THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Eastern Kentucky clinched at least a share of its 19th OVC Championship, and first since the 1997 season, with a 28-14 victory at Austin Peay last week...The Colonels are now 8-2 on the season (7-0 OVC), have won seven in a row and have not lost a game to a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team this season (their losses were at Kentucky and Western Kentucky)...Even though EKU could share the Championship with Eastern Illinois (if EKU lost and EIU won its season finale), the Colonels have already locked up the OVC's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs, which will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24...Eastern Illinois, which has won the last two OVC Championships, kept its co-championship and at-large playoff hopes alive with a 37-23 road victory at Jacksonville State...EIU is now 7-3 on the season and 6-1 in the OVC...With a victory over Samford on Saturday, the Panthers would finish the season at 8-3 and put themselves in prime position to appear in the playoffs for the third straight season and sixth time in the last eight years...No OVC team with eight victories over Division I opponents in any given year, has never been left out of the FCS Playoffs since an expansion to 16 teams in 1986...In non-playoff related games, Tennessee State will attempt to win the inaugural Sgt. York Trophy when it hosts UT Martin on Saturday...A win by TSU would put the team 3-0 against fellow in-state OVC foes and give the program the inaugural trophy; a loss would mean the Tigers would share the trophy with Austin Peay...UT Martin made OVC history last Saturday by putting up 76 points in a 76-34 victory over Murray State; the 76 points matched the most ever scored in a OVC matchup, tying Tennessee State's 76 against UT Martin in 1998...UTM running back Don Chapman eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the fourth consecutive season on Saturday, becoming just the 14th player in Division I history (FBS and FCS combined) to achieve that feat...Chapman has 4,914 career rushing yards with one game to play; that is just 147 yards out of second place in OVC history...Chapman is also fourth in OVC history in career scoring (284 points) and would move into third place with one more touchdown run.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Don Chapman, RB • Sr., 5-10, 234 • Marietta, Ga. • UT Martin

Chapman rushed for 204 yards on 23 carries and had four touchdowns in the Skyhawks 76-34 win over Murray State. He scored on runs of 22, 50, 1 and 9 yards, all of which came in the first half. He scored three of the four touchdowns in the first quarter and one in the second quarter. He had three touches in the third quarter and did not play in the fourth quarter as his team led 49-10 at the break. With the 204 yards, Chapman became the 14th Division I football player ever to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. He recorded his seventh career 200-yard rushing game, his 23rd career 100-yard rushing game and his third consecutive 100-yard rushing game of this season. He helped his team accounted for 76 points, which was tied for most ever scored in a OVC matchup. He needs 147 yards in his career finale next week to finish second in OVC history for rushing.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Michael Torres, DE • Sr., 6-1, 255 • Miami, Fla. • Eastern Illinois

Torres made four tackles in the Panthers win over Jacksonville State, including one for loss. His biggest contribution, however, was tipping a pass to himself for an interception and returning it 40 yards for a fourth quarter touchdown that sealed EIU's win over JSU and kept its at-large playoff hopes alive.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Brandon Gathof, DB • Jr., 6-2, 204 • LaGrange, Ky. • Eastern Kentucky
Gathof intercepted two passes in the Colonels 28-14 win over Austin Peay, including one inside the ECU red zone. He also chipped in with six tackles and added a pass break-up.

Quinten Ponius, KR • Jr., 5-9, 197 • Rockford, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Ponius opened the second half of the Panthers game against Jacksonville State with a 96-yard kickoff return for touchdown. It marked the first time since 2002 that an EIU player had returned a kick off for touchdown. Ponius finished the game with three kick returns for 133 yards (44.3 yards per return) as Eastern Illinois won 37-23 and kept its at-large playoff hopes alive.

NEWCOMER

Cade Thompson, QB • So., 6-2, 188 • Maryville, Tenn. • UT Martin

Thompson earned his third start of the season and completed 13-of-21 passes for 261 yards (no interceptions) and four touchdowns in the Skyhawks 76-34 victory over Murray State. Thompson threw touchdown passes of 79 yards (Roren Thomas), 13 yards (Linzy Patterson), 42 yards (Thomas) and 16 yards (Jamaal Akbar). The 79-yard pass to Thomas was the second longest completion of the season for the Skyhawks. It marked the second time in three weeks he has earned the Newcomer of the Week award and UTM is 2-1 in his three starts this season.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Sports.TV: For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVC Sports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports (formerly XOS Technologies) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks: Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In 11 weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 753 kickoffs in 66 games and only 36 of those went for touchbacks (4.8%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 562 kickoffs and 81 touchbacks (14.4%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

Eastern Kentucky Clinches Share of 19th OVC Championship; Automatic Bid to FCS Playoffs: With a 28-14 victory at Austin Peay on Nov. 10, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels gained at least a share of their 19th OVC Championship and first in 10 years (1997). It also locked up the OVC's automatic bid to the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs, the school's 18th appearance, which is tied for the most all-time (with fellow 2007 participant Montana). EKU is now 8-2 on the season and 7-0 in OVC play with one game left (home against Tennessee Tech). The Colonels two losses this season have both come against FBS teams (Kentucky and Western Kentucky), as they are a perfect 8-0 this season against FCS teams and are positioning themselves for the playoffs which begin on Nov. 24. The team has locked up its 30th consecutive winning season, a mark that is the second longest nationally, behind Florida State, who has currently won 30 in a row and would extend that streak to 31 if they finish this season with a winning record (FSU is currently 6-4 on the year). You have to go back to 1977 to find a year the EKU program did not have a winning record (they were 5-5). It will also be the program's 35th consecutive non-losing season (second nationally behind Michigan's now 40 years) and the team has not suffered a losing season since 1972.

Eastern Illinois Looks At Possible FCS Playoffs At-Large Berth: With a big 37-23 road victory at Jacksonville State on Nov. 10, Eastern Illinois, the two-time defending OVC Champions, kept its hopes alive for a possible at-large berth into the FCS Playoff. With a home victory over Samford this weekend, the Panthers would finish the season 8-3 overall and 7-1 in the OVC. Since the FCS Playoff field expanded to 16 teams in 1986, no OVC team with eight Division I victories has ever been left out of the field. Eastern is looking for its third straight playoff appearance and sixth appearance in the last eight years. What separates EIU from other possible at-large teams? For starters: (1) Have played a complete Division I schedule this season; (2) Have won six of last seven games; (3) Are 5-1 in road games this year (only loss was at FBS Purdue); (4) Only losses are to Eastern Kentucky (who is undefeated against FCS opponents this season) by 7 points and Illinois State by 3 points and FBS power Purdue; (5) Ranks in Top 10 nationally in punting and least interceptions thrown; (6) Have battled injuries all season long by has had entire team healthy for final two games of regular season, including 37-23 road win over Jacksonville State; (7) Has advanced to the FCS Playoffs in five of the last seven years.

OVC Looking For Back-to-Back Multiple Playoff Teams: If the OVC gets two teams into the FCS Playoffs, it would mark the second straight season that has occurred (Eastern Illinois and UT Martin represented the league last season). It would be the first time since the 1995/1996 seasons that the OVC had placed multiple teams into the playoffs in back-to-back years (Eastern Kentucky/Murray State in 1995 and Eastern Illinois/Murray State in 1996).

Sgt. York Trophy To Be Decided Saturday: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After five of the six games in the series, Tennessee State (2-0) is the only team without a defeat in the series. Austin Peay has played all three of its games and finished at 2-1, Tennessee Tech played all three games and finished 1-2 and UT Martin is 0-2 with one more game to play. The final game in the series is this Saturday (Nov. 17), when Tennessee State hosts UT Martin. A win by TSU would

Chapman Named National Player of the Week; Becomes 8th OVC Player to Win National Honor This Season: UT Martin senior RB Don Chapman became the eighth OVC player to earn a National Player of the Week award this season on Nov. 12 when he was tabbed with that honor by The Sports Network. Chapman rushed for 204 yards on 23 carries (8.9 yards per carry) and scored four touchdowns in a 76-34 win over Murray State. He scored on runs of 22, 50, 1 and 9 yards all of which came in the first half. He had only three touches in the third quarter before being pulled as UT Martin led 49-10 at halftime. With the 204 yards he went over the 1,000-yard plateau for the fourth straight season becoming just the 14th Division I player to reach that accomplishment. It was his seventh career 200-yard rushing effort, his 23rd career 100-yard plus rushing game and his third consecutive 100-yard rushing game of the season. The other OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this season include a pair of Jacksonville State players - **Maurice Dupree** on Special Teams (Oct.1) and LB **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 10), Austin Peay LB **Daniel Becker** (Sept. 16), Samford kicker **Mark Prevost** (Sept. 23), Eastern Kentucky QB **Allan Holland** (Oct. 7) and DB **Derrick Huff** (Oct. 28) and Tennessee Tech WR/RS **Larry Shipp** (Oct. 28).

Chapman Becomes 14th Division I Player to Rush for 1,000 Yards in Four Straight Seasons: UT Martin senior RB **Don Chapman** made NCAA Division I history on Nov. 10 when he became the 14th player at the Division I level to rush for 1,000 or more yards in four straight seasons. Chapman pushed above the 1,000-yard plateau against Murray State by running for 204 yards in just a half of play (he touched the ball only three times in the second half before sitting out the rest of the game). He is the eighth player at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level to do so, including Drake's Scott Phaydavong, who reached the milestone earlier this season. The other FCS players to accomplish the feat include Jerry Azumah, New Hampshire (1995-98); Adrian Peterson, Georgia Southern (1998-01); Alonzo Coleman, Hampton (2003-06); Clifton Dawson, Harvard (2003-06) and Steve Baylark, Massachusetts (2003-06). The FBS players to reach the feat include Tony Dorsett, Pittsburgh (1973-76); Amos Lawrence, North Carolina (1977-80); Dennis Manns, New Mexico State (1995-98), Ron Dayne, Wisconsin (1996-99); DonTrell Moore, New Mexico (2002-05); Cedric Benson, Texas (2002-05). One player did it by playing two years at a lower division school and two years at a FBS school (Howard Stevens, Randolph Macon in 1968-69 and Louisville in 1971-72.).

UT Martin Re-Writes OVC Record Book: UT Martin set several OVC records in a 76-34 victory over Murray State on Nov. 10. The 76 points in an OVC contest tied the record established by Tennessee State (against UT Martin) in the 1998 season. The team also set a record for most rushing yards (821, besting the former mark of 800), best rushing yards average (10.6, besting a mark of 9.91) and kicker **Tom Hansen** equaled the record for most point after attempts converted (10, done now four different times). Murray State did set one record in the contest as well, setting the record for most kickoffs returned (12, breaking the previous mark of 10).

Two OVC Players on Updated Buck Buchanan Watch List: Two OVC players were on the updated watch list (released in October) for *The Sports Network's* Buck Buchanan Award given to the nation's top defensive player. The list includes Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who were also two of the 16 players on the August preseason list. UT Martin running back **Don Chapman** was on the preseason Walter Payton Watch List (top offensive player), but was not on the updated October list, that included 16 players. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. A final update of both lists will be released in November before the final ballots are decided upon. Final ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

Samford's Evans is Nation's Leading Rusher Among Freshman: Samford freshman RB **Chris Evans** currently ranks 48th nationally in rushing yards per game (92.70). He barely leads Karrington Bush of Texas State (92.20 yards/game) for the freshman lead going into the final week of the season.

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Now 3rd in OVC History in Rushing Yards, 1st in Rushes and 4th in Scoring: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing

leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman now ranks third all-time in OVC history (4,914), and is 143 yards away from moving into second place on the list (Charles Anthony, TSU). After rushing the ball 24 times in a win over Samford on Oct. 13, Chapman increased his career rushes total to 930, putting him first in OVC history in that category. He broke the record previously held by Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71) of Eastern Kentucky. Chapman now has 995 career rushes. After scoring four times against Murray State, he increased his career scoring total to 284 points, which is fourth in OVC history and just four points out of third place.

Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record; Now 5th in OVC History for Receptions, 6th in Receiving Yardage: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks fifth in OVC history for career receptions (188), six catches out of third place all-time with one game to play. Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he now has 2,786 career receiving yards which is sixth (27 yards out of fifth). Shipp has caught a pass in all 43 career games, as has Samford's **Jeff Moore**, which is believed to be an OVC record.

Moore Puts Up Career Numbers, Moves Up Career OVC Lists: Samford senior WR Jeff Moore had a career day on Oct. 27 at Tennessee Tech, as he caught nine passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns in a 59-52 Bulldogs victory. Moore set the Samford record for receiving yards in a game and the 260 yards was the second-highest output in FCS football this season (behind a 268-yard outing). Moore currently ranks fourth in OVC history in career receptions (189) and seventh in career receiving yards (2,724). He needs just five receptions to move up to third place all-time.

Murray State's Ehrhardt Tops 300 Yards Passing, 100 Rushing in Same Game: Murray State freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt has had an impressive redshirt freshman season. He has had many "firsts" for the Racer program and is one of only five QB's nationally this season to pass for 300 or more yards and rush for 100 or more yards in the same game. Ehrhardt threw for 330 yards and two scores and rushed the ball 30 times for 104 yards and another score. His 36 completions on the day set a new Murray State record. He is the first OVC player to achieve this feat since Samford's Ray Nelson did so in 2004. Ehrhardt is only the fifth FCS player to achieve the feat this season; the full list of players who have accomplished the feat is below.

Tennessee Tech Plays in Front of 85,754, Which is Largest Crowd to Ever See an OVC Team Play: When Tennessee Tech played at No. 16 Auburn on Nov. 3, there were 85,754 fans in attendance, marking the biggest crowd to ever see an OVC football team play. It passed the former record which was 77,527 when Murray State played at Wisconsin on Sept. 4, 1998. Overall this year, OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds. Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game (and the 7th largest crowd to see an OVC game). On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic; that crowd was the second largest to see a FCS football game this year (the Jackson State crowd is the fourth largest FCS crowd this year).

Washington Sets OVC Record for Longest Rush: Eastern Kentucky senior RB Bobby Washington set the OVC record for longest run on Oct. 27 at Murray State. Washington took a handoff and went 99 yards to break the record of 97 yards previously set by Don Daly (EKU, 1951), Carl Walker, (Murray State, 1954) and Stevie Chaney (Murray State, 2005).

Eastern Kentucky Named National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com: Following its 28-21 victory at No. 16 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels were named the Division I FCS National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com. With the win, EKU improved to 4-2 overall and 3-0 in the OVC, which puts them atop the Conference standings. The Colonels only losses of the season have come at FBS schools Kentucky and Western Kentucky. In the win over Eastern Illinois, junior quarterback Allan Holland threw for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC and National Offensive Player of the Week honors. Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 19th OVC Championship this season and its first since the 1997 season, which was also the last time the program advanced to the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs.

No. 2 and No. 3 Active FCS Rushers Face Off: When Austin Peay claimed a 17-14 victory over UT Martin on Sept. 22, the game featured two of the top three active career rushers in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) - **Don Chapman** of UT Martin and **Chris Fletcher** of Austin Peay. Chapman entered the matchup as the No. 2 active career rusher while Fletcher entered the game third overall. Fletcher won the individual battle (107 yards to 46 yards) and also led his team to victory. Fletcher, a senior from Clarksville, has 25 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second most among active players (behind Drake's Scott Phaydavong) while Chapman, a senior from Marietta, Ga., has 20 100-yard games, the third most among active players at the FCS level. Chapman became the all-time leading rusher in UTM history this season while Fletcher broke the Austin Peay career rushing record as a junior in 2006.

Huff and Shipp Earned National Player of the Week Honors; Become 6th and 7th OVC Players to Earn National Honors This Season: Eastern Kentucky DB Derrick Huff and Tennessee Tech WR/RS Larry Shipp were named National Defensive and National Special Teams Players of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 29. Huff grabbed three interceptions in EKU's road victory at Murray State, while also adding a career-high 10 tackles. He currently ranks third nationally in interceptions per game (0.89). Shipp had 301 all-purpose yards on the day (including 191 yards on seven receptions as a wideout) and returned a kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown. It marked his third KO return for a touchdown this season, a TTU and OVC record. His three kickoff returns for a touchdown is currently first nationally.

Holland Named National Offensive Player of the Week: Eastern Kentucky junior QB **Allan Holland** became the fifth OVC player to earn National Player of the Week honors on Oct. 8, as he was named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (CSN). Holland completed 30-of-44 passes for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns in the Colonels 28-21 win at No. 16 Eastern Illinois. His first touchdown came with one second left in the first half and put EKU up 15-14; the other came late in the game to increase his team's lead to two scores. Both came after Holland scrambled out of the pocket, avoided would-be tacklers and found an open receiver.

Dupree Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: For the fourth time in five weeks of play this season, the OVC has another National Player of the Week. This time it is Jacksonville State return specialist **Maurice Dupree**, who earned National Special Teams Player of the Week from each the Sports Network, College Sporting News (CSN) and SME Network. Dupree finished the Murray State victory with 316 total return yards, 212 coming on four kickoffs and 104 on three punt returns. He was just three yards shy of breaking the OVC all-time record for kickoff return yardage in a game (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin) and he did set the JSU record in the process. Dupree returned a punt 88 yards in the second quarter to set-up a Gamecocks touchdown and later returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The punt return was the second longest in JSU's Division I history (trailing a 93-yarder) and the kickoff return for a touchdown was the first time JSU had accomplished that since the 2005 season and was the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest: When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyrone Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10th year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the squad's 28-22 win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game: Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time an woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

Prevost Named National Special Teams Player of the Week: Samford freshman kicker **Mark Prevost** was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Football Gazette on Sept. 26 after leading Samford to a 26-21 victory over Southeast Missouri. Prevost kicked four second-half field goals, after missing his lone attempt in the first half, to lead Samford to the come-from-behind victory (the Bulldogs trailed 21-10 at one point). Prevost kicked field goals of 47, 37, 41 and 34 yards. The 47-yarder was the career-long for the freshman.

Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week: For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network and the Football Gazette after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS at that point of the season.

Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week: Jacksonville State linebacker **Drew Robinson** was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chattanooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 85 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 75 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (52) and UT Martin (33). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (that streak is also second in Division I).

White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Tennessee Tech senior running back **Derek White** has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record also held by Austin Peay's Daniel Williams (1996) and Youngstown State's Patrick Wicks (1981).

Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return: Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

Jax State Keeps Interception Likely an NCAA Record: Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The streak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks: Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

Halford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks; Owns JSU Career Field Goals Made Mark: It is not rare to see a kicker make a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Halford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Halford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Halford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). He has been named OVC Specialist of the Week three times this season.

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

An Early Conference Matchup: The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

Add One, Lose One: The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

NCAA ACTIVE RUSHING LEADERS

This season two OVC running backs are near the top of the active career rushing leaders at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Don Chapman of UT Martin and Chris Fletcher of Austin Peay currently rank No. 2 and No. 3 nationally in that category, only trailing Scott Phaydavong of Drake.

OVC OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS

Since the league expanded to include Jacksonville State and Samford in 2003, three teams are at the top of the winning list in OVC games in the last five years. Eastern Kentucky has won 31 games, one more than Jacksonville State (30) and three more than Eastern Illinois (28). Below is a list of team's records in Conference games dating back to the beginning of the 2003 season (Austin Peay just re-joined the OVC in 2007 after a 10-year period of being away from the league).

New Faces: After just four weeks of the 2007 season, the three new OVC head football coaches have combined to go 10-5 overall. **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

Another Coach Returns: One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

Coaches At Their Alma Maters: Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gobs quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at ECU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

NFL Connections: As of October 22, 11 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players are two players who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens and Tristan Burge (Eastern Illinois) of the Green Bay Packers. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

FCS Playoffs: For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

CHAPMAN MAKES HISTORY

This season UT Martin senior RB Don Chapman made history this season. Chapman became just the 14th player in Division I football history to rush for 1,000 yards or more in four different seasons. He reached that mark with a 204-yard performance on Nov. 10 against Murray State. Another player - Drake's Scott Phaydavong - reached that milestone by hitting 1,000 yards on Oct. 27. Six FBS players, seven FCS players and one player who did it at two schools, have reached that milestone, including three last season at the FCS level.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

FOOTBALL

One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and Murray State renew a rivalry that has pretty much been dormant since the Governors left the OVC following the 1996 season. The teams have played only twice since then (1997, 2005) with Murray winning by a combined margin of 93-6. Overall the Racers have won seven in a row in the series which dates back to the 1953 season. Murray State leads the series which will have its 41st meeting on Saturday.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Senior RB Chris Fletcher continued to be the workhorse for the team, carrying the ball 24 times for 130 yards and a 33-yard touchdown in last weekend's 28-14 loss to OVC Champion Eastern Kentucky. It was Fletcher's 28th 100-yard rushing performance of his career (second nationally among active players) and his eighth 100-yard performance of the season. Freshman WR Adrian Mines had four catches for 105 yards and fellow freshman Darryl Miller caught three passes for 30 yards in the game. Austin Peay, however, ran into trouble in the red zone, scoring just once in its five trips inside the ECU 20-yard line. APSU threw two interceptions, missed a field goal and turned the ball over on downs in four of its five trips into the red zone. The Governors defense did manage to intercept a pass, doing so for the seventh consecutive game when Tremayne Townsend picked off Allan Holland in the first quarter. LB Kit Hartsfield returned from an injury to have a team-high 12 tackles while fellow LB Chris Haynes added 11 stops. It was also senior day for the Govs, as they honored the nine seniors who came to Austin Peay as walk-on's during the team's non-scholarship days.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State was on the wrong end of a UT Martin buzz saw this past weekend, falling 76-34 to the red-hot Skyhawk offense. On the positive, the team did rack up over 500 yards of offense for the third straight game in scoring those 34 points. Freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt set a new Murray State freshman record as he tossed his 21st touchdown pass of the season. He also tied the school record with his third-straight 300-yard passing performance. He finished the game 31-of-54 for 315 yards and three touchdowns. He is the No. 2 rated freshman QB in the nation in terms of yards (2,402 - sixth most in a season at Murray State) and touchdowns (trailing only Scott Riddle of Elon). One of his new favorite targets has been Marcus Harris, who caught a pair of touchdowns against UTM; he now has four touchdown receptions in the past three weeks. Fellow WR Rod Harper caught seven passes for 99 yards and two scores as well. He is currently ninth in receptions and 10th in yards in a single-season in Racer history. Freshman K/P handled both the kicking and punting duties for the first time in his young career. He punted the ball seven times for an average of 36.3 yards, and put four punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line. He was also 2-of-2 on field goal attempts, connecting from 35 and 36 yards. Weiss was also successful on all four point after attempts, and is 30-for-30 on the season on PAT's.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky has already clinched at least a share of its 19th OVC Championship and can win the title outright with a victory over Tennessee Tech on Saturday. The Colonels have already secured the OVC's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs and know they have life after this week. ECU begins play in the FCS Playoffs on Nov. 24. Tennessee Tech looks to close the first season under new head coach Watson Brown, as they look to snap a five-game losing streak. The teams have played 63 times over the year with ECU holding a big advantage (46-17) in the all-time series. But Tech snapped a five-game losing streak in the all-time series last season, winning 27-14 in Cookeville.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech is coming off a bye week and will be rested going into the season finale. Two weeks ago they played at No. 16 Auburn and did so in front of 85,754 fans, the largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play football (surpassing a crowd of 77,527 when Murray State played Wisconsin). TTU lost that game 35-3. Derek White rushed for 66 yards while QB Lee Sweeney was 19-of-26 for 168 yards through the air. Larry Shipp caught four of those passes for 28 yards. Shipp enters the final game of his career ranking fifth in OVC history in career receptions (188) and sixth in career receiving yards (2,786). He has caught a pass in each of his career games (43), which is an OVC record.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: The Colonels go for their eighth straight victory on Saturday when they host Tennessee Tech. The team is a perfect 8-0 this season against Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams, having lost to only FBS schools Kentucky and Western Kentucky. Last week the team pulled off a 28-14 win at Austin Peay. Junior DB Brandon Gathof was named OVC Co-Defensive Player of the Week after intercepting two passes (one in the red zone) in the contest; he also added six tackles and a pass break-up. George Anderson also got into the act on the defensive side of things, recording 12 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 2.0 tackles-for-loss and forcing a fumble. The defense was also excellent in the red zone, limiting the Governors to just 1-of-5 on their trips inside the 20-yard line. ECU's defense, which is first nationally in turnover margin, has tallied at least three turnovers in four straight games. Offensively, senior RB Bobby Washington netted 116 yards while senior Mark Dunn chipped in with 74. It was the third straight 100-yard rushing game in a row for Washington. QB Allan Holland was 13-of-21 for 176 and two touchdowns. The team will be making its 18th FCS Playoff appearance, which is a national record (tied with Montana). The Colonels have not been in the playoffs in 10 years (1997). ECU won the I-AA (now FCS) National Championship in 1979 and 1982.

GAME NOTES: UT Martin and Tennessee State will meet in the season finale, both looking to close their seasons on strong notes. UT Martin has won three of its last four including racking up 76 points (which tied an OVC game record) in a win over Murray State last week. Tennessee State needs a win to finish above .500 for the season. A win by the Tigers would also give them outright ownership of the inaugural Sgt. York Trophy, which is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee. A loss by TSU means they would share the initial trophy with Austin Peay. UTM and TSU have played 16 times but not since the 2005 season. That year UTM won 42-20, snapping a 9-game losing streak in the all-time series. The meeting is the first between head coaches James Webster and Jason Simpson.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: On the short-end of hard luck and close losses all season, UT Martin finally put all the pieces together in a 76-34 home victory over Murray State (and former coach Matt Griffin). The Skyhawks tied the OVC record for most points in an OVC game and set OVC records for most rushing yards (821) and best rushing average (10.6 yards per carry). Kicker Tom Hansen also tied the OVC record for successful extra points in a game (10). It was a record-setting day for senior RB Don Chapman, as well, as he rushed for 204 yards to top the 1,000-yard plateau for the fourth consecutive season, becoming just the 14th Division I player to ever accomplish that feat. Chapman was named OVC Player and National Player of the Week for his efforts. He needs 147 yards in the season finale to move into second place on the OVC career rushing list. He currently has 4,914 yards entering his final career game. Chapman was one of three UTM running backs who went over 150 yards rushing in the game, as Brandyn Young (159) and Trace McDermott (158) also did so. Sophomore QB Cade Thompson was named OVC Newcomer of the Week for the second time in three weeks after throwing for 261 yards and four touchdowns; he completed 13-of-21 passes in the contest. Seven different UT Martin receivers caught passes in the game, led by Roren Thomas who caught three for 144 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State won its second straight game and kept its hopes of a winning season alive with a 38-28 win at Samford in front of a national television audience last Thursday. With a victory the team would finish at 6-5, marking back-to-back winning seasons for the program for the first time since 1998 and 1999, the years the team won back-to-back OVC Championships. Junior RB Javaris Williams rushed for 105 yards on 21 carries in the victory. It was his 14th 100-yard rushing effort of his career. He also went over the 1,000-yard mark for the season and now has consecutive seasons with 1,000 or more yards (1,233 in 2006). He is 12th nationally among active players in career rushing yards. Sophomore LB Calvin Baker recorded double-digit tackles for the third straight week, making 14 stops (13 solo) in the win. He had two tackles-for-loss and a pass break-up as well.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri close out its seasons both looking to snap losing streaks. The Gamecocks have only lost one in a row (last week at home vs. Eastern Illinois), but that lost ended the team's chance at an at-large FCS Playoff berth. The team is 6-4 right now and looking to win seven games for the third time in the last five years. Southeast Missouri will be looking to snap a seven-game losing streak that dates back to a Sept. 15 home win over Indiana State. The Gamecocks and Redhawks have played 11 times previously with JSU winning the last five.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: In the Gamecocks home loss to Eastern Illinois, QB Cedric Johnson had his first 100-yard rushing day. He carried the ball 14 times for 100 yards, becoming the third QB in school history to accomplish that feat. He also passed for 143 yards, becoming the first player in the JSU Division I Era to run and throw for more than 100 yards in the same contest. Johnson hooked up with WR Taurean Rhetta for a 51-yard score in the first half, a reception that extended Rhetta's streak of consecutive games with a catch to 31. Rhetta had 56 receiving yards on the day and moved into fifth place on the Jax State career receiving yards list (1,552). Johnson was intercepted in the fourth quarter by EIU's Michael Torres, snapping a streak of 120 passes without a pick for the signal caller. Another streak came to an end in the first quarter when kicker Gavin Hallford missed his first extra point of the season, snapping his 52 consecutive makes streak that dated back to last season. Punter Zach Walden averaged 44.0 yards per punt in the game, including a long punt of 64 yards and one downed inside the five-yard line. Defensively, sophomore Alexander Henderson finished the contest with a career-high 11 tackles.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri stepped out of Conference play last week to challenge in-state rival Missouri State and lost 55-17. On of the standout performance of the week was turned in by junior DB Victor Anderson. Anderson, who started the season out as the team's QB before switching over to defense a few weeks ago, recorded 10 tackles, a tackle-for-loss, a sack, forced two fumbles and recovered a fumble which he returned 45 yards for a fourth quarter touchdown. Jared Goodson added 11 tackles, while Vincent Anderson (Victor's twin brother) added 10 and Adam Casper, the OVC's leading tackler, also had 10. Junior QB Houston Lillard was 20-of-39 for 230 yards while WR Miles Edwards caught seven of those passes for 85 yards. K/P Doug Spada made a field goal in the game and punted four times for an average of 50.2, three of which were downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

GAME NOTES: The final game of the season for these teams is a chance for Eastern Illinois to solidify its playoff resume as the team hopes for an at-large bid. They will try to do so against Samford, who is playing its final OVC game before departing the conference at the end of the season. These teams have played just four times since the Bulldogs joined the league in 2003. Samford won that initial meeting but EIU has come out on top the last three years, including 24-13 in Birmingham last season.

SCOUTING SAMFORD: The final game of the first season of the Pat Sullivan Era will see the Bulldogs looking to end on a high note and snap a two-game losing streak and win a fifth game overall. The team will also be looking at freshman RB Chris Evans who is nearing a milestone. Evans, the nation's leading freshman rusher entering the final week of the regular season, needs just 73 yards to reach the 1,000-yard mark for the season. If he does that he will become the first SU player since Jerome Russell in 1999 to rush for 1,000 or more yards in a year. Evans rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown in the team's 38-28 home loss to Tennessee State last week. In that contest senior QB Jefferson Adcock threw for 315 yards (30-of-50) and a touchdown. He enters his final OVC game eighth in career completions in league history (466). Senior WR Jeff Moore enters his final game fourth in career receptions (189 - just five out of third place) and seventh in career receiving yards (2,724). Moore has caught a pass in every game of his career (43), which is an OVC record (along with TTU's Larry Shipp).

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: The Panthers need to win against Samford on Saturday to finish 8-3 overall and 7-1 in the OVC this season. EIU, who has played against a full Division I schedule this season, would be in good position for an at-large playoff berth, as no OVC team with eight or more Division I victories has been left out of the FCS Playoffs since the field expanded to 16 teams in 1986. The Panthers scored a big 37-23 road victory at Jacksonville State last week to put itself into sole possession of second place in the Conference. Along the way two Panther players earned OVC Weekly Honors. Senior DE Michael Torres was named Co-Defensive Player of the Week after making four tackles in the win. His big contribution, however, was tipping a pass to himself for an interception which he returned 40 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to seal the victory over JSU. Junior KR Quinten Ponius was named Specialist of the Week after opening the second half with a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. It marked the first time since 2002 that a Panther had returned a kick for a score. He finished the game with three kickoff returns for 133 total yards (44.3 average). Senior RB Ademola Adeniji put in another stellar game, rushing for 158 yards and two touchdowns in the win. He averaged 5.4 yards per carry and went over the 1,000-yard mark on the season (1,008). He also became the 13th EIU player to rush for more than 2,000 yards in a career.
