OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

ROBBY GOODSON • DH/RHP, SR. • VICKSBURG, MS • JACKSONVILLE ST.

Robby Goodson starred on both sides of the plate as Jacksonville State posted a 3-1 record last week. The senior designated hitter/pitcher drove in 12 runs and scored seven more while hitting .625 (10-for-16) in the four contests, posting slugging and on-base percentages of 1.313 and .727, respectively. Goodson's heroics came in Sunday's 15-14, Game 3 win over Southeast Missouri as he launched a solo homer in the 10th inning to cap off a 10run rally and lift the Gamecocks to victory. He also held the Indians scoreless over the final 3.1 innings of that contest, striking out five and giving up a hit to pick up his first win of the season on the mound.

RYAN CAMPBELL • 3B, FR. • ORLAND PARK, IL • EASTERN ILLINOIS

Campbell batted .478 (11-for-23) while driving in 12 runs and scoring 10 more as Eastern Illinois posted a 4-1 record last week. The freshman third baseman rapped out six extra-base hits in the five contests, including a school record-tying three home runs against Chicago State, as he posted slugging and on-base percentages of 1.000 and .571, respectively, for the week. Campbell, who extended his hitting streak to 10 games, also registered two putouts and 15 assists while manning the hot corner for the Panther defense.

COLLINS HUGHES • RHP, SR. • WEST POINT, MS • TENNESSEE TECH

Hughes threw seven scoreless innings and picked up the win in Tennessee Tech's combined 3-0 shutout of Morehead State on Sunday. The senior righthander, who also gave up just one run in 8.1 innings of work in Tech's 2-1 victory over in-state rival Middle Tennessee, fanned 17 batters while allowing 12 hits and one walk in 15.1 innings of work for the week.

SHAWN KELLEY • RHP, FR. • LOUISVILLE, KY • AUSTIN PEAY

Kelley allowed only one run on five hits in eight innings to earn the win in Austin Peay's 3-1 victory over Lipscomb. The redshirt freshman also worked 2.2 innings of effective relief during the Govs' come-from-behind 7-5, Game 3 win at Samford, giving up three hits while holding the Bulldogs scoreless and striking out seven of the 12 batters he faced. For the week, Kelley registered 13 strikeouts, eight hits and one walk in 10.2 innings on the hill.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (19-7 OVERALL, 6-0 OVC): Austin Peay remains unbeaten in Conference play after recording its second straight OVC series sweep over the weekend at Samford. The Governors also split a pair of non-conference outings, defeating Lipscomb (3-1) and losing to Vanderbilt (7-4)...Less than a year removed from "Tommy John" surgery, redshirt freshman RHP Shawn Kelley is doing well. He picked up the win against Lipscomb, allowing just one run on five hits in 8.0 innings, and struck out seven of the 12 batters he faced in relief in Sunday's game at Samford... APSU pitchers limited opponents to a .216 batting average while posting a 3.21 ERA in 42 innings of work during the five-game stretch...Transfer sophomore Rowdy Hardy and senior Jeff Mault each improved to 6-1, picking up respective wins in Saturday's twinbill...Junior Jared Walker led the Govs with a 10-for-20 effort and five RBI in the five contests...Senior Ron Bethke and junior Chris Hyde cranked back-to-back homers in Sunday's contest, the squad's first consecutive dingers this season... Sophomore Jacob Schroeder has solidified his position as the team's DH after batting .375 last week and extending his hitting streak to eight games...At 19-7, the Govs are off to their best start since opening the 1996 season with a 20-6 mark. The team's 6-0 Conference start is its best in school history, eclipsing five 5-1 openings...APSU puts its eightgame home win streak on the line as Middle Tennessee visits midweek and Tennessee Tech comes into town for OVC action over the weekend.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (7-17 OVERALL, 4-2 OVC): Eastern Illinois tallied a 4-1 record last week, sweeping Murray State in OVC action and splitting non-conference outings against Saint Louis and Chicago State...Freshman 3B Ryan Campbell tied a school record by hitting three home runs in a 22-10 win over CSU. He finished the week batting .478 with 10 runs scored and 12 RBI, posting a 1.000 slugging percentage with three doubles and three homers. Campbell also extended his hitting streak to 10 games while going 6-for-13 at Murray, scoring four times and driving in five runs over the weekend...Junior Kyle Widegren went 2-0 with a 6.0 ERA last week, working two scoreless innings of relief against CSU and tossing all seven innings of Saturday's Game 2 with the 'Breds...Pete Stone hit .500, scoring six runs and driving in 11...Jason Cobb hit .444 and Kyle Haines batted .440 while pushing his hitting streak to a team-high 14 games...Brian Long struck out six batters in 6.1 innings of action, allowing one earned run, while Chris Vaculik pitched 3.2 innings on Sunday, picking up the win...EIU has gone 6-4 since returning from Spring Break, hitting .345 as a team while posting a .951 fielding percentage and getting a 6.35 ERA from its pitching staff during that span...The Panthers return home for five straight, starting with Tuesday's game against in-state rival Western Illinois and an OVC series versus Jacksonville State.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (19-4 OVERALL, 4-2 OVC): Eastern Kentucky went 2-1 in its Conference series at Tennessee-Martin...Senior LF Stephen Carter went 3-for-4 with three RBI and two runs scored on Sunday, finishing the three-game set with a .667 hitting average (8-for-12) and a .733 on-base percentage while batting from the leadoff position. He leads the team in hitting (.484), runs scored (35), hits (44), stolen bases (19) and on-base percentage (.586)...Freshman RHP Chris Grider improved to 5-0 on the season after working all seven innings of EKU's 6-1 win in Saturday's nightcap, giving up one unearned run on five hits while fanning nine batters. Grider has recorded at least nine strikeouts in each of his last three outings and tops the team with 37 K's overall while posting a 1.86 ERA in five starts... Neil Sellers batted .500 with five RBI in the series and extended his hitting streak to nine games, while Brett Bolger went 7-for-14 with six RBI. Sellers has driven in a team-high 36 runs thus far in 2004... Chris Clark had the only extra-base hits in EKU's 20-4, Game 3 victory, rapping out two doubles for a team-high 12 on the year...The Colonels lost back-to-back games for the first time this season after losing the finale of the Tennessee Tech series a week ago and Saturday's opener at UTM... EKU returns home to host Berea College on Wednesday and OVC foe Murray State over the weekend.

2004 OVC BASEBALL NOTES

JACKSONVILLE STATE (12-14, 5-1 OVC): Jacksonville State improved to 5-1 in conference play after taking two of three in its OVC series with Southeast Missouri. The Gamecocks, who also won a 19-8 decision over Alabama State, have won six of their last seven contests...Senior DH/RHP Robby Goodson starred on both sides of the plate in Sunday's win as the Gamecocks rallied with 10 unanswered runs for a 15-14 victory in 10 innings. The Vicksburg, Miss., native entered the game in the seventh inning and allowed only one hit through 3.1 scoreless frames for the win. Goodson also provided the winning run with a solo shot in the bottom of the 10th. He finished the week with a .625 batting average and 1.313 slugging percentage, registering 12 RBI and five extra-base hits, including three home runs...Senior RHP C.R. Palmer posted a 1.17 ERA and held opponents to a .083 batting average for the week. He pitched seven innings of no-hit ball before exiting in the eighth frame of Saturday's twinbill opener, earning the victory after giving up only two hits and two walks while fanning six batters...The Gamecocks have hit .339 as a team over their last seven games, rapping out 33 extra-base hits during that span... Austin Stein extended his hitting streak to 16 games, the secondlongest run in JSU's Division I history, while Goodson pushed his streak to nine games...The Gamecocks visit Birmingham-Southern and host Alabama State before traveling to Eastern Illinois for OVC play.

MOREHEAD STATE (5-19, 0-6 OVC): Morehead State finds itself on an 11-game slide after dropping all three over the weekend at Tennessee Tech...Thirteen of the team's last 16 losses have been on the road, including the last 10...The team's starting rotation of Chad Parsons, Casey Campbell and Adrian Duran posted a respectable 3.37 ERA in the series, but got little run support as the Eagle offense hit just .222 with runners in scoring position...Duran struck out 13 batters in his eight innings of work in Game 3 on Sunday...Morehead State's meeting with Marshall on Tuesday has been changed to a doubleheader, beginning at 12 noon CT. Morehead also hosts a three-game set with OVC foe Tennessee-Martin. If the Eagles and the Skyhawks open as scheduled on Friday, Morehead State will have gone 26 days between home games.

MURRAY STATE (7-19, 1-5 OVC): Murray State posted a 13-6 midweek victory over Evansville before dropping all three of its OVC outings against Eastern Illinois...Freshman CF Tyler Pittman led the Thoroughbreds with a .333 average at the plate, going 6-for-18 with two doubles and six runs scored. He batted .385 in the EIU series with four runs and a double... Senior RHP and Evansville, Ind., native Bart Peach made the midweek start against the Purple Aces, allowing four runs on five hits...Junior IF Alex Stewart went 5-for-15 and slugged .867 in the four contests, finishing with two doubles, two homers and seven RBI in his first action since missing four games with an injured Achillles' tendon...Sophomore Ike Bridwell came up big as a pinch-hitter in Sunday's 10-inning, 7-5 loss slapping a game-tying double in the ninth inning in his only plate appearance of the week...The 'Breds entertain Arkansas State, then head to Eastern Kentucky for a Conference series.

SAMFORD (4-20, 0-6 OVC): Samford is still looking for its first OVC win after losing all three of its meetings with Austin Peay...Senior catcher Eric Hollis drove in two runs while leading the Bulldogs with a 5-for-12 effort at the plate...Sophomore RHP Stephen Artz struck out nine batters and walked four while working the first seven innings of Saturday's 6-2, Game 1 loss...The Bulldogs will be looking to snap their six-game losing streak when they wrap up their four-game homestand against Alabama-Huntsville before traveling to Southeast Missouri for Conference play.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (12-15, 3-3 OVC): Southeast Missouri went 2-3 on the road last week, splitting a pair of non-conference meetings with Oklahoma State and winning one of three at Jacksonville State in OVC action...Junior OF Frankie Montiel batted .400 in the five contests, driving in five runs while scoring four more. The Guadalupe, Ariz., native also hit .545 with runners on and .556 with runners in scoring position...Junior RHP Ryan Forsyth earned the 4-2 victory at OSU, striking out eight batters while allowing two runs on five hits through 8.2 innings...The Indians return home to entertain Freed-Hardeman and OVC opponent Samford.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (8-17, 3-3 OVC): Tennessee-Martin lost three of its four outings last week, dropping an 11-7 decision at Western Kentucky and losing two of three in OVC action versus Eastern Kentucky...Freshman Ben Meador pitched eight innings and gave up three earned runs while fanning seven batters en route to picking up the 4-3 win in the opener of Saturday's twinbill with EKU...Freshman Adam Ledlow claimed his third save of the season after striking out two of the three batters he faced in the ninth inning of Game 1. Ledlow is now tied for fifth on the school's career saves list and is also tied for fourth on the single-season saves chart...Junior Brian Berryman registered three multi-hit games as he led the Skyhawks with a .429 average at the plate, collecting six hits and two RBI, while senior Bryan Jones hit safely in all four games, posting a .389 batting average...UTM hosts Harding University in a midweek contest, then hits the road for an OVC series at Morehead State.

TENNESSEE TECH (7-11, 4-2 OVC): Tennessee Tech sports a fourgame win streak after sweeping Morehead State in OVC action and splitting a home-and-home series with Middle Tennessee...Junior IF Nathan Marty hit .412 and scored twice in the five contests. He plated the winning run in Saturday's 7-6, Game 1 triumph against the Eagles and rapped out the game-winning hit in Wednesday's 2-1 victory over Middle Tennessee...Senior RHP Collins Hughes posted a 2-0 record while fanning 17 batters and walking only one in 15.1 innings of work. He posted a 0.59 ERA for the week, which included seven scoreless innings in Sunday's 3-0 victory over the Eagles. Colt Ashman combined with Hughes for the shutout, giving up a lone hit in the final two frames...Ben Pincus tossed a complete-game, four-hit shutout in Game 2 against Morehead State on Saturday as the Tech pitching staff blanked back-to-back Division I opponents for the first time since 1966 (East Tennessee State, 11-0/5-0)...The Golden Eagles visit Lipscomb and host Appalachian State in non-conference play, then travel cross-state to take on OVC foe Austin Peay.
