release of the lists. The Payton and Buchanan awards will undergo two more revisions, one in November and a final revision at the end of the regular season before ballots are sent out to a panel of sports information directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries on Nov. 24. The Sports Network awards banquet will be held Dec. 18 in Chattanooga, Tenn., on the eve of before the NCAA Division I national championship game. The Payton Award goes to the FCS national player of the year, with the Buchanan Award honoring the FCS national defensive player of the year. The Eddie Robinson Award, which goes to the FCS national coach of the year, will also be awarded that night. The Robinson Award ballot will be announced in November. The Sports Network established the Payton and Robinson awards in 1987, and began sponsoring the Buchanan Award in 1995. Georgia Southern quarterback Jayson Foster was the 2007 Payton Award winner, while Montana defensive end Kroy Biermann took home the Buchanan Award.

Young Nets Longest Rush of the Season in FCS Football: UT Martin junior running back **Brandyn Young** had a 94-yard run for a touchdown in the Skyhawks 29-26 win over Eastern Illinois on Oct. 9. The run is tied for the longest by a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) player in 2008. He matched the mark of Central Connecticut's James Mallory. The next longest run this season is an 87-yarder.

Hallford Sets OVC Career Scoring By Kicking Record; Ranks Fifth on All-Time Scoring List: Jacksonville State senior kicker **Gavin Hallford** increased his career points scored total to 287 points on Oct. 18 and is fifth all-time in OVC history. That number pushed him past Middle Tennessee's Garth Petrilli (1991-94) for the most points scored in OVC history by a kicker. The all-time scoring record (by any position) is 322 by EKU's Markus Thomas. Hallford needs one more point to move up to fourth place all-time. Hallford currently ranks second nationally among active players in career extra points made (146), first in extra points attempted (154), third nationally in career field goals made (47), second nationally in career field goals attempted (70) and fourth nationally in career scoring (287).

Tennessee State Leads Sgt. York Trophy Standings: After four games of the Sgt. York Trophy series, Tennessee State (2-0) is on the verge of wrapping up its second straight Sgt. York Trophy. Even with a loss to Tennessee Tech on Nov. 1, the worst TSU can do is share the trophy, but due to the rules of the series, they will retain the actual hardware for the second straight season. The 2008 season marks the second for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay,

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Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). Last summer the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. Last season Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records. Both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee Tech and UT Martin each finished 1-2 in the series during the year. This weekend's matchup between Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay is the next-to-last game of the series this season.

Seven Former FBS Quarterbacks Starting in the OVC This Season: This season there are currently seven former Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) quarterbacks starting for Ohio Valley Conference schools. That number is the most among all Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) schools, with the Big Sky and MEAC coming in next with four FBS quarterback transfers apiece. The six OVC quarterbacks who transferred from FBS schools are Austin Peay's **T.C. Jennings** (Arkansas State), Eastern Illinois' **Bodie Reeder** (Wyoming), Eastern Kentucky's **Allan Holland** (Wake Forest), Jacksonville State's **Ryan Perrilloux** (LSU), Tennessee State's **Antonio Heffner** (South Carolina), Tennessee Tech's **Lee Sweeney** (Louisville) and UT Martin's **Cade Thompson** (South Carolina).

Two OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalist for Draddy Trophy: Two Ohio Valley Conference football student-athletes were among the 164 semifinalists for the 2008 Draddy Trophy, presented by HealthSouth, and the candidates for the 2008 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards as announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) on Wednesday. The two honored were Austin Peay senior defensive end **P.R. Morris** and Eastern Illinois senior kicker **Tyler Wilke**. The duo are two of just 43 individuals from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) who were honored. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Established to honor former NFF Chairman Vincent dePaul Draddy, a Manhattan College quarterback who developed the Izod and Lacoste brands, the award comes with a 25- pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship. The NFF Awards Committee will select and announce up to 15 finalists on Oct. 29. Each finalist will be recognized as part of the 2008 National Scholar-Athlete Class, receiving an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The Draddy winner, who will receive a \$25,000 postgraduate scholarship, will be announced at the NFF's Annual Awards Dinner on December 9 at the prestigious Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. A total distribution of more than \$300,000 in scholarships will be awarded that evening. Launched in 1959, the NFF scholar-athlete program became the first initiative in history to credit a player for both academic and athletic accomplishments. The Draddy, first awarded in 1990, adds to the program's mystique, having previously honored two Rhodes Scholars, a Rhodes Scholar finalist and a Heisman winner.

Heffner Named National Offensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network: Tennessee State senior quarterback **Antonio Heffner** was named the National Offensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network on Sept. 22. Heffner led Tennessee State to a crucial OVC victory over defending champion Eastern Kentucky, completing 20-of-28 passes for 312 yards and three touchdowns in the No. 25 Tigers 34-20 victory. With the win TSU improved to 4-0 overall for the first time since the 2001 season. It marked TSU's first win over Eastern Kentucky since 1999 and only its third win over the Colonels in 19 tries. Heffner, who also carried the ball nine times for 47 yards (360 yards total yards of offense for the game), threw two of his touchdowns in the second half including a 3-yarder to Ronald Evans early in the fourth quarter to put the Tigers up by two scores. His first touchdown came on a 62-yard strike to Brandon Belvin in the first half. It marks the second time this season that Heffner has earned a National Player of the Week honor this season; he earned the same honor from the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 following his team's win over Southern at the John Merritt Classic.

OVC Strong Against FCS Teams: OVC schools have fared well against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) competition this year, having completed the non-conference portion of their schedule (save for a game against FBS Auburn later in the season). OVC schools have compiled a 10-6 record in 16 FCS non-conference matchups (with two of those losses coming against nationally-ranked teams). OVC schools are 0-11 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams and 5-0 against non Division I squads.

OVC Schools Play in Front of Large Crowds: OVC schools have played in front of some large crowds this year, including a crowd of 62,305 on Sept. 6 when Southeast Missouri played at No. 6 Missouri. That crowd was the 10th largest ever to see an OVC school play. A crowd of 60,131 saw Eastern Illinois play at No. 24 Illinois, which marked the 13th largest crowd to see an OVC school play. A crowd of 50,794 saw Tennessee State play Jackson State at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis on Sept. 13 and 50,428 filled the Georgia Dome on Sept. 27 to see Tennessee State battled Florida A&M. In all, 11 games have had a crowd of 20,000 or more this season including 28,830 for a Tennessee State home game against Southern on Sept. 6.

Williams Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Murray State redshirt senior linebacker **Nathan Williams** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network on Sept. 15. The honor came after Williams posted 23 tackles in the Racers game against Illinois State on Sept. 13. That total is tied for the most nationally at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) this season (with Nathan Totino of Duquesne).

Hansen Sets OVC Record for Single-Game Extra Points: UT Martin junior kicker **Tom Hansen** set the OVC single-game record for extra points made when he converted on 12 in the Skyhawks 87-21 victory over Concordia (Ala.) on Sept. 11. Hansen broke the record of 10 previously held by four other people, including a 10-make performance by Hansen last year against Murray State. In doing so, Hansen also set the OVC record for consecutive extra points made in a game.

Heffner Named National All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News: Tennessee State quarterback **Antonio Heffner** was named one of four National All-Stars of the Week by the *College Sporting News* on Sept. 9 for his performance in the Tigers win over Southern at the John Merritt Classic. Down 11-0 at halftime Heffner led his offense to five straight touchdowns on the first five drives in the second half to give Tennessee State a 34-32 come-from-behind victory and their first victory over Southern in the last three years. The Memphis, Tenn. native would go 23-for-29 passing for 315 yards, completing three touchdown passes (87, 8 and 38 yards) in the first three offensive drives of the second half. He would also add 8 rushes for 68 yards, giving Heffner 383 yards of total offense on the evening.

Holt Sets OVC Single-Game Kickoff Return Record: Austin Peay sophomore **Terrence Holt** set the OVC's single-game kickoff yardage record in the opening weekend, returning 250 yards of kicks against No. 2 North Dakota State (Aug. 28). That broke the 11-year old record previously held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin (215 yards against Murray State in 1997). During his freshman season in which he was named an OVC All-Newcomer selection, Holt set the OVC single-season record for kickoff return yardage (1,104).

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference

competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCSports.TV: For the third consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed nearly a thousand events in its first two years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC Looks to Put Two in Playoffs For Third Straight Season: In 2007, the OVC put multiple teams in the FCS playoffs for the second straight year, which marked the first time since the mid-90s that had occurred. Eastern Illinois and UT Martin were playoff participants in 2006 while Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky were participants last season. The OVC has now put multiple teams in the playoffs in three straight years since 1994-96.

Jacksonville State Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's, Although Three Schools Split First-Place Votes: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head football coaches and sports information directors, Jacksonville State University has been picked as the 2008 preseason favorite in the nine-team league. The Gamecocks claimed the 2003 and 2004 OVC Championships and were tabbed as the favorites for the second time in history (2005 was the other). Although Jax State was tabbed as the favorites, the votes indicated the pollsters predicted this year's race should be extremely tight, as the 18 first-place votes were split evenly amongst three schools. JSU received six first-place votes and were followed by 2007 OVC Champion Eastern Kentucky, who was picked second and also received six first-place votes. Eastern Illinois, who was a 2007 at-large selection for the FCS Playoffs, also garnered six first-place votes and was tabbed third. The three teams were separated by just five points, as preseason favorite Jacksonville State ended up with 113 points, Eastern Kentucky followed with 111 points and Eastern Illinois received 108 points. It marked the closest preseason vote in Ohio Valley Conference history.

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Jacksonville State? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past five seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 29 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (41.4%).

Holland and Walters Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Kentucky senior quarterback **Allan Holland** and Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** were tabbed the 2008 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with the most individual selections (5), following closely by four each from Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (9 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included eight players who were second-team selections in 2007.

FCS Playoffs: For the 12th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 19 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 29 and continue with second round games on Dec. 6 and semifinal contests on Dec. 12/Dec. 13 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Eastern Kentucky and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs.

New Faces: This season one new head coach makes his debut in the OVC. Eastern Kentucky is under the direction of first-year head coach **Dean Hood**, who served as an assistant coach for the Colonels from 1994-98, where the team compiled a 32-6 OVC record and made three FCS playoff appearances. Hood was most recently the defen-

NFL Connections: Currently there are 13 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2008 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is former TSU defensive back Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a first round draft pick of the Arizona Cardinals this season. He became only the fourth OVC player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in 2008. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at UT Martin, who also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants prior to the 2007 season. In his first season as GM, Reese led the Giants to the Super Bowl Championship.

NCAA Rule Changes for 2008: There are several rule changes for the 2008 season that will make noticeable effects on the game. Among them are the banning of "horse-collar" tackles, a simplification of chop blocking rules and the elimination of the 5-yard face mask penalty for incidental contact (it will either be a 15-yard penalty or no foul at all). The major rule change involves the play clock which will have both 40 and 25-second settings. Whenever the ball becomes dead, the play clock will reset to 40 seconds and will start immediately. This includes when a runner is down in the field of play or out of bounds, a fumble out of bounds, backward pass out of bounds and after an incomplete pass. After a team has picked up a first down the game clock will stop but the play clock will go to 40 seconds and will start counting down.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2008 season marks the second of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime.

GAME NOTES: In a game that will be shown to a national television audience on Thursday night, the UT Martin and Jacksonville State matchup is shaping up to be a key game in the OVC race. The two teams are currently tied with Eastern Kentucky in the one-loss column in OVC play. The winner will find itself in good position for the OVC Championship or an at-large bid to the FCS Playoffs while the loser will have some work to do to make the playoffs. Jacksonville State leads the series 24-5, including winning last year's meeting by a 27-24 margin. UT Martin scored a 24-14 victory in 2006 when the game was last in Martin. UTM head coach Jason Simpson was an assistant coach at JSU from 1997-99.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State got back on the winning track by topping Murray State 31-21. Quarterback Ryan Perrilloux was near perfect in completing 18-of-20 passes for 189 yards and four touchdowns on his way to OVC Offensive Player of the Week and OVC Newcomer of the Week honors. The 90 percent completion percentage is the tops among FCS players this season. Linebacker Alexander Henderson was tabbed Defensive Player of the Week after a 21-tackle performance against Murray State. Senior kicker Gavin Hallford set the OVC career record for points by a kicker and was named OVC Specialist of the Week. Hallford now has 287 career points. It marked the first time since the OVC went to four weekly awards (which happened in 1983) that a school had four players win each award in the same week. Maurice Dupree had two touchdown catches to increase his season total to nine, which tied the Jax State single-season record; his three multiple receiving touchdown games is the most among OVC receivers this season.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin enters Thursday matchup as the No. 2 ranked scoring offense nationally, averaging 41.88 points a contest. They are meeting a JSU defense that is first in the OVC in scoring defense (21.14 points/game). Last week they went on the road and topped Tennessee Tech 35-7 in Cookeville. Junior running back Brandyn Young rushed for 107 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Skyhawk offensive attack. Quarterback Cade Thompson tossed two touchdown passes on the night; Thompson currently ranks 10th nationally in passing efficiency (155.39). He completed four passes to Roren Thomas, who racked up 118 yards and a touchdown; Thomas also had 14 yards rushing and 58 on kick returns to finish with 190 all-purpose yards for the game. Thomas leads the OVC (and ranks 17th nationally) in all-purpose yards per game (160.14/game). Junior safety Dontrell Miller recovered a fumble and returned it 60 yards for a touchdown, his fifth defensive touchdown of the season, which is believed to be a NCAA record. Miller also had an interception, two pass breakups and a tackle in the contest. With a win UT Martin would crack the national Top 25 polls, as the Skyhawks currently sit just outside the Top 25.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri are meeting for the first time since the 2006 season when the Tigers shutout the Redhawks 31-0. The teams have split the series over the last four years, with each team winning every other year. All-time the series is locked at 8-8 with the first game of the series dating back to the 1991 season.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State, ranked No. 19 in this week's national polls, remained undefeated in the OVC by holding on to top Austin Peay 37-34 at home on Saturday night. The Tigers led 27-12 at halftime and opened up a 34-20 lead later in the third quarter. But each time TSU would jump out to a big lead the Governors would come back and they tied the game on an 11-yard interception return early in the fourth quarter. But Tennessee State would have the final long drive, going 10 plays in 4:52 and capping the drive with a 29-yard field goal by Eric Benson with two seconds remaining. On the night Benson was 3-for-3 on field goals (26, 29, 31 yards) and a perfect 4-for-4 on point after attempts. His performance earned him OVC Co-Specialist of the Week honors. Senior running back Javarris Williams had his best game of the season in rushing for 195 yards in 30 carries and scoring three touchdowns. He had a long run of 40 yards and also caught two passes (for 21 yards) in finishing the night with 216 all-purpose yards. Williams now leads the OVC in rushing (99.14 yards/game) and has 11 rushing touchdowns on the season. It was his 18th 100-yard rushing game of his career, which is fourth among active players at the FCS level. Junior JaJuan Spillman had three rushes for 61 yards, a catch for 19 yards and three kickoff returns for 94 yards on the night; he finished the game with 174 all-purpose yards.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Coming off a bye week, Southeast Missouri State traveled to Eastern Illinois and gave the Panthers a fight before falling 24-21. The game was tied at halftime when Timmy Holloman scored from six yards out. Later in the game Holloman's 2-yard run with six minutes left pulled the team to within three points but neither team would score after that. Holloman would finish the game with 84 yards on 23 carries; he also added two catches for 13 yards and finished with 97 all-purpose yards for the game. Senior linebacker Nick Stauffer continued his solid play as he recorded 13 tackles for the third time this season; he also broke up a pass and had a tackle-for-loss. Stauffer currently ranks 15th nationally (and third in the OVC) in tackles per game (10.86). Punter Doug Spada continues to lead all of FCS in punting (45.29 yards/punt); he had four punts for an average of 43 yards on Saturday, including a long of 45 yards. True freshman Matt Scheible saw extensive time at quarterback, playing in place of Houston Lillard. He was 6-of-16 for 54 yards, no did not turn the ball over and directed all three Redhawk scoring drives in the game.

GAME NOTES: The two OVC teams that were participants in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoffs last year meet in a key game this weekend. Eastern Kentucky enters in a tie for second place (1 loss) while Eastern Illinois is fresh off its first victory in OVC play and looking to get back into the title hunt. EIU and EKU have played 15 times, with 12 of those coming since Eastern Illinois joined the OVC in 1996. EKU leads 8-7 all-time, although EIU leads 7-5 in games as a member of the OVC. The Colonels won last year's meeting 28-21 on their way to the OVC Championship. The game will air on WCKY radio as the FCS Game of the Week.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: The Panthers won their first OVC game of the season, knocking off Southeast Missouri 24-21 at home this past weekend. Freshman running back Desmin Ward scored all three Eastern Illinois touchdowns, scoring on runs of 1, 3 and 4 yards. That effort earned him OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week honors; he now has five of EIU's seven rushing touchdowns on the season. While Ward was getting the carries on the goal line it was Travorus Bess who carried the ball 20 times for 124 yards on the night. Chevon Walker added 66 yards rushing as EIU racked up 199 yards on the ground on the afternoon. Quarterback Bodie Reeder completed 10-of-18 passes for 76 yards for EIU. On defense Nick Nasti led the team with nine tackles while Ke'Andre Sams added eight and Cory Leman had seven.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: The Colonels are rested after coming off a bye week. Last time out Eastern Kentucky handed Jacksonville State's its first OVC loss of the season, winning 38-35 in Richmond. Allan Holland completed 19-of-27 passes for 242 yards and a touchdown. Those 242 yards moved him to 3,865 yards for his career, which is fourth on EKU's career passing list. Sophomore wide receiver Shannon Davis pulled in five passes for 116 yards to lead the EKU offensive attack. Running back C.J. Walker carried the ball nine times for 53 yards and a pair of scores. On defense Jordan Dalrymple had eight tackles and a sack for the Colonels. He also intercepted a pass with 2:02 remaining to seal the victory. EKU has now forced 17 turnovers this season which is 13th nationally. They have forced at least three turnovers in four of their last five games. Overall the Colonels intercepted five passes, marking the second straight season the team had a five-interception contest. The 38 points for EKU was a season-high. The team has now scored 71 points in its last two games after scoring only 69 points in its first five games of the season.

GAME NOTES: In-state rivals Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech are meeting for the 41st time this week. The game is part of the Sgt. York Trophy series which is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee. Austin Peay won last year's contest 30-27, ending a two-game winning streak in the series for Tennessee Tech.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: The Golden Eagles are coming off a 35-7 loss at home to UT Martin last Thursday. That game was played in a driving rain storm that made hanging onto the football difficult. Senior linebacker Corey Reed made a career-high 20 tackles to lead the Golden Eagles defense. He also totaled two tackles-for-loss and limited UT Martin to 342 yards of total offense on the night (82 of which came on one play). Tennessee Tech's first score came on an 87-yard kickoff return by Henry Sailes, his second kickoff return for a touchdown. Cedric Wilkerson led the offensive attack, rushing for a career-high 75 yards.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is coming off a three-point loss to first-place Tennessee State on Saturday, falling 37-34 on a field goal with two seconds left. That game follows a game three weeks ago when they lost to Eastern Kentucky (who has only one OVC loss this year) by three points in overtime. Junior Theo Townsend rushed 27 times for 150 yards and a touchdown in the game against TSU. Of the 150 yards, 126 came in the second half as Austin Peay rallied from a 15-point halftime deficit to tie the game. It marked Townsend's and APSU's first 100-yard rushing performance of the season. He also had a rush of 40 yards on the night, the longest rush of the season for the team. Quarterback T.C. Jennings completed 12-of-17 passes for 167 yards and two touchdowns. That included a 53-yarder to Adrian Mines in the first quarter, the longest APSU play from scrimmage on the season; Mines finished the game with six catches for 97 yards. APSU also scored another touchdown in the first quarter, marking the first time this season the Govs had scored in the first quarter of a game. On defense, P.R. Morris intercepted a pass and returned it 11 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 34. It was Austin Peay's 14th interception of the season, a mark that ranks second nationally at the FCS level.
