BRANDON GRIFFIN • SR., C, 6'8, 230 • GREENSBURG, LA • SOUTHEAST MISSOURI

Griffin averaged a double-double (14 ppg/11.5 rpg) as Southeast Missouri went 1-1 in non-conference action last week. After recording 16 points and 11 rebounds in the Indians' 78-68 loss at Arkansas, the senior center charted his first career triple-double with 12 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists in a 79-67 triumph over Oakland City. Griffin shot 59.1 percent from the field (13-of-22) for the week and was 2-of-4 at the free throw line.

NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

JARED NEWSON • SO., G/F, 6'5, 215 • BELLEVILLE, IL • TENNESSEE-MARTIN

Newson tallied 20 points in 24 minutes of action in Tennessee-Martin's 88-64 win over Rochester College. The sophomore guard/forward was perfect in four 3-point attempts as part of an overall 7-of-8 shooting effort (87.5%). He also contributed four rebounds, four assists, three steals and a blocked shot.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

WILL LEWIS • FR., F, 6'8, 210 • FORT WAYNE, IN • TENNESSEE-MARTIN

Lewis collected his first double-double with 13 rebounds and 10 points in the Skyhawks' win over Rochester. The true freshman forward shot 50 percent from the floor (3-of-6) and was a perfect 4-of-4 at the charity stripe while also registering a blocked shot and two steals.

2003-04 Ohio Valley Conference Men's Basketball Report AROUND THE OVC...

AUSTIN PEAY (2-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Austin Peay dropped a 75-59 outing at Western Kentucky for its second straight loss...The Governors held a 39-31 lead at the break, but hit a 5:56 scoreless stretch in the second half, during which WKU scored 16 unanswered points...Senior center **Josh Lewis (Lexington, KY)** led the team with 13 points and six rebounds. He also blocked one shot attempt, tying him for fourth place on the OVC's all-time list (186) and extending to 32 his streak of consecutive games with at least one rejection...Senior foward **Adrian Henning (Memphis, TN)** sits five points shy of the 1,000 career mark and needs just one rebound to reach 500...The Govs put their 18-game home win streak on the line when they host Maryville College on Monday. APSU also visits its 2003 NCAA tournament opponent, Louisville, on Saturday.

EASTERNILLINOIS (1-5 overall, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Illinois rolled over St. Francis (80-57) to snap a season-opening four-game slide, but the Panthers were unable to maintain the momentum in an 86-76 loss to Evansville...EIU registered season-highs in points (80) and field goal percentage (53.8%) in the win over the Saints as four Panthers scored in double-figures, led by junior guard Emanuel Dildy (Chicago, IL) and junior forward Aaron Patterson (Indianapolis, IN), who combined to go 11-of-13 from the field and finished with 12 points apiece...Junior guard Derik Hollyfield (Aurora, IL) grabbed 10 rebounds and blocked three shots in the SFU contest...Junior guard Jason Wright (DeKalb, IL) netted a career-high 17 points at Evansville. He hit 62.5 percent of his field attempts for the week (10-of-16), including going 4-of-6 from 3-point land...EIU plays the second of four straight road contests at Western Illinois on Saturday.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (2-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Kentucky lost a tough 63-62 outing in overtime at Savannah State...Junior forward **Michael Haney (Madisonville, KY)** went 7-of-12 from the field and fell just shy of a double-double with 19 points and nine rebounds...Senior guard **Mike Scott (Baltimore, MD)** added 12 points and a career-high 11 boards before fouling out...Leading scorer **Matt Witt (Tipp City, OH)** played only 11 minutes before leaving with a sprained ankle midway through the first half...Five EKU players registered six or more rebounds as the Colonels held a 50-37 advantage on the glass...The Colonels will have an opportunity to avenge its loss to SSU when the Tigers return the game in a Dec. 20 visit to Richmond.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (4-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State placed five players, including four starters, in double figures but still fell, 70-68, at Alcorn State...Senior forward Scott Watson (Gilbert, AZ) went 4-of-6 from 3-point range as he led the Gamecocks with 18 points...Junior forward Carl Brown (Birmingham, AL) added 12 points along with a game-high seven rebounds, while senior forward Trent Eager (Monroeville, AL) and sophomore reserve Walker Russell (Rochester, MI) chipped in 11 points each and senior guard James Denson (Walnut Grove, MS) contributed 10...The Gamecocks hauled in a season-low 25 rebounds, but still finished with a 25-23 edge over the Braves...JSU visits Savannah State on Tuesday.

MOREHEAD STATE (3-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State dropped a close 78-75 decision at IPFW...Senior forward/guard Ricky Minard went 10-of-11 from the free throw line as he pumped in a season-high 37 points to go with eight rebounds. The Mansfield, Ohio, native has 1,889 points and now sits within 183 tics of the Eagles' all-time scoring mark...Senior guard Chez Marks (Paris, KY) tossed in 10 points to pass the 900-point career mark (902). He is on pace to become the 27th member of the school's 1,000-point club later this season...All three of Morehead State's victories have come at home, while all three losses have been on the road...The Eagles play host to Kentucky Christian on Monday.

MURRAY STATE (7-0 overall, 0-0 OVC): Murray State breezed past Chicago State, 100-80, to extend its unbeaten record to seven...Senior forward Cuthbert Victor (St. Croix, Virgin Islands) had a monster game, canning a career-high 35 points on 13-of-16 shooting from the field (8-of-9 from the free throw line) while grabbing eight rebounds and blocking five shots...Freshman forward Shawn Witherspoon (Oviedo, FL) netted a season-best 15 points in 16 minutes of play off the bench, going 7-of-10 from the field with a free throw...Senior forward Antione Whelchel (Gainesville, GA) was a perfect 8-of-8 at the charity stripe, finishing with 18 points and six assists...The Racers, who have won 11 straight at home dating back to last season, host Southern Illinois on Wednesday before traveling to Pittsburgh for a Dec. 20 meeting.

SAMFORD (2-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Samford lost an 80-62 outing at Ohio State...Sophomore forward J. Robert Merritt (Oklahoma City, OK) went 6-of-9 from the floor, including 4-of-7 from behind the arc, to lead the Bulldogs with 16 points and five assists...Senior center Phillip Ramelli (New Orleans, LA) is the only Samford player to score in double figures in all six games after netting 14 at OSU. He shot 6-of-8 from the field with a pair of 3-pointers...Merritt, Ramelli and senior guard Eddie Harper (Laurel, MS) are all averaging a team-high 12 points per game...Samford shot 49 percent from the floor (41% from 3-point range), but foul trouble cost the Bulldogs as OSU went 17-of-19 from the charity stripe in the second half...After playing five of their first six games on the road, the Bulldogs return home to face Tennessee Temple on Thursday and Covenant College on Saturday.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (5-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Southeast Missouri split a pair of non-conference tilts last week, losing at Arkansas (78-68) and defeating Oakland City (79-67)... Senior center Brandon Griffin (Greensburg, LA) had an outstanding week, registering a double-double in the loss to the Razorbacks (16 pts./11 rbds.) and collecting a triple-double against the Mighty Oaks (12 pts./12 rbds./10 asts.)... After pumping in 20 points at Arkansas, junior forward Dainmon Gonner (Ft. Worth, TX) was held scoreless in just six minutes of play versus the Oaks to halt his streak of double-figure scoring at five... Junior guard Derek Winans hit four 3-pointers as part of a 7-of-7 night to contribute 18 points against OCU, while junior guard Mike Nelke (St. Louis, MO) drained all five of his trey attempts in the first half and finished with 15 points. Senior guard Damarcus Hence (Memphis, TN) scored a team-high 20 points off the bench... Southeast shot 50 percent or better from the field in both contests... The Indians take the week off for final exams.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (3-5 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee-Martin ended a three-game losing skid with an 88-64 rout of Rochester College...Four players scored in double figures. Junior guard **Justin Smith (Memphis, TN)** led all scorers with 23 points while sophomore guard/forward **Jared Newson** was perfect on four 3-point attempts in a 7-of-8 shooting effort and finished with 20. Smith converted all four of his free throw attempts and is 24-of-25 from the stripe thus far (96%)...Junior guard **Jeremy Kelly (Louisville, KY)** was one of two Skyhawks with double-double performances, collecting 20 points and 10 rebounds while dishing out six assists. Freshman foward **Will Lewis (Fort Wayne, IN)** registered his first career double-dip with 10 points and 13 boards...The Skyhawks will be without the services of senior guard **Earl Bullock (Lineville, AL)**, who is out for the season with a knee injury, and freshman guard **Logan Mooneyham**, who has decided to transfer...UTM will be looking to avenge an earlier loss when Mississippi Valley State visits on Saturday.

TENNESSEE STATE (1-6 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee State dropped an 85-64 decision at Vanderbilt and then lost a 78-77 heartbreaker to host Alabama A&M on a buzzer-beating shot...Junior forward **Roshaun Bowens (Nashville, TN)** and senior guard **Garrett Richardson (El Paso, TX)** combined for 40 of the Tigers' 64 points in the Vandy contest, scoring 22 and 18, respectively...Richardson, the OVC's career active steals leader (215), is averaging a league-high 3.1 steals per game this season...Freshman guard **Bruce Price (Minneapolis, MN)** tossed in a season-high 23 points at AAMU, while Bowens added 18 and junior **Jeremy Jackson (East St. Louis, IL)** came off the bench to can five 3-pointers, including four in the second half, for 15 points...After winning their season-opener, the Tigers have lost six straight...TSU continues its six-game road trip with dates at Wyoming (Dec. 17) and Colorado (Dec. 19).

TENNESSEE TECH (4-2 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee Tech had four players score in double figures in a 98-79 loss at undefeated Vanderbilt...Senior guard **Cameron Crisp (Bolivar, TN)** canned five 3-pointers on 10-of-14 field shooting for a team-high 26 points...Sophomore guard **Millone Clark (Gibson, NC)** and junior foward **Willie Jenkins (Memphis, TN)** followed with 16 points apiece, while senior guard **Will Moore (Atlanta, GA)** added 11...TTU boasts a 13-game win streak at home...Tech meets up with East Tennesssee State for the first time in 20 years when the Buccaneers visit Eblen Center on Wednesday. The Golden Eagles also host Appalachian State on Saturday.

OVC HOOPS NOTES

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: The last time Austin Peay squared off against Louisville, the two teams were battling for the right to advance in the 2003 NCAA Tournament. This year's contest, however, pairs the two teams for a decidedly different reason -- to help a colleague face a challenging future. Of the guarantee Louisville will pay Austin Peay for the Dec. 20 contest, \$10,000 will be donated in the name of APSU and the people of Clarksville, Tenn., to a medical fund established for former Louisville basketball star and Clarksville native Marques Maybin, who was paralyzed from the waist down in an Aug. 5 motorcycle accident.

VICTOR SIZZLING: Seven games into the season, Murray State senior forward Cuthbert Victor is making a strong case for postseason honors. The St. Croix, Virgin Islands, native is torching the nets with a league-high and nationally-ranked 75.3 shooting percentage, having missed just 18 of 73 field goal attempts. He leads the OVC in rebounding (11.3 rpg) and blocked shots (16) while ranking second in scoring (19.9 ppg).

STREAKIN': Three OVC teams boast double-digit win streaks on their home courts. Austin Peay is currently ranked eighth in the nation with an 18-game run in the Dunn Center, while Tennessee Tech has won 13 straight in Eblen Center and is tied for 13th nationally. Murray State has won 11 consecutive games in the Regional Special Events Center and is tied for 15th.

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE: Nearly one month into the season, nine of the league's 11 teams are undefeated at home as OVC squads boast a combined 29-3 record on their own turf. The road hasn't been as kind, however, as the league is 3-34 in away contests.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: Samford forward J. Robert Merritt's move to the OVC hasn't affected his ability to hit the "3," as the sophomore leads the league with a 51.5 conversion rate behind the arc. He has hit 17-of-33 long-range attempts thus far and ranks fourth in the conference with 2.83 treys per game. Last season, Merritt canned 48-of-112 three-pointers (42.9%). As a team, the Bulldogs are averaging a league-high 10 treys per game while ranking third in 3-point field goal percentage (39.2%).

OFF TO THE RACES: At 7-0, Murray State is off to its best start since opening the 1998-99 campaign with a 9-0 run. After topping the century mark in back-to-back wins over Western Kentucky (100-95) and Chicago State (100-80), the Racers' high-octane offense is averaging 90.6 points per game and outscoring opponents by a +20.9 margin (both OVC highs), while the defense has blocked a conference-best 35 shot attempts and recorded a league-high 74 steals (10.57 spg). The Racers also boast the OVC's best turnover margin (+5.71) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.42).

BLOCK PARTY: Austin Peay senior center Josh Lewis, the OVC's active career leader in blocked shots, continues his climb up the league's charts, moving into a tie for fourth place with 186 rejections. The Lexington, Ky., native has a long way to go, though, for the all-time mark of 439, set by Tennessee Tech's Lorenzo Coleman (1993-97).

RANKING THE MID-MAJORS: Undefeated Murray State was ranked 15th in the Dec. 8 edition of the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. Tennessee Tech has also received some notice, garnering three votes. The website named Morehead State senior forward/guard Ricky Minard to its 25-member Preseason All-Mid Major Team.
