### OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

BOBBY HICKS • 3B/2B, SR. • KEYSTONE HEIGHTS, FL • JACKSONVILLE ST.

**Hicks** paced Jacksonville State's offense with a blistering .700 hitting average as the Gamecocks posted a 3-1 record last week. Batting leadoff, the senior infielder recorded multi-hit outings in all four games, rapping two doubles and two home runs for a slugging percentage of 1.100 and 22 total bases. In an OVC series at Tennessee-Martin, Hicks batted .688, including a 5-for-6, four-run effort in Sunday's loss to the Skyhawks. For the week, Hicks made 22 plate appearances without a strikeout, posting a .682 on-base percentage while tallying 14 hits, 10 runs and five RBI.

#### **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:**

ROWDY HARDY • LHP, SO. • BETHEL SPRINGS, TN • AUSTIN PEAY

Hardy picked up two victories last week -- one in relief and one as a starter -- to become the league's second 10-game winner of the 2004 campaign. He worked a scoreless inning of relief and was the pitcher of record in Austin Peay's come-from-behind win over Memphis, then went the distance for a 5-1 triumph in Game 1 of the Murray State series. The sophomore lefthander allowed one unearned 'Breds run on six hits while striking out eight batters in nine innings for his fourth complete game of the season. For the week, he pitched 10.0 frames with a 0.00 ERA, giving up seven hits and a walk while fanning nine batters.

### AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (32-15 OVERALL, 17-4 OVC): League-leading Austin Peay set a new school record for conference victories (17) after sweeping Murray State over the weekend. The Govs also split a pair of non-conference contests, dropping a 5-4 decision to Belmont before defeating Memphis, 13-10...Junior DH Chris Poynter went 9-for-11 with seven RBI in the Murray State series. He finished with a .616 average for the week, striking out only once in 20 plate appearances for a .632 on-base percentage. Poynter, who missed the 2003 campaign due to a back injury, is batting a team-high .545 with 22 RBI in Conference play this season...Senior RHP Jeff Mault tied a school record with his 11th win of the season and set a new APSU mark with his 13th career save. He is the first OVC pitcher, and sixth nationally, to reach 10 wins this season...Sophomore LHP Rowdy Hardy joined Mault in the 10-win category with a pair of victories last week, including a complete-game triumph in Saturday's opener against Murray State. He held the 'Breds to one unearned run on six hits with eight K's in the contest...Mault and Hardy are the second APSU duo to record 10-win seasons...Junior 1B Chris Hyde ran his hitting streak to a team-best 16 games before going 0-for-3 on Sunday. He batted .397 with 16 RBI and eight walks during the 16-game span...The Govs take the week off to concentrate on final exams before heading to Eastern Kentucky for OVC play.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (20-25 OVERALL, 13-8 OVC): Eastern Illinois held on to its third-place spot with a 2-1 effort at Eastern Kentucky over the weekend...Five of senior SS Kyle Haines' eight hits over the weekend went for extra bases, including two home runs in the series finale for his third career multi-HR outing. He finished the series batting .533 with eight RBI and four runs, posting a 1.267 slugging percentage in the process. ...Freshman reliever Chris Vaculik earned two saves, holding EKU to just one run off five hits in 5.0 innings pitched. He has six saves this season, tying him for sixth on the school's single-season chart and eighth on its all-time list...Senior OF Marcus Jackson batted .583 with three RBI and five runs, while freshman OF Mark Chagnon, freshman C Joe Hernandez and senior 2B Chris Uhle all hit .500...Freshman 1B/OF Kevin Carkeek finished 3-for-5 with four runs and two doubles...Uble moved into ties for seventh and 10th, respectively, on EIU's career doubles (38) and hits (183) list...Senior RHP Jared Marshall allowed just two runs on five hits in six innings of relief work in the game one loss, equaling his longest outing this year...EIU rapped out 16 doubles while hitting .400 as a team over the weekend...The Panthers, 5-1 against in-state rivals this season, take on two more this week, traveling to Western Illinois and Bradley before returning home to entertain Morehead State in OVC play.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (29-11, OVERALL, 11-9 OVC): Eastern Kentucky is tied for fourth after dropping two of three versus Eastern Illinois over the the weekend...Senior 2B Jonathan Woodard went 6-for-11 (.545) with four RBI in the series, posting multi-hit efforts in all three games. ...Sophomore IF/OF Chris O'Dell and senior 3B Neil Sellers each homered twice during the weekend...Senior OF Stephen Carter went 7-for-13 (.538) with two doubles, two runs and an RBI...Junior reliever Richard Boothe earned his team-high fifth save in Saturday's 8-7, game one victory...Through games of May 2, EKU boasts the nation's top team batting average at .385, with five Colonels (Carter, Woodard, O'Dell, senior C Chris Clark and sophomore IF/OF Brett Bolger) ranking among the individual hitting leaders. The Colonel pitching staff struggled on the mound, walking 21 batters during the series...EKU visits Marshall before playing host to in-state rival Western Kentucky and OVC opponent Austin Peay.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (23-22, 14-7 OVC): Jacksonville State went 3-1 last week, winning a non-OVC meeting with fellow Conference member Samford and taking two of three at Tennessee-Martin. Winners of eight of their last 10 league tilts, the Gamecocks had their season-high six-game win streak snapped in Sunday's 21-16 loss to the Skyhawks...Senior 3B/2B Bobby Hicks batted .700 for the week, going 14-for-20 with four extrabase hits, 10 runs and five RBI. He has hit .532 over the last 10 games,

rapping 10 extra-base hits for a .936 slugging percentage during that span...Senior RHP **C.R. Palmer** has a team-best 8-3 record thus far...Five Gamecocks are batting better than .350 in league play, led by Hicks (.449). Also in the quintet is junior OF **Austin Stein** (.421), senior 1B/C **Danny Civello** (.370), senior C **Scott Smith** (.357) and sophomore OF **Jason Horn** (.356)...Senior RHP **Bobby Wynns** has allowed just four earned runs over his last 25.0 innings pitched for an 1.44 ERA with 30 strikeouts and five walks...Four JSU players are riding hit streaks of five games or better, including junior OF **Winston Pearson** (8), freshman SS/2B **Cory Tucker** (6), Stein (5) and Smith (5)...Junior 1B **Brian Haskins** slugged his first career grand slam and also had a three-run shot in Sunday's loss at UTM...After hitting 11 home runs last week, Jax State has 53 dingers for the season, the most since hitting 49 in 2000...Second-place JSU hosts in-state rival UAB, then entertains Murray State in Conference action.

MOREHEAD STATE (12-33, 5-16 OVC): Tenth-place Morehead State saw its losing skid stretch to eight games after losing one to Cincinnati and a three-game OVC set to Southeast Missouri...Junior RHP Adrian Duran has been a workhorse for the Eagle pitching staff, completing all seven of his Conference starts and making one relief appearance. Run support has been hard to come by though, as the Eagle offense has provided only two runs in 22 innings over Duran's last three starts...Junior 2B Lance Seasor is almost back to 100 percent after having been plagued with a rash of minor injuries this season. He went 6-for-12 with two home runs in the SEMO series, finishing the week with a .412 average and three dingers...The Eagles are on the road this week, playing a two-game series at Kansas State before visiting Eastern Illinois for a three-game OVC set.

MURRAY STATE (14-30, 8-13 OVC): Murray State lost all three at Austin Peay over the weekend, including a pair of tough one-run decisions in back-to-back outings...Freshman CF/RHP Tyler Pittman went 4-for-10 at APSU with two home runs, five RBI and five runs scored, posting slugging and on-base percentages of 1.000 and .462, respectively...Senior RHP Bart Peach was tagged with Sunday's loss, despite holding the Govs to a .250 team batting average. He gave up five runs on seven hits through eight innings of work...Freshman LF Austin Swain led the 'Breds with a .444 average over the weekend (4-for-9), reaching base at a .583 clip, while sophomore C Bo Baxter hit .429 (3-for-7)...The Murray State defense went errorless in the three-game set at APSU, compared to five miscues for the Govs...After playing a two-game series at Illinois State, the eighth-place 'Breds travel to Jacksonville State for a key OVC set.

SAMFORD (18-28, 10-11 OVC): Samford continues to climb its way back into postseason contention, sweeping its third straight OVC opponent with a trio of wins over Tennessee Tech. The Bulldogs also dropped a 9-4 decision to Jacksonville State in a non-OVC meeting...Senior C Eric Hollis hit a grand slam in the second half of Saturday's twinbill at Tech and finished the week batting .474 (9-for-19) with three doubles, a home run and 11 RBI in four games...Senior RHP Karl Huch pitched all nine innings of Saturday's 7-2, game one win, giving up two runs on nine hits while striking out six batters and walking one...Sophomore 3B Trey Moody hit for the cycle in game two Saturday, finishing 5-for-5 with two singles, a double, a triple and a home run...After opening Conference play with 11 straight losses, Samford has won 10 consecutive league tilts and now sits in sixth place in the OVC standings. After a brief road trip to Vanderbilt, Samford hosts Tennessee-Martin in a three-game Conference series.

**SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (21-23, 11-9 OVC):** Southeast Missouri moved back above .500 in OVC action and into a fourth-place tie after sweeping road opponent Morehead State...Senior DH **Eric Hoffman** raised his batting average 43 points after going 7-for-14 in the series with slugging and on-base percentages of 1.357 and .533, respectively. He homered in all three games, finishing with four home runs, seven RBI, five runs scored and 19 total bases...Junior reliever **Brad Smith** closed out both ends of Saturday's doubleheader, recording saves in each outing. He has eight saves in 2004, tying a school single-season mark...Southeast scored 30

runs on 37 hits over the weekend while committing just one error...Indian skipper **Mark Hogan** recorded his 300th win at the helm of Southeast baseball, becoming just the second coach in school history to reach that milestone...The Indians are home this week, playing host to Arkansas State and OVC foe Tennesseee Tech.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (15-31, 6-15 OVC): Tennessee-Martin exploded for 21 hits on Sunday to salvage its OVC series against Jacksonville State with a 21-16 victory. Prior to Sunday's victory, the Skyhawks had lost six straight, including two to JSU and a 19-2 loss to Arkansas State earlier in the week...The Skyhawks averaged 13.5 hits per game for the week...Senior 2B Bryant Jones is among national leaders with a .444 batting average. He went 4-for-5 in game two of the JSU series and leads the team with 88 hits this season...Junior RHP Dustin Summers tied his own school record for single-season appearances with 25. He ranks second all-time at UTM with 63 career appearances, seven short of the Skyhawk record...Senior OF Adam Salter was a perfect 5-for-5 in the series finale, falling a triple shy of hitting for the cycle. He finished the week with a .444 batting average...The ninth-place Skyhawks host Lipscomb, then hit the road for an OVC set at Samford.

**TENNESSEE TECH (14-26, 9-12 OVC):** Tennessee Tech snapped a fivegame slide with a 10-8 non-conference win over East Tennessee State, but dropped all three of its OVC meetings with Samford to slip to seventh place in the Conference standings...Junior 3B **Philip Hatch** batted 7-for-17 (.467) in the four games, belting one home run and scoring five runs...Sophomore **Josh Eye** also homered against the Bulldogs. He currently boasts the team's longest hitting streak at eight games...Ten different Golden Eagles have hit home runs this season with junior 2B **Brandon Selvog** and junior OF **J.D. Druckenmiller** tying for a team-high six each...Sophomore 1B **Brent Bilodeau** batted .455 with five hits, including one dinger...Tech visits Southeast Missouri for a three-game OVC series.
