Griggs went 7-for-15 (.467) at the plate as Murray State posted a 3-1 mark last week, including a three-game sweep of OVC foe Tennessee-Martin. The junior third baseman had at least one hit in each of the four games, finishing with two doubles, three RBI and five runs scored.

Hicks batted .538 (7-for-13) and scored six times in Jacksonville State's three-game sweep of OVC opponent Tennessee Tech. The senior infielder drove in four runs while recording four extra-base raps for a 1.077 slugging percentage.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (28-14 OVERALL, 14-4 OVC): League-leading Austin Peay ran its winning streak to a season-high six games before falling in its OVC series finale at Eastern Illinois...Prior to Sunday's loss, the Govs were 15 games above .500, their best mark this season...Wednesday's 7-6 victory at Belmont snapped a four-game non-conference skid for the Govs...Senior RHP Jeff Mault tossed his fourth complete game of the year and became the Conference's first 10-game winner in 2004 with a six-hit effort in game two at EIU...Junior LHP Rowdy Hardy notched his eighth win of the season, scattering 10 Panther hits over 8.0 innings with eight K's...Senior OF Alfredo Burkeen has hit a home run in three of his last four games. He went 4-for-8 last week with a double and two homers before missing the final two games of the EIU series due to a leg injury...Junior 1B Chris Hyde drove in four runs in the game one win at EIU, finishing the week 6for-13 at the plate with seven RBI...The Govs rapped out 12 extra-base hits during the week (6 2B and 6 HR)...APSU is ranked second in the league in hitting (.311), on-base (.392) and slugging (.461) percentages, despite having only one player, junior 3B Jared Walker (.373 BA) listed among the Top 10 in any of those categories...The Govs are home for the next five games, entertaining Belmont, Memphis and OVC foe Murray State.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (18-24 OVERALL, 11-7 OVC): Eastern Illinois slipped into third place in the Conference standings following its 1-2 effort versus Austin Peay...The Panthers also split a pair of meetings against instate rivals with a 13-3 loss to Illinois and an 8-7 win over Illinois State, snapping a nine-game losing streak to the Redbirds...Junior OF David Chacon batted .700 with three runs and two RBI against APSU, opening the series with a 7-for-7 effort at the plate...Junior LHP Jason Pinnell made the most of his first career OVC start, tossing the program's first complete-game shutout in four years as he held APSU to five hits in Sunday's 7-0 victory...Junior LHP Ted Juske allowed only three Govs hits in the first four innings of game two, but suffered the loss...Freshman 1B/ OF Kevin Carkeek hit .444 last week, scoring two runs and driving in three, while sophomore OF Paul Dean batted .412 with three doubles, a triple and a home run, collecting three runs and eight RBI...EIU nearly pulled off a come-from-behind win in game one on Saturday, scoring five runs in the bottom of the ninth and bringing the tying run to plate before taking the 10-8 loss...The Panthers travel to Eastern Kentucky for OVC action on Saturday and Sunday.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (28-9, OVERALL, 10-7 OVC): Eastern Kentucky moved up a spot in the OVC standings, climbing into fourth place with a two-game sweep of Southeast Missouri. The third game of the series was lost due to inclement weather. EKU also snapped a season-high threegame skid with a 9-6 midweek victory over Louisville...Junior CF Derrick Bussell batted .667 over the three-game span, scoring four runs and stealing two bases...Junior LHP Dan Bachman (4-1) and freshman RHP Chris Grider (7-2) tossed back-to-back complete games in Sunday's twinbill sweep at Southeast. Grider's seven-inning effort was his third complete game of the season as he held Southeast to three hits while facing one batter over the minimum, striking out six and walking two over seven innings in the 3-0 shutout. He is holding opponents to a league-low .227 batting average while sporting the OVC's best ERA at 1.94...Senior C Chris Clark batted .714 with a double and an RBI for the week. Clark has hit a team-high 17 two-baggers this season and leads the league with 0.5 per game...Sophomore IF/OF Chris O'Dell belted three homers and drove in six over the three-game span. He has a team-high 11 dingers on the season and tops the OVC in home run average (0.35 pg), runs scored (1.32 pg), total bases (2.97 pg) and slugging percentage (.780)...Senior 3B **Neil Sellers** drove in five runs, giving him a league-best 51 (1.38 pg) for the year...The Colonels play host to OVC foe Eastern Illinois.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (20-21, 12-6 OVC): Jacksonville State gained a game on league-leader Austin Peay, climbing into second place with a three-game sweep of Tennessee Tech. The Gamecocks have won six of

their last seven OVC contests...Senior 3B/2B Bobby Hicks batted .538 with four RBI and six runs for the series, posting a 1.077 slugging percentage while hitting two doubles, one triple and a home run. Hicks, who hit .172 in the month of Feburary, finished with a .407 average for the month of April.. Senior RHP Bobby Wynns tossed his second straight complete game and recorded a career-high 12 strikeouts without a walk in leading JSU to the 7-1, game two win. He has given up just two earned runs in his last 21.0 innings of work, posting a 0.86 ERA with 26 K's and a walk during that span...Senior Robby Goodson struck out the side and then hit a walk-off homer to lift JSU to Sunday's 7-6 victory. Goodson, who leads the league with 12 home runs, has hit two game-winning dingers this season...Four JSU players are batting better than .400 over the last 10 games, including junior OF Winston Pearson (.439), senior C Scott Smith (.424), sophomore OF Jason Horn and junior OF Austin Stein (.405)...Senior RHP C.R. Palmer struck out seven without giving up an earned run in an 11-4 decision on Saturday...The Gamecocks' midweek meeting with OVC rival Samford will not count in the league standings. Jax State also travels to Tennessee-Martin for a Conference series.

MOREHEAD STATE (12-29, 5-13 OVC): Morehead State fell into a two-way tie for ninth place after losing all three of its OVC meetings at Samford. The Eagles, who also split a twinbill with Marshall and got shut out at Kentucky, are on a four-game slide....Morehead State out-hit Samford in every game and 29-20 for the series, but stranded 27 runners compared to only 13 for the Bulldogs...Senior LHP Luke Lockwood, making his first start since 2001, pitched a seven-inning shutout against Marshall in the Eagles' 6-0 win in game two of Tuesday's doubleheader...Junior OF Jesse Howell's first collegiate home run was a grand slam against the Thundering Herd...Tuesday's game between the Eagles and Cincinnati has been moved from Queen City to Morehead's Allen Field. The Eagles also host Southeast Missouri in OVC action.

MURRAY STATE (14-27, 8-10 OVC): Murray State climbed into seventh place and tied a season-high win streak with a three-game sweep of Tennessee-Martin in OVC action over the weekend, including a 5-4, 10-inning victory in game two that spanned two days. The Thoroughreds also dropped a close 2-1 decision to nationally-ranked Mississippi earlier in the week... Junior 3B Clint Griggs led the 'Breds with a .467 batting average, including going 6-for-11 in the UTM series. He scored a team-high five runs with two doubles and three RBI versus the Skyhawks...Sophomore LHP West Harris came on in relief with Murray State trailing 4-3 in the fifth inning of game two versus UTM, allowing no runs on three hits while striking out a season-high nine in 6.0 innings of work to pick up the victory... Junior RHP Craig Kraus held the Skyhawks to three hits over 4.2 innings to aide Murray State's 9-5 comeback win in game one on Saturday...Freshman CF/LHP Tyler Pittman scored a team-high five runs against UTM, while he and junior 1B Josh Foreman tied for a team-high four RBI each in the series. Pittman also collected the complete-game win in the series finale, allowing three runs (one earned) in seven innings... Thirteen of Murray State's 18 runs against the Skyhawks were scored with two outs...Senior RHP Bart Peach went the distance in the loss to Ole Miss, retiring 23 of the last 27 batters after giving up two first-inning runs...The Breds travel to Austin Peay for Conference play.

SAMFORD (15-27, 7-11 OVC): Samford had a four-game win streak snapped earlier in the week with a 6-2 loss to Auburn, but is enjoying a season-high five-game run after winning two over Alabama A&M and sweeping its OVC series with Morehead State. After opening Conference play 0-11, the Bulldogs have won seven straight league tilts with back-to-back series sweeps, moving them into eighth place in the OVC standings... Sophomore OF Justin Worthington batted .462 (6-for-13) in five games...Sophomore RHP Stephen Artz played a role in all three Bulldog victories over the weekend, earning back-to-back saves in Saturday's twinbill while picking up the win on Sunday. He worked 8.0 innings, posting a 3.38 ERA while striking out 10 batters and holding the Eagles to a .267 hitting average...Prior to their OVC series at Tennessee Tech, the Bulldogs host league rival Jacksonville State in a non-conference affair.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (18-23, 8-9 OVC): Southeast Missouri remained in sixth place after dropping a pair to Eastern Kentucky on Sunday. Saturday's action was rained out, forcing the cancellation of the series' third game...Junior 2B **Bo Jenkins**, one of only six Indians to get a hit in the series, belted a two-run homer in game one...The Indians host Evansville in a midweek contest, then travel to OVC foe Morehead State.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (14-28, 5-13 OVC): Tennessee-Martin ended a five-game slide by taking a twinbill from Mississippi Valley State, but tumbled into a tie for ninth place in the OVC standings after getting swept by Murray State over the weekend...Two of the Skyhawks' three losses at Murray were one-run affairs as UTM forced the 'Breds to come from behind in all three contests...Senior 2B Bryant Jones hit .455 (10-of-22) with six RBI last week. With 80 hits thus far in 2004, Jones has established new Skyhawk records for single-season and career hits (currently at 202)...Junior RHP Dustin Summers made three appearances last week, posting a 3.18 ERA with a save. Summers has made 23 outings this season, two shy of tying his school-record 25 from a year ago, and also sits nine short of equaling the UTM career record of 70...The Skyhawks kick off a five-game homestand this week against Arkansas State and OVC opponent Jacksonville State.

TENNESSEE TECH (13-23, 9-9 OVC): Tennessee Tech finds itself on a five-game slide and in fifth place in the OVC standings after going 0-5 last week with losses at Western Carolina, Appalachian State and Jackson-ville State...Junior C **Britt Clubb** hit .375 for the week, going 6-for-16 with four runs...Junior 2B **Brandon Selvog** belted his team-leading sixth home run of the season at Jax State...Selvog and Clubb continue to vie for the squad's top hitting average, batting .351 and .348, respectively....Freshman OF **Justin Showalter** boasts a perfect fielding record for the Golden Eagles, going errorless in 29 putout attempts while starting 30 of 33 games this season...Tech visits East Tennessee State before returning home to entertain Samford in OVC action.

OVC NOTES: The non-conference schedule is light over the next few days as several OVC teams are taking the week off to concentrate on final exams....Despite a wet spring, Mother Nature has been kind to the Conference schedule, with only one contest out of 90 being lost to weather thus far...Three weeks remain on the OVC regular-season calendar as the teams vie for spots in the six-team field at the 2004 OVC Tournament, set for May 26-29 at Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky.
