THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Ohio Valley Conference schools combined for a 5-2 record in seven games last week, as Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin all picked up victories...So far this season the OVC is 7-4 against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) competition and 11-13 overall in non-conference action through three weeks of play...Tennessee State finished a 3-game run against SWAC competition by topping Jackson State 41-18 at the Southern Heritage Classic in Memphis; the Tigers are now 3-0 and cracked its first Top 25 poll of the season on Monday when it entered the Sports Network poll at No. 25...Eastern Illinois also remains in the Top 25, giving the OVC two nationally-ranked teams...Tennessee Tech topped Southeast Missouri State on Thursday night to improve to 2-1 on the year and 1-0 in the first OVC game of the season...This week two other Conference games will be played, as last year's champion Eastern Kentucky plays at Tennessee State and UT Martin travels to Austin Peay...The UT Martin/Austin Peay contest is the first in six Sgt. York Trophy games this season; that trophy is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee...Other games include Chattanooga at Jacksonville State, Missouri State at Southeast Missouri, Murray State at Western Kentucky, Eastern Illinois at Illinois State and Tennessee Tech at Western Michigan...Three OVC players currently rank No. 1 in their respective categories among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams; Southeast Missouri State punter Doug Spada is first nationally in punting (49.87 yards/punt), Tennessee Tech kicker Justin Kraemer is first in field goals made (2.00/game) and Murray State senior linebacker Nathan Williams is first in tackles (16.33/game)...Williams had 23 tackles on Saturday against Illinois State, the highest single-game total among all FCS players this year; he was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network for his performance.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Henry Sailes, RB • So., 5-7, 165 • Palmetto, Fla. • Tennessee Tech

Sailes had the first 100-yard rushing game of his career in Tennessee Tech's 29-27 win at Southeast Missouri to open Conference play last Thursday. Sailes rushed for 113 yards on only eight carries (14.1 ypc) and caught six passes for 51 yards to account for 164 all-purpose yards on the night. One of his eight rushes included a 63-yard touchdown run on a reverse in which he reversed field and outran the defense; that play was selected as *SportsCenter's* Play of the Day. One of Sailes' six receptions included a 15-yard play that took the ball to the two-yard line, where TTU scored the winning touchdown on the next play.

DEFENSIVE

Nathan Williams, LB • R-Sr., 6-1, 225 • Murray, Ky. • Murray State

Williams had one of the best defensive performances of the year nationally when he recorded 23 tackles, a sack and recovered a fumble in the Racers' loss to Illinois State on Saturday. The 23 tackles was a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) single-game high for 2008 and just three tackles short of the MSU school record of 26 set during the 1969 season. Through three games this season, Williams' 16.3 tackles per game ranks first nationally.

SPECIALIST

Justin Kraemer, K • So., 5-7, 170 • Smyrna, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

Kraemer scored 11 of Tennessee Tech's 29 points in the Golden Eagles' 29-27 road win over Southeast Missouri last Thursday night. Kraemer kicked a career-best three field goals, including a career-long 51-yarder just two seconds before halftime to give his team a three-point lead. The 51-yard field goal was the second longest in school history. Kraemer also connected from 37 and 45 yards on the night and kicked two PAT's.

CO-NEWCOMER

Henry Harris, RB • So., 5-8, 185 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Playing in his first game of the season, the University of Memphis transfer carried the ball 14 times for 70 yards and a touchdown in Southeast Missouri's two-point loss to Tennessee Tech. Harris also returned a kickoff 22 yards and had a reception to account for 96 all-purpose yards on the night.

CO-NEWCOMER

Daryl Bourne, RB • Fr., 5-10, 175 • Hattiesburg, Miss. • UT Martin

Bourne recorded his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game on the season, as he carried the ball 10 times for 111 yards (11.1 ypc) and a touchdown in the Skyhawks' 87-21 win over Concordia (Ala.). His touchdown came on a 57-yard run in the third quarter.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

First Sgt. York Game of 2008 to Be Played on Saturday: The first of six Sgt. York Trophy games for the 2008 season will be played on Saturday when UT Martin travels to Austin Peay. The 2008 season marks the second for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). Last summer the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. Last season Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records. Both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee Tech and UT Martin each finished 1-2 in the series during the year.

Williams Named National Defensive Player of the Week; Also Ranks as National Leader in Tackles: Murray State redshirt senior linebacker **Nathan Williams** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network on Sept. 15. The honor came after Williams posted 23 tackles in the Racers game against Illinois State on Sept. 13. That total is the most nationally at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) this season (three more than Dominique Davenport of Coastal Carolina who had 20 in a game on Sept. 7). Williams also had 17 tackles in a game earlier this season; that total ranks fifth nationally for a single-game in 2008. Williams is averaging 16.33 tackles/game through three contests this season, which ranks first nationally.

Hansen Sets OVC Record for Single-Game Extra Points: UT Martin junior kicker **Tom Hansen** set the OVC single-game record for extra points made when he converted on 12 in the Skyhawks 87-21 victory over Concordia (Ala.) on Sept. 11. Hansen broke the record of 10 previously held by four other people, including a 10-make performance by Hansen last year against Murray State. In doing so, Hansen also set the OVC record for consecutive extra points made in a game. For the season Hansen is 21-of-21 on extra points and has made 45 in a row dating back to last season (where he was 42-of-45 overall on PAT's).

Heffner Named National All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News: Tennessee State quarterback **Antonio Heffner** was named one of four National All-Stars of the Week by the *College Sporting News* on Sept. 9 for his performance in the Tigers win over Southern at the John Merritt Classic. Down 11-0 at halftime Heffner led his offense to five straight touchdowns on the first five drives in the second half to give Tennessee State a 34-32 come-from-behind victory and their first victory over Southern in the last three years. The Memphis, Tenn. native would go 23-for-29 passing for 315 yards, completing three touchdown passes (87, 8 and 38 yards) in the first three offensive drives of the second half. He would also add 8 rushes for 68 yards, giving Heffner 383 yards of total offense on the evening.

Strong Start Against FCS Teams: Through two weeks of the regular season, OVC schools have fared well against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) competition. OVC schools have compiled a 4-2 record in six FCS matchups, losing only games which each came against nationally-ranked teams (No. 2 North Dakota State, No. 16 Georgia Southern). The OVC has wins against Alabama A&M (2), Gardner-Webb and Southern. OVC schools are 0-9 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams and 3-0 against non Division I squads.

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OVC Players Among the National Leaders: After two weeks of play, many OVC players rank among the national leaders, including several among the Top 10 nationally. Tennessee State quarterback **Antonio Heffner** ranks second nationally in total offense (347.00/game), fourth in passing yards (303.5/game) and ninth in passing efficiency (168.12). TSU senior receiver **Chris Johnson** is third in total receiving yards (285) and sixth in receiving yards/game (142.5) while TSU junior receiver **JuJuan Spillman** is fourth in kick returns (37.80 yards/return). Southeast Missouri State punter **Doug Spada** is first nationally in punting (50.75 yards/punt) while SEMO quarterback **Houston Lillard** is fifth nationally in passing yards/game.

OVC Schools Play in Front of Large Crowds: OVC schools have played in front of some large crowds this year, including a crowd of 62,305 on Sept. 6 when Southeast Missouri played at No. 6 Missouri. That crowd was the 10th largest ever to see an OVC school play. A crowd of 60,131 saw Eastern Illinois play at No. 24 Illinois, which marked the 13th largest crowd to see an OVC school play. In all, eight games have had a crowd of 20,000 or more this season including 28,830 for a Tennessee State home game against Southern on Sept. 6.

Holt Sets OVC Single-Game Kickoff Return Record: Austin Peay sophomore **Terrence Holt** set the OVC's single-game kickoff yardage record in the opening weekend, returning 250 yards of kicks against No. 2 North Dakota State (Aug. 28). That broke the 11-year old record previously held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin (215 yards against Murray State in 1997). During his freshman season in which he was named an OVC All-Newcomer selection, Holt set the OVC single-season record for kickoff return yardage (1,104).

Williams and Walters Named to Sports Network's Payton and Buchanan Watch Lists: Two Ohio Valley Conference football players found their names among The Sports Network's announcement of the 2008 Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan award watch lists at the end of August. Tennessee State senior running back **Javarris Williams** was named to the Payton list while Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** was named to the Buchanan list. The Payton and Buchanan awards will undergo two revisions, one in October and one in November, before ballots are sent out to a panel of sports information directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries on Nov. 24. The Sports Network awards banquet will be held Dec. 18 in Chattanooga, Tenn., on the eve of before the NCAA Division I national championship game. The Payton Award goes to the FCS national player of the year, with the Buchanan Award honoring the FCS national defensive player of the year. The Eddie Robinson Award, which goes to the FCS national coach of the year will also be awarded that night. The Robinson Award ballot will be announced in November. The Sports Network established the Payton and Robinson awards in 1987, and began sponsoring the Buchanan Award in 1995. Georgia Southern quarterback Jayson Foster was the 2007 Payton Award winner, while Montana defensive end Kroy Biermann took home the Buchanan Award.

football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCSports.TV: For the third consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed nearly a thousand events in its first two years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC Looks to Put Two in Playoffs For Third Straight Season: In 2007, the OVC put multiple teams in the FCS playoffs for the second straight year, which marked the first time since the mid-90s that had occurred. Eastern Illinois and UT Martin were playoff participants in 2006 while Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky were participants last season. The OVC has now put multiple teams in the playoffs in three straight years since 1994-96.

Jacksonville State Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's, Although Three Schools Split First-Place Votes: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head football coaches and sports information directors, Jacksonville State University has been picked as the 2008 preseason favorite in the nine-team league. The Gamecocks claimed the 2003 and 2004 OVC Championships and were tabbed as the favorites for the second time in history (2005 was the other). Although Jax State was tabbed as the favorites, the votes indicated the pollsters predicted this year's race should be extremely tight, as the 18 first-place votes were split evenly amongst three schools. JSU received six first-place votes and were followed by 2007 OVC Champion Eastern Kentucky, who was picked second and also received six first-place votes. Eastern Illinois, who was a 2007 at-large selection for the FCS Playoffs, also garnered six first-place votes and was tabbed third. The three teams were separated by just five points, as preseason favorite Jacksonville State ended up with 113 points, Eastern Kentucky followed with 111 points and Eastern Illinois received 108 points. It marked the closest preseason vote in Ohio Valley Conference history.

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Jacksonville State? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past five seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 29 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (41.4%).

Holland and Walters Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Kentucky senior quarterback **Allan Holland** and Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** were tabbed the 2008 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with the most individual selections (5), following closely by four each from Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. FCS Playoffs: For the 12th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 19 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 29 and continue with second round games on Dec. 6 and semifinal contests on Dec. 12/Dec. 13 before the title game. Last season the OVC had two teams (Eastern Kentucky and Eastern Illinois) make the playoffs.

New Faces: This season one new head coach makes his debut in the OVC. Eastern Kentucky is under the direction of first-year head coach **Dean Hood**, who served as an assistant coach for the Colonels from 1994-98, where the team compiled a 32-6 OVC record and made three FCS playoff appearances. Hood was most recently the defensive coordinator at Wake Forest, where the Demon Deacons made an appearance in the 2006 FedEx Orange Bowl and the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

NFL Connections: As of August 20, 13 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2008 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is former TSU defensive back Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a first round draft pick of the Arizona Cardinals this season. He became only the fourth OVC player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in 2008. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at UT Martin, who also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants prior to the 2007 season. In his first season as GM, Reese led the Giants to the Super Bowl Championship.

NCAA Rule Changes for 2008: There are several rule changes for the 2008 season that will make noticeable effects on the game. Among them are the banning of "horse-collar" tackles, a simplification of chop blocking rules and the elimination of the 5-yard face mask penalty for incidental contact (it will either be a 15-yard penalty or no foul at all). The major rule change involves the play clock which will have both 40 and 25-second settings. Whenever the ball becomes dead, the play clock will reset to 40 seconds and will start immediately. This includes when a runner is down in the field of play or out of bounds, a fumble out of bounds, backward pass out of bounds and after an incomplete pass. After a team has picked up a first down the game clock will stop but the play clock will go to 40 seconds and will start counting down.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 88 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (57) is second followed by UT Martin (36) and Murray State (33). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2008 season marks the second of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State open their OVC seasons this week by meeting for the 22nd time in the history of the series. Eastern Kentucky has dominated the series, winning 19 of the previous 21 meetings including a 49-7 victory in Richmond a season ago. EKU has won eight in a row in the series and has outscored TSU 118-10 over the last three years. The Tigers last won in the series in 1998 and 1999, which were the years that Tennessee State won OVC Championships.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky picked up its first victory of the season on Saturday as they topped Morehead State 16-8 in Richmond. That game was the first meeting between the schools since the 1995 season and was the sixth straight win in a row for the Colonels over the Eagles. Senior quarterback Allan Holland completed 15-of-27 passes for 191 yards in the victory. In the process he moved up to ninth on EKU's all-time career passing list (3,134 yards). He is only six yards away from passing Greg Couch for eighth spot. C.J. Walker scored on a 17-yard run in the third quarter, which was the first rushing touchdown of the season by an EKU running back. Walker finished the game with 58 rushing yards while EKU had 112 as a team. Taylor Long was successful on all three of his field goal attempts, hitting from 22, 22 and 28 yards. Long now ranks fifth nationally with 1.67 field goals made per contest. On defense sophomore Yameen Thomas had five tackles, two sacks and recovered a fumble for the Colonels. Tyjuan Jones added a team-best 10 tackles.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State remained the only OVC with a perfect record this season as they went to a neutral site in Memphis to top Jackson State 41-18 in the Southern Heritage Classic. A crowd of 50,794 saw the Tigers win the contest, which marked the highest single-game attendance among FCS teams this season. TSU is now 3-0, its best start since the 2004 season. With the start came some national attention, as the team has jumped into the Sports Network Top 25 poll after starting the season unranked. The Tigers were last ranked at the end of the 1999 regular season when they were the No. 1 team in the country. Sophomore safety Eugene Clifford had seven tackles (five solo) and intercepted a pass that he returned 43 yards for a touchdown to give TSU a 21-10 lead in the second quarter. Senior quarterback Antonio Heffner was efficient again, completing 11-of-16 passes for 137 yards and a touchdown and rushing for a team-best 48 yards and another touchdown. Heffner ranks sixth nationally in total offense (293 yards/game) while receiver Chris Johnson is ninth nationally in receiving yards per game (114.67). Overall TSU is ninth nationally in pass efficiency (166.69), fifth nationally in punt return yardage defense (1.00 yards/return) and sixth nationally in turnovers gained (8).

GAME NOTES: Dating back to the 1904 season, the Jacksonville State/UTC rivalry is one of the oldest in Gamecock history. The two teams have played 33 times with Chattanooga holding a 25-8 advantage. The teams played every year from 1953 to 1968, and then again 10 times between 1970 and 1983. But a 21-year break ensued and the teams rekindled the series in 2004. Since the series began in 2004, Jax State holds a 3-1 advantage including a 33-19 win at home last season.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State returns to action after a bye week. The Gamecocks opened the season with a loss at Georgia Tech but in their only competition against a fellow subdivision team, they blew out Alabama A&M by a 45-18 margin. In that game Ryan Perrilloux played only the first half, throwing for 144 yards and two touchdowns as JSU evened its record. Also in that contest, senior running back Daniel Jackson rushed for 115 yards and a touchdown in the victory. His touchdown run covered 3 yards and was the fourth of his career. Kicker Gavin Halford connected on a 20-yard field goal against A&M, marking his first make of the season. He is now just 10 made field goals away from the OVC career record. With the win JSU improved to 30-4 overall and 18-2 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. The game was played in front of 16,654, the third highest in Paul Snow Stadium history. JSU currently ranks third nationally in kick return yardage defense, allowing only 11.33 yards per kickoff during the year.

SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA: Three games into the season and UTC has yet to play a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team. The Mocs opened the season at No. 4 Oklahoma (losing 57-2) and last week played another FBS team when they lost 46-7 at Florida State. In between those two contests was a 47-6 win over Cumberland University at home. Through three games quarterback Tony Pastore is 23-of-43 (53.5%) for 446 yards and four touchdowns. Three of those touchdowns came in the big win over Cumberland. Receiver Blue Cooper has hauled in 10 passes for 159 yards and two touchdowns to lead the wideouts. Defensively Joseph Thornton leads the team with 20 tackles.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and UT Martin are playing for the 55th time dating back to the 1959 season. UT Martin holds a 27-25-2 advantage in the all-time series and a 25-17 advantage since becoming a Senior College in 1951. Austin Peay won last year's meeting 17-14 in Martin, snapping a four-game losing streak in the series and winning for the first time since 1996 (a 55-24 win). The game is the first of the year in the Sgt. York Trophy series, which is competed for by the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee. APSU shared the crown with Tennessee State last year (although TSU took home the trophy after a tiebreaker). APSU has lost three straight road games dating back to last season.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After starting the season with nationally-ranked South Florida, UT Martin has found the last two weeks of non-Division I competition a little easier, as they beat Baker 56-0 two weeks ago and blasted Concordia (Ala.) 87-21. Wide receiver Roren Thomas had a career day as he racked up 245 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns in the win. He carried the ball once - scoring a 65-yard touchdown - and had four catches for 180 yards and two touchdowns (of 60 and 72 yards). Thomas did not play much in the second half as UTM was up 49-7 at halftime. Quarterback Cade Thompson was 11-of-18 for 261 yards and three scores and his backup Dexter Anoka came into the game to complete 4-of-8 passes for 105 yards and a score. Thompson's 171.32 passing efficiency ranks seventh nationally. True freshman Daryl Bourne had his second straight 100-yard rushing game, netting 111 yards and a touchdown while earning OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week honors. Kicker Tom Hansen set a new OVC record for successful extra points in a game, hitting on 12 in the victory (the NCAA record is 15). He also hit a 36-yard field goal and tied the UTM record for points in a game by kicking (15). UTM is second nationally in scoring offense (50.0 points/game) and sixth in total offense (460.67 yards/game).

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay opened the home portion of its schedule on Saturday with a 31-15 loss to Gardner-Webb. Sophomore Terrence Holt averaged 31 yards per kickoff return and helped the Gobs to an averaged field position in the first half (and the 43-yard line for the game). Sophomore kicker John Bell hit the team's first field goal of the year in the second quarter, a 42-yarder in the second quarter, and later he added a 51 and 45 yard field goal. Senior Lanis Frederick caught four passes for 32 yards in the game and is now 22 yards shy of becoming the third player to join the Gobs 2,000-yard receiving club. Sophomore wideout Adrian Mines scored the team's lone touchdown on Saturday, grabbing a 29-yard pass in the fourth quarter; it marked the team's longest reception of the season. Austin Peay converted on all three red zone attempt two weeks ago against nationally-ranked Georgia Southern, but failed to score in all three trips inside the red zone against GWU.

GAME NOTES: In-state rivals meet for the 74th time on Saturday when Missouri State comes to Cape Girardeau to battle Southeast Missouri. Missouri State owns a 45-28 advantage in the all-time series and has won the past two meetings (2005 and 2007). Southeast last won 17-10 in 2003. The teams have been pretty even over the past seven meetings, with Missouri State holding a 4-3 advantage in those games.

SCOUTING MISSOURI STATE: The Bears are coming off a 57-13 loss at Oklahoma State this past weekend, after opening the season against Division II Washburn on Sept. 4 (a 35-27 home loss). Quarterback Cody Kirby has completed 24-of-57 passes for 286 yards and three touchdowns this season. On the ground Kingjack Washington has 144 rushing yards (5.0 yards per carry) and a touchdown. Washington had 76 yards in the OSU contest. Defensively Skylar Smith has 18 tackles, two pass break-ups and a fumble recovery through two games.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri State opened OVC play last Thursday by dropping a tough 29-27 decision to Tennessee Tech in a game that was televised on ESPNU. Southeast trailed early but managed to take a 27-23 lead with 14:54 left when Houston Lillard hooked up with Bradley Brown for a 21-yard touchdown. But TTU responded and scored with 7:40 left and were able to hang on for the win. Sophomore Henry Harris, a transfer from the University of Memphis, was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week after carrying the ball 14 times for 70 yards (5.0/carry) and a touchdown. He also caught a pass and had a kickoff return and finished the game with 96 all-purpose yards. Lillard, who is 18th nationally in total offense (244.67 yards/game) finished the contest 18-of-36 for 187 yards and two touchdowns. Walter Peoples grabbed five of those passes for 61 yards and a score. On defense, senior linebacker Nick Stauffer had 13 tackles and broke up two passes to lead the defense. Vincent Anderson added 11 tackles while Eddie Calvin, who is first nationally in interceptions per game, had eight tackles, three pass break-ups and a fumble recovery. Southeast ranks first nationally in net punting (42.47 yards/punt) as Doug Spada is the nation's leader with 49.87 yards/punt. The Redhawks also rank third nationally in interceptions (6) and sixth in turned gained (8).

GAME NOTES: Saturday's game will be the first in the all-time series between the schools. Tennessee Tech is 0-21 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams, including a loss at Louisville earlier in the season.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech moved atop the OVC standings as they topped Southeast Missouri State in the Conference opener among all teams. Henry Sailes was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after netting his first career 100-yard rushing game (113). Sailes electrified the crowd with an amazing 63-yard run that was named the "Play of the Day" on SportsCenter. Sailes also caught six passes and finished the game with 164 all-purpose yards. Derrian Waters added 45 yards on the ground and two touchdowns, including the game-winner in the fourth quarter. His touchdown run capped a 72-yard drive that lasted seven minutes. After having only one touchdown all of last season, Waters doubled that output in just one game. Quarterback Lee Sweeney passes for 229 yards, his ninth 200-yard passing game of his career. Sophomore kicker Justin Kraemer was named OVC Specialist of the Week after scoring a career-best 11 points including a career-best three field goals. That included a career-long 51-yard field goal right before halftime that broke a tie and pushed Tennessee Tech into the lead. He also connected from 37 and 45 yards on the night and ranks first nationally in field goals made per game (2.00). Senior linebacker Corey Reed had 12 tackles on the night as did Jake Kiser. Taron Ryce had four pass break-ups for the game, tying a TTU single-game record. The win was the 100th of the coaching career of Watson Brown.

SCOUTING WESTERN MICHIGAN: Following a season-opening 47-24 loss at Nebraska, Western Michigan has rebounded with two straight wins, including a 29-26 victory over Northern Illinois and a 51-28 road win over Idaho last week. The Broncos scored 23 points in the third quarter to open up a tied game and never looked back against the Vandals. Tim Hiller completed 23-of-31 passes for 241 yards and four touchdowns, two of which went to Jamarko Simmons (six catches, 82 yards) and the other two that went to Branden Ledbetter (three catches, 21 yards). Hiller has nine touchdowns and only one interception (while completing 67.3% of his passes) through three games this year. Brandon West rushed for 95 yards and a touchdown while Drew Burdi added 54 yards and a score.

GAME NOTES: Murray State and Western Kentucky are playing for the first time since the 2002 season and for the 67th time in the history of the program dating back to the 1931 season. Most of the meetings occurred when both were members of the OVC (WKU was a member from 1948-81 and 99-00). The last meeting happened in Bowling Green in 2002 in the first round of the FCS Playoffs (WKU won 59-20). WKU has won 9 of the last 11 overall in the series. MSU's last win in the series was 36-31 in Murray in 1998.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State fell to 1-2 on the season with a 42-23 home loss to Illinois State on Saturday. The standout for the Racers was senior linebacker Nathan Williams who had 23 tackles, which is the most among all Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) players this season. Williams also had a sack and recovered a fumble on his way to OVC Defensive Player of the Week honors. Williams is averaging 16.33 tackles/game (49 total tackles) through three games this year, which is first nationally. Zach Kutch added 14 tackles and Will Werner 10 tackles in the ISU loss. The MSU defense also scored its second touchdown of the season on Saturday as Jamal Crook recovered a fumble in the end zone during the second quarter. Kicker Kienan Cullen connected on a 41-yard field goal and is now 4-for-4 on the season. Battling injuries at quarterback, the Racers started their third different quarterback in as many games this year, as Chris Franklin got the nod. Franklin completed 16-of-25 passes for 145 yards and two touchdowns. Marcus Harris grabbed 10 of those passes for 95 yards and a touchdown. When they have marched into the red zone this year, the Racers have made the most of their opportunities, as they are 7-for-7 which is the best efficiency nationally.

SCOUTING WESTERN KENTUCKY: Western Kentucky will be playing its second game of the year against an OVC school, as the Hilltoppers topped Eastern Kentucky 37-13 two weeks ago in Richmond. Sandwiched between that game was a pair of losses to Indiana and nationally-ranked Alabama. The 'Toppers are in their final year of reclassification from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). WKU will be full members of the Sun Belt Conference next season and eligible for a bowl appearance. David Wolke has completed 23-of-43 passes for 200 yards and two touchdowns this season while K.J. Black is 24-of-38 for 269 yards and a score. Defensively Alonzo Higgins has 26 tackles to lead the WKU defense through three games.

GAME NOTES: In-state rival Eastern Illinois and Illinois State will play for the 97th time on Saturday. The two teams have been scheduled to play each of the past 11 seasons (although the 2001 game was cancelled due to 9/11). The first meeting between the squads happened all the way back in 1901. Illinois State has won the last six meetings, including a 24-21 decision a year ago in Charleston. Eastern Illinois' last win was in 2002, a 45-10 rout. The two teams played twice in 2006, as they squared off in the FCS Playoffs.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: After battling a pair of Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams to open the season, Eastern Illinois finally matched up with an FCS team last week as they topped Indiana State 38-3 in the team's home opener. Travorus Bess rushed for 93 yards on 13 carries including breaking out for a 31-yard touchdown in the win on Saturday. He added a 14-yard reception for 107 all-purpose yards on the day. Bodie Reeder completed 9-of-15 passes for 107 yards and two touchdowns. Charles Graves was his favorite target, as the duo hooked up four times for 62 yards and a touchdown. Defensively Rashad Haynes had two tackles and also picked off an ISU pass and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter to put EIU up 10-0. Donovan Johnson, Ke'Andre Sams and Alain Marcelin each had eight tackles to lead the Panthers. EIU currently ranks first nationally as a team in punt returns (33.50 yards/return) as well as first nationally in fourth down conversion defense (0%).

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE: Illinois State evened its record at 1-1 on the season on Saturday by beating OVC foe Murray State 42-23 on the road. Geno Blow carried the ball 20 times for 98 yards and two touchdowns while Parrish Fisher also added two touchdowns to go along with his 73 yards. Blow was named Missouri Valley Football Conference Player of the Week for his effort. Quarterback Kevin Brockway was 12-of-19 for 112 yards and Tom Nelson returned a punt 82 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. The Redbirds had opened the season on Aug. 30 with a 35-10 loss at Marshall.
