PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

ERIC HORSTMAN • 3B, SR. • OMAHA, NE • SE MISSOURI

Horstman went 6-for-10 last week at the plate, helping the Redhawks win a trio of games, to bring their record within one game of .500 (6-7). He scored four runs, hit two RBI and registered an on-base percentage of .615. Against Southern Illinois, he hit an RBI triple and scored two runs, and versus Freed-Hardeman, he went 2-4 with one RBI and another run scored. The senior also showed his versatility on defense, posting a 1.000 fielding percentage while seeing action at both third and second base.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK: BRAD DANIEL • RP, JR. • DICKSON, TN • AUSTIN PEAY

It's the second week in a row a mound dweller for the 8-6 Governors has won Pitcher of the Week. This week's winner, **Brad Daniel**, picked up both victories in Peay's doubleheader against Indiana State, and he also recorded his first save of his career against Evansville. The senior is the first APSU pitcher to to win both games of a doubleheader since Jeff Mault did it last year against Southeast Missouri.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (8-6, 0-0 OVC): Austin Peay had a roller coaster week, sweeping Indiana State at home early in the week, before dropping a pair to Northern Illinois and winning one against Evansville at the Aces Diamond Classic in Evansville...Gary McClure, Austin Peay's coach of 17-plus years, is now just one victory away from his 500th career win...Senior Jared Walker led the Governors' offense last week, going 9-20 (.450) with multiple hits in each of the three contests in Evansville...Junior Cody Youngblood also shined at the plate last week, going 8-18 (.444) with a .545 on base percentage. He also scored seven times...On the mound, junior hurler Brad Daniel went 2-0, collecting both victories against Indiana State. He also picked up his first career save against Evansville. With the two wins against ISU, Peay's undefeated home record improved to 5-0. Peay next travels to in-state rival Lipscomb on Tuesday.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (1-9, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Illinois undoubtedly had the hardest schedule in the OVC last week, traveling to the 11th-ranked team in the country, Arkansas, for a three-game bout...The Panthers managed 17 hits in the series, while scoring just three runs, opposed to 35 by Arkansas...EIU's **Keiji Szalo** and **Joe Hernandez** hit one homerun each. EIU will continue its eight game road-trip in the state of Arkansas on Tuesday against Arkansas State.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (2-8, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Kentucky's Florida trip didn't pan out quite as planned, but it did end on a high note with a 7-2 victory over Georgetown on Sunday...The Colonels had lost four consecutive prior to the victory and will return home with a few days off to regroup...Northern Illinois comes to town this weekend for a three-game series...Leading EKU last week was junior outfielder Brett Bolger, who batted .526 with seven RBI and three stolen bases... In three of the five games he registered three hits, and drove in three runs on two separate occasions...Sophomore pitcher McKenzie Willoughby went 7.0 innings and struck out seven in the game against Georgetown, picking up his first collegiate victory. The win snapped EKU's seven-game slide.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (6-8, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State went 3-1 last week, picking up wins against Alabama State and Middle Tennessee State (twice) before losing to MTSU in the third and final game of the weekend series...Senior OF Winston Pearson posted seven hits and seven RBI in the four games, including game-winning hits in each of the two victories against MTSU...Junior pitcher Lee Drinkard posted his second win of the year (Alabama St.), and he also made a relief appearance against MTSU...For the week, Drinkard finished with a 0.00 ERA, bringing his season ERA to a measley .142...JSU will return home for a Wednesday meeting against the Blazers of Alabama-Birmingham.

MOREHEAD STATE (5-7, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State won both of last week's contests against Brescia and the Unviersity of Kentucky by a combined score of 26-5...The hottest bat for the Eagles was probably that of senior first baseman Bryan Ingram, who had six hits in the two games, with six RBI and four runs scored...Morehead pitchers surrendered just nine hits total and struck out 19, while issuing only one walk...Reid Kittleson struck out nine in a complete game shutout against Brescia, and Adrian Duran allowed five hits and just one earned run in seven and one-third innings of work in Lexington...Morehead will host Cleveland State for a two-game series this week, beginning on Tuesday.

MURRAY STATE (10-6, 0-0 OVC): Murray State became the first team in the league to win 10 games after going 3-2 last week...Sophomore Tyler Pittman went 10-21 at the plate (.476), including a 6-for-11 performance in the two games against Akron...He finished with three doubles, five runs scored and nine RBI...LHP Jon Ross Shelton had two saves in as many appearances, with an ERA of 1.80 and nine strikouts...West Harris made three appearances on the mound, allowing no runs in 9.2 innings of work and an opposing batting average of .171...As a team, Murray State finished the week with a team ERA of

2.72. The 'Breds will return to the diamond on Wednesday, when they will begin a four game road trip with a stop at No. 16 Vanderbilt.

SAMFORD (2-10, 0-0 OVC): Samford's losing streak reached 10 games on Saturday after a 2-11 loss to Southeastern Louisiana, the second in as many days to the Lions... But, on Sunday, the Bulldogs returned the favor, posting their first win since the season opener...The 12-11 win over SIU marked the first time Samford reached double-digits in scoring this year...Freshman Bear Burnett batted .530 (9-17) in the team's four games last week, including a 4-6, three-RBI performance in Sunday's win...RHP Michael Neimkin picked up the win, going 5.0 innings and yielding just two runs...The Bulldogs will host Butler this weekend for a three game series...It will be the team's first home outings since Feb. 26 (UNC-Asheville.)

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (6-7, 0-0 OVC): Southeast Missouri ripped off three wins last week in as many tries, defeating South Dakota State, Southern Illinois and Freed-Hardeman by a combined score of 22-6...The Redhawks tallied 22 runs on 30 hits, while the pitching staff combined for a team ERA of 1.67 and 29 strikeouts...At the plate, senior third baseman Eric Horstman hit 6-10 (.600) with two RBI and four runs scored...Pitcher Derek Herbig picked up the win against regional rival SIU, holding the Salukis' offense to a .111 batting average...Southeast Missouri will be at No. 15 Old Miss for a two-game series on Tuesday and Wednesday before hosting Central Michigan this weekend.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (4-6, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee-Martin's woes continued, as they fell to 4-11 on the year after dropping all five games last week, the last three of which came at the USA Challenge in Milligan, TN...Junior hurler **Scott Massey** made two starts for the Skyhawks and finished 0-2, throwing 15 innings and ending with a 3.60 ERA...Four UT Martin sluggers hit .333 over the five-game skid...The only game that was decided by more than three runs was the second game against Evansville on Wednesday, when the Purple Aces won by a score of 13-3...UTM will stay on the road and travel to Birmingham Southern for a two-game series on Tuesday and Wednesday, followed by a Thursday match-up at Lipscomb.

TENNESSEE TECH (3-11, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee Tech also lost all five of their contests last week, two to Georgia and three to UAB...Senior first baseman **Nathan Marty** had three hits during the weekend bout with UAB, including two consecutive days, Saturday and Sunday, in which he hit a two-run homerun...The Golden Eagles will travel to Atlanta for a doubleheader against Georgia State, beginning on Tuesday.


