The senior center, who also had 11 points in a setback at No. 15 Alabama, finished with six blocked shots and five assists in the three contests. Flowers has scored in double figures in all 11 games this season and leads the OVC with seven double-doubles and a 10.5 rebounding average.

AROUND THE OVC...

AUSTIN PEAY (1-6 overall, 0-0 OVC): Austin Peay (1-6) dropped a tough 71-66 decision at Memphis...The loss was the sixth straight for the Governors, the program's longest losing streak since an eight-game skid during the 1996-97 season...APSU's 1-6 record is the program's worst seven-game mark since the the 1993-94 team began at 0-7...The Govs shot a season-low 32.8 percent from the floor... Senior G/F Anthony Davis, who has been struggling to regain his shot after opening the year with a severe ankle sprain, scored 15 second-half points, including 13 in the final 5:11, to finish with a game-high 21. He was a perfect 8-of-8 from the free-throw line...Senior F **William Durden** collected his second double-double of the season (11 pts./10 rbds.)...Sophomore G **Maurice Hampton** hit a trio of 3's at the start of the contest before finishing with 16 points...This week, the Govs take on New Orleans in the opening round of the Billy Minardi Classic on Dec. 21. Also participating in the tournament are host Louisville and IUPUI...After playing eight of its first nine contests away from the Dunn Center, APSU will open a seven-game homestand with Western Kentucky (Dec. 28) and Middle Tennessee (Dec. 30).

EASTERN ILLINOIS (4-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Illinois (4-4) took second place at the Nevada Holiday Classic in Reno, picking up an opening-round 56-53 win over Idaho State before falling to host Nevada, 83-57, in the championship...Freshman G **Bobby Catchings** led the Panthers with 21 points in the two contests...Senior G **Emanuel Dildy** and freshman C **George Tandy** netted a team-high 12 points each in the loss to Nevada, with Tandy also pulling down a team-best eight rebounds...After hitting 50 percent (7-of-14) of their 3-point attempts against ISU, the Panthers managed just 5-of-23 from behind the arc versus Nevada...EIU returns home to entertain in-state rival Western Illinois on Tuesday, then hits the road for a stretch of six games beginning with Kansas State (Dec. 30) and Purdue (Jan. 2).

EASTERN KENTUCKY (7-1 overall, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Kentucky upped its league-best record to 7-1 with an 87-62 triumph over Greenville College...Junior G **Jason McLeish** tossed in a career-high 21 points, going 9-of-11 with a pair of free throws...Junior F **Alonzo Hird** hit 6-of-7 field shots and finished with 13 points and seven rebounds...Senior F **Michael Haney** cleared a game-high eight boards, while junior point guard **Matt Witt** dished out a game-best six assists...The contest was the Colonlels' last home home outing until Jan. 20 against Jacksonville State...EKU begins a span of seven straight road games beginning on Jan. 20 at Savannah State. The Colonels also visit Florida (Dec. 22) and Louisville (Dec. 30) over the holiday break.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (4-5 overall, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State dropped to 4-5 with an 88-78 loss at Coastal Carolina...Junior G B.J. Spencer pumped in a career-high 25 points, shooting 67% from the field (3-of-5 from 3-pt. range) and 6-of-7 from the free throw line... Freshman F Dorien Brown also had a career day, tossing in a season-high 17 points on 7-of-8 field and 3-of-4 foul shooting...Junior point guard Walker Russell continues to dish out the assists, handing out nine at CCU while also collecting 12 points and four steals. He played the entire game and is averaging just over 35 minutes of action each time out...JSU was 27-of-54 from the field against the Chanticleers, snapping a 29-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better...The Gamecocks boast an all-time record of 30-2 when shooting 50 percent or better under head coach Mike LaPlante...JSU converted a sizzling 61.5 percent in the second half of the contest, marking its best shooting half of the season, but hit only 39.3 in the first 20 minutes of play...Jax State wraps up its six-game road odyssey with dates at Delaware State (Dec. 20), Mississippi State (Dec. 22) and Arkansas (Dec. 29).

MOREHEAD STATE (5-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State slipped to 5-3 with a 74-48 setback at Ohio State...Sophomore G and Ohio native Josh Reed scored a career-high 17 points against the Buckeyes. He hit 6-of-9 from the field, including 5-of-6 from 3-point range, to give him a 48.4% conversion rate (14-of-31) from behind the arc through eight games...The Eagles continue to play well defensively, holding opponents to only 38.2 percent floor shooting and 60.5 points per game...Morehead State hit 9-of-11 free throws as a team at OSU and is converting a league-high 80.6 percent of its attempts from the charity stripe for the season...Freshman C Jonathan True blocked two more shots at OSU and now has 13 rejections in eight outings...The Eagles sandwich a Dec. 27 road trip to Louisville between home games against Taylor (Dec. 21) and George Mason (Dec. 30).

MURRAY STATE (3-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Murray State (3-3) was idle last week off while concentrating on final exams. The Racers will take the court for the first time in 11 days when they play host to Delaware State on Dec. 22...Murray State also travels to Moraga, Calif., over the holiday break for the Shamrock Office Solutions Classic on Dec. 28-29. The Racers face UC Davis in opening-round action, then take on either Radford or host St. Mary's. They wrap up the three-game road stretch with a Jan. 2 date at UAB.

SAMFORD (5-3 overall, 0-0 OVC): Samford (5-3) registered its second straight double-digit victory at home on Saturday as the Bulldogs posted a 71-56 win against the Tennessee Temple Crusaders...Senior F **J. Robert Merritt** hit three treys and all four foul attempts as he led Samford with 17 points...Sophomore point guard **Jerry Smith** grabbed a game-high seven rebounds to go with 12 points and five assists... The Bulldogs are 3-1 in Seibert Hall this season, outscoring opponents by a 273-208 margin at home...All five of Samford's wins thus far have been double-figure victories (+17.0 avg.) while all three losses have been by a total of 11 points (-3.7 avg.)...The Bulldogs kick off a series of four road games Dec. 21 at Bradley before trying to avenge their lone home loss of the season with a return trip to IUPUI on Dec. 28...Samford also stages its first-ever meeting with Notre Dame in a Dec. 30 outing.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (3-5 overall, 0-0 OVC): Southeast Missouri (3-5) saw a late-game rally fall short as the Indians dropped a tough 72-68 decision to long-time rival Southern Illinois...Senior F **Dainmon Gonner** led the team with a game-high 22 points and six rebounds, while senior F **Reggie Golson** canned 7-of-11 field and 3-of-4 free throw attempts to follow with 17 points and six boards...Gonner (33.8 mpg) played all 40 minutes against SIU and leads a trio of Indian starters who are averaging over 30 minutes minutes of action each time out. Also racking up the court time are Golson (32.8 mpg) and senior G **Brett Hale** (33.7 mpg)...Following a pair of road games at North Texas (Dec. 22) and Saint Louis (Dec. 29), the Indians return home for a New Year's Day outing against Division II opponent Lincoln.

AROUND THE OVC...

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (3-5 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee-Martin (3-5) dropped its fifth of six road games this season, falling to Portland State, 79-66...Three Skyhawks scored double digits in the game, as junior C **Cleve Woodfork** led the way with 16 points Junior G/F **Jared Newson** went 9-for-10 at the free throw line and finished with 13 points while senior F **Earl Bullock** knocked down four second-half 3-pointers and finished with 12 points...UT Martin shot a season-high 90% (18-of-20) from the free throw line, but managed just 36% from the field (21-of-59), marking the team's third straight contest of sub-37% shooting...UT Martin has logged more than 8,000 miles in travel through five states thus far...Following a Dec. 21 trip to Mississippi, the Skyhawks wrap up a stretch of seven road games Dec. 29-30 at the Dr. Pepper Classic, where they face Birmingham-Southern in the opening round before taking on host UTC or North Texas.

TENNESSEE STATE (5-6 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee State (5-6) went 1-2 while playing a stretch of three games in five days last week, beginning with an 86-67 home win over Alabama A&M. Despite trailing by only six points early in the second halves of two road contests with Southeastern Conference opponents, the Tigers came out on the short end of both, falling at Arkansas (96-68) and Alabama (87-79)...Senior C **Rod Flowers** averaged 15.3 points and 12.0 rebounds a game and now leads the OVC with seven double-doubles after registering two last week...Senior F **Roshaun Bowens** chipped in 13.0 points and 6.3 rebounds each time out while shooting 53.3 percent from the field...The Tigers dominated the glass versus AAMU, 58-37...Sophomore point guard **Bruce Price** led the Tigers at Alabama with 26 points...TSU hosts South Dakota State on Wednesday before kicking off a four-game road stretch with dates at lowa State (Dec. 31) and Louisville (Jan. 2).

TENNESSEE TECH (4-4 overall, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee Tech (4-4) kept its home record unblemished with a 92-74 triumph over Jacksonville...Senior F **Willie Jenkins** registered his fourth 20-point game of the season, hitting 11-of-13 free throw attempts while pouring in a game-high 27 points. He has been the team's leading scorer in six of eight contests thus far and ranks second in the OVC with 19.1 ppg...Senior F **Derek Stribling** set a career-high with eight rebounds against the Dolphins...The Golden Eagles were 31-of-34 from the foul line against JU...Tech plays its next three on the road, starting with a Dec. 23 meeting at Miami. The Golden Eagles also take part in the College of Charleston Tournament, Dec. 29-30, where they are scheduled to face St. Peter's and either Harvard or the host Cougars.

HAPPY HOLIDAYS: This will be the final men's basketball report for the year as the Ohio Valley Conference office will be closed for the holiday break from 12 noon on Thursday, Dec. 23 through Sunday, Jan. 2, 2005. The next report will be Monday, Jan. 3, 2005.

HALE-ING THREES: Southeast Missouri senior guard **Brett Hale**, who led the nation in 3-point field goal shooting percentage through games of Dec. 13, continues to blister the nets from long distance. He is currently converting 63 percent (17-of-27) of his 3-point attempts while averaging 2.43 treys a game.

FLOWER POWER: Tennessee State's **Rod Flowers** has quickly made his presence known since joining the Tigers from Cincinnati. After sitting out the 2003-04 season due to NCAA transfer rules, the senior center has gotten off to an explosive start, scoring in double figures in all 11 games thus far (16.2 ppg). He boasts a league-high 10.5 rebounding average and tops the OVC with seven double-doubles.

NATIONAL NOTEABLES: Through games of Dec. 13, Southeast Missouri's **Brett Hale** leads all of NCAA Division I with a 61.5 3-pt. field goal shooting percentage, while Murray State's **Trey Pearson** is tied for first in free throw shooting (100%)...Also ranked among the nation's Top 10 in various categories are Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (7.3 apg/6th), Eastern Illinois' **Josh Gomes** (94.7 FT%/t7th), Morehead State's **Ramon Kelly** (93.3 FT%/t10th) and Eastern Kentucky's **Michael Haney** (67.7% FG/t9th).
