## THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### PLAYER

#### **Chad Oberacker, OF • Jr., 5-11, 175 • Erie, Pa. • Tennessee Tech**

Oberacker hit .600 (9-for-15) with four runs scored, four doubles, a home run, seven RBI and two stolen bases in four games last week. That included a 1.067 slugging percentage and a .714 on-base percentage. Oberacker had a double and RBI in the team's mid-week game with Middle Tennessee. In game one of Saturday's doubleheader at UT Martin, the junior was 3-for-5 with three runs scored, a double, home run, two RBI and two walks. He doubled to start the 13th inning and later scored on a wild pitch, as the Golden Eagles would go on to win that game 9-7 in 13 innings. In the second game of that double-dip, Oberacker was 2-for-3 with two doubles, two stolen bases, a run scored and RBI. He finished the week by going 3-for-4 with three RBI. Oberacker leads the OVC in batting (.451) and is tied for the Conference lead in multiple-hit games (30).

### PITCHER

#### **Anthony Bazzani, RHP • Fr., 6-4, 195 • Stockbridge, Ga. • Eastern Kentucky**

Bazzani tossed a nine-inning complete game in Eastern Kentucky's 4-2 win over Jacksonville State on Saturday. The freshman allowed just one earned run, while scattering seven hits and striking out six batters. Bazzani allowed a solo home run to start the game and an unearned run in the third inning, but after that frame did not allow a Gamecock to reach second base the rest of the game. He also pitched two scoreless innings of relief in a road win over Dayton on Tuesday. For the week Bazzani had a 0.82 E.R.A. in 11 total innings of work.

## TEAM NOTES

**Austin Peay (24-25, 5-13 OVC):** Austin Peay split a mid-week doubleheader at Evansville before dropping two of three games at Southeast Missouri State over the weekend. The losses to Southeast Missouri left the Governors 5-13 in OVC play and eliminated them from the chance of making the six-team OVC Tournament field. It marks the second year in a row the Gobs will have missed the championship field after making the tournament every year from 1999 through 2008. In the doubleheader with Evansville, Austin Peay lost 11-7 in game one before rebounding to win 13-2 in the second game. In the win, Eric Davis improved to 3-1 on the season by allowing two runs (one earned) and five hits over five innings. APSU was able to take game one from Southeast Missouri on Saturday, winning 8-4 before barely losing 2-1 in the second game. The weekend ended with a 10-3 loss to the Redhawks. Stephen Huff picked up the win over Saturday, going 5.2 innings. During the week John Hogan hit .500 (9-for-18) with three RBI and two stolen bases. The Governors will close out the final week of the 2010 season by playing at Lipscomb on Tuesday and then hosting UT Martin for three games over the weekend.

**Eastern Illinois (15-32, 9-11 OVC):** Eastern Illinois had an off week from OVC play but had its schedule altered by Mother Nature, cancelling two games with SIU Edwardsville. The Panthers did go on the road and top Illinois State, the Missouri Valley leader, 6-1 in Normal, Ill. Troy Barton, Brent McNeil and Matt Miller combined to hold the Redbirds to just four hits (all singles) on the night. Barton struck out a season-high seven in five innings of work. Zach Borenstein was 3-for-3 with two runs scored in the victory. On Friday the Panthers lost at home to Indiana State, before seeing the rest of the weekend washed away. Josh Mueller started that game and worked 5.1 innings of two-run ball, striking out four and not issuing a walk. The EIU bullpen was not able to contain the Sycamores though, as they scored seven additional runs to win 9-2, including five runs with two outs in the seventh inning. Mueller continues to lead the OVC in strikeouts per nine innings (10.51). This week the Panthers will play at Bradley and then host Southeast Missouri State in a key OVC contest. The Panthers have not secured a bid to the six-team OVC Tournament yet can secure a bid with two victories.

**Eastern Kentucky (24-24, 9-12 OVC):** Eastern Kentucky split four games last week, winning in non-conference action at Dayton and then winning one of three at home against Jacksonville State over the weekend. Freshman Anthony Bazzani was named OVC Pitcher of the Week after playing key roles in both of ECU's wins last week. In the win over Dayton, Bazzani pitched two scoreless innings of relief, striking out one batter in the 7-5 victory. In game one against Jacksonville State he tossed a complete game, scattering seven hits and striking out six batters in nine innings. The freshman allowed a solo home run to start the game and then an unearned run in the third inning, but after the third did not allow another Jax State batter to reach second base. For the week Bazzani pitched 11.0 innings and had an E.R.A. of 0.82. Offensively senior Anthony Ottrando hit .333 (4-for-12) with four runs scored, three home runs and four RBI. He belted a pair of home runs and drove in three runs in the win over Dayton and then crushed his 16th home run of the season in game one against the Gamecocks that tied the game at 2-2. Ottrando is tied for fifth in the OVC in total home runs. After dropping the final two games to JSU, the Colonels completed its OVC schedule for 2010. ECU will play host to future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville this coming weekend, games that do not count in the OVC standings. ECU, who will also play nationally-ranked Louisville this week, is currently in sixth place in the OVC standings. To secure a spot in the six-team OVC Tournament field the Colonels will need Morehead State to win only once and UT Martin to win only twice this weekend, assuming Eastern Illinois wins at least one game against Southeast Missouri. That would give ECU its first OVC Tournament bid since 2007.

**Jacksonville State (26-23, 12-8 OVC):** Jacksonville State split a non-conference home-and-home series with UAB last week (winning 7-6 on the road and losing 9-7 at home) before traveling to Richmond, Ky. to take two games from Eastern Kentucky. The wins secured a spot in the six-team OVC Tournament field for the Gamecocks, who have been in the field every year since joining the OVC in 2004. Jacksonville State currently sits in fourth place in the standings, but still has a shot to claim its third OVC regular season championship when it plays at Morehead State this weekend. The Gamecocks will need to sweep the Eagles and hope that Tennessee Tech takes two of three from Murray State and that Southeast Missouri does not sweep Eastern Illinois. The Gamecocks will also square off with Auburn in non-conference action this week. On Sunday JSU senior Bert Smith played in his 225th career game, breaking the OVC mark for career games played (previously 224 by MTSU's Clay Snellgrove). Smith also registered his 300th career hit earlier in the week, making him the only active Division I player to have more than 300 hits. Senior catcher Andrew Edge hit .389 (7-for-18) with two doubles, a home run and seven RBI in five games last week. He hit a two-run game-winning home run in the 7-6 victory over UAB to begin the week and was 3-for-5 with four RBI in Sunday's 11-3 win over Eastern Kentucky. Senior Austin Lucas scattered three hits and struck out six to pick up the victory in Saturday's contest which was shortened to five innings due to rain and darkness.

**Morehead State (24-22-1, 6-9-1 OVC):** Morehead State played at league-leading Murray State over the weekend, losing the first game 7-5 before seeing the second game end in a 4-4 tie in extra innings. Sunday's game with the Thoroughbreds was cancelled due to rain, marking the fifth OVC contest this season the Eagles have seen washed away. MSU has played only 16 Conference games this season, the fewest among the nine teams in the league. In the two games the Eagles did play in Murray, senior Drew Lee hit .714 (5-for-7) with three runs scored, a double, home run, RBI and two walks. Lee's 1.74 hits/game currently ranks him third in the OVC. During the week Lee tied the MSU career record for doubles (57) also held by Brad Allison (1993-96). Sophomore hurler Matthew Robertson pitched seven innings while striking out six batters in the game that ended in a tie. Entering this weekend's games with Jacksonville State, the Eagles are sitting in seventh place in the OVC standings; the top six teams will make next week's OVC Tournament. The Eagles can clinch a spot in the field with a three-game sweep of Jacksonville State, or by winning two games and having UT Martin not sweep at Austin Peay.

## 2010 OVC TOURNAMENT

A first is in order for the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Championship. After nine years in Paducah, Ky., the tournament will be held May 26-29 (30) at Pringles Park in Jackson, Tenn. Every game of the event can be seen live and on-demand at OVCsports.TV.

Pringles Park is the home of the West Tenn Diamond Jaxx, the Double-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners. The 6,000-seat natural grass stadium opened in 1998. The OVC and Pringles Park agreed to a three-year agreement last summer, guaranteeing the 2010, 2011 and 2012 tournaments will be held in Jackson.

This marks the 10th anniversary of the tournament being held at a neutral site; prior to the 2001 season, the event was held at campus sites.

Last season Tennessee Tech went to a perfect 4-0 in the event to claim its first championship since 2001 and in the process became the first No. 5 seed under the current format to win the title. TTU topped Jacksonville State in extra innings in the title game.

The first official OVC Tournament was held in 1980; prior to that only playoff series between divisional winners were played.

**Murray State (25-22-1, 12-5-1 OVC):** League-leading Murray State is in search of its first OVC regular season championship since 1991. The Thoroughbreds have a one game lead over Tennessee Tech and Southeast Missouri and a 1.5 game advantage over Jacksonville State with one series remaining. Murray State can win the title outright with two victories over Tennessee Tech this weekend. Last week the 'Breds lost 10-1 at Memphis in non-conference action and then beat Morehead State 7-5 in game one of Saturday's doubleheader, before seeing game two end in a 4-4 tie due to rain and darkness. The teams tried to resume the game on Sunday, but Mother Nature would not allow it, forcing the game to finish in a tie and cancelling Sunday's finale in the series as well. Senior lefty Matt McGaha appeared in two games last week, picking up his fifth victory of the season on Saturday, allowing an unearned run over three innings of work in the 7-5 victory. McGaha currently has a 3.29 E.R.A. in all game this season (which is third in the OVC) and a 1.50 E.R.A. in conference-only games, which is first among all OVC athletes. In addition to its road series at Tennessee Tech this weekend, Murray State will also play a neutral site game with in-state rival Kentucky at Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky. on Tuesday. Murray State topped the Wildcats earlier this season in Lexington.

**Southeast Missouri (29-21, 12-7 OVC):** Southeast Missouri has locked up a spot in the six-team OVC Tournament field and has an outside shot of claiming its second OVC regular season championship. The Redhawks, who will play at Eastern Illinois, will need to sweep the Panthers and hope that Tennessee Tech wins two of three from Murray State. Either way the Redhawks will be playing in the OVC Championship for a record 16th straight season, which happens to be every year under current head coach Mark Hogan. This past weekend the Redhawks won two of three from Austin Peay, eliminating the Governors from OVC Tournament contention. After dropping the opener 8-6, the Redhawks won game two 2-1 and Sunday's finale by a 10-3 margin. Junior Tim Rupp hit .625 (5-for-8) with two doubles and five RBI in the three games. Rupp was a perfect 3-for-3 with a career-best three RBI in Sunday's win. In his first career start, freshman Shae Simmons allowed just two hits and struck out three in getting a no-decision against the Govs on Saturday. In Sunday's win senior Jim Klocke tied Southeast's all-time career RBI mark (184) when he launched his 10th home run of the season in what was his final home game. With a run in the fifth inning of the same game, shortstop Kenton Parmley broke the school's single-season runs mark (63). This week the Redhawks will prepare for the regular season finale at Eastern Illinois on Friday and Saturday.

**SIU Edwardsville (14-35):** Due to weather over the weekend, SIU Edwardsville only got to play one game last week. The Cougars played its final game of the season against rival Saint Louis University, falling 6-5 in 10 innings at a neutral site in Sauget, Ill. The game was played with wood bats and gave the Billikens a 2-1 advantage in the season series with SIUE. The Cougars struck first with a run in the second inning and then scored three in the sixth inning to take a 4-0 lead. SIUE led 5-3 in the bottom of the eighth before surrendering two runs in that inning and giving up a run in the bottom of the 10th. Adam Eggemeyer and James Vazquez each had three hits for the Cougars. SIUE was supposed to play Indiana State and Eastern Illinois in Charleston, Ill. over the weekend but rain cancelled each contest. The Cougars will close out the season this weekend with three games at future OVC foe Eastern Kentucky.

**Tennessee Tech (25-23, 11-6 OVC):** After a 13-9 mid-week loss to Middle Tennessee, Tennessee Tech rebounded by sweeping Saturday's doubleheader at UT Martin, marking the team's 10th and 11th straight OVC wins on the season. Those 11-straight wins came after starting the season 0-5 in Conference play. Including in the wins was a 9-7, 13-inning affair in game one on Saturday. On Sunday the streak would come to an end as UTM pulled out a 12-9 victory. The loss left the Golden Eagles, last year's OVC Tournament champions, at 11-6 in OVC play, just one game out of first place in the standings. This weekend Tech will host first place Murray State for three crucial games in Cookeville. If the Golden Eagles sweep they will be the out-right OVC champions. If Tennessee Tech takes two of three and neither Jacksonville State or Southeast Missouri State sweep their three-game series, then Tech will also be able to claim its first OVC regular season title since 1997. Junior Chad Oberacker was named OVC Player of the Week on Monday after hitting .600 (9-for-15) with four runs scored, four doubles, a home run, seven RBI and two stolen bases. In Saturday's first game, Oberacker was 3-for-5 with three runs scored, a double, home run, two RBI and two walks. He started the 13th inning of that game with a double and later scored as Tech scored three times in that frame to pull out the win. On Sunday he finished the series by going 3-for-4 with three RBI. The junior continues to lead the OVC in batting (.451) and is tied for the OVC lead in multiple-hit games (30). Lee Henry tossed his second complete game of the season in picking up his fifth victory of the year on Saturday. Henry went all seven innings, allowing four hits while striking out eight. His E.R.A. on the season is 2.64 which is the best in the OVC. In addition to hosting Murray State this week, the Golden Eagles will entertain Western Carolina on Tuesday.

**UT Martin (23-28, 8-13 OVC):** UT Martin lost a non-conference game with Belmont on Wednesday and then dropped two of three home OVC games to Tennessee Tech over the weekend. Despite falling to 8-13 in league play, the Skyhawks still have a shot to make the OVC Tournament field entering the final weekend of the regular season. That is something the program has not done since the 1996 season (the Skyhawks only appearance in the event since joining the league). If UT Martin wins all three games it will only need Morehead State to not sweep Jacksonville State this weekend. With two wins the Skyhawks will need Eastern Illinois to be swept by Southeast Missouri and Morehead State to only win one against Jacksonville State. In last week's four games Wes Patterson hit .500 (7-for-14) with four runs scored, three doubles, two home runs and seven RBI. Patterson set the UT Martin single-season RBI mark with his 59th RBI of the year on Sunday. The two home runs during the week increased his career total to 35; he set the Skyhawk home run mark the previous week. For the week Patterson slugged 1.143. Sophomore Jordan Owen smashed a home run in game two on Saturday, giving him 11 round-trippers in 21 total OVC games this season; in all games he has 15 home runs this year, the second most in UTM single-season history. UTM, who has already set a overall wins record under head coach Bubba Cates (23) can set a new single-season OVC wins mark this week; UTM has eight wins, just two off the program mark of 10 set in 2009. UT Martin will play at Belmont on Tuesday and then travel to Austin Peay for three games this weekend.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** The race for the OVC Championship and seeding for the upcoming OVC Tournament could not be any closer heading into the final week of the regular season...Four teams (Murray State, Tennessee Tech, Southeast Missouri and Jacksonville State) could still walk away with the title after this weekend's action...All four of those teams have already clinched a spot in the six-team field, with the final two spots up for grabs amongst four teams...As the standings are right now Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky are seeding fifth and sixth, but Morehead State and UT Martin are just on the outside looking in...The biggest matchup of the weekend will be in Cookeville, Tenn. where Tennessee Tech hosts Murray State for three games...The winner of the series could walk away the OVC Champion (Murray State clinches the title with two wins, Tech with three victories is guaranteed the title)...It will also be a showdown between the top two hitters in the league in TTU's Chad Oberacker (.451) and Murray State's Wes Cunningham (.436)...Southeast Missouri and Jacksonville State will need to sweep their opponents this weekend and hope for Tennessee Tech to win two of three from Murray State in order to claim the top prize...Other matchups this weekend include Southeast Missouri at Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State at Morehead State and UT Martin at Austin Peay...Eastern Kentucky, who sits in sixth place in the OVC standings, is idle in league play this week and will instead host SIU Edwardsville...A more detailed OVC Tournament scenario listing will be available later in the week.

**OVC Regular Season Title Could Be First in Long Stretch For Several Teams:** Entering the final weekend of the regular season, four teams could end the year with the OVC regular season championship, in what has proven to be a very close race. If Murray State wins the title, it will be the Thoroughbreds first championship since 1991. Should Tennessee Tech claim the title it would be the Golden Eagles first since 1997 and if Southeast Missouri comes away the winner, it will be the Redhawks first title since 2002. Jacksonville State, who is fourth entering the final week of play, is the newest addition to the OVC but has won regular season championships in 2005 and 2008.

**JSU's Smith Sets OVC Record for Career Hits, At-Bats and Games Played:** This season Jacksonville State senior second baseman **Bert Smith** has set OVC career marks for both hits and at-bats. On April 17 Smith set the record for hits, registering his 288th mark against Austin Peay and breaking the previous record of 287 held by Jeremy Johnson (Southeast Missouri, 1997-2000). Smith now has 304 career hits. He is currently the only active Division I player with more than 300 career hits. On April 7 against No. 19 Alabama Smith became the OVC's all-time leader in at-bats, passing the mark of 831 career at-bats previously held by Middle Tennessee's Clay Snellgrove (1994-97). Smith now has 908 career at-bats. On May 16 Smith played in his 225 career game, setting a new OVC record in that category. That passed the previous record of 224 held by MTSU's Snellgrove (1994-97).

**EKU's Langfels Sets OVC Career Triples Mark:** With a triple on March 24 against Miami (Ohio) Eastern Kentucky's **Jayson Langfels** netted his 17th career triple, which set the OVC career mark (previously 16 by Tennessee Tech's Bill Maclin from 1968-71). Langfels now has 18 career triples.

**Morehead State's Lee, Southeast Missouri's Klocke Search for OVC Career RBI Record:** Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** and Southeast Missouri State senior catcher are each approaching the OVC career RBI mark. Entering the week Lee has 185 career RBI while Klocke has 184 RBI. The OVC all-time record is 208 held by Western Kentucky's Mike Williams (1978-81). Tennessee Tech junior utility man **A.J. Kirby-Jones**, who has 177 RBI, is also in the hunt.

**Pringles Park to Host 2010 OVC Baseball Championship:** In May 2009, the Ohio Valley Conference Board of Athletic Directors and Board of Presidents approved a plan to move the OVC Baseball Championship to Jackson, Tenn. for the next three years, beginning with the 2010 season. The six-team, double-elimination tournament will be held May 26-30 at Pringles Park, home of the West Tenn Diamond Jaxx, the AA affiliate of the Seattle Mariners. This year will mark the 31st OVC Baseball Championship. The first elimination style tournament was held in 1980, most usually being played at the site of the regular season champion. Beginning in 2001 the tournament switched to a neutral site for the first time (with the last nine championships have been held at Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky.). Pringles Park opened in 1998 and has a seating capacity of 6,000. The venue hosted the 1999 Southern League All-Star Game and will also host that event in 2011. Pringles Park also has luxury suites, a video board and merchandise shop that will be used for the championship. More information on the stadium and the Diamond Jaxx can be found at <http://www.diamondjaxx.com>. Jackson, Tenn. is located 130 miles from Nashville and 77.2 miles from Memphis on Interstate 40. Tickets for the event will be \$10 per day or \$30 for an all-session pass (up to 11 total games). There is also an \$8 a day rate for students/faculty of OVC-member schools or groups. All seats at the 6,000-seat park are general admission for the OVC Championship. Fans can purchase tickets in person at the Diamond Jaxx box office or by calling (731) 988-5299.

**The OVC in the NCAA Statistical Leaders:** In this week's national statistical leaders the OVC had several teams and individuals among the leaders. As a team Southeast Missouri ranks sixth in batting average (.351), 10th in slugging (.552) and 10th in hits (597). Morehead State ranks fourth in home runs (2.04/game), ninth in scoring (9.3 runs/game) and sixth in slugging (.582). Individually, Murray State senior **Wes Cunningham** is first in RBI (1.60/game), second in slugging (.870), fifth in home runs (0.40/game), second in total bases (161) and third in runs (1.47/game). Tennessee Tech junior **A.J. Kirby-Jones** ranks fourth in home runs (0.43/game), third in slugging (.841), 10th in on-base percentage (.538) and second in walks (1.16/game). Tennessee Tech's **Chad Oberacker** is eighth in hits (84). Morehead State's **J.D. Ashbrook** is first in runs (1.50/game), 10th in home runs

**Lee, Parmley Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List:** Morehead State senior **Drew Lee** and Southeast Missouri State sophomore **Kenton Parmley** are two of 25 quarterfinalists for the Brooks Wallace Shortstop of the Year award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award, sponsored by Mizuno, recognizes the nation's top shortstop and will be presented on July 2 in Lubbock, Texas, as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. The revised watch list features shortstops from 15 conferences, with the ACC, Big 12 and SEC leading the pack with three representatives each. The award is a tribute to Brooks Wallace, a slick fielding shortstop that played at Texas Tech University, from 1977 to 1980 and led that team to its first ever trip to the Southwest Conference championship. The College Baseball Awards Show will take place on July 2 in Lubbock, Texas, as part of a nearly weeklong schedule of festivities sponsored by the College Baseball Foundation. The events also include the induction ceremony for the National College Baseball Hall of Fame.

**Three OVC Players Named to Olerud Award Watch List:** Three Ohio Valley Conference players are among the 25 quarterfinalists for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation on Monday. The players are Morehead State senior **Michael Bottoms** (RHP/1B), Southeast Missouri State junior **Michael Adamson** (OF/LHP) and Tennessee Tech junior **Chad Oberacker** (OF/LHP). The three selections from the OVC are second among all conferences, trailing only the four picks from the SEC. The Olerud Award, which recognizes a player who makes an impact both on the mound and at the plate, will be presented in Lubbock, Texas, on July 2 as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. The award is named for Olerud, who was named freshman All-American, All-American 1B and Pitcher, and Baseball America College Player of the Year. Olerud left a legacy of character and greatness in college and professional baseball.

**Eleven OVC Baseball Student-Athletes Named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Team:** Eleven OVC baseball student-athletes have been named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Teams as selected by CoSIDA. Six of the players were first-team selections and five were second-team picks. The six first-team selections will now have their names appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American later this month. The ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America baseball team will be announced on Tuesday, May 25. The first-team selections included Murray State senior first baseman **Wes Cunningham** (3.35 GPA in history), Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** (3.57 GPA in industrial engineering technology), Austin Peay senior designated hitter **Matt Kole** (3.00 in business), SIU Edwardsville senior outfielder **Dustin Brooks** (3.83 in exercise and wellness), Southeast Missouri State senior pitcher **Kyle Gumieny** (3.97 in engineering technology) and Southeast Missouri State senior catcher **Jim Klocke** (3.94 in business administration). The five second-team selections included Morehead State senior infielder **Michael Bottoms** (3.73 in business), Tennessee Tech senior pitcher **Lee Henry** (3.31 in education), Tennessee Tech junior outfielder **Chad Oberacker** (3.31 in physical education), UT Martin senior catcher **Ty Nelson** (3.33 in engineering) and UT Martin junior infielder **Cody Terry** (3.81 in health and human performance). **EIU's Alex Gee Named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper:** Eastern Illinois senior **Alex Gee** earned Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on May 10 after hitting four home runs and driving in nine RBI in a three game series at Jacksonville State. Gee went deep in four of his 13 at-bats in the three-game series at JSU, finishing the weekend 6-for-13 with nine RBIs (six coming with two outs) and five runs scored. He connected for a pair of solo homers in the series opener and hit a three-run shot in the nightcap of Saturday's doubleheader. In an EIU victory Sunday, he gave the Panthers an early lead with a two-run homer in the first inning en route to a 3-for-4, four-RBI performance.

**Lee Named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper:** Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as well as by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on April 19/20 after an outstanding week. In four Morehead State victories Lee hit .550 (11-for-20) with 12 runs scored, three doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI, two stolen bases and a 1.450 slugging percentage. In a mid-week win over Marshall, the senior homered, drove in three runs and scored three times as the Eagles prevailed 15-6. Lee started a weekend sweep of OVC foe Eastern Kentucky by homering three times in game one of Saturday's doubleheader. He drove in two more runs in the second game of the twin bill, bringing Saturday's RBI total to six. Lee concluded the week by adding another home run and driving in five additional runs.

**Flynn Named CollegeBaseballInsider.com National Player of the Week:** Coming off a week where he doubled his season home run and RBIs total, Morehead State sophomore **Cameron Flynn** was named the National Player of the Week by CollegeBaseballInsider.com on March 31. In four games the previous week, Flynn batted .588 (10-for-17) with four home runs and 16 RBI. The Lexington native smacked two doubles and one triple, scored seven runs and slugged a remarkable 1.529. He knocked in a career-high six in a mid-week win over Indiana, before homering three times and tallying nine RBI in an OVC doubleheader against Southeast Missouri State on Saturday.

**Kirby-Jones Named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper:** Tennessee Tech junior **A.J. Kirby-Jones** was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on March 15. In six games during the week Kirby-Jones hit .526 (10-for-19) with eight runs scored, two doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI. The junior had a .655 on-base percentage and a 1.421 slugging percentage for the week. In the first game of the Buffalo series, Kirby-Jones was 4-for-4 at the plate with three home runs and five RBI. He also drove in three runs in a road win over South Alabama on Wednesday and in game two of the series against Buffalo.

**College Baseball Foundation National All-Star Lineup:** Each week the College Baseball Foundation and Diamond Sports releases a "National All-Star Lineup" which gives accolades to the past week's top performers around the country. **EKU's Purcell Named to Mid-Season NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List:** Eastern Kentucky junior closer **Ryne Purcell** is one of 45 players named to the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year Award Watch List. The award is given to the top relief pitcher in college baseball. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts will be selected as finalists and released Wednesday, June 2, prior to start of NCAA regional tournament competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee then will select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced on the opening day of the College World Series on June 19.

**Two OVC Catchers Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List:** Two OVC catchers have been named to the 2010 Coleman Company Johnny Bench Award Watch List delivered by Papa John's Pizza and announced by The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission. The two OVC players are Southeast Missouri State senior **Jim Klocke** and Eastern Kentucky senior **Joey Stevens**. Fifty-three catchers were nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 5, 2010. The watch list will be narrowed down to 10 semifinalists, whom will be announced May 19, 2010. Ballots will be sent to the national voting panel at the end of May for a vote to determine the three finalists. The finalists will be announced June 2, 2010 prior to the NCAA Regionals and Major League Baseball Draft. A final vote among the national committee will occur during the College World Series. All finalists will be brought to Wichita and the winner will be announced at the 13th Annual Greater Wichita Sports Banquet on July 1, 2010.

**Cunningham Named to Golden Spikes Watch List:** Jacksonville State's **Todd Cunningham** has been named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List, as released by USA Baseball. The watch list features 50 of the nation's top amateur talents, and it will be a "rolling" list to ensure that athletes can play themselves into consideration for the Golden Spikes Award, to be presented live on Tuesday, July 13, at the 2010 Major League Baseball All-Star FanFest in Anaheim, Calif. Cunningham, a native of Jacksonville, led the prestigious Cape Cod League with a .378 batting average after playing for the Falmouth Commodores. He also led the league in hits (59) and on-base percentage (.458) after winning the batting title by 36 points. On Tuesday, June 1, USA Baseball officials will cut the watch list of players to 30 names. The final list of 30 will then be sent to a voting body consisting of select professional baseball personnel, past USA Baseball National Team coaches, select members of the media, former USA Baseball sports information directors, and current USA Baseball staff - close to 150 voters in total.

**OVC Players in the Pros:** Entering the 2010 season, there were three players from OVC schools on Major League Baseball Opening Day rosters. Austin Peay has the distinction of having two former players on teams including 2008 All-Star reliever **George Sherrill** (Baltimore) and relief pitcher **Shawn Kelley** (Seattle). Former Morehead State pitcher **Jon Rauch** is now the closer in Minnesota after being the setup man in Arizona last year. That number became four at the end of the first week of the regular season as another former OVC player - Austin Peay catcher **A.J. Ellis** - was called up from AAA by the L.A. Dodgers. One OVC school - Eastern Illinois - has two alumni who are coaching at the highest level of professional baseball. Former Panther **Kevin Seitzer** is the Kansas City Royals hitting coach with **Tim Bogar** is the Boston Red Sox third base coach.

**Five OVC Coaches Coaching at Their Alma Mater:** This season five of the nine OVC head baseball coaches are currently coaching at their alma maters. That lists includes second-year head coach **Jason Stein** who played at Eastern Kentucky from 1992-95 and graduated in 1997. He played against Morehead State head coach **Jay Sorg** who was at MSU from 1992-94. Ironically in the 1994 season, Sorg was named OVC Player of the Week on April 11 while Stein earned the same honor on May 2. The other coaches currently at their alma mater are Austin Peay's **Gary McClure** (1987), Murray State **Rob McDonald** (1984) and Southeast Missouri's **Mark Hogan** (1977).

**Eastern Illinois Picked as Preseason Favorite:** Fresh off the 2009 OVC Regular Season Championship, Eastern Illinois has been picked as the

2010 preseason favorite for the nine-team league in a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches. The overall voting in the preseason poll was close as three different teams received first-place votes. Eastern Illinois garnered three first-place votes and 59 total points in being picked the favorites. Jacksonville State got the most first-place vote (4), but finished three points (56) behind Eastern Illinois in being picked second overall. Tennessee Tech, last year's OVC Tournament Champions, picked up the other two first-place votes and finished third in the predicted order of finish with 51 points. Murray State was picked fourth (43), followed by Morehead State (33), Eastern Kentucky (26), Southeast Missouri (25), Austin Peay (22) and UT Martin (9).


**Four Players Share Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year Honors:** Preseason voting was so balanced in the OVC this season that four players shared the two major preseason honors. Morehead State senior shortstop **Drew Lee** and Eastern Kentucky junior third baseman **Jayson Langfels** were named OVC Preseason Co-Players of the Year while Murray State senior **Chris Craycraft** and Eastern Illinois junior **Josh Mueller** were tabbed OVC Preseason Co-Pitchers of the Year. In all, 14 players were selected to the Preseason All-OVC team. The 14 players represented seven of the nine teams who will compete for the OVC championship this season. Murray State led the way with four selections while Jacksonville State had three picks. Returning players who were first-team selections at the end of last season were automatic picks for this year's team.

**SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC:** On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).
