THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

The 2007 regular season ended with Eastern Kentucky capping a perfect Conference season (8-0), with a 38-24 home victory over Tennessee Tech...The Colonels won their 19th OVC Championship (which is second most among all FCS schools) and earned their 18th Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoff berth, which is tied for the most all-time (with Montana)...EKU will be joined in the FCS Playoffs by Eastern Illinois, who received an at-large berth and is appearing in the playoffs for the third straight year and sixth time in the last eight years overall...EIU is the first OVC team to make three consecutive appearances since Eastern Kentucky did so from 1993-95...This marks the second straight season that the OVC has placed two teams in the FCS Playoffs, marking the first time since the 1995/1996 seasons that multiple teams from the league have been in the playoffs...EKU will open the playoffs at Richmond, while EIU will travel to Southern Illinois...The OVC is searching for its first FCS Playoffs victory since 2000 (former member Western Kentucky)...Austin Peay closed out its first season back in the OVC with a 23-17 road victory at Murray State to finish 7-4 overall and 5-3 in the OVC...The Governors, who were picked to finish last in the OVC in a preseason vote of coaches and SIDs, finished in a tie for third overall...It was the most victories for the team since 2002 and most wins at the scholarship level (APSU played non-scholarship football from 1997-2005) since 1984; The Govs five OVC wins was the most since the program was 5-2 in the 1980 season...Austin Peay finished the season an impressive 5-1 road record...Austin Peay and Tennessee State finished the year as co-champions in the inaugural Sgt. York Trophy race, which was competed for by the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee; the teams each finished the year 2-1 against the other schools from Tennessee...Although both teams share the award, Tennessee State will take home the trophy this year due to a head-to-head victory over the Govs...UT Martin senior RB Don Chapman ran for 103 yards in his final game to finish his career with 5,017 yards, the third-highest total in OVC history; he also scored two touchdowns and finished his career with 296 career points, also the third-highest total in OVC history...Tennessee Tech senior WR Larry Shipp caught seven passes for 164 yards and two scores in his final career game, to finish his career third in OVC history in receptions (195) and fourth in receiving yards (2,950); he caught a pass in all 43 career games, which set an OVC record.

ALL-TIME FCS PLAYOFF APPEARANCES

The FCS playoffs began in 1978, when four teams competed for the national championship. The OVC did not have a team in the playoffs that season but have in 29 years since then (including this season). No team has made more playoff appearances than Eastern Kentucky, who won national championships in 1979 and 1982. The Colonels have been in 18 playoffs (tied with Montana), including this season, when they are making their first appearance in 10 years (1997). Eastern Illinois is 9th all-time (12 appearances) while Murray State is 31st (5 trips).

EASTERN KENTUCKY

Eastern Kentucky Claims 19th OVC Championship; Automatic Bid to FCS Play-offs: The Eastern Kentucky Colonels finished the 2007 season 8-0 in the OVC and won their 19th OVC Championship and first in 10 years (1997). The team also earned the OVC's automatic bid to the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs, the school's 18th appearance, which is tied for the most all-time (with fellow 2007 participant Montana). The 19 conference championships is the second most for a team among active FCS teams (UMass has won 21 conference titles, including sharing the Colonial title this season).

Perfect Against FCS Teams: Eastern Kentucky finished the regular season 9-2 overall, but a perfect 9-0 against Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams. The Colonels two losses this season were both come against FBS teams (Kentucky and Western Kentucky).

30 Winning Seasons in a Row; 35 Non-Losing Seasons in a Row: By finishing the season 9-2 this year, ECU has guaranteed itself a winning season, the 30th year in a row the program has had an above .500 record. The streak is second nationally, behind Florida State (who can make it 31 in a row if they win their season finale next week). You have to go back to 1977 to find a year the ECU program did not have a winning record (they were 5-5 that season). It will also be the program's 35th consecutive non-losing season (second nationally behind Michigan's now 40 years) and the team has not suffered a losing season since 1972.

14 Colonels Named to All-OVC Team: Fourteen ECU players were selected to the 2007 All-OVC Football team, including seven first-team and seven second-team selections. The team took home three of the four major awards, including Offensive Player of the Year (QB Allan Holland), Defensive Player of the Year (DB Derrick Huff) and Coach of the Year (Danny Hope). The first-team selections included Holland and Huff, C **Shawn Dedden**, G **Bakahri Thornton**, T **Sean Dumford**, DL **Chris Coy** and DB **Brandon Gathof**.

ECU Leads Nation in Turnover Margin: No team at the FCS level was better than forcing turnovers and protecting the ball like the Colonels. ECU led the nation with a +22 (2.00/game) turnover margin. ECU forced three or more turnovers in five straight games to end the season. Amazingly, ECU was -7 in turnover margin just a year ago. ECU did more than just cause turnovers, they also converted off of them. Eastern scored 121 points off opponent miscues this season and gave up only six points off their turnovers.

Switch at Quarterback Pays Off: ECU started the season with senior **Josh Greco** at the quarterback position. Greco was the 2005 OVC Offensive Player of the Year (2,861 yards, 25 touchdowns) in a season he set program records for passing yards, completions, attempts and touchdown passes. He entered the season poised to write his name in several OVC career categories but struggled early in the year. The team made a switch by going to junior **Allan Holland** and the gamble paid off. Holland finished the regular season 173-of-284 (60.9%) for 1,962 yards and 14 touchdowns while throwing only three interceptions. Holland was also very mobile, rushing the ball 70 times for 201 yards and four scores. Holland was so efficient this season, he had a stretch where he went 201 pass attempts without an interception, a mark that set an ECU record.

Washington Sets OVC Record for Longest Rush; Finishes Season with 1,002 Yards: Eastern Kentucky senior RB Bobby Washington set the OVC record for longest run on Oct. 27 at Murray State. Washington took a handoff and went 99 yards to break the record of 97 yards previously set by Don Daly (EKU, 1951), Carl Walker, (Murray State, 1954) and Stevie Chaney (Murray State, 2005). Washington rushed for 65 yards in the regular season finale, pushing him above the 1,000-yard mark for the season (1,002).

Double the Running Fun: Eastern Kentucky is lucky enough to have not one but two solid running backs. Senior **Bobby Washington** (a transfer who is playing in his second season with the team) finished the regular season with 1,002 yards and 10 rushing touchdowns, as he averaged 91.1 yards/game. Senior **Mark Dunn**, a four-year player for the Colonels, also had a solid year, rushing for 671 yards and 10 touchdowns; he averaged 67.1 yards/game. ECU finished the regular season averaging 212.6 yards per game, which led the OVC; it marked the first time Eastern had led the OVC in rushing since the 2001 season (238.9 yards/game).

Hope Coaching At Alma Mater: Colonel head coach **Danny Hope** is one of two OVC head coaches currently coaching at their alma mater (Austin Peay's Rick Christophel is the other). Hope played offensive guard for ECU from 1977-80. He was a four-year starter and team captain his senior season for legendary head coach Roy Kidd (who the OVC's Coach of the Year award is named after). Hope was part of the 1979 I-AA National Championship squad and the 1980 national runner-up team. Hope picked up his first OVC Roy Kidd Coach of the Year Award in 2007. The award is named after Kidd, who picked up 10 awards as coach of the ECU program.

EASTERN ILLINOIS

Panthers Making Third Straight Playoff Appearance; Sixth in Last Eight Years: Although Eastern Illinois did not win its third straight OVC Championship this season, it did continue its recent success by earning an at-large bid to the FCS Playoffs, marking the third straight year it will have appeared in the postseason. Beginning in 2000, it is the sixth time in the last eight years the team has been in the playoffs and 12th time overall. The third straight playoffs appearances marks the first time an OVC school has done that since ECU from 1993-95.

EIU Places 13 on All-OVC Teams: Eastern Illinois placed 13 total players on the 2007 All-OVC Football team, which was released on Tuesday. That included six first-team selections, four second-teamers and three All-Newcomer picks. The first-team picks included RB **Ademola Adeniji**, WR **Micah Rucker**, OG **Chaz Millard**, OL **Anthony Rubican**, DL **Pierre Walters** and LB **Donald Thomas**.

Thomas on Final Buck Buchanan List: Eastern Illinois senior linebacker Donald Thomas has been named one of the 16 finalists for this year's Buck Buchanan Award handed out by the Sports Network to the top defensive player in the NCAA FCS. Thomas, the reigning OVC Defensive Player of the Year, has battled through injuries this season to make a team-high 70 tackles. Last season he made 127 tackles (9.77/ game). He is one of two OVC players on the final Buchanan List (Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie is the other).

Spoo Returns to Sidelines: Eastern Illinois head coach **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returned to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007. He has compiled a record of 127-101-1 in his 20 years on the EIU sidelines. Spoo, who was a quarterback at Purdue, got to match up against his alma mater earlier this season in West Lafayette.

Cradle of NFL Coaches: Eastern Illinois has most recently been known for alumni who have gone on to serve as head coaches in the NFL. There are currently three former EIU players who are current head coaches in the NFL: Minnesota's Brad Childress, New Orleans' Sean Payton and Denver's Mike Shanahan. EIU is currently tied for first among schools with head coaches in the NFL (USC and San Diego State also have three apiece). Three other former players are currently NFL assistant coaches - Mike Heimerdinger (Denver), Greg McMahon (New Orleans) and Randy Melvin (Cleveland). Of course, the Panthers are getting a lot of attention from a former player who is still playing in the NFL - Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo, who won the Walter Payton Award as I-AA's/FCS Top Player in 2002.

Switch at Quarterback Pays Off: While Eastern Kentucky had tremendous success in switching quarterbacks this season (from Josh Greco to Allan Holland), a similar move also paid off for Eastern Illinois. EIU started the season with senior **Cole Stinson** at QB, and he threw for 308 yards and two touchdowns in a season-opening victory against Tennessee Tech. Following a loss to Illinois State, sophomore **Bodie Reeder** took over the reigns of the team and compiled a 7-1 record as the starter. Reeder finished the regular season completing 148-of-227 passes (65.2%) for 1,613 yards and nine touchdowns (vs. only four interceptions).

Rucker Does It On and Off the Field; Finalist for ARA Sportsmanship Award: Stinson and Reeder did have the luxury of throwing the ball to NFL prospect **Micah Rucker** this season. Rucker has played in 10 games this season, catching 52 passes for 765 yards (14.7 ypc) and nine touchdowns. A transfer from the University of Minnesota, Rucker has 101 catches for 1,731 yards and 22 touchdowns in his two-year career at EIU. Off the field Rucker has done great things as well, including helping form an Eastern Illinois chapter of UMADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) after his girlfriend of two-and-a-half years was killed by a drunk driver. Rucker has been named a national finalist for the ARA Sportsmanship Award.

Running Game Grows Legs: Despite some injuries that plagued the team in the middle of the season, the EIU rushing game got better as the season went along. Senior **Ademola Adeniji** started the season slow, gaining only 13 yards in the season-opener and 139 total yards through the first four games of the season. But as the season got deep into Conference play, Adeniji rushed for 1,039 yards over the final seven games of the season (148.4 yards/game), including 150 or more yards in the final three games and 150 or more yards in five of the final six games of the regular season. He also scored five touchdowns in the final two games and 10 over the final five games. In 11 games this year, Adeniji has 1,178 rushing yards on 226 carries (5.2 ypc) and 15 touchdowns; he is averaging 107.1 yards per game over the season. He was named National Offensive Player of the Week by the College Sporting News on Nov. 19. Junior **Trevor Bess** has played in nine games so far this season, rushing for 603 yards (5.7 ypc) and four touchdowns. Overall on the season the team has 29 rushing touchdowns as a team.

Wilke Turns In Great Punting Effort: After starting punter Kevin Cook suffered an injury two weeks ago at Jacksonville State, kicker Tyler Wilke was pushed into duty. Wilke's first punt was a 45-yarder out of his own end zone and his second effort was downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Last week against Samford, Wilke punted four times for 214 yards (53.5 yards/punt) with a long punt of 73 yards. Two of his four punts were downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. He also made a 42-yard field goal in the game.

GENERAL OVC NOTES

OVC Puts Multiple Teams in FCS Playoffs for Second Straight Season: The OVC put two teams into the FCS Playoffs for the second consecutive season in 2007. Eastern Kentucky and Eastern Illinois each received a bid this year after Eastern Illinois and UT Martin were selected for the championship last season. The multiple bids in back-to-back years marked the first time it has happened in the OVC since the 1995/1996 seasons. Then it was Eastern Kentucky/Murray State in 1995 and Eastern Illinois/Murray State in 1996. Since the FCS Playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986, no OVC team with eight or more Division I victories has been left out of the playoffs.

OVC All-Time in the FCS Playoffs: In 29 previous years of the FCS Playoffs, the OVC has compiled a record of 27-48 overall. Eastern Kentucky has the best all-time record (16-15) while Eastern Illinois is 3-11 all-time (which includes four appearances before they were members of the OVC). The OVC is searching for its first victory in the playoff since 2000, when former member Western Kentucky topped Florida A&M 27-0; OVC teams have lost nine games in a row since WKU's first round victory in 2000.

Nine OVC Players Named National Player of the Week This Year: OVC players had their share of great performances in 2007. Overall nine different OVC standouts were honored as a National Player of the Week this season. The players include a pair of Eastern Kentucky players - QB **Allan Holland** (Oct. 7) and DB **Derrick Huff** (Oct. 28), a pair of Jacksonville State players - **Maurice Dupree** on Special Teams (Oct. 1) and LB **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 10), Austin Peay LB **Daniel Becker** (Sept. 16), Samford kicker **Mark Prevost** (Sept. 23), Tennessee Tech WR/RS **Larry Shipp** (Oct. 28), UT Martin RB **Don Chapman** (Nov. 12) and Eastern Illinois RB Ademola Adeniji (Nov. 19).

Two OVC Players on Updated Buck Buchanan Watch List: Two OVC players were on the final watch list (released in November) for *The Sports Network's* Buck Buchanan Award given to the nation's top defensive player. The list includes Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who were also two of the 16 players on the August preseason list and October updated list. UT Martin running back **Don Chapman** was on the preseason Walter Payton Watch List (top offensive player), but was not on the updated October list, that included 16 players. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. A final update of both lists will be released in November before the final ballots are decided upon. Final ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

Tennessee State/Austin Peay Share Inaugural Sgt. York Trophy: On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award, both finishing the year 2-1 in the series. TSU will take home the actual hardware in 2007, as they topped Austin Peay in the head-to-head matchup.

Chapman Becomes 14th Division I Player to Rush for 1,000 Yards in Four Straight Seasons: UT Martin senior RB **Don Chapman** made NCAA Division I history on Nov. 10 when he became the 14th player at the Division I level to rush for 1,000 or more yards in four straight seasons. Chapman pushed above the 1,000-yard plateau against Murray State by running for 204 yards in just a half of play (he touched the ball only three times in the second half before sitting out the rest of the game). He is the eighth player at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level to do so, including Drake's Scott Phaydavong, who reached the milestone earlier this season. The other FCS players to accomplish the feat include Jerry Azumah, New Hampshire (1995-98); Adrian Peterson, Georgia Southern (1998-01); Alonzo Coleman, Hampton (2003-06); Clifton Dawson, Harvard (2003-06) and Steve Baylark, Massachusetts (2003-06). The FBS players to reach the feat include Tony Dorsett, Pittsburgh (1973-76); Amos Lawrence, North Carolina (1977-80); Dennis Manns, New Mexico State (1995-98); Ron Dayne, Wisconsin (1996-99); DonTrell Moore, New Mexico (2002-05); Cedric Benson, Texas (2002-05). One player did it by playing two years at a lower division school and two years at a FBS school (Howard Stevens, Randolph Macon in 1968-69 and Louisville in 1971-72.).

Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Finishes Career 3rd in OVC History in Rushing Yards, 1st in Rushes and 3rd in Scoring: After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman finished his career ranked third all-time in OVC history for rushing (5,013). After rushing the ball 24 times in a win over Samford on Oct. 13, Chapman increased his career rushes total to 930, putting him first in OVC history in that category. He broke the record previously held by Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71) of Eastern Kentucky; Chapman finished his career with 930 rushes. After scoring twice in his career finale, he increased his career scoring total to 296 points, which was third in OVC history.

Tennessee Tech Plays in Front of 85,754, Which is Largest Crowd to Ever See an OVC Team Play: When Tennessee Tech played at No. 16 Auburn on Nov. 3, there were 85,754 fans in attendance, marking the biggest crowd to ever see an OVC football team play. It passed the former record which was 77,527 when Murray State played at Wisconsin on Sept. 4, 1998. Overall this year, OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds. Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game (and the 7th largest crowd to see an OVC game). On Aug. 30, Murray State

played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic; that crowd was the second largest to see a FCS football game this year (the Jackson State crowd is the fourth largest FCS crowd this year).

Shipp Finishes Career 3rd in OVC History for Receptions, 4th in Receiving Yardage: Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp finished his career ranked third in OVC history for career receptions (195). Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he finished his career with 2,950 career receiving yards which was fourth all-time. Shipp caught a pass in every career game he played in (43) during his Tech career.

Moore Catches a Pass In Every Game of Career, Ends Up on Career Top 10 Lists: Samford senior WR Jeff Moore finished his career by catching a pass in every game in which he played (44), which established an OVC record. Moore finished his career with 193 catches (5th in OVC history) and 2,759 yards (7th in OVC history).

Murray State's Ehrhardt Tops 300 Yards Passing, 100 Rushing in Same Game: Murray State freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt has had an impressive redshirt freshman season. He has had many "firsts" for the Racer program and is one of only five QB's nationally this season to pass for 300 or more yards and rush for 100 or more yards in the same game. Ehrhardt threw for 330 yards and two scores and rushed the ball 30 times for 104 yards and another score. His 36 completions on the day set a new Murray State record. He is the first OVC player to achieve this feat since Samford's Ray Nelson did so in 2004. Ehrhardt is only the fifth FCS player to achieve the feat this season; the full list of players who have accomplished the feat is below.

Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's: In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th), Samford (9th) and Austin Peay (10th).

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. Including this year (when Eastern Illinois was picked as preseason favorites) in each of the past five seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 29 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (41.4%).

Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

Welcome Back: The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

NFL Connections: As of October 22, 11 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players are two players who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens and Tristan Burge (Eastern Illinois) of the Green Bay Packers. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 86 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Samford, who has scored in 76 straight games, is second followed by Eastern Illinois (53) and UT Martin (34). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.
