THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-PLAYER

COURTNEY BRADLEY • F, Sr., 6'5, 215 • UTICA, MISS. • JACKSONVILLE STATE

Bradley scored 20 points against Eastern Illinois on Thursday and turned around and poured in 28 against Southeast Missouri on Saturday. For the week he averaged 24.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and shot 42.5 percent (17-of-40) from the field and 13-of-16 (81.3%) from the free throw line. Against SEMO, 21 of his 28 points came in the second half as the Gamecocks topped the Redhawks 78-72. In the Southeast Missouri game, Bradley picked up his OVC-leading eighth double-double of the year by adding 10 rebounds to go along with his 28 points and three steals. Bradley earned the Player of the Week honor for the third time this season.

CO-PLAYER

ANTHONY FISHER • G, Jr., 6'3, 190 • ATLANTA, GA. • TENNESSEE TECH

Fisher, who also won the award for the third time this year, averaged 23.5 points and 4.0 assists per game while shooting 55.6 percent (15-of-27) from the field, in Tennessee Tech's two OVC games last week. He scored 30 points in leading Tech to a 73-72 win over regular season champion Austin Peay on ESPNU, going 10-of-17 from the field and 5-of-11 from long range. He had five assists versus the Govs, and scored the game-winning points on a 3-point play with 31 seconds remaining. Against Murray State, Fisher had a game-high 17 points, going 5-of-10 from the field, and hit 6-of-7 at the free throw line.

NEWCOMER

BRANDON FOUST • F, JR., 6'6, 215 • COLUMBUS, OHIO • SOUTHEAST MISSOURI

Foust, who won the award for the third time this season, averaged 16.5 points, 6.5 rebounds per game and hit 65 percent (13-of-20) from the field and 55.6 percent (5-of-9) from 3-point range in two games last week. He had 12 points and seven rebounds in a win at Samford and 21 points and six rebounds in a loss at Jacksonville State.

FRESHMAN

WES CHANNELS • G, FR., 6'3, 180 • MEMPHIS, TENN. • AUSTIN PEAY

Following the injury of sophomore Kyle Duncan at Tennessee Tech, Channels was awarded his first career start against Eastern Kentucky last Thursday. He set career and game-highs in points (22) and rebounds (8) while playing a season-best 36 minutes. He hit 9-of-13 field goals (69.2%) including three 3-pointers. In his second start against Morehead State, Channels scored 12 points and dished out five assists. For the week he averaged 13.7 points, 3.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists and hit 55.2 percent (16-of-29) from the floor. It marked the second Freshman of the Week honor for Channels this season.

OVC TOURNAMENT NOTES

Final Four Set: After a wild first round of games, four teams - Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech and Samford - won first round games and advanced to this weekend's semifinals and finals. Austin Peay, the No. 1 seed and 2003 champion, will seek their fourth OVC Tournament Title, Eastern Kentucky seeks its fifth title and first since 2005, Tennessee Tech will be looking for only its second title and first since 1967 and Samford (in only its fourth year in the Conference) is seeking its first title.

Murray Suffers Rare Quarterfinal Loss: No. 4 seed Murray State suffered a 70-60 loss to No. 5 seed Samford in Tuesday's quarterfinal matchup. The loss marks only the second time in 20 years that the Racers have not advanced past in the opening round of the event. With Murray State's, the defending champion, loss - the League is assured its third consecutive season with a new champion. Eastern Kentucky won in 2005 and Murray State won last season.

Coaching Where They Once Played: Of the eight men's coaches in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament, one has a special connection to the postseason. Morehead State coach Donnie Tyndall, who will be coaching in his first OVC Tournament this year in his first year as Morehead's head coach, played in three OVC Tournaments as a member of the Eagles team (1990-93). After transferring from Iowa Central, Tyndall helped the Eagles to a No. 6 seed and semifinal appearance his sophomore year, a No. 6 seed and semifinal appearance his junior season and a No. 5 seed and first round appearance his senior year. There are two OVC women's coaches who have done both, Austin Peay's Carrie Daniels (who is in her first year as a head coach at her alma mater) and UT Martin's Tara Tansil.

OVC Tournament Broadcast Coverage: This year's O'Reilly OVC Men's Basketball Tournament will have its semifinals aired on ESPNU and its final once again aired on ESPN2. Lou Canellis and Bob Valvano will call the semifinals games while Dave Barnett and Tim McCormick will have the call of the championship game. Fans with Sirius Satellite Radio can listen to the games on Ch. 121 (semifinals) and Ch. 119 (finals). Fans can access live coverage of the first round of the tournament at OVCSports.TV, and access tape-delayed on-demand coverage of the semifinals and finals there as well.

TEAM NOTES

AUSTIN PEAY (20-10 overall; 16-4 OVC): Austin Peay entered the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament as the No. 1 seed after claiming the regular season championship nearly two weeks ago...Austin Peay topped No. 8 seed Tennessee State 89-84 in overtime in Tuesday's opening round...This year marks APSU's 23rd straight appearance in the OVC Tournament; the team last won the OVC Tournament title in 2003...The regular season title is the 7th for the Govs, who also won titles in 1973, 1974, 1977, 1997, 2003 and 2004; the seven titles are tied for fourth most in OVC history...The Govs came up one Conference victory short of equaling the OVC record for wins in a season (17 by Murray State last season)...Austin Peay entered the tournament having lost three of four games, including dropping its first OVC home game of the season, 82-77 to Morehead State; that snapped an 11-game home-court OVC win streak...That loss was the first OVC loss at the Dunn Center since Feb. 2, 2006, a double-overtime loss to Murray State...Austin Peay also lost a close 73-72 game at Tennessee Tech last week but did manage to top Eastern Kentucky, the No. 2 seed in this week's tournament, 77-68 in Clarksville...Freshman **Wes Channels** was named OVC Freshman of the Week for the second time this season after averaging 13.7 points, 3.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game and hitting 55.2 percent (16-of-29) from the floor; following an injury to **Kyle Duncan**, Channels stepped in and started a pair of games last week, his first career starts - he had career-highs of 22 points and eight rebounds in a win over Eastern Kentucky...Sophomore **Drake Reed**, the 2007 OVC Player of the Year, ended the regular season with 21 double figure scoring games (in 29 total contests), including doing so in each of his last 16 games; last week Reed averaged 14.7 points for the week and scored 19 on 8-of-10 shooting against Morehead State.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (10-20 overall; 6-14 OVC): Eastern Illinois wrapped-up its 2006-07 season last week by topping Jacksonville State 69-65 on the road and falling 71-45 at Samford in the regular season finale...The win over JSU kept the playoff hopes of the Panthers alive until the last day of the season, but a loss at Samford put the team in 10th place to finish the year...Had EIU won their last regular season game and Morehead State lost to Austin Peay (they did not), then Eastern would have won a three-way tiebreaker and been the No. 8 seed for the tournament...It marks the second consecutive season the Panthers have not made the OVC Tournament; EIU claimed the OVC Tournament crown in 2001...Junior forward **Jake Byrne** capped off the season with a strong outing, averaging 18.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game and hitting 66.7 percent (14-of-21) of his field goal attempts in two games last week; Byrne had a career-high 28 points in EIU's win over Jacksonville State...Freshman **Romain Martin** finished the season with a 14.8 points per game average, which placed him first on Eastern's team and seventh in the Conference; Martin became the first freshman in EIU's Division I history to lead the Panthers in scoring...Martin shared OVC Co-Freshman of the Year honors with Eastern Kentucky's Adam Leonard.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (19-11 overall; 13-7 OVC): Eastern Kentucky earned the No. 2 seed in this week's O'Reilly OVC Tournament by closing the season strong; the Colonels entered the week having won eight of their last 10 games (and now have won 9 of 11) and are the No. 2 seed for the second time in three years...They topped No. 7 seed Morehead State 63-45 in Tuesday's opening round...Last week Eastern lost 77-68 at Austin Peay but locked up the second seed with a 65-53 road victory at Tennessee State...EKU finished the season in a three-way tie for second place with Tennessee Tech and Murray State but won a composite record tiebreaker to be the No. 2 seed...Eastern is making its fifth straight appearance in the OVC Tournament; they claimed the 2005 Championship by defeating Austin Peay 52-46...The Colonels 13 OVC victories this season equaled a program record set by the 1964-65 Colonel squad...The team's six OVC road victories were also the most since the 1964-65 team...EKU is 12-0 this season when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent...The only OVC team the Colonels did not beat during the regular season was No. 1 seed Austin Peay...Sophomore **Mike Rose**, a second-team All-OVC selection this season, averaged 19.5 points, 4.0 assists, 2.5 steals and 1.5 rebounds per game last week and hit 57.7 percent (15-of-26) from the field and 57.1 percent (8-of-14) from 3-point range; He had a game-high 18 points in the win over TSU and notched career-highs in assists (6) and steals (4) without committing a turnover against Austin Peay...**Adam Leonard** was named the OVC Co-Freshman of the Year, sharing the award with Eastern Illinois' Romain Martin.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (9-21 overall; 7-13 OVC): Jacksonville State saw its season come to an end on Saturday night following a 78-72 victory over Southeast Missouri; but JSU was left out of the OVC Tournament when Morehead State topped Austin Peay to claim the eighth spot - had Morehead State lost, the Gamecocks would have been the No. 8 seed thanks to a pair of wins over the Eagles during the regular season...Jacksonville State began the week with a 69-65 loss at home to Eastern Illinois, a defeat that most likely cost them the tournament berth; in that game an unlucky bounce went against them at the end, as a shot in the final seconds came to rest on the back of the rim, instead of falling and giving the team a chance to tie on a free throw...Although JSU was 7-13 in OVC play, they suffered seven of those defeats by five points or less including losing four 1-point contests and a 2-point game...Senior **Courtney Bradley**, a first-team All-OVC selection this year and who finished the season averaging 17.0 points (4th in the OVC) and 7.0 rebounds (also 4th), was named OVC Player of the Week for the third time this season on Monday...Bradley averaged 24.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.0 assists per game last week and hit 42.5 percent (17-of-40) from the field; he scored 20 points against EIU and had his OVC-leading eighth double-double of the year against SEMO, scoring 28 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

MOREHEAD STATE (12-18 overall; 8-12 OVC): Despite losing nine straight games at one point of the season, Morehead State rebounded and won their regular season finale and was the No. 7 seed in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament...The Eagles lost 63-45 to Eastern Kentucky in Tuesday's opening round...The Eagles got back in the tournament this season after a two-year absence...After losing nine in a row and 11 of 12, the Eagles topped Samford at home a week and a half ago and last week closed out the season with a 82-77 victory over OVC Regular Season Champion Austin Peay; the Eagles capped the season with a perfect 2-0 record against the Govs and were the only OVC team to win a game in Clarksville this season...The win was big for Morehead, who would have lost a tiebreaker with Jacksonville State and missed the tournament had they lost the regular season finale...In his first year as coach, **Donnie Tyndall** led the Eagles to eight more regular season wins and five more Conference wins than the team had a season ago...Tyndall will also be the only OVC men's coach in this week's tournament who has played in the OVC Tournament before; Tyndall led Morehead State to three OVC appearances from 91-93...Senior forward **Cordaryl Ballard** averaged 16.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.0 assists per game last week while hitting 47.4 percent (9-of-19) from the field and 86.7 percent (13-of-15) from the foul line; Ballard had 19 points in the win at Austin Peay...Freshman **Maze Stallworth** had a double-double in the win over Austin Peay, netting 12 points and 11 rebounds; he averaged 8.5 points and 9.0 rebounds per game last week.

MURRAY STATE (16-14 overall; 13-7 OVC): Murray State, a perennial power in the Conference, clinched a home game in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament with a pair of wins last week and enter the tournament having won eight of 10...However, they suffered a 70-60 loss to No. 5 seed Samford in Tuesday's opening round...The No. 4 seed Racers have now hosted a first round game in the tournament every year since 1994, when the current format was put in place...The defending champions, Murray State has won 13 OVC Tournament titles (first among all OVC schools), including six of the last 10 tournaments...Last week the team beat Tennessee Tech 64-60 at home and followed that up with a 74-52 road win at UT Martin...That put the Racers in a three-way tie for second place in the Conference with Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee Tech, but Murray finished fourth due to tiebreakers...Senior **Ed Horton** averaged 15.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game last week while hitting 58.8 percent (10-of-17) from the floor and 5-of-8 (62.5%) from 3-point range...Freshman **Danero Thomas** averaged 11.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and

2.5 steals per game last week including scoring 13 in the final game of the regular season against UT Martin...Senior **Shawn Witherspoon** moved into 29th place on the Murray State all-time scoring list (1,055) during the week, passing Bennie Purcell, the original member of the group...Murray State is assured of a winning season this year, their 20th straight winning season; they have not had a losing season since 1986-87 when they were 13-15 overall...In its last four games, Murray has held its opponents to 20 percent (19-of-95) shooting from 3-point range.

SAMFORD (16-15 overall; 12-8 OVC): Despite having lost seven of its last 10 games, Samford closed the regular season strong and are the No. 5 seed in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament...Samford was the only lower seed to win an opening round game, as they topped No. 4 seed Murray State 70-60 on Tuesday night...The Bulldogs snapped a five-game losing streak by topping Eastern Illinois 71-45 on Senior Day to claim the fifth spot...The game was the last for the men's team at historic Seibert Hall, a place the program has played for the last 45 years and which will be replaced with the brand new Pete Hanna Center next season (the Samford women will play the last official game in the building on Tuesday night)...The team also lost 70-67 to Southeast Missouri to begin the week...Samford is appearing in the OVC Tournament for the fourth straight year; the team has qualified every year it has been a member of the Conference...Senior **Randall Gulina**, a first-team All-OVC selection who finished the regular season No. 2 in the League in scoring (17.9 ppg) averaged 20.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game last week while hitting 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from the field and 81.3 percent (13-of-16) from the free throw line; he scored 23 points in the win over EIU to move into 14th place on Samford's all-time scoring list (1,204)...Gulina also became only the ninth player in Samford history to score 500 or more points in a season, reaching that plateau on Thursday night; he has scored 538 points this season and knocked down a team-high 76 3-pointers...The 26-point victory over EIU last week was the largest margin of victory for the team this season; besting a 24-point non-conference win over Tennessee Temple back in November...Senior point guard **Jerry Smith** reached a milestone on Saturday, as he became Samford's all-time leader in assists (426), dishing out four in the win over EIU.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (11-20 overall; 9-11 OVC): Southeast Missouri was the No. 6 seed in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament...They suffered an 88-60 loss to Tennessee Tech in Tuesday's opening round game...The Redhawks split a pair of road games last week, winning 70-67 at Samford and losing 78-72 at Jacksonville State in the regular season finale...Southeast is 4-6 in its last 10 games this season and back in the OVC Tournament after a year absence; SEMO won the tournament in 2000...**Brandon Foust** earned his third OVC Newcomer of the Week honor of the season this week after averaging 16.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per game and hitting 65 percent (13-of-20) from the field and 55.6 percent (5-of-9) from 3-point range; Foust scored 12 points and had seven rebounds against Samford and followed that with 21 points and six rebounds at JSU...Senior **Terrick Willoughby** averaged 15.5 points and 2.5 assists per game last week including scoring 20 in the win over Samford, where he hit on 6-of-8 from 3-point range.

TENNESSEE STATE (12-20 overall; 8-12 OVC): Tennessee State grabbed a Thursday victory over Morehead State (62-46) in Nashville to win its eighth Conference game of the season and earn a spot in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament...The Tigers lost 89-84 to No. 1 seed Austin Peay in Tuesday's opening round...The Tigers lost their regular season finale to Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State topped Austin Peay in its finale to put the two teams into a tie for seventh place in the league; a tiebreaker gave Morehead the No. 7 seed and left TSU as the No. 8 seed in this year's event...Tennessee State is 2-8 in its last 10 games entering this week's play and are 3-13 in road games this year; but they do own a key 64-60 overtime victory over Murray State two weeks ago, a victory that secured their place in the tournament...They are appearing in the OVC Tournament for the fourth straight year...Junior **Ladarious Weaver** averaged 16.5 points and hit 7-of-16 (43.8%) from 3-point range last week...Senior **Clarence Matthews**, a second-team All-OVC selection, finished the regular season as the No. 2 rebounder in the Conference (7.7 per game) and may have won the rebounding title had an injury not limited his minutes against EIU...Newcomer **Jerrell Houston** continued his good play as an addition to the lineup, averaging 10.5 points and 5.5 rebounds per game; Houston has played in four games since joining the team and TSU is 2-2 in those contests.

TENNESSEE TECH (19-12 overall; 13-7 OVC): Tennessee Tech finished the season in a three-way tie for second place in the League with Eastern Kentucky and Murray State and earned the No. 3 seed in the 2007 O'Reilly OVC Tournament after a tiebreaker...Tennessee Tech topped Southeast Missouri 88-60 in Tuesday's opening round contest...The Golden Eagles are making their 20th straight OVC Tournament appearance; they have advanced to the semifinals each of the past two seasons...Tennessee Tech has only won one OVC Tournament title, that coming in 1967...Tech enters this weekend having won five of six and they won 13 of 14 games this season at home...Junior **Anthony Fisher**, a first-team All-OVC selection, earned his third OVC Player of the Week award after averaging 23.5 points, 4.0 assists, 1.5 rebounds and 1.0 steals per game and hitting 55.6 percent (15-of-27) from the field in a pair of games; Fisher scored 30 points in a one-point win over Austin Peay, including scoring the game-winning 3-point play with 30 seconds remaining, and added 17 points at Murray State...Fisher ended the regular season third in the OVC in scoring (17.3 ppg), although his 18.4 points per game average in OVC-only games led the League...Teammate **Belton Rivers**, also a first-team All-OVC pick, did lead the OVC in scoring (all games) during the regular season, averaging an even 18 points a contest...Sophomore newcomer **Daniel Northern** averaged 5.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game last week including grabbing a career-high nine rebounds against Austin Peay.

UT MARTIN (8-23 overall; 5-15 OVC): UT Martin saw its regular season come to an end with a 74-52 loss at home to Murray State on Saturday night...The Skyhawks were 5-15 overall in the Conference and finished in 11th place overall...Senior **Cleve Woodfork** finished out his UTM career by scoring 15 points in the matchup, the only Skyhawk to score in double figures...UT Martin will also say goodbye to six other seniors, including **McKale Jones**, **Bubba Tolliver**, **Justin Flatt**, **Zerek Knight**, **Will Lewis** and **Lorenzo Dorse**.

2006-07 Predicted Order of Finish: The race for the 2006-07 Ohio Valley Conference men's basketball crown appears to be wide open, according to a preseason poll of OVC head basketball coaches and sports information directors. **Samford**, the 2006 OVC tournament runner-up, received nine first-place votes and 177 points to claim the top spot in the poll, edging out **Tennessee State**, who earned six first-place votes and 169 points to follow in second. **Tennessee Tech** was a close third with four first-place votes and 165 points, while defending OVC champion **Murray State** was selected fourth, claiming the remaining three first-place votes and 144 points. **Southeast Missouri** earned a fifth-place preseason selection with 134 points, followed by **Austin Peay** in sixth with 110 points. Rounding out the number seven through 11 spots in the poll were **Jacksonville State** (103 points), **Eastern Kentucky** (71 points), **Eastern Illinois** (56 points), **UT Martin** (53 points) and **Morehead State** (28 points).

Murray State's Witherspoon Headlines Preseason All-OVC Squad: According to preseason voting by the league's coaches and sports information directors, Murray State senior **Shawn Witherspoon** is the player to watch in 2006-07, selecting the 6-foot-5 forward as the OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Joining Witherspoon on the preseason All-OVC first team are Tennessee State senior forward **Clarence Matthews**; Jacksonville State senior forward **Courtney Bradley**; Samford senior guard **Randall Gulina**; and Tennessee Tech junior guard **Anthony Fisher**. Witherspoon earned first team All-OVC honors in 2005-06 after averaging a team-high 10.6 points per game while boasting a league-high 2.38 assist-to-turnover ratio and ranking second in the Conference in rebounding (7.7 rpg) and sixth in steals (1.68 spg). Matthews was a second team All-OVC selection a year ago, shooting a league-best 54.5 percent from the field and pulling down a Conference-high 8.5 rebounds per game while contributing a 13.7 scoring average and 47 blocked shots. Bradley led his team in scoring (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (7.6 rpg), ranking sixth in the league in both categories. Gulina dished out 55 assists last season and was second on his team in scoring (12.6 ppg), while Fisher averaged a team-high 12.9 points a game to go with 64 assists in 2005-06. Selected to the 2006-07 preseason All-OVC second team were Tennessee Tech senior guard **Belton Rivers**; Morehead State senior guard **Shaun Williams**; Samford junior center **Travis Peterson**; Eastern Illinois sophomore guard **Mike Robinson**; and Jacksonville State junior forward **Dorien Brown**.

All 11 OVC Schools Once Again Compete in O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters Event: For the second consecutive season all 11 Ohio Valley Conference men's basketball teams competed in the O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters event, which this year was held on Friday, Feb. 16 and Saturday, Feb. 17 at campus sites. The event, now in its fifth season, featured a record 102 schools in the 51-game, two-day event. Austin Peay was the lone OVC school selected to appear in a television game, as they traveled to Akron for an ESPNU game; Akron won that contest 74-57. Other OVC teams going on the road include Eastern Illinois at Loyola (Chicago), Eastern Kentucky at Youngstown State, Jacksonville State at Chattanooga and Murray State at Rider. Six OVC teams will host BracketBusters games, including Morehead State hosting Bowling Green, Samford playing Evansville, Southeast Missouri against Louisiana Tech, Tennessee State playing Loyola College (Md.), Tennessee Tech hosting Northwestern State and UT Martin hosting Saint Peter's. Overall, Tennessee Tech, Murray State and UT Martin were the only OVC schools to come out on top in their games, leaving the League with a 3-8 record this season. This year marked the fourth consecutive year at least one OVC team has competed in the event, and the conference now holds a 9-16 record in that time frame, with Murray State's perfect 3-0 record leading the way. As part of the agreement, home teams will play a return game at the home facility of their BracketBusters series opponent in November or December of the following season.

BracketBusters Rematches: As part of the ESPNU BracketBusters event, teams pay a return visit to the teams they hosted a year ago and vice versa. Last year the OVC was 5-6 in BracketBuster games and were 5-6 in the return matchups in 2006-07. Four of those five wins helped OVC teams avenge losses from a season ago, as Eastern Kentucky (UNC Asheville), Samford (Ohio), Southeast Missouri (UC Riverside) and Tennessee Tech (Bradley) all topped teams that had defeated them last February. Tennessee State topped Ball State for the second straight year this December.

Early Conference Openers: Murray State and Eastern Illinois opened the conference

season on Nov. 25 with the earliest OVC Conference matchup in league history. The teams were the first squads to play a conference game nationally as well. The game was pushed up due to both schools competing in the BracketBusters event later this year; the Nov. 25 date was the only other date that worked for the teams. Murray State topped EIU 53-50.

Nationally-Ranked Opponents: OVC schools have competed against eight nationally-ranked teams so far this season. Samford has played the toughest schedule, battling No. 1 Florida, No. 15 Arizona and No. 17 LSU this year. Eastern Kentucky has played at No. 4 Ohio State, Tennessee State played at No. 12 Kansas and No. 6 Alabama, Austin Peay battled No. 19 Memphis and Tennessee Tech played at No. 21 Tennessee.

Weaver Named to Las Vegas Invitational All-Tournament Team: Tennessee State junior **Ladarious Weaver** was named to the All-Tournament team at the Las Vegas Invitational after four quality games including a 13-point performance in the team's final game against Towson. Tennessee State finished the event 2-2 with losses to Western Kentucky and No. 12 Kansas and wins over Prairie View A&M and Towson.

Rivers Named to San Juan Shootout All-Tournament Team: Tennessee Tech guard **Belton Rivers** was named to the All-Tournament team at the San Juan Shootout after averaging 19 points per game in contests against Northwestern, Vanderbilt and Central Florida. He had 22 points including the game-winner against Northwestern to open the tournament.

Gulina Earns All-Tournament Honors at Hispanic College Funds Classic: Samford's **Randall Gulina** was named to the All-Tournament Team at the Hispanic College Funds Classic hosted by LSU Dec. 27-29. Gulina averaged 15.3 points per game at the event including a game-high 26 points in the Bulldogs overtime victory over Mississippi Valley State and 14 points against No. 17 LSU.

Samford Puts An End to Murray State's Home Court Winning Streak: When Samford defeated Murray State 55-44 on Dec. 21, it marked the end of the Racers 15-game home court winning streak, a mark that was tied for the 11th longest nationally. The Bulldogs became the first team to win at the Regional Special Events Center since Dec. 2005. It also snapped a streak of 14 straight OVC victories at the RSEC.

Murray State Returns the Favor: After Samford ended Murray State's home court winning streak in December, the Racers re-paid the favor on Jan. 29, defeating the Bulldogs 57-51 in Birmingham to end Samford's 9-game home court streak.

Samford's Tillette Named Coach of the Week by CollegeInsider.com: Samford head coach **Jimmy Tillette** was named the nation's mid-major Coach of the Week on Dec. 27 by CollegeInsider.com. The award came after his team had won four games in a row including opening up the Conference season 3-0.

Buzzer Beaters: OVC schools have had their fare share of exciting finishes this season with several buzzer beaters factoring into the final outcome of games. One of the most dramatic came on Dec. 2 when Eastern Illinois' **Mike Robinson** hit a 3-pointer from just inside of half court to top Arkansas State 73-70 in Charleston. Other notable late game-winning shots include:

- Dec. 7 **Joe Ross Merritt (Samford)** - 3-Pointer with 3.5 seconds left to top Jacksonville State 54-53
- Dec. 9 **Cleve Woodfork (UT Martin)** - Baseline jumper with 0.6 seconds left to top Jacksonville State 70-69

Jan. 6 **Curtis West (Samford)** - Hit two 3-pointers in the final nine seconds, including the game-winner with 1.0 second left to push Bulldogs to their second 1-pointer, buzzer-beating victory of the season over Jacksonville State

Jan. 13 **Julian Mascoll (Eastern Kentucky)** - Hit a driving, left-handed lay-up with 5.2 seconds left to give ECU a 63-62 win over Eastern Illinois

Jan. 24 **Michael Rembert (Southeast Missouri)** - Putback basket with 1.4 seconds remaining led Redhawks to a 61-59 victory at Morehead State.

Jan. 25 **Andrae Belton (Tennessee State)** - Scored on a lay-up with 2.2 seconds remaining to give the Tigers a 63-62 win at Eastern Kentucky.

Feb. 8 **Will Ginn (Jacksonville State)** - Scored on a lay-up with 11 seconds left to give JSU a 72-71 home win over Tennessee Tech.

Feb. 17 **Amadi McKenzie (Tennessee Tech)** - Scored the game-winning basket with nine seconds left in overtime to lift Tennessee Tech to an 85-84 victory over Northwestern State as part of the 2007 O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters series.

Sutton Given Contract Extension at Tennessee Tech: Tennessee Tech head basketball coach Mike Sutton was given a contract extension through the 2010-11 season by the school on Dec. 22. Sutton, who is in his fifth year with the program, is the 11th head coach in program history and was named the 2005 OVC Coach of the Year after leading the Golden Eagles to the OVC Championship. Last season Tech was 19-12 and finished third in the Conference during a year Sutton bravely battled Guillain-Barre' Syndrome.

It Has Been Pretty Close: Through the end of the regular season, competition in the Ohio Valley Conference has been close. In the 110 regular season Conference games, the average margin of victory has been 9.9 points per game. That includes 11 1-point games, 47 games decided by five points or less and six overtime contests.

Morehead Exceeds Win Total From 2006 After Only Nine Games: After only nine games this season first-year head coach **Donnie Tyndall** led his alma mater, Morehead State, to more wins that it had the entire 2005-06 season (4). The fifth win came on Dec. 18 at UT Martin (56-55). With a 70-48 win over UT Martin on Jan. 13, Morehead doubled its OVC win total (3) from a season ago. Morehead finished the season 12-19 overall and 8-12 in the OVC, losing in the first round of the tournament to No. 2 seed Eastern Kentucky.

Loos Becomes Winning Coach in APSU History: Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** became the winningest coach in Austin Peay State University history on Jan. 13 when his team defeated Southeast Missouri 68-67 at home. That gave him 259 wins, one better than Dave Aaron. Loos' career record at APSU is now 270-235 in 17 seasons (and is 352-287 in 22 years overall). He is also among elite company that have coached in the OVC. His 270 victories at APSU (all of which were as a member of the OVC) is third all-time among all coaches who have coached in the OVC. He trails only Cal Luther (319 wins with Murray State and UT Martin) and E.A. Diddle (296 wins at Western Kentucky when the Hilltoppers were members of the OVC; it does not include his wins prior to WKU joining the Conference in 1948). The next highest active OVC coach as far as win totals goes is UT Martin's Bret Campbell (86). Loos' 17 years coaching in the OVC is second all-time, behind only Luther who coached 23 years in the Conference.

Rivers and Fisher Rank No. 1 & 3 in OVC in Scoring: Entering this week the Tennessee Tech backcourt duo of Belton Rivers (18.0 ppg) and Anthony Fisher (17.3 ppg) rank No. 1 and No. 3 in the OVC in scoring. Sandwiched between the duo is Samford's Randall Gulina (17.9 ppg). The duo has been ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in scoring at different points of this season (only one other team and conference - VMI of the Big South Conference - has that happening right now). The last time teammates finished No. 1 and No. 2 in scoring in the OVC was in 2000-01 when Eastern Illinois' Kyle Hill (23.8 ppg) and Henry Domercant (22.8) topped the league scoring charts.

Austin Peay Sees Nation's Third Longest Winning Streak End: Austin Peay had won 11 games in a row (the third longest streak nationally behind Wisconsin and Florida) until losing 77-68 at Murray State on Feb. 1. The loss was the first for the Governors since falling 80-75 against Evansville on Dec. 18. It was the team's longest winning streak since the 2003-04 season when they won 14 in a row on the way to the OVC Regular Season Championship. That year the team lost in the OVC Tournament Championship game and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

1,000-Point Club: Samford's **Randall Gulina** became the 20th member of his school's 1,000-Point Club on Jan. 20, as he scored 14 points in a win over Eastern Kentucky. Gulina was the first OVC Player to reach the 1,000-Point career mark this season and was joined by Tennessee Tech's **Anthony Fisher** on Jan. 27, when he scored 20 points against Tennessee State. Two days later it was UT Martin's **Cleve Woodfork** who joined the club, scoring his 1,000th point against Eastern Kentucky. Murray State's **Shawn Witherspoon** became the latest player to achieve the feat, doing so against Eastern Kentucky on Feb. 8.

Martin Among Elite Company: Eastern Illinois freshman **Romain Martin** finished the season

leading his team in scoring (14.8 ppg). He is one of just 23 freshmen nationally to be leading their teams in scoring as on Feb. 26. The nationally freshmen leader in scoring is Texas' Kevin Durant (24.7 ppg). Martin is the first freshmen to lead EIU in scoring during the team's Division I era. Martin, along with Eastern Kentucky's Adam Leonard, was named OVC Co-Freshman of the Year.

Austin Peay Claims 2007 OVC Regular Season Championship: Austin Peay claimed the 2007 Ohio Valley Conference Regular Season Championship with a 16-4 record in League play. The regular season title is the seventh overall for the Governors, who also won OVC Championships in 1973, 1974, 1977, 1997, 2003 and 2004. The seven titles rank tied for fourth (with Tennessee Tech) in OVC history, behind only Murray State (20), Western Kentucky (19) and Morehead State (9). They have won three of the last five regular season titles. The team's 16 wins was just one off the OVC record of 17 Conference wins set by Murray State last season. The Govs do own the record for best winning percentage in an OVC season, going 16-0 (1.000) in 2003-04 (they share that record with three Western Kentucky squads from over the years).

Reed Named Player of the Year, Loos Tabbed as Coach of the Year and Martin and Leonard Split Freshman of the Year Awards: Austin Peay sophomore forward **Drake Reed** was tabbed as the 2007 OVC Player of the Year while Governors Coach **Dave Loos** earned Coach of the Year honors. Eastern Illinois' **Romain Martin** and Eastern Kentucky's **Adam Leonard** were named Co-Freshmen of the Year. Reed is the first Austin Peay player named Coach of the Year since 2003-04 (when Trenton Hassell - now with the Minnesota Timberwolves - won the award). Loos earned his fifth OVC Coach of the Year honor, the most in Conference history. Martin and Leonard became the first duo to share the Freshman of the Year award. The All-OVC first team included Reed, Tennessee Tech guards **Anthony Fisher** and **Belton Rivers**, Samford's **Randall Gulina** and Jacksonville State's **Courtney Bradley**.
