# OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

#### BRYAN INGRAM • 1B, JR. • HAMILTON, OH • MOREHEAD STATE

Ingram batted .500 as Morehead State posted a 4-1 record last week, splitting a twinbill at Marshall and sweeping Tennessee-Martin in three OVC contests. Six of his nine hits went for extra bases as the junior first baseman posted slugging and on-base percentages of 1.167 and .526, respectively. Ingram hit a grand slam in the Eagles' 6-5 win over Marshall and finished the week with three homers, three doubles, eight runs scored and eight RBI.

#### **CO-PITCHERS OF THE WEEK:**

## COLLINS HUGHES • RHP, SR. • WESTPOINT, MS • TENNESSEE TECH

**Hughes** recorded his second straight shutout of the season after limiting league-leading Austin Peay to five hits over seven scoreless innings en route to the complete-game victory. The senior righthander struck out 10 batters and walked just one, holding the Govs' offense to a .192 hitting average as APSU was held scoreless for the first time this season.

#### BRAD DANIEL • RHP, SO. • DICKSON, TN • AUSTIN PEAY

**Daniel** helped Austin Peay avoid a sweep in its OVC series with Tennessee Tech, holding the Golden Eagles to four hits over nine innings in a 6-1, complete-game victory. The sophomore righthander allowed one run on three walks while fanning a career-high seven batters. Prior to his Game 3 performance, the Golden Eagles had pounded out 25 hits in Friday's twinbill.

# AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (20-10 OVERALL, 7-2 OVC): Austin Peay fell from the ranks of the OVC unbeaten but remains in first place after going 1-2 in its Conference series with Tennessee Tech. The Govs also dropped a 3-1 decision to Middle Tennessee, snapping APSU's eight-game home win streak and putting an end to the fourth-best start in school history...The 3:45 marathon against MTSU was the Govs' longest game of the year by nearly 30 minutes...Sophomore RHP Brad Daniel (3-0) threw a completegame four-hitter in Saturday's 6-1 win over Tech, allowing one run on three walks while fanning a career-high seven batters in nine innings...Sophomore C Tommy Smith led the Govs' offense with a .462 batting average and five RBI for the week, including his first homer of the season...The Govs are a perfect 14-of-14 in stolen base attempts over the last six outings, including 12 thefts last week...The APSU defense committed six errors in the twinbill with Tech. Prior to Friday, the Govs had made just three miscues on the season... Austin Peay hosts Memphis and Western Kentucky before traveling to Southeast Missouri for OVC action.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (10-18 OVERALL, 6-2 OVC): Eastern Illinois went 3-1 last week, edging Western Illinois (5-4) before taking two of three from OVC opponent Jacksonville State...Freshman 3B Ryan Campbell batted .462 for the week, with three of his six hits going for extra bases. He drove in four runs and scored three times, with two runs coming off his teamleading fifth homer in Game 3 of the JSU series...Freshman reliever Chris Vaculik went 1-0 with a save in three appearances, giving up one run off two hits iwith a pair of strikeouts and a walk...Freshmen RF Mark Chagnon and 1B Kevin Carkeek both hit .400 over the four games with Carkeek also driving in four runs...Junior RHP Kyle Widegren pitched his second complete game in as many weekends, picking up the Game 2 win against JSU...Senior RHP Jared Marshall threw nine innings in two starts, striking out six without issuing a walk...Sophomore LHP Kirk Miller was the hard-luck loser in Game 1 versus JSU, throwing 7.2 innings before taking the 3-2 loss... After suffering through a 14-game skid earlier in the season, the Panthers have won seven of their last eight outings...EIU closes out its five-game homestand with St. Joseph's, then visits Northern Illinois before heading to OVC foe Samford.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (22-5 OVERALL, 6-3 OVC): Eastern Kentucky breezed past Berea, 17-1, then won two of three in its OVC series with Murray State...Senior C Chris Clark sat out the Berea contest, but went 6-for-9 with six runs scored and an RBI in the Murray State series...Junior LHP Dan Bachman (3-1, 5.46 ERA) picked up the 8-2 win in Game 3 versus the 'Breds, givng up two runs on seven hits with six strikeouts in 6.1 innings of work...EKU has won all three of its OVC series to date...The Colonels turned five double plays last week, giving them 24 on the season...Five EKU players are hitting .418 or better as the Colonels boast a league-high .400 team batting average. Heading the list of sluggers are sophomore RF Chris O'Dell (.457) and senior LF Stephen Carter (.456) as the No. 1 through 5 batters in the lineup are hitting a combined .429... EKU hitters also sport the OVC's top slugging (.575) and on-base (.481) percentages while the Colonel pitching staff claims the league's best earned run average at 3.60...The Colonels, who are 14-2 at Tukey Hughes Field thus far in 2004, close out their six-game homestand with Xavier and Marshall before taking off for a Conference series at Jacksonville State.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (14-17, 6-3 OVC): Jacksonville State went 2-3 last week, splitting a pair of non-conference outings and dropping two of three in OVC action at Eastern Illinois...Senior 3B Bobby Hicks extended his hitting streak to nine games as he batted .556 with seven RBI. Seven of his 10 hits went for extra bases to give him a 1.222 slugging percentage for the week. Hicks, who leads the team with a .352 batting average, was a single shy of hitting for the cycle in the Gamecocks' 9-2 win over Alabama State...JSU, which lost a conference series for the first time in five tries, has won 10 of its last 14 conference games, dating back to last

season...Junior RF **Austin Stein** saw his career-best 16-game hitting streak end in a 6-4 loss at Birmingham-Southern...Stein is batting a teamhigh .433 in OVC contests, while Hicks is .429 versus conference pitching...JSU has outscored OVC opponents, 63-47, through four series thus far...Senior 1B/RHP **Robby Goodson** has hit nine home runs in 2004, the most in a single season under head coach **Jim Case's** tutelage ...JSU's pitching staff boasts a league-high 9.22 strikeouts per nine innings while sporting the OVC's third-best earned run average (5.12)...The Gamecocks entertain Eastern Kentucky in OVC play this weekend.

MOREHEAD STATE (9-20, 3-6 OVC): Morehead State dropped a twinbill opener at Marshall (5-1), then snapped its 12-game slide with a 6-5 victory in the nightcap. The Eagles also swept their OVC series with UT Martin... Junior 1B Bryan Ingram batted .500 in four outings, with six of his nine hits going for extra bases. Ingram, who hit a grand slam in Game 2 versus Marshall, posted slugging and on-base percentages of 1.167 and .526, respectively, finishing the week with three homers, three doubles, eight runs scored and eight RBI...Senior RHP Casey Campbell went 1-0 with a save in two appearances. He worked 7.2 frames, allowing five hits and only one earned run...The Eagles registered 68 hits to their opponents' 49, including a 13-6 home run margin, while outscoring them, 53-33...As a team, Morehead State batted .380 with a .726 slugging percentage for the week...Sophomore Robert Dittrich hit leadoff and played the outfield in four games last week, posting a .588 batting average and six runs...The Eagles put their four-game win streak on the line at OVC foe Murray State.

MURRAY STATE (8-22, 2-7 OVC): Murray State went 1-3 in four outings last week, dropping a 10-8 decision to Arkansas State before losing two of three at Eastern Kentucky...Freshman CF Tyler Pittman went 4-for-4 in the Thoroughbreds' 6-3, Game 2 win over EKU, hitting a double and homer for two runs and four RBI...Junior LHP Jon Ross Shelton recorded the complete-game win at EKU, allowing three runs on eight hits while striking out four and walking two in seven innings...The win at EKU snapped a five-game skid for Murray State...The 'Breds pitching staff allowed only three walks in the first three outings last week. Murray State hurlers have struck out 8.21 batters per nine innings, good enough for third in the league...Junior 1B Geoff Kirksey has left the team. Kirksey, who had started all 26 of the team's games at the time of his departure, was batting .301 with 24 RBI and 14 runs...The 'Breds visit Southern Illinois before returning home to host Morehead State in Conference action.

SAMFORD (4-23, 0-9 OVC): Samford is still searching for its first OVC victory after getting swept in its third straight conference series, this time at Southeast Missouri...Sophomore 3B Trey Moody drove in five runs over the weekend, finishing with a .400 batting average, a double and a home run...Sophomore RF Matt Alling has rapped out a Conference-best four triples this season and also ranks among league leaders in hitting (.420), runs batted in (31), hits (42), walks (20), total bases (63) and on-base (.516) and slugging (.630) percentages...The Bulldogs' Apr. 7 lightning-shortened game at Alabama-Huntsville will not be made up. Samford held a 4-0 lead when the the game was called at the bottom of the fourth inning...Samford looks to put the breaks on its nine-game slide when it plays a two-day, home-and-home series with cross-town rival Birmingham-Southern and hosts OVC opponent Eastern Illinois.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (16-15, 6-3 OVC): Southeast Missouri posted a perfect 4-0 effort last week, routing Freed-Hardeman (12-4) and sweeping its OVC series with Samford...Junior 3B/LF Eric Horstman batted .556 (10-for-18) with eight runs scored and six RBI...Junior LHP Derek Herbig went 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA in two appearances. He struck out 12 batters in eight innings to pick up the win over FHU, then worked 2.0 scoreless innings of the Game 3 victory over Samford...The Indians are above .500 for the first time after opening up the 2004 campaign with a tough non-conference schedule...The Indians outscored their opponents by a 40-18 margin last week, with four different hurlers picking up wins... Southeast visits Saint Louis and entertains league leader Austin Peay.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (9-20, 3-6 OVC): Tennessee-Martin thumped Harding University, 13-4, but lost all three of its outings in a Conference series at Morehead State...Junior OF Hunter Hart went 8-for-13 (.615) in the four contests, finishing with four home runs, eight RBI and four runs scored...After averaging 15 hits a game in their first three outings of the week, the Skyhawks were held to four hits in their series finale at Morehead...Junior 2B/SS Nick Bruner hit his first home run of the season at Morehead, finishing with a .500 average in the series and extending his hitting streak to five games...Senior IF Bryant Jones has hit safely in eight straight outings after going 5-for-11 against the Eagles. He leads the team with 11 multi-hit games...Sophomore C Brett Spivy went 3-for-4 against Harding, falling a home run shy of hitting for the cycle...Sophomore Casey Estill pitched seven innings against Harding to earn his first win of the season, allowing four runs off six hits with four strikeouts and three walks...The Skyhawks will meet Lipscomb in a neutral-site game at Savannah, Tenn., before opening a homestand with Saint Louis and OVC foe Tennessee Tech.

TENNESSEE TECH (10-13, 6-3 OVC): Tennessee Tech became the first team to beat league-leading Austin Peay in 2004, winning both ends of Friday's twinbill before suffering a 6-1 loss in the series finale. The Golden Eagles also split a pair of non-conference tilts, losing at Lipscomb (13-2) and defeating Appalachian State (13-9)...Junior IF Brandon Selvog recorded six extra-base hits among a .476 batting effort. He scored eight times and drove in five runs while compiling 21 total bases...Senior RHP Collins Hughes handed APSU its first shutout of the season, giving up five hits, striking out 10 batters and walking one while tossing all seven innings to pick up the 7-0, Game 2 victory...Sophomore IF Brent Bilodeau was one of four Tech hitters to bat over .400 for the week, going 9-for-18. Joining Bilodeau and Slevog was sophomore UT Josh Eye (.444) and sophomore C Grant French (.400)...Junior OF J.D. Druckenmiller launched a grand slam home run in Game 1 of the APSU series, and Selvog followed with a solo shot to give the Golden Eagles their first backto-back dingers of the season...Junior C Britt Clubb is batting .400 versus Conference opponents, while Hughes is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in league action...Tech hosts Georgia State for a pair of midweek games, then visits Tennessee-Martin for an OVC series.

**OVC RACE OFF TO A TIGHT START:** Three weeks into the Conference schedule, the 2004 OVC race looks to be an exciting one as defending regular-season champion and league-leader **Austin Peay** (7-2) holds a one-game lead over five other squads, who are knotted up at 6-3.
