THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

The 2008 season got underway last week as seven teams opened play on Thursday night and two others got underway on Saturday...Against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) competition, the OVC squads fared well, compiling a 2-1 record...That included Tennessee State going on the road to top rival Alabama A&M (who was picked to finish second in the SWAC East Division) and Tennessee Tech winning at home over Gardner-Webb (picked to finish third in the Big South Conference)...The only loss to a FCS team was Austin Peay dropping a decision at No. 2 North Dakota State, the Missouri Valley Football Conference favorites and one of the favorites for this year's national championship...Two other OVC schools - Murray State and Southeast Missouri - battled non-Division I teams and both came away with wins...The other four OVC schools played Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools, including UT Martin playing at No. 19 South Florida, a team that was ranked as high as No. 2 in the national polls a year ago...This week will feature two OVC schools battling nationally-ranked FBS teams, as Southeast Missouri plays No. 6 ranked Missouri and Eastern Illinois plays at No. 19 Illinois...Tennessee Tech (at Louisville), Murray State (at Indiana) will also play FBS schools...Eastern Kentucky will battle FBS reclassifying team Western Kentucky, who will be a full-fledged FBS team next season; the "Battle of the Bluegrass" will be played in Richmond for the last time ever and should draw a big crowd...Other games include Tennessee State hosting Southern in the John Merritt Classic, Jacksonville State hosting Alabama A&M, Austin Peay played at No. 17 Georgia Southern and UT Martin hosting Baker University.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Houston Lillard, QB • Sr., 6-0, 210 • Oakland, Calif. • Southeast Missouri

Lillard completed 27-of-39 passes for 387 yards and three touchdowns as Southeast Missouri came from behind to hold off the upset by of Southwest Baptist on Thursday night. With his team trailing 28-12 late in the fourth quarter, Lillard directed to fourth quarter scoring drives as the Redhawks tied the game at 28 and forced overtime. In overtime Lillard hooked up with sophomore Miles Edwards for a 23-yard touchdown on the second play of the series to give the Redhawks the 35-28 victory. Lillard and Edwards also hooked up on an 80-yard touchdown pass on the first play of a drive with 5:52 to play in the fourth. Lillard also did not throw an interception in the game.

DEFENSIVE

Eddie Calvin, CB • Jr., 6-1, 170 • St. Louis, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

Calvin netted three interceptions, all in the first half, to help Southeast Missouri State top Southwest Baptist 35-28 in overtime on Thursday. With the Redhawks offense struggling in the first half, Calvin's defense kept the game close and allowed for the second half comeback. He returned the interceptions for a total of 71 yards. He also finished second on the team with seven tackles and had a pass break-up. The three interceptions was one of the OVC record for most in a single game.

Terrence Holt, KR • So., 5-6, 160 • Nashville, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Holt set an OVC record with 250 kick return yards in the Governors 41-6 loss at No. 2 ranked North Dakota State on Thursday night. The 250 yards broke the previous record of 215 yards set by UT Martin's Darriel Ruffin against Murray State in 1997. Holt returned seven total kickoffs for an average of 35.7 yards per kick on the night. His four longest returns totaled 64, 55, 41 and 39 yards. As a freshman last season, Holt set the OVC record for total kick return yards for a season (1,104 yards).

JaJuan Spillman, WR • Jr., 5-8, 152 • Louisville, Ky. • Tennessee State

In his Tennessee State debut, Spillman caught a 65-yard touchdown pass and returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown as the Tigers went on the road to top rival Alabama A&M 34-13 on Saturday. The University of Louisville transfer, Spillman had only four total touches on the night, but netted those two touchdowns and 209 all-purpose yards. In all, he returned three kickoffs for 144 yards. His kick return touchdown put TSU on top for good in the second quarter.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Holt Sets OVC Single-Game Kickoff Return Record: Austin Peay sophomore **Terrence Holt** set the OVC's single-game kickoff yardage record in the opening weekend, returning 250 yards of kicks against No. 2 North Dakota State (Aug. 28). That broke the 11-year old record previously held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin (215 yards against Murray State in 1997). During his freshman season in which he was named an OVC All-Newcomer selection, Holt set the OVC single-season record for kickoff return yardage (1,104).

Williams and Walters Named to Sports Network's Payton and Buchanan Watch Lists: Two Ohio Valley Conference football players found their names among The Sports Network's announcement of the 2008 Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan award watch lists at the end of August. Tennessee State senior running back **Javarris Williams** was named to the Payton list while Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** was named to the Buchanan list. The Payton and Buchanan awards will undergo two revisions, one in October and one in November, before ballots are sent out to a panel of sports information directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries on Nov. 24. The Sports Network awards banquet will be held Dec. 18 in Chattanooga, Tenn., on the eve of before the NCAA Division I national championship game. The Payton Award goes to the FCS national player of the year, with the Buchanan Award honoring the FCS national defensive player of the year. The Eddie Robinson Award, which goes to the FCS national coach of the year will also be awarded that night. The Robinson Award ballot will be announced in November. The Sports Network established the Payton and Robinson awards in 1987, and began sponsoring the Buchanan Award in 1995. Georgia Southern quarterback Jayson Foster was the 2007 Payton Award winner, while Montana defensive end Kroy Biermann took home the Buchanan Award.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCsports.TV: For the third consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed nearly a thousand events in its first two years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

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the OVC put multiple teams in the FCS playoffs for the second straight year, which marked the first time since the mid-90s that had occurred. Eastern Illinois and UT Martin were playoff participants in 2006 while Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky were participants last season. The OVC has now put multiple teams in the playoffs in three straight years since 1994-96.

Sgt. York Trophy: The 2008 season marks the second for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). Last summer the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. Last season Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records. Both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee Tech and UT Martin each finished 1-2 in the series during the year.

Jacksonville State Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's, Although Three Schools Split First-Place Votes: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head football coaches and sports information directors, Jacksonville State University has been picked as the 2008 preseason favorite in the nine-team league. The Gamecocks claimed the 2003 and 2004 OVC Championships and were tabbed as the favorites for the second time in history (2005 was the other). Although Jax State was tabbed as the favorites, the votes indicated the pollsters predicted this year's race should be extremely tight, as the 18 first-place votes were split evenly amongst three schools. JSU received six first-place votes and were followed by 2007 OVC Champion Eastern Kentucky, who was picked second and also received six first-place votes. Eastern Illinois, who was a 2007 at-large selection for the FCS Playoffs, also garnered six first-place votes and was tabbed third. The three teams were separated by just five points, as preseason favorite

Jacksonville State ended up with 113 points, Eastern Kentucky followed with 111 points and Eastern Illinois received 108 points. It marked the closest preseason vote in Ohio Valley Conference history.

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Jacksonville State? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past five seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 29 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (41.4%).

Holland and Walters Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Kentucky senior quarterback **Allan Holland** and Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** were tabbed the 2008 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with the most individual selections (5), following closely by four each from Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (9 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included eight players who were second-team selections in 2007.

FCS Playoffs: For the 12th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 19 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 29 and continue with second round games on Dec. 6 and semifinal contests on Dec. 12/Dec. 13 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Eastern Kentucky and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs.

New Faces: This season one new head coach makes his debut in the OVC. Eastern Kentucky is under the direction of first-year head coach **Dean Hood**, who served as an assistant coach for the Colonels from 1994-98, where the team compiled a 32-6 OVC record and made three FCS playoff appearances. Hood was most recently the defensive coordinator at Wake Forest, where the Demon Deacons made an appearance in the 2006 FedEx Orange Bowl and the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

NFL Connections: As of August 20, 13 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2008 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is former TSU defensive back Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a first round draft pick of the Arizona Cardinals this season. He became only the fourth OVC player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in 2008. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at UT Martin, who also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants prior to the 2007 season. In his first season as GM, Reese led the Giants to the Super Bowl Championship.

NCAA Rule Changes for 2008: There are several rule changes for the 2008 season that will make noticeable effects on the game. Among them are the banning of “horse-collar” tackles, a simplification of chop blocking rules and the elimination of the 5-yard face mask penalty for incidental contact (it will either be a 15-yard penalty or no foul at all). The major rule change involves the play clock which will have both 40 and 25-second settings. Whenever the ball becomes dead, the play clock will reset to 40 seconds and will start immediately. This includes when a runner is down in the field of play or out of bounds, a fumble out of bounds, backward pass out of bounds and after an incomplete pass. After a team has picked up a first down the game clock will stop but the play clock will go to 40 seconds and will start counting down.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 87 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (55) is second followed by UT Martin (35) and Murray State (31). SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2008 season marks the second of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois will make its second trip in three seasons to Memorial Stadium to battle Illinois this Saturday. The two teams, who are separated by only 45 miles, met for the first time in the 2006 season when Illinois pulled away in the second half for a 42-17 victory. EIU is now 4-22 all-time against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS); that includes a loss at Central Michigan in week one of this season. EIU is the last OVC team to pull off a win against a FBS team, as they beat Eastern Michigan 31-28 in the 2004 season. EIU's D'Angelo McCray is returning to play at Illinois, a school he transferred to Eastern from prior to the season. Another EIU player - senior Jeff Sobol - played in two games as a redshirt freshman for coach Ron Zook, before transferring to Eastern. A sellout crowd is expected for the rededication of Memorial Stadium which will mark the third time EIU has played in front of 50,000 or more fans.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Coming off its season-opener loss to Central Michigan, the Panthers remained No. 18 in all three national Football Championship Subdivision polls. Against CMU, Eastern trailed only 24-12 in the fourth quarter when Seymour Loftman had a potential interception he would have returned for an easy touchdown slip out of his hands. Quarterback Bodie Reeder was sharp, completing 19-of-28 passes for 201 yards on the evening. Tight end Sean McGrath caught six of Reeder's passes, logging 66 yards in his first collegiate start. The six receptions by an EIU tight end were the most since the 2006 season. Panther running back Tavorus Bess pushed his career rushing total to 970 yards; he needs just 30 yards against Illinois to become the 23rd player in EIU history with 1,000 rushing yards.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS: Illinois started the season with a loss to nationally-ranked rival Missouri in St. Louis. The Fighting Illini feature one of the top dual threat quarterbacks in the nation in Juice Williams. In the loss to Mizzou, Williams passed for 451 yards and five touchdowns. The team also returns the Big Ten Freshman of the Year Arrelious Bean, who hauled in seven passes for 92 yards against the Tigers in week one. A key matchup may be at running back, where Illinois lost NFL Draft Pick Rashard Mendenhall following last season. In the meeting two years against Illinois rushed for 345 yards against EIU; last week the Panthers allowed Central Michigan to only 172 rushing yards, including 82 for Ontario Sneed, the MAC's leading rusher. Illinois was ranked No. 19 in last week's USA Today poll and may fall slightly after its loss to Missouri; a new AP poll will be released on Tuesday.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech and Louisville will be meeting for the third time in history but first time in 47 years on Saturday. The teams split the two previous meetings. On side-story that makes an interesting note is the return of TTU quarterback Lee Sweeney to the University of Louisville. Sweeney spent a redshirt season at UofL in 2005 before transferring to the Golden Eagles squad. Tech head coach Watson Brown currently has 99 career wins and will reach 100 with a victory over Louisville. UofL marks the first of two Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents for Tech this year (Western Michigan being the other).

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: TTU is coming off a win in its home opener for the 10th time in 11 years on Thursday, as they beat FCS Gardner-Webb 28-12. Tech's defense was stout, as it limited GWU to 280 yards of total offense (45 on the ground) and denied the Bulldogs three times inside the redzone. On the other hand, Tennessee Tech was 5-for-5 inside the red zone (3 TD's, 2 FG's) on the night. Preseason All-OVC selection Maurice Smith led the defense with 14 tackles and added three pass break-ups. Dontrell Baines had 13 stops, a sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. Sophomore Henry Sailes had 10 receptions (one short of the school record) and finished the contest with 171 all-purpose yards. Freshman Tim Benford added five catches for 99 yards. Quarterback Lee Sweeney was 19-for-31 for 199 yards and two touchdowns.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE: The Cardinals began their season on Sunday, falling 27-2 to in-state rival Kentucky at home. After losing their starting quarterback, running back and top three receivers, the Cardinals offense struggled, racking up only 53 yards rushing and 152 through the air and not netting an offensive score on the day. The two points was the lowest point total for the team since being shutout by Florida State in the 2000 season. Quarterback Hunter Cantwell, who was a reserve behind now NFL quarterback Brian Brohm for three years, was 20-for-43 for 152 yards and three interceptions in his first start. Doug Beaumont had nine catches for 77 yards for UofL.

GAME NOTES: After a loss to BCS Conference foe South Florida last week, UT Martin will begin the first of two straight at home when they entertain Baker University on Saturday. The game will mark the first meeting between the schools. Last season the Skyhawks were 3-2 at home and enter this contest with a three-game winning streak at Graham Stadium.

SCOUTING BAKER: Baker, a member of the NAIA Heart of America Conference, will start its season this week when it travels to UT Martin. Last year the Wildcats won four of their final six games of the season to finish at 6-5 overall. The team does return All-American kicker Derek Doerfler, who set school records for field goals made in a season (23), field goals made in a game (5) and longest field goal (62 yards) during the 2007 season. Overall he made eight field goals over 50 yards during the campaign. On offense the team brings back eight players, including two-year starter at quarterback, Mack Brown. The defense also features eight returnees, including the entire starting defensive line.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin was outmatched against the No. 19 ranked South Florida Bulls last week, falling 56-7 in Tampa. The biggest bright spot of the game was junior safety Dontrell Miller. Miller had 11 solo tackles, an interception that he returned 33 yards and forced and recovered a fumble that he returned 64 yards for the team's lone points of the night. The performance mirrored what he did in last year's opener against Southern Miss, when he also had 11 tackles. Senior punter Adam Ivey punted 12 times on the night, and set a new UT Martin single-game record for punt yardage (467). He was just three punts shy of the school record for most punts in a game. The game took place in front of 48,058 fans, the largest crowd to ever see a UTM football game. It also marked the team's second straight game in a NFL stadium, as the Skyhawks closed out 2007 at LP Field in Nashville against Tennessee State.

The meeting is the first all-time between the schools.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay will be looking to rebound from its loss to No. 2 North Dakota State last week. The Govs tallied just 91 yards of total offense (including 26 yards in the first half). APSU's quarterbacks struggled, as Gary Orr and T.C. Jennings combined to go 5-of-13 for 35 yards. One highlight was sophomore kick returner Terrence Holt, who set an OVC single-game record with 250 yards on kickoff returns (35.7 yard/return). Holt had returns of 55, 64, 39 and 41 on the night. A year ago he set the League's single-season record for kickoff yardage. He was named OVC Specialist of the Week for his efforts. After missing most of last season with an injury, middle linebacker Daniel Becker returned to lead Austin Peay with 10 tackles.

SCOUTING GEORGIA SOUTHERN: While Austin Peay was battling one of the best FCS teams in the nation last week, Georgia Southern was battling one of the best FBS teams when they played between the hedges at Sanford Stadium against No. 1 Georgia. GS had two players split time at quarterback, as Lee Chapple was 9-of-18 for 86 yards (and rushed for a touchdown) while Antonio Henton was 10-of-18 for 102 yards and a passover touchdown. The Eagles are trying to replace last year's quarterback, Jayson Foster, who won the Walter Payton Award for the nation's top player.

GAME NOTES: Western Kentucky and Eastern Kentucky began playing football against each other in 1914 and have battled 83 times since then. The "Battle of the Bluegrass" generally is the biggest game on each team's calendar for a season. This year will be the last time that the rivalry is played in Richmond, as WKU will be a full-fledged FBS member next season and Sun Belt bylaws will prevent the team from playing on the road at a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team. Whether the game continues in Bowling Green or at a neutral site in the future is unknown. Western Kentucky won last year's meeting 26-6 while ECU winning 26-21 two years ago when the game was played in Richmond.

SCOUTING WESTERN KENTUCKY: Western Kentucky is finishing up its final year of reclassifying to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). The Hilltoppers will begin a full Sun Belt schedule next year and be bowl eligible during that season. In its season opener at Indiana last week, WKU could not contain Kellen Lewis who had 329 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in the 31-13 IU victory. Western's multi-talented quarterback K.J. Black also put on a show, completing 19-of-31 passes for 219 yards and a touchdown; he also rushed for 47 yards on 15 carries. Through the air he found Jake Gaebler, who caught six passes for 81 yards and a touchdown. On defense, Alonzo Higgins had 11 tackles to lead the 'Toppers.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky opened the season against a tough Cincinnati team last Thursday night in suffering the 40-7 loss. Senior quarterback Allan Holland, the preseason OVC Offensive Player of the Year, was 12-of-17 for 141 yards and a touchdown in the contest. He now needs just 55 more passing yards to move into ECU's top 10 list after just 12 games as the full-time starter. His touchdown pass went to sophomore Cody Watts (the first of his college career), who pulled in three passes for a total of 97 yards on the night. In a game controlled by Cincinnati, sophomore punter Logan O'Connor helped the Colonels gain as much field position as possible. He averaged 43.4 yards per punt in his first game as the punter, the highest per punt average for the team since the beginning of the 2005 season (a span of 34 games). The Knoxville, Tenn. native connected on two punts of at least 50 yards and also knocked one inside the UC 20-yard line. Antonio Fredrick had 12 tackles to lead the ECU defense while Jeremy Caldwell added 10 and a fumble recovery.

The teams are meeting for the first time since 2003, when the Gamecocks won 9-3 in Huntsville. JSU is 41-18-3 all-time in home openers at Paul Snow Stadium and 6-2 under Coach Crowe. When the two teams played in Jacksonville in 2002, a Paul Snow Stadium record crowd of 16,861 showed up for the contest.

SCOUTING ALABAMA A&M: Alabama A&M opened its season last Saturday with a 34-13 home loss to Tennessee State. The Bulldogs allowed TSU to rack up 399 total yards of offense in the contest. A&M quarterback Kevin Atkins was 16-of-31 for 185 yards through the air, and hooked up with Thomas Harris seven times for 105 yards. On the ground Atkins netted 55 yards and a touchdown for his team. AAMU did a good job on special teams as well, as punter Rashan Cylar punted four times for an average of 46.0 yards and a long of 52. Defensively David Gaines led the way with eight tackles while Frank Moore added six stops and three pass break-ups.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: The Gamecocks opened the season with a tall task, playing at Georgia Tech last Thursday night. A tough opponent was combined with a lot of new faces (10 players made their first career start) led to a 41-14 loss. In his much anticipated JSU debut, junior quarterback Ryan Perrilloux was 22-for-37 for 136 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 67 yards and 18 carries in his Gamecock debut. His favorite target was Maurice Dupree, who he hit for a five-yard score and later a 16-yard score. Dupree became the first Gamecock to catch two touchdown passes in the same game since Oct. 2006 and his nine receptions in the contest were the most by a JSU player since Sept. 1999. The game at Georgia Tech was played in front of 45,706 fans, the second largest crowd to ever see a JSU game (trailing only the 47,456 fans that saw them play at Mississippi State in 2002).

GAME NOTES: Murray State will be challenging the Indiana Hoosiers for the first-time in school history.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State is coming off a season-opening victory over Lambuth, the team's first season opening win since the 2004 season. The Racers overcame a slow start and an injury to starting quarterback Jeff Ehrhardt who went down in the first half after completing 6-of-13 passes for 122 yards and a touchdown (and also punting four times). But junior Nico Yantko came in to the contest and did not miss a beat. Yantko was 10-of-15 for 156 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Racers to the victory. He also ran the ball nine times for 22 yards as Murray State scored 24 unanswered points to win the game. The game marked the return of senior linebacker Nathan Williams, who was injured in the first game of last season and granted a rare sixth season of eligibility by the NCAA. Williams made the most of the beginning of his second senior season, as he equaled his career-best with 17 tackles. One of the biggest plays of the night came from Will Werner, who returned an interception 76 yards for a touchdown, the first on a play like that for Murray State since the 2004 season. Sophomore cornerback Harry McCall made his Racer debut last Thursday and finished the game with seven tackles, two pass break-ups and an interception (which led to a MSU field goal). Freshman kicker Kienan Cullen made both of his extra point attempts during the game and added field goals from 22 and 28 yards. He was also forced into punting duties when Ehrhardt went down, and punted twice for a 44.0 yards/punt average.

SCOUTING INDIANA: Indiana is coming off a season-opening 31-13 victory over Western Kentucky last weekend. In that contest, junior quarterback Kellen Lewis did it with his arm and his feet. Lewis was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after finishing 17-of-27 for 144 yards and two passing touchdowns and rushing nine times for 185 yards and two more scores. The two rushing touchdowns went for distances of 75 and 62 yards, as he became the first IU player to ever run for two touchdowns of 60 or more yards in the same game.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Southern will meet on Saturday in what will be the 10th annual John Merritt Classic. The event is named for the legendary coach who compiled 30 straight winning seasons and won four historically black national championships at TSU and a record of 172-33-7. Overall he was 232-65-11 as a head coach. Tennessee State is 6-3 all-time at the event, dropping a game to Alabama A&M last season. Southern, while no stranger to game with TSU, will be playing its first-ever game at the JMC. TSU and Southern have played 38 times previously, including a 41-34 SU victory last season in Louisiana.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN: Southern started the season by challenging Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Houston on the road. The Jags managed only 252 yards of offense while the Cougars piled up 615 in the 55-3 loss. Quarterback Lee Bryant was 22-of-34 for 182 yards through the air and rushed the ball nine times for 40 yards. Receiver Juamorr Stewart grabbed eight balls for 56 yards. The lone points came off the foot of kicker Josh Duran, who connected from 36 yards on his only attempt of the night. On defense, Michael Williams and Joe Manning each netted 12 tackles and a forced fumble.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State picked up its first win over Alabama A&M in three years, going on the road to Huntsville for a 34-13 win on Saturday. It marked the first time in the James Webster Era that the Tigers had opened the season with a victory. TSU gained 399 yards of total offense behind a strong performance from quarterback Antonio Heffner. Heffner, who missed the second part of last season with an injury, returned to complete 16-of-30 passes for 292 yards and a touchdown and rush for 19 yards. The Tigers main back, senior Javarri Williams, rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown while receiver Chris Johnson grabbed six balls for 127 yards. The biggest splash came from University of Louisville transfer JaJuan Spillman, who was named OVC Newcomer of the Week after his performance. He touched the ball only four times, but scored two touchdowns, including on a 65-yard reception and a 94-yard kickoff return.

GAME NOTES: Fresh off a season-opening victory, Southeast Missouri will face the toughest task in program history, when the Redhawks travel to Memorial Stadium to battle the No. 6 ranked Missouri Tigers on Saturday. The teams have played once previously, but that came in the 1936 season - 62 years ago. Southeast Missouri has never played a team as highly ranked as Mizzou. The Tigers have won seven straight and 15 of its last 16 games at home; they are 25-6 there since the 2003 season. SEMO is 1-12 all-time against FBS teams.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri State made things interesting in its season-opener, trailing Division II Southwest Baptist the entire game, before catching up at the end of regulation and winning 35-28 in overtime. The hero of the game was senior quarterback Houston Lillard who was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week. Lillard completed 27-of-39 passes for 387 yards and three second half touchdowns. He hooked up with sophomore Miles Edwards on an 80-yarder with 5:52 to play in regulation to bring the game to three points, and the tandem did the same thing on the second play from scrimmage in overtime to give the Redhawks the win. Edwards finished the game with 10 catches for 204 yards and two touchdowns. It was kicker Doug Spada who tied the game with 1:47 to play, kicking a 47-yarder to knot the game at 28. He also hit a 35-yarder earlier in the game and had five punts for an average of 47.6 yards. Defensively it was junior corner Eddie Calvin who kept Southeast in the game in the first half. Calvin picked off the SBU offense three times in the first 30 minutes. That was just one interception off the OVC single-game record; after one week Calvin now leads all FCS players in pickoffs. Calvin finished the game with seven tackles and a pass break-up to go along with his trio of picks.

SCOUTING MISSOURI: The Tigers are coming off an exciting 52-42 win over No. 20 Illinois last Saturday at the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis. Missouri fell behind briefly in the second quarter, Tiger All-American Jeremy Maclin took the ensuing kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown and a lead the team would not relinquish. Heisman candidate Chase Daniel completed 26-of-45 passes for 323 yards and three scores while Chase Coffman pulled down nine catches for 120 yards and a score. Tommy Saunders added six catches, two of which were touchdowns. On the ground Derrick Washington rushed for 130 yards (6.8 yards/carry) and two scores.
