THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Wes Cunningham, 1B • Sr., 6-2, 195 • Louisville, Ky. • Murray State

For the second week in a row and third time this season Cunningham earned OVC Player of the Week honors after hitting .636 (7-for-11) with 12 RBI as Murray State swept Eastern Kentucky and took over sole possession of first place in the league standings. In three games Cunningham also had five runs scored, a double, triple and home run. Along the way Cunningham set the MSU single-season record for RBI (72) and tied the single-season record for hits (81). He was 2-for-4 with a walk in the opener against EKU, hit a home run in his first at-bat of game two on his way to a 3-for-3 performance and finished the weekend with a 2-for-4 performance where he drove in a career-best six RBI. His triple on Sunday was the 13th of his career, giving him the Murray State all-time mark in that category (passing former Major Leaguer Jack Perconte).

Chris Craycraft, RHP • Sr., 6-1, 190 • Lexington, Ky. • Murray State

Craycraft tossed a complete game three-hitter in the 8-1 series opening victory over Eastern Kentucky on Saturday. The senior retired the first nine hitters he faced and allowed just a pair of hits in the fourth and another hit in the sixth inning. Craycraft needed just 107 total pitches to finish the game as he struck out eight and walked only one to improve to 6-3 on the season.

TEAM NOTES

Austin Peay (22-22, 4-11 OVC): After having its weekend series with Morehead State rained out last weekend, Austin Peay finally returned to Conference action this weekend, playing three at Tennessee Tech. Unfortunately for the Governors, Tech remained hot, sweeping the Governors by scores of 15-3, 6-1 and 10-2. The losses dropped Austin Peay to 4-11 in OVC play, 6.5 games out of first place. With only six OVC games remaining for APSU, the team will have to win at least four to avoid elimination from tournament contention, but are not guaranteed a spot even if they win out (it will depend on what other teams do). This week the Govs will play a doubleheader at Evansville on Tuesday and then travel to Southeast Missouri State for a three-game weekend series.

Eastern Illinois (14-31, 9-11 OVC): Eastern Illinois took one of three games at Jacksonville State this past weekend and are now 9-11 in OVC play, which has moved them into fifth place overall in the league standings. The Panthers are in a group of four teams who are virtually even in the standings with two weekends of play remaining. EIU, however, has just one Conference weekend left, as they step out of Conference play this coming weekend, hosting future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville and non-conference foe Indiana State for four total games (two with each squad). The Panthers also play at Illinois State in mid-week action. Senior Alex Gee hit .462 (6-for-13) with five runs scored, four home runs and nine RBI (six of which came with two outs) in the weekend series. Although he did not earn OVC Player of the Week honors, he was touted one of the Louisville Slugger National Players of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. In the opening game against Jax State, the Panthers led 10-5 in the seventh before JSU took an 11-10 lead after a six-run inning. Eastern would tie the game in the ninth only to lose in walk-off fashion; it marked the sixth walk-off loss of the season for the Panthers who are now just 2-13 in one-run games. But EIU came back strong on Sunday with a six-run third inning (the team's second biggest scoring inning of the year) on its way to a 10-3 win. Josh Mueller struck out 10 in 5.2 innings of work on Friday, his second 10+ strikeout effort of the year. His 10.91 strikeouts per nine innings is tops in the league and ranks in the top 50 nationally.

Eastern Kentucky (22-22, 8-10 OVC): Eastern Kentucky continued its road woes this season by dropping three games at now league-leading Murray State over the weekend (following an 11-10 non-conference win at home over Ohio to begin the week). That dropped the Colonels to 11-17 in all road games this season and 2-10 in OVC road games (EKU is 6-0 in home Conference games this season). Sophomore shortstop Richie Rodriguez hit .429 (6-for-14) with six runs scored, two triples, a home run, four RBI and a stolen base in four games last week. In the team's win over Ohio, Rodriguez had a triple and his first career grand slam as Eastern won by a single run. For the week Rodriguez had a .929 slugging and .556 on-base percentage. This week the Colonels will play at Dayton in non-conference action and then host Jacksonville State in what will be EKU's last Conference series of the year (the Colonels have a Conference bye the last weekend of the regular season). EKU was supposed to host Xavier this week as well, but the game was cancelled due to scheduling conflicts. Entering the week EKU is in sixth place in the standings, but in a group of four teams who are nearly identical in winning percentage, meaning every win down the stretch will be important.

Jacksonville State (23-21, 10-7 OVC): Jacksonville State lost to Troy in non-conference action and then won two of three games against Eastern Illinois to improve to 10-7 in OVC play, which places them in third place overall, but just 1.5 games out of first place. Junior Todd Cunningham hit .500 (9-for-18) with three runs, a triple, home run and five RBI in four games last week. In those four games, Cunningham had three multiple-hit and two multiple-RBI outings and raised his batting average to a team-high .362. The triple was the 16th of his career, two away from the OVC all-time record. Senior Bert Smith started his 219th game on Saturday, giving him the JSU all-time record. He has played in 220 total games, which is just four away from the OVC all-time mark, which he should tie on Saturday and break on Sunday of this week. Smith, who also stole his 100th career base last week, is just one hit shy of 300 for his career, which would make him the only active Division I player with 300 knocks. Senior Steven Leach drew his 111th career walk last week, setting the Jax State career mark in that category. Over the weekend Leach hit .545 with four RBI including going a combined 6-for-8 in Saturday's doubleheader sweep. Junior Jay Davis had a bases loaded single in the bottom of the ninth of Saturday's first game, giving the Gamecocks a walk-off victory over EIU; it was the team's second walk-off OVC win of the season. JSU will play at UAB on Tuesday and host that same team on Wednesday night. In weekend OVC play the Gamecocks travel to Eastern Kentucky for a three-game series. So far this year EKU is 6-0 in home OVC contests.

Morehead State (24-21, 6-8 OVC): After being rained out from OVC competition a week ago, Morehead State returned to play this weekend with three home games against UT Martin. The Eagles, who had been 15-6 at home entering the series, were swept in Saturday's doubleheader, losing games by margins of 10-9 and 17-8. But MSU rebounded on Sunday to win 10-9 and improve to 6-8 in OVC play on the season. That puts the Eagles in seventh place in the league standings with six Conferences games to be played. Morehead State is among a group of four teams who are virtually tied in the standings by winning percentage meaning every game down the stretch will be important. During the week sophomore Taylor Davis hit .545 (6-for-11) with three runs, two home runs and five RBI. Andrew Deeds extended his hitting streak to 12 games, the longest active streak in the OVC right now. Senior Drew Lee had a big week on and off the field. Lee was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District team for his work in the classroom, and as a quarterfinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award, given to the nation's top shortstop. Lee also tied the MSU career doubles mark of 57. Lee now has 184 career RBI, just 24 away from the OVC all-time record (he already owns the Morehead State career mark). This week

2010 OVC TOURNAMENT

A first is in order for the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Championship. After nine years in Paducah, Ky., the tournament will be held May 26-29 (30) at Pringles Park in Jackson, Tenn. Every game of the event can be seen live and on-demand at OVCsports.TV.

Pringles Park is the home of the West Tenn Diamond Jaxx, the Double-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners. The 6,000-seat natural grass stadium opened in 1998. The OVC and Pringles Park agreed to a three-year agreement last summer, guaranteeing the 2010, 2011 and 2012 tournaments will be held in Jackson.

This marks the 10th anniversary of the tournament being held at a neutral site; prior to the 2001 season, the event was held at campus sites.

Last season Tennessee Tech went a perfect 4-0 in the event to claim its first championship since 2001 and in the process became the first No. 5 seed under the current format to win the title. TTU topped Jacksonville State in extra innings in the title game.

The first official OVC Tournament was held in 1980; prior to that only playoff series between divisional winners were played.

the Eagles will play at Marshall on Wednesday and then travel to league-leading Murray State for three OVC games this weekend.

Murray State (24-21, 11-5 OVC): Murray State swept Eastern Kentucky last week to improve to 11-5 in OVC play and vault into first place in the standings with two weekends of play remaining. The Thoroughbreds have now won five straight games (and 7 of its last 9 OVC games) and are trying to win the program's first regular season title since the 1991 season. MSU has a one game lead over Tennessee Tech and Southeast Missouri in the standings and a 1.5 game advantage over Jacksonville State. The 'Breds will clinch a spot in the OVC Tournament field with one more victory in its last six OVC games. Senior Wes Cunningham was named OVC Player of the Week for the second straight week (and third time this season) after hitting .667 (7-for-11) with five runs scored, a double, triple, home run and 12 RBI in three games. The first baseman set the Murray State single-season record for RBI and tied the school mark for single-season hits during the week. He also netted his 13th career triple, giving him the school record in that category. Cunningham drove in six runs in Sunday's game, a career-best. Senior Chris Craycraft was named OVC Pitcher of the Week after tossing a complete game three-hitter in the series opener against ECU. Craycraft struck out eight and walked only one as he needed just 107 total pitches to improve to 6-3 on the season. This week the Thoroughbreds will travel to Arkansas State and Memphis in non-conference action and then host Morehead State in OVC action over the weekend.

Southeast Missouri (27-20, 10-6 OVC): With a weekend off from Conference play, Southeast Missouri traveled to Nebraska where they were on the wrong side of three scores by margins of 6-2, 20-6 and 10-3. That followed a wild 16-12 victory over Mid-Continent on Wednesday afternoon. Despite not playing an OVC game, the Redhawks fell out of first place in the league standings, dropping to third place overall, just a game back of new leader Murray State (who swept a doubleheader from Southeast a weekend ago). And although the Redhawks fell victim to a tough Nebraska squad, sophomore Kenton Parmley had a big week. The sophomore was named one of 25 quarterfinalists for the Brooks Wallace Award, given to the nation's top shortstop. During last week's four games Parmley hit .611 (11-for-18) with six runs, two doubles, two home runs and four RBI. He slugged 1.056 which included tying the Southeast Missouri single-season runs record (62). Junior reliever Trent Wise appeared in two games last week, pitching three total innings, and picking up the win over Mid-Continent. It marked his second victory of the season. Southeast Missouri will host Austin Peay in a three-game weekend set at Capaha Field.

SIU Edwardsville (14-33): SIU Edwardsville played a home-and-home doubleheader with Bradley this weekend, playing two in Peoria on Saturday and two in Edwardsville on Sunday. Bradley got the best of the Cougars on Saturday, winning by scores of 7-1 and 3-2, sending SIUE to its 10th and 11th consecutive losses. But that streak would come to an end a day later when SIUE swept Bradley by scores of 8-5 and 3-2. In game one the Cougars took advantage of four Bradley errors in pulling out the victory while Travis Becherer hit his first home run of the season to put the team up 3-0 in the second inning. Josh Hoguet collected the victory to improve to 3-1 on the season as he struck out seven Braves. In the nightcap SIUE allowed Bradley to tie the game in the final inning before Dustin Brooks capped his best offensive game of the season with an infield single to give SIUE the 3-2 win. The Cougars will close out the home season on Tuesday when they host Indiana State. The team plays a neutral site game with Saint Louis on Wednesday (Sauget, Ill.) and then travels to Charleston, Ill. for the weekend. SIUE will play Indiana State in a neutral site contest on Saturday, then play single games with Eastern Illinois on Saturday and Sunday.

Tennessee Tech (23-21, 9-5 OVC): Tennessee Tech remains the hottest team in OVC competition, as the Golden Eagles swept Austin Peay to improve to 9-5 in Conference play, just one game out of first place. After losing its first five OVC games of the season, the defending OVC Tournament champions have caught fire and reeled off nine Conference victories in a row. The Golden Eagles outscored the Governors 31-6 in the three games in Cookeville. Part of that offense attack was lead by catcher Ben Burgess who hit .444 (4-for-9) with five runs scored, a home run and four RBI. In Sunday's victory he was 3-for-4 and smashed his third home run of the 2010 season. On Saturday senior Adam Liberatore did not allow a run in seven innings of work, striking out eight to pick up his fifth victory of the season. Liberatore struck out the side in the first inning and took a no-hitter into the fifth. Overall he allowed just two hits and no runs before giving way for the bullpen. In game two on Saturday, Lee Henry picked up his fourth victory of the season while lowering his E.R.A. to an OVC-best 2.65. Tennessee Tech will host Middle Tennessee on Tuesday and then travel to UT Martin for its last road OVC series of the season. UTM is just outside the top six in the standings. The final weekend of OVC play Tech will host league-leading Murray State; TTU is currently undefeated in OVC play at home this season.

UT Martin (22-25, 7-11 OVC): UT Martin helped its cause and hopes of making the six-team OVC Tournament field by going on the road to win two of three OVC contests at Morehead State last week (following a non-conference loss at Arkansas State to begin the week). The Skyhawks swept Saturday's doubleheader, winning by margins of 10-9 and 17-8 before losing 10-9 on Sunday in the series finale. That gave UTM 22 wins on the season, setting a new single-season wins record under head coach Bubba Cates (the team won a then record 21 a season ago). During the week junior West Patterson hit .571 (8-for-14) with six runs scored, a double, two home runs and eight RBI. In the process Patterson became the UT Martin all-time home runs leader (33), breaking a 25-year old school record. He now has 52 RBI on the season, which is tied for second-most in Skyhawk history. Patterson slugged 1.071 and had a .684 on-base percentage for the week. On the mound freshman reliever Dan Tobik picked up his third win, and lowered his E.R.A. to 2.67 (just .02 off the OVC lead). He pitched four scoreless innings of relief against MSU. On Saturday senior righty Coty Green picked up his OVC-leading ninth victory of the season, tying him with Mike Hayes (1986) for most single-season wins in program history. Sophomore Jordan Owen hit his 10th OVC home run of the season on Saturday (in 18 total OVC games), the most of any player in league games. Overall Owen has 14 home runs this season. UT Martin will host Belmont this week and then host second place Tennessee Tech for three games this weekend.

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: The OVC standings are tight with just two weekends of play remaining...Murray State, who has won five games in a row, has claimed the top spot for now with a three-game sweep over Eastern Kentucky...The Thoroughbreds hold a one-game lead over Tennessee Tech and Southeast Missouri and a 1.5 game advantage over Jacksonville State...Four other teams are nearly identical in the standings, as Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State are all four games out of first place while UT Martin, who is trying to make only its second-ever OVC Tournament field, five games back...The closeness in the standings would lend one to believe the Conference championship and the six teams who will make the OVC Tournament field will not be decided until the last day of regular season play...It was announced that last week 11 baseball student-athletes named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District teams as selected by CoSIDA...Despite not winning OVC Player of the Week honors, Eastern Illinois senior Alex Gee was named one of the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on Monday; Gee hit four home runs in a weekend series at Jacksonville State over the weekend...Two OVC shortstops - Morehead State's Drew Lee and Southeast Missouri's Kenton Parmley - were named quarterfinalists for the Brooks Wallace Award, given to the nation's top shortstop...Three OVC players (Michael Bottoms, Michael Adamson and Chad Oberacker) were named to the John Olerud Two-Way Award Watch list, given to the nation's top player who pitches and plays the field; the three selections were second among all conferences (trailing only the four SEC selections)...This weekend's games include Jacksonville State at Eastern Kentucky, Austin Peay at Southeast Missouri, Morehead State at Murray State and Tennessee Tech at UT Martin.

Eleven OVC Baseball Student-Athletes Named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Team: Eleven OVC baseball student-athletes have been named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Teams as selected by CoSIDA. Six of the players were first-team selections and five were second-team picks. The six first-team selections will now have their names appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American later this month. The ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America baseball team will be announced on Tuesday, May 25. The first-team selections included Murray State senior first baseman **Wes Cunningham** (3.35 GPA in history), Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** (3.57 GPA in industrial engineering technology), Austin Peay senior designated hitter **Matt Kole** (3.00 in business), SIU Edwardsville senior outfielder **Dustin Brooks** (3.83 in exercise and wellness), Southeast Missouri State senior pitcher **Kyle Gumieny** (3.97 in engineering technology) and Southeast Missouri State senior catcher **Jim Klocke** (3.94 in business administration). The five second-team selections included Morehead State senior infielder **Michael Bottoms** (3.73 in business), Tennessee Tech senior pitcher **Lee Henry** (3.31 in education), Tennessee Tech junior outfielder **Chad Oberacker** (3.31 in physical education), UT Martin senior catcher **Ty Nelson** (3.33 in engineering) and UT Martin junior infielder **Cody Terry** (3.81 in health and human performance). To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average.

EIU's Alex Gee Named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper: Eastern Illinois senior **Alex Gee** earned Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on May 10 after hitting four home runs and driving in nine RBI in a three game series at Jacksonville State. Gee went deep in four of his 13 at-bats in the three-game series at JSU, finishing the weekend 6-for-13 with nine RBIs (six coming with two outs) and five runs scored. He connected for a pair of solo homers in the series opener and hit a three-run shot in the nightcap of Saturday's doubleheader. In an EIU victory Sunday, he gave the Panthers an early lead with a two-run homer in the first inning en route to a 3-for-4, four-RBI performance.

Lee, Parmley Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List: Morehead State senior **Drew Lee** and Southeast Missouri State sophomore **Kenton Parmley** are two of 25 quarterfinalists for the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award, sponsored by Mizuno, recognizes the nation's top shortstop and will be presented on July 2 in Lubbock, Texas, as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. The revised watch list features shortstops from 15 conferences, with the ACC, Big 12 and SEC leading the pack with three representatives each. The award is a tribute to Brooks Wallace, a slick fielding shortstop that played at Texas Tech University, from 1977 to 1980 and led that team to its first ever trip to the Southwest Conference championship. The College Baseball Awards Show will take place on July 2 in Lubbock, Texas, as part of a nearly weeklong schedule of festivities sponsored by the College Baseball Foundation. The events also include the induction ceremony for the National College Baseball Hall of Fame.

Three OVC Players Named to Olerud Award Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players are among the 25 quarterfinalists for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation on Monday. The players are Morehead State senior **Michael Bottoms** (RHP/1B), Southeast Missouri State junior **Michael Adamson** (OF/LHP) and Tennessee Tech junior **Chad Oberacker** (OF/LHP). The three selections from the OVC are second among all conferences, trailing only the four picks from the SEC. The Olerud Award, which recognizes a player who makes an impact both on the mound and at the plate, will be presented in Lubbock, Texas, on July 2 as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. The award is named for Olerud, who was named freshman All-American, All-American 1B and Pitcher, and Baseball America College Player of the Year. Olerud left a legacy of character and greatness in college and professional baseball.

JSU's Smith Sets OVC Record for Career Hits and At-Bats, Closes in on OVC Mark for Games Played: This season Jacksonville State senior second baseman **Bert Smith** has set OVC career marks for both hits and at-bats. On April 17 Smith set the record for hits, registering his 288th mark against Austin Peay and breaking the previous record of 287 held by Jeremy Johnson (Southeast Missouri, 1997-2000). Smith now has 299 career hits (and closing in on a NCAA milestone). On April 7 against No. 19 Alabama Smith became the OVC's all-time leader in at-bats, passing the mark of 831 career at-bats previously held by Middle Tennessee's Clay Snellgrove (1994-97). Smith now has 892 career at-bats. Smith has now played in 220 career games, just four away from equaling the OVC career mark of 224 held by MTSU's Snellgrove (1994-97).

Smith Set to Become Only Active NCAA Player with 300 Career Hits: Not only is Jacksonville State's **Bert Smith** rank among all the career and active OVC leaders, but he is only one hit away from making a mark in the NCAA record book. With seven more hits Smith will become the only active Division I baseball player with 300 career hits.

EKU's Langfels Sets OVC Career Triples Mark: With a triple on March 24 against Miami (Ohio) Eastern Kentucky's **Jayson Langfels** netted his 17th career triple, which set the OVC career mark (previously 16 by Tennessee Tech's Bill Maclin from 1968-71). Langfels now has 18 career triples.

Morehead State's Lee, Southeast Missouri's Klocke Search for OVC Career RBI Record: Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** and Southeast Missouri State senior catcher are each approaching the OVC career RBI mark. Entering the week Lee has 184 career RBI while Klocke has 183 RBI. The OVC all-time record is 208 held by Western Kentucky's Mike Williams (1978-81). Tennessee Tech junior utility man **A.J. Kirby-Jones**, who has 175 RBI, is also in the hunt.

The OVC in the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In this week's national statistical leaders the OVC had several teams and individuals among the leaders. As a team Southeast Missouri ranks sixth in batting average (.355), seventh in slugging (.559) and 10th in hits (552). Morehead State ranks first in home runs (2.10/game), eighth in scoring (9.3 runs/game) and fifth in slugging (.580). Individually, Tennessee Tech junior **A.J. Kirby-Jones** ranks second in home runs (0.46/game), second in slugging (.859) and second in walks (1.17/game). Southeast Missouri's **Casey Jones** is first in RBI (1.53/game). Tennessee Tech's **Chad Oberacker** is fifth in hits (80) and ninth in doubles (0.41/game). Morehead State's **J.D. Ashbrook** is first in runs (1.51/game), sixth in home runs (0.41/game), seventh in slugging (.824) and 10th in on-base percentage (.547). Murray State senior **Wes Cunningham** is third in slugging (.851), seventh in home runs (0.40/game), third in total bases (148) and third in runs (1.45/game). Morehead State's **Drew Lee** is fifth in RBI (1.48). Eastern Kentucky's **Anthony Ottrando** is ninth in RBI (1.45/game) while teammate **Jayson Langfels** is ninth in slugging (.818). Eastern Illinois' **Mike Hoekstra** is seventh in walks allowed per nine innings (0.91). The latest set of NCAA rankings will be released on Tuesday.

Pringles Park to Host 2010 OVC Baseball Championship: In May 2009, the Ohio Valley Conference Board of Athletic Directors and Board of Presidents approved a plan to move the OVC Baseball Championship to Jackson, Tenn. for the next three years, beginning with the 2010 season. The six-team, double-elimination tournament will be held May 26-30 at Pringles Park, home of the West Tenn Diamond Jaxx, the AA affiliate of the Seattle Mariners. This year will mark the 31st OVC Baseball Championship. The first elimination style tournament was held in 1980, most usually being played at the site of the regular season champion. Beginning in 2001 the tournament switched to a neutral site for the first time (with the last nine championships have been held at Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky.). Pringles Park opened in 1998 and has a seating capacity of 6,000. The venue hosted the 1999 Southern League All-Star Game and will also host that event in 2011. Pringles Park also has luxury suites, a video board and merchandise shop that will be used for the championship. More information on the stadium and the Diamond Jaxx can be found at <http://www.diamondjaxx.com>. Jackson, Tenn. is located 130 miles from Nashville and 77.2 miles from Memphis on Interstate 40. Tickets for the event will be \$10 per day or \$30 for an all-session pass (up to 11 total games). There is also an \$8 a day rate for students/faculty of OVC-member schools or groups. All seats at the 6,000-seat park are general admission for the OVC Championship. Fans can purchase tickets in person at the Diamond Jaxx box office or by calling (731) 988-5299. A link to order tickets online will be available soon and posted at OVCSports.com.

Hitting Streaks: Southeast Missouri State senior catcher **Jim Klocke** recently had a 25-game hitting streak come to an end. The streak was the longest in the OVC this season. The all-time OVC mark is 42 games by Austin Peay's Chuck Abbott, set in the 1996 season. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Lowe's, an official Corporate Partner of the NCAA, will announce the Senior CLASS Award winner at the NCAA College World Series® in June. Earlier in the year two additional OVC players - Murray State first baseman **Wes Cunningham** and Morehead State shortstop **Drew Lee** - were among the 30 candidates for the award but those two did not make the final cut to 10.

EKU's Purcell Named to Mid-Season NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List: Eastern Kentucky junior closer **Ryne Purcell** is one of 45 players named to the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year Award Watch List. The award is given to the top relief pitcher in college baseball. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts will be selected as finalists and released Wednesday, June 2, prior to start of NCAA regional tournament competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee then will select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced on the opening day of the College World Series on June 19.

OVC Players in the Pros: Entering the 2010 season, there were three players from OVC schools on Major League Baseball Opening Day rosters. Austin Peay has the distinction of having two former players on teams including 2008 All-Star reliever **George Sherrill** (Baltimore) and relief pitcher **Shawn Kelley** (Seattle). Former Morehead State pitcher **Jon Rauch** is now the closer in Minnesota after being the setup man in Arizona last year. One OVC school - Eastern Illinois - has two alumni who are coaching at the highest level of professional baseball. Former Panther **Kevin Seitzer** is the Kansas City Royals hitting coach with **Tim Bogar** is the Boston Red Sox third base coach.

Lee Named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper: Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as well as by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on April 19/20 after an outstanding week. In four Morehead State victories Lee hit .550 (11-for-20) with 12 runs scored, three doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI, two stolen bases and a 1.450 slugging percentage. In a mid-week win over Marshall, the senior homered, drove in three runs and scored three times as the Eagles prevailed 15-6. Lee started a weekend sweep of OVC foe Eastern Kentucky by homering three times in game one of Saturday's doubleheader. He drove in two more runs in the second game of the twin bill, bringing Saturday's RBI total to six. Lee concluded the week by adding another home run and driving in five additional runs.

Flynn Named CollegeBaseballInsider.com National Player of the Week: Coming off a week where he doubled his season home run and RBIs total, Morehead State sophomore **Cameron Flynn** was named the National Player of the Week by CollegeBaseballInsider.com on March 31. In four games the previous week, Flynn batted .588 (10-for-17) with four home runs and 16 RBI. The Lexington native smacked two doubles and one triple, scored seven runs and slugged a remarkable 1.529. He knocked in a career-high six in a mid-week win over Indiana, before homering three times and tallying nine RBI in an OVC doubleheader against Southeast Missouri State on Saturday.

Kirby-Jones Named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper: Tennessee Tech junior **A.J. Kirby-Jones** was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on March 15. In six games during the week Kirby-Jones hit .526 (10-for-19) with eight runs scored, two doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI. The junior had a .655 on-base percentage and a 1.421 slugging percentage for the week. In the first game of the Buffalo series, Kirby-Jones was 4-for-4 at the plate with three home runs and five RBI. He also drove in three runs in a road win over South Alabama on Wednesday and in game two of the series against Buffalo.

Two OVC Catchers Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List: Two OVC catchers have been named to the 2010 Coleman Company Johnny Bench Award Watch List delivered by Papa John's Pizza and announced by The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission. The two OVC players are Southeast Missouri State senior **Jim Klocke** and Eastern Kentucky senior **Joey Stevens**. Fifty-three catchers were nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 5, 2010. The watch list will be narrowed down to 10 semifinalists, whom will be announced May 19, 2010. Ballots will be sent to the national voting panel at the end of May for a vote to determine the three finalists. The finalists will be announced June 2, 2010 prior to the NCAA Regionals and Major League Baseball Draft. A final vote among the national committee will occur during the College World Series. All finalists will be brought to Wichita and the winner will be announced at the 13th Annual Greater Wichita Sports Banquet on July 1, 2010.

Cunningham Named to Golden Spikes Watch List: Jacksonville State's **Todd Cunningham** has been named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List, as released by USA Baseball. The watch list features 50 of the nation's top amateur talents, and it will be a "rolling" list to ensure that athletes can play themselves into consideration for the Golden Spikes Award, to be presented live on Tuesday, July 13, at the 2010 Major League Baseball All-Star FanFest in Anaheim, Calif. Cunningham, a native of Jacksonville, led the prestigious Cape Cod League with a .378 batting average after playing for the Falmouth Commodores. He also led the league in hits (59) and on-base percentage (.458) after winning the batting title by 36 points. On Tuesday, June 1, USA Baseball officials will cut the watch list of players to 30 names. The final list of 30 will then be sent to a voting body consisting of select professional baseball personnel, past USA Baseball National Team coaches, select members of the media, former USA Baseball sports information directors, and current USA Baseball staff - close to 150 voters in total.

Five OVC Coaches Coaching at Their Alma Mater: This season five of the nine OVC head baseball coaches are currently coaching at their alma maters. That lists includes second-year head coach **Jason Stein** who played at Eastern Kentucky from 1992-95 and graduated in 1997. He played against Morehead State head coach **Jay Sorg** who was at MSU from 1992-94. Ironically in the 1994 season, Sorg was named OVC Player of the Week on April 11 while Stein earned the same honor on May 2. The other coaches currently at their alma mater are Austin Peay's **Gary McClure** (1987), Murray State **Rob McDonald** (1984) and Southeast Missouri's **Mark Hogan** (1977).

Eastern Illinois Picked as Preseason Favorite: Fresh off the 2009 OVC Regular Season Championship, Eastern Illinois has been picked as the 2010 preseason favorite for the nine-team league in a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches. The overall voting in the preseason poll

was close as three different teams received first-place votes. Eastern Illinois garnered three first-place votes and 59 total points in being picked the favorites. Jacksonville State got the most first-place vote (4), but finished three points (56) behind Eastern Illinois in being picked second overall. Tennessee Tech, last year's OVC Tournament Champions, picked up the other two first-place votes and finished third in the predicted order of finish with 51 points. Murray State was picked fourth (43), followed by Morehead State (33), Eastern Kentucky (26), Southeast Missouri (25), Austin Peay (22) and UT Martin (9).

Four Players Share Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year Honors: Preseason voting was so balanced in the OVC this season that four players shared the two major preseason honors. Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** and Eastern Kentucky junior third baseman **Jayson Langfels** were named OVC Preseason Co-Players of the Year while Murray State senior **Chris Craycraft** and Eastern Illinois junior **Josh Mueller** were tabbed OVC Preseason Co-Pitchers of the Year. In all, 14 players were selected to the Preseason All-OVC team. The 14 players represented seven of the nine teams who will compete for the OVC championship this season. Murray State led the way with four selections while Jacksonville State had three picks. Returning players who were first-team selections at the end of last season were automatic picks for this year's team.

SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC: On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).
