PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

NEIL SELLERS • 3B, SR. • ROBARDS, KY • EASTERN KENTUCKY

Sellers recorded three multi-hi/multi-RBI outings as Eastern Kentucky won a non-conference meeting with Georgetown College and took two of three from Tennessee Tech in OVC action last week. The senior third baseman drove in 10 runs and scored five more while batting .471 (8-of-17) for the week. Three of Seller's eight hits went for extra bases, including home runs in back-to-back games, as he racked up 15 total bases and posted an .882 slugging percentage.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK:

JOE DENSON • RHP/SS, SR. • BIRMINGHAM, AL • SAMFORD

Denson made the most of his second career start, tossing a nine-inning, complete-game shutout over 24th-ranked Mississippi State last week. The senior righthander, who spends most of his time at shortstop and entered the week having pitched a total of 12.1 innings in his career, limited the homestanding Bulldogs to three hits while striking out three batters and surrendering four walks.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (15-6 OVERALL, 3-0 OVC): Austin Peay posted a solid 5-1 record last week, including a three-game sweep of Morehead State (6-3, 8-3, 6-4) in the two teams' Conference opener. The Govs also picked up non-conference wins over Wisconsin-Stevens Point (7-1) and Lee University (12-9) while dropping a 5-2 decision at Memphis...Junior Rowdy Hardy improved to 5-1 on the season with a pair of wins, including a complete-game effort against UWSP. He gave up four runs (two earned) on 12 hits with 19 K's in 17.0 innings of work, holding opponents to a .190 batting average...The Govs' pitching staff posted a 3.53 ERA in the six contests, including two complete games with an average of 9.7 strikeouts per nine innings...Hardy's 13 K's against UWSP was the most for an APSU pitcher since 1996, while converted starter Jeff Mault's 12 K's in Game 2 of the Eagle series tied for the third-best effort during that span...The Govs' offense averaged 6.8 runs per game while compiling a .308 batting average...Sophomore 2B/DH Jacob Schroeder hit .571 while junior SS Matt Ledbetter batted .526 and belted his first home run of the season against Morehead State...Brett Luther also cranked his first homer of the year in the win over Lee...APSU pounded out 17 extra-base hits, including four dingers...The Govs were 14-of-16 in stolen base attempts, including a perfect 6-of-6 effort by senior OF Alfredo Burkeen...APSU hosts Lipscomb and visits Vanderbilt before traveling to OVC foe Samford.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (3-16 OVERALL, 1-2 OVC): Eastern Illinois went 2-3 last week, posting a 4-2 victory over Olivet Nazarene and picking up a 5-1, Game 2 win over Tennessee-Martin in OVC action. The Panthers also lost an 8-3 meeting at Indiana State before dropping Games 1 (8-3) and 3 (8-4) versus UTM...The win over ONU halted a 14-game slide for the Panthers...Senior OF Marcus Jackson batted .625 (10-of-16) in the five contests. He put together a hitting streak of 8-for-8 with seven of those hits coming in Saturday's UTM twinbill, then reached base in his next four plate apperances for a run of 12 straight before lining out in the eighth inning on Sunday...EIU's pitching staff, which entered the week with a 10.4 team ERA, allowed just 14 earned runs over 40 innings to lower it to 8.74. Only four of the 48 hits allowed by EIU hurlers went for extra bases (all doubles)...Freshman 3B Ryan Campbell hit .421 with two doubles and a home run, while fellow frosh and RF Mark Chagnon hit .417 with a double and two RBI...Senior 2B Chris Uhle was caught stealing for the first time in 26 tries, dating back to his freshman year. He is 25-of-27 in theft attempts for his career...Sophomore Kirk Miller tossed his second complete game, scattering three hits and allowing one run to pick up the seven-inning, Game 2 win versus UTM... Freshman Chris Vaculik posted his first save versus ONU, then threw five innings in the UTM series finale. Overall, he made three appearances, giving up two runs on seven hits in 7.1 innings...The Panthers visit Saint Louis and host Chicago State before heading to Murrray State for OVC action.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (17-3 OVERALL, 2-1 OVC): Eastern Kentucky defeated Georgetown College (11-3) and won its first two in OVC action against Tennessee Tech (6-0, 12-4) before having its eight-game win streak snapped with a 9-7 loss in the series finale...Senior 3B Neil Sellers homered in back-to-back games and finished the week with a .471 batting average, five runs and 10 RBI. He has driven in three+ runs seven times this season, including three last week, and leads the league with 31 RBI. Sellers is riding a six-game hitting streak...Senior LF Stephen Carter batted .636 (7-for-11) but had his 16-game hitting streak snapped in Game 2 versus Tech. He also walked four times and was hit by a pitch five times, posting an on-base percentage of .800... Junior RHP Scott Goetz earned the win as the Colonels' staff recorded its first combined shutout of the season in Game 1 against Tech. He allowed five hits and struck out six in 7.2 innings pitched, and now leads the team with 29 K's and 26.0 IP...Freshman DH Brett Bolger went 7-for-14, driving in three runs with a double and a triple...Sophomore RF Chris O'Dell leads the team with a .509 batting average...Junior C Chris Clark batted .300 and threw out back-to-back would-be base stealers in Sunday's loss to Tech...EKU visits Kentucky and OVC foe Tennessee-Martin.

2004 OVC BASEBALL NOTES

JACKSONVILLE STATE (9-13, 3-0 OVC): Jacksonville State snapped a five-game losing streak with a sweep of fellow OVC newcomer Samford in their inaugural Conference series, winning by scores of 7-3, 4-0 and 11-3...It was the Gamecocks' first series sweep of the Bulldogs since 1997, when the two teams played as members of the Atlantic Sun Conference...Jax State has recorded six three-game series sweeps in three years under head coach Jim Case...Freshman SS Jake Ball hit .400 and drove in six runs to end an 0-for-16 slump and raise his batting average 63 points...He recorded his first career extra-base hits in Game 1, finishing with a 1.000 slugging percentage for the week...Senior RHP Bobby Wynns allowed just four hits and recorded seven strikeouts in his complete-game, seven-inning shutout in Game 2. He threw 69 pitches, including 55 strikes, and faced the minimum through six innings...Junior OF Austin Stein, who leads the team with a .316 batting average, extended his hitting streak to a career-long 12 games, while senior 1B/RHP Robby Goodson is currently riding a five-game hitting streak...The Gamecocks travel to Alabama State, then entertain Southeast Missouri in OVC play.

MOREHEAD STATE (5-16, 0-3 OVC): Morehead State is on an eight-game slide after losing non-conference outings at Vanderbilt (9-4) and Alabama (20-2) and getting swept in OVC action at Austin Peay (6-3, 8-3, 6-4)...The Eagles have faced some tough foes to start out the 2004 season as Morehead State opponents sport a combined record of 157-96 (.621), including a 69-26 mark (.726) by the teams the Eagles played last week...Junior 3B Zac Carr led the team with a 5-for-10 effort in the five contests...The Eagles have played their last seven games on the road and are scheduled for four more away from home before returning to Allen Field on Apr. 9-10 against Tennessee-Martin...Morehead State has the week off before traveling to Tennessee Tech for its OVC series.

MURRAY STATE (6-16, 1-2 OVC): Murray State won a 13-11 non-conference slugfest with Western Kentucky, then posted a 16-3 victory on Sunday to salvage its OVC series at Southeast Missouri. The 'Breds lost both ends of Saturday's twinbill by scores of 19-5 and 6-2...Junior 3B Clint Griggs led the team with a .600 batting average for the week. He went 7-for-11 in the series at Southeast, scoring seven runs and slugging 1.021 with two doubles and a homer...Junior LHP Jon Ross Shelton picked up the Game 3 win on Sunday, limiting the Indians to three runs on 10 hits in seven innings, striking out five and walking one...Junior 1B Geoff Kirksey hit .538 with six RBI for the week, including going 5-for-9 at Southeast with two doubles, a home run and four RBI...Freshman 3B/DH James Akin hit .429 during the SEMO series, while frosh CF Tyler Pittman and senior RF Scotty Scott drove in four runs apiece against the Indians...The 'Breds batted .329 as a team over the four games, averaging 11.8 hits per game while collecting 15 extra-base raps...The win over WKU was the team's first since 1980...Murray State visits Evansville before returning home to entertain OVC foe Eastern Illinois.

SAMFORD (4-17, 0-3 OVC): Samford split a pair of non-conference games, losing an 8-4 decision to Georgia State and staging a 6-0 upset of then 24th-ranked Mississippi State before getting swept in its inaugural OVC series at Jacksonville State (7-3, 4-0, 11-3)...Sophomore RF Matt Alling went 5-for-5 in Game 1 of the JSU series, finishing the week with a .444 batting average (8-for-18)...Senior RHP/SS Joe Denson made the most of his second career start, tossing a three-hit, complete-game shutout at 24th-ranked Mississippi State. Prior to the nine-inning contest, the Bulldogs' starting shortstop had pitched just 12.1 frames in his career, including 6.1 this season...The Bulldogs have the week off before entertaining Austin Peay in a three-game OVC series over the weekend.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (10-12, 2-1 OVC): Southeast Missouri dropped a pair of non-conference meetings with Southern Illinois (6-5) and Missouri (6-3) before taking two of three from OVC foe Murray State. The Indians swept Saturday's doubleheader by scores of 19-5 and 6-2 before losing the series finale, 16-3...Junior 1B/DH **Freddy Lopez** is on a six-

game hitting streak after going 11-for-22 during the week, including a .643 effort against the 'Breds, where he slugged 1.143, drove in six runs and scored seven times...Junior closer **Brad Smith** earned one save in three appearances, allowing no runs with six strikeouts and two walks in 5.2 innings...The Indians visit Big 12 powerhouse Oklahoma State for a two-game midweek series, then head to Jacksonville State for OVC action.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (7-14, 2-1 OVC): Tennessee-Martin posted a 3-1 effort last week, staging an 8-3 victory over non-conference opponent Saint Louis, before winning two of three in its OVC series at Eastern Illinois. The Skyhawks won Games 1 and 3 by scores of 8-3 and 8-4, respectively, but lost Game 2 by a 5-1 margin...Senior OF Adam Salter hit .470 for the week, including a .416 effort at EIU. He finished the week with four RBI, three runs and two stolen bases...Freshman RHP Ben Meador worked 7.2 innings to earn the Game 1 victory at EIU, giving up 11 hits and three runs while striking out seven batters and walking two...He also tossed the final two frames of UTM's win at SLU, fanning five of the seven batters he faced...Meador is 2-1 with a 2.31 ERA this season and leads the team with 32 K's...Four pitchers combined to throw a four-hitter at SLU, with Scott Massey getting the victory in a pre-determined rotation. Massey claimed his second win of the week in Game 3 of the EIU series, giving up four runs (three earned) off seven hits while striking out five...Junior CF Hunter Hart hit .461 with four runs scored and an RBI in the EIU series...The Skyhawks visit Western Kentucky, then return home to welcome OVC foe Eastern Kentucky.

TENNESSEE TECH (3-10, 1-2 OVC): Tennessee Tech posted a 2-3 record last week, losing a 17-4 decision at Belmont before edging Western Carolina, 13-12, in a pair of non-conference outings. The Golden Eagles opened OVC play with a twinbill loss to Eastern Kentucky (6-0, 12-4), but rallied for a 9-7 victory in the series finale to earn their first road win of the season... Junior reliever Colt Ashman has accounted for all three of the Golden Eagles' victories thus far after going 2-0 last week. He worked the final 3.2 innings of the WCU contest and the last five 5.0 of Game 3 at EKU, giving up three runs off 10 hits in the two games with six strikeouts...Tech set a school mark with 24 hits against WCU, led by junior IF Nathan Marty's record-tying five hits. Marty, who sports the team's longest active hitting streak at four games, finished the week with six runs, three RBI, a homer and a .474 batting average...Junior OF J.D. Druckenmiller launched back-to-back leadoff home runs in the WCU contest...Sophomore IF Kenny Stiles hit .600 for the week with two RBI...The Golden Eagles play a homeand-home two-game series on Tuesday and Wedesday with Middle Tennessee, then host OVC foe Morehead State.
