#### **PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

#### CHEZ MARKS • SR., G, 6'3, 160 • PARIS, KY • MOREHEAD STATE

**Marks** poured in 35 points to lead Morehead State to a 93-66 win over Kentucky Christian. The senior guard hit his first 10 attempts before missing a 3-point try and finished the game with a 14-of-15 effort (93.3%). His performance ranks first nationally among single-game outings through Dec. 15. Marks canned five 3-pointers in the contest and leads the league in both trey shooting (46.3%) and average (3.57 pg). He also went 2-of-2 from the free throw line and contributed two rebounds, two assists and five steals in 23 minutes of action.

#### **NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK**

#### JUSTIN SMITH • JR., G, 6'3, 190 • MEMPHIS, TN • TENNESSEE-MARTIN

**Smith** canned six 3-pointers to help guide Tennessee-Martin to a 99-70 victory over Mississippi Valley State. The junior guard did all of his damage from either behind the arc, where he was 6-of-9, or at the foul line, where he made all but one of seven free throw attempts. Smith also hauled in six rebounds and dished out three assists with a steal.

#### **ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

#### BRUCE PRICE • FR., G, 6'3, 205 • MINNEAPOLIS, MN • TENNESSEE STATE

**Price** bounced back from injury to pump in a season-high 29 points in Tennessee State's 71-44 loss at Colorado. The freshman guard, who sat out the Tigers' game against Wyoming two days earlier with a strained back, drained six 3-pointers as part of a 56.2 percent shooting effort, and went 5-of-8 from the charity stripe. Price also hauled in five rebounds.

# 2003-04 Ohio Valley Conference Men's Basketball Report AROUND THE OVC...

**AUSTIN PEAY (3-5 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Austin Peay is still seeking its first road win of the season after losing at 20th-ranked Louisville, 80-63. Earlier in the week, the Governors extended their home court win streak to 19 with an 86-62 triumph over Maryville College...Adrian Henning (Memphis, TN) recorded back-to-back double-doubles (15 pts./10 rbds. vs. MC, 15 pts./11 rbds. vs. UL) to become only the 10th Gov to join the 1,000-point, 500-rebound club...After contributing 31 points and 11 assists in the Maryville contest, APSU's bench was held to eight points and two assists versus Louisville...**Josh Lewis (Lexington, KY)** collected four blocked shots last week, stretching to 34 his streak of consecutive games with at least one rejection...APSU continues its eightgame road swing with a Dec. 23 date at Middle Tennessee and a New Year's Eve meeting versus Kentucky at Freedom Hall in Louisville, Ky. The Govs also kick off the conference portion of their OVC schedule on Jan. 3 at Jacksonville State.

**EASTERN ILLINOIS (1-6 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Eastern Illinois had five players score in double figures in its 84-79 loss at Western Illinois...**Derik Hollyfield (Aurora, IL)** led the quintet with 17 points...**Jason Wright (DeKalb, IL)** had a solid all-around outing with 13 points, six rebounds and five assists...EIU shot over 40 percent from the field for the third straight game...Down by 13 with 2:46 left to play, the Panthers trimmed the deficit to just three with seven seconds remaining but WIU made two free throws a second later to clinch the win...**Jake Sinclair (Pana, IL)** chipped in six points, five boards and five steals off the bench...The Panthers conclude a four-game road stretch at Ohio State (Dec. 23) and lowa (Dec. 30) before returning home to entertain Illinois College.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (3-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Kentucky avenged an earlier loss to Savannah State with a 90-56 rout of the Tigers. The game was a 35-point turnaround from the Colonels' 63-62 overtime loss at SSU on Dec. 8...Michael Haney (Madisonville, KY) went 8-of-11 from the field en route to his ninth career double-double and second of the season (20 pts./13 rbds.)...Mike Scott (Baltimore, MD) also had a double-dip (16 pts./11 rbds.)...The Colonels outrebounded SSU, 51-42, and dished out 17 assists while committing just eight turnovers...EKU's free throw woes continued with a 55.3 percent effort (26-of-47) in the contest...The Colonels' Dec. 23 trip to No. 1 Kentucky marks just the second time in school history an EKU squad has faced off against a top-ranked team. The first was a 106-57 loss to Maryland during the 1972-73 season...EKU also visits 13th-ranked Florida on Dec. 27 before opening a six-game homestand with Alabama A&M and Robert Morris.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (5-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State got double-digit scoring from four of five starters in a 71-58 victory over Savannah State... James Denson (Walnut Grove, MS) paced the Gamecocks with 16 points, while Walker Russell (Rochester, MI) drained 10-of-12 free throws and added 12 points... Trent Eager (Monroeville, AL) scored 11 points and hauled in 11 rebounds for a double-double... JSU visits Mississippi on Dec. 22 and plays its first OVC contest on Jan. 3 against Austin Peay as part of a two-game homestand which opens on Dec. 30 with Alcorn State.

MOREHEAD STATE (4-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State staged a 93-66 rout of Kentucky Christian... Chez Marks (Paris, KY) hit his first 10 field goal attempts and finished 14-of-15, including 5-of-6 from 3-point range, as he poured in 35 points in just 23 minutes of action. The senior guard is closing in on 1,000 career points with 937 thus far... Ricky Minard (Mansfield, OH) added 11 points to push his career scoring total to 1,900... Thirteen of the 14 Eagles who entered the contest played at least 10 minutes with 12 of the 14 scoring at least one basket... Morehead State shot a blistering 68.8 percent from the field in the first half, 59.7 percent for the game... Quinton Smith (Radcliff, KY) dished out 10 assists while committing just two turnovers... The Eagles play three on the road (Dec. 23 at Indiana, Dec. 28 at Notre Dame and Dec. 30 at Xavier) before returning home to begin a four-game stand with Greenville College.

MURRAY STATE (8-1 overall, 0-0 OVC): Murray State rallied from a 15-point deficit to hand Southern Illinois its first loss of the season (68-64), but the Racers' season-opening eight-game win streak came to an end in a 70-49 setback at Pittsburgh...Kelvin Brown netted a game-high 20 points against the Salukis...Cuthbert Victor (St. Croix, Virgin Islands) went 7-of-9 against SIU to finish with a double-double (19 pts./15 rbds.), but was held to seven points with 11 boards versus Pitt. Victor, who began the week as the nation's top field-goal shooter (75.3%), saw his league-leading average dip to 68.4 percent after a 3-of-13 outing at Pitt...The Racers entered last week averaging 90 points per game, but were limited to less than 70 in each contest...Murray State shot 29 percent from the floor on Saturday, marking its first sub-43-percent effort of the season ...The Racers play their third and final game of the Pittsburgh Holiday Classic on Dec. 22 against Georgetown College, then continue their six-game road swing at Delaware State (Dec. 28) and Louisville (Jan. 3).

SAMFORD (4-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Samford won back-to-back outings for the first time this season, defeating Tennessee Temple (85-50) and Covenant College (95-54)...Tyson Dorsey (Brantford, Ontario) went 7-of-11 from behind the arc (63.6%) and led the team with 25 points for the week...Rookie reserve Jerry Smith (Picayune, MS) was a perfect 5-of-5 from the field and 2-of-2 at the line for a season-high 13 points against Tennessee Temple. He also dished out a season-best eight assists versus Covenant...The Bulldogs torched the nets, shooting 69.3 percent from the field, including a 16-of-33 effort from 3-point range (48.5%)...Phillip Ramelli (New Orleans, LA) sat out the Covenant game after hitting 8-of-11 field goal attempts for 18 points against Tennessee Temple...Josh Hare (Cleveland, TN) and Sebastian Sachse each went 6-of-8 from the field and combined for 35 points off the bench in the Covenant contest...Samford plays at Memphis (Dec. 22) and Oklahoma State (Dec. 30) before returning home to welcome Tennessee Wesleyan on Jan. 3.

**SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (5-3 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Southeast Missouri took the week off for final exams, but returns to action on Dec. 22 as North Texas visits the Show Me Center....The Indians also travel to DePaul for a New Year's Eve contest and play at IPFW on Jan. 3.

**TENNESSEE-MARTIN (4-5 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee-Martin placed four players in double-digit scoring as the Skyhawks won their second-straight with a 99-70 rout of Mississippi Valley State. The victory avenged an earlier-season 90-74 loss at MVSU...**Justin Smith (Memphis, TN)** drained 6-of-9 three-point attempts and hit 6-of-7 free throws for a game-high 24 points and six rebounds...**Jeremy Kelly (Louisville, KY)** was perfect in three trey attempts as part of a 6-of-7 shooting effort and followed with 20 points...**Cleve Woodfork (St. Louis, MO)** hit all six of his field goal tries, finishing with 15 points and six boards...The Skyhawks shot 59.6 percent from the field, including going 13-of-24 from 3-point range (54.2%), and outrebounded MVSU, 43-35...UTM plays at Indiana State (Dec. 22) and Central Florida (Dec. 30), then comes home for a Jan. 2 date with Portland State.

**TENNESSEE STATE (1-8 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee State took a trip to the Rocky Mountains last week, dropping contests at Wyoming (109-56) and Colorado (71-44)...The Tigers are on an eight-game slide after winning their season-opener against Trevecca...**Bruce Price (Minneapolis, MN)** sat out the Wyoming contest with a strained back but rebounded nicely to score 29 points against the Buffaloes. He connected on six 3-pointers in the contest...**Brandon Lockridge (Nashville, TN)** chipped in six 3-pointers and 20 points off the bench at Wyoming...At Colorado, TSU cut a 19-point deficit to 10 with just under nine minutes to play, but the Tigers didn't make another field goal the rest of the game...Tennessee State ends its six-game road trip Dec. 22 at Chattanooga, then takes a week off before opening a three-game homestand with Portland State on Dec. 30.

**TENNESSEE TECH (5-3 overall, 0-0 OVC):** Tennessee Tech split a pair of home games last week, losing a 77-70 decision to East Tennessee State before claiming an 86-78 victory over Appalachian State....The loss to ETSU snapped Tech's 22-game non-conference home win streak and 13-game overall run in Eblen Center....**Milone Clark (Gibson, NC)** averaged 16.5 points and 9.5 rebounds per game for the week. He tied a career-high with 23 points against ASU, adding 10 boards for his first double-double of the season...**Willie Jenkins (Memphis, TN)** contributed a 19.5 scoring average last week...Tech's first double-double effort of the season was a little non-traditional as **Will Moore** was held to just two points versus ETSU, but registered career-highs of 10 rebounds and 11 assists...**Cameron Crisp** handed out nine assists last week, moving him into fifth place on Tech's all-time list with 328 helpers...The Golden Eagles visit Tennessee on Dec. 22 and Jacksonville on Dec. 29, then return home for a Jan. 3 outing against Bluefield College.

#### **OVC HOOPS NOTES**

**NO OVC REPORT NEXT WEEK:** The Ohio Valley Conference office will be closed Wed., Dec. 24, 2003 through Fri., Jan. 2, 2004. There will be no OVC men's basketball report on Dec. 29. The next installment of the weekly report will be Monday, January 5, 2004.

**EAGLES ENJOY M&M FIX:** Morehead State senior guards **Ricky Minard** and **Chez Marks** currently account for over half of the Eagles' scoring, producing league-highs of 21.4 and 20.4 points per game, respectively. Each player has tallied double figures in six of seven games thus far with three 30+ outings between them. Marks also tops the OVC in 3-point shooting (46.3%, 3.5 pg) and ranks second with a 90 percent conversion rate at the free throw line.

**TV GAMES:** OVC fans may catch a glimpse of their favorite team on TV in the coming weeks. In addition to the conference television package (see schedule below) which kicks off on Jan. 10, 2004, several non-conference games will be televised regionally. Four contests will be ESPN regional broadcasts (known as ESPN-Plus): **Samford** at Memphis (Dec. 22), **Eastern Illinois** at Ohio State (Dec. 23) and lowa (Dec. 30) and **Morehead State** at Indiana (Dec. 23). Two games at Kentucky, **Eastern Kentucky** on Dec. 23 and **Austin Peay** on Dec. 31, are set to air on the UK Network, while EKU's Dec. 27 trip to Florida will be shown on the Sunshine Network. Also, Morehead State's Dec. 30 trip to Xavier will be televised on Fox Sports Net Ohio.

**CONFERENCE PLAY OFF TO EARLY START: Austin Peay** and **Jacksonville State** are getting an early start to the conference portion of their schedules as the two teams square off Jan. 3 in Jacksonville, Ala. The contest, originally scheduled for Feb. 21, was moved to facilitate Austin Peay's participation in the second edition of ESPN's "Bracket Buster Series."

**TORCHING THE NETS:** Samford shooters are converting a league-high 53.9 percent of their field goal attempts, including an OVC-best 40.9 percent from 3-point range. The Bulldogs are one of two OVC teams converting over half of their field goal attempts thus far, having shot below 40 percent only once in eight outings. A third of Samford's offense has come via the 3-point shot as the Bulldogs are averaging a conference-best 9.5 treys per game.

**TORCHING THE NETS, PART II:** Through games of Dec. 15, four of the nation's best single-game shooting efforts have come courtesy of the OVC. Morehead State's **Chez Marks** occupies the top spot following a 14-of-15 (93.3%) showing against Kentucky Christian. Tennessee State's **Roshaun Bowens** is second after going 12-of-13 (92.3%) versus Chattanooga, while Jacksonville State's **Carl Brown** is tied for third with his 11-of-12 (91.7%) effort against Shorter College. Murray State's **Cuthbert Victor** is tied for seventh after a 13-of-16 (81.3%) performance versus Chicago State.

**STREAKIN':** Two OVC teams boast double-digit win streaks on their home courts. **Austin Peay** is currently tied for eighth in the nation with an 19-game run in the Dunn Center, while **Murray State** has won 12 consecutive games in the Regional Special Events Center and is 14th. **Tennessee Tech** had its 13-game home win streak end in a 77-70 loss to East Tennessee State on Dec. 17.

**HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE:** One month into the season, eight of the league's 11 teams are undefeated at home as OVC squads boast a combined 37-5 record on their own turf. The road hasn't been as kind, however, as the league is 4-38 in away contests.

**RANKING THE MID-MAJORS: Murray State** is ranked ninth in the latest edition of the *CollegeInsider.com* Mid-Major Top 25 poll. The website named Morehead State senior forward/guard **Ricky Minard** to its 25-member Preseason All-Mid Major Team.
