THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Week No. 3 of the season saw the first OVC action of the year as Eastern Illinois topped Southeast Missouri in Cape Girardeau and two-time defending champion Eastern Kentucky topped Tennessee Tech 17-7 at home...With the victory ECU improved to 16-1 in OVC play over the past three seasons...Eastern Illinois is now 3-0 on the season (all three wins against FCS teams) which is the best start for the squad since 2001; that season the Panthers were 9-2 overall on their way to the OVC Championship...After two games against top FBS teams to start the season, Jacksonville State picked up its first victory of the year with a road win over previously unbeaten Alabama A&M; JSU will play its fourth straight road game (at Nicholls State) this week before finally getting to play at home next week...Tennessee Tech will challenge FBS Kansas State this week while Tennessee State travels to play Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic at the Georgia Dome (a game that can be seen on VERSUS)...OVC matchups this week include Eastern Illinois at Austin Peay, Southeast Missouri at UT Martin and Eastern Kentucky at Murray State...In the latest national polls released on Monday, three OVC schools are in the Sports Network Top 25, the first time this season the OVC has had three teams ranked...In that poll Eastern Kentucky comes in at No. 20, Jacksonville State is No. 22 and Eastern Illinois makes its first appearance of the season at No. 24...In the FCS Coaches Top 25, Jacksonville State is No. 21 and Eastern Kentucky is No. 22 while Eastern Illinois is just outside the poll at No. 27...In the latest Sagarin Power Ratings, Jacksonville State is No. 52 among all 245 Division I schools (both FBS and FCS); that is the third highest rank among all FCS squads (trailing just UNI and Richmond).

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Ryan Perrilloux, QB • Sr., 6-3, 223 • LaPlace, La. • Jacksonville State

Perrilloux scored five touchdowns as Jacksonville State went on the road and topped previously unbeaten Alabama A&M 45-13. He completed 13-of-22 passes for a season-high 293 yards and three touchdowns. That included a 57-yarder to Alan Bonner in the first quarter to put the team up 14-0, a 51-yarder to La'Ray Williams in the third quarter and a 59-yarder to James Wilkerson also in the third frame. In all, Perrilloux completed passes to eight different receivers. In addition, Perrilloux scored the game's first touchdown on an 11-yard run on Jax State's first possession and added a one-yard scamper in the second quarter to put his squad up 21-3. He became the first player in Jacksonville State's Division I history to throw for three touchdowns and run for two in the same game. He has now thrown for 200 yards in his career 10 times, eight of those as a Gamecock. Perrilloux has accomplished that feat in five of his last six games.

DEFENSIVE

Andre Evans, DB • Sr., 5-10, 167 • Cleveland, Ohio • Eastern Kentucky

Evans intercepted a Lee Sweeney pass and returned it for a 54-yard touchdown with 2:54 to play in the third quarter to give Eastern Kentucky its first lead of the game in a contest they would go on to win 17-7. Evans finished the game with two pass breakups and four tackles. As a defensive unit ECU held Tech to 12-of-30 passing for just 124 yards.

SPECIALIST

Alan Bonner, RS • Fr., 5-11, 168 • Newnan, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Bonner had 161 all-purpose yards in Jacksonville State's 45-13 road victory over previously unbeaten Alabama A&M. The highlight of the game was a 64-yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to put the game away. In total Bonner had four punt returns for 94 yards. On offense he also caught a 57-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter to put the Gamecocks ahead 14-0. His two touchdowns rank as the first and third longest plays for JSU on the season. Bonner's 20.80 yard per punt return average ranks fifth nationally on the season.

NEWCOMER

Jake Christensen, QB • Grad., 6-1, 215 • Lockport, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Christensen, the transfer from Iowa, was 19-of-26 for 292 yards and two touchdowns in helping Eastern Illinois to a 23-14 victory over Southeast Missouri in the Conference opener for both teams. Christensen's efficiency helped EIU overcome four fumbles inside the Southeast Missouri 25-yard line as the Panthers improved to 3-0 to start the season for the first time since 2001. Christensen also kept several drives alive with his feet, rushing for 30 yards on seven carries and not being sacked. His 177.75 passing efficiency for the season ranks fourth-best nationally.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Jacksonville State No. 52 in Sagarin Power Rankings: In this week's Sagarin Power Rankings, Jacksonville State comes in at No. 52 among 245 Division I teams (both FBS and FCS schools). That is the highest of any OVC school and the third-highest of any Football Championship Subdivision school (behind only No. 33 UNI and No. 47 Richmond). Overall Jax State has the fifth toughest schedule among all 245 Division I teams. Eastern Illinois is the second-highest rated team at No. 91.

OVC Teams Among FBS Opponents: OVC schools are 0-6 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) opponents, although two of those games went down to the wire with a chance for the OVC team to pull off a win. In week No. 1 Eastern Kentucky had the ball on Indiana's 5-yard line before a fumble ended what looked like to be a for-sure scoring drive. IU held on for a 19-13 victory. During week No. 2 Jacksonville State led Florida State 9-7 for most of the contest before the Seminoles came up with two scores in the final 35 seconds to win 19-9. All-time the OVC is 17-127-1 against FBS opponents. The last time an OVC team knocked off a FBS school was during the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. This week Tennessee Tech plays at Kansas State.

NCAA Stat Leaders: After three weeks of play Jacksonville State's **Jawaan Booker** is first nationally in fumble recoveries (1.00/game), the only OVC player to currently lead a NCAA stat category. Teammate **Monte Lewis** is second nationally in forced fumbles (1.00/game) while Southeast Missouri State punter **Doug Spada** is second in punting (45.86 yards/punt) and Austin Peay's **Terrence Holt** is second in all-purpose yards (210.00/game). Eastern Kentucky defensive back **Jeremy Caldwell** is third in interceptions (1.00/game) while Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jake Christensen** is fourth in passing efficiency (177.75). In punt returns, Murray State's **Derick Townsel** is fourth (21.00 yards/return) while JSU's **Alan Booker** is fifth (20.80 yards/return). In team rankings, Eastern Illinois is first in third down conversions (66.67%), second in scoring defense (6.67 points/game) and eighth in rushing offense (222.0 yards/game). Jacksonville State is first in fumble recoveries (9) and ninth in punt returns (18.33 yards/return). Murray State is first in that category, averaging 26.13 yards/return. Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech are currently tied for first nationally in fumbles lost (0).

Large Crowds: Several OVC teams have played in front of large crowds this season. That includes Jacksonville State who played in front of 71,420 fans at Florida State on Sept. 12. That marked the fifth largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play. On the same day Murray State played in front of 55,510 at N.C. State, the 39th time an OVC team had played in front of more than 50,000 fans. A large crowd is expected when Tennessee State plays Florida A&M at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta on Sept. 26, Eastern Illinois plays at Penn State on Oct. 10 and when Tennessee Tech plays at Georgia on Nov. 7 and Eastern Kentucky plays at Kentucky on the same day.

Murray State's Harris Named National Specialist of the Week: Murray State junior **Marcus Harris** was honored by The Sports Network on Sept. 7 as the FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week. Harris was honored after becoming the first Racer to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game. He accomplished the task by taking a kickoff back 86 yards with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter to put the Racers ahead 52-10. After hauling in a 13-yard touchdown reception on the next Racers' possession, Harris fielded a punt on his own 25 and raced untouched up the middle for the 75-yard touchdown. Harris finished the game with 83 yards on two punt returns and 125 yards on two kickoff returns. He added 17 yard receiving and finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards.

The Safety Dance: No we are not talking about the Men Without Hats song, but the Murray State defense. In the Racers season-opening victory over Kentucky Wesleyan, the defense recorded two safeties which tied the OVC (and Murray State) single-game record done three other times (most recently in 1996 by Middle Tennessee). To put it into perspective on how rare that is, only two OVC schools have had two safeties during an entire season over the last four years.

From Navy Pilot to Assistant Coach: Austin Peay's new offensive graduate assistant coach **Craig Candeto** has spent the last six years in the Navy as a fighter pilot, a member of Strike Fighter Squadron 106 "Gladiators" stationed in Virginia Beach, Va., flying T-34, T-45 and F/A-18 jets. The former lieutenant retired from the Navy earlier this year and now is going from piloting a \$57 million Super Hornet aircraft to taking flight as the Governors quarterbacks coach. But before his military career, Candeto was a sports star in his own right who shares an NCAA record. The Deland, Fla., native was a two-sport prep star, earning the 1999 6A Florida State High School Player of the Year award. He earned an appointment to the Naval Academy, where he enjoyed a storied athletic career. It was at quarterback where Candeto achieved his greatest stardom. In 2002, he rushed for six touchdowns in Navy's 58-12 win against Army—those six rushing TDs matched the NCAA record for rushing TDs by a quarterback. In total, he accounted for seven TDs in the game. Candeto is one of just 26 FBS quarterback to have rushed and pass for 1,000 or more yards, respectively. He earned the 2002 and 2003 Rubino Memorial Silver Helmet award as the Outstanding Football Player at the Naval Academy. As co-captain in 2003, he quarterbacked a Navy football team that won three games in the previous three seasons and guided it to an 8-5 record and its first bowl appearance in seven years. That same Navy team led the nation in rushing. Candeto also is a member of the Navy Athletic Hall of Fame.

Eastern Kentucky Tabbed Preseason Favorite: In what was one of the most balanced votes in the history of preseason OVC balloting (five different teams got at least one first-place votes), defending champion Eastern Kentucky was tabbed the preseason favorite by the league head coaches and sports information directors. EKU received 10 of the 18 first-place votes followed by UT Martin (4 first-place votes), Eastern Illinois (2), Tennessee State (1) and Murray State (1). It marks the 17th time that the Colonels have been picked to win the OVC Championship in the

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preseason poll. But is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 30 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (40.0%). In each of the last six years, the predicted champion has failed to claim the regular season title. The last time the preseason predicted champion went on to win the title was in 2002 when Eastern Illinois accomplished the feat (EIU also did that same thing in 2001).

Thompson and Lane Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: UT Martin senior quarterback **Cade Thompson**, the 2008 OVC Offensive Player, was tabbed the Preseason Player of the Year this season after throwing for 2,680 yards and 24 touchdowns as a junior. Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** was picked as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in both sacks (1.0) and tackles-for-loss (1.83) per game last season. Those two players led the selections of this season's Preseason All-OVC Teams. Murray State had six selections to the team, the most of any OVC school. The Racers were followed by UT Martin who had five selections and Jacksonville State who had four picks. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (8 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2008. Of the 26 total selections, 21 were seniors (including the entire offensive unit), four were juniors and there was one sophomore pick. All nine teams had at least one player appear on the squad.

Head Coaches All Return: For the first time since the 2004 season, every head coach in the OVC returns to coach the same team they did last season. All nine coaches are back including the Dean of OVC Coaches, **Bob Spoo** of Eastern Illinois. Spoo is beginning his 22nd season on the sidelines with the Panthers in 2009 (23rd season overall after missing 2006 with an illness). Spoo is the fifth longest active tenured head coach at the Division I level (tied with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer) and trails only Joe Paterno (at Penn State since 1966), Bob Ford (at Albany since 1973), Bobby Bowden (at Florida State since 1976) and Andy Talley (at Villanova since 1985).

Jacksonville State Ineligible for OVC Championship/Postseason Play: In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State University received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship. Jacksonville State will still play a full Conference schedule in 2009 with wins and losses counting for both teams. They will just not be eligible for the title and will be listed at the bottom of the standings with an asterisk.

JSU's Perrilloux on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Jacksonville State senior quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award is presented to the FCS Offensive Player of the Year. The All-OVC second-team selection last season completed 187-of-297 for 2,318 yards in 2008, which was the third-highest in school history. His 140.88 passing efficiency was ranked 27th nationally and his 244.18 yards of total offense ranked him 28th nationally. The LaPlace, La, native was named OVC Player or Newcomer of the Week seven times during the 2008 season after he led the Gamecocks to an 8-3 record. He enters his senior season as the school's career leader in completion percentage (63.0), passing yards per game (210.7) and total offense per game (244.2). The watch list will be revised in October and again in November before the final ballot is announced. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night prior to the NCAA Division I championship game. The Eddie Robinson Award (top FCS Coach) and Buck Buchanan Award (top FCS Defensive Player) will also be presented that night.

Murray State's Lane on Buck Buchanan Award Watch Lists: Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, honors the best defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award is named after Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame, defensive lineman who played for Grambling State from 1959 through 1962. He was selected to the NFL's All-Time Roster, indicative of his standing as one of the greatest football players of all time. Buchanan died of cancer July 16, 1992. His uniform number, 86, was retired by Kansas City in 1992. Lane has garnered national attention after putting together a 2008 campaign that consisted of school records in sacks (12.0) and tackles-for-loss (22.0), both of which ranked among the national leaders. The efforts earned him Sporting News Fabulous 50 All-America honors, as well as Third-Team All-America honors from the *Associated Press*. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night before the NCAA Division I championship game. The Walter Payton Award and the Eddie Robinson Award will also be presented that night.

Six OVC Schools Have Former FBS Quarterbacks Under Center This Season: This season there are currently six OVC schools with at least one former Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) quarterback competing for the starting job. Three of the quarterbacks are for sure the starter, including **Ryan Perrilloux** (LSU) starting for the second year at Jacksonville State and 2008 OVC Player of the Year **Cade Thompson** (South Carolina) starting for the third year at UT Martin. Two other schools have a pair of former FBS signal callers on the depth chart. That includes Eastern Illinois who has **Jake Christensen** (Iowa) as the starter and **Bodie Reeder** (Wyoming) as the backup while Tennessee Tech who has **Lee Sweeney** (Louisville) as the starter with **Clint Brewster** (Minnesota) on the bench. At Tennessee State **Dominic Grooms** (Missouri) is in the mix at quarterback while **T.C. Jennings** (Arkansas State) is the backup at Austin Peay.

Murray State/UT Martin Game Picked as FCS Game of the Week Radio Broadcast: The Murray State at UT Martin football game on Oct. 24 has been selected for the FCS Game of the Week radio broadcast as announced by David Brody, president and co-founder of Broadcaster Marketing Services. This marks the fourth year for the FCS Game of the Week series. The games are brought to the public by Clear Channel Communications, Gino Communications and Broadcaster Marketing Services and heard on WCKY AM 1530 out of Cincinnati. Frank Santore returns for his fourth year as play-by-play voice.

FCS Playoffs: For the 13th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 18 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 28 and continue with second round games on Dec. 5 and semifinal contests on Dec. 11/Dec. 12 before the title game. This will mark the final year under the 16-team playoff format. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved a new budget for the Division I Football Championships, which allowed the postseason bracket to expand from 16 to 20 teams beginning in the 2010 season. It marks the first expansion since the playoff field grew from 12 to 16 in 1997. In 2010, the field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8 now) and 10 at-large berths (up from 8 now).

FCS Playoffs - Part 2: The OVC will be looking to get multiple teams into the FCS Playoffs for the third time in four years this season. Last year marked the first time since 2005 that just one OVC team (league champion Eastern Kentucky) made the 16-team playoff field. Two other teams (Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) finished with eight Division I victories but did not receive an at-large bid. It marked the first time since the playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986 that an OVC team with eight Division I teams did not receive an at-large bid. ECU lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round last season.

2009 Marks Third Season For Sgt. York Trophy: The 2009 season marks the third season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2009 to claim its second trophy; the Tigers are 5-1 all-time in Sgt. York games. The first Sgt. York contest of 2009 will be on Oct. 3 when Austin Peay visits Tennessee Tech. The final will be the last weekend of the season (Nov. 21) when Austin Peay plays at UT Martin.

Eastern Kentucky Searches For 32nd Consecutive Winning Season, 37th Consecutive Non-Losing Season: Eastern Kentucky enters the 2009 season looking for its 32nd consecutive winning season. The team's current streak of 31 consecutive winning season is second in Division I only to the 32-straight by Florida State. Eastern has not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 in 1977. The Colonels also have now had 36 consecutive non-losing

seasons, as you have to go back all the way to 1972 to find a year ECU had a losing season (they were 5-6 that year, the only time in the last 42 years they have had a losing season). That streak is currently the longest in all of Division I, as the team overtook Michigan who suffered a losing season for the first time in 41 years in 2008.

The 62nd Season of Football: The 62nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football is underway this season. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2009. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the OVC have claimed at least one championship.

A Look Back at the 2008 Season: For the first time in 61 years of competition, the OVC finished the 2008 season with four teams with eight overall victories. The OVC was one of just two FCS conferences to have four or more teams with eight wins (the CAA was the other, who had five teams reach eight or more wins; each of those five CAA teams made the playoffs while only one OVC school made the field). Eastern Kentucky claimed its 20th OVC Championship (the second most crowns in FCS history trailing only the CAA's UMass who has 21; however, ECU's 16 outright conference crowns are the most in FCS history) and second in a row. The Colonels made their 19th FCS Playoff berth (tied for most all-time with Montana) and lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Sub-division (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC and SportsUnlimited Announce Launch of OVC Football Magazine: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced the launch and production of "Ohio Valley Conference Football 2009" a full-color, limited edition football magazine that previews the 2009 football season. The venture with SportsUnlimited ships in late August. Detailed feature articles on all nine OVC teams are included in the publication. For the first time, OVC football will be featured in a full-color magazine dedicated to its nine schools and suitable for display on your coffee table year round. To order your copy log onto www.collegesportsmags.com. The cost of the publication is \$4.99 plus tax and shipping.

OVCsports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first three seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2009 season, 15 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the season (12 active, 2 practice squad members, one IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout **Tony Romo**, who is the starting quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys and two-time Pro Bowl pick, defensive back **Cortland Finnegan** (Samford) who was a Pro Bowl selection with the Tennessee Titans last year and Tennessee State's **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who was a starter with the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII in February. There is one player on a NFL roster who played in the OVC last season, **Pierre Walters** (Eastern Illinois) who is with the Kansas City Chiefs. **Javarri Williams** (Tennessee State) is also with the Chiefs but as a member of the practice squad to start the season, as is former Tennessee State offensive lineman **Cecil Newton** who is on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad. Six of nine current OVC schools have at least one player on a NFL roster with Southeast Missouri State leading the way with three. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - **Brad Childress** (Minnesota) and **Sean Payton** (New Orleans). Another EIU alumni - **Mike Shanahan** - is out of coaching this year but should be back with a team in 2010. UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach **Jerry Reese** made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to the Super Bowl XLII Championship in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 92 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (69) is second followed by UT Martin (49) and Murray State (45). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2009 season marks the third of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech is playing Kansas State for the second time in school history and first time since 1984. In that meeting K-State won 28-12.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech opened Conference play on Saturday by losing 17-7 at two-time defending champion Eastern Kentucky. The Golden Eagle defense was stout, forcing three turnovers and blocking a field goal attempt on the night. Tech led 7-0 after a Tremaine Hudson six-yard run in the first quarter. TTU held an advantage until later in the third quarter when a Lee Sweeney pass was picked off and returned for a 54-yard touchdown that put EKU on top 10-7. For the game Tim Benford caught five passes for 92 yards. The sophomore has now caught at least two passes in all 14 games of his career. Sweeney completed 11-of-26 passes for 97 yards. He now has 500 completions in his four-year career, the eighth most in OVC history. Hudson led the team with 48 rushing yards on the night. The blocked field goal came from Dedrick Miley and marked the ninth blocked kick in three seasons under head coach Watson Brown.

SCOUTING KANSAS STATE: In its first year back under legendary head coach Bill Snyder, the Kansas State Wildcats are off to a 1-2 start. Snyder retired in 2005 after 17 successful years as head coach of the program helping what has been termed "the greatest turnaround in the history of college football." He led Kansas State to 11 straight bowl berths from 1993-2003 and the 2003 Big 12 Championship. K-State started the season with a 21-17 win over FCS foe Massachusetts before falling to Louisiana-Lafayette 17-15 in week two. This past week Kansas State lost 23-9 at UCLA in the Rose Bowl. Carson Coffman completed 20-of-34 passes for 193 yards for the Wildcats while Daniel Thomas rushed for 54 yards and a touchdown.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Florida A&M will square off for the 50th time in the long series that dates back to 1944. The all-time series is at an even 24-24-1 after the first 49 meetings. FAMU has won seven in a row over Tennessee State, including 28-21 at this game a year ago. In that game Curtis Pulley ran for two touchdowns and threw for another to lead the Rattlers to a win in front of 50,428. Antonio Heffner completed 20-of-37 passes for 241 yards for TSU. This year marks the 14th time the teams have played at the Atlanta Football Classic, including the last 11 years in a row. A&M has won nine of those meetings. The last time Tennessee State won in Atlanta was a 27-7 contest in 2001.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Three weeks into the season Tennessee State has played a home game, a neutral site game and a road game. The road game came last week at Southern where the Tigers lost 21-17. The improving TSU offense finally got going and took a 17-14 lead in the fourth quarter when quarterback Calvin McNairl connected with Joseph Hills for a 24-yard touchdown. McNairl threw for 86 yards on the night but carried the ball 11 times for 86 yards (7.8 yards/carry) which led all TSU rushers. On defense Kellen Woodard led Tennessee State with nine tackles, including 3.5 for loss. That included a sack (for a loss of five yards) and he also forced a fumble. Overall the defense limited Southern to just 107 rushing yards after SU rushed for 349 yards the week before. For the season Woodard has 17 tackles, including 4.0 for loss. Tennessee State has used three different quarterbacks on the season and they have completed just 36.5 percent of their pass attempts.

SCOUTING FLORIDA A&M: Florida A&M stayed a perfect 3-0 on the season and improved to 2-0 in MEAC action with a 48-10 win over Howard last Thursday night. The game was highlighted by All-American kick returner LeRoy Vann who ran back two punts for touchdowns for the second straight week. He now has seven punt returns for touchdowns for his career, which ties the FCS career record. His four returns this season is tied for the FAMU single-season mark (the NCAA single-season mark in 5). He has been named National Special Teams Player of the Week each of the past two weeks. After missing the first two games of the season with an injury, tailback Phil Sylvester ran for 55 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Curtis Pulley was 11-of-22 for 182 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing for 38 yards. After their 3-0 start, the Rattlers are finally ranked in the national polls this week, coming in at No. 25 in the FCS Coaches Poll. They are unofficially No. 26 in the Sports Network poll.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State will renew its rivalry with a former Southland Conference foe on Saturday when the two teams play at Guidry Stadium. The teams matched up when both were members of the Southland but have not played since the 2002 season when Nicholls State won 14-6. Jax State leads the all-time series 8-6. The game marks the return to the state of Louisiana for senior quarterback Ryan Perrilloux. A native of LaPlace, Perrilloux played two seasons at LSU before transferring to Jacksonville State. He will be playing some 40 miles from where he grew up.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: After starting its season against nationally-ranked Georgia Tech and Florida State (who has been ranked in two of the three polls so far this season), Jacksonville State finally got a win after playing a FCS team on Saturday, topping previously unbeaten Alabama A&M 45-13 in Huntsville. Ryan Perrilloux earned his second straight OVC Offensive Player of the Week honor after accounting for five touchdowns (3 passing, 2 rushing) in the win. He completed 13-of-22 passes for 293 yards in the game; the touchdown passes went for 57, 51 and 59 yards. He became the first player in JSU's Division I history to throw for three touchdowns and run for two in the same game. Freshman return specialist Alan Bonner was named OVC Specialist of the Week after returning a punt for a 64-yard touchdown on Saturday. He also caught a 57-yard touchdown and finished the game with 161 all-purpose yards. JSU had 494 yards of total offense the most since Sept. 2007. The Gamecocks defense recovered three fumbles for the third straight game as they now lead all FCS schools with nine fumble recoveries on the season. Last season JSU recovered just nine fumbles all season long. Individually senior linebacker Alexander Henderson had eight tackles to lead the team. He also recovered a fumble. Jax State limited A&M to 257 yards of total offense on the night. In the latest FCS national polls, Jacksonville State is No. 21 in the FCS Coaches Top 25 (up from No. 22 last week) and No. 22 in the Sports Network Poll (up from No. 24 last week).

SCOUTING NICHOLLS STATE: Nicholls State has played a very similar schedule to Jacksonville State to begin the season, playing a pair of Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foes in its first three games. The Colonels lost 72-0 at Air Force to start the season and followed that with a 14-7 home win over Duquesne before losing 48-13 at Louisiana Tech this past week. At Louisiana Tech, Nicholls State played tough, trailing only 13-3 at halftime before injuries and fatigue finally set in. True freshman quarterback Jacob Witt was 9-of-20 for 107 yards through the air while also rushing for 41 yards and a score. Witt is the team's leading rusher through three games. His favorite target was Antonio Robinson who had 101 receiving yards against Tech. Robinson has pulled in 13 catches on the season.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois will travel to Austin Peay as the two teams do battle for the 10th time on Saturday. It marks the first time the Panthers have played in Clarksville since the 1997 season. From 1997-06 the Governors were not members of the OVC but they rejoined the Conference in 2007 (the teams did not play that season). In the first meeting in 11 years last season, Austin Peay went to Charleston and pulled off the 15-13 upset in the next to last game of the season. Then freshman Ryan White scampered for a 45-yard touchdown with 8:17 to play to put APSU on top for good and spoil EIU's Senior Day. White finished the game with 124 rushing yards. That snapped a six-game winning streak for Eastern Illinois in the series.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois improved to 3-0 for the first time since 2001 (a year they won the OVC Championship and were 9-2 overall) with a 23-14 road win against Southeast Missouri on Saturday. Transfer Jake Christensen continued his great play at quarterback, completing 19-of-26 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 30 yards and was not sacked. Through three games this year Christensen ranked fourth nationally in passing efficiency. The Panthers rushing game also continued to excel as EIU now ranks eighth nationally in rushing (222 yards/game). He earned OVC Newcomer of the Week honors for his play. Florida transfers Mon Williams (119 yards and a touchdown) and Chevon Walker (63 yards) led the rushing attack once again. Williams currently ranks 14th nationally in rushing offense (106.33 yards/game). Seven different receivers caught at least one pass with Lorence Ricks pulling in three for 101 yards and a 42-yard touchdown to begin the game. Defensively Cory Leman led the way with 16 tackles, becoming the first EIU player with more than 15 stops in a game since Sept. 2008. With the win the Panthers climbed back into the Sports Network Top 25 poll at No. 24. EIU had not been ranked since falling out of the Top 25 in week six of the 2008 season.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay went on the road to face a Missouri Valley Football Conference team for the second week in a row, this time falling 38-7 at Illinois State after losing to Youngstown State the previous week. The Governors offense struggled early at Illinois State, as Austin Peay did not record a first down until nearly the eight minute mark of the second quarter. For the game APSU gained just 107 yards, the fewest since 91 against North Dakota State to open the 2008 campaign. Sophomore Ryan White scored a 24-yard touchdown in the second quarter, the sixth straight game APSU has had at least one rushing touchdown. White was limited to 40 total yards on the night. Punter Ryan Key averaged 43.6 yards/punt (41.4 net) including have two downed inside the Redbirds 20-yard line. After failing to intercept a pass in the first two games of the season, Zac Burkhart picked off one in the third quarter. Safeties Amius Smith and Spencer Gulumire and linebacker Daniel Becker each had nine tackles on the night. Smith and Becker each have 24 tackles on the season to lead the Govs. Junior Terrence Holt had 158 yards all-purpose yards on the night; Holt is now second nationally with a 210 all-purpose yard average per game on the season.

GAME NOTES: Saturday's game marks the 25th all-time between Southeast Missouri and UT Martin. Southeast Missouri controls the all-time series by a 13-11 margin although UT Martin has won the last four in a row. That came on the heels of the Redhawks having won eight in a row between 1997 and 2004. UT Martin won last year's meeting in Cape Girardeau by a 31-21 margin. In that game Cade Thompson threw for two touchdown passes and Brandyn Young rushed for two more for the Skyhawks. For Southeast, Matt Scheible passed for 108 yards and a score and ran for 90 additional yards and a touchdown.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri fell to 4-15 all-time in OVC openers with a 23-14 home loss to Eastern Illinois on Saturday. After falling behind 7-0, Matt Scheible scored on a 1-yard run late in the first quarter to pull the Redhawks even. A quarter later Henry Harris scored from nine yards out to give Southeast the lead. And although EIU would turn the ball over four times, SEMO could not capitalize as EIU scored 16 unanswered points in the second half to pull away. Scheible finished 17-of-35 for 171 yards and a team-high 75 yards on the ground. Harris added 72 yards and Mike Jones had 63 yards as the Southeast team had 210 total yards on the night. On defense Justin Woodlief had 10 tackles in his first career start; he also forced a fumble. This week's game with UT Martin marks the beginning of a stretch that will see the team play four of its next five on the road.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After a season-opening victory over Iowa Wesleyan, UT Martin has dropped two straight on the road, falling to Missouri State and this past week to FBS foe Memphis. It marked the first meeting between the west Tennessee schools since 1932. UTM started slow, committing 13 penalties for 108 yards in the first half alone. Those mistakes allowed Memphis to pull ahead 24-0 at the half and eventually 31-0 early in the third quarter. But the Skyhawks would finally get on the board with 10:13 to play when junior Eunike Williams caught a 44-yard touchdown pass from Cade Thompson. Williams finished the night with four catches for 117 yards. Former quarterback Dexter Anoka pulled down a team-high five catches. Under center Thompson was 11-of-29 for 209 yards while Miguel Barnes led the team with 105 rushing yards. For Barnes it marked his third 100-yard rushing game at UTM and second of this season. For the contest the Skyhawks were without wide receiver Mike Hicks and running back Brandyn Young due to injury; both who were preseason All-OVC selections.

GAME NOTES: The Bluegrass State rivals battle for the 69th time (and 65th straight season) on Saturday at Roy Stewart Stadium. Eastern Kentucky holds a 39-25-4 advantage in the series, including winning four in a row and seven of the last eight. Murray State's lone win in that stretch was a 19-16 overtime win in Richmond in 2004. A year ago EKU scored the game's first 34 points on their way to a 34-7 victory at home. That game featured a heavy dose of C.J. Walker, who carried the ball 25 times for 229 yards (9.2 yards/game) and three touchdowns. His scoring runs came from 16, 51 and 60 yards. The running game was so dominant that EKU had to attempt only eight passes on the day. Murray State was led by Paul McKinnis who had 63 rushing yards.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky started the defense of its 2007 and 2008 OVC Championships with a 17-7 home victory over Tennessee Tech on Saturday. The game proved to be a defensive struggle, as TTU held a 7-3 advantage late in the third quarter. But then Andre Evans intercepted a pass and returned it 54 yards for a touchdown to put EKU on top for good. Evans, who was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week, also had four tackles and two pass break-ups on the night. Overall EKU held the Golden Eagles to just 12-of-30 passing for 124 yards. Redshirt freshman Justin Bell came up big in the second quarter when he blocked a TTU punt that led to the Colonels first three points of the night. The Colonels forced just the one turnover on the night, ending a streak of eight straight games with two or more turnovers. Offensively for Eastern, T.J. Pryor took the most snaps under center, completing 12-of-19 passes for 163 yards. C.J. Walker rushed for 74 yards on 19 carries. Both Pryor and Cody Watts are expected to see action on Saturday at Murray State. With the win EKU has now won 20 of its last 21 Conference games dating back to 2006.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State suffered its second straight loss, a 35-10 defeat at Missouri State on Saturday. The Racers scored the first three points of the game, a 22-yard field goal by Kienan Cullen, but then saw the Bears score 35 unanswered points. Cullen, who also handles punting duties, also averaged 43.0 yards per punt on six attempts, including a 57-yarder that was downed at the nine yard line. Defensively senior All-American Austen Lane had eight tackles, three of them coming behind the line of scrimmage. He added a sack which was the 20th of his career. Offensively, senior Derrick Townsel had seven catches for 91 yards, including a 51-yard grab on the opening drive that set up the Racers field goal. Including 56 punt return yards and 84 kickoff return yards he finished the game with 231 all-purpose yards. Townsel now ranks 18th nationally in all-purpose yardage (151 yards/game). Teammate Marcus Harris continues to rank sixth in all-purpose yardage (189 yards/game).
