GARY GILBERT • 3B/1B, SR. • ALBUQUERQUE, NM • SE MISSOURI

Gilbert hit .357 with two home runs, including a grand slam, and eight RBI to help Southeast Missouri sweep a doubleheader from Central Michigan and take two of three from 2003 College World Series participant Southwest Missouri State last week. The senior infielder, who is riding a season-high six-game hitting streak, also played flawless defense, committing no errors in 38 fielding attempts.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK:

ANTHONY MAUPIN • RHP, JR. • MILTON, FL • SE MISSOURI

Maupin picked up a complete-game victory in Southeast's 8-2 win over Southwest Missouri State on Saturday, allowing two runs (one earned) off seven hits with seven strikeouts and a walk in nine innings of action. The junior righthander also worked 1.2 hitless/scoreless innings of middle relief in the Indians' 7-2 win over Central Michigan. For the week, he posted a 0.84 ERA with eight K's and two walks.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (10-5 OVERALL, 0-0 OVC): Austin Peay snapped a fourgame skid in fine fashion, winning all four of its outings last week. The Governors took a two-game series at Georgia State, then returned home to sweep a pair of pitcher's duels in a twinbill with Youngstown State...Ace closer Jeff Mault (4-1), who is one away from setting the school career saves record, has moved into a starting role. The senior righthander went 2-0 last week, picking up the win in Game 1 versus GSU and throwing Sunday's 1-0 shutout against YSU. He leads the league with a 1.96 ERA...The leadoff trio of Ron Bethke (1 RBI, 4 R), Alfredo Burkeen (6 RBI, 5 R) and Jake Peterson (7 RBI, 3 R) combined for a .433 batting average in the GSU series, while 1B/DH Chris Hyde cranked three homers, collecting eight RBI...After banging out 35 hits in the series at GSU, the Govs managed just five in two games versus YSU...Jared Walker went 3-for-3 in Game 1 against YSU, accounting for all but one of APSU's four hits...The Govs have a busy week on tap, sandwiching a trip to Memphis between home dates versus Wisconsin-Stevens Point and Lee University. APSU also begins defense of its 2003 OVC regular-season title with Morehead State visiting Clarksville.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (1-13 OVERALL, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Illinois is on a 13-game slide after losing two games at South Alabama and dropping a three-game series at Arkansas State last week. The Panthers haven't won since defeating SMS in their season opener...EIU hit .230 as a team during the five-game span... After getting shut out for a school-record third consecutive outing in a 5-0, Game 1 loss at USA, the Panthers halted a 28-inning scoreless streak with 24 hits and 24 runs in the second game. USA won the contest, 25-24, as EIU's run total tied for the sixth-highest in NCAA history by a losing team...The Panthers were 7-for-8 in stolen base attempts for the week... Erik Huber led all EIU hitters with a .556 batting average over the five games, followed by Kyle Haines (.389) and Chris Uhle (.368)...Middle reliever Chris Vaculik struck out seven USA batters in 4.2 innings of work in Game 2... The Panthers' opponents did most of their damage in the late innings as the EIU pitching staff gave up 26 runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth frames...The Panthers return to the Midwest from their Spring Break trip, visiting Indiana State for a single game before returning home for a meeting with Olivet Nazarene. EIU also opens OVC action at home against Tennessee-Martin.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (14-2 OVERALL, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Kentucky went 3-0 last week, beginning with a 7-2 victory over Vermont in the Colonels' finale at the Florida All-Star Baseball Challenge. EKU also outscored its opponents by a 39-12 margin in wins over Cedarville and Western Kentucky to push its win streak to five games...The Colonels registered season-highs of 26 runs and 25 RBI against CU...Chris O'Dell went 4-for-8 with three home runs, a triple, seven RBI and four runs in the CU and WKU games. He is batting a league-high .535 and tops the OVC in onbase (.608) and slugging (1.047) percentages... Chris Grider (3-0) earned his third straight win, giving up one earned run on six hits with 11 K's and two walks in six innings against Vermont...Stephen Carter, the OVC leader in stolen bases this season, has not been thrown out in 16 attempts, including three last week. He heads a list of seven EKU players who are perfect in one or more theft attempts...Carter, who is tied with an OVCbest 22 RBI in 2004, boasts a 29-game hitting streak dating back to last season... EKU is batting a league-high .410 as a team while its pitching staff sports an OVC-best 4.24 ERA...After a midweek date with Georgetown College, the Colonels entertain Tennessee Tech in their OVC opener.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (6-13, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State has lost five straight after dropping an 8-6 decision at UAB and getting swept in a three-game series with Purdue...One week after hitting for the cycle in a win over Toledo, Robby Goodson belted two home runs in Game 2 of the Purdue series, including his first career grand slam. He finished the week with three dingers, nine RBI and four runs scored...Goodson's grand slam was the first for a JSU player in over three years...Bobby Hicks batted

.471 with a homer, a double and a .526 on-base percentage... **Austin Stein** and **Scott Smith** are riding nine- and seven-game hitting streaks, respectively... Junior first baseman **Brian Haskins** played in his 100th career game, the second most on the club. He has started all but one of those contests. Senior **Matt Ruckdeschel** has played in 112 career games with 105 starts... Jax State's first OVC baseball series is against a familiar opponent as the Gamecocks entertain fellow OVC newcomer and former Atlantic Sun Conference rival Samford.

MOREHEAD STATE (5-11, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State out-hit Belmont, 21-18, in a two-game series over the weekend, but was unable to come away with a win. The Eagles also lost a game to Mother Nature as Sunday's meeting with Alice Loyd was cancelled due to wet grounds and cold temperatures...Travis Rima got a lone hit in each of the games to extend his hitting streak to 15 games...Despite picking up the loss on Friday, freshman lefthander Andrew Dieruf made his first collegiate start a good one, allowing only five hits and one earned run in five innings of work...Third baseman Zac Carr went 3-for-3 in Game 1 at Belmont and also registered five assists defensively from his spot at third base...After a midweek trip to Vanderbilt, the Eagles open the OVC portion of their slate at Austin Peay.

MURRAY STATE (4-14, 0-0 OVC): Murray State went 2-3 in five outings last week, suffering a doubleheader loss at Louisville and a single setback at Southern Illinois before sweeping a twinbill at home against Arkansas-Little Rock...Geoff Kirksey led the Thoroughbreds with a .438 batting average in the five games, going 7-for-16 with three doubles, a homer, three RBI and four runs. His two-run dinger in Game 1 of the UALR series proved to be the difference...Billy Fares picked up the win in the opener of the UALR doubleheader, scattering six hits while allowing no earned runs with eight strikeouts and one walk in seven innings...Alex Stewart hit .421, going 8-for-19 with two doubles, four runs and two RBI, including a 4-for-8 series against UALR...West Harris and Bart Peach each earned saves in the UALR contests, the first of the season for the 'Breds...Murray State, the defending OVC Tournament champion, hosts Western Kentucky before opening its OVC schedule at Southeast Missouri on Saturday.

SAMFORD (3-13, 0-0 OVC): Samford managed just three runs in a pair of setbacks to visiting Middle Tennessee. The 10-0 loss in Game 2 marked the first time the Bulldogs had been shut out this season...Trey Moody batted .375 in the series, including a 2-for-3 effort in Game 2...Lee Brady took the hard-luck loss in Game 1, giving up just two earned runs on five hits while striking out four batters and walking one...Garrett Rice and Eric Hollis are riding 14- and 11-game hitting streaks, respectively...The Bulldogs have given up double-digit runs to six opponents in 2004, losing all six contests...Samford has played a league-high three extra-inning games this season, going 1-2 in those contests...The Bulldogs host Georgia State and visit Mississippi State, then kick off their inaugural OVC schedule at fellow league newbie and former A-Sun rival Jacksonville State.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (8-9, 0-0 OVC): Southeast Missouri posted a 4-1 record last week, sweeping a doubleheader against Central Michigan and taking two of three from in-state rival Southwest Missouri State... Gary Gilbert cranked a grand slam in the Indians' 8-2 win over SMS on Saturday, finishing the week with two dingers, eight RBI and a .357 batting average...After tossing 1.2 innings of scoreless/hitless ball in the CMU twinbill, Anthony Maupin earned a complete-game victory versus SMS on Saturday. The junior righty allowed just one earned run off seven hits while striking out seven and walking one in nine innings...The Indians hit .317 for the week, belting six home runs...Bryan Kurt had three hits on Friday while Ernie Bracamonte and Frankie Montiel had three hits apiece on Saturday as the Indians out-hit the Bears, 31-25, in the series... Southeast's four-game win streak, which ended on Sunday, was its longest of the season...The Indians visit another rival on Tuesday when they travel to Southern Illinois before returning home to host Missouri and an OVC-opening series with Murray State.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (4-13, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee-Martin's skid stretched to seven games as the Skyhawks lost a 6-5 heartbreaker at Vanderbilt and a 13-1 decision to Lambuth...UTM held a 5-3 lead going into the ninth inning of the Vandy contest, but back-to-back balks by freshman pitcher Adam Ledlow led to the Commodores' winning run...The Skyhawks were held to a season-low two hits in the loss to Lambuth...Freshman hurler **Ben Meador** continues to show promise. The righthander gave up only two earned runs in six innings against then nationally-ranked Vanderbilt, scattering eight hits and striking out three batters...Senior Jaraad Robinson's first start of the season was a rocky one as he gave up six earned runs to Lambuth in three frames of action...Bryant Jones, who has hit safely in his last five games and tops the OVC with 47 total bases in 2004, went 4-for-5 at the plate with an RBI and two runs scored at Vandy. He leads the team in batting average (.484), hits (31), home runs (3), doubles (6) and runs scored (18)...The Skyhawks visit Saint Louis before kicking off their OVC slate at Eastern Illinois.

TENNESSEE TECH (1-7, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee Tech edged visiting Lipscomb, 9-8, to claim its first win of the 2004 campaign but fell back into the loss column in a series at UNC Asheville, dropping all three contests... Britt Clubb launched a three-run homer versus Lipscomb, the Golden Eagles' first four-bagger of the season...J.D. Druckenmiller recorded his first career dinger with a solo shot off the Bisons' pitching staff...Tech's win over Lipscomb was the first career victory for new head coach Matt Bragga and the 1,000th for the Golden Eagle program...Brandon Selvog, who recorded the team's first road homer of the season at UNCA, is the only Tech slugger to have double-digit hits with a team-high 10 thus far...Five Golden Eagle starters have perfect fielding percentages in 2004, despite the team's 11 errors through eight games...Tech visits Belmont and hosts Western Carolina, then travels to Eastern Kentucky for its first OVC series of the season.
