OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

KEVIN CARKEEK • 1B, FR. • ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, IL • EASTERN ILL.

Carkeek batted .667 as Eastern Illinois posted a 3-2 record last week, including a pair of Conference wins at Samford. The Arlington Heights, Ill., native had multiple-hit efforts in all five outings, rapping out five doubles among 14 hits while collecting two RBI and eight runs. He recorded 19 total bases, posting slugging and on-base percentages of .864 and .700, respectively. Defensively, the freshman went errorless in 35 fielding attempts at first base.

BRYANT JONES • 2B, SR. • WADDY, KY • TENNESSEE-MARTIN

Jones batted .524 (11-for-21) with six runs and six RBI to lead Tennessee-Martin to a 3-1 effort last week, including two OVC wins against Tennessee Tech. The Waddy, Ky., product had two four-hit outings and stroked three doubles, one triple and a homer among 11 hits as he slugged .905 and recorded 19 total bases without a single strikeout. In the field, the senior second baseman racked up 12 assists and 13 putouts.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK:

JEFF MAULT • RHP, SR. • WAWAKA, IN • AUSTIN PEAY

Mault went 2-0 as he pitched league-leading Austin Peay to a twinbill sweep of Southeast Missouri. The senior hurler worked the final 1.2 innings of Game 1, then held Southeast to a lone run over a six-inning start for the Game 2 win. In the first game, the Wawaka, Ind., native came on in the bottom of the ninth with one out and the potential winning run on second in a 2-2 ballgame, getting out of the jam with a pair of flyouts. After the Govs took a 3-2 lead, Mault pitched to just four batters in the bottom of the 10th, giving up a lone two-out single to seal the victory. In the nightcap, Mault went 6.0 frames of a seven-inning contest, allowing one run on six hits while walking two batters and striking out three.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (22-12 OVERALL, 9-3 OVC): League-leading Austin Peay won its first OVC series against Southeast Missouri since 1999 after taking two of three from the Indians over the weekend. The Govs also lost a 13-1 decision to Western Kentucky...Senior RHP Jeff Mault was the winner in both ends of Saturday's twinbill sweep of the Indians. He became the first pitcher in school history to come on in relief to win the first game of a doubleheader, then start the second game and pick up the victory. The Govs won the first contest 3-2 in 10 innings, and took a 15-4 decision in the nightcap...Leadoff hitter and junior SS Matt Ledbetter had an impressive week at the plate, going 8-for-14 (.533) while scoring four times...Senior DH Chris Poynter went 5-for-7 on Saturday, registering three doubles and five RBI...On Sunday, sophomore CF Brett Luther drove in six runs with a two-run homer and a grand slam...Junior 3B/1B Jared Walker, who entered the week ranked nationally in doubles, increased his season tally to 16 with a pair against Southeast. He had three hits apiece in Games 2 and 3 at Southeast...APSU is batting .314 and averaging 6.7 runs per game in conference play...The Govs visit Middle Tennessee, then host UT Martin for an OVC set.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (13-20 OVERALL, 8-4 OVC): Eastern Illinois posted a 3-2 mark last week, splitting a pair of non-conference games and winning two of three in its OVC series at Samford by sweeping Saturday's doubleheader (4-2, 11-2)...Freshman 1B Kevin Carkeek extended his hitting streak to 11 games, batting .636 with eight runs scored and two RBI. Five of his 14 hits were doubles...Junior **Ted Juske** went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA, allowing just one run on seven hits in 8.1 innings of work. He worked 3.1 scoreless frames of relief in a 10-7 win over Northern Illinois, then pitched five innings in his first OVC start in Game 2 at Samford...Freshman 3B Ryan Campbell pushed his hitting streak to 17 games before having it end on Saturday...Senior 2B Chris Uhle saw his 10-game hitting streak end over the weekend as well...Freshman Chris Vaculik picked up his team-leading third save...Junior LF David Chacon's grand slam in Game 2 at Samford was the team's first this season...The Panthers hit .348 as a team last week with 11 doubles and four homers, and have registered at least 10 hits in seven straight outings...EIU visits Illinois-Chicago and hosts Saint Louis before entertaining Southeast Missouri in OVC action.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (24-6, OVERALL, 8-4 OVC): Eastern Kentucky went 2-1 in its OVC series at Jacksonville State, winning both ends of Saturday's doubleheader (8-5, 10-1)...Junior OF Derrick Bussell batted .600 and drove in four runs over the three-game series...Freshman RHP Chris Grider upped his record to 6-1 after tossing a complete game in his only outing of the week. He gave up just one run off nine hits while striking out eight batters in the Game 2 victory on Saturday...In Game 1, iunior 1B Will Whisenant belted a three-run homer to break a 5-5 tie and lift the Colonels to the 8-5 victory. He was the only player with two hits in the contest, driving in four runs and scoring twice...Junior reliever Richard **Boothe** picked up his third save of the season, working a scoreless ninth inning of Game 1...Fifteen EKU players are hitting .333 or better this season, including six who boast averages of .400 or better...The Colonels were 5-for-7 in stolen base attempts over the weekend, upping their season tally to 70-of-85...Nine Colonels have each driven in 20+ runs thus far...EKU is on the road for non-conference tilts at Xavier and Marshall, then returns home to host Samford in OVC play.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (15-19, 7-5 OVC): Jacksonville State snapped a four-game OVC losing skid with a 19-5, Game 3 win over EKU on Sunday... Senior C Scott Smith belted a school-record two grand slams in the contest, also matching JSU's Division I record for RBI with eight. He batted .545 for the series while posting a 1.091 slugging percentage...Senior 3B Bobby Hicks' 11-game hitting streak came to an end on Sunday...The Gamecocks recorded four homers in the victory...Senior DH/P Robby Goodson is the first Jax State player in four years to record double-digit homers. He leads the team with 10...Junior LF Winston Pearson scored

four times and went 4-for-5 on Sunday, just missing hitting for the cycle with two singles, a double and a triple...Senior RHP **C.R. Palmer** moved into 12th place on the school's all-time strikeouts list with 164. He also ranks 10th in career innings pitched (205)...Hicks leads the team with 17 multi-hit games, while Goodson has a team-high eight multi-RBI outings...The Gamecocks outhit the league-leading Colonels, .388 to .349, over the three-game series...Jax State is batting .415 in bases-loaded situations this season and has 63 two-out RBI...JSU hosts Troy State, then travels to OVC foe Morehead State.

MOREHEAD STATE (10-22, 4-8 OVC): Morehead State went 1-2 in its OVC series at Murray State...Both of the Eagles' losses were by one run, each of which was unearned...Sophomore RF Robert Dittrich is hitting .420 for the season after going 5-for-12 (.417) at Murray State...Junior Adrian Duran tossed his fourth complete game of the season in Saturday's 4-2, Game 2 victory. He gave up two runs over seven hits with seven strikeouts...Senior C Matt Morris drove in six runs in the series, homering twice and slapping a double...The Eagles nearly pulled out a win in Game 3, rallying from a 6-0 deficit with a 10-run eighth inning before giving up five runs to the 'Breds in the ninth for the 11-10 loss...Morehead State travels to Kentucky before returning home to host an OVC series against Jacksonville State.

MURRAY STATE (10-24, 4-8 OVC): Murray State won its first OVC series of the season by taking two of three from Morehead State. The Thoroughbreds also dropped an 11-5 non-conference decision at Southern Illinois...Freshman CF/P Tyler Pittman gave up four hits with eight strikeouts in seven scoreless innings on Sunday. Despite leaving with a 6-0 lead, he didn't get the decision, as the 'Breds had to rally for the 11-10 victory...Pittman also batted .417 (5-for-12) with four RBI and five runs in the series...Sophomore C Bo Baxter snapped an 0-for-32 slide at the plate with a single in the sixth inning of Sunday's contest...Junior 1B Josh **Foreman** cranked his first home run of the season on Sunday, a two-run blast in the first inning. He finished with four RBI in the series...Senior RF Scotty Scott went 4-for-10 against Morehead, collecting three runs and two RBI...The 'Breds hit .320 as a team against the Eagles...Junior 3B Clint Griggs plated five runs over the weekend...An Apr. 20 contest at Western Kentucky has been cancelled, so the 'Breds are off until their OVC series at Tennessee Tech.

SAMFORD (6-25, 1-11 OVC): Samford lost both ends of an OVC double-header to Eastern Illinois, but avoided its fourth straight league sweep with a 12-5 victory over the Panthers in Game 3. The win snapped an OVC-opening, 11-game slide for the Bulldogs. Samford also halted an overall nine-game losing streak earlier in the week, defeating cross-town rival Birmingham-Southern, 9-7, in a 14-inning affair...Freshman IF/P Parker Gargis smacked his first collegiate homer and finished the week with five RBI. At BSC, Gargis drove in the game-winning run and worked the final inning on the mound for the save...Freshman RHP Joseph Edens went 1-0 with a 5.62 ERA last week. He started Game 3, striking out seven batters without a walk while giving up five runs on 11 hits in eight innings...The Bulldogs will host BSC in a makeup game and travel to Alabama before making the trek to Eastern Kentucky for OVC action.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (17-18, 7-5 OVC): Southeast Missouri went 1-3 last week, dropping a 6-4 non-conference decision at Saint Louis and losing two of three in OVC action against Austin Peay...Junior 1B Freddy Lopez batted .600 (9-for-15) for the week, and was a triple shy of hitting for the cycle on Sunday. He has registered two or more hits in each of his last five outings...Lopez and junior SS Ernie Bracamonte each homered in Sunday's 9-7 victory over the Govs, while junior Eric Horstman and freshman Brent Lawson extended their hitting streaks to 11 and six games, respectively...Senior closer Brad Smith recorded his sixth save of the season on Sunday, while starter Derek Herbig picked up the victory to even his record at 3-3...The Indians host Southern Illinois, then travel to Eastern Illinois for an OVC series.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (12-21, 5-7 OVC): Tennessee-Martin staged a lopsided 14-4 non-conference win over Saint Louis, then won its second OVC series of the season by taking two of three from Tennessee Tech in a slugfest of a series that saw the two teams combine for 60 runs...Senior 2B Bryant Jones hit .524 in the four games, registering three doubles, a triple and a home run among his 11 hits. He racked up 19 total bases, driving in six runs and scoring six times in the process...The Skyhawks batted .383 as a team for the week while outscoring their opponents, 47-31, as all but one starter hit above .300 in the four contests...UTM hit five home runs last week, one-fourth of their season tally of 20...Freshman hurler Ben Meador was credited with the win in Game 1 on Saturday, upping his record to 4-2, while sophomore LHP Micky Dobson tossed his first complete game and earned his first win of the season in the nightcap...The Skyhawks visit Lipscomb and host Mississippi Valley State before traveling to Austin Peay for Conference play.

TENNESSEE TECH (11-15, 7-5 OVC): Tennessee Tech salvaged its OVC series at Tennessee-Martin, posting a 12-8 victory in Sunday's finale... Junior C Britt Clubb registered two doubles and a home run as part of a 7-for-10 effort at the plate during the series. He posted slugging and onbase percentages of 1.200 and .750, respectively...The Golden Eagles smacked six homers over the weekend, the most in any weekend series for Tech this year...Justin Showalter's grand slam on Sunday broke a 6-6 tie en route to the four-run victory...Brandon Selvog and Nathan Marty hit back-to-back dingers in the 5-4, Game 2 loss on Saturday, marking the third time this season Tech had recorded consecutive home runs...Selvog extended his hitting streak to 10 games...The Golden Eagles batted .324 as a team, with five players hitting .400 or better...Tech is home for all five of its contests this week as non-conference foes Belmont and Tennessee pay visits before the Golden Eagles take on Murray State in OVC action.
