OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

RICKY MINARD • G/F, SR., 6'4, 205 • MANSFIELD, OH • MOREHEAD STATE

Minard shot an impressive 58.3 percent from the field as he led Morehead State to a pair of OVC road victories to close out the regular season. The senior guard/forward collected 24 points and seven rebounds at Eastern Kentucky, then fell just short of a triple-double at Tennessee Tech with 24 points, nine boards and eight assists. For the week, he was 14-of-24 from the field and 18-of-24 from the foul line (75%). Minard, who picks up his third OVC Player of the Week honor, tops the OVC and ranks among NCAA leaders with 21.1 points a game.

NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

WALKER RUSSELL • G, SO., 6'0, 170 • ROCHESTER, MI • JACKSONVILLE STATE

Russell collects his second OVC Newcomer of the Week accolade after averaging 16.5 points, 7.0 assists and 3.5 rebounds in Jacksonville State's two OVC victories last week. The sophomore guard opened with 18 points and four assists against Samford, then recorded his fifth double-double of the season with 16 points and 10 assists versus Tennessee State. Russell, who leads the league and ranks among national leaders with a 6.37 assists average, also shot 55 percent from the field (11-of-20) and 75 percent from the foul stripe (9-of-12).

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

SHAWN WITHERSPOON • F, FR., 6'5, 215 • OVIEDO, FL • MURRAY STATE

Witherspoon earns his first OVC Rookie of the Week award after blistering the nets for a 68.4 shooting percentage, including a perfect 3-of-3 from behind the arc, in Murray State's two conference victories last week. The rookie guard went 6-of-9 from the floor against Southeast Missouri, finishing with 13 points and four rebounds, then added 14 points and eight boards on 6-of-8 field shooting versus Eastern Illinois.

AROUND THE OVC ...

AUSTIN PEAY (19-8 overall, 16-0 OVC): Regular-season champion Austin Peay closed out its conference run undefeated with wins over Tennessee Tech (88-64) and Eastern Kentucky (81-64)...The victory over EKU marked APSU's 27th consecutive win in the Dunn Center, setting a school record and ranking as the nation's fourth-longest active home win streak...Senior center Josh Lewis (Lexington, KY) has recorded 15 blocked shots over the last three games, including six versus Tech. Lewis has tallied seven six-block outings over his career and currently sits three swats shy of 250...Lewis (9 pts./10 rbds.) and senior forward Adrian Henning (14 pts./9 rbds.) just missed double-doubles against Tech. Versus EKU, Henning (Memphis, TN) scored 15 second-half tics en route to his second 20-point effort of the season...APSU, which entered the week ranked last in the OVC in scoring and ninth in field goal shooting, rolled up 80 points in both games last week, hitting better than 50 percent from the field in each contest (51.8% vs. TTU, 51.9% vs. EKU)...The Govs have won 19 straight regular-season OVC games, and 30 of their last 31, dating back to the 2002-03 season. They enter postseason play with a 22-game win streak against OVC opposition, including tourney contests...Head coach Dave Loos will be looking for his 300th career coaching victory when top-seeded APSU hosts #8 Tennessee State in first-round OVC Tournament action. The Governors and Tigers played only once during the regular season.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (6-21 overall, 4-12 OVC): Eastern Illinois will miss its first OVC Tournament since joining the league in 1996 after road losses to Tennessee-Martin (77-73) and Murray State (81-51) eliminated the Panthers from the eight-team field...Senior forward **Jesse Mackinson** (Pontiac, IL) topped the 1,000-point mark for his career (1,016). He shot 53.9 percent from the field (9-of-17) while averaging 12 points a game for the week, collecting his second double-double of the season in the process with 14 points and 10 rebounds at Murray State...Sophomore guard **Josh Gomes** (Indianapolis, IN) converted 9-of-12 foul shots and contributed 13 points per outing. He led the team in scoring (13.6 ppg) this season while ranking sixth in the conference in field goal percentage (47.9%)...The Panthers tied for 10th (4-12) in the OVC in 2003-04, the lowest finish for an EIU squad in its eight-year history with the league.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (13-14 overall, 8-8 OVC): Eastern Kentucky lost its final two regular-season games to Morehead State (80-71) and Austin Peay (81-64), but still finished in fourth with an 8-8 OVC mark, its first .500 or better effort since going 9-7 for a fourth-place finish in 1993-94...Sophomore guard Matt Witt (Tipp City, OH) averaged 19 points and 4.5 assist per game for the week...Freshman guard Brandon Moore (Huntington, WV) made his second career start in the APSU contest. He played 27 minutes, collecting three rebounds and an assist before fouling out...Skipper Travis Ford is the first EKU coach to lead the Colonels to back-to-back OVC Tournament appearances since Mike Calhoun did it in 1994-95 and 1995-96...The Colonels' run of 16 straight games in which they equaled or surpassed an opponent's assist total ended at APSU, where EKU dished out just seven assists to the Governors' 14...EKU's 13 overall wins are the most since a 13-14 record during the 1995-96 campaign...Seeded fourth for OVC tourney action, the Colonels will be hosting a first-round game for the first time since the event moved to its current format in 1997. EKU entertains fifth-seeded Samford after sweeping both in-season meetings with the Bulldogs, including a double-overtime thriller on Jan. 24.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (14-13 overall, 7-9 OVC): Jacksonville State posted wins over Samford (71-51) and Tennessee State (86-70) to claim the No. 6 seed for the upcoming OVC Tournament. Jax State finished in a three-way tie for fifth in the OVC standings, but came out in the middle of the tiebreaker...The victory against the Bulldogs marked the Gamecocks' second consecutive 20-point win following an 80-59 decision versus Tennessee Tech the previous week...Sophomore guard Walker Russell (Rochester, MI) recorded his fifth double-double of the season with 15 points and 10 assists against TSU. He shot 55 percent from the field while averaging 16.5 points, 7.0 assists and 3.5 rebounds for the week...The Gamecocks finished the 2003-04 season with a 12-2 record in Pete Mathews Coliseum, the most home wins for the program at the Division I level...Jax State canned 13 three-pointers against the Tigers, the seventh time this season JSU has registered 10+ treys in a game. The Gamecocks have made 54 treys over the last five outings...JSU travels to third-seeded Morehead State for its first foray into OVC Tournament action. The Gamecocks will be looking for their first win against the Eagles in 2003-04 after losing both regular-season meetings.

MOREHEAD STATE (15-12 overall, 10-6 OVC): Morehead State closed out regular-season action with back-to-back road wins over Eastern Kentucky (80-71) and Tennessee Tech (90-86)...At 15-12, the Eagles have clinched a winning record for the third consecutive season. The last time Morehead State posted winning records in three straight campaigns was 1981-84...Senior guard/forward Ricky Minard (Mansfield, OH) fell short of a triple-double at Tech with 24 points, nine boards and eight assists. He shot 58.3 percent from the field (14-of-24) for the week, averaging 24 points, eight rebounds and 5.5 assists per game while also going 18-of-24 from the foul line (75%)...According to all available records, Minard is the first player in school and OVC history to surpass 2,300 points (2,321), 700 rebounds (710), 400 assists (404) and 200 steals (235) for his career...Freshman guard Josh Reed (East Liverpool, OH) has seen more action recently following Chez Marks' season-ending injury. Reed averaged 10.5 points per game last week, including a career-high 13 at Tech. He went 7-of-14 from the field in the two contests, including 5-of-10 from 3-point range...Five Eagles socred in double figures at Tech...Starting point guard Quinton Smith missed the second half of the TTU contest after becoming ill during the game...Third-seeded Morehead State hosts No. 6 Jacksonville State in first-round action of the OVC Tournament. The Eagles swept the Gamecocks in regular-season play.

MURRAY STATE (25-5 overall, 14-2 OVC): Murray State enters postseason play having won its last five and 10 of its last 11 following a non-conference victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (73-53) and OVC triumphs versus Southeast Missouri (76-63) and Eastern Illinois (81-51)...Senior forward Cuthbert Victor (St. Croix, Virgin Islands) tallied his 13th double-double of the season and 29th of his career with 22 points and 13 rebounds against TAMCC. He also matched a career-high with six blocker shots in the contest to lead the Racers' school-record 13-block effort. The Racers' all-time shot blocker, Victor has 156 career swats...Freshman forward Shawn Witherspoon (Oviedo, FL) went 12-of-17 (70.6%) in the two OVC contests, averaging 13.5 points and six rebounds a game off the bench...The Racers are 5-0 since the loss of starting junior point guard Adam Chiles (Louisville, KY). Chiles suffered a shoulder injury in a Feb. 14 contest at Austin Peay and is sidelined indefinitely...Murray State leads the league with an 80.8 scoring average. The Racers are 157-8 over the last 10 years when scoring 80+ points...Second-seeded Murray State welcomes #7 Tennessee Tech for opening-round OVC Tournament action. The Racers won a road contest at Tech in their only in-season meeting.

SAMFORD (12-15 overall, 7-9 OVC): Samford split its final two OVC regular-season contests, dropping a 71-51 decision to Jacksonville State before picking up an 86-70 triumph over Tennessee State...Senior forward Eddie Harper (Laurel, MS) tossed in a career-high 27 points versus TSU on 9-of-12 shooting form the floor. He averaged 18 points each time out while converting 55 percent of his field attempts, including a 6-of-13 effort from 3-point range...Freshman guard Jerry Smith contributed eight points, 6.5 rebounds and four assists per game...Samford shot 58 percent from the floor (52% from 3-pt. range) and 81 percent at the foul stripe in the win over TSU...After finishing in a three-way tie for fifth place in the league standings, the Bulldogs won the tiebreaker for the No. 5 seed and will travel to fourth-seeded Eastern Kentucky on Tuesday for opening-round tourney action. The Bulldogs lost both of their in-season meetings with the Colonels, including a double-overtime outing on Jan. 24.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (11-16 overall, 4-12 OVC): Southeast Missouri closed out its 2003-04 slate with consecutive road losses at Murray State (76-63) and Tennessee-Martin (88-71)...Junior forward Reggie Golson (Kansas City, KS) led the Indians with 19 points and six boards at Murray, followed by a 15-point effort from junior guard Derek Winans (East Cape Girardeau, IL)...Golson went 7-of-14 from the floor and finished with a team-high 17 points at UTM. He scored double digits in each of his last five games while filling in for an injured Brandon Griffin (Greensburg, LA). Griffin suffered a severely sprained antle just forur minutes into a Feb. 14 outing at Tennessee State and missed the rest of that game, plus the remaining four. At the time of his injury, Griffin was shooting 57.6 percent from the field and led the team with 7.4 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game...Winans will enter his senior year in 2004-05 as the program's seventh-leading all-time scorer (1,253 points) and ninth-leading assists man (230)...After losing eight OVC contests by six points or less, the Indians finished the 2003-04 season with a disappointing 4-12 conference record and 10th-place tie.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (10-18 overall, 5-11 OVC): Tennessee-Martin ended the 2003-04 season on a winning note, capturing back-to-back victories over Eastern Illinois (77-73) and Southeast Missouri (88-71)...Six UTM players, including all five starters, scored in double figures against Southeast. Sophomore guard Jared Newson (Belleville, IL) had six rebounds and went 8-of-11 from the field to lead the sextet with 20 points, while senior forward Kenan Asceric (Sarajevo, Bosnia) collected his only career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds in his final game. Sophomore center Cleve Woodfork (St. Louis, MO) hit 6-of-10 from the floor, adding 15 points and seven boards...The Skyhawks were credited with a season-best 25 assists against the Indians, led by junior point guard Tyler George's (Princeton, IN) career-high 12 helpers...The Skyhawks shot 76.2 percent in the first half of the SEMO contest en route to posting their second-best shooting effort of the season (57.1%)...After suffering two key personnel losses early in the year with season-ending injuries to senior guard Earl Bullock (knee) and junior guard Justin Smith (Achilles tendon), UT Martin finished ninth in the conference standings with a 5-11 mark (10-18 overall).

TENNESSEE STATE (7-20 overall, 6-10 OVC): Tennessee State finished off the regular-season portion of its schedule with identical 86-70 road losses at Samford and Jacksonville State, but will still qualify for the OVC Tournament as the No. 8 seed...Junior forward Roshaun Bowens (Nashville, TN) averaged 22.5 points and 9.5 rebounds a game last week, scoring 35 of his 45 points in the second halves of each contest...Freshman guard Bruce Price (Minneapolis, MN) contributed 16 points per game while also handing out nine assists and grabbing 10 rebounds in the two contests...Senior guard Garrett Richardson (El Paso, TX) netted a season-high 22 points at JSU...Under the direction of first-year coach Cy Alexander, the Tigers are making an OVC tourney appearance after a one-year absence. TSU, picked to finish last in the OVC in preseason balloting, posted a 6-10 record in league action for an eighth-place effort. The Tigers visit regular-season champ and top seed Austin Peay for first-round play.

TENNESSEE TECH (13-14 overall, 7-9 OVC): Tennessee Tech dropped contests to Austin Peay (88-64) and Morehead State (90-86) to finish the regular-season on a fourgame slide for the first time since the 1990-91 campaign...Junior forward Willie Jenkins (Memphis, TN), the league's second-ranked scorer this season (19.4 ppg), is on pace to post the Golden Eagles' best scoring average since 1955 (Kenny Sidwell, 21.3 ppg). Jenkins, a UMass transfer, has netted double-figures in 25 of 26 outings in his first year in the OVC...Senior guard Cameron Crisp (Bolivar, TN) went 6-of-6 from the free throw line at APSU, marking his 10th perfect outing this season. He has converted 57 of 71 foul attempts (80.3%) thus far in 2003-04...Sophomore reserve Millone Clark (Gibson, NC) tossed in 16 points versus Morehead State, hitting four 3-pointers as part of a 6-of-10 field shooting effort...The Golden Eagles, who finished in a three-way tie for fifth place in the OVC standings but lost the tiebreaker, are seeded seventh for the OVC Tournament and will travel to No. 2 Murray State for the opening round. Tech lost the teams' only in-season meeting in Cookeville.

OVC HOOPS NOTES

AUSTIN PEAY CROWNED CHAMPS: Austin Peay led from start-to-finish en route to capturing its second straight OVC regular-season crown and sixth overall. After sharing the title with Morehead State a year ago, the Governors won the 2003-04 race outright, the third time in school history APSU has claimed sole possession of the crown. Austin Peay ran the conference table, making the Governors the first team to go undefeated in OVC regular-season action since former league member Western Kentucky went 14-0 in 1969-70. APSU is the only team other than WKU (three times) to go unbeaten in OVC play and the first to do so in a 16-game format.

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: The Austin Peay women's basketball team also repeated as OVC regular-season champions, marking the third time in league history both the men's and women's teams from one school have either won outright or shared back-to-back regular-season crowns. Tennessee Tech's men's and women's teams each won two straight titles in 2000-01 and 2001-02, while former league member Middle Tennessee had consecutive men's and women's champions in 1985-86 and 1986-87.

DOESN'T MATTER WHERE THEY PLAY: Austin Peay finished the road portion of its 2003-04 OVC schedule with a perfect 8-0 record. The Govs became the first team to win all of their away games in conference play since Murray State went 6-0 on the road during the 1990-91 season. Additionally, APSU's 27 consecutive home victories in the Dunn Center is ranked as the nation's fourth-longest active home win streak.

SWAN SONG FOR MR. EVERYTHING: As the OVC Tournament kicks off this week, conference opponents will be getting their last look at Morehead State senior guard/forward Ricky Minard, who has ranked among the league's Top 15 in every statistical category for each of the last three seasons. According to all available records, the Mansfield, Ohio, native is the only player in school and OVC history to surpass 2,300 points (2,321), 700 rebounds (710), 400 assists (404) and 200 steals (235) for his career.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: Regular-season champion Austin Peay and fifth-place Tennessee Tech were the only teams to finish according to preseason predictions. While several teams finished within one or two spots of their preseason nods, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State posted the biggest improvements on their preseason selections of 10th and 11th place, respectively. JSU tallied a 7-9 OVC record and finished tied for fifth, while TSU went 6-10 in conference play for an eighth-place effort.

IT'S ALL ACADEMIC: Southeast Missouri junior guard Derek Winans and Austin Peay senior guard Rhet Wierzba have been named to their respective College Sports Information Directors Association (CoSIDA) Academic All-District Teams. Winans, a business management major, carries a perfect 4.0 grade point average. Wierzba, a 2003-04 OVC Scholar-Athlete recipient, sports a 3.91 GPA in business.

SPEAKING OF HONORS: Three OVC hoopsters have been recognized by the National Association of Basketball Coaches for their efforts on the hardwood during the 2003-04 campaign. Murray State senior foward Cuthbert Victor (14.5 ppg/10.4 ppg) was selected to the District 7 first team, while Morehead State senior forward/guard Ricky Minard (20.4 ppg/7.3 rpg) and Austin Peay senior forward Adrian Henning (13.5 ppg/6.4 rpg) were second team honorees.

AIN'T IT GRAND: Eastern Illinois' Jesse Mackinson posted his 1,000th career point last week, bringing to 11 the number of active OVC cagers who have reached that milestone. A 12th player, Morehead State's Chez Marks, hit the plateau earlier in the season prior to being sidelined with a knee injury. Also recording their 1,000th career point during the 2003-04 campaign were Murray State's Cuthbert Victor, Antione Whelchel and Chris Shumate; Austin Peay's Anthony Davis and Adrian Henning; Tennessee State's Roshaun Bowens; Tennessee Tech's Cameron Crisp and Southeast Missouri's Derek Winans. Morehead State's Ricky Minard and Tennessee State's Garrett Richardson each topped the 1,000-point plateau last year.

OVC PLAYERS IN NCAA STATS: Eastern Kentucky's Jon Bentley leads a trio of OVC players ranked among the Top 30 in the NCAA in field goal shooting percentage through games of Feb. 23. Bentley is fourth (64.2%), followed by Murray State's Cuthbert Victor (62.4%) in fifth and Southeast Missouri's Brandon Griffin (57.6%) in 27th. Victor is also fourth among national leaders in rebounding (10.5 rpg). Samford's **Tyson Dorsey** is third in 3-point field goal percentage (47.1%). Two OVC players rank among the nation's Top 40 scorers, led by Morehead State's Ricky Minard (20.9 ppg). Minard is 17th, followed by Tennessee Tech's Willie Jenkins (19.6 ppg) at 31st. Tennessee State's Garrett Richardson is 20th in steals (2.5 spg), while Jacksonville State's Walker Russell is 13th in assists (6.3 apg). Austin Peay's Josh Lewis is 20th in the country with 2.5 blocks per game.

RANKING THE MID-MAJORS: Murray State is in eighth place in the latest CollegeInsider.com poll, while Austin Peay sits in 12th. APSU is ranked 10th in Tony Mejia's most recent CBS Sportsline.com poll, while the Racers are 12th. APSU and Murray State both fell out of ESPN.com's latest Mid-Major Top 10 ranking, but continue to be listed under other teams receiving votes.
