### CUTHBERT VICTOR • SR., F, 6'5, 220 • ST. CROIX, VIRGIN ISLANDS • MURRAY ST.

**Victor** turned in a solid all-around effort in Murray State's season-opening victory over Wagner. The senior forward shot 60 percent from the field and finished with 14 points en route to notching his 1,000th career point. He also cleared a team-high eight rebounds and dished out seven assists without committing a turnover.

### **NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK**

### JUSTIN SMITH • JR., G, 6'3, 190 • MEMPHIS, TN • TENNESSEE-MARTIN

**Smith** took over for an injured Earl Bullock and responded with a 17.3 scoring average in his first week of Division I competition. The junior college transfer came off the bench to hit four 3-pointers and contribute 26 points in the Skyhawks' 96-67 win over Western Illinois. He followed that with another 26 points as a starter in a 90-74 loss at Mississippi State. For the week, Smith shot 46.2 percent (18-of-39) from the field, including going 7-of-21 from 3-point range, and was a perfect 9-of-9 at the free throw line.

### BRANDON MOORE • FR., G, 6'4, 190 • HUNTINGTON, WV • EASTERN KENTUCKY

**Moore** scored all 15 of his points from 3-point range in Eastern Kentucky's 64-58 loss at Saint Louis. The Huntington, WV, native canned five of nine trey attempts, and also contributed one steal in 27 minutes of action off the bench.

### AROUND THE OVC...

**AUSTIN PEAY (0-0 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Austin Peay puts a 16-game home win streak on the line when the Governors entertain NAIA foe Knoxville College in their season opener...The Govs are preseason favorites to win the OVC after sharing the regular-season title last year with Morehead State...Head coach **Dave Loos** returns his top eight players from a year ago, including 1st team All-OVC senior forward **Adrian Henning** (15.5 ppg/7.0 rpg), 2nd team All-OVC senior center and 2003 OVC Tournament MVP **Josh Lewis** (12.8 ppg/7.0 rpg/2.6 bpg) and 3rd team All-OVC junior guard **Anthony Davis** (14.0 ppg/4.7 rpg)...Lewis is the league's active career leader in blocked shots (173) after tallying an OVC-high and school-record 82 last season...In addition to its meeting with Knoxville, APSU plays at Belmont on Wednesday and Memphis on Saturday.

**EASTERN ILLINOIS (0-1 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Eastern Illinois dropped an 83-76 decision at Northern Illinois in its season opener. The Panthers shot jst 35 percent from the field, including going 5-of-25 (20%) from 3-point range... Four EIU players scored in double figures, led by junior college transfer and guard **Derik Hollyfield**, who hit 10-of-19 from the field (52.6%) and finished with 27 points... Senior center **Jesse Mackinson** followed with 15 points while redshirt freshman guard **Cortez Forte** and junior forward **Andy Gobczynski** had 11 apiece... Mackinson and Gobczynski had seven boards each and Hollyfield chimed in with six... The Panthers visit Wisconsin on Tuesday, the first of three Big Ten opponents for EIU in 2003-04.

**EASTERN KENTUCKY (0-1 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Eastern Kentucky lost its season opener to host Saint Louis, 64-58, despite outshooting (52.2% to 44.9%) and outrebounding (30-23) the Billikens...The Colonels got strong performances from several underclassmen as sophomore guard **Matt Witt** netted a team-high 16 points and handed out seven assists...Freshman guard **Brandon Moore** scored all 15 of his points from 3-point range, going 5-of-9 from behind the arc. Frosh forward **Mamadou Diakhate** hauled in a game-high eight rebounds...Senior forward/center **Jon Bentley**, last year's OVC field goal percentage leader (65.2%), picked up where he left off, hitting all three of his floor attempts...The Colonels open the home portion of their schedule on Tuesday against Ohio Wesleyan, then travel to Alabama A&M for a Saturday contest.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (1-0 overall, 0-0 OVC): New OVC member Jacksonville State staged a 74-68 victory over Alabama A&M in its season opener. The Gamecocks shot 63.2 percent from the field in the second half, finishing with a 51.1 percent effort for the game... Senior forward Trent Eager went 5-of-7 from the field (71.4%), hitting all three of his 3-point attempts en route to a game- and career-high 18 points. He also went 5-of-5 at the foul line and tied for a team-high five rebounds... Junior forward Carl Brown went 7-of-9 from the field for 14 points and five caroms off the bench... The Gamecocks lost the rebounding battle, 39-36, despite a balanced effort that had six players grabbing at least four boards apiece... JSU plays host to NAIA opponent Shorter College on Monday before visiting Southern Illinois and Mississippi Valley State on Wednesday and Saturday.

MOREHEAD STATE (0-1 overall, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State opened the season with a 95-82 loss at Colonial Athletic Association preseason favorite George Mason. The Eagles, who led the nation in field goal percentage last year (51%), shot 53.4 percent against GMU, but the Patriots managed a 56.5 percent effort in the high-scoring affair...Senior forward/guard and 2003-04 OVC Preseason Player of the Year Ricky Minard paced the Eagles with 22 points...Senior guard Chez Marks canned four 3-pointers as part of a 7-of-9 effort from the field and finished with 18 points...Junior guard Kyle Hankins, who missed most of preseason practice with an injured hand, came off the bench to add 15 points...Senior center David Aliu grabbed seven rebounds...Morehead State kicks off the home portion of its schedule on Tuesday against Asbury College, then visits Marshall on Saturday.

**MURRAY STATE (1-0 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Murray State parlayed a 56.1 percent shooting effort into a 92-68 rout of Wagner in its home and season opener. The Racers held a slim 41-40 halftime lead, but went on a 24-0 run in the second half and outscored the Seahawks, 51-28, down the stretch to give new skipper **Mick Cronin** his first victory as a head coach...Junior guard and Vincennes transfer **Adam Chiles** led five Racers in double-figures with 20 points, five assists and four steals...Senior forward **Cuthbert Victor** notched his 1,000th career point, finishing the game with 14 points, eight rebounds and seven assists without a turnover...Junior forward **Kelvin Brown** went 7-of-9 from the field and added 16 points...The Racers finish off their four-game homestand this week with a trio of dates against West Florida, SIU-Edwardsville and Southern Mississippi.

**SAMFORD (0-1 overall, 0-0 OVC):** New OVC member Samford lost its season opener at Purdue, 66-50...Senior forward **Eddie Harper** led the Bulldogs with 16 points and five rebounds, followed by an 11-point, five-board effort from senior center **Phillip Ramelli**...Samford canned seven 3-pointers in the contest, slightly under its trey average of 9.2 from a year ago which ranked seventh nationally...The Bulldogs play NAIA foe Bryan College in their home opener on Tuesday, then travel to New Orleans on Saturday.

**SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (1-0 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Southeast Missouri held off a late rally by visiting Wisconsin-Green Bay and held on for the 63-62 victory in the Indians' opener...Junior college transfer **Dainmon Gonner** led four SEMO players in double digits with 14 points and five rebounds...Freshman guard **Terrick Willoughby** nailed three 3-pointers and followed with 11 points...Senior center **Brandon Griffin** and junior guard **Derek Winans** added 10 points apiece...Southeast hosts NCCAA foe Kentucky Christian on Monday, then travels to Missoula, MT, for the Montana Holiday Classic, Nov. 29-30. The Indians play host Montana before squaring off against either St. Mary's or UC Santa Barbara.

**TENNESSEE-MARTIN** (1-2 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee-Martin had a busy week, opening the 2003-04 season with a split at the Guardians Classic. The Skyhawks lost a 72-63 meeting with San Francisco, then claimed a 96-67 win over Western Illinois. UTM also dropped a 90-74 decision at Mississippi State....Juco transfer **Justin Smith's** transition to Division I hoops is off to a solid start. The junior guard took over for an injured **Earl Bullock** (knee) during the WIU game and finished with back-to-back 26-point outings against WIU and MSU...Bullock, who hit four 3-pointers and tossed in 16 points in the USF contest, sat out against MSU and is listed as questionable for Saturday's game at Vanderbilt...In addition to their meeting with Vandy, the Skyhawks play their home opener on Monday against NCCAA opponent Central Baptist.

**TENNESSEE STATE (0-0 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee State kicks off the 2003-04 season at home on Tuesday against in-town rival and NAIA foe Trevecca...The Tigers are under new management as legendary coach **Cy Alexander** takes over the reins of the Tiger program after compiling a 277-202 record during the last 16 years at South Carolina State...Senior guard **Garrett Richardson** is the league's active career leader in assists with 328 career handouts...Junior forward **Roshaun Bowens** is the Tigers' top returning scorer and rebounder after averaging 15.4 points and 6.7 rebounds per game a year ago...In addition to Trevecca, TSU travels to Tennessee on Friday.

**TENNESSEE TECH (1-0 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee Tech dismantled NAIA opponent Virginia Intermont, 96-67, to kick off the 2003-04 season. The Golden Eagles shot 53.7 percent from the field, its best effort in five games dating back to last season...Junior forward and UMass transfer **Willie Jenkins** had a solid Tech debut, scoring 17 points and tying for a game-high seven rebounds...Junior college transfer **Ben Jacobson** led all scorers with 18 points, while senior guard **Cameron Crisp** added 16 points and five boards...Senior guard **Leigh Gayden**, who took a medical redshirt last season, contributed eight points off the bench before fouling out...Tech entertains NAIA foe Virginia-Wise on Monday...TTU skipper and former Kentucky assistant **Mike Sutton** returns to Lexington for the first time as a Division I head coach when the Golden Eagles visit the Wildcats on Friday.

### OVC HOOPS NOTES

**NEW FACES IN THE CROWD:** Several new faces will be on the sidelines this season as **Jacksonville State** and **Samford** begin their first year of competition in the Ohio Valley Conference. JSU is headed by fourth-year coach **Mike LaPlante**, while Samford's skipper is seventh-year coach **Jimmy Tillette**. In addition, two long-time OVC members, **Murray State** and **Tennesseee State**, are under new management as **Mick Cronin** and **Cy Alexander** take over the reins of the Racer and Tiger programs, respectively.

**ONE MORE YEAR FOR MR. EVERYTHING:** Morehead State forward/guard and 2002-03 OVC Player of the Year **Ricky Minard** has finished among the Top 15 in every statistical category in each of the past two seasons. A two-time unanimous first-team All-OVC selection, Minard initially declared for the 2003 NBA Draft, but took his name out of the early-entry pool in order to return for his senior season.

**BUSTIN' BRACKETS:** Austin Peay will participate in the second edition of ESPN's Bracket Buster Saturday, traveling to an as-yet-to-be-determined opponent's site on February 21, 2004.

**BLOCK PARTY:** Austin Peay center **Josh Lewis** enters the season ranked seventh on the conference's all-time blocked shots list with a school-record 173 rejections after dismissing a league-high 82 shot attempts in 2002-03. He holds two spots on the league's single-season blocked shots chart. Last year's total of 82 is eighth, while his 2001-02 tally of 66 is ninth.

**TOP SCORERS RETURN:** Eight of the OVC's top 15 scorers from a year ago, all of whom averaged at least 14 points per game, return in 2003-04. Back are Morehead State forward/guard **Ricky Minard** (22.5 ppg) and guard **Chez Marks** (17.4 ppg), Tennessee-Martin guard **Earl Bullock** (16.0 ppg), Austin Peay forward **Adrian Henning** (15.5 ppg) and guard **Anthony Davis** (14.0 ppg), Tennessee State forward **Roshaun Bowens** (15.4 ppg), Southeast Missouri guard **Derek Winans** (15.3 ppg) and Murray State forward **Cuthbert Victor** (15.3 ppg).

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE: Morehead State senior guard/forward Ricky Minard was overwhelmingly selected as the 2003-04 OVC men's basketball preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. Minard joins AustinPeay senior forward Adrian Henning as unanimous choices to the preseason All-OVC first team. Accompanying them on the preseason All-OVC first team are Murray State senior guard/forward Cuthbert Victor, Austin Peay senior center Josh Lewis and Tennessee Tech senior guard Cameron Crisp. Selected to the preseason All-OVC second team were senior guard Chez Marks of Morehead State, junior guard Earl Bullock of Tennessee-Martin, junior guard Derek Winans and senior center Brandon Griffin of Southeast Missouri, junior forward/guard Anthony Davis of Austin Peay and sophomore guard Matt Witt of Eastern Kentucky.

**RANKING THE MID-MAJORS:** Austin Peay entered the season ranked 17th in the Preseason Mid-Major Top 25 poll, conducted by CollegeInsider.com. The website named Morehead State senior forward/guard **Ricky Minard** to its 25-member Preseason All-Mid Major Team.
