THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

For the second week in a row Jacksonville State quarterback Ryan Perrilloux accounted for five touchdowns (this week four passing, one rushing) as the Gamecocks went on the road and beat Nicholls State 60-10...Perrilloux, who returned to his home state of Louisiana for that game, is now the national leader in passing efficiency...He was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week for the third straight week, becoming the first player to accomplish that feat since Tony Romo did during the 2002 season; he also earned National Player of the Week honors from College Sporting News....No. 20 JSU played its first four games of the season on the road (two against FBS opponents) but will finally play at Paul Snow Stadium this week when they host UT Martin on Saturday; last season Jacksonville State missed an extra point and lost at UTM by one point...The biggest matchup of the week comes from two nationally-ranked teams who are both 2-0 in the OVC; that matchup takes place on Saturday when No. 18 Eastern Kentucky travels to No. 23 Eastern Illinois...Those two teams have combined to win the last four OVC Championships...It marks the first time since Oct. 28, 2006 that two nationally-ranked OVC teams have squared off against each other (in that game No. 12 UT Martin topped No. 14 Eastern Illinois)...EKU improved to 2-1 (2-0) with a win over rival Murray State on Saturday; EKU has now won 21 of its last 22 OVC games dating back to the 2006 season...EIU improved to a perfect 4-0 on the season with a 30-20 road win at Austin Peay; the Panthers, 4-0 for the first time since 1996, are 3-0 in road games this season...Southeast Missouri, coming off a loss at UT Martin, will travel to Tennessee State who is playing its first OVC game of the season...The other matchup features Austin Peay at Tennessee Tech in the first Sgt. York Trophy Series matchup of the 2009 season...The OVC has three teams ranked in the national polls for the second straight week.

THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Ryan Perrilloux, QB • Sr., 6-3, 223 • LaPlace, La. • Jacksonville State

In the return to his home state, Perrilloux accounted for five touchdowns (four passing, one rushing) for the second straight week as Jacksonville State pounded Nicholls State 60-10. He finished the game 14-of-22 for 250 yards and four touchdowns (of 17, 44, 14 and 6 yards) and added 58 rushing yards and a score (38 yard rush) to account for 308 total yards of offense in just three quarters of play (he sat out the fourth quarter). He finished with a passing efficiency of 219.09, the third best total in school history. His 181.55 passing efficiency on the season is No. 1 nationally. He became the first Gamecock to post back-to-back five-touchdown games in school history. Perrilloux accounts for 22.00 points/game for his team, the third best total nationally. Perrilloux has been named OVC Offensive Player of the Week three straight weeks, marking the first time a player has done that since now Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo did for Eastern Illinois from Oct. 5-19, 2002.

DEFENSIVE

Bryan Blanfort, FS • Jr., 6-1, 190 • Miami, Fla. • Southeast Missouri

Blanfort netted a career-high 14 tackles, forced a fumble and had a pass breakup in Southeast Missouri's 29-22 road loss at UT Martin. Blanfort recorded nine tackles in the first half along to help keep the Redhawks close. His crushing hit on a UTM back forced a fumble that led to a Southeast touchdown as the team pulled to within six points early in the fourth quarter.

SPECIALIST

Patrick Tatum, K/P • So., 6-2, 200 • Sylvania, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Tatum had a career game in handling all the kicking duties in Jacksonville State's 60-10 road win over Nicholls State. As a punter he averaged a career-best 47.2 yards/punt on four punts, including booming a long of 55 yards. He pinned two of those punts inside the Nicholls 8-yard line (one at the 2-yard line). As a place kicker Tatum hit six extra points and had 10 kickoffs for a career-best average of 61.6 yards.

CO-NEWCOMER

Jake Christensen, QB • Grad., 6-1, 215 • Lockport, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Christensen helped Eastern Illinois remain perfect on the season with a 30-20 road win over Austin Peay on Saturday. The transfer from Iowa started the game by going 10-of-11 with two touchdown passes as EIU built a 21-0 lead. Christensen finished the game 21-of-36 for 192 yards and those two scores. The win helped the Panthers improve to 4-0 for the first time since the 1996 season. Christensen was named Newcomer of the Week for the second straight week and it marks the third straight week an EIU player has earned the honor.

CO-NEWCOMER

Jamal Young, RS/RB • Jr., 5-7, 175 • Jackson, Miss. • Jacksonville State

Young finished with 217 all-purpose yards, including a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, in Jacksonville State's 60-10 road win over Nicholls State. Young had 130 yards on two kickoff returns, carried the ball 12 times for a team-high 65 yards and caught three passes for 22 yards. The 95-yard kickoff return for a score was the sixth longest in Jax State history. It was the longest scoring play of the season for the Gamecocks.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Ranked Conference Foes Square Off: This weekend two nationally-ranked OVC schools will face off in Charleston, Ill. as No. 18 Eastern Kentucky plays No. 23 Eastern Illinois. This marks the first time since Oct. 28, 2006 that two nationally-ranked OVC foes have squared off against each other. On that date it was No. 12 UT Martin who topped No. 14 Eastern Illinois 15-9 in Martin, Tenn. UTM and EIU went on to share the OVC Championship that season.

JSU's Perrilloux Named National Weekly All-Star By College Sporting News: Jacksonville State's Ryan Perrilloux was named a National Weekly All-Star by the College Sporting News on Sept. 28. In the return to his native Louisiana, Perrilloux accounted for five touchdowns (four passing, one rushing) for the second straight week as Jacksonville State pounded Nicholls State 60-10. He finished the game 14-of-22 for 250 yards and four touchdowns (of 17, 44, 14 and 6 yards) and added 58 rushing yards and a score (38 yard rush) to account for 308 total yards of offense in just three quarters of play (he sat out the fourth quarter). He finished with a passing efficiency of 219.09, the third best total in school history. He became the first Gamecock to post back-to-back five-touchdown games in school history.

Jacksonville State No. 94 in Sagarin Power Rankings: In this week's Sagarin Power Rankings, Jacksonville State comes in at No. 94 among 245 Division I teams (both FBS and FCS schools). That is the highest of any OVC school and the eighth-highest of any Football Championship Subdivision school (UNI is the top FCS team at No. 49). Overall Jax State has the 68th toughest schedule among all 245 Division I teams. Eastern Kentucky is the second-highest rated team at No. 144 while Eastern Illinois is 145.

OVC Teams Among FBS Opponents: OVC schools are 0-7 this season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) opponents, although two of those games went down to the wire with a chance for the OVC team to pull off a win. In week No. 1 Eastern Kentucky had the ball on Indiana's 5-yard line before a fumble ended what looked like to be a for-sure scoring drive. IU held on for a 19-13 victory. During week No. 2 Jacksonville State led Florida State 9-7 for most of the contest before the Seminoles came up with two scores in the final 35 seconds to win 19-9. All-time the OVC is 17-128-1 against FBS opponents. The last time an OVC team knocked off a FBS school was during the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28. The next game against an FBS school for an OVC team is on Oct. 10 when Eastern Illinois plays at Penn State.

NCAA Stat Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical rankings Jacksonville State quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** is now first nationally in passing efficiency (181.55). Perrilloux also ranks third in points responsible for (22.0/game) and ninth in total offense (288.00/game). Austin Peay running back/return specialist **Terrence Holt** is second nationally in all-purpose yards (213.5/game) while Murray State's **Derrick Townsel** is fourth in punt returns (22.29 yards/return). Southeast Missouri punter **Doug Spada** is fourth in punting (44.26 yards/punt), Eastern Kentucky's **Andrew Soucy** is fourth in tackles for loss (2.00/game) while Jacksonville State's **Monte Lewis** is second in forced fumbles (0.75/game) and teammate **Jawaan Booker** is third in fumble recoveries (0.75/game). In national team rankings Eastern Illinois is fifth in total defense (227.75 yards/game), third in scoring defense (10.0 points/game), sixth in kickoff returns (27.44 yards/return), fourth in interceptions thrown (1) and third in third down conversion percentage (52.94%). Jacksonville State ranks sixth in turnover margin (+2.00/game), first in fumbles recovered (12), fourth in interceptions thrown (1), sixth in turnovers gained (12) and first in fourth time conversion defense (0%). Eastern Kentucky is sixth in rushing defense (55.0 yards/game), eighth in scoring defense (13.0 points/game), fourth in interceptions thrown (1) and eighth in tackles for loss (8.67/game). UT Martin is eighth in total offense (432.75 yards/game) and eighth in punt return defense (2.00 yards/return).

Keeping the Interceptions Down: As noted above, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State are tied for fourth nationally in interceptions thrown with just one apiece. The teams have combined to attempt 295 passes on the season, with each just throwing one pick. The teams have also combined for 20 passing touchdowns on the year.

Large Crowds: Several OVC teams have played in front of large crowds this season. That includes Jacksonville State who played in front of 71,420 fans at Florida State on Sept. 12. That marked the fifth largest crowd to ever see an OVC team play. On the same day Murray State played in front of 55,510 at N.C. State and on Sept. 26 Tennessee State played Florida A&M in front of 51,950 at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. Those games marked the 40th time an OVC team had played in front of more than 50,000 fans. A large crowd is expected when Eastern Illinois plays at Penn State on Oct. 10, when Tennessee Tech plays at Georgia on Nov. 7 and Eastern Kentucky plays at Kentucky on the same day.

2009 Marks Third Season For Sgt. York Trophy; First Matchup This Weekend: The 2009 season marks the third season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2009 to claim its second trophy; the Tigers are 5-1 all-time in Sgt. York games. The first Sgt.

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York contest of 2009 will be on Oct. 3 when Austin Peay visits Tennessee Tech. The final will be the last weekend of the season (Nov. 21) when Austin Peay plays at UT Martin.

Murray State's Harris Named National Specialist of the Week: Murray State junior **Marcus Harris** was honored by The Sports Network on Sept. 7 as the FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week. Harris was honored after becoming the first Racer to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game. He accomplished the task by taking a kickoff back 86 yards with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter to put the Racers ahead 52-10. After hauling in a 13-yard touchdown reception on the next Racers' possession, Harris fielded a punt on his own 25 and raced untouched up the middle for the 75-yard touchdown. Harris finished the game with 83 yards on two punt returns and 125 yards on two kickoff returns. He added 17 yard receiving and finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards.

The Safety Dance: No we are not talking about the Men Without Hats song, but the Murray State defense. In the Racers season-opening victory over Kentucky Wesleyan, the defense recorded two safeties which tied the OVC (and Murray State) single-game record done three other times (most recently in 1996 by Middle Tennessee). To put it into perspective on how rare that is, only two OVC schools have had two safeties during an entire season over the last four years.

From Navy Pilot to Assistant Coach: Austin Peay's new offensive graduate assistant coach **Craig Candeto** has spent the last six years in the Navy as a fighter pilot, a member of Strike Fighter Squadron 106 "Gladiators" stationed in Virginia Beach, Va., flying T-34, T-45 and F/A-18 jets. The former lieutenant retired from the Navy earlier this year and now is going from piloting a \$57 million Super Hornet aircraft to taking flight as the Governors quarterbacks coach. But before his military career, Candeto was a sports star in his own right who shares an NCAA record. The Deland, Fla., native was a two-sport prep star, earning the 1999 6A Florida State High School Player of the Year award. He earned an appointment to the Naval Academy, where he enjoyed a storied athletic career. It was at quarterback where Candeto achieved his greatest stardom. In 2002, he rushed for six touchdowns in Navy's 58-12 win against Army—those six rushing TDs matched the NCAA record for rushing TDs by a quarterback. In total, he accounted for seven TDs in the game. Candeto is one of just 26 FBS quarterback to have rushed and pass for 1,000 or more yards, respectively. He earned the 2002 and 2003 Rubino Memorial Silver Helmet award as the Outstanding Football Player at the Naval Academy. As co-captain in 2003, he quarterbacked a Navy football team that won three games in the previous three seasons and guided it to an 8-5 record and its first bowl appearance in seven years. That same Navy team led the nation in rushing. Candeto also is a member of the Navy Athletic Hall of Fame.

Eastern Kentucky Tabbed Preseason Favorite: In what was one of the most balanced votes in the history of preseason OVC balloting (five different teams got at least one first-place votes), defending champion Eastern Kentucky was tabbed the preseason favorite by the league head coaches and sports information directors. EKU received 10 of the 18 first-place votes followed by UT Martin (4 first-place votes), Eastern Illinois (2), Tennessee State (1) and Murray State (1). It marks the 17th time that the Colonels have been picked to win the OVC Championship in the preseason poll. But is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 30 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (40.0%). In each of the last six years, the predicted champion has failed to claim the regular season title. The last time the preseason predicted champion went on to win the title was in 2002 when Eastern Illinois accomplished the feat (EIU also did that same thing in 2001).

end **Austen Lane** was picked as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in both sacks (1.0) and tackles-for-loss (1.83) per game last season. Those two players led the selections of this season's Preseason All-OVC Teams. Murray State had six selections to the team, the most of any OVC school. The Racers were followed by UT Martin who had five selections and Jacksonville State who had four picks. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (8 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2008. Of the 26 total selections, 21 were seniors (including the entire offensive unit), four were juniors and there was one sophomore pick. All nine teams had at least one player appear on the squad.

Head Coaches All Return: For the first time since the 2004 season, every head coach in the OVC returns to coach the same team they did last season. All nine coaches are back including the Dean of OVC Coaches, **Bob Spoo** of Eastern Illinois. Spoo is beginning his 22nd season on the sidelines with the Panthers in 2009 (23rd season overall after missing 2006 with an illness). Spoo is the fifth longest active tenured head coach at the Division I level (tied with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer) and trails only Joe Paterno (at Penn State since 1966), Bob Ford (at Albany since 1973), Bobby Bowden (at Florida State since 1976) and Andy Talley (at Villanova since 1985).

Jacksonville State Ineligible for OVC Championship/Postseason Play: In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State University received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship. Jacksonville State will still play a full Conference schedule in 2009 with wins and losses counting for both teams. They will just not be eligible for the title and will be listed at the bottom of the standings with an asterisk.

JSU's Perrilloux on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Jacksonville State senior quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award is presented to the FCS Offensive Player of the Year. The All-OVC second-team selection last season completed 187-of-297 for 2,318 yards in 2008, which was the third-highest in school history. His 140.88 passing efficiency was ranked 27th nationally and his 244.18 yards of total offense ranked him 28th nationally. The LaPlace, La, native was named OVC Player or Newcomer of the Week seven times during the 2008 season after he led the Gamecocks to an 8-3 record. He enters his senior season as the school's career leader in completion percentage (63.0), passing yards per game (210.7) and total offense per game (244.2). The watch list will be revised in October and again in November before the final ballot is announced. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night prior to the NCAA Division I championship game. The Eddie Robinson Award (top FCS Coach) and Buck Buchanan Award (top FCS Defensive Player) will also be presented that night.

Murray State's Lane on Buck Buchanan Award Watch Lists: Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, honors the best defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award is named after Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame, defensive lineman who played for Grambling State from 1959 through 1962. He was selected to the NFL's All-Time Roster, indicative of his standing as one of the greatest football players of all time. Buchanan died of cancer July 16, 1992. His uniform number, 86, was retired by Kansas City in 1992. Lane has garnered national attention after putting together a 2008 campaign that consisted of school records in sacks (12.0) and tackles-for-loss (22.0), both of which ranked among the national leaders. The efforts earned him Sporting News Fabulous 50 All-America honors, as well as Third-Team All-America honors from the *Associated Press*. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night before the NCAA Division I championship game. The Walter Payton Award and the Eddie Robinson Award will also be presented that night.

Six OVC Schools Have Former FBS Quarterbacks Under Center This Season: This season there are currently six OVC schools with at least one former Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) quarterback competing for the starting job. Three of the quarterbacks are for sure the starter, including **Ryan Perrilloux** (LSU) starting for the second year at Jacksonville State and 2008 OVC Player of the Year **Cade Thompson** (South Carolina) starting for the third year at UT Martin. Two other schools have a pair of former FBS signal callers on the depth chart. That includes Eastern Illinois who has **Jake Christensen** (Iowa) as the starter and **Bodie Reeder** (Wyoming) as the backup while Tennessee Tech who has **Lee Sweeney** (Louisville) as the starter with **Clint Brewster** (Minnesota) on the bench. At Tennessee State **Dominic Grooms** (Missouri) is in the mix at quarterback while **T.C. Jennings** (Arkansas State) is the backup at Austin Peay.

Murray State/UT Martin Game Picked as FCS Game of the Week Radio Broadcast: The Murray State at UT Martin football game on Oct. 24 has been selected for the FCS Game of the Week radio broadcast as announced by David Brody, president and co-founder of Broadcaster Marketing Services. This marks the fourth year for the FCS Game of the Week series. The games are brought to the public by Clear Channel Communications, Gino Communications and Broadcaster Marketing Services and heard on WCKY AM 1530 out of Cincinnati. Frank Santore returns for his fourth year as play-by-play voice.

FCS Playoffs: For the 13th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 18 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 28 and continue with second round games on Dec. 5 and semifinal contests on

Dec. 11/Dec. 12 before the title game. This will mark the final year under the 16-team playoff format. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved a new budget for the Division I Football Championships, which allowed the postseason bracket to expand from 16 to 20 teams beginning in the 2010 season. It marks the first expansion since the playoff field grew from 12 to 16 in 1997. In 2010, the field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8 now) and 10 at-large berths (up from 8 now).

FCS Playoffs - Part 2: The OVC will be looking to get multiple teams into the FCS Playoffs for the third time in four years this season. Last year marked the first time since 2005 that just one OVC team (league champion Eastern Kentucky) made the 16-team playoff field. Two other teams (Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) finished with eight Division I victories but did not receive an at-large bid. It marked the first time since the playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986 that an OVC team with eight Division I teams did not receive an at-large bid. ECU lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round last season.

Eastern Kentucky Searches For 32nd Consecutive Winning Season, 37th Consecutive Non-Losing Season: Eastern Kentucky enters the 2009 season looking for its 32nd consecutive winning season. The team's current streak of 31 consecutive winning season is second in Division I only to the 32-straight by Florida State. Eastern has not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 in 1977. The Colonels also have now had 36 consecutive non-losing seasons, as you have to go back all the way to 1972 to find a year ECU had a losing season (they were 5-6 that year, the only time in the last 42 years they have had a losing season). That streak is currently the longest in all of Division I, as the team overtook Michigan who suffered a losing season for the first time in 41 years in 2008.

The 62nd Season of Football: The 62nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football is underway this season. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2009. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the OVC have claimed at least one championship.

A Look Back at the 2008 Season: For the first time in 61 years of competition, the OVC finished the 2008 season with four teams with eight overall victories. The OVC was one of just two FCS conferences to have four or more teams with eight wins (the CAA was the other, who had five teams reach eight or more wins; each of those five CAA teams made the playoffs while only one OVC school made the field). Eastern Kentucky claimed its 20th OVC Championship (the second most crowns in FCS history trailing only the CAA's UMass who has 21; however, ECU's 16 outright conference crowns are the most in FCS history) and second in a row. The Colonels made their 19th FCS Playoff berth (tied for most all-time with Montana) and lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Sub-division (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC and SportsUnlimited Announce Launch of OVC Football Magazine: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced the launch and production of "Ohio Valley Conference Football 2009" a full-color, limited edition football magazine that previews the 2009 football season. The venture with SportsUnlimited ships in late August. Detailed feature articles on all nine OVC teams are included in the publication. For the first time, OVC football will be featured in a full-color magazine dedicated to its nine schools and suitable for display on your coffee table year round. To order your copy log onto www.collegesportsmags.com. The cost of the publication is \$4.99 plus tax and shipping.

OVCsports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first three seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2009 season, 15 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the season (12 active, 2 practice squad members, one IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout **Tony Romo**, who is the starting quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys and two-time Pro Bowl pick, defensive back **Cortland Finnegan** (Samford) who was a Pro Bowl selection with the Tennessee Titans last year and Tennessee State's **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who was a starter with the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII in February. There is one player on a NFL roster who played in the OVC last season, **Pierre Walters** (Eastern Illinois) who is with the Kansas City Chiefs. **Javarris Williams** (Tennessee State) is also with the Chiefs but as a member of the practice squad to start the season, as is former Tennessee State offensive lineman **Cecil Newton** who is on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad.. Six of nine current OVC schools have at least one player on a NFL roster with Southeast Missouri State leading the way with three. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - **Brad Childress** (Minnesota) and **Sean Payton** (New Orleans). Another EIU alumni - **Mike Shanahan** - is out of coaching this year but should be back with a team in 2010. UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach **Jerry Reese** made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to the Super Bowl XLII Championship in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 93 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (70) is second followed by UT Martin (50) and Murray State (46). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2009 season marks the third of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games.

GAME NOTES: Last season UT Martin forced Jacksonville State kicker Gavin Hallford to miss an extra point in the rain with 4:38 to play and held on for an exciting 31-30 win in front of a national audience on ESPN2. The win kept UT Martin's OVC title hopes alive but kept JSU front a share of the title and most likely kept the Gamecocks out of the FCS Playoffs last year. It was the second win for UTM over Jax State in the last three years after JSU had won five in a row in the series. Overall Jax State controls the all-time series, having won 24 of the 30 matchups. The last two games in the series, however, have been decided by a combined four points. In last year's rain soaked game, then No. 20 Jacksonville State was led by Ryan Perrilloux who was 14-of-29 for 261 yards and two touchdowns while Daniel Jackson ran for 98 yards. UTM quarterback Cade Thompson passed for 275 yards and two scores while Miguel Barnes rushed for 117 yards and a score. This game is the home opener for JSU after four in a row on the road; only two other FCS schools have yet to play a home game at this point in the season. JSU head coach Jack Crowe is 7-2 in Conference openers and 7-2 in home openers since 2000.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After two road losses UT Martin returned home and opened the Conference season with a 29-22 victory over Southeast Missouri on Saturday. After trailing 6-0 in the first quarter, the Skyhawks scored three second quarter touchdowns to open up a 21-6 lead and held off a late Southeast Missouri rally as Aaron High picked off Matt Scheible with nine seconds to play on the Redhawks last drive of the game. UTM racked up 447 yards of total offense including 105 on the ground by Miguel Barnes who scored two touchdowns. It was his second 100-yard outing in a row and third of his career. Cade Thompson completed 22-of-32 passes for 246 yards and a score. He completed passes for 11 different receivers with his former backup, Dexter Anoka, catching nine passes for 113 yards and a touchdown. The team was without leading receiver Mike Hicks who missed his second straight game due to injury. Defensively Josh Bey led UTM with 10 tackles, his second double-digit tackle outing of the season.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: For the second straight week Ryan Perrilloux accounted for five touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing) as Jacksonville State went on the road and thrashed Nicholls State 60-10. Perrilloux was 14-of-22 for 250 yards and ran for 58 yards. The effort earned him his third straight OVC Offensive Player of the Week honors as well as National Player of the Week honors by College Sporting News. Perrilloux was the first OVC player to win the award in three straight weeks since Tony Romo did in 2002. Perrilloux now leads the nation in passing efficiency (181.55). In the last two games Jax State has outscored its opponents 105-23 while scoring 15 touchdowns and averaging 52.5 points a game. In that stretch the team is averaging 489 yards of total offense and 7.4 yards per play. Jamal Young was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week after returning a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown and finishing the game with 217 all-purpose yards. Kicker/punter Patrick Tatum was named OVC Specialist of the Week after averaging 47.2 yards/punt and hitting six extra points. Jacksonville State is now No. 20 in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches polls.

GAME NOTES: In what will be the top game in the OVC so far this season, two nationally-ranked foes will square off in Saturday in Charleston. It marks the first time since Oct. 28, 2006 that two ranked OVC teams have played each other (that time No. 12 UT Martin topped No. 14 Eastern Illinois and both teams went on to share the OVC title that year). ECU and EIU have played 16 times including every year since 1996 when the Panthers joined the Conference. Eastern Kentucky has won the last two meetings, 28-21 in 2007 and 20-7 a year ago. In last year's meeting, ECU led 17-0 at halftime on its way to the victory. The Colonels combined to run for 108 yards with C.J. Walker's 44 leading the way. The two teams have combined to win the last four OVC Championships. ECU enters the game having won 21 of its last 22 OVC games dating back to 2006 (the lone loss was to Tennessee State last year).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky is off to a 2-0 start in the OVC for the third time this decade after wins over Tennessee Tech and Murray State last week. So far this season the Colonels have done it with defense, holding each of its first three opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground, including holding the Racers to 12 yards this past week. Entering this week ECU is sixth nationally in rushing defense (55.0 yards/game). At Murray State on Saturday, the Colonels scored 16 second-quarter points to lead 16-6 at halftime. There was no scoring in either the first or third quarters, but ECU added a touchdown with 14:37 to play to cement the victory. T.J. Pryor took most of the snaps at quarterback, completing 11-of-14 passes for 174 yards and rushing for 35 more yards. The team rushed for 184 total yards with Bruce Frieson rushing for 68 yards and a touchdown and C.J. Walker rushing for 66 yards and two scores. Jordan Dalrymple had six tackles and two sacks to lead ECU while redshirt freshman Justin Bell had two interceptions and three tackles. Eastern Kentucky has climbed to No. 18 in the Sports Network poll and is No. 21 in the FCS Coaches poll.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois won its third straight road game to improve to 4-0 on the season, the team's best start since the 1996 season. That season, the team's first in the OVC, the Panthers finished 8-4 and played in the FCS Playoffs. This past week EIU grabbed a 24-7 lead over Austin Peay at halftime and held on to win 30-20. Jake Christensen was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week (the second straight week he has won the award) after starting the game 10-of-11 and passing for two scores. He finished the game 21-of-36 for 192 yards. The Panthers were limited to just 51 yards on the ground (45 from Mon Williams) but still ranks 16th nationally in rushing offense (179.25 yards/game). The Panthers also rank fifth nationally in total defense (227.75 yards/game) and third nationally in scoring defense (10.0 points/game). That defense got a lift from junior CJ James who blocked a punt that led to his team's first score. Senior kicker Austin Signor not only averaged 63.3 yards per kickoff but was 3-of-3 on field goals, connecting from 34, 42 and 28 yards. He is 5-of-6 on field goal attempts on the season. Eastern Illinois moved up one spot in the Sports Network poll to No. 23 and jumped into the FCS Coaches poll at No. 24.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri State and Tennessee State are each searching for their first OVC victories of the season. Southeast Missouri is 0-2 after losses to Eastern Illinois and UT Martin while Tennessee State has yet to play a Conference game this year. The two teams have played 17 times previously with SEMO holding a 9-8 advantage. Last year the teams (playing for the first time since 2006) played a close game with the Redhawks coming out on top 27-20 in overtime. TSU, ranked No. 19 at the time, led 17-3 with 31 seconds left in the third quarter before Southeast battled back. A Timmy Hollman touchdown reception with 4:42 to play tied the game at 17. However, it looked like the Tigers were going to pull out the win when Eric Benson nailed an 18-yard field goal with 29 seconds to play. But a return to the 43-yard line gave Southeast a chance, and the Redhawks hit a 37-yard field goal as time expired to force overtime. In the extra period quarterback Matt Scheible ran in a score from five yards out (his only offensive play of the game) and the Southeast defense held TSU on four downs to win the game.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri went on the road and lost 29-22 at UT Martin on Saturday. The Redhawks struck first, scoring on a 15-yard pass from Matt Scheible to Miles Edwards. The touchdown was the 11th of Edwards' career moving him into ninth on the Southeast all-time list. But the Skyhawks would score three times in the second quarter to lead 21-6 at the break. A Doug Spada field goal and Mike Jones touchdown pulled the team to within six points (21-15) with 13:55 to play. The teams then traded touchdowns before Southeast got the ball back down seven with 38 seconds to play. But Scheible would be intercepted by Aaron High to end the game with nine seconds to play. Jones carried the ball 15 times for 101 yards (6.7/carry), becoming the first Redhawk to hit the 100-yard plateau this season. Scheible completed 24-of-38 passes for 199 yards. Bryan Blanford was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after netting a career-high 14 tackles, forcing a fumble and registering a pass break-up. His forced fumble led to the team's early fourth quarter touchdown. Spada made a career-long 53-yard field goal on the night and averaged 39.8 yards/punt, including a long of 51. He has had a punt of 50 or more yards in three straight games.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State played its third consecutive game away from home on Saturday, taking on No. 25 Florida A&M in the Atlanta Classic in front of 51,950 at the Georgia Dome. The defenses were pitted evenly early as A&M managed only a field goal in the first quarter before TSU took a second quarter led on a Preston Brown nine-yard touchdown run. After a Rattler score, Calvin McNair punched the ball in from a yard out and TSU led 12-10 at the half. Florida A&M scored once in the third to go on top for good and then added two fourth quarter scores to pad their lead. McNair led the rushing attack, netting 82 yards while Brown added 75 as the team netted 167 on the ground. Returning to action for the first time since suffering an injury the season opener against Alabama A&M, Dominic Grooms completed 9-of-16 passes for 89 yards. John Jones led the team with eight tackles, 2.5 of which were for loss.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay travels to Tennessee Tech in what is the 42nd meeting between the Conference foes all-time. The game marks the first of the Sgt. York Trophy series this season, which pits the four OVC schools in Tennessee against each other. Austin Peay has won each of the last two meetings in the series, both by a field goal. In fact three of the last four meetings have been determined by a touchdown or less. Tennessee Tech last won in 1997, a 36-3 win in Clarksville (the teams did not play from 1998-2006). In last year's 31-28 victory, APSU built a 21-0 lead and later led 31-14 entering the fourth quarter before holding off the Golden Eagles comeback attempt. TTU cut it to three points on a touchdown catch by Tim Benford with 1:33 to play and then recovered the ensuing on-side kick. But kicker Justin Kraemer missed a 32-yard field goal as time expired. Ryan White had 185 yards to lead the Gobs on the ground while Trent Caffee threw for four touchdowns. Tech was led by a 324-yard and three touchdown outing from Lee Sweeney. Head coaches Watson Brown and Rick Christophel have coached on the same staffs at each Mississippi State, Vanderbilt, Austin Peay, Cincinnati, Rice and UAB.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay lost its OVC opener on Saturday falling to No. 24 Eastern Illinois 30-20 at home. The Governors fell behind 21-0 to the Panthers, including getting a punt blocked that set up EIU's first score. It marked the second punt the Gobs have had blocked in 2009. APSU finally got on the board with four minutes to play before halftime when Terrence Holt ran in a touchdown from 13 yards out. Holt finished the game with 224 all-purpose yards (his second highest output of the season) but fumbled twice, the first time in his career he fumbled twice in the same game. Holt remains second nationally in all-purpose yards per game (213.50). Austin Peay's run defense was stout, allowing a season-low 51 yards to the Panthers. It was the lowest output allowed by APSU since Gardner-Webb had only 32 yards in Sept. 2007. EIU had entered the contest eighth nationally in rushing (222 yards/game). Senior cornerback Kevis Buckley had four pass breakups on the night; he now ranks 21st nationally in passes defended (1.50/game). In his first full game as starter, Gary Orr was 18-of-32 for 156 yards and a score. After the game APSU head coach Rick Christophel had to go to the E.R. and get stitches after suffering gashes on his face when being run over by an EIU player on the sideline.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech stepped outside Conference play last week when they traveled to Manhattan, Kan. to battle Kansas State. The Golden Eagles were tied 7-7 with the Wildcats in the first quarter after quarterback Lee Sweeney hit Jamere Hogue for a 19-yard touchdown. But K-State would score 42 unanswered points on its way to the 49-7 victory. Tech was limited to just 107 yards of offense on the afternoon while K-State had 448 yards (296 on the ground). The Golden Eagle rushing attack managed just 28 total yards but netted -19 after sacks were figured in. Sweeney's touchdown pass did help him tie the TTU career record (38). Sophomore receiver Tim Benford caught three passes which extended his streak to 15 games (every game of his career) with at least two catches in a game. Defensively Jake McIntosh led Tech with nine tackles while Howard Griffin and Justin Vann made eight apiece. Tennessee Tech does rank fourth nationally in turnovers lost, having lost only two through three games this season.
