THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Saturday's games marked an offensive explosion, as the four games combined to produce 340 points...That includes a 59-52 shootout in Cookeville between Samford and Tennessee Tech, a 46-35 affair involving Eastern Kentucky and Murray State, 73 combined points in the Eastern Illinois/Tennessee State contest which was decided on a last-second field goal and 55 points scored by UT Martin in a win over Southeast Missouri...Nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky improved to 6-0 in Conference play with a road win at Murray State; the Colonels have a bye week this week and then games at Austin Peay and at home against Tennessee Tech with one win needed to clinch at least a tie for the Conference championship...EKU is now 7-2 on the season and have clinched its 30th consecutive winning season, which is the second-longest streak nationally (Florida State has 30 in a row and is currently 5-3 this season)...Eastern Illinois won on a last-second field goal and is now 5-1 in OVC play with a bye week coming up; Jacksonville State is coming off a bye week and is 4-1 in OVC play...EIU and JSU will meet on Nov. 10 in Jacksonville; the winner of that contest - assuming they win out - will have a shot at either sharing the OVC Championship or at least earning an at-large berth in the FCS Playoffs...The OVC is looking to put two teams into the FCS playoffs for the second straight season; the OVC has not put multiple teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years since 1995 and 1996...In the latest national rankings, Eastern Kentucky moved up just slightly, to No. 16 in the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Poll... The Colonels are also 16th in last week's Gridiron Power Index (GPI)...This week's OVC Specialist of the Week - Tennessee Tech's Larry Shipp - set a school record and what is believed to be an OVC record for kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season (3); his three scores is first nationally this season while the FCS single-season record is 5.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Jefferson Adcock, QB • R-Sr., 5-11, 208 • Brentwood, Tenn. • Samford

Adcock set a Samford record with 472 yards passing in the Bulldogs 59-52 win at Tennessee Tech on Saturday. Adcock completed 29-of-40 passes with a career-high five touchdowns and no interceptions. The 472 passing yards was the most by an OVC player this season and the third highest output nationally in 2007. Adcock threw touchdown passes of 50, 3, 40, 24 and 61 yards in the game. Nine of his completions went to senior WR Jeff Moore, who had 260 total receiving yards (the second most nationally this season) and three touchdowns on the day.

DEFENSIVE

Derrick Huff, DB • Sr., 5-11, 188 • Hamilton, Ohio • Eastern Kentucky

Huff won the award for the second straight week after another impressive performance in EKU's 46-35 victory at Murray State. Huff tallied three interceptions, two of which came inside EKU's 20-yard line. He also added two pass break-ups and finished the game with a career-high 10 tackles. Huff's eight interceptions on the season is first in the OVC while his 0.89 interceptions/game ranks third nationally.

SPECIALIST

Larry Shipp, RS/WR • Sr., 5-9, 183 • Memphis, Tenn. • Tennessee Tech

Shipp had 301 all-purpose yards in a 59-52 loss to Samford, the second-best all-purpose game in school history. His total included two kickoff returns for 110 total yards, as he returned one kick for 88 yards for his school-record third kickoff for a touchdown this season. The three kickoff returns for a touchdown this season is most in the nation. Shipp also had seven receptions for a career-high 191 yards, the third-highest receiving yards game in school history.

CO-NEWCOMER

Jeff Ehrhardt, QB • R-Fr., 6-4, 210 • St. Louis, Mo. • Murray State

Ehrhardt turned in one of the best performances ever by a Murray State quarterback as he tossed for a career-best 344 yards and five touchdowns against No. 16 Eastern Kentucky. All five of his touchdowns were to different receivers. He became just the second MSU freshman to throw for over 300 yards in a game and fell one touchdown shy of Michael Proctor's school-record of six touchdown passes. Ehrhardt threw three of his touchdown passes in the first half as the Racers went into intermission trailing by just three points. With the Racers trailing by 22 heading into the fourth quarter, Ehrhardt led two scoring drives of over 75 yards to pull the team within one score. He also carried the ball 22 times for 51 yards.

CO-NEWCOMER

Cade Thompson, QB • So., 6-2, 188 • Maryville, Tenn. • UT Martin

Thompson earned his second start of the season and made the best of it in a 55-20 victory over Southeast Missouri State. He completed 23-of-32 passes for 317 yards and three touchdowns. He did not throw an interception and he was only sacked once. Thompson is the first UT Martin quarterback in to throw for more than 300 yards in a game, becoming the first to do so since Brady Wahlberg had 327 yards against Indiana State in 2004. Thompson completed passes to eight different receivers. His longest pass of the day was a 46-yard pass to Jessie Burton for one of his three touchdowns. Thompson also threw touchdown passes to Jamaal Akbar (31 yards) and Jay Robinson (115).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Sports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVC Sports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports (formerly XOS Technologies) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In nine weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 644 kickoffs in 57 games and only 29 of those went for touchbacks (4.5%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 481 kickoffs and 71 touchbacks (14.8%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

Eastern Kentucky Clinches 30th Consecutive Winning Season: With a 46-35 victory at Murray State on Oct. 27, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels improved to 7-2 on the season and clinched its 30th consecutive winning season. That mark is the second longest nationally, behind Florida State who has currently won 30 in a row and would extend that streak to 31 if they finish this season with a winning record (FSU is currently 5-3 on the year). You have to go back to 1977 to find a year the program did not have a winning record (they were 5-5). It will also be the program's 35th consecutive non-losing season (second nationally behind Michigan's now 40 years) and the team has not suffered a losing season since 1972.

Huff and Shipp Earned National Player of the Week Honors; Become 6th and 7th OVC Players to Earn National Honors This Season: Eastern Kentucky DB Derrick Huff and Tennessee Tech WR/RS Larry Shipp were named National Defensive and National Special Teams Players of the Week by the Sports Network on Monday. Huff grabbed three interceptions in EKU's road victory at Murray State, while also adding a career-high 10 tackles. He currently ranks third nationally in interceptions per game (0.89). Shipp had 301 all-purpose yards on the day (including 191 yards on seven receptions as a wideout) and returned a kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown. It marked his third KO return for a touchdown this season, a TTU (and possibly an OVC) record. His three kickoff returns for a touchdown is currently first nationally. The duo becomes the sixth and seventh OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this year. The other OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this season include a pair of Jacksonville State players - **Maurice Dupree** on Special Teams (Oct. 1) and LB **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 10), Austin Peay LB **Daniel Becker** (Sept. 16), Samford kicker **Mark Prevost** (Sept. 23) and Eastern Kentucky QB **Allan Holland** (Oct. 7).

Eastern Kentucky 16th in Latest Gridiron Power Index (GPI) Ranking: While national polls may be influenced by many factors and may not be totally accurate, one ranking system tries to put a fair spin on the issues. The Gridiron Power Index (GPI), is a hybrid ranking and index indicator of at-large playoff selection for the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and similar to the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) rankings. New GPI's are released each Tuesday; in last week's (Oct. 22) ranking, Eastern Kentucky was tabbed 16th nationally (18.50). The top five teams nationally were Northern Iowa (1.13), North Dakota State (2.25, although NDSU is ineligible for this year's championship), Massachusetts (2.25), McNeese State (5.00) and James Madison (6.00).

Two OVC Players on Updated Buck Buchanan Watch List: Two OVC players were on the updated watch list (released in October) for *The Sports Network's* Buck Buchanan Award given to the nation's top defensive player. The list includes Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who were also two of the 16 players on the August preseason list. UT Martin running back **Don Chapman** was on the preseason Walter Payton Watch List (top offensive player), but was not on the updated October list, that included 16 players. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. A final update of both lists will be released in November before the final ballots are decided upon. Final ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

The League of Extraordinary Rushers: If there is one thing the OVC has excelled at so far this season it is running the football. Through nine weeks there are currently two individuals who rank in the top 12 nationally in rushing - Austin Peay's Chris Fletcher (7th) and Tennessee Tech's **Derek White** (12th). Another individual - Southeast Missouri's Timmy Holloman - would be 7th, but he is currently ineligible and under the minimum (75%) of games played to qualify. There is only one other FCS Conference who currently has more players in the top 10 (the Colonial, who has the 5th, 7th and

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10th leading rushers nationally). From top to bottom as a Conference, the OVC has rushed the ball well by team as well, with 10 teams in the top 56 - something none of the other 13 FCS Conference can claim.

Samford's Evans is Nation's Top Rushing Freshman: Samford freshman RB **Chris Evans** currently ranks third in the OVC and 27th nationally in rushing yards per game (103.29). That number is first nationally among all freshmen; the next closest freshman is Florida A&M's Philip Sylvester, who is 34th at 95.88 yards/game.

National Leaders: In the latest set of national statistical rankings, one player and two teams can be found at a top of national statistical lists. Jacksonville State kicker Gavin Hallford is first in field goals made per game (2.13), a spot he has held most of the season. As a team, Eastern Kentucky is first nationally in three categories - turnover margin per game (+2.22), passes intercepted (19) and turnovers gained (28). Samford is first nationally in sacks allowed per game (0.50).

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Now 3rd in OVC History in Rushing Yards and 1st in Rushes: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman now ranks third all-time in OVC history (4,710), and is 439 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list. After rushing the ball 24 times in a win over Samford on Oct. 13, Chapman increased his career rushes total to 930, putting him first in OVC history in that category. He broke the record previously held by Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71) of Eastern Kentucky. Chapman now has 972 career rushes.

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record; Now 4th in OVC History for Receptions, 6th in Receiving Yardage: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks fourth in OVC history for career receptions (184), 10 catches out of third place all-time. Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he now has 2,758 career receiving yards which is sixth (55 yards out of fifth). Shipp has caught a pass in all 41 career games, as has Samford's **Jeff Moore**, which is believed to be an OVC record.

Moore Puts Up Career Numbers, Moves Into OVC Receiving Yards Top 10: Samford senior WR Jeff Moore had a career day on Oct. 27 at Tennessee Tech, as he caught nine passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns in a 59-52 Bulldogs victory. Moore set the Samford record for receiving yards in a game and the 290 yards was the third-highest output in FCS football this season. Moore currently ranks fifth in OVC history in career receptions (178) and eighth in career receiving yards (2,529).

Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will be the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After five of the six games in the series, Tennessee State (2-0) is the only team without a defeat in the series. Austin Peay has played all three of its games and finished at 2-1, Tennessee Tech played all three games and finished 1-2 and UT Martin is 0-2 with one more game to play. The final game in the series is Nov. 17, when Tennessee State hosts UT Martin. A win by TSU would give them the inaugural trophy out-right, while a loss would mean that TSU would share the trophy with Austin Peay.

Eastern Kentucky Named National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com: Following its 28-21 victory at No. 16 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels were named the Division I FCS National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com. With the win, EKU

improved to 4-2 overall and 3-0 in the OVC, which puts them atop the Conference standings. The Colonels only losses of the season have come at FBS schools Kentucky and Western Kentucky. In the win over Eastern Illinois, junior quarterback Allan Holland threw for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC and National Offensive Player of the Week honors. Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 19th OVC Championship this season and its first since the 1997 season, which was also the last time the program advanced to the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs.

No. 2 and No. 3 Active FCS Rushers Face Off: When Austin Peay claimed a 17-14 victory over UT Martin on Sept. 22, the game featured two of the top three active career rushers in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) - **Don Chapman** of UT Martin and **Chris Fletcher** of Austin Peay. Chapman entered the matchup as the No. 2 active career rusher while Fletcher entered the game third overall. Fletcher won the individual battle (107 yards to 46 yards) and also led his team to victory. Fletcher, a senior from Clarksville, has 25 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second most among active players (behind Drake's Scott Phaydavong) while Chapman, a senior from Marietta, Ga., has 20 100-yard games, the third most among active players at the FCS level. Chapman became the all-time leading rusher in UTM history this season while Fletcher broke the Austin Peay career rushing record as a junior in 2006.

Holland Named National Offensive Player of the Week: Eastern Kentucky junior QB **Allan Holland** became the fifth OVC player to earn National Player of the Week honors on Oct. 8, as he was named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (CSN). Holland completed 30-of-44 passes for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns in the Colonels 28-21 win at No. 16 Eastern Illinois. His first touchdown came with one second left in the first half and put EKU up 15-14; the other came late in the game to increase his team's lead to two scores. Both came after Holland scrambled out of the pocket, avoided would-be tacklers and found an open receiver.

Dupree Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: For the fourth time in five weeks of play this season, the OVC has another National Player of the Week. This time it is Jacksonville State return specialist **Maurice Dupree**, who earned National Special Teams Player of the Week from each the Sports Network, College Sporting News (CSN) and SME Network. Dupree finished the Murray State victory with 316 total return yards, 212 coming on four kickoffs and 104 on three punt returns. He was just three yards shy of breaking the OVC all-time record for kickoff return yardage in a game (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin) and he did set the JSU record in the process. Dupree returned a punt 88 yards in the second quarter to set-up a Gamecocks touchdown and later returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The punt return was the second longest in JSU's Division I history (trailing a 93-yarder) and the kickoff return for a touchdown was the first time JSU had accomplished that since the 2005 season and was the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest: When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyronne Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10th year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the squad's 28-22 win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game: Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time an woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

Prevost Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: Samford freshman kicker **Mark Prevost** was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Football Gazette on Sept. 26 after leading Samford to a 26-21 victory over Southeast Missouri. Prevost kicked four second-half field goals, after missing his lone attempt in the first half, to lead Samford to the come-from-behind victory (the Bulldogs trailed 21-10 at one point). Prevost kicked field goals of 47, 37, 41 and 34 yards. The 47-yarder was the career-long for the freshman.

Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week: For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network and the Football Gazette after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS at that point of the season.

Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Jacksonville State linebacker **Drew Robinson** was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chatta-

nooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Tennessee Tech senior running back **Derek White** has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record also held by Austin Peay's Daniel Williams (1996) and Youngstown State's Patrick Wicks (1981).

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Jax State Keeps Interception Likely an NCAA Record: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The streak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Halford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks; Owns JSU Career Field Goals Made Mark: It is not rare to see a kicker make a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Halford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Halford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Halford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). He has been named OVC Specialist of the Week three times this season.

That's A Crowd: OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds this season. When Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game. On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic; that crowd was the largest to see a FCS football game this year (the Jackson State crowd is the third largest FCS crowd this year).

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were

CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Eastern Kentucky has secured its 30th consecutive winning season in 2007. The Colonels have not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 overall in 1977 (the second longest streak in Division I). You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (that streak is also second in Division I).

first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

New Faces: After just four weeks of the 2007 season, the three new OVC head football coaches have combined to go 10-5 overall. **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of October 22, 11 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players are two players who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens and Tristan Burge (Eastern Illinois) of the Green Bay Packers. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

A Look Back at 2006: The 2006 season marked a first for the League, as Tennessee-Martin captured its first OVC Championship (sharing the title with Eastern Illinois). The Skyhawks, who joined the Conference in 1992, finished the year with a 9-3 overall record and 6-1 OVC mark. Prior to the season the program had recorded just one above .500 Conference mark (a 5-3 record in 1993). Over the last two seasons UTM is 10-5 in the Conference after compiling just an 11-89 (11%) mark over the previous nine seasons. Tennessee-Martin was rewarded with the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Playoffs, where it competed in its first postseason game as an I-AA (now FCS) school. Eastern Illinois, who finished the year 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the OVC, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship, the program's fifth bid in the last seven years. It marked the first time since the 2000 season that the OVC had two teams in the playoffs in the same season. UTM won its regular season meeting with EIU, 15-9, marking only its second win over the Panthers in 12 tries. UTM running back **Don Chapman** and Eastern Illinois running back **Vincent Webb** were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year while EIU's **Donald Thomas** earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. UTM's **Jason Simpson** picked up the Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award while Tennessee Tech freshman quarterback **Lee Sweeney** grabbed the Newcomer of the Year award.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

NCAA ACTIVE RUSHING LEADERS

This season two OVC running backs are near the top of the active career rushing leaders at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Don Chapman of UT Martin and Chris Fletcher of Austin Peay currently rank No. 2 and No. 3 nationally in that category, only trailing Scott Phaydavong of Drake.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and Southeast Missouri meet for the 11th time in history and second year in a row on Saturday. The matchup is key for Austin Peay, who was picked to finish last in the OVC this season but finds itself in fourth place after five Conference games and is looking to stay above .500 in OVC play this season. The Redhawks are looking to end a five-game losing streak dating back to the middle of September.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is coming off a bye week, having last played two weeks ago when the Governors topped Samford 28-25. The five wins for the team is already the most since the 2002 team was 7-5 overall. It is the most by a Govs scholarship program (the team was non-scholarship from 1997-05) since going 5-6 in 1991. The three wins in OVC play are the most by an APSU squad since going 3-5 in 1994. Senior RB Chris Fletcher was named last week's OVC Offensive Player of the Week after recording the 26th career 100-yard rushing game of his career. He finished with a season-best 196 yards, one yard shy of his career-high. He collected 171 of those yards in the second half and needs just two yards to tally his second-straight 1,000-yard season. He now has 41 career touchdowns and 246 career points. The Govs defense has been steady this year, netting 11 interceptions on the season and intercepting at least one pass in seven of eight games. In the Samford win, redshirt freshman punter Ryan Key punted five times for an average of 47.8 yards/punt. That included three punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line and another that went a career-long 60 yards.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri lost its fifth game in a row on Saturday, falling 55-20 at UT Martin. Now healthy and starting at quarterback, newcomer Houston Lillard completed 19-of-33 passes for 252 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He spread the ball around to eight different receivers, with Joseph Tuineau catching five balls for 78 yards and Daryl Gist grabbing four passes for 72 yards (including a touchdown). Kicker/punter Doug Spada continued to do both jobs well this season, as he kicked a 26-yard field goal and had four punts for an average of 42.8 yards/kick and downed two inside the 20-yard line. He ranked in the Top 20 in both categories nationally. Defensively, the 'Hawks were without their top defensive player, LB Adam Casper, who may miss this week's game as well. In his place Nick Stauffer had 15 tackles (7 solo). Vincent Anderson, who started the season at WR, had 11 tackles (including one for a loss) in the game while his twin brother Victor, who started the season at QB for Southeast, made six tackles (5 solo).

GAME NOTES: Rivals Jacksonville State and Samford will meet on Saturday for the 45th and last time in the near future. Samford, who will leave the OVC for the Southern Conference after this season, is 21-21-2 all-time against its in-state rivals. Jacksonville State has controlled the series in recent years, winning seven straight. Samford is looking to even its record in the OVC, while Jacksonville State tries to keep its hunt alive for an OVC Championship and/or an at-large FCS Playoff berth. The meeting between JSU head coach Jack Crowe and Samford head coach Pat Sullivan pits old friends against each other for the first time. Both grew up in the West End of Birmingham and have coached in similar circles, but have never faced off when both parties have been head coaches.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State is fresh after taking a bye week last week. The Gamecocks have won four in a row since an 11-point home loss to Eastern Kentucky. They play rival Samford before facing off with Eastern Illinois in a key game in two weeks. Last time out they topped Tennessee Tech 38-10 at home. In that game QB Cedric Johnson scored three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) and was 8-for-21 for 85 yards through the air and rushed for 37 yards. He has now gone 113 consecutive touches without committing an error and has six rushing touchdowns in his last two outings. Senior Adrian Smith had a big defensive outing against TTU, recording three tackles, a sack, two tackles-for-loss, forcing a fumble and making an interception. Senior WR Taurean Rhetta extended his school-record streak for consecutive catches to 29 and moved into seventh place on the JSU career receiving chart (1,456 yards). He is just 44 yards away from sixth place in school history. Junior return specialist Maurice Dupree continues to impress and currently ranks second nationally in punt returns and fourth nationally in kickoff returns.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: Samford is coming off an offensive explosion last week, when it scored 59 points in a 59-52 victory over Tennessee Tech last Saturday. The win in Cookeville marked the team's first road victory of the season. The offensive output was buoyed by QB Jefferson Adcock and WR Jeff Moore. Adcock earned OVC Offensive Player of the Week honors after completing 29-of-40 passes for 472 yards (a Samford record) and five touchdowns (a career-high). Adcock threw touchdown strikes of 50, 3, 40, 24 and 61 yards in the game. The 472 yards passing was the third-highest total in the country this season. Three of his touchdowns went to senior WR Jeff Moore, who had nine receptions for a career-high 260 yards (the second-highest total nationally this year). Despite all the offense from that duo, it took freshman Alex Barnett to end the game. Barnett scored the game-winning touchdown with 52 seconds left. He finished the game with nine carries for 40 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore safety Ty Levie added eight tackles and an interception on the day; the pick came on TTU's last drive of the game and secured the victory for the Bulldogs.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech steps out of conference for the final time this season to play nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Auburn on Saturday. The game marks the return to SEC competition for TTU head coach Watson Brown who was the head coach at Vanderbilt from 1986-90; Brown was 0-3 against the Tigers in that time frame. The game is the annual Homecoming matchup for Auburn, who is 67-8-5 all-time on Homecoming weekend, and won 15 straight Homecoming contests.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech put up 52 points this past weekend against Samford, but unfortunately came out on the losing end of a 59-52 decision. The 111 combined points in the game was a TTU school record. WR/RS Larry Shipp was named OVC Specialist of the Week after catching seven passes for a career-high 191 yards (third best in school history) and scoring two touchdowns, and also returning two kicks for 110 total yards, including an 88-yard touchdown. It marked his school-record third TD on a kickoff return this season, a mark that is third nationally. Shipp finished the game with 301 all-purpose yards, the second-highest single-game total in Tech history. Shipp raised his school record career catch mark to 184 and is now just 55 yards behind Craig Rolle for career receiving yards (2,813). He is also third in career all-purpose yards (3,991). Senior RB Derek White had a good game, tallying 105 yards (his 10th career 100-yard rushing game) and scoring a pair of touchdowns. He now has 1,051 rushing yards on the season, the sixth-highest total in school history. In his second game back from an injury he suffered earlier this season, sophomore QB Lee Sweeney passed for 367 yards and three touchdowns; it was the fourth-best individual passing game in Golden Eagle history. It marked Sweeney's eighth 200-yard-plus passing game of his career; he now has 3,317 yards of total offense in his career, a mark that is already eighth in TTU history. Sweeney has 3,427 total passing yards, a mark that is fifth in school history for a career.

SCOUTING AUBURN: The Tigers have continued to move up the national polls and are now 16th nationally in one poll, 19th in the other. Tommy Tuberville has built the program into a consistent winner, as they are 46-16 overall in SEC games since the 2000 season; over the last four seasons the team is 39-8 (.830), the fifth-best record among FBS teams. This year they have won six games and are now bowl eligible for the eighth straight season. The Tigers break a tough defense to the field, as they rank eighth in the nation in total defense (292.7 yards/game allowed) and ninth in scoring defense (15.8 points/game allowed). Brandon Cox leads the passing attack, completing 59.8 percent (128-of-214) of his passes for 1,452 yards and seven touchdowns this season. Bent Tate has rushed for 686 yards and four scores while Mario Fannin has added five touchdown runs. Defensively, Patrick Lee has four interceptions and Chris Evans leads the team with 53 tackles, while also adding a sack, interception, four pass break-ups and four quarterback hurries.

GAME NOTES: Murray State and Tennessee State square off for the 19th time on Saturday when the Racers travel to Nashville. TSU lost its second game in a row after losing starting QB Antonio Heffner, while Murray State gave league-leader Eastern Kentucky all it could handle before falling by 11. The teams have been even in the series over the past seven years, with no team winning two in a row over that span.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State gave first-place Eastern Kentucky all it could handle last weekend before falling by 11 points at home. The team racked has been hitting on all cylinders the last six quarters, racking up 862 yards of offense and 66 total points. Redshirt freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt completed 29-of-43 passes for 344 yards and five touchdowns while also rushing the ball 22 times for 51 yards. That performance earned him OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week honors. The performance was one of the best in Racer history, as he became just the second MSU freshman to throw for over 300 yards in a game and fell just one passing touchdown short of Michael Proctor's school record. His five touchdown passes went to five different receivers and the 300-yard passing game was the first for a Murray player since the 2003 season (Stephen Hatchel). Sophomore RB Charlie Jordan saw his streak of two straight 100-yard rushing games come to an end, as he finished the game with 75 rushing yards; he has rushed for 359 yards over the last three contests. Senior WR Rod Harper caught three passes for 35 yards and a score against the Colonels; he has caught a pass in 24 straight games. LB Tamar Butler recorded a pair of sacks against EKV to move his season total to a team-high five.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: The Tigers lost their second straight game, falling on a last second field goal at home to No. 25 Eastern Illinois. It was the team's first home game since its season-opener against Alabama A&M on Sept. 1. TSU was without QB Antonio Heffner, who suffered a season-ending injury the previous week at EKV. In his place, true freshman Calvin McNairl, a native of Paris, Tenn., got his first career start. McNairl passed for 189 yards (8-of-16) and rushed for 45 yards and a touchdown. He accounted for 234 yards of total offense and had pass completions of 50 and 49 yards. RB Javaris Williams moved into second place on the career rushing list at Tennessee State. He carried the ball 14 times for 86 yards and now has 2,869 career rushing yards. Sophomore LB Calvin Baker was a difference-maker on defense, making a career-high 16 tackles (8 solo) against the Panthers. Tennessee State will play its second straight home game, and has one more home game left after this week.
