THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

After eight weeks of play, only one OVC team is atop the standings without a loss...Following a 49-7 home victory over Tennessee State, Eastern Kentucky is now 5-0 in OVC play and in the driver's seat to claim its 19th OVC Championship and first in a decade (1997 season); they can do so with two wins in its last three OVC games...Although ECU has not lost, three schools remain just one loss behind them in the loss column, awaiting a possible defeat in its remaining three games...Those teams are Jacksonville State (4-1), Eastern Illinois (4-1) and Tennessee State (2-1); ECU has already defeated each of those teams this season...The Colonels are ranked 16th in the SME Network poll this week, their highest national ranking since 2002; the team is 17th in the Sports Network poll and 18th in the FCS Coaches Poll...Eastern Illinois is the only other OVC team ranked (25th in FCS Coaches Poll) while Jacksonville State and Austin Peay are receiving votes...Two OVC teams scored road victories last week, as Austin Peay went to Samford and won by three to improve to 5-3 (3-2 OVC) on the year, and Murray State spoiled Southeast Missouri's Homecoming with a 31-17 win in Cape Girardeau to win its first OVC contest of the season, a win that put to rest an 18-game OVC losing streak dating back to the 2004 season...Southeast Missouri State punter Doug Spada currently ranks in the Top 11 nationally in both punting and field goals, the only person nationally to achieve that feat...Samford freshman RB Chris Evans ranks third in the OVC in rushing and 18th nationally; he is first nationally among freshmen running backs.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Chris Fletcher, RB • Sr., 5-10, 200 • Clarksville, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Fletcher carried the ball 24 times for 196 yards and three touchdowns in the Governors 28-25 road victory at Samford. Most of his production came in the second half when he rushed the ball 16 times for 171 yards and had touchdown runs of 50 yards, 2 yards and 20 yards. The win was the first for Austin Peay over Samford in nine tries and was the Gobs third OVC victory of the season in the team's first year back in the OVC. Fletcher currently ranks seventh nationally in rushing yards per game (124.75) and third among active players in career yards (4,594).

DEFENSIVE

Derrick Huff, DB • Sr., 5-11, 188 • Hamilton, Ohio • Eastern Kentucky

Huff equaled his career-best with nine tackles in the Colonels 49-7 victory over Tennessee State which left the team alone atop the Conference standings. His biggest play came in the second quarter when TSU was driving and threatening to tie the game at 14-all. Huff intercepted a pass and returned it 68 yards for a touchdown and EKU never looked back. The interception was the fifth of the season for Huff and the 10th of his career. His 0.63 interceptions per game ranks 11th nationally.

Sean O'Brien, P • So., 6-0, 188 • Lexington, Ky. • Murray State

O'Brien helped the Racers win the field-position battle in the first half as he averaged 46.3 yards a punt on his six first-half punts in Murray State's 31-17 road victory at Southeast Missouri. He pinned SEMO inside the 15-yard line with a 53-yard punt on his first effort and followed it up with a 55-yard effort that resulted in a fumble inside the SEMO five-yard line.

NEWCOMER

Chris Evans, RB • RS-Fr., 6-0, 197 • Alexandria, Ala. • Samford

Evans rushed for a career-high 212 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries Saturday in Samford's 28-25 home loss to Austin Peay. Evans first touchdown of the game came on a career-long 81-yard run in the third quarter. The 212 yards was the second highest output by an OVC runner this season, and just one yard behind the top rushing effort. Evans has won the Newcomer of the Award twice this season (he also won on Sept. 16 of this season). Evans ranks 18th nationally in rushing (107.29 yards/game), which is tops among all freshmen nationally (the next closest freshman is 28th at 99.43 yards/game).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCsports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports (formerly XOS Technologies) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In eight weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 586 kickoffs in 53 games and only 29 of those went for touchbacks (4.9%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 452 kickoffs and 61 touchbacks (13.5%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

Two OVC Players on Updated Buck Buchanan Watch List: Two OVC players were on the updated watch list (released in October) for *The Sports Network's* Buck Buchanan Award given to the nation's top defensive player. The list includes Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who were also two of the 16 players on the August preseason list. UT Martin running back **Don Chapman** was on the preseason Walter Payton Watch List (top offensive player), but was not on the updated October list, that included 16 players. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. A final update of both lists will be released in November before the final ballots are decided upon. Final ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

The League of Extraordinary Rushers: If there is one thing the OVC has excelled at so far this season it is running the football. Through eight weeks there are currently two individuals who rank in the top 11 nationally in rushing - Austin Peay's Chris Fletcher (7th) and Tennessee Tech's **Derek White** (11th). Another individual - Southeast Missouri's Timmy Holloman - would be 7th, but he is currently ineligible and under the minimum (75%) of games played to qualify. There is only one other FCS Conference who currently has more players in the top 10 (the Colonial, who has the 4th, 9th and 10th leading rushers nationally). From top to bottom as a Conference, the OVC has rushed the ball well by team as well, with nine teams in the top 45 - something none of the other 13 FCS Conference can claim. All 10 OVC teams rank in the top 67 overall nationally.

Samford's Evans is Nation's Top Rushing Freshman: Samford freshman RB **Chris Evans** currently ranks third in the OVC and 18th nationally in rushing yards per game (107.29). That number is first nationally among all freshmen; the next closest freshman is Florida A&M's Philip Sylvester, who is 28th at 99.43 yards/game.

Spada Excelling at Punting and Kicking: Southeast Missouri State sophomore K/P **Doug Spada** is excelling on both sides of the kicking game in 2007. Spada is the only player nationally to rank in the Top 11 nationally in both punting (11th, 42.58 yards/punt) and field goal kicking (10th, 1.57 field goals/game).

National Leaders: In the latest set of national statistical rankings, two individuals and two teams are at the top of a statistical category. Jacksonville State's **Gavin Halford** is first nationally in field goals (2.13/game) while Tennessee State's **Shaun Richardson** is first in forced fumbles (0.57/game). On the team side of things, Eastern Kentucky is first nationally in turnover margin (+2.13/game), passes intercepted (16) and turnovers gained (24), while Eastern Illinois is first nationally in passes had intercepted (1).

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Now 3rd in OVC History in Rushing Yards and 1st in Rushes: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman

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now ranks third all-time in OVC history (4,594), and is just 555 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list. After rushing the ball 24 times in a win over Samford on Oct. 13, Chapman increased his career rushes total to 930, putting him first in OVC history in that category. He broke the record previously held by Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71) of Eastern Kentucky. Chapman now has 952 career rushes.

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record; Now 4th in OVC History for Receptions, 6th in Receiving Yardage: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks fourth in OVC history for career receptions (177). Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he now has 2,567 career receiving yards which is sixth. Shipp has caught a pass in all 40 career games, as has Samford's **Jeff Moore**, which is believed to be an OVC record.

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After five of the six games in the series, Tennessee State (2-0) is the only team without a defeat in the series. Austin Peay has played all three of its games and finished at 2-1, Tennessee Tech played all three games and finished 1-2 and UT Martin is 0-2 with one more game to play. The final game in the series is Nov. 17, when Tennessee State hosts UT Martin. A win by TSU would give them the inaugural trophy out-right, while a loss would mean that TSU would share the trophy with Austin Peay.

Eastern Kentucky Named National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com: Following its 28-21 victory at No. 16 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels were named the Division I FCS National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com. With the win, ECU improved to 4-2 overall and 3-0 in the OVC, which puts them atop the Conference standings. The Colonels only losses of the season have come at FBS schools Kentucky and Western Kentucky. In the win over Eastern Illinois, junior quarterback Allan Holland threw for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC and National Offensive Player of the Week honors. Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 19th OVC Championship this season and its first since the 1997 season, which was also the last time the program advanced to the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs.

No. 2 and No. 3 Active FCS Rushers Face Off: When Austin Peay claimed a 17-14 victory over UT Martin on Sept. 22, the game featured two of the top three active career rushers in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) - **Don Chapman** of UT Martin and **Chris Fletcher** of Austin Peay. Chapman entered the matchup as the No. 2 active career rusher while Fletcher entered the game third overall. Fletcher won the individual battle (107 yards to 46 yards) and also led his team to victory. Fletcher, a senior from Clarksville, has 25 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second most among active players (behind Drake's Scott Phaydavong) while Chapman, a senior from Marietta, Ga., has 20 100-yard games, the third most among active players at the FCS level. Chapman became the all-time leading rusher in UTM history this season while Fletcher broke the Austin Peay career rushing record as a junior in 2006.

Holland Named National Offensive Player of the Week; He Becomes 5th OVC Player to Earn That Honor This Season: Eastern Kentucky junior QB **Allan Holland** became the fifth OVC player to earn National Player of the Week honors on Oct. 8, as he was named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (CSN). Holland completed 30-of-44 passes for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns in the Colonels 28-21 win at No. 16 Eastern Illinois. His

first touchdown came with one second left in the first half and put ECU up 15-14; the other came late in the game to increase his team's lead to two scores. Both came after Holland scrambled out of the pocket, avoided would-be tacklers and found an open receiver. The other OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this season include a pair of Jacksonville State players - **Maurice Dupree** on Special Teams (Oct.1) and LB **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 10). Also included in the list is Austin Peay LB **Daniel Becker** (Sept. 16) and Samford kicker **Mark Prevost** (Sept. 23).

Dupree Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: For the fourth time in five weeks of play this season, the OVC has another National Player of the Week. This time it is Jacksonville State return specialist **Maurice Dupree**, who earned National Special Teams Player of the Week from each the Sports Network, College Sporting News (CSN) and SME Network. Dupree finished the Murray State victory with 316 total return yards, 212 coming on four kickoffs and 104 on three punt returns. He was just three yards shy of breaking the OVC all-time record for kickoff return yardage in a game (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin) and he did set the JSU record in the process. Dupree returned a punt 88 yards in the second quarter to set-up a Gamecocks touchdown and later returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The punt return was the second longest in JSU's Division I history (trailing a 93-yarder) and the kickoff return for a touchdown was the first time JSU had accomplished that since the 2005 season and was the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest: When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyrone Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10th year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the squad's 28-22 win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game: Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time a woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

Prevost Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: Samford freshman kicker **Mark Prevost** was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Football Gazette on Sept. 26 after leading Samford to a 26-21 victory over Southeast Missouri. Prevost kicked four second-half field goals, after missing his lone attempt in the first half, to lead Samford to the come-from-behind victory (the Bulldogs trailed 21-10 at one point). Prevost kicked field goals of 47, 37, 41 and 34 yards. The 47-yarder was the career-long for the freshman.

Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week: For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network and the Football Gazette after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS at that point of the season.

Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Jacksonville State linebacker **Drew Robinson** was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chattanooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Tennessee Tech senior running back **Derek White** has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Jax State Keeps Interception Likely an NCAA Record: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was been **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The streak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Hallford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks; Owns JSU Career Field Goals Made Mark: It is not rare to see a kicker make a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Hallford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Hallford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Hallford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). Hallford now has 38 career made field goals, which is the most in school history. He has been named OVC Specialist of the Week three times this season.

That's A Crowd: OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds this season. When Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game. On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic; that crowd was the largest to see a FCS football game this year (the Jackson State crowd is the third largest FCS crowd this year).

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 82 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 71 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (49) and UT Martin (30). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

The FCS playoffs began in 1978, when four teams competed for the national championship. The OVC did not have a team in the playoffs that season but have in 28 years since then. No team has made more playoff appearances than Eastern Kentucky, who won national championships in 1979 and 1982. The Colonels have been in 17 playoffs (tied with Montana), last appearing in 1997. Eastern Illinois is 10th all-time (11 appearances) while Murray State is 27th (5 trips).

CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 30th consecutive winning season in 2007. The Colonels have not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 overall in 1977 (the second longest streak in Division I). You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (that streak is also second in Division I).

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: After just four weeks of the 2007 season, the three new OVC head football coaches have combined to go 10-5 overall. **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of October 22, 11 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players are two players who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens and Tristan Burge (Eastern Illinois) of the Green Bay Packers. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the Newcomer of the Year award.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

NCAA ACTIVE RUSHING LEADERS

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will look to keep the top spot in the OVC when it travels to in-state rival Murray State on Saturday. The teams have played 66 times previously. EKU has a 12-win advantage in the series but has won five of the last six in the series; Murray's lone win in that stretch was a 19-16 overtime win in 2004. A win by Eastern Kentucky would clinch the team's 30th consecutive winning season, the second longest streak nationally (behind Florida State's current 30 in a row). They team is already guaranteed a non-losing season, which is their 35th in a row, the second longest streak nationally (behind Michigan's 39).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky knocked off OVC co-leader Tennessee State 49-7 at home on Saturday to take over sole possession of first place. The team is 5-0 in OVC play for the first time since 1997 (the last year they won the OVC title). The Colonels are one game ahead of Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State, each of who they have already defeated this season. EKU is ranked as high as No. 16 in the three major national polls (SME Network). Senior DB Derrick Huff was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after tallying a career-best nine tackles and also intercepting a pass and returning it 68-yards for a touchdown. That return came when TSU was driving in the second quarter and looking to tie the game at 14; EKU was in total control following the pick and score. Junior QB Allan Holland continues his torrid pace, as he broke the school record for consecutive passes without an interception (175), breaking the record formerly held by Simon Fuentes (1997). Both C.J. Walker (138) and Bobby Washington (134) both rushed for over 100 yards, marking the second time this season EKU has had two rushers break the 100-yard plateau (Washington and Mark Dunn did it against Western Carolina). EKU improved its turnover margin on the season to +17, which is tops in the nation. The Colonels have scored 100 points off of opponent's turnovers this season, while giving up just six points off their own miscues.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State scored a 31-17 road victory at Southeast Missouri to snap an 18-game OVC losing streak which had dated back to the 2004 season. It was the team's first OVC win since winning 30-13 at Tennessee State on Nov. 20, 2004 (the last game of that season). Sophomore punter Sean O'Brien was named OVC Specialist of the Week after punting six times for a 46.3 average. He put three punts inside the SEMO 20-yard line and had a long of 55 yards. Sophomore RB Charlie Jordan carried the ball 29 times for a career-high 157 yards (5.4 yard/carry) and a touchdown. It marked the second week in a row he had topped the 100-yard plateau, as he became the first Racer to accomplish that feat since 2005 (Chad Cook). Most importantly, 102 of Jordan's 157 yards came during the fourth quarter, including his 20-yard touchdown run with 6:32 to play. Senior WR Rod Harper caught a 25-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter, marking his only catch of the game; that extended his streak to 23 straight games with at least one catch. Murray State's defense totaled a season-high four sacks and 10 tackles-for-loss. Senior CB Derrick Parrot had 10 tackles (9 solo), a sack and an interception.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri is searching for its first Conference victory of the season while UT Martin is looking for its second Conference and overall victory when these two teams meet this weekend. The matchup features a pair of head coaches in the second-year with their respective programs. The programs have met 22 times previously; SEMO had won eight in a row against the Skyhawks until the last two years. UT Martin has now won the last two, including a 24-21 win in 2005 and a 28-14 road victory a season ago.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri had its Homecoming spoiled by regional rival Murray State, falling 31-17 on Saturday. Southeast is now the only team without an OVC victory this season. Sophomore P/K Doug Spada continues to impress. The dual-kicker is the only player ranked in the Top 11 nationally in both punting and field goals at this point of the season. He kicked a 50-yard field goal against the Racers and had seven punts that averaged 44.9 yards per kick. Six of those punts were downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. The Redhawks are still without the OVC's leading rusher, Timmy Holloman, who is out indefinitely after being ruled ineligible. In his place, true freshman Mike Jones got his second career start and turned in a great performance. He rushed the ball 14 times for 131 yards and two touchdowns. That was an average of 9.4 yards per carry including a long run of 59 yards. Senior LB Adam Casper is leading the OVC in tackles per game (10.57), a mark that is 16th nationally. The Redhawks do have injured QB Houston Lillard back, after missing two games due to injury. Victor Anderson, who started six games at QB this season, has been moved to safety, as has his twin brother Vincent, who moved from WR to defensive back a few weeks back.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: The Skyhawks built an early lead at Eastern Illinois only to see the Panthers score three touchdowns in the final 18 minutes of the game to fall 29-23 in a game that pitted last year's league co-champions. Senior RB Don Chapman rushed for 140 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries. It was his 21st 100-yard rushing effort of his career, a mark that is third nationally among active players. Defensively, LB Josh Yarbrough had 15 tackles on the night. Sophomore QB Cade Thompson entered the game late in the fourth quarter for the injured Dexter Anoka and completed 9-of-11 passes for 113 yards. He marched the team 79 yards in 1:27 only to see the game end on the 1-yard line as UTM could not get off a final play. It marked the fourth time this season that the 'Hawks had had their fate determined on the last play of the game; UT Martin has now lost four OVC games by a total of 15 points. The Skyhawk defense did rattle the Panthers passing attack at times, and became the first team to intercept an Eastern Illinois passer this year when Dante Harrold came through with a pick. Punter Adam Ivey had six punts for 234 yards (39 yards/punt) including a 57-yarder and two punts inside the 20-yard line.

GAME NOTES: Both teams will be looking to snap three-game losing streaks this weekend. Tennessee Tech head coach Watson Brown will host good friend and former coaching colleague Pat Sullivan and Samford to Cookeville this weekend. Brown was previously the head coach at UAB where Sullivan served on his staff. Brown has already faced another former assistant this season, when his squad lost to Rick Christophel and Austin Peay. Samford leads the all-time series 11-10, although Tech has won the last two. This may be the last matchup between the teams for awhile as Samford is leaving the OVC following this season. The game is the last of the season at home for TTU, who will say goodbye to 19 seniors.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: Samford lost its first home contest of the season last week, dropping a 28-25 decision at Seibert Stadium to Austin Peay. Redshirt freshman RB Chris Evans was named OVC Newcomer of the Week after an outstanding performance that saw him rush for a career-high 212 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries. That included an 81-run in the third quarter. The 212 yards was the second largest rushing output of the season (trailing 213 yards by TTU's Derek White). Evans ranks third in the OVC in rushing and 18th nationally; he is however, the leading freshman rusher in the country at 107.29 yards per contest. Junior LB Rodney Shepherd led the Bulldogs with nine tackles (7 solo) in the APSU contest.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: The Golden Eagles suffered its third straight loss, 38-10, at Jacksonville State over the weekend. TTU committed six turnovers in the contest, as they lost two fumbles and threw four interceptions. Tech did see the return of sophomore QB Lee Sweeney, who saw his first action since going down with an injury at home against Murray State on Sept. 20. Sweeney was 10-for-20 for 77 yards and a touchdown. Backup Steven Brown also played and completed 11-for-18 for 108 yards. Sweeney's touchdown was set-up by an Adonis Sharpe blocked punt; Sweeney then hit Daniel Brown for Brown's first collegiate touchdown reception. Senior WR Larry Shipp had seven catches for a season-high 104 yards. Shipp now ranks sixth in career receiving yards in OVC history (2,567) and is fourth in career receptions (177). Henry Sailes continued his impressive season, catching a career-high eight passes for 43 yards; he also had 86 yards in kickoff return yardage. Senior RB Derek White had 49 rushing yards and is now at 946 yards on the season, just 54 away from the 1,000-yard plateau.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State enter this weekend's matchup with the same number in the loss column (1), and in a tie for second place (with Jacksonville State). Eastern Illinois is looking for a third straight OVC championship and will play the other 1-loss team in two weeks on the road. After being 2-0 in OVC play before last weekend, the Tigers are coming off a 49-7 loss at league-leading Eastern Kentucky which where they lost more than just the scoreboard battle; they also lost starting QB Antonio Heffner for the season. EIU leads the all-time series with TSU by a 6-4 margin; Eastern has won three in a row and six of seven in the series.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois kept its hopes alive for a third straight OVC Championship with a 29-23 come-from-behind victory over UT Martin. The Panthers scored 21 points over the final 18 minutes of the game and were able to escape from UTM's final drive ended at the 1-yard line as time expired. Senior WR Micah Rucker hauled in seven passes for 98 yards and two touchdowns to lead the EIU offensive attack. He now has seven touchdown catches on the season to go along with his 48 receptions and 699 yards. Redshirt freshman punter Kevin Cook had four punts for an average of 43.8 yards/punt with a long of 53 yards; Cook currently ranks third nationally in punting. DT Jeff Sobol had his best defensive game in an EIU uniform, as he made four tackles (3 solo), added a sack and two quarterback hurries. Freshman LB Alain Marcelin was forced into his first collegiate start when All-American Donald Thomas was a scratch with a foot bruise. Marcelin had eight tackles on the day, one more than he had made in the previous seven games this season. Eastern Illinois did throw its first interception of the season, becoming the last FCS team to do so on the year. That ended a stretch of 218 passing attempts without an interception, which is a school record. The NCAA record for pass attempts without a pick is held by Lamar (275 in 1988). The Panthers dropped from No. 24 to No. 25 in the FCS Coaches Poll this week, but remained in the poll, a place they have been all season. Eastern Illinois has been ranked in either the Sports Network or Coaches poll for 25 consecutive weeks dating back to the 2005 season.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: TSU will be without junior QB sensation Antonio Heffner for the rest of the season, after he broke his right leg last week against ECU. Heffner had been the OVC leader in passing, passing efficiency and total offense before getting hurt. In seven games this season, the 2006 first-team All-OVC selection was 96-for-171 for 1,486 yards and 10 touchdowns; he also rushed for 337 yards (48.1 yards per game) and averaged 260.4 yards per game of total offense. Javaris Williams rushed for 66 yards in the loss and also scored a touchdown. LB Remond Willis led the Tigers with eight tackles (5 solo) while Shaun Richardson added seven tackles, a sack, a forced fumble and a pass break-up. The home contest is the first for TSU since the opening weekend of the season when the Tigers hosted Alabama A&M; the team's last six games have been at neutral or road sites.
