PLAYER OF THE WEEK

RICKY MINARD • F/G, SR., 6'4, 205 • MANSFIELD, OH • MOREHEAD STATE

Minard shot 68 percent while averaging a double-double as Morehead State picked up wins over Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State. The senior forward/guard opened with 30 points and 12 rebounds against EKU, and followed that effort with 28 points and 11 boards versus TSU. For the week, Minard went 19-of-28 from the field, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, and 16-of-20 (80%) at the free throw line. He also dished out 16 assists with two steals and a block.

NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

WILLIE JENKINS • F, JR., 6'6, 210 • MEMPHIS, TN • TENNESSEE TECH

Jenkins ran his streak of double-figure scoring to 21 games with a pair of double-double efforts in Tennessee Tech's victories over Samford and Jacksonville State. The junior forward netted 18 points and 10 rebounds against the Bulldogs, then went 10-of-15 from the field as he pumped in 28 points and cleared 10 boards versus the Gamecocks. Jenkins also handed out six assists with a pair of steals.

AROUND THE OVC ...

AUSTIN PEAY (14-7 overall, 11-0 OVC): League-leading Austin Peay boasts the nation's fifth-longest home win streak at 23 after victories over Jacksonville State (84-72) and Samford (61-56)...Senior forward Adrian Henning (Memphis, TN) enjoyed one of his best outings of the season in the JSU contest, going 9-of-13 from the field with 22 points, eight rebounds and four assists...The Govs' overall 11-game win streak, tied for the seventh-best active run in the NCAA, is the longest under coach Dave Loos...APSU has won a school-record 14 straight regular-season OVC contests, dating back to last season...The Govs, who entered the week with a league-low 43.1 FG percentage, shot a season-high 64.6% against JSU while scoring a season-best 84 points. The Gamecocks' 72 points, however, snapped APSU's nine-game streak of holding opponents to 60 or fewer points...APSU sits at 294-293 all-time in OVC play, marking the first time the Govs have been above the .500 mark since Jan. 17, 1980 (105-104)...With 11 conference wins, APSU is the first team to claim a berth for the 2004 OVC Tournament...The Govs close out their four-game homestand against Tennessee-Martin and Murray State.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (4-16 overall, 2-8 OVC): Eastern Illinois dropped an 85-67 decision to Murray State, then ended its eight-game skid with an 83-79 overtime victory over Tennessee-Martin...Sophomore guard Josh Gomes (Indianapolis, IN) poured in a career-high 40 points against UTM, hitting 15-of-23 field goal attempts (65.2%) and 8-of-9 free throws. Gomes' 40 points is the most by an OVC player this season...Senior forward/center Jesse Mackinson (Pontiac, IL) tossed in 18 points and cleared nine rebounds against the Skyhawks. He was 8-of-8 at the charity stripe as the Panthers posted their second-best free throw effort of the season, converting 17-of-21 foul shots...Sophomore reserve Jake Sinclair (Pana, IL) contributed a career-high 16 points in the loss to Murray...The 83 points scored against UTM marked EIU's best total since an 83-70 win over Tech just prior to the losing streak...The 11th-place Panthers hit the road for a pair, traveling to Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (8-12 overall, 3-6 OVC): Eastern Kentucky suffered its third straight loss in a 74-67 setback at Morehead State...The Colonels' recent five-game road stretch covered 13 days and 1,653 miles...Senior forward Jon Bentley (Hazard, KY) came off the bench at Morehead, ending his run of seven consecutive starts. He responded with his first double-double of the year, scoring 21 points and clearing a career-high 15 rebounds...Senior guard Mike Scott (Baltimore, MD) has ramped up his offensive output, averaging 13.3 points per game over the last three contests...The Colonels have posted eight double-doubles this season, including one in each of the last two games...Tied for seventh in the league standings, EKU plays a three-game homestand this week versus Tennessee State, Samford and Jacksonville State.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (11-11 overall, 4-7 OVC): Jacksonville State fell to sixth in the conference rankings after road losses at Austin Peay (84-72) and Tennessee Tech (101-86)...Junior forward Abdou Diame (Thies, Senegal) went 6-of-9 from the field as he led the Gamecocks with 15 points against APSU...Senior forward Trent Eager (Monroeville, AL) was a perfect 9-of-9 at the free throw line as he pumped in 30 points at Tech...Senior guard James Denson (Walnut Grove, MS) tallied a double-double in the TTU contest with 10 points and 10 caroms...Senior reserve Josh Perry (Orlando, FL) hit 10-of-12 field attempts and chimed in with 21 points off the bench in the two games...The Gamecocks finish off their four-game road swing at Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky.

MOREHEAD STATE (11-10 overall, 6-4 OVC): Morehead State moved back above .500 in conference play and into a tie for third place with wins over Eastern Kentucky (74-67) and Tennessee State (89-75)...Senior forward/guard Ricky Minard (Mansfield, OH) recorded back-to-back double-doubles (30 pts./12 rbds. vs. EKU, 28 pts./11 rbds. vs. TSU). He shot 67.9 percent from the field, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, and also dished out 16 assists for the week...Junior forward Chad McKnight (Lancaster, OH) pumped in a career-high 23 points versus TSU. He went 8-of-10 from the field and 7-of-8 from the foul line...All five Eagle starters scored in double-figures against the Tigers as the Eagles shot 64.4 percent from the field, including 6-of-10 from behind the arc...Senior guard Chez Marks sat out the TSU contest after suffering a knee injury in the first half against EKU. He's expected to see limited action this week when the Eagles conclude their four-game homestand against Jacksonville State and Samford.

MURRAY STATE (19-4 overall, 9-1 OVC): Murray State has a solid hold on second place after wins over Eastern Illinois (85-67) and Southeast Missouri (80-74)...Senior guard Chris Shumate (Louisville, KY) went 7-of-10 from the field with three 3-pointers to lead four Racers in double figures with 20 points against EIU, while freshman reserve Shawn Witherspoon (Oviedo, FL) added 14 points and six rebounds off the bench...The Racers shot a blistering 59.3 percent from the field versus the Panthers as five Murray State players converted at least half of their floor attempts...Murray State had to stage a come-from-behind win at Southeast as the Racers shot just 38.2 percent in the first half and trailed, 42-30, at the break...The Racer bench outscored the Indian bench, 32-8...Murray State is 17-0 this season when scoring at least 70 points...The Racers continue their five-game road swing with dates at Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay.

SAMFORD (10-11 overall, 5-5 OVC): Samford slipped into fifth place in the OVC standings after setbacks at Tennessee Tech (90-83, 2ot) and Austin Peay (61-56). The game at Tech marked the Bulldogs' second double-overtime loss in two weeks...Senior forward **Eddie Harper** (Laurel, MS) hit five 3-pointers as he tossed in a careerhigh 22 points at Tech...Free throw woes hampered the Bulldogs in both contests as Samford finished the week 18-of-28 at the stripe (64.3%)...Of Samford's 98 field goal attempts, 63 were from 3-point range. For the season, the Bulldogs have attempted 13 more 3-point shots than two-point tries...Samford's last four overtime games have all gone two extra periods, with the Bulldogs going 1-3 in those contests...Samford wraps up its four-game road stretch at Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (10-11 overall, 3-7 OVC): Southeast Missouri split the first two outings of a three-game homestand, defeating Tenenssee-Martin, 89-78, before dropping an 80-74 decision to Murray State...Senior center **Brandon Griffin** (Greensburg, LA) played all but one minute of the two contests, going 14-of-23 from the field (60.9%) while averaging 17 points, 12.5 rebounds and five assists per game...Junior forward **Dainmon Gonner** (Ft. Worth, TX) also had a pair of solid outings, contributing 18 points, six rebounds and 4.5 assists per game...Junior guard **Derek Winans** (East Cape Girardeau, IL) shot 64.2 percent from ther field (9-of-14) and was a perfect 7-of-7 at the foul line against UTM, finishing with 28 points, while senior guard **Demarcus Hence** hit 4-of-5 three-pointers and all four foul shots as part of an 18-point effort off the bench...After shooting 53.6 percent in the first half and staking themselves to a 12-point lead (42-30) at the break against the Racers, the Indians went 13-of-34 (38.2%) over the final 20 minutes en route to the loss...Southeast ends its homestand with Eastern Illinois, then travels to Tennessee State.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (8-14 overall, 3-7 OVC): Tennessee-Martin opened a four-game road swing with setbacks at Southeast Missouri (89-78) and Eastern Illinois (83-79, ot)...Junior guard **Jeremy Kelly** (Louisville, KY) had back-to-back 20+ outings with 20 points at Southeast and 26 at EIU. Kelly moved into a tie for eighth place on the school's all-time list for 3-pointers made (67) and into ninth for career assists (220)...Sophomore guard/forward **Jared Newson** (Belleville, IL) went 11-of-12 at the free throw line and finished with 21 points versus the Indians...UTM is 0-10 in games where the opponents have scored 80+ points...With the loss to EIU, the Skyhawks are 1-1 this season in overtime contests...UTM closes out the road portion of its schedule this week at Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech.

TENNESSEE STATE (4-16 overall, 3-6 OVC): Tennessee State is on a five-game slide after falling to Morehead State (89-75) in its only action last week...The Tigers trailed by just four at halftime (41-37), but couldn't stop a hot-shooting Eagle squad down the stretch...Freshman guard **Bruce Price** (Minneapolis, MN) led TSU with 19 points...Junior forward **Roshaun Bowens** (Nashville, TN) scored 12 of his 16 points in the second half...Senior reserve **Brandon Lockridge** (Nashville, TN) went 5-of-6 from behind the arc to add 15 points off the bench. All 25 of his field goals this season have been 3-pointers...Senior guard **Garrett Richardson** (El Paso, TX), the league's career active leader in steals, had six thefts against Morehead to go with 11 points and four assists...Tied for seventh place in the OVC standings, the Tigers have a busy slate this week with three games on tap. TSU visits Eastern Kentucky on Monday before returning home to close out the home portion of its schedule against Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri.

TENNESSEE TECH (12-9 overall, 6-4 OVC): Tennessee Tech pushed its win streak to three games with a 90-83, double-overtime victory against Samford and a 101-86 triumph over Jacksonville State...Senior guard **Cameron Crisp** (Bolivar, TN) shot 54.3 percent from the field (19-of-35) and was a perfect 6-of-6 at the line as he averaged 24 points a game, including 29 versus Samford...Junior foward **Willie Jenkins** (Memphis, TN) upped his league-leading scoring average to 20.9 points each time out as he netted a pair of double-doubles (18 pts./10 rbds. vs. SU and 28 pts./10 rbds. vs. JSU). Jenkins has scored in double figures in all 21 outings this season...Sophomore guards **Keyon Boyd** (Marietta, GA) and **Milone Clark** (Gibson, NC) combined to go 12-of-17 from the field against the Bulldogs. Clark had 15 points and eight rebounds while Boyd added 13 points and seven boards...Prior to the Samford contest, Tech's last double-overtime contest was an 86-84 victory over Austin Peay during the 2001-02 season. Tech boasts a four-game win streak in overtime games...The Golden Eagles put five players in double figures and shot a season-high 57 percent from the field against JSU...Tech closes out a four-game homestand with Murray State and Tennessee-Martin.

OVC HOOPS NOTES

GOVS AND RACERS CLASH: Austin Peay and Murray State fans have Valentine's Day circled in red on their calendars, and it's not for a romantic dinner for two. Due to a quirk in the league's 16-game schedule, the Governors and Racers meet only once this season, a Feb. 14 date at APSU's Dunn Center. With Murray State sitting just a game back of the league-leading Govs, Saturday's contest is a crucial one leading into the final two weeks of the regular season.

MOVIN' ON UP: Morehead State's Ricky Minard moved into the league's Top-10 list for all-time 3-pointers made last week and is currently tied for ninth with 214 treys. The senior forward/guard, who is the school's recordholder for career points, steals, 3-pointers made and 3-pointers attempted, will also finish his career ranked among the OVC's Top 10 in those categories.

COACHES VS. CANCER: Last Saturday, Feb. 7, was Coaches vs. Cancer Awareness Day and men's basketball coaches across the country were asked to don sneakers during their games as a show of support. Taking part in the event from the OVC ranks were head coaches Mike LaPlante (Jacksonville State), Mike Sutton (Tennessee Tech) and Mick Cronin (Murray State).

VICTOR UNSUNG HERO OF THE WEEK: College Hoopsnet.com announced that Murray State's Cuthbert Victor was named its Unsung Player of the Week, for the period ending February 4th. The 6-5 senior shot 73 percent from the floor and averaged 24 points, 16 rebounds and four blocks per game to lead the Racers to a pair of victories over OVC rivals Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State. Victor is the second OVC player to earn the weekly accolade, which goes to a player who consistently evades the eye of the national media despite impressive accomplishments.

AIN'TIT GRAND: Although Morehead State's Ricky Minard is the only 2,000-point scorer in the OVC this season (2,177), he is just one of 11 active players with at least 1,000 career points under his belt. Nine of those players reached the 1,000-point milestone this season with two more poised at the doorway. Three of the nine are from the Murray State squad as Cuthbert Victor (1,334), Antione Whelchel (1,215) and Chris Shumate (1,079) have all topped the plateau, while Austin Peay boasts two 1,000-point scorers on its roster in Anthony Davis (1,231) and Adrian Henning (1,202). Rounding out the list are Tennessee Tech's Cameron Crisp (1,254), Southeast Missouri's Derek Winans (1,165) and Tennessee State's Roshaun Bowens (1,034). Two more players sit poised to join the group as Eastern Kentucky's Jon Bentley and Eastern Illinois' Jesse Mackinson have collected 965 and 935 career points, respectively.

OVC PLAYERS IN NCAA STATS: Murray State's Cuthbert Victor is ranked fourth nationally with an 11.0 rebounding average through stats of Feb. 2. The senior forward is also fifth in the NCAA in field goal shooting percentage (64.1%), while Samford senior guard Tyson Dorsey is fourth in 3-point field goal percentage (49.5%). Three OVC players rank among the nation's Top 40 scorers, led by Tennessee Tech's Willie Jenkins (20.7 ppg). Joining Jenkins is Morehead State's deadly duo of Chez Marks (20.2 ppg) and Ricky Minard (19.4 ppg) at 27th and 35th, respectively. Tennessee State's Garrett Richardson is 15th in steals (2.6 spg), while Jacksonville State's Walker Russell (6.2 apg) and Easten Kentucky's Matt Witt (5.7 apg) are tied for 17th and 29th, respectively, in assists. Austin Peay shot-blocker Josh Lewis is 20th in the country with 2.6 rejections per game.

REMEMBER TO SET THE VCR: The Feb. 21 contest between Tennessee Tech and Samford will be televised live on Fox Sports Net South at 2:00 p.m. Central. Mike Hogewood will handle play-by-play duties while Tom Apke will provide analysis.

RANKING THE MID-MAJORS: Austin Peay's 11-game win streak has moved the Governors up to 12th place in Tony Mejia's latest CBS Sportsline.com poll, while Murray State is 14th. In the Feb. 9 edition of the CollegeInsider.com poll, the two teams are reversed, with the Racers ranked ninth and the Govs in 21st.
