# OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### **PLAYER**

# WALKER RUSSELL • G, JR., 6-0, 170 • PONTIAC, MI • JACKSONVILLE STATE

**Russell** averaged 20.7 points and 9.3 assists a game as he helped guide Jacksonville State to a 2-1 record last week, including the team's first OVC win of the season. The junior point guard's best effort came in the Gamecocks' 88-87, double-overtime upset of then league coleader Tennessee Tech, where he poured in a season-high 30 points and dished out 11 assists for his third double-double of the season. A native of Pontiac, Mich., Russell went 6-of-10 from the field in the contest and hit an OVC-record 18 straight free throw attempts before missing his final one. For the week, he shot 53.6 percent from the field (15-of-28) and 93.9 percent from the foul line (31-of-33) while also tallying 10 steals and 10 rebounds.

#### **NEWCOMER**

## WAYNE ARNOLD • G, JR., 6-4, 190, • LILBURN, GA • TENNESSEE STATE

**Arnold** scored 36 points (18.0 ppg) in two Tennessee State victories, including a TSU career-high 22 points off the bench against Eastern Kentucky. The Lilburn, Ga., product then followed that with 14 points in a starting role versus Morehead State. For the week, the junior guard shot 57.9 percent from the field (11-of-19), including 8-of-13 (61.5%) from 3-point range, and also had nine rebounds, six assists, and a pair of steals.

#### **FRESHMAN**

# JOE ROSS MERRITT • G, FR., 6-4, 200 • OKLAHOMA, OK • SAMFORD

**Merritt** averaged 10.0 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in a pair of crucial OVC wins versus then first-place Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay. After tallying eight points and two rebounds against Tech, the freshman guard scored 12 points and grabbed a team-high five rebounds versus Austin Peay. He finished the APSU contest 5-of-6 from the field, including a clutch 3-point basket late in the game that helped force overtime. For the week, the Oklahoma City, Okla., native shot 66.7 percent from the floor (8-of-12), including 2-of-4 from behind the arc.

# AROUND THE OVC...

AUSTIN PEAY (8-14 overall, 6-4 OVC): Austin Peay finds itself in a four-way logjam for fourth place in the OVC standings after splitting a pair of road games last week. The Governors picked up their first road win of the season at Jacksonville State (80-69) but dropped an overtime heartbreaker (73-71) at Samford...Freshman G Todd Babington tossed in a career-high 15 points at JSU. For the week, he shot 61.5 percent from the floor (8-of-13), including 6-of-8 from 3-point range...After going 37 straight games without placing five or more players in double figures, the Govs managed the feat in back-to-back outings as the same five starters posted double-digit efforts at JSU and Samford...Junior C Zac Schlader netted his third career double-double (20 pts./10 rbds.) at Samford, while playing all 45 minutes of an overtime contest for the second time this year...APSU shot a season-high 66 percent from the field at JSU, including a whopping 15-of-20 (75%) in the second half, and followed that with a 54.9 percent effort at Samford, marking the first time this season the Govs had hit better than 50 percent in back-to-back contests...Senior point guard Maurice Hampton dished out a career-high six assists at JSU. He scored 28 points on the week while shooting 64.3 percent (9-of-14) from the field, including a scorching 7-of-10 from 3-point range...After visiting UT Martin on Thursday, the Govs wrap up a four-game road stretch Saturday at Murray State in front of a national ESPN2 audience.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (9-12 overall, 4-6 OVC): Eastern Illinois rolled a split in road action last week, dropping a 73-69 decision to Murray State before collecting a 96-91 win in overtime at Tennessee-Martin...Junior G Josh Gomes poured in 32 points at UT Martin, the second-highest scoring effort of his career. For the week, he shot 51.5 percent from the field (17-of-33) while also going 9-of-10 at the free throw line...Freshman C George Tandy contributed 11.0 points and 7.0 rebounds a game, hitting 10-of-12 (83.3%) at the charity stripe and 6-of-11 (54.5%) from the floor...Senior F Emanuel Dildy went 10-of-12 at the foul line and leads the OVC with an 85-9 percent conversion rate at the stripe...EIU boasts two of the league's Top 10 scoring leaders (Gomes - 16.1 ppg, Dildy 15.6 ppg)...The win at UT Martin with Panthers' first on an opponent's home turf this season, snapping a 13-game road losing streak that dated back to the 2003-04 campaign...EIU scored a season-high 96 points versus the Skyhawks, marking the highest output by a Panther squad since a 96-67 win over Tennessee State in January, 2003...Head coach Rick Samuels missed both games last week due to the death of his father...Eighth-place EIU has won four of its last six games and returns home to host Southeast Missouri (Feb. 8) and Tennessee State (Feb. 10).

**EASTERN KENTUCKY (14-7 overall, 6-4 OVC):** Eastern Kentucky is one of four teams tied for fourth place in the league standings after going 1-1 last week. The Colonels picked up an 83-69 home win over in-state rival Morehead State before losing a 75-63 outing at Tennessee State...Junior G **Matt Witt** went 6-of-12 from three-point land for the week as he led the team with 19.5 points and 5.5 assists per game...The Colonels went 4-1 on their recent homestand, giving them an 8-1 mark thus far this season in McBrayer Arena...Four Colonels accounted for all 13 of EKU's 3-pointers in the Morehead State contest, including a 4-of-4 effort from **Ben Rushing**. The senior guard finished with five treys on the week to push his career total to 191, setting a new school record for made 3-pointers...After shooting better than 50 percent from behind the arc in their last three home games, the Colonels saw the streak end with a 6-of-15 (40%) effort against the Tigers...The TSU contest also marked only the third time in the past 11 games EKU lost the battle of the boards (45-34)...Junior C **Alonzo Hird** led the Colonels' rebounding efforts with 20 caroms last week while senior F **Michael Haney** had 17...At 14-7, EKU has already matched its win total from last season...The Colonels end a three-game road swing at Samford (Feb. 10) and Jacksonville State (Feb. 12).

JACKSONVILLE STATE (6-17 overall, 1-9 OVC): Jacksonville State picked up its first league win of the season in dramatic fashion, edging then OVC co-leader Tennessee Tech, 88-87, in double overtime. Earlier in the week, the Gamecocks ended a 14-game losing streak with a 73-62 non-conference victory over Reinhardt before dropping an 80-69 OVC decision to Austin Peay...Junior point guard Walker Russell shot 53.6 percent (15-of-28) from the field for the week, pacing the Gamecocks with 20.7 points and 9.3 assists per game. He posted his third double-double of the season (30 pts./11 asts.) versus Tech, setting a new OVC mark for consecutive free throws made and numerous school records (consecutive and overall FT made and attempted, FT shooting percentage) with an 18-of-19 (94.7%) effort... Freshman F Brandon Davis recorded the first two starts of his career and responded by averaging 7.0 points and 7.5 rebounds a game, including a career-high 10 boards versus Reinhardt...Junior G B.J. Spencer canned 12 three-pointers for the week, finishing with an 18.3 scoring average...The Tech contest marked JSU's first overtime venture in 87 games and its first double-OT victory in over five years...Jax State closes out its final homestand of the regular season with dates against Morehead State (Feb. 10) and Eastern Kentucky (Feb. 12).

MOREHEAD STATE (9-12 overall, 3-7 OVC): Morehead State is in ninth place after road setbacks at Eastern Kentucky (83-69) and Tennessee State (100-65)...Senior C/F Chad McKnight had a pair of solid outings last week, averaging 18.0 points per game while torching the nets with a 14-of-17 (82.4%) effort. He leads the league with a 62.2 percent conversion rate from the floor, including a league-best 65.9 percent clip in OVC action...The Eagles shot the ball well in both contests, hitting a combined 52.7 percent (49-of-93) from the field, but struggled in other areas, committing 42 turnovers (21.0 tpg) while being outrebounded, 60-46...Sophomore guard Josh Reed was the only other Morehead State player to score in double figures in both contests, averaging 11.5 points and 4.5 assists per game...Junior G Quinton Smith chipped in 17 points at EKU...Senior G Ramon Kelly continues to rank among the league's top foul shooters after hitting 8-of-11 (72.7%) free throws against TSU...The Eagles will be looking to end a three-game skid when they close out the road portion of their regular-season schedule at Jacksonville State (Feb. 10) and Samford (Feb. 12).

MURRAY STATE (12-8 overall, 7-3 OVC): Murray State flirted briefly with a shared first place OVC ranking after a 73-69 win over Eastern Illinois but slipped back into a two-way tie for second place following a close 61-58 loss to Southeast Missouri...Sophomore G Trey Pearson went 6-of-11 from 3-point range to lead the Racers with 23 points in the EIU contest as they picked up their eighth straight win over the Panthers...The loss to Southeast snapped a five-game home win streak for Murray State as the Racers recorded season-lows in free throws attempted (7) and made (2) while also tallying their lowest offensive output at home since a loss by the exact same score to Samford just over a year ago...Junior point guard Keith Jenifer (15 pts.) and junior reserve Issian Redding (10 pts.) were the only Murray State players in double figures versus the Redhawks...Pearson, who entered Saturday's contest averaging 18.5 points a game over his last six outings, was held to just nine against Southeast...Murray State continues its five-game homestand this week, making back-to-back television appearances while playing host to Tennessee Tech (Feb. 10) and OVC rival Austin Peay (Feb. 12). Thursday's game will be regionally televised on FSN South, while Saturday's contest will be aired nationally on ESPN2.

**SAMFORD (13-8 overall, 8-2 OVC):** Samford regained sole possession of first place atop the OVC standings with wins over Tennessee Tech (64-57) and Austin Peay (73-71 OT)...Junior F **J. Robert Merritt** canned nine 3-pointers as he led the Bulldogs with 20.0 points and 5.5 rebounds a game. He has scored in double figures in 12 straight outings, tallying at least 20 points in four of the last five contests...Merritt's younger brother, **Joe Ross**, knocked down a crucial 3-pointer late in the APSU contest that helped send the game to overtime. He finished the week with 20 points and seven rebounds while going 8-fo-12 (66.7%) from the field...The Bulldogs have won seven straight at home, boasting an 8-1 record in Seibert Hall this season...Under head coach **Jimmy Tillette**, Samford is 53-12 at home against league opponents, including a 14-3 mark versus OVC opposition...At 8-2 in Conference play, the Bulldogs have already surpassed their 2003-04 tally of seven OVC victories...Samford will be looking complete OVC series sweeps against both Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State when they wrap up a four-game homestand with the Colonels and Eagles on Thursday and Saturday, respectively.

# AROUND THE OVC...

**SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (11-10 overall, 6-4 OVC):** Southeast Missouri climbed into a fourway tie for fourth place in the OVC standings after picking up wins over UT Martin (75-68) and Murray State (61-58)...Senior F **Dainmon Gonner** netted his fourth double-double of the season (12 pts./10 rbds.) against Murray State and continues to lead the OVC with a 20.3 scoring average after going 16-of-32 from the field while averaging 19.5 points and 7.0 rebounds a game...Senior F and OVC rebounding leader **Reggie Golson** (8.9 rpg) has six double-doubles this year after registering back-to-back double dips (15 pts./10 rbds. vs. UTM, 15 pts./11 rbds. vs. MSU)...Sophomore G/F **Terrick Willoughby** has scored in twin figures in four straight outings, averaging 19.3 points per game while hitting a blistering 60.9 percent (28-of-46) of his field attempts during that span...The Redhawks have won five straight, their longest win streak since the 2000-01 season...Southeast wraps up a three-game road swing Tuesday at Eastern Illinois, then returns home for a lone date with Tennessee State on Saturday.

**TENNESSEE-MARTIN** (4-17 overall, 1-9 OVC): UT Martin saw its losing streak stretch to seven games after dropping two OVC contests by a total of 13 points last week. The Skyhawks fell to Southeast Missouri (75-68) before losing a 96-91 heartbreaker in overtime to Eastern Illinois...The EIU contest marked the second straight time the two squads needed an extra five minutes to determine the outcome...Senior G **Earl Bullock** aggravated a knee injury he suffered a year ago and did not dress for either game...Juniors **Cleve Woodfork** and **Jared Newson** led the team with identical 19.5 scoring averages...Newson also pulled down 22 rebounds for the week, collecting his sixth double-double of the season (19 pts./13 rbds. vs. SEMO) in the process...The Skyhawks hit nine 3-pointers versus EIU, matching their trey production from the three prevoius games combined...UT Martin outrebounded each of its opponents, sporting an 82-69 advantage on the glass...The Skyhawks close out the home portion of their regular-season slate with Austin Peay (Feb. 10) and Tennessee Tech (Feb. 12).

**TENNESSEE STATE (11-13 overall, 6-4 OVC):** Tennessee State halted a three-game skid and started a streak on the other side of the ledger with wins over Eastern Kentucky (75-63) and Morehead State (100-65)...The Tigers got a spark from their bench in both contests, as junior G **Wayne Arnold**, who has been nursing a pulled stomach muscle, exploded for 22 points and eight rebounds against the Colonels, hitting five 3-pointers and going 6-of-10 from the field overall, while junior G **Kareem Grant** pumped in 20 points with four treys versus the Eagles...Senior F **Rod Flowers**, also slowed by an ankle injury, had 13 points and 11 rebounds in the EKU contest. He leads the OVC with seven double-dips this season...Five TSU players scored in twin figures against the Eagles as the Tigers shot 52.9 percent from the field, including 15-of-33 from behind the arc (45.5%)...Tied for fourth in the league, TSU visits Eastern Illinois and Southeast Missouri for its final two road contests of the regular season.

**TENNESSEE TECH (12-9 overall, 7-3 OVC):** Tennessee Tech is tied for second in the Conference standings after dropping both ends of a road trip to Alabama with losses to Samford (64-57) and Jacksonville State (88-87), the latter coming in double-overtime...Senior F Willie Jenkins went 18-of-35 (51.4%) from the floor while leading the team with 48 points for the week...For the second straight week, freshman **Anthony Fisher** hit a 3-pointer to force overtime in an OVC contest. He finished the JSU game with a career-high 18 points off the bench, going 5-of-10 from the field and 6-of-6 at the foul line...Junior F **Derek Stribling** grabbed six boards and hit all six of his field and both of his free throw attempts for 16 points before fouling out of the JSU contest...The Golden Eagles committed a season-high 30 turnovers at JSU...Tech wraps up its four-game road swing with dates at Murray State (Feb. 10) and UT Martin (Feb. 12)...Thursday's contest will be regionally-televised on FSN South.

**OVC RECORD FALLS:** Jacksonville State junior point guard **Walker Russell** hit 18 straight foul shots before missing his final attempt in the Gamecocks' double-overtime upset of Tennessee Tech, establishing a new OVC record for consecutive free throws made. The old mark of 17 was originally set nearly 45 years ago by Morehead State's Hecky Thompson (1960-61) and had been tied twice since then, most recently by former Eastern Illinois standout and OVC career scoring leader Henry Domercant (2001-02).

**OVC ON TELEVISION:** Seven Ohio Valley Conference regular-season games will be televised live during the 2004-05 season. This week, the Feb. 10 meeting between **Tennessee Tech** and **Murray State** will be broadcast regionally on FSN South, tipping off at 8 p.m. Central with **Blake Fulton** handling play-by-play duties and **Bobby Cremins** providing analysis. Saturday's 1 p.m. CT contest between **Austin Peay** and **Murray State** will be a national telecast on ESPN2, with **Bob Carpenter** and **Bob Wenzel** calling the action.

**BUSTIN' BRACKETS: Murray State** will travel to Rice for a Feb. 19 non-conference outing as part of ESPN's third *Bracket Buster Saturday* series...The Owls, 11-8 overall, are currently tied for fourth place (6-5) in the Western Athletic Conference standings.

**JUST LIKE OLD TIMES:** Defending OVC champion **Austin Peay** will visit former league rival and two-time defending Southern Conference champ East Tennessee in a Feb. 19 non-conference tilt. The two teams were a part of the original 64-team *Bracket Buster Series* pool.

**OVC HELPS KICKS OFF NEW ESPN CHANNEL:** The Ohio Valley Conference will take center stage when ESPN unveils its latest venture in the arena of sports programming. ESPNU, a new multi-media college sports initiative featuring a 24-hour television network, launches on Saturday, March 4, 2005, and the inaugural contest to be aired on ESPNU TV will be the second semifinal game of the 2005 O'Reilly Ohio Valley Conference Men's Basketball Tournament, which is scheduled for 8 p.m. Central time that same day. Additionally, the men's championship game will be televised live on ESPN2 at 3 p.m. CT on Sat., March 5.
