THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

OVC teams were 5-3 in the first week of action with two of the three losses coming against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams...Thursday night saw teams with an offensive explosion as Southeast Missouri (72), Murray State (66) and UT Martin (56) all score 55 or more points in their contests...In its 72-3 victory over Quincy, Southeast Missouri scored 28 points in the first quarter; last season the Redhawks scored just 13 points in the first quarter in 11 total games...In this week's action, Tennessee Tech will play its first game of the season after having a bye during week one; the Golden Eagles host NAIA Pikeville College on Thursday night...Seven other OVC schools are in action on Saturday, including three games against FBS opponents; Jacksonville State travels to Florida State, Murray State plays at N.C. State and Southeast Missouri takes on Cincinnati...The four other games feature OVC teams against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponents as Eastern Illinois battles Indiana State, Austin Peay is at Youngstown State, UT Martin travels to Missouri State and Tennessee State and Jackson State tangle in the Southern Heritage Classic at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis...In the latest set of polls this week, Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State are each ranked in the Top 25 of both major polls...In the Sports Network Poll, eight of nine OVC teams received at least some votes in the poll (Austin Peay was the only school not to receive a vote)...Murray State junior Marcus Harris was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network after returning both a kickoff and punt for a touchdown in the Racers 66-10 victory over Kentucky Wesleyan; Harris became the first player in Racer history to accomplish that feat in the same game.

OFFENSIVE

Jake Christensen, QB • Grad., 6-1, 215 • Lockport, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

In his debut with Eastern Illinois, quarterback Jake Christensen completed 14-of-22 passes for 167 yards and three touchdowns as the Panthers topped in-state rival Illinois State 31-6 on Thursday night. The Iowa transfer spread the ball to nine different receivers and had a long pass of 25 yards. His first EIU touchdown came with 14 seconds left in the first half when he connected on a 10-yard strike to Jimmy Potempa. He also connected on a 12-yard pass to Chris Wright in the third quarter and a 25-yard score to Lorence Ricks in the fourth.

Jeremy Caldwell, DB • So., 5-10, 172 • Chattanooga, Tenn. • Eastern Kentucky

Caldwell tallied two interceptions, including one in his team's own end zone in the third quarter, as No. 24 Eastern Kentucky lost 19-13 at Indiana on Thursday night. His third quarter pick kept the score 19-10 and led to an ECU field goal on the ensuing possession. Caldwell also had six tackles and returned a punt 40 yards late in the second quarter to set up a field goal and trim the IU lead to 19-10.

Marcus Harris, WR • Jr., 6-1, 185 • St. Louis, Mo. • Murray State

Harris returned both a kickoff and punt return for a touchdown in Murray State's 66-10 victory over Kentucky Wesleyan on Thursday night. He became the first-ever Racer to accomplish that task in the same game. With less than three minutes remaining in the third quarter he took the KWC kickoff 86-yards for a touchdown to put Murray State up 52-10. After catching a 13-yard touchdown pass on the Racers next possession he took a Kentucky Wesleyan punt 75 yards for a touchdown to put his team up 66-10 with 11 minutes to play. Harris finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards.

McNair led UT Martin with 148 all-purpose yards in the Skyhawks season-opening 56-0 victory over Iowa Wesleyan on Thursday night. McNair also added two touchdowns, on carries of 5 and 17 yards in the fourth quarter. In total he carried the ball 14 times for 83 yards. McNair also returned two punts for 33 yards, had a kickoff return for 26 yards and one reception for six yards.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Murray State's Harris Named National Specialist of the Week: Murray State junior **Marcus Harris** was honored by The Sports Network on Sept. 7 as the FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week. Harris was honored after becoming the first Racer to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game. He accomplished the task by taking a kickoff back 86 yards with just over three minutes remaining in the third quarter to put the Racers ahead 52-10. After hauling in a 13-yard touchdown reception on the next Racers' possession, Harris fielded a punt on his own 25 and raced untouched up the middle for the 75-yard touchdown. Harris finished the game with 83 yards on two punt returns and 125 yards on two kickoff returns. He added 17 yard receiving and finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards.

OVC Teams Among FBS Opponents: Three OVC schools will square off with Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) opponents this week. Jacksonville State travels to Florida State, Murray State plays at N.C. State and Southeast Missouri battles Cincinnati. All-time the OVC is 17-123-1 against FBS opponents. The last time an OVC team knocked off a FBS school was during the 2004 season when Eastern Illinois beat Eastern Michigan 31-28.

The Safety Dance: No we are not talking about the Men Without Hats song, but the Murray State defense. In the Racers season-opening victory over Kentucky Wesleyan, the defense recorded two safeties which tied the OVC (and Murray State) single-game record done three other times (most recently in 1996 by Middle Tennessee). To put it into perspective on how rare that is, only two OVC schools have had two safeties during an entire season over the last four years.

Eastern Kentucky Tabbed Preseason Favorite: In what was one of the most balanced votes in the history of preseason OVC balloting (five different teams got at least one first-place votes), defending champion Eastern Kentucky was tabbed the preseason favorite by the league head coaches and sports information directors. ECU received 10 of the 18 first-place votes followed by UT Martin (4 first-place votes), Eastern Illinois (2), Tennessee State (1) and Murray State (1). It marks the 17th time that the Colonels have been picked to win the OVC Championship in the preseason poll. But is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 30 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 12 times (40.0%). In each of the last six years, the predicted champion has failed to claim the regular season title. The last time the preseason predicted champion went on to win the title was in 2002 when Eastern Illinois accomplished the feat (EIU also did that same thing in 2001).

Thompson and Lane Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: UT Martin senior quarterback **Cade Thompson**, the 2008 OVC Offensive Player, was tabbed the Preseason Player of the Year this season after throwing for 2,680 yards and 24 touchdowns as a junior. Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** was picked as the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in both sacks (1.0) and tackles-for-loss (1.83) per game last season. Those two players led the selections of this season's Preseason All-OVC Teams. Murray State had six selections to the team, the most of any OVC school. The Racers were followed by UT Martin who had five selections and Jacksonville State who had four picks. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC picks last season (8 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2008. Of the 26 total selections, 21 were seniors (including the entire offensive unit), four were juniors and there was one sophomore pick. All nine teams had at least one player appear on the squad.

Head Coaches All Return: For the first time since the 2004 season, every head coach in the OVC returns to coach the same team they did last season. All nine coaches are back including the Dean of OVC Coaches, **Bob Spoo** of Eastern Illinois. Spoo is beginning his 22nd season on the sidelines with the Panthers in 2009 (23rd season overall after missing 2006 with an illness). Spoo is the fifth longest active tenured head coach at the Division I level (tied with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer) and trails only Joe Paterno (at Penn State since 1966), Bob Ford (at Albany since 1973), Bobby Bowden (at Florida

Jacksonville State Ineligible for OVC Championship/Postseason Play: In May the NCAA announced the Jacksonville State University received a postseason ban due to an occasion three historic penalty of the APR (Academic Progress Rate). In accordance with OVC by-laws, since Jax State is not eligible for the NCAA postseason, they are also not eligible for the OVC Championship. Jacksonville State will still play a full Conference schedule in 2009 with wins and losses counting for both teams. They will just not be eligible for the title and will be listed at the bottom of the standings with an asterisk.

JSU's Perrilloux on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Jacksonville State senior quarterback **Ryan Perrilloux** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award is presented to the FCS Offensive Player of the Year. The All-OVC second-team selection last season completed 187-of-297 for 2,318 yards in 2008, which was the third-highest in school history. His 140.88 passing efficiency was ranked 27th nationally and his 244.18 yards of total offense ranked him 28th nationally. The LaPlace, La, native was named OVC Player or Newcomer of the Week seven times during the 2008 season after he led the Gamecocks to an 8-3 record. He enters his senior season as the school's career leader in completion percentage (63.0), passing yards per game (210.7) and total offense per game (244.2). The watch list will be revised in October and again in November before the final ballot is announced. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night prior to the NCAA Division I championship game. The Eddie Robinson Award (top FCS Coach) and Buck Buchanan Award (top FCS Defensive Player) will also be presented that night.

Murray State's Lane on Buck Buchanan Award Watch Lists: Murray State senior defensive end **Austen Lane** is one of 20 players named to the Preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, honors the best defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award is named after Junious "Buck" Buchanan, the NAIA All-American and Pro Football Hall of Fame, defensive lineman who played for Grambling State from 1959 through 1962. He was selected to the NFL's All-Time Roster, indicative of his standing as one of the greatest football players of all time. Buchanan died of cancer July 16, 1992. His uniform number, 86, was retired by Kansas City in 1992. Lane has garnered national attention after putting together a 2008 campaign that consisted of school records in sacks (12.0) and tackles-for-loss (22.0), both of which ranked among the national leaders. The efforts earned him Sporting News Fabulous 50 All-America honors, as well as Third-Team All-America honors from the *Associated Press*. Voting from a panel of FCS sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other football experts will be conducted after the regular season ends. Three finalists will be announced on Nov. 30 and will be invited to the 23rd annual Sports Network Awards banquet on Dec. 17 in Chattanooga, Tenn., the night before the NCAA Division I championship game. The Walter Payton Award and the Eddie Robinson Award will also be presented that night.

Six OVC Schools Have Former FBS Quarterbacks Under Center This Season: This season there are currently six OVC schools with at least one former Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) quarterback competing for the starting job. Three of the quarterbacks are for sure the starter, including **Ryan Perrilloux** (LSU) starting for the second year at Jacksonville State and 2008 OVC Player of the Year **Cade Thompson** (South Carolina) starting for the third year at UT Martin. Two other schools have a pair of former FBS signal

At Tennessee State **Dominic Grooms** (Missouri) is in the mix at quarterback while **T.C. Jennings** (Arkansas State) is in the mix at Austin Peay.

Murray State/UT Martin Game Picked as FCS Game of the Week Radio Broadcast: The Murray State at UT Martin football game on Oct. 24 has been selected for the FCS Game of the Week radio broadcast as announced by David Brody, president and co-founder of Broadcaster Marketing Services. This marks the fourth year for the FCS Game of the Week series. The games are brought to the public by Clear Channel Communications, Gino Communications and Broadcaster Marketing Services and heard on WCKY AM 1530 out of Cincinnati. Frank Santore returns for his fourth year as play-by-play voice.

FCS Playoffs: For the 13th straight season, the FCS Championship game was held in Chattanooga, Tenn., this year on Friday, Dec. 18 at Finley Stadium/Davenport Field. The playoffs will begin on Saturday, Nov. 28 and continue with second round games on Dec. 5 and semifinal contests on Dec. 11/Dec. 12 before the title game. This will mark the final year under the 16-team playoff format. In April 2008 the NCAA Board of Directors approved a new budget for the Division I Football Championships, which allowed the postseason bracket to expand from 16 to 20 teams beginning in the 2010 season. It marks the first expansion since the playoff field grew from 12 to 16 in 1997. In 2010, the field will be comprised of 10 automatic bids (up from 8 now) and 10 at-large berths (up from 8 now).

FCS Playoffs - Part 2: The OVC will be looking to get multiple teams into the FCS Playoffs for the third time in four years this season. Last year marked the first time since 2005 that just one OVC team (league champion Eastern Kentucky) made the 16-team playoff field. Two other teams (Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) finished with eight Division I victories but did not receive an at-large bid. It marked the first time since the playoffs expanded to 16 teams in 1986 that an OVC team with eight Division I teams did not receive an at-large bid. ECU lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round last season.

2009 Marks Third Season For Sgt. York Trophy: The 2009 season marks the third season for the Sgt. York Trophy, a challenge trophy which will go to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools, and in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy. In 2007, Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season. Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2009 to claim its second trophy; the Tigers are 5-1 all-time in Sgt. York games. The first Sgt. York contest of 2009 will be on Oct. 3 when Austin Peay visits Tennessee Tech. The final will be the last weekend of the season (Nov. 21) when Austin Peay plays at UT Martin.

Eastern Kentucky Searches For 32nd Consecutive Winning Season, 37th Consecutive Non-Losing Season: Eastern Kentucky enters the 2009 season looking for its 32nd consecutive winning season. The team's current streak of 31 consecutive winning season is second in Division I only to the 32-straight by Florida State. Eastern has not had a non-winning season since finishing 5-5 in 1977. The Colonels also have now had 36 consecutive non-losing seasons, as you have to go back all the way to 1972 to find a year ECU had a losing season (they were 5-6 that year, the only time in the last 42 years they have had a losing season). That streak is currently the longest in all of Division I, as the team overtook Michigan who suffered a losing season for the first time in 41 years in 2008.

The 62nd Season of Football: The 62nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football is underway this season. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2009. Since its beginning, 14 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the OVC have claimed at least one championship.

A Look Back at the 2008 Season: For the first time in 61 years of competition, the OVC finished the 2008 season with four teams with eight overall victories. The OVC was one of just two FCS conferences to have four or more teams with eight wins (the CAA was the other, who had five teams reach eight or more wins; each of those five CAA teams made the playoffs while only one OVC school made the field). Eastern Kentucky claimed its 20th OVC Championship (the second most crowns in FCS history trailing only the CAA's UMass who has 21; however, EKU's 16 outright conference crowns are the most in FCS history) and second in a row. The Colonels made their 19th FCS Playoff berth (tied for most all-time with Montana) and lost to eventual national champion Richmond in the first round.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC and SportsUnlimited Announce Launch of OVC Football Magazine: The Ohio Valley Conference has announced the launch and production of "Ohio Valley Conference Football 2009" a full-color, limited edition football magazine that previews the 2009 football season. The venture with SportsUnlimited ships in late August. Detailed feature articles on all nine OVC teams are included in the publication. For the first time, OVC football will be featured in a full-color magazine dedicated to its nine schools and suitable for display on your coffee table year round. To order your copy log onto www.collegesportsmags.com. The cost of the publication is \$4.99 plus tax and shipping.

OVCsports.TV: For the fourth consecutive year, fans can watch every Conference matchup and all non-conference home contests at OVCsports.TV. The venture with JumpTV Sports allows fans to access live and on-demand streaming video and audio of all conference matchups on their home computer. The premium Web site was launched in July 2006 and streamed over a thousand events in its first three seasons, including all Conference matchups in football and men's and women's basketball as well as select baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball games and OVC Championship events. Packages are available on a yearly, seasonally, monthly or per-event basis.

NFL Connections: As of the start of the 2009 season, 15 former Ohio Valley Conference football players are on NFL rosters for the season (12 active, 2 practice squad members, one IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout **Tony Romo**, who is the starting quarterback of the Dallas Cowboys and two-time Pro Bowl pick, defensive back **Cortland Finnegan** (Samford) who was a Pro Bowl selection with the Tennessee Titans last year and Tennessee State's **Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie**, who was a starter with the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII in February. There is one player on a NFL roster who played in the OVC last season, **Pierre Walters** (Eastern Illinois) who is with the Kansas City Chiefs. **Javarris Williams** (Tennessee State) is also with the Chiefs but as a member of the practice squad to start the season, as is former Tennessee State offensive lineman **Cecil Newton** who is on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad.. Six of nine current OVC schools have at least one player on a NFL roster with Southeast Missouri State leading the way with three. Several NFL coaches also have connections to OVC schools, including two current ones who played at Eastern Illinois - **Brad Childress** (Minnesota) and **Sean Payton** (New Orleans). Another EIU alumni - **Mike Shanahan** - is out of coaching this year but should be back with a team in 2010. UT Martin graduate and former assistant coach **Jerry Reese** made waves in 2007 when he led the New York Giants to the Super Bowl XLII Championship in his first season as General Manager with the franchise.

SCORING STREAKS

Jacksonville State currently has a streak of scoring in 98 consecutive games, the longest streak of any OVC school. Eastern Illinois (67) is second followed by UT Martin (47) and Murray State (43). Below is a list of each OVC school and their current scoring streak; that list is followed by the longest FCS scoring streaks in NCAA history.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2009 season marks the third of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's O'Charley's Dinner of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play last year. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games.

SCOUTING PIKEVILLE: Pikeville College is a member of the NAIA and competes in the Mid-South Conference. The Bears opened the season last week by hosting Division II Brevard College, losing 40-3 at home. Pikeville was held to just 75 yards of total offense for the game and seven total first downs. The team got its lone points on a 44-yard field goal by Kyle Chilton with 14:11 to play in the second quarter to cut the lead to 14-3.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech had the rare occurrence of not playing the opening week of the 2009 season. The Golden Eagles were ideal and begin play this Thursday night when they host Pikeville College. Tech is under the direction of Watson Brown, who enters his third year in Cookeville. Overall it is Brown's 25th year as a head coach, including stops at Austin Peay, Cincinnati, Rice, Vanderbilt and UAB. This season Brown will have 46 lettermen back from last year's team that was 3-9 overall and 1-7 in the OVC. Tech has junior defensive end Charlie Seivers returning; Seivers was a Preseason All-OVC selection this year. Also back is honorable mention preseason All-American Henry Sailes who returns kicks as well as plays running back. The offense also gets a spark from sophomore wideout Tim Benford, last year's OVC Freshman of the Year.

GAME NOTES: This will be the 83rd meeting between the schools separated by just over 50 miles. The teams have played every year since 2000 and in 27 of the last 29 years. But the series is not being renewed and this might be the last time the squad's play each other for awhile. EIU has won the last four in a row in the series including a 38-3 victory in Charleston a season ago.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois got the season underway with a 31-6 victory over Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) foe Illinois State on Thursday. The victory over their rival was the biggest for the Panthers in the rivalry since 2002 (when they won 45-10). Iowa transfer Jake Christensen made an impact at quarterback right away, completing 14-of-22 passes for 167 yards and three touchdowns as he earned OVC Player of the Week honors. Christensen ran a key two-minute drive late in the first half to set up a score for EIU. Also impressive was Florida transfer Mon Williams who carried the ball 16 times for 87 yards and a touchdown. Chevon Walker, a transfer from Florida who was with the program last year, had 68 yards rushing on 10 attempts. Christensen found nine different targets on the night, with Michigan transfer Jim Potempa pulling down a team-best three including a touchdown. Nick Nasti led the way with nine tackles and a fumble recovery for EIU. Eastern Illinois is still receiving votes in both national FCS polls. They took the biggest leap in the Sports Network poll, coming in unofficially at No. 28.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE: Indiana State enters this week's game with a 28-game losing streak, the longest in the country. The Sycamores are one of three Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams with losing streaks over 10 games (Dartmouth and St. Francis (PA) have both lost 12 in a row). After opening the season two weeks ago with a loss to Quincy (a team Southeast Missouri State beat last week), the team showed improvement in battling Football Bowl Subdivision foe Louisville. Indiana State had a 7-3 lead in the first quarter but could not hold on in losing 30-10. Defensive back Santino Davis had two interceptions against the Cardinals on the night, including one that set up the team's first touchdown. On defense Aaron Archie had 11 tackles to lead the Sycamores.

GAME NOTES: Old rivals will meet for the first time since 1987 on Saturday. The two teams have played eight previous times but not since a 20-18 Youngstown victory in 1987 in the last season that YSU was a member of the OVC.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay started its season with a 34-23 victory over Newberry College on Saturday night. It was just the team's fourth season-opening victory in the past 15 years but the second in three years under head coach Rick Christophel. The team did it with a top notch rushing attack as the Governors had 371 rushing yards on the night. Sophomore Ryan White carried the ball 23 times for 210 yards (9.1 ypc) while junior Terrence Holt carried the ball 15 times for 156 yards (10.1 ypc) and two touchdowns. It marked the first time since Sept. 10, 2005 that APSU had two rushers with more than 100 yards and the team had 300 or more rushing yards in a contest. White's 310 yards was the first 200-yard rushing game since Jay Bailey had 201 yards against Davidson in 2002. It was the first scholarship player to do it since Jacob Dickson had 226 yards against UT Martin in 1996 (Austin Peay played non-scholarship football from 1997 through 2005). Holt had a 75-yard touchdown run on the night, the longest for the team since 2005. He finished the game with 288 all-purpose yards. Quarterback Trent Caffee was efficient, completing 6-of-12 passes for 84 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Amius Smith had nine tackles to lead the team; he also added two pass break-ups. The team's first score of the season came just 16 seconds into the game as senior linebacker Kit Hartsfield returned a Newberry fumble 24 yards for a score. It was the fourth straight game (dating back to last season) that Austin Peay had a fumble recovery in a game.

SCOUTING YOUNGSTOWN STATE: The Penguins opened their season at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Pittsburgh, losing 38-3 at Heinz Field on Saturday. Senior quarterback Brandon Summers completed 11-of-22 passes for 113 yards while senior running back Kevin Smith had 47 yards on 17 carries. Junior Sir DeMarco Bledsoe led the YSU defense with a career-high nine tackles. Youngstown State was picked to finish six in the Missouri Valley Football Conference preseason poll. The last time YSU was picked sixth (2005), they tied for the Conference championship.

GAME NOTES: Missouri State and UT Martin are playing for the sixth time ever and the second time in the last three seasons. The teams played in Martin during the 2007 season with the Bears coming out on top 51-44 in a shootout. Missouri State has won all five prior meetings by a margin of 231-78. This game marks the first of two straight against OVC opponents for Missouri State, who will host Murray State next week.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin opened the 2009 season with a 56-0 shutout over Iowa Wesleyan. It marked the first time in four years under head coach Jason Simpson that the Skyhawks had opened the season at home (instead of facing a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent on the road). The shutout was the third under Simpson and first since blanking NAIA foe Baker by an identical 56-0 score a season ago. UTM held Iowa Wesleyan to just 74 yards of total offense and had 11 tackles for loss on the night. On the other hand, UT Martin racked up 555 yards of total offense as a unit. Senior running back Miguel Barnes had 115 yards and three touchdowns while redshirt freshman Jason McNair (nephew of the late Steve McNair) carried the ball 14 times for 83 yards and two scores. McNair had 148 all-purpose yards on the night after also returning punts and kicks. OVC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Cade Thompson completed 21-of-34 passes for 273 yards and three scores. His favorite target, All-OVC senior Mike Hicks, had five catches for 108 yards and a score. UT Martin had 11 different players catch at least one pass on the evening. Thompson also handled punting duties for the Skyhawks, punting twice for an average of 39.5 yards per punt. Josh Bey led the way with eight tackles (two for loss), 1.5 sacks and two quarterback hurries.

SCOUTING MISSOURI STATE: Missouri State was picked eighth in the nine-team Missouri Valley Football Conference preseason poll. The Bears opened the season against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Arkansas at a neutral site in Little Rock, Ark., falling 48-10 to the Razorbacks. Quarterback Cody Kirby completed 12-of-20 passes for 107 yards and was picked off twice. Running backs Chris Douglas (38 yards) and Mikael Cooper-Falls (34 yards) led a balanced rushing attack. On the defensive side of the ball, Antoine Wilkinson had 11 stops (8 solo) to lead Missouri State.

GAME NOTES: The Jacksonville State Gamecocks are playing their second straight ACC opponent after opening the season with Georgia Tech last week. This week they travel to Tallahassee to battle nationally-ranked Florida State. The two teams have played only once before, a 7-0 Jax State victory during the 1947 season.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Having opened the season with a loss to nationally-ranked (No. 15) Georgia Tech, Jacksonville State turns around and faces another nationally-ranked team from the Atlantic Coast Conference this week when they battle Florida State. This week the team will have starting quarterback Ryan Perrilloux back under center; Perrilloux was suspended for the Georgia Tech game. In his place sophomore Marques Ivory completed 22-of-38 passes for 193 yards and two touchdowns. He found James Wilkerson six times, as Wilkerson hauled in 70 yards worth of catches to lead the Gamecocks. Calvin Middleton was the leading rusher for the squad, carrying the ball 11 times for 59 yards. In all, 14 players made their Jax State debut last Saturday and four made their first career start. Georgia Tech scored 31 of its 37 points in the first half, before JSU limited the Yellow Jackets to just six points in the second half. It marked the most points allowed in the first half by JSU since Mississippi State scored 32 points in the first half of a 2002 contest. The Georgia Tech game was the 100th for head coach Jack Crowe at Jacksonville State.

SCOUTING FLORIDA STATE: Florida State will enter Saturday's game on short rest, having opened their season on Labor Day Monday night against arch rival Miami (giving JSU two more days rest). The Seminoles are coached by legend Bobby Bowden who enters his 43rd year as a head coach (33rd at FSU) in 2009. Bowden has won 382 career games and lost just 123 in those 43 years. Florida State returns 39 lettermen from last year's team that was 9-4 overall and topped Wisconsin 42-12 in the Champs Sports Bowl. FSU is ranked No. 18/19 in the national FBS polls prior to the Miami contest.

GAME NOTES: Murray State travels to North Carolina State on Saturday for the first meeting between the schools.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State got the season off to a good start with a 66-10 victory over Division II Kentucky Wesleyan last Thursday night. The 66 points scored by the Racers was the most ever in a season opener. What may be more impressive is that Murray State found seven different ways to put points on the board during the game (field goal, fumble recovery, safety, rushing, passing, kickoff return and punt return). The team also equaled a MSU and OVC record with two safeties in the contest while the defense had three interceptions and a fumble recovery. Marcus Harris was named Sports Network National and OVC Specialist of the Week after he became the first Murray State player to ever return a punt and kickoff return for a touchdown in the same game. Harris returned a kickoff 86 yards for a score, then on the next MSU possession catch a 13-yard touchdown pass and on the ensuing KWC possession he returned a punt 75 yards for a score. He finished the game with 225 all-purpose yards. Senior running back Charlie Jordan recorded his fifth 100-yard rushing game with 116 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries. He was the first Racer to rush for 100 or more yards in the season opener since 2004. On defense, the Racers limited Kentucky Wesleyan to just 12 yards passing. Senior linebacker Tamar Butler had a career-high 17 tackles (including 13 in the first half). Buck Buchanan Award candidate Austen Lane had seven tackles, a tackle-for-loss, a forced fumble and two quarterback hurries.

SCOUTING N.C. STATE: The Wolfpack opened the season last Thursday night when a 7-3 loss at home to South Carolina. N.C. State gained just 133 yards of total offense on the night, getting a 43-yard field goal with 56 seconds left in the third quarter as their only score. But the Pack's defense was solid too, allowing just 256 yards to the Gamecocks. South Carolina's only score was a 1-yard touchdown run with 9:10 to play in the opening quarter; that play came after a N.C. State fumble gave the Gamecocks good field position.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Jackson State will play in the 20th annual Southern Heritage Classic Saturday night in the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. This marks the 16th year in a row (and 18th overall) that the teams have squared off in this Classic which began in 1990 (the two other games were between TSU and Mississippi Valley State and Grambling). Tennessee State was won six straight in the series including last year's 34-20 victory in the game played in front of over 50,000 people. Prior to TSU's 14-point victory a season ago, the four prior matchups had been decided by a combined 11 points (including two games that went into overtime). Tennessee State is 10-9 all-time in the event while Jackson State is 7-10. The all-time series between the two schools is 24-18-2 in favor of Tennessee State.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State began the season by hosting the annual John Merritt Classic, falling 24-7 to Alabama A&M in front of over 23,000 people at LP Field in Nashville. The Tigers finished with 191 yards of total offense on the night, but committed eight penalties and converted on 4-of-14 on third down. Starting quarterback Dominic Grooms left the game with an injury in the first half and was replaced by Jeremy Perry. Perry completed 10-of-30 passes for 136 yards and two interceptions. The Tigers lone touchdown of the night came on a 78-yard fumble recovery by junior Eugene Clifford. Clifford also added seven tackles on the evening. The 78-yard fumble recovery was the longest in school history.

SCOUTING JACKSON STATE: Jackson State, the preseason favorites in the SWAC, started the season with a 45-7 loss to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Mississippi State. MSU jumped out to a 38-0 lead before Terrence Davis scored on a 16-yard run with 8:27 remaining in the game. Trae Rutland led the Tigers in rushing, carrying the ball 14 times for 46 yards. Rutland also completed eight passes for 132 yards. Malcolm Palmer led Jackson State with 11 tackles, a fumble recovery and a pass break-up.

GAME NOTES: For the second time in three years, Southeast Missouri will travel to Nippert Stadium to take on the Bearcats. The first meeting between the teams came in 2007 when Cincinnati won 59-3.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri got the season off to a good start last Thursday by smoking Quincy 72-3 at Houck Stadium. The 72 points were a modern day record for the Redhawks. After scoring only 13 points in the first quarter in 11 total games in 2008, Southeast scored 28 first quarter points against Quincy and led 58-0 at halftime. Making just his third career start, quarterback Matt Scheible completed 11-of-18 passes for a career-high 222 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for another score. In the first quarter alone he was 6-of-7 for 114 yards. Running back Henry Harris ran for 88 yards and a career-best three touchdowns on just 11 carries. Harris averaged 8.0 yards per carry in just his third career start. Junior linebacker Justin Woodlief recorded a game-high 10 tackles in his Redhawk debut. The transfer from San Jose State registered four of his tackles to key a big goal line stand at the end of the game. Senior All-American punter/kicker Doug Spada scored a career-high 12 points in the victory. He was 9-of-10 on point after attempts and kicked a 20-yard field goal.

SCOUTING CINCINNATI: Cincinnati opened the 2009 season by playing fellow Big East foe Rutgers on Monday afternoon. The Bearcats were winning big late in the third quarter when these previews were finished. Head coach Brian Kelly has been named Big East Coach of the Year each of the past two seasons and is 22-6 entering his third year with the Bearcats. Cincinnati won the Big East Championship a year ago and lost to Virginia Tech in the Orange Bowl.
