THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

This week's matchups include three Ohio Valley Conference contests, as Murray State hosts UT Martin, Eastern Kentucky hosts Austin Peay and Jacksonville State travels to Eastern Illinois...That contest annually proves to be one that will factor into the OVC Championship race, as four times in the last five years the winner of the EIU/JSU game has gone on to win the OVC Championship; the only time it didn't (last season), the winner (EIU) went on to earn a FCS Playoff at-large berth...This week's non-conference games feature nationally-ranked Tennessee looking to go 5-0 when they challenge Florida A&M at the 20th Atlanta Football Classic...Other non-conference games include Southeast Missouri at Indiana State and Tennessee Tech hosting Central Methodist...Two more OVC games were played last week, as Tennessee State improved to 4-0 overall (1-0 OVC) with a home victory over defending champion Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin topped Austin Peay 31-17 in what was also the first Sgt. York Trophy game of the season as well...Tennessee Tech is the other OVC team who is 1-0, as they had a Conference victory over Southeast Missouri a week ago...The three OVC schools who have not played a Conference game so far this season (Eastern Illinois, Murray State and Jacksonville State) will see their first action this coming soon...Tennessee State, ranked No. 25 in last week's Sports Network poll, is 4-0 for the first time since 2001 and moved up to No. 23 in the Sports Network poll (along with a first-place votes) and entered the FCS Coaches poll at No. 25 this week...Jacksonville State scored a win over the Southern Conference's Chattanooga while Eastern Illinois won at Missouri Valley foe Illinois State...EIU is ranked as high as No. 16 in this week's polls while JSU would jump into the Top 25 poll with a win this weekend...OVC schools are currently 9-5 this season against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) non-conference foes this season.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Antonio Heffner, QB • Sr., 6-2, 207 • Memphis, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Heffner was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season (Sept. 7 was the other) after completing 20-of-28 passes for 312 yards and three touchdowns in the No. 25 Tigers 34-20 Conference-opening victory over defending champion Eastern Kentucky. Heffner, who also carried the ball nine times for 47 yards (360 yards total yards of offense for the game), threw two of his touchdowns in the second half including a 3-yarder to Ronald Evans early in the fourth quarter to put the Tigers up by two scores. His first touchdown came on a 62-yard strike to Brandon Belvin in the first half. Heffner's play has Tennessee State off to its best start (4-0) in seven years.

DEFENSIVE

A.J. Davis, DB • Fr., 6-0, 183 • Birmingham, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Davis had a pair of interceptions in Jacksonville State's 31-3 non-conference road win over Chattanooga on Saturday night. Davis picked off his first pass of the season in the first quarter, setting up a field goal for the Gamecocks. His second pick came in the second quarter; his team turned that interception into a touchdown which gave Jax State a 24-0 halftime advantage. He became the first JSU player to record two interceptions in a game since Russell Green in 2004. Overall the Gamecocks had five interceptions on the game and limited UTC to just 177 total yards for the game.

Tyler Wilke, K • Sr., 6-4, 223 • Libertyville, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Wilke was perfect on both of his field goal attempts, including one that sealed the game, in the Panther's 25-21 victory at Illinois State on Saturday. Wilke connected on a 20-yard attempt in the third quarter to cut ISU's advantage to 11 points and then nailed a 44-yarder with 1:54 to go, giving EIU a four-point lead and forcing the Redbirds to go the length of the field and score a touchdown to win the game. Wilke also made his only point-after attempt of the game in recording seven points for his team on the night.

NEWCOMER

Mike Hicks, WR • Jr., 6-3, 215 • Jacksonville, Fla. • UT Martin

Hicks caught nine passes for 155 yards and a touchdown in the Skyhawks 31-17 Conference victory over Austin Peay on Saturday. With his team leading by only two points late in the third quarter, Hick caught five passes on the drive, capping it with a 28-yard touchdown reception from Cade Thompson on the first play of the fourth quarter. In all, Hicks accounted for 91 yards on that 13-play drive that capped the game for UTM.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Strong Start Against FCS Teams: Through four weeks of the regular season, OVC schools have fared well against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) competition. OVC schools have compiled a 9-5 record in 14 FCS non-conference matchups (with two of those losses coming against nationally-ranked teams). OVC schools are 0-11 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams and 4-0 against non Division I squads. At this point of the season last year, OVC schools were just 7-7 against fellow FCS teams.

Hallford Enters OVC Career Scoring Top 10 List: Jacksonville State senior kicker **Gavin Hallford** increased his career points scored total to 264 points on Sept. 20 and is now eighth all-time in OVC history. He needs just eight more points to move up to seventh place all-time. Hallford currently ranks first nationally among active players in career field goals made (45) and attempted (68) and is second in extra points attempts (137) and third in extra points made (129).

UT Martin Takes Early Lead in Sgt. York Trophy Standings: UT Martin topped Austin Peay 31-17 on Sept. 20 in the first Sgt. York Trophy contest of the 2008 season. The 2008 season marks the second for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). Last summer the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. Last season Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records. Both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee Tech and UT Martin each finished 1-2 in the series during the year. The next Sgt. York Trophy game this season will be on Oct. 4 when Tennessee State plays at UT Martin.

Williams Named National Defensive Player of the Week; Also Ranks as National Leader in Tackles: Murray State redshirt senior linebacker **Nathan Williams** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network on Sept. 15. The honor came after Williams posted 23 tackles in the Racers game against Illinois State on Sept. 13. That total is the most nationally at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) this season (three more than Dominique Davenport of Coastal Carolina who had 20 in a game on Sept. 7). Williams also had 17 tackles in a game earlier this season; that total ranks fifth nationally for a single-game in 2008. Williams is averaging 14.25 tackles/game through four contests this season, which ranks third nationally.

Hansen Sets OVC Record for Single-Game Extra Points: UT Martin junior kicker **Tom Hansen** set the OVC single-game record for extra points made when he converted on 12 in the Skyhawks 87-21 victory over Concordia (Ala.) on Sept. 11. Hansen broke the record of 10 previously held by four other people, including a 10-make performance by Hansen last year against Murray State. In doing so, Hansen also set the OVC record for consecutive extra points made in a game.

Heffner Named National All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News: Tennessee State quarterback **Antonio Heffner** was named one of four National All-Stars of the Week by the *College Sporting News* on Sept. 9 for his performance in the Tigers win over Southern at the John Merritt Classic. Down 11-0 at halftime Heffner led his offense to five straight touchdowns on the first five drives in the second half to give Tennessee State a 34-32 come-from-behind victory and

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their first victory over Southern in the last three years. The Memphis, Tenn. native would go 23-for-29 passing for 315 yards, completing three touchdown passes (87, 8 and 38 yards) in the first three offensive drives of the second half. He would also add 8 rushes for 68 yards, giving Heffner 383 yards of total offense on the evening.

OVC Schools Play in Front of Large Crowds: OVC schools have played in front of some large crowds this year, including a crowd of 62,305 on Sept. 6 when Southeast Missouri played at No. 6 Missouri. That crowd was the 10th largest ever to see an OVC school play. A crowd of 60,131 saw Eastern Illinois play at No. 24 Illinois, which marked the 13th largest crowd to see an OVC school play. A crowd of 50,794 saw Tennessee State play Jackson State at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis on Sept. 13. In all, 10 games have had a crowd of 20,000 or more this season including 28,830 for a Tennessee State home game against Southern on Sept. 6.

Holt Sets OVC Single-Game Kickoff Return Record: Austin Peay sophomore **Terrence Holt** set the OVC's single-game kickoff yardage record in the opening weekend, returning 250 yards of kicks against No. 2 North Dakota State (Aug. 28). That broke the 11-year old record previously held by UT Martin's Daniel Ruffin (215 yards against Murray State in 1997). During his freshman season in which he was named an OVC All-Newcomer selection, Holt set the OVC single-season record for kickoff return yardage (1,104).

Williams and Walters Named to Sports Network's Payton and Buchanan Watch Lists: Two Ohio Valley Conference football players found their names among The Sports Network's announcement of the 2008 Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan award watch lists at the end of August. Tennessee State senior running back **Javarris Williams** was named to the Payton list while Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** was named to the Buchanan list. The Payton and Buchanan awards will undergo two revisions, one in October and one in November, before ballots are sent out to a panel of sports information directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries on Nov. 24. The Sports Network awards banquet will be held Dec. 18 in Chattanooga, Tenn., on the eve of before the NCAA Division I national championship game. The Payton Award goes to the FCS national player of the year, with the Buchanan Award honoring the FCS national defensive player of the year. The Eddie Robinson Award, which goes to the FCS national coach of the year, will also be awarded that night. The Robinson Award ballot will be announced in November. The Sports Network established the Payton and Robinson awards in 1987, and began sponsoring the Buchanan Award in 1995. Georgia Southern quarterback Jayson Foster was the 2007 Payton Award winner, while Montana defensive end Kroy Biermann took home the Buchanan Award.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to

be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVCSports.TV: For the third consecutive year, fans can watch nearly every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests this season at OVCSports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed nearly a thousand events in its first two years, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

OVC Looks to Put Two in Playoffs For Third Straight Season: In 2007, the OVC put multiple teams in the FCS playoffs for the second straight year, which marked the first time since the mid-90s that had occurred. Eastern Illinois and UT Martin were playoff participants in 2006 while Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky were participants last season. The OVC has now put multiple teams in the playoffs in three straight years since 1994-96.

Jacksonville State Preseason Favorite Among Coaches/SID's, Although Three Schools Split First-Place Votes: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head football coaches and sports information directors, Jacksonville State University has been picked as the 2008 preseason favorite in the nine-team league. The Gamecocks claimed the 2003 and 2004 OVC Championships and were tabbed as the favorites for the second time in history (2005 was the other). Although Jax State was tabbed as the favorites, the votes indicated the pollsters predicted this year's race should be extremely tight, as the 18 first-place votes were split evenly amongst three schools. JSU received six first-place votes and were followed by 2007 OVC Champion Eastern Kentucky, who was picked second and also received six first-place votes. Eastern Illinois, who was a 2007 at-large selection for the FCS Playoffs, also garnered six first-place votes and was tabbed third. The three teams were separated by just five points, as preseason favorite Jacksonville State ended up with 113 points, Eastern Kentucky followed with 111 points and Eastern Illinois received 108 points. It marked the closest preseason vote in Ohio Valley Conference history.

All-Time Preseason Predicted Order of Finish: Is being picked first in the Conference a good thing for Jacksonville State? If history holds true, then maybe not. In each of the past five seasons, the preseason favorite has not gone on to win the OVC crown. The last team picked to win it all in the preseason and actually accomplish the feat was Eastern Illinois, who did it in back-to-back years (2001 and 2002). In 29 years of preseason polls, the preseason favorite has gone on to win the championship only 12 times (41.4%).

Holland and Walters Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Kentucky senior quarterback **Allan Holland** and Eastern Illinois senior defensive lineman **Pierre Walters** were tabbed the 2008 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote on by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with the most individual selections (5), following closely by four each from Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State. Each of the league's nine teams had at least one player on the preseason squad. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (9 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included eight players who were second-team selections in 2007.

New Faces: This season one new head coach makes his debut in the OVC. Eastern Kentucky is under the direction of first-year head coach **Dean Hood**, who served as an assistant coach for the Colonels from 1994-98, where the team compiled a 32-6 OVC record and made three FCS playoff appearances. Hood was most recently the defensive coordinator at Wake Forest, where the Demon Deacons made an appearance in the 2006 FedEx Orange Bowl and the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

NFL Connections: As of August 20, 13 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the 2008 season. That includes former EIU standout Tony Romo, who is the starting signal caller for the Dallas Cowboys. Among those players is former TSU defensive back Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a first round draft pick of the Arizona Cardinals this season. He became only the fourth OVC player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in 2008. Several NFL head coaches have connections to OVC schools including three current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - Brad Childress (Minnesota), Sean Payton (New Orleans) and Mike Shanahan (Denver). One of the NFL's newest coaches - Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin - was a former assistant coach at UT Martin, who also got national recognition when a former player and coach, Jerry Reese, was named the general manager of the New York Giants prior to the 2007 season. In his first season as GM, Reese led the Giants to the Super Bowl Championship.

NCAA Rule Changes for 2008: There are several rule changes for the 2008 season that will make noticeable effects on the game. Among them are the banning of "horse-collar" tackles, a simplification of chop blocking rules and the elimination of the 5-yard face mask penalty for incidental contact (it will either be a 15-yard penalty or no foul at all). The major rule change involves the play clock which will have both 40 and 25-second settings. Whenever the ball becomes dead, the play clock will reset to 40 seconds and will start immediately. This includes when a runner is down in the field of play or out of bounds, a fumble out of bounds, backward pass out of bounds and after an incomplete pass. After a team has picked up a first down the game clock will stop but the play clock will go to 40 seconds and will start counting down.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 89 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (58) is second followed by UT Martin (36) and Murray State (34). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2008 season marks the second of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions.

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime.

GAME NOTES: Thursday's contest will be the first between the two schools that are located 535 miles apart.

SCOUTING CENTRAL METHODIST: Central Methodist, a member of the NAIA Heart of America Conference, built a 17-0 lead only to give up 27 unanswered points in losing to Evangel on Saturday night. The school, which is located in Fayette, Mo., is 1-2 on the season after a season-opening 20-3 win over Graceland University and a 24-13 loss on the road at William Jewell. Quarterback Brock Brockmeier completed 36-of-56 passes for 291 yards and a touchdown in Saturday's loss. Alonso Spiller caught 10 of those passes for 142 yards and a score while Kevin Pike had 11 catches for 80 yards.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech stepped out of Conference play for the next-to-final time in 2008 last week when they battled their second Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent of the season, playing at Western Michigan. TTU kept it close early, trailing only 13-7 at one point, before WMU quarterback Tim Hiller took over and finished the game with 333 yards and five touchdowns. The Golden Eagles, however, are 2-0 this season against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams, having beaten Gardner-Webb in their only other home contest of the season and winning at Southeast Missouri two weeks ago in the team's OVC opener. At WMU last week, junior Josh Lowery filled in for injured quarterback Lee Sweeney; he completed 19-of-33 passes for 151 yards and a touchdown. Freshman wide receiver Tim Benford continued his early season success, catching seven passes for 70 yards and a touchdown. Through four games this season Benford leads the team with 23 catches and 262 yards (11.4 ypc). Leading rusher Henry Sailes was limited to just 45 yards on 12 carries while Tremaine Hudson had 38 yards on four carries. True freshman outside linebacker Kedrick Towles had a career-high 10 tackles to lead the Golden Eagle defense. Junior Taron Ryce added eight tackles while freshman Alden Olverson had a career-best seven stops. Nick Campbell punted eight times and averaged 40.2 yards per punt, including a 51-yarder.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri State and Indiana State are playing for the seventh time in 2008. The teams played a year ago for the first time since 1999. Southeast Missouri pulled out the 13-10 victory in Cape Girardeau last year, the team's first win since a 13-0 blanking of ISU in 1943. SEMO also topped Indiana State 14-0 in the first meeting in the series which happened in 1935.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: The Redhawks dropped their third straight game last week, falling 45-28 at home to in-state rival Missouri State. Missouri State built 28-7 lead after three quarters and then the two teams combined for 38 points in the final period, including 21 by Southeast. Quarterback Houston Lillard completed 33-of-40 passes for 331 yards and three touchdowns on the night. His favorite target was Brad Stewart who pulled in eight receptions for 93 yards and a touchdown. Michael Williamson added six receptions for 83 yards and a score and Walter Peoples had six catches for 61 yards and a touchdown. Last week's OVC Newcomer of the Week, Henry Harris, had 36 yards on the ground and a touchdown for the Redhawks. Senior linebacker Nick Stauffer had 13 tackles, a sack and a tackle-for-loss to lead the defensive effort. Stauffer leads the team with 50 tackles (nearly twice as many as the second most on the team), 2.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles-for-loss on the season. His 12.50 tackles per game currently ranks 10th nationally among FCS players. SEMO continues to rank among the national leaders in net punting, ranking fifth (40.65 yards/punt) among FCS schools.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE: The Sycamores are off to a 0-3 start on the season including a 38-3 defeat to the hands of OVC foe Eastern Illinois two weeks ago. The team also lost 52-0 at Eastern Michigan to open the year and 48-3 at Northern Illinois last week. The Sycamores are under the direction of first-year head coach Trent Miles who is an ISU alum. ISU has lost 17 games in a row dating back to the 2006 season and are just 1-41 in its last 42 games overall. Darrius Gates is the team's leading rusher, gaining 112 yards on 25 carries. Chuck Dowdell is second with 74 yards on 17 carries in two games.

GAME NOTES: The series between Jacksonville State and Eastern Illinois is quickly becoming one of the most important battles on the OVC slate on an annual basis. The teams have met each of the last five years, and four times the winner of the game has gone on to claim the OVC Championship. The only time it did not happen (last year), the winner (Eastern Illinois) went on to finish second and earn an at-large berth into the FCS Playoffs. Eastern Illinois has won each of the last three meetings, including a 14-point victory a season ago in Jacksonville. Overall the two teams have combined to win six of the last seven championships.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: After a season-opening loss to FBS Georgia Tech, Jacksonville State has rebounded with two impressive non-conference victories. The Gamecocks topped Alabama A&M by 27 and last weekend won by 28 points (31-3) at Chattanooga. In that win, freshman defensive back A.J. Davis intercepted two passes (the team intercepted five in all) and was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week. The multiple interceptions by Davis was the first for a JSU player since 2004. Sophomore running back Tremayne Cogger made his JSU debut on Saturday, carrying the ball 16 times for 123 yards (7.7/carry) and a touchdown. He had a 39-yard carry, which was the longest of the season for Jax State. Daniel Jackson added 111 yards as the Gamecocks combined to rush for 322 yards on the game. JSU has had three of the eight individuals in the OVC who have reached the 100-yard plateau in a game this season. Kicker Gavin Hallford kicked a 35-yard field goal and added four extra points to net seven points on the day. He now has 264 career points, which moved him into eighth place on the OVC career scoring list. Maurice Dupree caught five passes for 95 yards and two scores; he leads the OVC with two multiple touchdown games this year. JSU is now unofficially 27th in the FCS Coaches Poll, 29th in the SME Broadcasters poll and 30th in the Sports Network poll.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: The Panthers evened their record at 2-2 on the year (and 2-0 against FCS opponents) with a 25-21 come-from-behind victory over Illinois State on Saturday. EIU fell behind 21-7 midway through the third quarter before starting its comeback. Tyler Wilke added a field goal in the third quarter and later put the game away with a 44-yarder with 1:54 to play. For his efforts Wilke was named OVC Specialist of the Week. In between his field goals, Bodie Reeder hooked up with Alicus Nozinor for a 44-yard touchdown pass and Chip Keys rushed four yards for what proved to be the game winner. Reeder had an impressive night, completing 17-of-28 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns. On the ground senior Travorus Bess rushed for 79 yards; he is averaging 94.50 yards per game, which is 26th nationally. He also caught six passes for 45 yards and a touchdown. Jack Kosinski led the team with eight tackles (5 solo) and an interception. Preseason OVC Defensive Player of the Year Pierre Walters added five tackles, 25 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and also forced a fumble. The Panthers are ranked in all three major national FCS polls, including No. 16 in the SME Broadcasters Poll.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay travels to Eastern Kentucky for the 41st meeting between the two schools. The teams met last year for the first time in 10 years which was due to Austin Peay leaving the Conference for 10 years to play non-scholarship football. In that first meeting in a decade, EKU won 28-14 on their way to an undefeated league season and OVC Championship. Overall Eastern Kentucky has won the last 21 in the series, with Austin Peay last winning 20-17 in 1977.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay dropped its fourth straight game of the season, losing its OVC opener to UT Martin on Saturday night. The Governors got off to another slow start (they have not scored in the first quarter of any game this season) but got on the board early in the second period when Kevis Buckley picked off a pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown. Early in the third quarter T.C. Jennings hooked up with Scott Thomas for a 7-yard score as the Govs pulled to within two points and 16-14. But the Skyhawks would go on to score two more touchdowns and APSU managed only an Issac Ziolkowski 33-yard field goal the remainder of the way. Sophomore Terrence Holt had a 22-yard punt return, his longest of the season, while also averaging 27.5 yard per kickoff return. For the year Holt is averaging 172.75 all-purpose yards a game, which is the 14th best nationally. Starting quarterback Gary Orr suffered a third quarter thumb injury and was replaced by Jennings, who would later throw a touchdown pass. Jennings also finished the night with 49 yards rushing, a team-best. Junior linebacker Daniel Swenson recorded a career-high 11 tackles in the game and also had a quarterback sack.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: The Colonels traveled to No. 25 Tennessee State for its OVC opener on Saturday, and suffered a 34-20 loss. The loss snapped EKU's 12-game OVC winning streak which dated back to the 2006 season. It also marked the team's first loss to TSU since the 1999 season. Quarterback Allan Holland completed 21-of-37 passes for 244 yards and two touchdowns. That increased his career passing yardage total to 3,378, which is now sixth all-time on the Colonel career list. C.J. Walker led the team with six catches and a touchdown. The EKU's rushing attack was limited to just nine net yards. Jordan Dalrymple led the team with 10 tackles while Tyjuan Jones added nine and an interception. Overall EKU forced Tennessee State into three turnovers (two interceptions and a fumble) but failed to convert those miscues into any points. Eastern kicker Taylor Long currently ranks fifth nationally in field goals made per game (1.75).

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Florida A&M have played 48 times over the year and 12 times at the Atlanta Football Classic. The teams have played at the AFC each of the past 10 years with Florida A&M winning eight of those games including the last six in a row. Overall FAMU has won nine of the 12 meetings held in Atlanta. The last time Tennessee State won in Atlanta was a 27-7 decision in 2001 (which was the last time TSU started the year 4-0). Last year's game was close with the Rattlers pulling out an 18-17 decision.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2001 with a 34-20 win over Eastern Kentucky in its OVC opener. In 2001 the team went on to start the season 6-0 and finished 8-3 overall. The win was the first over ECU since the 1999 campaign when TSU won the OVC Championship. The 34 points for the Tigers marked the eighth straight game in which TSU has scored 30 or more points dating back to last year; the last time the team failed to score 30 or more points was a 49-7 loss to ECU in 2007. The team is averaging 35.75 points per game this season, which ranks 16th nationally. Senior quarterback Antonio Heffner earned his second OVC Offensive Player of the Week award of the season after completing 20-of-28 passes for 312 yards and three touchdowns. He also carried the ball nine times for 47 yards as he finished the game with 360 yards of total offense. Heffner ranks fifth nationally in total offense (309.75) and eight in passing efficiency (171.95). Senior running back Javaris Williams carried the ball 17 times for 117 yards (6.9/carry) and a touchdown. Junior wide receiver JaJuan Spillman totaled 111 all-purpose yards on the night, rushing three times for 24 yards, catching four passes for 24 yards and totaling 63 yards on kick/punt returns. Spillman currently ranks nine nationally in kick returns (31.75 yards/return). Senior safety Larry Williford had nine tackles (5 solo) for TSU and forced a fumble. TSU moved up to No. 23 in the Sports Network poll this week (including receiving a first-place vote) and entered the FCS Coaches Poll at No. 25.

SCOUTING FLORIDA A&M: The Rattlers are just one overtime period away from being a perfect 3-0 on the season, after a season-opening victory over Alabama State and a 51-24 road win at Howard this past Saturday. The lone loss came on the road at Delaware State; FAMU tied the game up at 28 in the fourth quarter but went on to lose 35-28 in overtime. This past weekend the Rattlers defense did not allow a score until its reserves were playing in the fourth quarter after their offense had pulled out to a 51-0 lead. That defense also scored on a 65-yard fumble recovery and a 67-yard interception on back to back possession in the first quarter. Phillip Sylvester led FAMU with 131 yards on 14 carries (9.4 ypc). For the season he has averaged 5.3 yards per carry and scored three times. Quarterback Curtis Pulley, a transfer from Kentucky, is second on the team with 153 rushing yards (10.2 ypc) while also completing 10-of-17 passes for 98 yards and two scores.

GAME NOTES: Murray State and UT Martin are playing for the 45th time dating back to 1927 this weekend. Murray State holds a big advantage in the all-time series but UT Martin has won the last three meetings after the Racers had won 12 in a row from 1993 through 2004. Last season the Skyhawks' offense was nearly unstoppable as they won 76-34. The 76 points equaled the most ever scored by an OVC team in a Conference matchup (TSU also scored 76 in a game against UTM in 1998).

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After battling national power South Florida in the season opener, UT Martin has found its stride, winning its last three contests including an OVC opening victory at Austin Peay on Saturday. That game also marked the beginning of the Sgt. York Trophy series, putting the Skyhawks on top of the standings early in the year. Cade Thompson completed 17-of-28 passes for 254 yards and three touchdowns. He currently ranks ninth nationally in pass efficiency (166.98). Nine of his completions went to Mike Hicks who totaled 155 yards and a touchdown. Hicks was best when his team most needed him, as he made five catches and accounted for 91 yards on the team's march to the end zone on a 13-play drive at the end of the third and beginning of the fourth quarter. Roren Thomas and E.J. Daniel also hauled in receiving touchdowns while Miguel Barnes led the way with 62 yards on the ground. Senior defensive tackle Ray Williams had eight tackles, a sack and 1.5 tackles-for-loss in the contest. The road win marked the seventh road victory in 10 games under head coach Jason Simpson. The Skyhawks ranks third nationally in scoring (45.25 points/game) and ninth in total offense (442.50 yards/game). UTM is receiving votes in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches polls this week.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State suffered its third straight loss (two of which have come against Football Bowl Subdivision foes) on Saturday when they lost 50-9 at Western Kentucky. Senior safety Will Werner scored his second defensive touchdown of the season when he intercepted a pass and returned it 54 yards. Werner now has two picks for 130 total yards and two scores on the season; he is the first Racer with multiple picks for touchdowns in the same season since 1995. He also added eight tackles and a tackle-for-loss during the game. Punter/kicker Kienan Cullen had his best kicking day of the season as he averaged 47.3 yards on six punts including a long of 55 yards. He also connected on his fifth field goal of the season, a 24-yarder in the third quarter. Still starting in place of two other injured quarterbacks, third-stringer Chris Franklin completed 26-of-40 passes for 228 yards but was intercepted four times. Freshman Patrick Robertson had his best day as a Racer, as he caught nine passes for 67 yards. Daniel Ard grabbed five balls and has now had three or more receptions in every game of the season. Nathan Williams had eight tackles on the night and now ranks third nationally in tackles (14.25/game).
