THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

After the OVC went 5-3 in week one of the 2009 season, week No. 2 saw OVC schools compile a 3-5 record...After a bye week to start the season Tennessee Tech opened the 2009 campaign with a 51-10 win over Pikeville College on Thursday...On Saturday Eastern Illinois shutout Indiana State (and has outscored two opponents this season by a combined 62-6) and Tennessee State beat rival and SWAC favorite Jackson State at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis...Jacksonville State almost made the biggest splash of the day, holding a 9-7 lead over Florida State for most of the contest in Tallahassee; but FSU scored twice in the final minute of play to win 19-9 and send Jax State to its second straight loss to an ACC opponent...Murray State (at N.C. State) and Southeast Missouri (at No. 23 Cincinnati) also lost to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents on Saturday...Three OVC players are currently ranked first nationally in a statistical category: Southeast Missouri's Doug Spada (45.80 yards/punt), Eastern Kentucky's Jeremy Caldwell (2.00 interceptions/game) and Austin Peay's Terrence Holt (236.00 all-purpose yards/game)...This week features the first batch of Conference games, as Eastern Illinois travels to Southeast Missouri and Tennessee Tech plays at two-time defending champion Eastern Kentucky...Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State remain ranked in the Top 25 polls, with ECU being No. 22 in the Sports Network poll and No. 23 in the FCS Coaches Poll; Jacksonville State is No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 24 in the Sports Network poll...Eastern Illinois is right outside the Top 25 in each poll and should enter the poll with a win this weekend.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Ryan Perrilloux, QB • Sr., 6-3, 223 • LaPlace, La. • Jacksonville State

Perrilloux had the Gamecocks to within 35 seconds of upsetting Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) power Florida State after throwing for 213 yards and one touchdown on Saturday. His 28-yard touchdown pass to Jamal Young early in the first quarter gave JSU a 6-0 lead of the Seminoles. Overall Perrilloux completed 12 passes and rushed for 39 net yards for the game. He has now thrown for 200 yards nine times during his career (seven as a Gamecock) and in four of his last five starts. Perrilloux has at least one passing touchdown pass in 11 of his 12 games at Jax State. He was making his season debut for the Gamecocks after being suspended for the season-opener at Georgia Tech.

DEFENSIVE

Jawaan Booker, DB • So., 5-11, 180 • Lanet, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Booker led a Gamecock defense that limited the high-powered Florida State offense to just 78 yards rushing after leading the team with eight tackles, including four solo stops as the Gamecocks were just 35 seconds away from upsetting the Seminoles. Booker finished the contest with two fumble recoveries, including one in the third quarter that stopped a Florida State drive on the JSU 1-yard line. He also recorded another fumble on FSU's opening drive of the fourth quarter as the Gamecocks held on to a 9-7 lead before eventually falling 19-9. Booker now ranks second nationally in fumble recoveries per game (1.50).

SPECIALIST

Austin Signor, K • Sr., 6-4, 216 • Urbandale, Iowa • Eastern Illinois

Signor made 1-of-2 field goal attempts (hitting from 31 and missing from 44 yards) in Eastern Illinois' 31-0 road win over Indiana State. He averaged 68 yards on kickoffs as he sailed three of the five into the end zone for touchbacks.

NEWCOMER

Mon Williams, RB • Jr., 6-2, 220 • Mesquite, Texas • Eastern Illinois

Williams carried the ball 15 times for 113 yards (7.5 yards/carry) and two touchdowns as Eastern Illinois went on the road and topped Indiana State 31-0. It marked his first 100-yard game of his EIU career after transferring from Florida. Williams scored two touchdowns on the day, the first from 54 yards to put the Panthers up 21-0 and the final from 30 yards out in the third quarter. After two weeks of the season, Williams is averaging 100.00 yards/game, which ranks 17th nationally.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Teams Among FBS Opponents: OVC schools are 0-5 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) opponents, although two of those games went down to the wire with a chance for the OVC team to pull off a win. In week No. 1 Eastern Kentucky had the ball on Indiana's 5-yard line before a fumble ended what looked like to be a for-sure scoring drive. IU held on for a 19-13 victory. During week No. 2 Jacksonville State led Florida State 9-7 for most of the contest before the Seminoles came up with two scores in the final 35 seconds to win 19-9. This week UT Martin will battle FBS Memphis. All-time the OVC is 17-126-1 against FBS opponents. The last time an OVC team knocked off a FBS school was during the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28.

NCAA Stat Leaders: Three OVC players are at the top of an NCAA statistical category after two weeks of play. Southeast Missouri senior punter **Doug Spada** leads the nation in punting (45.8 yards/punt), Eastern Kentucky sophomore defensive back **Jeremy Caldwell** leads all FCS players in interceptions (2.00/game) while Austin Peay junior running back **Terrence Holt** leads the country in all-purpose yards (236.0/game). Some other individuals that rank high in the rankings include Jacksonville State's **Jawaan Booker** (second with 1.50 fumble recoveries/game) and Murray State's **Derrick Townsel** (third in punt return yardage with 23.33/return). In team rankings, there are 12 statistical categories that the OVC has a team or teams ranked first. That includes pass defense (UT Martin, 50.5 yards/game), scoring defense (Eastern Illinois, 3.0 points/game), net punting (Tennessee Tech, 42.50 yards/punt), kickoff returns (Tennessee Tech, 33.0 yards/return), fumbles recovered (Jacksonville State, 6), fumbles lost (Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech, 0), interceptions thrown (Eastern Kentucky, 0), turnovers lost (Tennessee Tech, 0), pass efficiency defense (Tennessee Tech, 58.11), sacks allowed (UT Martin, Tennessee Tech, 0), fourth down conversion defense (Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee Tech, 0.0%) and red zone offense (Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, UT Martin, 100%).

Large Crowds: Several OVC teams have played in front of large crowds this season. That includes Jacksonville State who played in front of 71,420 fans at Florida State on Sept. 12. That marked the fifth largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play. On the same day Murray State played in front of 55,510 at N.C. State, the 39th time an OVC team had played in front of more than 50,000 fans. A large crowd is expected when Tennessee State plays Florida A&M at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta on Sept. 26, Eastern Illinois plays at Penn State on Oct. 10 and when Tennessee Tech plays at Georgia on Nov. 7 and Eastern Kentucky plays at Kentucky on the same day.

Murray State's Harris Named National Specialist of the Week: Murray State junior **Marcus Harris** was honored by The Sports Network on Sept. 7 as the FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week. Harris was honored after becoming the first Racer to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game. He accomplished the task by taking a kickoff back 86 yards with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter to put the Racers ahead 52-10. After hauling in a 13-yard touchdown reception on the next Racers' possession, Harris fielded a punt on his own 25 and raced untouched up the middle for the 75-yard touchdown. Harris finished the game with 83 yards on two punt returns and 125 yards on two kickoff returns. He added 17 yard receiving and finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards.

The Safety Dance: No we are not talking about the Men Without Hats song, but the Murray State defense. In the Racers season-opening victory over Kentucky Wesleyan, the defense recorded two safeties which tied the OVC (and Murray State) single-game record done three other times (most recently in 1996 by Middle Tennessee). To put it into perspective on how rare that is, only two OVC schools have had two safeties during an entire season over the last four years.

Eastern Kentucky Tabbed Preseason Favorite: In what was one of the most balanced votes in the history of preseason OVC balloting (five different teams got at least one first-place votes), defending champion Eastern Kentucky was tabbed the preseason favorite by the league head coaches and sports information directors. EKU received 10 of the 18 first-place votes followed by UT Martin (4 first-place votes), Eastern Illinois (2), Tennessee State (1) and Murray State (1). It marks the 17th time that the Colonels have been picked to win the OVC Championship in the preseason poll. But is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 30 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (40.0%). In each of the last six years, the predicted champion has failed to claim the regular season title. The last time the preseason predicted champion went on to win the title was in 2002 when Eastern Illinois accomplished the feat (EIU also did that same thing in 2001).

Thompson and Lane Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: UT Martin senior quarterback **Cade Thompson**, the 2008 OVC Offensive Player, was tabbed the Preseason Player of the Year this season after throwing for 2,680 yards and 24 touchdowns as a junior. Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** was picked as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in both sacks (1.0) and tackles-for-loss (1.83) per game last season. Those two players led the selections of this season's Preseason All-OVC Teams. Murray State had six selections to the team, the most of any OVC school. The Racers were followed by UT Martin who had five selections and Jacksonville State who had four picks. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (8 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2008. Of the 26 total selections, 21 were seniors (including the entire offensive unit), four were juniors and there was one sophomore pick. All nine teams had at least one player appear on the squad.

Head Coaches All Return: For the first time since the 2004 season, every head coach in the OVC returns to coach the same team they did last season. All nine coaches are back including the Dean of OVC Coaches, **Bob Spoo** of Eastern Illinois. Spoo is beginning his 22nd season on the sidelines with the Panthers in 2009 (23rd season overall after missing 2006 with an illness). Spoo is the fifth longest active tenured head coach at the Division I level (tied with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer) and trails only Joe Paterno (at Penn State since 1966), Bob Ford (at Albany since 1973), Bobby Bowden (at Florida State since 1976) and Andy Talley (at Villanova since 1985).

Jacksonville State Ineligible for OVC Championship/Postseason Play: In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State University received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship. Jacksonville State will still play a full Conference schedule in 2009 with wins and losses counting for both teams. They will just not be eligible for the title and will be listed at the bottom of the standings with an asterisk.

JSU's Perrilloux on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Jacksonville State senior quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award is presented to the FCS Offensive Player of the Year. The All-OVC second-team selection last season completed 187-of-297 for 2,318 yards in 2008, which was the third-highest in school history. His 140.88 passing efficiency was ranked 27th nationally and his 244.18 yards of total offense ranked him 28th nationally. The LaPlace, La, native was named OVC Player or Newcomer of the Week seven times during the 2008 season after he led the Gamecocks to an 8-3 record. He enters his senior season as the school's career leader in completion percentage (63.0), passing yards per game (210.7) and total offense per game (244.2). The watch list will be revised in October and again in November before the final ballot is announced. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night prior to the NCAA Division I championship game. The Eddie Robinson Award (top FCS Coach) and Buck Buchanan Award (top FCS Defensive Player) will also be presented that night.

Murray State's Lane on Buck Buchanan Award Watch Lists: Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, honors the

best defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award is named after Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame, defensive lineman who played for Grambling State from 1959 through 1962. He was selected to the NFL's All-Time Roster, indicative of his standing as one of the greatest football players of all time. Buchanan died of cancer July 16, 1992. His uniform number, 86, was retired by Kansas City in 1992. Lane has garnered national attention after putting together a 2008 campaign that consisted of school records in sacks (12.0) and tackles-for-loss (22.0), both of which ranked among the national leaders. The efforts earned him Sporting News Fabulous 50 All-America honors, as well as Third-Team All-America honors from the *Associated Press*. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night before the NCAA Division I championship game. The Walter Payton Award and the Eddie Robinson Award will also be presented that night.

Six OVC Schools Have Former FBS Quarterbacks Under Center This Season: This season there are currently six OVC schools with at least one former Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) quarterback competing for the starting job. Three of the quarterbacks are for sure the starter, including **Ryan Perrilloux** (LSU) starting for the second year at Jacksonville State and 2008 OVC Player of the Year **Cade Thompson** (South Carolina) starting for the third year at UT Martin. Two other schools have a pair of former FBS signal callers on the depth chart. That includes Eastern Illinois who has **Jake Christensen** (Iowa) as the starter and **Bodie Reeder** (Wyoming) as the backup while Tennessee Tech who has **Lee Sweeney** (Louisville) and **Clint Brewster** (Minnesota) battling for the job. At Tennessee State **Dominic Grooms** (Missouri) is in the mix at quarterback while **T.C. Jennings** (Arkansas State) is in the mix at Austin Peay.

Murray State/UT Martin Game Picked as FCS Game of the Week Radio Broadcast: The Murray State at UT Martin football game on Oct. 24 has been selected for the FCS Game of the Week radio broadcast as announced by David Brody, president and co-founder of Broadcaster Marketing Services. This marks the fourth year for the FCS Game of the Week series. The games are brought to the public by Clear Channel Communications, Gino Communications and Broadcaster Marketing Services and heard on WCKY AM 1530 out of Cincinnati. Frank Santore returns for his fourth year as play-by-play voice.

FCS Playoffs: For the 13th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 18 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 28 and continue with second round games on Dec. 5 and semifinal contests on Dec. 11/Dec. 12 before the title game. This will mark the final year under the 16-team playoff format. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved a new budget for the Division I Football Championships, which allowed the postseason bracket to expand from 16 to 20 teams beginning in the 2010 season. It marks the first expansion since the playoff field grew from 12 to 16 in 1997. In 2010, the field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8 now) and 10 at-large berths (up from 8 now).

FCS Playoffs - Part 2: The OVC will be looking to get multiple teams into the FCS Playoffs for the third time in four years this season. Last year marked the first time since 2005 that just one OVC team (league champion Eastern Kentucky) made the 16-team playoff field. Two other teams (Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) finished with eight Division I victories but did not receive an at-large bid. It marked the first time since the playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986 that an OVC team with eight Division I teams did not receive an at-large bid. ECU lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round last season.

2009 Marks Third Season For Sgt. York Trophy: The 2009 season marks the third season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2009 to claim its second trophy; the Tigers are 5-1 all-time in Sgt. York games. The first Sgt. York contest of 2009 will be on Oct. 3 when Austin Peay visits Tennessee Tech. The final will be the

Eastern Kentucky Searches For 32nd Consecutive Winning Season, 37th Consecutive Non-Losing Season: Eastern Kentucky enters the 2009 season looking for its 32nd consecutive winning season. The team's current streak of 31 consecutive winning season is second in Division I only to the 32-straight by Florida State. Eastern has not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 in 1977. The Colonels also have now had 36 consecutive non-losing seasons, as you have to go back all the way to 1972 to find a year ECU had a losing season (they were 5-6 that year, the only time in the last 42 years they have had a losing season). That streak is currently the longest in all of Division I, as the team overtook Michigan who suffered a losing season for the first time in 41 years in 2008.

The 62nd Season of Football: The 62nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football is underway this season. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2009. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the OVC have claimed at least one championship.

A Look Back at the 2008 Season: For the first time in 61 years of competition, the OVC finished the 2008 season with four teams with eight overall victories. The OVC was one of just two FCS conferences to have four or more teams with eight wins (the CAA was the other, who had five teams reach eight or more wins; each of those five CAA teams made the playoffs while only one OVC school made the field). Eastern Kentucky claimed its 20th OVC Championship (the second most crowns in FCS history trailing only the CAA's UMass who has 21; however, ECU's 16 outright conference crowns are the most in FCS history) and second in a row. The Colonels made their 19th FCS Playoff berth (tied for most all-time with Montana) and lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC and SportsUnlimited Announce Launch of OVC Football Magazine: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced the launch and production of "Ohio Valley Conference Football 2009" a full-color, limited edition football magazine that previews the 2009 football season. The venture with SportsUnlimited ships in late August. Detailed feature articles on all nine OVC teams are included in the publication. For the first time, OVC football will be featured in a full-color magazine dedicated to its nine schools and suitable for display on your coffee table year round. To order your copy log onto www.collegesportsmags.com. The cost of the publication is \$4.99 plus tax and shipping.

OVCsports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first three seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2009 season, 15 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the season (12 active, 2 practice squad members, one IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout **Tony Romo**, who is the starting quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys and two-time Pro Bowl pick, defensive back **Cortland Finnegan** (Samford) who was a Pro Bowl selection with the Tennessee Titans last year and Tennessee State's **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who was a starter with the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII in February. There is one player on a NFL roster who played in the OVC last season, **Pierre Walters** (Eastern Illinois) who is with the Kansas City Chiefs. **Javarri Williams** (Tennessee State) is also with the Chiefs but as a member of the practice squad to start the season, as is former Tennessee State offensive lineman **Cecil Newton** who is on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad.. Six of nine current OVC schools have at least one player on a NFL roster with Southeast Missouri State leading the way with three. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - **Brad Childress** (Minnesota) and **Sean Payton** (New Orleans). Another EIU alumni - **Mike Shanahan** - is out of coaching this year but should be back with a team in 2010. UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach **Jerry Reese** made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to the Super Bowl XLII Championship in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 91 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (68) is second followed by UT Martin (48) and Murray State (44). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2009 season marks the third of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games.

GAME NOTES: Murray State return to the FCS ranks this week for its first game against a similar team this year. The Racers opened the year with Division II Kentucky Wesleyan and played Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe North Carolina State last week. Murray State will play Missouri State for the fifth time in history and first since 1985. In that contest Murray State came out on top 36-21 in Springfield. Saturday's contest will actually be the third straight in the series held in Springfield. Overall Murray State has outscored the Bears 109-48 in the four all-time contests (all held between 1982 and 1985).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State was overmatched in its trip to FBS North Carolina State on Saturday, falling 65-7 to the Wolfpack at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh. N.C. State scored three first quarter touchdowns and three more plus a field goal in the second quarter to lead 45-0 at the break. The Wolfpack had 484 yards of total offense on the day while Murray State was held to just 36 total yards, including one yard net rushing. Marcus Harris, who was last week's National Special Teams Player of the Week, had a rush for 18 yards to lead the running attack and also caught a pass for five yards. He also returned eight kickoffs for 167 total yards and finished the day with 190 all-purpose yards. Through two games this season Harris is sixth nationally in all-purpose yards/game (207.50). Murray State finally got on the board in the fourth quarter when backup quarterback Nico Yantko hooked up with Daniel Ard for a 2-yard touchdown pass to complete a 12-play, 57-yard drive. The Racers had failed to score a touchdown against both FBS opponents (Indiana, Western Kentucky) a season ago. Zach Kutch led the Racers with 11 tackles (7 solo) while Buchanan Award Candidate Austen Lane had three tackles and a sack. That marked his 36th career tackle-for-loss, which moved him into second on the Racer career list (tied with Chris Vaughn). He needs only eight more to take over the MSU career record. He now has 19 career sacks, just nine away from the Racer all-time record.

SCOUTING MISSOURI STATE: Missouri State will be playing its second straight game against an OVC opponent, having topped UT Martin 24-14 at Plaster Field this past Saturday. The Bears scored the games first 10 points and led 17-7 at halftime before holding off the Skyhawk comeback attempt. Missouri State had a very balanced rushing attack, combining for 185 yards and three different backs scored a touchdown including quarterback Cody Kirby who was 9-for-16 for 103 yards through the air as well. The Bears defense held curb the UTM attack while Adam Beauchamp leading the way with 10 tackles.

GAME NOTES: This matchup marks one of two OVC games to be played this weekend. Eastern Illinois will travel to Southeast Missouri for the 17th meeting between the two squads. Eastern Illinois won 24-21 in Charleston last season, as Travorus Bess rushed for 124 yards and fullback Desmin Ward scored three touchdowns to lead the EIU attack. Eastern Illinois has won five in a row in the all-time series, with Southeast Missouri last winning 30-17 in the 2003 season. This will be the second straight road game for EIU who is playing three in a row before a home game on Oct. 3. Southeast Missouri is 4-14 all-time in OVC openers. The two teams have previously met twice in the Conference opener for each school, with EIU coming out on top both times.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois improved to a perfect 2-0 with a 31-0 victory over regional rival Indiana State on Saturday. In two games this season the Panthers have outscored their opponents 62-6 and currently rank first nationally in scoring defense (3.0 points/game). EIU has allowed only 22.0 rushing yards/game, a mark that ranks them fourth nationally. Overall the team is third nationally in total defense (140.5 yards/game). On the other hand the Panthers have excelled at rushing the ball, ranking 12th nationally in rushing offense (217.5 yards/game). Against Indiana State the Panthers outgained the Sycamores 370-95 for the game as Mon Williams carried the ball 15 times for 113 yards (7.5 ypc) and two touchdowns. That performance earned Williams OVC Newcomer of the Week honors. Quarterback Jake Christensen had his second solid performance, completing 14-of-19 passes for 145 yards and a touchdown. In two games with the Panthers, Christensen has completed 68.3 percent of his passes for 312 yards and four touchdowns. His 159.53 passing efficiency ranks him 20th nationally in that category. Austin Signor was named OVC Specialist of the Week after connecting on a 31-yard field goal and averaging 68 yards per kickoff as three of the five went into the end zone as touchbacks. Eastern Illinois is poised to break into the Top 25 with a victory this week. The Panthers are unofficially 26th in the Sports Network poll (just 26 points out of 25th place) and are 28th in the FCS Coaches Poll (25 points out of 25th place).

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: After a season-opening 72-3 win over Quincy, Southeast Missouri faced one of the top FBS teams in the country, losing 70-3 at No. 23 ranked Cincinnati. After not having to punt against Quincy, senior All-American punter Doug Spada had to punt 10 times and averaged 45.8 yards per punt (with a long of 57). That average is good enough to rank him No. 1 nationally. Henry Harris rushed for 41 yards for the Redhawks and quarterback Matt Scheible completed 15-of-27 passes for 123 yards. Southeast Missouri is now 1-14 against FBS teams, having lost nine in a row to those teams. After Walter Peoples went over 1,000 career receiving yards in the team's opener, Miles Edwards joined him during this game, with a 17-yard catch in the first quarter.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State travels to Huntsville for the first time since the 2003 season to take on in-state rival Alabama A&M. The two teams renewed their old rivalry a season ago in Jacksonville, as the Gamecocks came out on top 45-18. In that contest Jax State scored 24 second quarter points to break open a tight game. Daniel Jackson carried the ball 15 times for 115 yards and a score while Ryan Perrilloux completed 11-of-17 passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for another score. The two teams have played 25 times previously, with Jacksonville State winning 21 of the matchups. JSU has won three in a row and 12 of the last 13 in the series.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State enters the week ranked No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 24 in the Sports Network Poll. Jacksonville State will play its third straight road game (out of four in a row to start the season) and first game against a FCS opponent this year after opening the season with two games against ACC foes. This past week it was a game at Florida State where the Gamecocks came within 35 seconds of making a national impression and pulling the upset. In a pouring rain storm, JSU's Jamal Young caught a 28-yard touchdown pass from Perrilloux four minutes into the game to put the Gamecocks up 6-0 (after a missed PAT). Florida State took the lead later in the quarter on a touchdown run but JSU regained the lead with 7:47 to play in the second quarter on a 37-yard field goal by Patrick Tatum. Jax State would hold that advantage until 35 seconds left in the game when Ty Jones scored on a 1-yard run. FSU would score 14 seconds later on a JSU fumble to make the final margin 10 points. Perrilloux was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after completing 12-of-27 passes for 213 yards and the touchdown; he also rushed for 39 yards despite being sacked seven times. On defense, Jawaan Booker was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after making eight tackles and recovering two fumbles. He was part of the Gamecock defense that limited FSU to just 78 yards rushing on the night. The game was played in front of 71,420 fans, the largest crowd to ever see a JSU football game and the fifth highest to ever watch an OVC team.

SCOUTING ALABAMA A&M: Alabama A&M has started the season 2-0 with a 24-7 victory over OVC foe Tennessee State and a 31-24 win over Hampton at home this past weekend. It marked the first win over a MEAC school for A&M since 1979. In the game, senior wideout Thomas Harris was named SWAC Offensive Player of the Week after pulling down 10 catches for 224 yards and two touchdowns. LeMarcus Coker had 334 all-purpose yards on the night, rushing for 122 yards, adding 64 yards on receptions and 148 on kickoff returns including taking the opening kickoff 87 yards for a score to open the game. On defense Willie Fuller had five tackles and 3.5 sacks (for -32 yards) to disrupt the Hampton offense.

GAME NOTES: After playing last season in the John Merritt Classic in Nashville, the series shifts back to Baton Rouge this season. The two teams are lacing up the cleats for the 40th time against each other. Last season TSU won an exciting 34-32 contest that saw Antonio Heffner complete 23-of-29 passes for 315 yards and three touchdowns and Javarris Williams rush for 87 yards and two touchdowns. Southern won the 2007 meeting at home (41-34), which was the first meeting between the schools since 1996.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: After falling to SWAC opponent Alabama A&M 24-7 in the season opener the Tigers bounced back by topping a SWAC opponent in Jackson State on Saturday night at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. The game marked the 20th Annual Southern Heritage Classic and gave TSU its seventh straight victory over Jackson State. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Calvin McNairl was named MVP of the event after carrying the ball 14 times for 107 yards and a touchdown, including a 54-yard rush in the fourth quarter that set up the Tigers final score of the game. In his first start of the season at quarterback, McNairl completed 4-of-11 passes for 43 yards and TSU rushed the ball 4 times for 217 total yards. It was the Tennessee State defense who came up big at the end of the game, holding off a late JSU rally. Jackson State scored with 4:25 to go in the game and after a three-and-out drive got the ball back with 2:42 to play. Jackson State marched down to the TSU 8-yard line before Justin Bather intercepted a Dedric McDonald pass attempt to end the game. Newcomer John Jones, a transfer from Florida, led Tennessee State with eight tackles (6 solo) and two tackles-for-loss on the evening. He made a crucial open-field tackle in the third quarter to help save the game. Anthony Levine had a 51-yard interception return that set up the Tigers first score of the game.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN: The Jaguars opened the 2009 campaign with a 42-19 loss to FBS Louisiana-Lafayette and followed that up with a 68-0 win over Central State (Ohio) at home last week. In that contest Bryant Lee passed for 220 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Southern offense that racked up 592 yards on the night. The Jaguar offense limited the Division II team to just 44 total yards of defense on the night. SU had 349 rushing yards for the game, with Brian Threat leading the way with a career-high 122 yards and two touchdowns on 17 carries. The margin of victory was the largest in 17 years under head coach Pete Richardson.

GAME NOTES: One of two Conference matchups this weekend, this week's matchup pits the two teams who have already had bye weeks so far this season. The two teams have played 65 times previously with EKU winning 48 of those contests. The Colonels have won the last two and seven of the last eight overall. A season ago EKU won 33-12 in Cookeville as Aaron Bradley rushed for 46 yards and two touchdowns and quarterback Cody Watts completed 6-of-7 passes for 86 yards and at touchdown in relief of an injured Allan Holland. Kicker Taylor Long was also busy making four field goals for Eastern.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: After a bye week to open the season, Tennessee Tech finally got to play last Thursday night, overmatching Pikeville College 51-10 at home. The Golden Eagles rushed for 256 yards as Dontey Gay tallied a career-best 88 yards (and two touchdowns), Tremaine Hudson had 86 yards and Jimmie Blair netted 62 yards (and a score). Senior quarterback Lee Sweeney was nearly perfect, completing 14-of-18 passes for 187 yards and a touchdown. Sweeney's touchdown strike was the 37th of his TTU career, putting him one shy of the career record of 38 held by Robert Craft. Sweeney's 183.38 passer rating after one game is the fifth-best nationally. Henry Sailes did a little of everything, rushing for 25 yards, netting 25 receiving yards and picking up 48 yards on punt returns (98 all-purpose yards on the night). On defense Brendon Fisher and Dustin Dillehay each picked up the first interceptions of their careers, as both picks led to Tech touchdowns.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: After a 19-13 loss at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Indiana to open the season (Sept. 3), Eastern Kentucky has been off, giving them 16 days between matchups. The Colonels had the ball on the Indiana 5-yard line early in the fourth quarter but Cody Watts was stripped of the ball while going in for the game-tying score. The Colonels had one more chance two possessions later, when freshman T.J. Pryor led the team down the field and his Hail Mary pass into the end zone as time expired was touched by an EKU player but knocked down. Pryor led Eastern with 37 rushing yards and completed 5-of-10 passes for 107 yards while under center. Watts, making the move back to quarterback after playing wide receiver for most of last season, completed 12-of-16 passes for 171 yards and a score. Both Evan Cromer (124 yards) and Garnett Phelps (104 yards) racked up 100 or more receiving yards on the night. Defensively sophomore Jeremy Caldwell was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after netting six tackles and two interceptions. Dating back to 2008, Eastern Kentucky has forced at least two opponent turnovers in eight straight contests. The EKU defense held IU to 137 yards and no points in the second half after the Hoosiers had 262 yards and 19 points in the first two quarters. EKU is ranked No. 22 in the Sports Network poll this week and No. 23 in the FCS Coaches Top 25 poll.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and Illinois State are meeting for only the second time in the programs long history. The two schools played during the 1990 season with the Redbirds coming out on top 13-9.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay traveled to Youngstown State on Saturday to battle former OVC foe YSU for the first time since 1987. Early on it was all APSU, as Ricky Thomas blocked a Penguin punt on the fourth play from scrimmage and Adrian Mines recovered in the end zone to put the Gobs up 7-0. It marked the fifth time in his career that Thomas had blocked a kick. After Youngstown State connected on a field goal, Austin Peay pulled ahead 14-3 on a Trent Caffee 1-yard run with 9:13 to play before halftime. YSU would then respond with touchdown on back-to-back possession to take the league for good at 17-14 entering halftime. After rushing for more than 300 yards a week ago against Newberry, APSU was limited to just 64 yards on 41 carries by YSU. Junior running back Terrence Holt was limited to just eight yards rushing and 11 yards receiving but did manage 156 kickoff yards, although he only averaged 22.3 yards per return. Holt still leads the nation in all-purpose yards, averaging 236.0 per game this season. Kit Hartsfield and Daniel Becker each tallied 10 tackles on the night while Hartsfield also forced a fumble.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE: Illinois State is still searching for its first victory under first-year head coach Brock Spack, a former assistant coach at Eastern Illinois for Bob Spoo. The Redbirds lost to EIU in its season opener and last week dropped a 45-17 decision to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Illinois. In place of injured starter Drew Kiel, redshirt freshman Matt Brown completed 27-of-47 passes for 312 yards and two scores, marking the first 300-plus passing effort for the team since 2006. Nine different ISU players caught at least one pass with Eyad Salem catching a team-best seven balls for 103 yards. Defensively Kelvin Hemphill led Illinois State with 14 tackles.

GAME NOTES: With the two west Tennessee schools separated by just two and a half hours, you would think they may have played each other more over the years. Well when UT Martin travels to the Liberty Bowl on Saturday night, it will be the first matchup between the two schools since 1932. UT Martin (then known as Hall-Moody) won the first two meetings in the all-time series in 1924 and 1925 before Memphis (then known as West Tennessee State Teachers College) won four straight between 1928 and 1932.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin suffered its first defeat of the season on Saturday, traveling to Missouri State and losing 24-14. The Skyhawks are now 0-6 all-time against MSU (all of which have come since 1996). The injured-bug bit UTM as offensive stars Mike Hicks, Brandyn Young and Jason McNair all suffered or aggravated injuries which limited their action. Running back Miguel Barnes carried the majority of the load for UT Martin, rushing 18 times for 83 yards. Young scored a touchdown before his injury and Tevin Barkdsale added the Skyhawks last score of the night. Preseason OVC Player of the Year Cade Thompson completed 22-of-35 passes for 196 yards, with Eunique Williams pulling in five catches for 53 yards and Stephen Shiver grabbing four receptions for 57 yards. The game may have been a little closer had UTM had more success in the kicking game, however, the Skyhawks had their first attempt of the night blocked and attempts from 33 and 38 yards in the second half were missed. Linebacker Josh Bey had 12 tackles, a fumble recovery and a sack to key the UTM defense, which limited MSU to 288 yards (while UTM had 323 yards for the game). Jonathan Utley added 10 tackles, including three tackles-for-loss, and had an interception.

SCOUTING MEMPHIS: The Tigers are 0-2 on the season after a 45-14 loss to nationally-ranked Ole Miss at home to start the season and a 31-14 road loss to in-state foe Middle Tennessee this past weekend. T.J. Pitts led the Tigers with 40 yards of rushing at MTSU while Curtis Steele added 29 yards and a touchdown that tied the game at 7-7 in the first quarter. But the Blue Raiders then ran off 24 unanswered points to put the game out of reach. Quarterback Arkelon Hall completed 13-of-22 passes for 93 yards and backup Tyler Bass entered the game to complete all four of his pass attempts for 33 yards. The Tiger defense was led by Greg Jackson who had eight tackles.
