## THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

After several short weeks where several teams had byes, nine of the 10 OVC teams will be in action this week...The biggest matchup is in Jacksonville, Ala. where a battle of second place teams will take place when No. 22 Eastern Illinois plays at Jacksonville State...The two teams are tied at 5-1 in the OVC standings, a loss behind Eastern Kentucky in the Conference standings...EKU will clinch its record 19th OVC Championship and the automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs (both first since the 1997 season) with a win at Austin Peay; the 13th-ranked Colonels already own victories over EIU and JSU this season...The winner of the EIU/JSU game will be 7-3 overall and 6-1 in the OVC; with a win in the final weekend of the season, the winner of the matchup would finish the season 8-3/7-1 and have a good shot at an at-large berth in the FCS Playoffs...The OVC put two teams into the FCS Playoffs last season and have not put multiple teams in the playoffs in back-to-back seasons since 1995/1996 (when Murray State and Eastern Kentucky did it in both seasons)...Since the FCS Playoff field expanded to 16 teams in 1986, no OVC team with eight Division I victories has been left out of the playoff field...The week also features a nationally televised game on ESPNU when Tennessee State travels to Birmingham to battle Samford...Murray State head coach Matt Griffin makes a return to his former stomping ground when the Racers play at UT Martin, last season's co-champions...Southeast Missouri takes a trip outside of Conference play as they battle in-state rival Missouri State...Murray State QB Jeff Ehrhardt was named OVC Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week after throwing for 330 yards (and two scores) and rushing for 104 yards (and another score); he is the first OVC player to accomplish that feat since the 2004 season (Ray Nelson, Samford) and is only the fifth QB in FCS Football to achieve that feat this year.

## THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### OFFENSIVE

#### **Jeff Ehrhardt, QB • R-Fr., 6-4, 210 • St. Louis, Mo. • Murray State**

Ehrhardt set the Murray State record for completions in the Racers 42-28 loss at Tennessee State. He was 36-of-46 for 330 yards and two touchdowns through the air and also carried the ball 30 times for 104 yards and another score. The 300/100 performance was the first by an OVC quarterback since the 2004 season (Ray Nelson, Samford) and only the fifth such performance in FCS football nationwide this season. The performance was Ehrhardt's second straight 300-yard performance and he increased his OVC-leading touchdown pass total to 18. He capped off Murray State's second scoring drive of the game by leaping over two defenders at the goal line.

### DEFENSIVE

#### **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, DB • Sr., 6-2, 185 • Bradenton, Fla. • Tennessee State**

In the Tigers 42-28 home victory over Murray State, Rodgers-Cromartie recorded his fourth blocked kick of the season (3 field goals, 1 PAT) in the first quarter, on a 31-yard field goal attempt by the Racers. The block resulted in TSU scoring its first touchdown of the game. "DRC" finished the game with eight tackles (6 solo) and an interception, which he returned 71 yards for a touchdown. The Buck Buchanan Award Watch nominee also added a tackle-for-loss and a pass break-up.

### SPECIALIST

#### **Maurice Dupree, RS • Jr., 5-10, 180 • Centre, Ala. • Jacksonville State**

Dupree, who was named Specialist of the Week for the second time this season, had another productive day in the Gamecocks 24-12 road win at Samford. He finished with 201 all-purpose yards and one touchdown after returning five kicks for 164 yards, including an 86-yard return that secured JSU's victory. After the Bulldogs kicked their fourth field goal to cut the score to 17-12, Dupree took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 86 yards to the Samford 8-yard line; two plays later, JSU scored a touchdown to seal the win. Dupree also scored a touchdown on a 24-yard reverse run midway through the second quarter to give the Gamecocks a 14-3 lead. He currently ranks third nationally in kickoff returns (33.40 yards/return) and fourth in punt returns (13.93 yards/return).

### NEWCOMER

#### **Jeff Ehrhardt, QB • R-Fr., 6-4, 210 • St. Louis, Mo. • Murray State**

Ehrhardt, who was named Newcomer of the Week for the second time in a row, set the Murray State record for completions in the Racers 42-28 loss at Tennessee State. ## NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

**I-AA No More:** Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with last year's national championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

**OVC Sports.TV:** For the second consecutive year, fans can watch EVERY Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVC Sports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports (formerly XOS Technologies) allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed hundreds of events in its first season, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Last season the OVC was one of just two Conferences nationally streaming every football and men's and women's basketball game on the Internet. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis. This week's games include:

**Change in Kicking Game Decreases Number of Touchbacks:** Prior to the season the NCAA moved kickoffs from the 35-yard line back to the 30-yard line for this season (as well as reverting clock timing rules back to what they were in 2005). In 10 weeks there has been a noticeable increase in kickoff returns and a decrease in touchbacks. So far this season there have been 700 kickoffs in 61 games and only 30 of those went for touchbacks (4.3%). Last season at this point in the year there had been 523 kickoffs and 74 touchbacks (14.1%). The change was made in part to increase the number of returns and lead to more excitement in college football.

**Eastern Illinois/Jacksonville State Game Serves As Playoff Elimination Contest:** The two teams tied for second in the OVC - Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State - will meet this Saturday (Noon) in Jacksonville for what could prove to be a playoff elimination contest. Neither team controls their playoff/championship destiny, as an Eastern Kentucky win over Austin Peay on Saturday will clinch the OVC Championship for the Colonels. Both EIU and JSU enter the matchup 6-3 overall and 5-1 in the Conference. The winner would improve to 7-3 and with a win in their season finale finish the regular season 8-3 and have a shot at an at-large FCS Playoff berth. Both teams started the season slow (EIU 1-2, JSU 1-3) but have come on strong at the end of the year (EIU has won 5 of 6, JSU has won five in a row). Since the FCS Playoff field expanded to 16 teams in 1986, no OVC team with eight Division I victories has been left out of the playoff field.

**Murray State's Ehrhardt Tops 300 Yards Passing, 100 Rushing in Same Game:** Murray State freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt has had an impressive redshirt freshman season. He has had many "firsts" for the Racer program and is one of only five QB's nationally this season to pass for 300 or more yards and rush for 100 or more yards in the same game. Ehrhardt threw for 330 yards and two scores and rushed the ball 30 times for 104 yards and another score. His 36 completions on the day set a new Murray State record. He is the first OVC player to achieve this feat since Samford's Ray Nelson did so in 2004. Ehrhardt is only the fifth FCS player to achieve the feat this season; the full list of players who have accomplished the feat is below.

**Eastern Kentucky Clinches 30th Consecutive Winning Season; One Win Away From 19th OVC Championship:** With a 46-35 victory at Murray State on Oct. 27, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels improved to 7-2 on the season and clinched its 30th consecutive winning season. That mark is the second longest nationally, behind Florida State who has currently won 30 in a row and would extend that streak to 31 if they finish this season with a winning record (FSU is currently 5-3 on the year). You have to go back to 1977 to find a year the program did not have a winning record (they were 5-5). It will also be the program's 35th consecutive non-losing season (second nationally behind Michigan's now 40 years) and the team has not suffered a losing season since 1972. Eastern Kentucky can clinch its record 19th OVC Championship with one more win this season. It would also lock up their 18th FCS Playoff appearance, which would be the most all-time.

**Tennessee Tech Plays in Front of 85,754, Which is Largest Crowd to Ever See an OVC Team Play:** When Tennessee Tech played at No. 16 Auburn on Nov. 3, there were 85,754 fans in attendance, marking the biggest crowd to ever see an OVC football team play. It passed the former record which was 77,527 when Murray State played at Wisconsin on Sept. 4, 1998. Overall this year, OVC teams have played in front of some impressive crowds. Eastern Kentucky battled in-state foe Kentucky in Lexington on Sept. 1, 66,512 fans saw the game, a crowd that is believed to be the largest to ever see an Eastern Kentucky football game (and the 7th largest crowd to see an OVC game). On Aug. 30, Murray State played in front of a sold-out crowd at Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, as 42,185 fans came through the turnstiles. Also on Aug. 30, Samford hosted West Alabama and there were 10,483 in attendance, the third largest crowd to see a game at Seibert Stadium in Birmingham. On Sept. 8, Eastern Illinois played in front of 52,504 at Purdue, the second largest crowd to ever see a Panther game (trailing the 52,630 at BYU in 2005). Samford played in front of 43,288 at Georgia Tech and Tennessee State and Jackson State battled before 50,879 at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis during the Southern Heritage Classic. Tennessee State also played in front of 56,990 at the Georgia Dome when they played Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic; that crowd was the second largest to see a FCS football game this year (the Jackson State crowd is the fourth largest FCS crowd this year).

**Two OVC Players on Updated Buck Buchanan Watch List:** Two OVC players were on the updated watch list (released in October) for *The Sports Network's* Buck Buchanan Award given to the nation's top defensive player. The list includes Eastern Illinois senior linebacker **Donald Thomas** and Tennessee State defensive back **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who were also two of the 16 players on the August preseason list. UT Martin running back **Don Chapman** was on the preseason Walter Payton Watch List (top offensive player), but was not on the updated October list, that included 16 players. The OVC was one of four conferences to have more than one player on the Buchanan list. A final update of both lists will be released in November before the final ballots are decided upon. Final ballots will go out to voters in late November, with voting taking place immediately after the regular season. Over 100 voters, representing sports writers, broadcasters, sports information directors and other college football experts will decide on the Payton, Buchanan and Eddie Robinson awards. The 2007 awards will be presented in Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 13, the night before the FCS national championship game.

**Washington Sets OVC Record for Longest Rush:** Eastern Kentucky senior RB Bobby Washington set the OVC record for longest run on Oct. 27 at Murray State. Washington took a handoff and went 99 yards to break the record of 97 yards previously set by Don Daly (EKU, 1951), Carl Walker, (Murray State, 1954) and Stevie Chaney (Murray State, 2005).

**Samford's Evans is Nation's Second Leading Rusher Among Freshman:** Samford freshman RB **Chris Evans** currently ranks 40th nationally in rushing yards per game (93.78). That number is second nationally among all freshmen (he had been first the last two weeks). He trails only Karrington Bush of Texas State (96.22 yards/game).

**National Leaders:** In the latest set of national statistical rankings, one player and two teams can be found at a top of national statistical lists. Jacksonville State kicker Gavin Hallford is first in field goals made per game (2.00), a spot he has held most of the season. As a team, Eastern Kentucky is first nationally in turnover margin per game (+2.22) while Samford is first nationally in sacks allowed per game (0.56).

**Chapman Establishes UT Martin All-Time Rushing Record; Now 3rd in OVC History in Rushing Yards and 1st in Rushes:** After gaining 20 yards in the season opener at Southern Miss, 111 yards in week No. 2 against Missouri State and 104 yards in the third week against Central Arkansas, UT Martin senior running back **Don Chapman** is now the all-time rushing leader in school history. He broke the record of 4,033 yards previously held by Bobby Fowler (1956-59). Chapman now ranks third all-time in OVC history (4,710), and is 439 yards away from tying Markus Thomas (Eastern Kentucky, 1989-92) for first on the OVC all-time rushing list. After rushing the ball 24 times in a win over Samford on Oct. 13, Chapman increased his career rushes total to 930, putting him first in OVC history in that category. He broke the record previously held by Jimmie Brooks (920 rushes from 1968-71) of Eastern Kentucky. Chapman now has 972 career rushes.

**Shipp Sets Tennessee Tech All-Time Receptions Record; Now 4th in OVC History for Receptions, 6th in Receiving Yardage:** Tennessee Tech senior wide receiver **Larry Shipp** made history in week No. 2, as the Memphis, Tenn. native caught four passes from Tech QB **Lee Sweeney** to move into sole possession of first place on the TTU career receptions list. He caught six passes in week No. 1 to tie former record holder Walter Hill (1966-99) for first and passed him with the four grabs against Cumberland University. Shipp now ranks fourth in OVC history for career receptions (188), six catches out of third place all-time with one game to play. Shipp pulled in four catches for 51 yards at UT Martin (Sept. 27) to move into the OVC's career top 10 for receiving yards; he now has 2,786 career receiving yards which is sixth (27 yards out of fifth). Shipp has caught a pass in all 42 career games, as has Samford's **Jeff Moore**, which is believed to be an OVC record.

**Moore Puts Up Career Numbers, Moves Into OVC Receiving Yards Top 10:** Samford senior WR Jeff Moore had a career day on Oct. 27 at Tennessee Tech, as he caught nine passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns in a 59-52 Bulldogs victory. Moore set the Samford record for receiving yards in a game and the 260 yards was the second-highest output in FCS football this season (behind a 268-yard outing). Moore currently ranks fifth in OVC history in career receptions (182) and eighth in career receiving yards (2,581). He has two career games left.

**Sgt. York Trophy:** On July 24, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the **Sergeant York Trophy**, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee-Martin, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech). The team will

the best record against the other schools will take home the trophy each year, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. The award is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. After five of the six games in the series, Tennessee State (2-0) is the only team without a defeat in the series. Austin Peay has played all three of its games and finished at 2-1, Tennessee Tech played all three games and finished 1-2 and UT Martin is 0-2 with one more game to play. The final game in the series is Nov. 17, when Tennessee State hosts UT Martin. A win by TSU would give them the inaugural trophy outright, while a loss would mean that TSU would share the trophy with Austin Peay.

**Eastern Kentucky Named National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com:** Following its 28-21 victory at No. 16 Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, the Eastern Kentucky Colonels were named the Division I FCS National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com. With the win, EKU improved to 4-2 overall and 3-0 in the OVC, which puts them atop the Conference standings. The Colonels only losses of the season have come at FBS schools Kentucky and Western Kentucky. In the win over Eastern Illinois, junior quarterback Allan Holland threw for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns on his way to OVC and National Offensive Player of the Week honors. Eastern Kentucky is in search of its 19th OVC Championship this season and its first since the 1997 season, which was also the last time the program advanced to the FCS (formerly I-AA) playoffs.

**No. 2 and No. 3 Active FCS Rushers Face Off:** When Austin Peay claimed a 17-14 victory over UT Martin on Sept. 22, the game featured two of the top three active career rushers in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) - **Don Chapman** of UT Martin and **Chris Fletcher** of Austin Peay. Chapman entered the matchup as the No. 2 active career rusher while Fletcher entered the game third overall. Fletcher won the individual battle (107 yards to 46 yards) and also led his team to victory. Fletcher, a senior from Clarksville, has 25 career 100-yard rushing games, which is second most among active players (behind Drake's Scott Phaydavong) while Chapman, a senior from Marietta, Ga., has 20 100-yard games, the third most among active players at the FCS level. Chapman became the all-time leading rusher in UTM history this season while Fletcher broke the Austin Peay career rushing record as a junior in 2006.

**Huff and Shipp Earned National Player of the Week Honors; Become 6th and 7th OVC Players to Earn National Honors This Season:** Eastern Kentucky DB Derrick Huff and Tennessee Tech WR/RS Larry Shipp were named National Defensive and National Special Teams Players of the Week by the Sports Network on Monday. Huff grabbed three interceptions in EKU's road victory at Murray State, while also adding a career-high 10 tackles. He currently ranks third nationally in interceptions per game (0.89). Shipp had 301 all-purpose yards on the day (including 191 yards on seven receptions as a wideout) and returned a kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown. It marked his third KO return for a touchdown this season, a TTU (and possibly an OVC) record. His three kickoff returns for a touchdown is currently first nationally. The duo becomes the sixth and seventh OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this year. The other OVC players to earn National Player of the Week honors this season include a pair of Jacksonville State players - **Maurice Dupree** on Special Teams (Oct. 1) and LB **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 10), Austin Peay LB **Daniel Becker** (Sept. 16), Samford kicker **Mark Prevost** (Sept. 23) and Eastern Kentucky QB **Allan Holland** (Oct. 7).

**Holland Named National Offensive Player of the Week:** Eastern Kentucky junior QB **Allan Holland** became the fifth OVC player to earn National Player of the Week honors on Oct. 8, as he was named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (CSN). Holland completed 30-of-44 passes for a career-high 321 yards and two touchdowns in the Colonels 28-21 win at No. 16 Eastern Illinois. His first touchdown came with one second left in the first half and put EKU up 15-14; the other came late in the game to increase his team's lead to two scores. Both came after Holland scrambled out of the pocket, avoided would-be tacklers and found an open receiver.

**Dupree Named National Special Teams Player of the Week:** For the fourth time in five weeks of play this season, the OVC has another National Player of the Week. This time it is Jacksonville State return specialist **Maurice Dupree**, who earned National Special Teams Player of the Week from each of the Sports Network, College Sporting News (CSN) and SME Network. Dupree finished the Murray State victory with 316 total return yards, 212 coming on four kickoffs and 104 on three punt returns. He was just three yards shy of breaking the OVC all-time record for kickoff return yardage in a game (215, held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin) and he did set the JSU record in the process. Dupree returned a punt 88 yards in the second quarter to set-up a Gamecocks touchdown and later returned a kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The punt return was the second longest in JSU's Division I history (trailing a 93-yarder) and the kickoff return for a touchdown was the first time JSU had accomplished that since the 2005 season and was the eighth longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

**History Made In Southeast Missouri/Indiana State Contest:** When Southeast Missouri hosted Indiana State on Sept. 15 history was made. The two teams, who compete at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), are each coached by African-Americans - **Tony Samuel** at Southeast Missouri and **Lou West** at Indiana State. The contest marked what is believed to be the first time in history of the FCS level (formerly I-AA) that two programs led by black coaches from non-Historical Black Colleges have squared off with each other. Research from the NCAA reveals that this has happened 13 times at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level, and now happens annually in the Pac-10 Conference, when UCLA (Karl Dorrell) and Washington (Tyronne Willingham) square off. At first no data existed for match-ups at the FCS level, but the Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport at the University of Central Florida conducted some research and found no indications that this had ever happened before. That led Director Dr. Richard Lapchick to believe that Saturday's match-up will be the first time it has happened at the FCS level. Tony Samuel is in his second year as head coach at Southeast Missouri and his 10<sup>th</sup> year overall as a head coach. Lou West is in his third season as head coach at Indiana State. An asterisk, however, was attached to the game due to a one-game suspension that West served due to the Sycamores using an ineligible player in the

squad's 28-22 win over Missouri State in 2006; the game against Southeast Missouri was when the penalty was served. West still led his team in preparations for the game and was in attendance, but was not on the sideline and did not have any contact with his team during the game. His record, however, was credited with the loss, as Southeast Missouri won 13-10. Although West will not be on the sideline, the game is still the first at the FCS level between two programs led by African-American coaches.

**Jacksonville State Involved in Historic Game:** Jacksonville State was involved in a small piece of NCAA history during its game at Memphis on Sept. 15. During the game **Sarah Thomas** served as one of the officials, marking the first time a woman had been an official in a Division I football game. Martin is a member of Conference USA's officiating crew. JSU has been involved in other firsts for women at the Division I level, as Ashley Martin became the first female to score in a Division I football game in 2001 when she kicked three extra points in the team's 72-10 win over Cumberland.

**Prevost Named National Special Teams Player of the Week:** Samford freshman kicker **Mark Prevost** was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by the Football Gazette on Sept. 26 after leading Samford to a 26-21 victory over Southeast Missouri. Prevost kicked four second-half field goals, after missing his lone attempt in the first half, to lead Samford to the come-from-behind victory (the Bulldogs trailed 21-10 at one point). Prevost kicked field goals of 47, 37, 41 and 34 yards. The 47-yarder was the career-long for the freshman.

**Becker Named National Defensive Player of the Week:** For the second week in a row on Sept. 17, the OVC produced a National Defensive Player of the Week. Austin Peay sophomore LB **Daniel Becker** earned the honor from the Sports Network and the Football Gazette after recording a career-high 19 tackles (13 solo) in the Governors 33-32 overtime loss to Tennessee State on Sept. 15. Becker forced a fumble, recovered another fumble and had a 3-yard tackle-for-loss during the game. His 19 tackles were the second most in the FCS at that point of the season.

**Robinson Named National Defensive Player of the Week:** Jacksonville State linebacker **Drew Robinson** was honored by a trio of national outlets for his defensive effort against Chattanooga on Sept. 8. Robinson intercepted two passes, returned one 45 yards for a touchdown and recovered a fumble in the Gamecocks 33-19 victory. Besides the touchdown return, Robinson also ran his other interception back 63 yards to end a UTC scoring threat and set up a JSU field goal. His 108 yards of return yardage was more than any offensive player in the game. Robinson also added three solo tackles. For that effort he was named Co-National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network, Co-Linebacker of the Week by the Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network and Tri-Defensive Player of the Week by the Football Gazette.

**White Ties OVC Single-Game Rushing Touchdowns Mark:** Tennessee Tech senior running back **Derek White** has enjoyed great success early this season. In week No. 2 against Cumberland, White tallied 213 yards on the ground (the sixth-highest total in school history) and caught four passes for 58 yards to total 271 all-purpose yards for the game (the fifth-best all-purpose game in school history). A week later he did it again, rushing for 194 yards on 23 carries but this time scoring five touchdowns, which tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record. He tied the record also held by Austin Peay's Daniel Williams (1996) and Youngstown State's Patrick Wicks (1981).

**Calvin Ties OVC Record With 100-Yard Interception Return:** Southeast Missouri State sophomore defensive back **Eddie Calvin** tied an OVC record on Sept. 8 when he intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. Prior to Calvin's feat, only two other OVC players had even done that - Ray Oldham of Middle Tennessee (1970) and George Floyd of Eastern Kentucky (1980). He is the 26th person in Football Championship Subdivision history to achieve the feat, which was done only once in the 2006 season.

**Jax State Keeps Interception Likely an NCAA Record:** Jacksonville State has been forcing turnovers at a high-rate this season, and made noise with returning interceptions for touchdowns. Dating back to the final two games of last season, JSU had intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown in four consecutive games, a mark that is believed to be an OVC record (EIU had three straight games in 2005) and most-likely an NCAA record. To end last season it was Craig Agee (Nov. 11 vs. Samford) and Kenny Brown (Nov. 18 vs. Eastern Illinois) who returned picks for scores and in 2007 it was **T.J. Heath** (Sept. 1 vs. Alabama State) and **Drew Robinson** (Sept. 8 vs. Chattanooga). The streak came to an end at Memphis on Sept. 15 as the Gamecocks did not intercept a pass in the 35-14 loss.

**Fletcher Breaks More Austin Peay Rushing Marks:** Already the Austin Peay career rushing leader, senior RB **Chris Fletcher** scored his 32nd career touchdown on Sept. 1 against Bethel College, tying him for first in career touchdowns in school history. A week later (Sept. 8), he scored three touchdowns in a win at Indiana State to increase his career touchdown mark to 35 and his career total points mark to 210, passing Jay Bailey for first place in both categories.

**Halford Sets JSU Kicking Records in Back-to-Back Weeks; Owns JSU Career Field Goals Made Mark:** It is not rare to see a kicker make a big difference in a game in kicking a game-winning field goal. In the case of Jacksonville State junior kicker **Gavin Halford**, he has put his team on his back (or his foot) the first two weeks of the year. In week one, Halford set a JSU record for field goals in a game (4) and points scored by a kicker in a game (13) in a loss to Alabama State. A week later against Chattanooga, Halford tied his field goal mark (4) and broke his points record (14). He has been named OVC Specialist of the Week three times this season.

**Eastern Illinois Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's:** In a preseason league vote, Eastern Illinois was the favorite among head coaches and sports information directors to three-peat as OVC Champions. The Panthers, who have won or shared the last two titles, received eight of the 20 first-place votes to finish first. It marked the fourth time in the team's tenure with the League that they were the preseason favorites (EKU has been picked first the most, 16 times). Jacksonville State received six first-place votes and narrowly finished second behind EIU. Defending co-champion Tennessee-Martin was picked third, garnering four first-place votes, while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State each got one first-place vote and were slotted to finish fourth and fifth respectively. Tennessee Tech was picked sixth, followed by Murray State (7th), Southeast Missouri State (8th),

## CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Eastern Kentucky has secured its 30th consecutive winning season in 2007. The Colonels have not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 overall in 1977 (the second longest streak in Division I). You have to go back to 1972 to find a year they had a losing record (5-6), the program's only losing season in the past 42 years (that streak is also second in Division I).

**All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish:** Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Eastern Illinois? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past four seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 28 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (42.9%).

**Chapman and Thomas Headline Preseason All-OVC Team:** The 2007 preseason All-OVC team was highlighted by a pair of players who won Player of the Year honors in 2006. Tennessee-Martin running back **Don Chapman** (the co-Offensive Player of the Year last season) and Eastern Illinois linebacker **Donald Thomas** (the Defensive Player of the Year last season) were two of the 26 selections to the team. In total, Eastern Illinois had six players selected to the team, closely followed by Tennessee-Martin who had five selections. Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech each had three selections, while Murray State and Southeast Missouri had one apiece (Samford and Austin Peay were not represented). Overall, 13 players who were first-team selections a year ago made the preseason first-team this season.

**An Early Conference Matchup:** The regular season began on Aug. 30 this season with something unusual, a Conference matchup, as Tennessee Tech played at Eastern Illinois. It marked the first time since the 1999 season (when Western Kentucky played at UT Martin) that an OVC matchup occurred in the first week of the season. The feat has only happened one other time since 1990, that year Middle Tennessee opened the year at Tennessee State on Sept. 1.

**Welcome Back:** The 2007 season brings a familiar face back to the Ohio Valley Conference as Austin Peay will once again be sponsoring scholarship football and compete in the Conference. The Governors dropped scholarship football following the 1996 season and competed for a time in the Pioneer Football League. Last season the program played as an independent with some scholarships and will be back in full this year. The team also welcomes a new coach in former APSU quarterback **Rick Christophel**.

**Add One, Lose One:** The re-addition of Austin Peay to the Ohio Valley Conference brings the number of football playing institutions to 10, the largest number that has ever played football at one time in the OVC. That number will decrease to nine after this season, as Samford will exit to join the Southern Conference in all sports in 2008-09.

**New Faces:** After just four weeks of the 2007 season, the three new OVC head football coaches have combined to go 10-5 overall. **Rick Christophel** at Austin Peay is not the only new coach in the OVC this season. He is joined by **Watson Brown** at Tennessee Tech and **Pat Sullivan** at Samford. Uniquely all three have connections to each other, as all three were at UAB last season. Brown, who was the head coach at Austin Peay to begin his career (1979-80), had served as head coach at UAB from 1995 through last season before taking over the program at Tech, which is located in his hometown of Cookeville, Tenn. Sullivan, who won the 1971 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback at Auburn, was the offensive coordinator at UAB from 1999-05 and was the running backs coach last season; he was previously a head coach at Texas Christian (1992-97). Christophel had been at UAB from 1995 through 2007, serving as the defensive coordinator each of the past two seasons.

**Another Coach Returns:** One OVC head coach is not new to the League this year but does return after a one-year absence due to medical issues. Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** took last season off following a medical procedure the week of the season-opener. In his place acting head coach Mark Hutson led the Panthers to the program's fourth OVC championship and a playoff appearance. But Spoo is healthy this year and returns to the sidelines for his 20th season in 2007.

**Coaches At Their Alma Maters:** Two of the current 10 OVC head football coaches are currently guiding their alma maters. Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** is in his first season in Clarksville after previously serving as defensive coordinator at UAB. Christophel was a Gova quarterback in the 1970s. **Danny Hope** of Eastern Kentucky is in his fifth year with the Colonels and has guided the team to four winning seasons in four years. He was a lineman at EKU and was part of the team's 1979 national championship squad. Two others coaches in the OVC got to square off against their alma maters in 2007. Tennessee-Martin's **Jason Simpson** took on his alma mater in week one, as the Skyhawks lost to Southern Miss 35-13. In week No. 2 Eastern Illinois' **Bob Spoo** challenged his alma mater, Purdue, as the Panthers lost 52-6.

**NFL Connections:** As of October 22, 11 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2007 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players are two players who competed in the OVC last season, Edgar Jones (Southeast Missouri) of the Baltimore Ravens and Tristan Burge (Eastern Illinois) of the Green Bay Packers. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). EIU is one of only two schools to have three alums with current head coaching gigs (San Diego State with Joe Gibbs, John Fox and Herm Edwards and USC with Mike Holmgren, Jeff Fisher and Jack Del Rio are the other two). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. UTM also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants during the off-season.

**FCS Playoffs:** For the 11th straight season, the FCS Championship game will be held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Saturday, Dec. 14 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 24 and continue with second round games on Dec. 1 and semifinal contests on Dec. 7/Dec. 8 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Tennessee-Martin and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs and this season will look to put two teams in the playoffs in back-to-back years for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

## NCAA ACTIVE RUSHING LEADERS

This season two OVC running backs are near the top of the active career rushing leaders at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Don Chapman of UT Martin and Chris Fletcher of Austin Peay currently rank No. 2 and No. 3 nationally in that category, only trailing Scott Phaydavong of Drake.

## SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2007 season marks the first of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy will be contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

# FOOTBALL

## One Division I

As most football fans know, three classifications – Division I-A, I-AA and I-AAA – were used to differentiate the administration of a school's football program. As of December 15, 2006, those three classifications were declared out of bounds and new designations were kicked off.

The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will be used to describe football programs that compete to participate in the postseason bowl system that includes the 32 NCAA-licensed bowls that make up the Bowl Championship Series.

The NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) now will be used to describe schools that participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 88 NCAA national championships that formerly was described as the I-AA football championship).

## The Reason for the Change

The I-A, I-AA and I-AAA designations were confusing and as result, misapplied by college football fans and the media when referring not only to football programs (e.g., I-AA basketball). And because of greater awareness of specific conferences and schools, the I-A label was rarely emphasized by the I-A membership, which only caused greater confusion about the I-AA classification.

This initiative, voted into effect by the presidents and chancellors who comprise the NCAA Division I Board of Directors last August, is not intended to confuse or devalue the importance of the BCS format.

## Why These Titles Were Chosen

These labels communicate in a positive and clear way about the differences between the Division I football classifications, chiefly the postseason opportunity, while still defining them within the Division I experience.

The name change also clearly defines the student-athlete experience. Rather than being incorrectly referred to by a football classification, they'll simply be a Division I student-athlete.

## Spreading the Word

The use of the new football labels was rolled out at the 2006 NCAA Division I Football Championship game. During the course of the 2007 season, expect these new football designations to be used by members of the college football community, which includes student-athletes, corporate supporters, university/college officials, community leaders and media partners.

Coaches, administrators and staff have been asked to use the new classifications in media guides, game programs, Web sites, tickets and promotional materials.

Get to know the new names for the teams in your favorite game – the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

**GAME NOTES:** Samford and Tennessee State will lock horns on Thursday night in a game that will be seen by a national audience on ESPN. The teams have played four times previously with each team having come out on top twice. TSU won last year's game 29-7 in Nashville. Samford is 3-2 at Seibert Stadium this season and 125-62-4 all-time in the stadium. The meeting is the first between Samford head coach Pat Sullivan and Tennessee State head coach James Webster.

**SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE:** The Tigers rebounded from losing starting QB Antonio Heffner two weeks ago by posting a 42-28 home victory over Murray State (the OVC's top offense) this past weekend. The team did it with an impressive offensive performance and timely defense. Senior DB Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week for the first time this season. The Buck Buchanan Award (given to the FCS's Top Defensive Player nationally) nominee blocked his fourth kick of the season (3 field goals, 1 PAT) on a 31-yard field goal attempt in the opening quarter. That resulted in the Tigers scoring their first touchdown on the ensuing possession. He also intercepted a pass and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown, added eight tackles (6 solo), a tackle-for-loss and a pass break-up. Sophomore LB Calvin Baker added 10 tackles (hitting double figures for the second straight week) and recovered a fumble. Junior RB Javarris Williams proved the scoring punch for TSU, as he rushed for 156 yards on 20 carries (7.8 yards per carry) and scored three touchdowns. He finished the game with 191 all-purpose yards. It marked his 13th 100-yard rushing performance of his career, a mark that is 14th nationally among active FCS players. In his second career start, true freshman QB Calvin McNairl was 4-of-5 for 69 yards; he did rush for 21 yards and a touchdown (a fourth quarter score that put TSU up 28 points). TSU mainly focused on the running game, finishing with 280 total rushing yards as a unit.

**SCOUTING SAMFORD:** Samford is coming off a tough 24-12 loss to in-state rival Jacksonville State on Saturday. The Bulldogs were limited rushing the ball but cut the lead to 17-12 at one point before a big return by Jax State led to an easy score and put the game out of reach. The team got all of its points from freshman kicker Mark Prevost, who made field goals from 48, 29, 34 and 39 yards to account for all 12 of the Bulldogs points. Sophomore safety Ty Levie led Samford with 10 tackles (nine solo) in last Saturday's loss to JSU. He also added a pass break-up in the game. Redshirt freshman RB Chris Evans was limited to just 20 yards against JSU but has rushed for 844 yards on the season and needs only 156 yards in his remaining two games to reach the 1,000 plateau for the year. If he reaches that mark he will be the first Samford player to do so since Jerome Russell ran for 1,236 yards in 1999. QB Jefferson Adcock continues to climb the Samford statistical leader charts, as he now ranks third in total offense (5,678 yards) and fourth in passing (5,261 yards). Senior WR Jeff Moore keeps catching Adcock's passes, and is third in Samford history with 182 receptions; he has caught at least one pass in every career game.

**GAME NOTES:** These two teams have only played four times since Jacksonville State joined the OVC, but each time those games have been important in the final league standings. JSU won in 2003 and 2004 and went on to claim the OVC Championship; in 2005 and 2006 it was Eastern Illinois who came away with the game victory and the OVC title. The winner of the game would put themselves in good position for an at-large FCS Playoff berth, if they win their final game of the season (this assumes ECU wins one of its final two games of the season and claims the regular season title).

**SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS:** Eastern Illinois, now No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the Sports Network poll, is coming off a bye week. That rest gave the team a chance to heal and get healthy, as the squad has suffered a rash of injuries this season. The Panthers have won three in a row since losing to league-leading Eastern Kentucky on Oct. 6; overall the team has won five of six games since starting the season 1-2. In their last outing two weeks ago, the team got a 30-yard field goal from junior Tyler Wilke as time expired to top Tennessee State 38-35 on the road. He was also a perfect 5-for-5 in extra points on the day and is now 32-of-32 on point after this season. Junior RB Travorus Bess ran for 127 yards on 15 carries (8.5 ypc) including scoring a touchdown on a 39-yard run in the TSU game. He also played the part of quarterback, throwing an 8-yard score to WR Micah Rucker. Fellow RB Ademola Adeniji added 127 yards rushing. Senior DL Tim Kelly added seven tackles (6 solo) and a sack in the contest. Freshman DB Rashad Haynes intercepted his fifth pass of the season (second best in the OVC) and returned in 74 yards to help set up an EIU score.

**SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE:** Despite not being ranked all season, Jacksonville State has been gaining ground and are receiving votes in all the major polls for the last four weeks. A win over EIU would vault the Gamecocks into the Top 25 and FCS Playoffs picture. Jax State is fresh off a 24-12 victory over in-state rival Samford, in what could be the last meeting between the schools (as Samford leaves the Conference after this year); the win vaulted JSU to a 22-21-2 lead in the all-time series. Junior RS Maurice Dupree was named Specialist of the Week for the second time this season. He finished the Samford game with 201 all-purpose yards and a touchdown. After Samford cut the lead to 17-12, Dupree took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 86 yards to the Bulldogs 8-yard line; two plays later JSU scored to seal the win. He also scored a touchdown on a 24-yard reverse during the game. Junior DB Terrell Johnson finished the contest with eight tackles and an interception. He keyed a Gamecock defense that held the potent Samford offense to just 106 rushing yards and 199 passing yards. In the last three games, JSU has faced the top three individual rushers in the Conference and held them to a combined 144 yards, including Samford's Chris Evans, who managed just 20 on the ground (while averaging nearly 100 per game). Junior RB Daniel Jackson rushed for 103 yards on 18 carries, giving the Gamecocks their first 100-yard rusher of the season. The JSU defense has recorded at least one interception in 16 of its last 17 games dating back to last season.

**GAME NOTES:** Murray State and UT Martin will meet for the 44th time on Saturday. The Racers controlled the series for many years, winning each matchup between 1993 and 2004; however, the last two years the Skyhawks have been the victor, winning 49-20 in 2005 and 42-14 in 2006. The game also marks the return to Martin, Tenn. for Racer head coach Matt Griffin, who was the UT Martin coach from 2003-05.

**SCOUTING MURRAY STATE:** Murray State continues to lead the OVC in total offense (415.4 yards/game) and the young team is getting better each week. The Racers did come out on the short end of the stick at Tennessee State last week, falling 42-28. But it was not from a lack of performance from redshirt freshman QB Jeff Ehrhardt, who was named both OVC Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week. Ehrhardt set a Murray State record for completions in a game (36), as he was 36-of-46 for 330 yards and two touchdowns through the air and rushed the ball 30 times for 104 yards and a score. He became the first OVC quarterback since 2004 to throw for more than 300 yards and run for more than 100 yards in the same game; he is one of just five players at the FCS level to achieve that feat this season. He had his second-straight 300+ yard passing game and increased his OVC-leading passing touchdown total to 18. He capped off MSU's second scoring drive of the game with a leap over two defenders at the goal line. It also marked the second straight week he had been named OVC Newcomer of the Week. Senior WR Rod Harper extended his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 25, with a 31-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter. Ehrhardt spread the wealth on Saturday, completing passes to 10 different receivers. Fellow freshman Marcus Harris caught his second touchdown in as many weeks and Josh Jones caught a career-high eight passes. The Racers attempted three on-side kicks during the game and recovered two of them.

**SCOUTING UT MARTIN:** UT Martin is coming off a bye week and will be fresh for its two remaining games this season. It starts this week against Murray State and ends at Tennessee State next week in the final Sgt. York Trophy game of the year. The last time out UT Martin racked up 55 points in a 55-20 victory over Southeast Missouri, winning for the second time in three weeks after starting the season 0-6. The 55 points was the most in an OVC victory since joining the league in 1992. In that game QB Cade Thompson earned Co-Newcomer of the Week honors after completing 23-of-32 passes for 317 yards and three touchdowns. He also spread the ball around, completing passes to eight different receivers. Junior kicker Tom Hansen was busy on the day, making two field goals and kicking seven extra points (13 total points on the day). UTM accumulated a season-high 566 yards in the contest on 80 total plays while limiting Southeast to just 67 total rushing yards. Senior RB Don Chapman rushed the ball 20 times for 116 yards and a touchdown; he now has 22 100-yard rushing games in his career (3rd most nationally among active players) and needs 182 yards in his final two games to become the 14th player in Division I history (FBS and FCS) to rush for 1,000 or more yards in four straight seasons.

**GAME NOTES:** Although Jacksonville State/Eastern Illinois may be the matchup with the most on the line this weekend, the most intriguing matchup of the weekend will occur in Clarksville. Eastern Kentucky needs just one win to clinch its 19th OVC Championship and first in 10 years. The Colonels are nationally-ranked and on the verge of making their NCAA record 18th FCS Playoff appearance. Austin Peay, on the other hand, is in its first season back in the OVC after a 10-year break (where they played non-scholarship football). The Governors were picked to finish last in the league but have impressed under first-year head coach Rick Christophel, as he has led the team to a 6-3 record and 4-2 OVC mark. The Gobs are assured of their first winning season since 2002 and first as a scholarship program since 1984. A win over EKU and a season-ending win at Murray State could garner the Gobs a FCS Playoff at-large berth.

**SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY:** The Colonels can clinch the OVC Championship and automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs with a win over Austin Peay on Saturday. The Colonels have moved up to No. 13 in all three major national polls and they have won six games in a row and are a perfect 7-0 against FCS competition this year (the losses came against FBS Kentucky and Western Kentucky). EKU is coming off a bye week after topping Murray State 46-35 two weeks ago. In that game, Derrick Huff intercepted three passes (he leads the OVC with 8 picks on the year) and was named OVC and National Defensive Player of the Week. Senior RB Bobby Washington reeled off a 99-yard touchdown in the game, setting an OVC record for the longest rush from scrimmage in Conference history. He is one of two players nationally this season to have a 99-yard rush for a touchdown. EKU is first nationally in turnover margin (+20) this season; the team was -7 for the entire 2006 season. Amazingly, EKU has scored 107 points off opponent turnovers this year and allowed just six points off the turnovers they have committed.

**SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY:** The Governors won a thrilling 34-31 double overtime game at Southeast Missouri last weekend to assure itself of a winning record overall and in OVC play (which has not happened since going 4-3 in league play in 1984). Senior RB Chris Fletcher was the difference-maker, carrying the ball 30 times for 162 yards and three touchdowns. He scored twice during regulation (9 and 25 yards) and opened the first overtime with a 25-yard touchdown run. He now has 1,160 yards on the season, making him only the second APSU player with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons in their careers. He has 27 career 100-yard rushing games, which is the second most among active FCS players; Fletcher also has 44 career touchdowns and 254 career points scored. QB Mark Cunningham also got into the action, as his 25-yard touchdown pass to Darryl Miller on the first play of the second overtime proved to be the game-winner; APSU ran just one offensive play in each overtime. Austin Peay has won its last four games by three points apiece; in its six wins this season the team has outscored its opposition by just 10 total points. The Gobs have also now won three straight road games. Austin Peay special teams produced two touchdowns against SEMO (fumble recovery and blocked field goal) and the team has intercepted a pass in each of its last six games.

**GAME NOTES:** Southeast Missouri State will step out of Conference play to battle in-state foe Missouri State on Saturday. The teams have played 72 times before but not since the 2005 season. Missouri State has won five in a row in the series with a Southeast win last coming in the 1999 season (28-23), when the Bears were known as Southwest Missouri State. The games are generally close, as three of the last five have been determined by seven points or less, and two of those were settled by just a field goal. Southeast Missouri will be looking to snap a six-game losing streak for the 2007 season in the process.

**SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI:** The Redhawks nearly ended their losing streak and picked up their first OVC victory of the season against Austin Peay last Saturday but ended up falling 34-31 in double overtime at Houck Stadium. The game was evenly matched throughout and the heroics of junior QB Houston Lillard and freshman WR Miles Edwards helped the team score late and force the extra periods. Lillard finished the day 17-of-31 for 265 yards and four touchdowns, but none was bigger than a pass to Edwards with 1:27 left in regulation to tie the game at 27. Edwards, who finished the day with eight catches for 131 yards and three touchdowns, also caught a score in the first overtime, tying the game at 28 and forcing a second overtime. Doug Spada would kick a field goal in the second overtime but Austin Peay would score on a touchdown pass and claim the three-point victory. Lillard finished the day with touchdown passes of 18, 25, 25 and 25 yards. After missing the last game with an injury, LB Adam Casper, the leading tackler in the OVC (11.2 tackles/game), made his return to lead the Redhawk defense. Casper finished with a game-high 16 tackles (3 solo) and also added a tackle-for-loss and a pass break-up.

**SCOUTING MISSOURI STATE:** The Bears have shown improvement in year No. 2 under head coach Terry Allen, and have a .500 overall record heading into the final game of the season this weekend. With a win this weekend, the squad can clinch its first winning season since 2004 and only its third winning season in the past 11 seasons. Allen, who has also been the head coach at Northern Iowa and Kansas, has won 102 games in his 15-year college career. The team got the tough task of facing off with No. 1 ranked Northern Iowa last week, falling 38-17 at home to the Panthers. The game was closer than it appeared, as the teams were knotted at 17 at halftime, but UNI exploded for 21 unanswered points in the second half. Gerald Davis leads the team in rushing this season, totaling 773 yards (5.5 yards/carry) and 16 touchdowns. QB Cody Kirby has passed for 1,487 yards and 9 scores in 10 games.
