OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

AUSTIN STEIN • OF, JR. • LaPLACE, LA • JACKSONVILLE STATE

Stein batted .600 in four outings last week, collecting 10 RBI and six runs as Jacksonville State picked up a pair of Conference wins on the road. A native of LaPlace, La., Stein registered two homers each in Games 1 and 3 of the Gamecocks' OVC series at Morehead State, finishing with six extra-base hits and two walks for the week while recording slugging and on-base percentages of 1.600 and .647, respectively. The junior rightfielder also starred defensively, recording 11 putouts and one assist without an error.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK:

STEPHEN ARTZ • RHP, SO. • STONE MOUNTAIN, GA • SAMFORD

Artz earned two wins and a save in three appearances last week as Samford posted a 4-1 record. The sophomore righthander opened with a five-inning start at Alabama, giving up two runs on four hits while earning the win. He then came on in relief in Game 1 of the Bulldogs' series at Eastern Kentucky, surrendering just one hit over the final 1.2 innings for his first save of the season. He helped Samford complete the three-game sweep at EKU on Sunday, giving up two runs on six hits while fanning nine batters in 8.1 innings. In two outings versus the Colonels, Artz held the league's top offensive team to a .206 batting average. For the week, Artz allowed four runs on 11 hits, striking out 15 batters and walking three in 15.0 frames of work on the hill.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (25-13 OVERALL, 12-3 OVC): League-leading Austin Peay swept its third OVC foe of the season with a trio of wins versus Tennessee-Martin over the weekend...Senior LF Alfredo Burkeen stretched his hitting streak to eight games, batting .563 for the week while scoring six times and going 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts. Six of his nine hits went for extra bases to give him a 1.125 slugging percentage...Senior RHP Jeff Mault tossed the first nine-inning complete game of his career in Sunday's 13-1 victory over UTM, scattering seven hits while walking one batter and striking out four. He has thrown three complete games this season and boasts a 9-3 record... After being limited to just three hits in a midweek, 6-1 loss to Middle Tennessee, the Govs exploded for 49 runs on 57 hits in their three-game series with the Skyhawks...Since being shut out on Apr. 9 by Tennessee Tech, APSU has recorded 10 or more hits in seven consecutive OVC outings, averaging 11.4 runs and 15.3 hits per game during that span...Twelve Govs registered at least one RBI over the weekend, including three (Chris Poynter, Matt Ledbetter and Jared Walker) who drove in five runs each...APSU was a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts for the week...The Govs' pitching staff posted a 3-1 record with a 2.18 ERA, allowing just 3.5 runs per nine innings...Junior LHP Rowdy Hardy picked up his seventh win of the season in the 23-2, Game 1 victory over UTM, while sophomore RHP Shawn Kelley made his first conference start and pitched his first career complete game for the 13-4 win in Game 2...APSU is on the road for all four games this week, visiting Belmont before heading up to Eastern Illinois for Conference action.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (16-21 OVERALL, 10-5 OVC): Eastern Illinois sits alone in second place for the first time in three weeks after winning two of three in its series with Southeast Missouri. The two teams endured a 3:33 rain delay on Saturday, forcing the second game of the series to be moved to Sunday...The Panthers also won a midweek 16-15 slugfest over Saint Louis...Senior SS Kyle Haines hit .400 for the week, including going 5for-11 (.455) in the SEMO series with six RBI and four runs...Freshman reliever Chris Vaculik went 2-0 with a save in three appearances last week. He pitched six innings of shutout ball in the SEMO series to win one game and save another...Freshman 1B Kevin Carkeek's 13-game hitting streak came to an end on Sunday...Freshman 3B Ryan Campbell hit .529 last week. He rapped out his 19th double of the season and is tied for fourth on the school's Top 10 list, four back of the record. Campbell also hit his team-leading sixth home run on Sunday...Sophomore OF Paul Dean rapped a pinch-hit, game-tying double in the seventh inning of Sunday's first game and stayed in to hit the game-winning single in the ninth. Junior LHP Ted Juske allowed just two earned runs in 5.2 innings in the contest but did not figure in the decision...Freshman OF Mark Chagnon hit .462 last week, scoring six runs...Junior RHP Kyle Widegren won his fifth straight decision, earning a 6-5 victory in the series opener... The Panthers play a pair of in-state opponents, hosting Illinois and traveling to Illinois State, before entertaining Austin Peay in league play.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (25-9, OVERALL, 8-7 OVC): Eastern Kentucky dismantled Xavier, 19-4, in non-conference action but got swept for the first time this year in OVC play, dropping a season-high three straight games to Samford...Sophomore DH Brett Bolger led the Colonels with a .533 batting average last week, going 8-for-15 with three RBI and two stolen bases. His twin brother, Keith, went 3-for-4 in two games with an RBI...Senior 2B Jonathan Woodard and senior 3B Neil Sellers are the only two Colonels to have played in all 34 games thus far in 2004...Three of EKU's four homers against Xavier were three-run shots, including freshman OF Shawn Flora's first career dinger...The Colonels, who entered the week ranked first in the country with a .395 team batting average, hit just .253 in the Samford series. Through games of Apr. 18, four EKU players (Chris O'Dell, Stephen Carter, Woodard and Chris Clark) were ranked among national leaders in batting average...Tied for fifth in the league, the Colonels host a pair of in-state opponents, Kentucky State and Louisville, then hit the road for an OVC series at Southeast Missouri.

2004 OVC BASEBALL NOTES

JACKSONVILLE STATE (17-21, 9-6 OVC): Jacksonville State is tied for third after going 2-1 in its OVC series at Morehead State. Earlier in the week, the Gamecocks dropped a 5-2 decision to Troy State...Junior OF Austin Stein batted .600 and drove in 10 runs for the week, finishing with six extra-base hits, including four homers, for a 1.600 slugging percentage. He also had two walks and an on-base percentage of .647 while extending his hitting streak to five games. Senior RHP Bobby Wynns pitched a complete-game shutout in Jax State's 2-0, Game 2 win at Morehead State, scattering five hits over seven innings while walking one batter and fanning five....Senior C Bobby Hicks has a team-high eightgame hitting streak. He also leads the Gamecocks with eight multi-RBI games this season...Sophomore OF Jason Horn went 7-for-14 last week, while senior C Scott Smith batted .462 (6-for-13)...Jax State plays host to Tennessee Tech in OVC action this weekend.

MOREHEAD STATE (11-24, 5-10 OVC): Morehead State is in a threeway tie for seventh place after dropping two of three in its OVC series with Jacksonville State...Junior 2B Lance Seasor, who has been battling nagging injuries for much of the season, had a career day in the Eagles' 17-10 victory on Sunday, belting a trio of three-run homers and falling one short of the school RBI record of 10. He batted .417 for the series with 10 RBI and three runs scored, finishing with a 1.167 slugging percentage...Junior RHP Adrian Duran made two appearances over the weekend. He was the tough-luck loser in Saturday's 2-0 shutout, allowing only one earned run while working all seven innings. On Sunday, he came back to retire all six batters he faced to close out the Eagles' victory...Freshman C Donald Cheney was 4-for-6 at the plate with two home runs in Saturday's doubleheader...Junior CF Travis Rima and sophomore RF Robert Dittrich are riding 10- and nine-game hitting streaks, respectively...The Eagles host Marshall for a twinbill, then kick off a five-game road trip with visits to Kentucky and OVC foe Samford.

MURRAY STATE (11-26, 5-10 OVC): Murray State is tied for seventh after going 1-2 in its OVC series at Tennessee Tech...Freshman LF Austin Swain led the 'Breds offense with a 4-for-7 (.571) effort at the plate, driving in four runs and scoring two more while posting a 1.286 slugging percentage. He was a double shy of hitting for the cycle in Murray State's 7-3, Game 2 victory, belting the first home run of his life...Freshman LHP Tyler Pittman allowed eight hits while giving up just one earned run among seven in a 5.1-inning start on Sunday, but didn't figure in the loss. He also went 4-for-5 at the plate, scoring twice and driving in two runs...Junior 3B Clint Griggs hit .385 with five runs, five RBI, two doubles and a homer, while junior 1B Josh Foreman also hit .385 with two runs, three RBI and a double...The 'Breds batted .318 at Tech, belting five home runs while posting a .564 slugging percentage... Murray State's defense committed 11 errors in the three games, accounting for 15 unearned runs for the 'Breds pitching staff, which posted a 6.26 ERA...Sophomore RHP Billy Fares led the group with five strikeouts in six innings as the staff fanned 17 overall while also issuing seven walks...The 'Breds visit nationally-ranked Mississippi on Wednesday before returning home to host UT Martin.

SAMFORD (10-26, 4-11 OVC): Samford posted its first OVC series win with a three-game sweep at Eastern Kentucky. The Bulldogs also split a pair of non-conference meetings against in-state opponents, losing to Birmingham-Southern (10-3) and defeating Alabama (10-5)...Sophomore OF Justin Worthington batted .353 for the week, including driving in the winning runs in both ends of Samford's twinbill sweep at EKU on Saturday...Sophomore RHP Stephen Artz earned two wins and a save in three appearances last week, giving up four runs on 11 hits while striking out 15 batters in 15.0 innings. After holding 'Bama to two runs on four hits, he limited the league's top offensive team to a .206 batting average while picking up a win and a save in the series at EKU...The Bulldogs' four-game win streak is their longest of the season. Samford has also won its last four Conference outings after dropping 11 straight to open league play...The 10th-place Bulldogs kick off a seven-game homestand against Auburn, Alabama A&M and OVC foe Morehead State.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (18-21, 8-7 OVC): Southeast Missouri slipped into a two-way tie for fifth place in the OVC standings following a 1-2 Conference outing at Eastern Illinois. The Indians also dropped a 9-6 decision to Southern Illinois...Junior SS Ernie Bracamonte is riding a six-game hitting streak after going 8-for-18 (.444) with five runs batted in last week. He leads Southeast in multi-hit (18) and multi-RBI (10) games, ranking among league RBI leaders with 35...Junior RHP Anthony Maupin posted the team's only win, going the distance in the second game of Sunday's doubleheader for his second complete game in OVC action this season. Maupin gave up three runs off seven hits while walking four batters and striking out five in seven innings. He leads the Indians with five wins...Southeast entertains Eastern Kentucky in OVC action.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (12-25, 5-10 OVC): Tennessee-Martin is caught in a five-game slide after suffering a tough 7-6 setback at Lipscomb and losing all three OVC games at Austin Peay...After hitting .383 a week earlier, the Skyhawks managed just a .241 batting effort while getting outscored, 56-13, in the four losses...Senior 2B Bryant Jones had a solid week at the plate, going 7-for-16 with a double and two RBI for a .438 average...Sophomore RHP Justin Bryant (2-6, 9.36 ERA) missed his turn in the rotation for the second week because of a hand injury...Tied for the seventh in the Conference standings, UT Martin is on the road for five games, starting with a doubleheader at Mississippi Valley State and ending with a three-game set at OVC rival Murray State.

TENNESSEE TECH (13-18, 9-6 OVC): Tennessee Tech is tied for third after winning two of three in its OVC series with Murray State over the weekend. The Golden Eagles also dropped a pair of midweek contests to Belmont (24-5) and nationally-ranked Tennessee (10-1)...Sophomore 2B **Kenny Stiles** went 4-for-4 with five RBI in the opener of the Murray State series, finishing with a .400 batting average, nine RBI, three runs and a double for the week...Junior OF **J.D. Druckenmiller** recorded his second grand slam of the season when he launched one over the right field wall during Sunday's 17-11 victory. The Golden Eagles have registered three grannies this season, the most in a single campaign since 1977...Tech rapped out 22 hits in the opener of Saturday's twinbill, the Golden Eagles' second 20+ hit outing of the season and the most against any OVC opponent in 2004...Tech has belted at least one home run in six straight league contests...The Golden Eagles kick off a six-game road swing with dates at Western Carolina, Appalachian State and OVC foe Jacksonville State.
