#### **PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

### CUTHBERT VICTOR • SR., F, 6'5, 220 • ST. CROIX, VIRGIN ISLANDS • MURRAY ST.

Victor captures his second straight OVC Player of the Week honor after shooting 83.3 percent from the field (20-of-24) and recording back-to-back double-doubles in a trio of Murray State victories. The senior forward was a perfect 8-of-8 from the floor with 19 points and 11 rebounds versus West Florida. He followed that with 14 points and 11 boards against SIU-Edwardsville, and just missed out on a third double-dip in the Southern Miss contest (14 pts./8 rbds.). Victor also finished with seven blocked shots, four assists and three steals for the week.

### **NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK**

### KELVIN BROWN • JR., F, 6'7, 220 • FT. LAUDERDALE, FL • MURRAY STATE

**Brown** also had three impressive outings for Murray State last week, averaging 18.7 points and 6.3 rebounds a game. The junior forward opened with back-to-back 20+ scoring efforts against West Florida (20 pts./7 rbds.) and SIU-Edwardsville (22 pts./5 rbds.) before capping off the week with 14 points and seven boards in the Southern Miss game. He also did his job at the free throw line, sinking 22 of 24 attempts (91.7%).

#### **ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

### BRUCE PRICE • FR., G, 6'3, 205 • MINNEAPOLIS, MN • TENNESSEE STATE

**Price** averaged 11.5 points and five assists per game in his first week of collegiate hoops. The freshman guard opened with 14 points and six assists in Tennessee State's victory over Trevecca, then added nine points, four rebounds, six steals and four assists in a loss at Tennessee.

### AROUND THE OVC...

**AUSTIN PEAY (1-2 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Austin Peay held Knoxville College to a Dunn Center record-low 35 points en route to its season-opening victory, 90-35. The Govs were unable to maintain the momentum, however, losing back-to-back road outings at Belmont (68-65) and Memphis (74-60)...APSU shot just 17.3 percent from 3-point range (4-of-23) in the two losses...Senior center **Josh Lewis** (Lexington, KY) collected his sixth career double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds at Memphis. He continues to climb the OVC's blocked shots ladder, ranking sixth all-time with 182 rejections...Reserve sophomore guard **Maurice Hampton** (Russellville, KY) has been the Govs' assist leader in two of their first three games, including a career-best five helpers at Memphis...APSU puts a 17-game home win streak on the line Monday against Evansville, then travels to Alabama on Saturday.

**EASTERN ILLINOIS (0-2 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Eastern Illinois shot just 38.6 percent from the field in an 81-47 loss at 15th-ranked Wisconsin...The Panthers made 11-of-15 free throws in the contest, compared to a 34-of-41 effort by the Badgers...Junior guard **Jason Wright** (DeKalb, IL) was the only player in double figures, going 4-of-4 from the floor with a pair of 3-pointers and a free throw for 11 points off the bench...Turnovers were costly for the Panthers, who committed 23 miscues to just seven by Wisconsin...EIU entertains Illinois-Chicago in its home opener on Tuesday.

**EASTERN KENTUCKY (1-2 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Eastern Kentucky routed Division III Ohio Wesleyan (106-52) in its home opener, but dropped a 71-65 decision on the road at Alabama A&M...Sophomore guard **Matt Witt** (Tipp City, OH) averaged 18 points and 6.5 assists per game in the two contests. Through three games, he leads the team with nine 3-pointers made...Freshman forward **Mamadou Dikhate** (Manhasset, NY) has started all three games, averaging 7.7 points and 4.0 rebounds each time out...Junior forward **Michael Haney** (Madisonville, KY) went 5-of-6 from the field and registered a double-double (12 pts./12 rbds.) at AAMU...EKU's 54-point win over OWU marked its second-straight 50+ victory over the Battling Bishops. The Colonels dished out 33 assists in the contest as 12 players scored, including six in double-digits...Five players, including four from EKU, fouled out of the AAMU game as the two teams combined for 51 fouls...EKU visits Winthrop on Tuesday and hosts Centre on Saturday.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (2-2 overall, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State went 1-2 last week, defeating Shorter College, 97-90, before losing back-to-back outings at Southern Illinois (84-49) and Mississippi Valley State (84-59)...Senior forward Trent Eager (Monroeville, AL) canned six 3-pointers as he pumped in a career-high 30 points against SC, becoming the first JSU player to hit the 30-point mark since Feb. 19, 1998, a span of 143 games... Junior forward Carl Brown (Birmingham, AL) added 23 points in the SC contest, hitting 11-of-12 field attempts with a free throw...Junior forward Abdou Diame (Thies, Senegal) was the only Gamecock to score in double figures at SIU (10 points), following that with 12 at MSVU...Jax State returns home for a pair of contests against Jackson State (Dec. 1) and Tennessee Temple (Dec. 6).

MOREHEAD STATE (1-2 overall, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State easily handled Asbury College in a 71-54 victory, but lost a physical outing at Marshall, 85-71...Senior forward and VCU transfer Josh Graham (Flemingsburg, KY) shot 55.6 percent from the field in the two contests and fell a point shy of back-to-back double-doubles (9 pts./11 rbds. vs. Asbury, 15 pts./15 rbds. vs. Marshall). Eleven of his boards versus the Thundering Herd were on the offensive end...Senior forward Ricky Minard (Mansfield, OH) hauled in 11 defensive rebounds en route to a double-double against the 'Herd (17 pts./12 rbds.). He became only the fifth player in Eagle history to top the 1,800-point plateau...Senior guard Chez Marks (Paris, KY) canned four 3-pointers and finished with a game-high 22 points at Marshall...The Eagles and 'Herd were whistled for a combined 55 fouls in their meeting...Sophomore forward Cory Burns missed the Marshall game due to illness...The Eagles are home for a pair versus Wright State (Dec. 3) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (Dec. 6).

MURRAY STATE (4-0 overall, 0-0 OVC): Murray State won a trio of contests last week by an average of 30.3 points per game, defeating West Florida (94-68), SIU-Edwardsville (81-56) and Southern Mississippi (94-54)...The Racers' 4-0 start has them ranked 22nd in the latest Mid-Major Top-25 poll by CollegeInsider.com...Senior forward Cuthbert Victor(St. Croix, Virgin Islands) had an outstanding week, averaging 15.7 points, 10.0 rebounds and 3.5 blocks shots per game while torching the nets for an 83.3 field goal percentage (20-of-24). He posted back-to-back double-doubles against UWF (19 pts./11 rbds.) and SIUE (14 pts./11 rbds.)...Junior forward Kelvin Brown (Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.) also had a trio of solid outings with 18.6 points and 6.3 caroms per game. He went 22-of-24 at the charity stripe (91.6%) for the week...Six players scored in double figures against USM, including all five starters...The Racers see their first road action of 2003-04 when they visit TCU (Dec. 3) and Western Kentucky (Dec. 7).

**SAMFORD (1-2 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Samford dispatched Bryan College, 94-61, before losing a 62-60 heartbreaker at New Orleans...Sophomore forward **J. Robert Merritt** (Oklahoma City, OK) shot a blistering 65 percent from the field last week, including going 9-of-14 from 3-point range (64.3%). He tied a careerhigh with 20 points against BC and added 16 at UNO while also tallying 10 rebounds for the week...Three Bulldogs are currently averaging double figures. Merritt leads the trio (14.3 ppg) while shooting 57.1 percent (52.6% from 3-pt. range). Senior guard **Eddie Harper** (Laurel, MS) is next with a 13.3 scoring average, converting 54.2 percent of his field attempts while clearing seven boards per game. Senior center **Philip Ramelli** (New Orleans, LA) rounds out the group (13.0 ppg/7.0 rpg)...Samford travels to Rock Hill, S.C. for the 2003 Brothers Heat & Air Shootout, Dec. 5-6. The Bulldogs play host Winthrop on Friday, then either Hampton or Southern Mississippi.

**SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (3-1 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Southeast Missouri defeated Santa Barbara, 77-75, in consolation action at the Montana Doubletree Holiday Classic in Missoula after losing a first-round contest to host Montana, 61-50. Earlier in the week, the Indians also triumphed over Kentucky Christian, 83-51...UCSB was ranked 11th nationally in the *CollegeeInsiders.com* mid-major poll prior to its loss to Southeast...Junior forward **Dainmon Gonner** (Fort Worth, TX) averaged 15.5 points and seven rebounds a game in tourney action, earning him a spot on the all-tournament team...The Indians shot just 31 percent from the field against Montana, but bounced back for a 52-percent effort versus UCSB, including a 10-of-17 performance from 3-point range (58.8%)...Redshirt freshman **Lance Sechrest** has left the team to concentrate on academics...The Indians play another mid-major poll resident this week when they visit Southern Illinois, which is ranked 15th on the *CollegeInsiders.com* site. Southeast travels to SIU on Wednesday before returning home to host UMKC on Saturday.

**TENNESSEE-MARTIN (2-3 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee-Martin vanquished Central Baptist College, 105-78, in its home opener, but was on the short end of a 94-60 score at Vanderbilt... Senior guard **Earl Bullock** (Lineville, AL) returned from a knee injury and scored a game-high 17 points at Vandy. He accounted for 14 of the Skyhawks' 29 three-point attempts, hitting five of them... Junior guard **Justin Smith** (Memphis, TN) is a perfect 17-of-17 from the the free throw line through five games. Smith will be playing in front of a hometown crowd when the Skyhawks travel to Memphis for a Dec. 3 meeting with the Tigers. UTM ends the three-game road swing on Dec. 6 at Mississippi Valley State.

**TENNESSEE STATE (1-1 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee State went 1-1 in its first week of action. New head coach **Cy Alexander** claimed his first TSU win with a 73-71 victory over cross-town rival Trevecca before dropping an 81-56 decision at Tennessee. The win over the Trojans snapped the Tigers' 21-game losing streak that dated back to Dec. 21 of last season...Senior guard **Garrett Richardson** (El Paso, TX) topped the 1,000-point plateau, averaging 17 points and 4.5 assists per game...Freshman guard **Bruce Price** (Minneapolis, Minn.) bounced back from a shoulder injury to contribute 11.5 points and five assists per contest...All 29 of junior forward **Roshaun Bowens'** (Nashville, TN) points have come in the second half of TSU's first two contests...The Tigers play two at home versus Chattanooga (Dec. 1) and Fisk (Dec. 4) before traveling to 2003 Preseason NIT champion Georgia Tech on Saturday.

**TENNESSEE TECH (2-1 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee Tech split its two outings last week, with a 90-47 thrashing of Virigina-Wise and a 108-81 loss at 10th-ranked Kentucky...Junior forward **Willie Jenkins** (Memphis, TN) averaged 22.5 points and 5.5 rebounds a game while shooting at a 60.7 clip from the field (17-of-28), including going 5-of-8 from 3-point land (62.5%)...The Golden Eagles forced Kentucky's starters to shoulder nearly all of the scoring burden (99 of 108 points), holding the Wildcats' bench to a single field goal and seven free throws...Senior guard **Cameron Crisp** (Bolivar, TN) averaged 15 points per game last week and currently sits 12 tics shy of the 1,000-point plateau...Sophomore guard **Keyon Boyd** went 7-of-8 from the field with a trio of 3-pointers for 18 points off the bench at Kentucky...Tech, 44-1 at home over the last three seasons (97.7%), puts a 20-game home non-conference win streak on the line this week as Idaho State (Dec. 2) and Middle Tennessee (Dec. 6) visit Eblen Center.

### **OVC HOOPS NOTES**

**BLOCK PARTY:** Austin Peay center **Josh Lewis**, the OVC's active career leader in blocked shots, has climbed into sixth on the conference's all-time list with 182 rejections. He holds two spots on the league's single-season blocked shots chart. Last year's total of 82 is eighth, while his 2001-02 tally of 66 is ninth.

**ONE MORE YEAR FOR MR. EVERYTHING:** Morehead State forward/guard and 2002-03 OVC Player of the Year **Ricky Minard** has finished among the Top 15 in every statistical category in each of the past two seasons and is the league's active career leader in scoring (1,811 points) and 3-pointers made (187). A two-time unanimous first-team All-OVC selection, Minard initially declared for the 2003 NBA Draft, but took his name out of the early-entry pool in order to return for his senior season.

**RANKING THE MID-MAJORS:** Murray State is ranked 22nd in the latest *CollegeInsider.com* Mid-Major Top 25 poll. Ausin Peay, which entered the season ranked 17th on the preseason poll, dropped out following losses at Belmont and Memphis. The website named Morehead State senior forward/guard **Ricky Minard** to its 25-member Preseason All-Mid Major Team.

**NEW FACES IN THE CROWD:** Several new faces are on the sidelines this season as **Jacksonville State** and **Samford** begin their first year of competition in the Ohio Valley Conference. JSU is headed by fourth-year coach **Mike LaPlante**, while Samford's skipper is seventh-year coach **Jimmy Tillette**. In addition, two long-time OVC members, **Murray State** and **Tennesseee State**, are under new management as **Mick Cronin** and **Cy Alexander** take over the reins of the Racer and Tiger programs, respectively.

**BUSTIN' BRACKETS:** Austin Peay will participate in the second edition of ESPN's Bracket Buster Saturday, traveling to an as-yet-to-be-determined opponent's site on February 21, 2004.

**TOP SCORERS RETURN:** Eight of the OVC's top 15 scorers from a year ago, all of whom averaged at least 14 points per game, return in 2003-04. Back are Morehead State forward/guard **Ricky Minard** (22.5 ppg) and guard **Chez Marks** (17.4 ppg), Tennessee-Martin guard **Earl Bullock** (16.0 ppg), Austin Peay forward **Adrian Henning** (15.5 ppg) and guard **Anthony Davis** (14.0 ppg), Tennessee State forward **Roshaun Bowens** (15.4 ppg), Southeast Missouri guard **Derek Winans** (15.3 ppg) and Murray State forward **Cuthbert Victor** (15.3 ppg).

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE: Morehead State senior guard/forward Ricky Minard was overwhelmingly selected as the 2003-04 OVC men's basketball preseason Player of the Year in voting by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. Minard joins Austin Peay senior forward Adrian Henning as unanimous choices to the preseason All-OVC first team. Accompanying them on the preseason All-OVC first team are Murray State senior guard/forward Cuthbert Victor, Austin Peay senior center Josh Lewis and Tennessee Tech senior guard Cameron Crisp. Selected to the preseason All-OVC second team were senior guard Chez Marks of Morehead State, junior guard Earl Bullock of Tennessee-Martin, junior guard Derek Winans and senior center Brandon Griffin of Southeast Missouri, junior forward/guard Anthony Davis of Austin Peay and sophomore guard Matt Witt of Eastern Kentucky.
