CUTHBERT VICTOR • F, SR., 6'5, 220 • ST. CROIX, VIRGIN ISLANDS • MURRAY STATE

Victor shot a blistering 65.6 percent while averaging a double-double as Murray State recorded OVC wins over Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State. The senior forward went 10-of-12 from the field against the Colonels, finishing with 22 points, 15 boards, six blocked shots and four assists. Versus the Eagles, Victor hit 9-of-14 floor and 8-of-12 free throw attempts for 26 points and 17 rebounds, 10 of which were offensive caroms. Victor also had nine points and four rebounds in a non-conference loss at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

JARED NEWSON • G/F, SO., 6'5, 215 • BELLEVILLE, IL • TENNESSEE-MARTIN

Newson shot an even 50 percent as stretched his streak of double-figure scoring games to nine with back-to-back 20+ scoring performances in wins over Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky. Against the Eagles, the sophomore guard/forward collected his second double-double of the season with 20 points and 13 rebounds. He followed that with 25 points and five boards versus EKU.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

BRUCE PRICE • G, FR., 6'3, 205 • MINNEAPOLIS, MN • TENNESSEE STATE

Price averaged 21.5 points a game in a pair of tough OVC losses to Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech. The freshman guard went 15-of-17 from the foul line as part of a 23-point effort against APSU, then scored 16 of his 20 points in the second half of a one-point loss to Tech. Price also collected 12 rebounds, eight assists and two steals.

AROUND THE OVC...

AUSTIN PEAY (12-7 overall, 9-0 OVC): First-place Austin Peay continues to rack up the wins, escaping with a 58-56 victory at Tennessee Tech and claiming a 65-54 win at Tennessee State...The Governors have won 15 straight against OVC opposition, including tournament games, and their 12-game regular-season OVC win streak equals a school-record run set in 1976-77...After seeing his streak of 43 consecutive games with a blocked shot end at Tech, senior center Josh Lewis (Lexington, KY) responded with a career-tying six rejections in the TSU contest, marking the sixth time in his career he recorded six blocks in a single game. He has 223 career rejections, tying him for second place on the OVC's all-time chart...Junior guard Anthony Davis (Inglewood, CA) averaged 15 points and 6.5 rebounds a game last week. He became the 24th APSU player to top 1,000 career points, joining Henning as the second Gov to reach that milestone this season...APSU shot a season-high 54.2 percent (13-of-24) from the field in the first half of the TTU contest, marking the first time this year the Govs had converted more than 50 percent of their first-half field goal attempts against an OVC opponent...The Govs' nine-game win streak currently ranks 10th-best in the nation, while their 21-game home win streak is sixth. APSU puts both on the line this week as the Govs entertain Jacksonville State and Samford.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (3-15 overall, 1-7 OVC): Eastern Illinois remains in search of its first OVC road win following a pair of setbacks at Samford (73-69) and Jacksonville State (78-73)...The Panthers find themselves in the midst of a seven-game slide and in last place in the OVC...All five EIU starters scored in double figures at JSU, led by senior forward/center Jesse Mackinson's (Ponticac, IL) double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds...Josh Gomes (Indianapolis, IN) netted a team-high 16 points at Samford. The sophomore guard has been the squad's top scorer in seven contests this season, including five OVC games, and leads the Panthers with a 12.1 scoring average...The Panthers have converted 16 more field goals this season than their opponents (455-439), but have been outscored at the free throw line, 326-198...EIU's 73 points at Jax State marked the second-highest total for the Panthers in conference play this season, following their 83-point effort in a Jan. 8 victory over Tennessee Tech...The Panthers return home for a pair against Murray State and Tennessee-Martin.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (8-11 overall, 3-5 OVC): Eastern Kentucky fell into a three-way tie for seventh place in the OVC standings after losses at Murray State (94-70) and Tennessee-Martin (76-74)...Junior reserve Ben Rushing (Clinton, KY) went 5-of-11 from 3-point range in the two contests, moving him into third place on the school's list for career treys with 147...Senior guard Mike Scott (Baltimore, MD) produced back-to-back double-figure scoring efforts for only the second time this season, averaging 14.5 points per game...Junior forward Michael Haney (Madisonville, KY) tallied his fourth double-double of the season with 21 points and 10 rebounds at UTM, giving him double-dips in both of this year's meetings with the Skyhawks...EKU has recorded double digits in assists in nine of the last 10 games and is averaging 19.2 helpers per game over the last five outings...The Colonels failed to block a shot in either contest, ending a streak of 20 straight games with at least one rejection that dated back to last season...EKU plays a single date Tuesday at in-state rival Morehead State.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (11-9 overall, 4-5 OVC): Jacksonville State improved to 9-2 at home and climbed into sixth place in league action with back-to-back wins over Southeast Missouri (79-64) and Eastern Illinois (78-73)...Junior forward Carl Brown (Birmingham, AL) went 13-of-15 from the free throw line as he paced Jax State with 15.5 points and seven rebounds a game...Sophomore guard Walker Russell (Rochester, MI) shot 47.8 percent from the field, including a 7-of-10 effort versus EIU, to average 15 points, six assists and 4.5 rebounds each time out...Gamecock seniors Scott Watson (107), Emerson Brown (106) and Josh Perry (104) have played in 100 games for Jax State since arriving on the JSU campus for the 2000-01 season. Watson (Gilbert, AZ) set the school's Division I record for most games played with his start versus Southeast last Thursday. Just seven other teams at the Division I level currently boast at least three individuals with 100+ games played in their career...The SEMO-JSU contest marked the first meeting between the two squads since Jax State sank a half-court shot at the buzzer to defeat Southeast in the first round of the 1985 NCAA Division II Tournament quarterfinals en route to the national title...JSU is on the road for its next four, starting with trips to Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech.

MOREHEAD STATE (9-10 overall, 4-4 OVC): Morehead State slipped into a two-way tie for fourth place in the OVC after closing out a four-game road stretch with setbacks at Tennessee-Martin (72-64) and Murray State (90-76)...Senior guard Chez Marks (Paris, KY) averaged 19 points a game for the week, moving him into 18th place on the school's career scoring list with 1,179 points...Senior guard/forward Ricky Minard (Mansfield, OH) climbed into ninth place on the OVC's all-time scoring chart (2,119 points). He contributed 16 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.5 steals a game last week while committing just three turnovers in 74 minutes of playing time...Despite feeling less than 100 percent, junior forward Chad McKnight averaged 15 points and 5.5 boards a game, including a career-high 21 points and nine caroms at UTM...The Eagles were outrebounded, 88-48, in the two contests...Senior forward Josh Graham (Flemingsburg, KY) was dismissed from the Morehead State program for "conduct detrimental to the team." He had played in 16 games (3.7 ppg/4.4 rpg)...The Eagles return to open a four-game homestand against Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State.

MURRAY STATE (17-4 overall, 7-1 OVC): Murray State retains sole possession of second place, a game and a half behind league-leading Austin Peay, after victories over Eastern Kentucky (94-70) and Morehead State (90-76). Earlier in the week, the Racers dropped a non-conference decision at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (80-68)...After digging themselves a 42-29 halftime hole against EKU, the Racers outscored the Colonels 65-28 over the final 20 minutes for the win...Senior forward Cuthbert Victor (St. Croix, Virgin Islands) registered back-to-back double-doubles while averaging 24 points and 16 points a game and shooting 73 percent from the field (19-of-26) in the two OVC contests. He hauled in 10 offensive boards against the Eagles and blocked six shots versus the Colonels...Senior guard Chris Shumate (Louisville, KY) became the third Racer in 2003-04 to score his 1,000th career point, joining Victor and senior forward Antione Whelchel (Gainesville, GA), who reached the milestone earlier this season...With nine regular-season games left to play, Murray State has already equaled last year's win total (17)...The Racers open a five-game road stretch at Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri. Saturday's SEMO-MUR contest will be regionally televised on Fox Sports Net South at 2 p.m. Central.

SAMFORD (10-9 overall, 5-3 OVC): Samford vaulted into third place in the OVC standings after closing out a four-game homestand with wins over Eastern Illinois (73-69) and Southeast Missouri (70-58)...Senior center Phillip Ramelli (New Orleans, LA) has scored 20+ points in his last three outings as he shot 58 percent from the field (15-of-26) and led the Bulldogs with 21.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per game last week. He went 10-of-12 from the charity stripe, snapping a string of 22 consecutive made free throws...Ramelli and Tyson Dorsey (Brantford, Ontario) led the Bulldogs with 13.5 points per game in OVC action...Sophomore forward J. Robert Merritt (Oklahoma City, OK) showed signs of breaking out of his shooting slump with a 4-of-7 three-point effort and 18 points versus Southeast...Senior guard Eddie Harper (Laurel, MS) tossed in a career-high 19 points against ElU...Freshman guard Jerry Smith (Picayune, MS) contributed 12 points, five boards and six assists in the two contests...The Bulldogs committed a season-low six turnovers against Southeast...Samford embarks on a four-game road swing, beginning with dates at Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (9-10 overall, 2-6 OVC): Tenth-place Southeast Missouri finished 0-4 on its recent road swing, culminating with losses at Jacksonville State (79-64) and Samford (70-58)...Junior guard Derek Winans (East Cape Girardeau, IL) moved into 14th place on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,126 points. He went 12-of-24 from the field and led the Indians with 15.5 points per game...Senior center Brandon Griffin (Greensburg, LA) produced 13.5 points and 7.5 rebounds each time out. He is shooting a blistering 68 percent from the field (38-of-56) over his last six outings...Cape Girardeau Mayor Jay Knudtson has proclaimed this week as "Rivals Week" with Tennessee-Martin and Murray State visiting the Show Me Center to open a three-game homestand. Saturday's game against the Racers will be regionally-televised on Fox Sports Net South. Fans can also pick up a tape-delayed broadcast of the contest at 2 a.m. Central time on Sunday, Jan. 8, on Fox Sports Net Midwest.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (8-12 overall, 3-5 OVC): Tennessee-Martin has recovered nicely from its OVC-opening five-game slide, picking up wins over Morehead State (72-64) and Eastern Kentucky (76-74) to push its win streak to a season-high three games...Sophomore foward **Jared Newson** (Belleville, IL) has scored double digits in each of his last nine games, tallying his second double-double of the season versus the Eagles (20 pts./13 rbds.). In the EKU contest, he tied the game with just over a minute to play and gave the Skyhawks their first lead with 34 seconds remaining, finishing with 25 points and five rebounds...Sophomore center **Cleve Woodfork** (St. Louis, MO) contributed 10 points and 5.5 rebounds a game in the two contests...Junior guard **Jeremy Kelly** (Louisville, KY) broke into the school's Top-10 lists for steals and made 3-pointers. He currently ranks ninth with 108 thefts and 10th with 64 treys, and also moved into seventh place for career 3-point attempts (205)...Tied for seventh in the league standings, the Skyhawks hit the road for four straight games, starting with trips to Southeast Missouri and Eastern Illinois.

TENNESSEE STATE (4-15 overall, 3-5 OVC): Tennessee State went 0-4 during its recent homestand to fall into a tie for seventh place in the league rankings. Last week, the Tigers dropped a pair of tough meetings with Austin Peay (65-54) and Tennessee Tech (77-76)...Freshman guard **Bruce Price** (Minneapolis, MN) averaged 21.5 points, six rebounds and four assists for the week. He scored 16 of his 20 points against Tech in the second half as TSU rallied from a double-digit deficit to take the lead before the Golden Eagles escaped with the one-point win...There were 11 lead changes in the TTU contest...Against APSU, the Tigers trailed by just two points midway through the second half before the Govs pulled away for the win...Junior forward **Roshaun Bowens** (Nashville, TN) crossed the 1,000-point plateau, becoming the 22nd TSU player to reach the milestone while joining teammate **Garrett Richardson** (El Paso, TX) in that club. Bowens posted his fourth double-double of the season against Tech with 15 points and a game-high 11 boards...The Tigers play six of their final eight games away from the Gentry Center, beginning with a Feb. 7 visit to Morehead State.

TENNESSEE TECH (10-9 overall, 4-4 OVC): Tennessee Tech was the only team to split its OVC contests last week, dropping a 58-56 heartbreaker to Austin Peay before earning a 77-76 victory at Tennessee State...Junior forward **Willie Jenkins** (Memphis, TN) poured in a career-high 33 points with nine rebounds at TSU. He went 9-of-18 from the field and converted 14-of-16 free throws to give Tech nine straight points down the stretch. Jenkins' streak of 10 games with at least 20 points was halted against APSU as he was held to a season-low 10 points...Five of the Golden Eagles' games this season, all of them OVC contests, have been decided in the final minute. Tech is 3-2 in those meetings...Jenkins' 33 points against TSU is the first 30+ scoring performance for a Tech player since a 33-point effort by **Leigh Gayden** during the 2000-01 season...Tied for fourth in the OVC standings, Tech opens a four-game homestand with Samford and Jacksonville State.

OVC HOOPS NOTES

BRACKET BUSTIN': Austin Peay has learned who its opponent will be for the Feb. 21 edition of ESPN's Bracket Buster Saturday. The Governors will travel to Wichita, Kan., to take on Missouri Vallev Conference opponent Wichita State (13-7, 6-4 MVC). Tentatively scheduled for a 6:00 p.m. Central start, the contest will be televised as part of ESPN's Full Court package.

WALKING WOUNDED: Tennessee Tech assistant coaches are being pressed into action during 5on-5 drills in practice as several Golden Eagle players battle injuries. Senior center Rusty Strange is playing through knee problems and a rib injury sustained earlier this season, while senior guard Leigh Gayden is out with a leg injury. Freshman center Isaiah Mills has yet to see action after suffering a foot injury during the preseason.

NINES ARE WILD: Austin Peay went 9-0 in January, matching the longest win streak in head coach Dave Loos' career. In nine OVC contests, the Governors have held opponents to less than 60 points and 41.3 percent field goal shooting. In their 65-54 win at Tennessee State last Saturday, the Govs produced nine blocked shots and nine steals while committing an OVC season-low nine turnovers.

MOVIN' ON UP: Morehead State senior guard/forward Ricky Minard continues his assault on the Eagle and OVC record books. Two weeks ago, he became the school's all-time leading scorer, cracking the OVC's Top 10 list in the process. Below is a listing of where Minard ranks among team and league career leaders in various categories. The number in parentheses behind the "NR" listing under OVC records indicates how many more he needs to move into the Top 10:

LITTLE ROOM FOR ERROR: Austin Peay is winning its games by a slim margin these days. Currently ranked last in the league in scoring offense (63.4 ppg), the Governors are holding opponents to a conference-low 60.1 points per game. The gap widens ever so slightly in OVC action as APSU is outscoring league foes by a +7.4 margin (62.7 ppg to 55.2 ppg).

REMEMBER TO SET THE VCR: The Feb. 7 contest between Murray State and Southeast Missouri will be televised live on Fox Sports Net South at 2:00 p.m. Central. Charlie McAlexander will handle play-by-play duties while Tom Apke will provide analysis. Fans can also catch a tape-delayed broadcast of the game at 2:00 a.m. Central Sunday on Fox Sports Net Midwest.

RANKING THE MID-MAJORS: Murray State's non-conference loss to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi caused the Racers to fall out of the ESPN.com Mid-Major Top 10. In this week's CBS Sportsline.com poll, produced by Tony Meiia, Murray State is 11th, while Austin Peay is 16th. In the Feb. 2 College Insider.com poll. Murray State is 13th, while Austin Peay makes its first appearance in the Top 25 at No. 23.
