

#### FRANKIE MONTIEL • OF, JR. • GUADALUPE, AZ • SE MISSOURI

**Montiel** batted .600, going 9-for-15 at the plate to help Southeast Missouri to a 3-1 record last week. The junior outfielder recorded three-multi-hit outings, including a 4-for-4 effort against Arkansas State, and roped four doubles on the week to collect 13 total bases. He went errorless in eight putout attempts and finished the week with four RBI and one run scored without striking out in 15 at-bats.

#### MICHAEL COLLINS • 2B, SR. • HOMEWOOD, AL • SAMFORD

**Collins** registered two hits in each of his three outings for a .600 batting average as Samford posted a 3-1 record last week. The Homewood, Ala., native finished with six runs, three RBI and no strikeouts in 10 atbats, collecting 10 total bases while slugging 1.000. Defensively, the senior second baseman went errorless in 13 fielding opportunities.

## AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (33-17, 18-6 OVC): League-leader Austin Peay dropped two of three at Eastern Kentucky over the weekend, but the Govs' 2-1 win in game one on Saturday gives them at least a share of the 2004 OVC regular-season crown...The Govs, who entered the week batting .311, managed just 13 hits off EKU pitching to drop their average to .303...APSU was also limited to just six runs in the three games, despite averaging 6.5 runs per game prior to the series...Junior LHP Rowdy Hardy picked up his 11th victory, limiting the Colonels to one run on six hits in game one. Hardy, who a week ago became the eighth Division I pitcher to 10 wins in 2004, ties teammate Jeff Mault for the school record in single-season wins, a mark also held by former Gov hurler Mike Eikenberry (1996)...The APSU pitching staff limited the nation's top offense to just 14 runs over the series, well below the Colonels' average of 10.2 runs per game entering the weekend...The Govs close out the regular-season at home, hosting Evansville and Jacksonville State. APSU needs just one win in its three-game set with JSU to claim the OVC regular-season title outright.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (22-28, 15-9 OVC): Eastern Illinois moved into a tie for second place after winning two of three in its OVC series with Morehead State. Earlier in the week, the Panthers dropped a pair of close games at Bradley (10-7, 2-4)...Sophomore DH Paul Dean batted .545 last week, including a 4-for-7 effort against the Eagles. He finished with two doubles and a homer, driving in three runs and scoring three more...Junior LHP Ted Juske threw his first complete game of the year, striking out a careerand team season-high nine batters while allowing two runs on four hits with three walks...Senior 2B Chris Uhle hit .389 for the week, moving into fourth place on the school's career list for runs scored (154), eighth in hits (190), and seventh in both at-bats (621) and doubles (39)...Senior SS Kyle Haines rapped three doubles and drove in six runs...Sophomore OF Pete Stone drilled two home runs during the Morehead State finale for his second career multi-homer game...Junior RHP Kyle Widegren won his sixth straight decision, pitching the final 4.1 innings against the Eagles in game three...EIU honored six seniors between games on Saturday...The Panthers close out the regular season on the road, visiting in-state rival Chicago State and OVC opponent Tennessee Tech.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (31-14, 13-10 OVC): Eastern Kentucky took two of three from league-leading Austin Peay over the weekend and sits tied for fourth in the league standings. Earlier in the week, EKU was outscored 31-11 in a pair of non-Conference losses to Marshall and Western Kentucky...The Colonels' game two win versus APSU snapped a five-game skid...Senior LF Stephen Carter batted .421 for the week, driving in four runs and collected 10 total bases. Batting a team-high .459, he leads the Colonels with an 11-game hitting streak...Junior LHP Dan Bachman suffered the loss in game one of the APSU series, despite allowing just one earned run and one hit in 6.1 innings while holding the Govs to a .053 batting average...The Colonels honored seven seniors prior to Sunday's game (Carter, RHP Nick Adams, OF Greg Estep, RHP/C Chris Clark, 3B Neil Sellers, 2B Jonathan Woodard and RHP Brandon Scott)...EKU entertains Marshall in its home finale, then visits OVC rival Morehead State to wrap up its regular-season slate.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (25-24, 15-9 OVC): Jacksonville State fell into a two-way tie for second place after dropping two of three in its OVC series with Murray State over the weekend. The Gamecocks also won a 3-2 decision over UAB...Freshman LHP Tony Drinkard picked up the first two victories of his collegiate career with a 2-0 effort last week, allowing just one earned run for a 0.77 ERA in 11.2 innings. He recorded a careerhigh seven strikeouts in the game three victory over the 'Breds and gave up only two hits in five frames versus UAB...Senior 3B/2B Bobby Hicks continues to lead the team in hitting (.373), hits (75), doubles (16), triples (3) and total bases (124). He is currently tied for ninth and 14th on the school's single-season lists for triples and doubles, respectively...Freshman SS Jake Ball plated the first six runs of JSU's 9-2 win in the Murray State

finale. He finished the game 3-for-4, falling a double shy of hitting for the cycle...Senior RHP **C.R. Palmer** has moved into 11th place on JSU's career strikeout chart (190). He also ranks ninth all-time in career wins (18) and 10th in innings pitched (213.2)...The Gamecocks are hitting .441 with the bases loaded...In OVC play, Jax State is out-hitting opponents, .327 to .293, with 37 dingers to their foes' 17...JSU ends the regular season on the road, first at Troy State, then at league leader Austin Peay.

MOREHEAD STATE (13-37, 6-18 OVC): Morehead State snapped a 10game skid with an 11-7 win in game one of its OVC series at Eastern Illinois, but was eliminated from postseason contention after dropping the final two contests of the series...Earlier in the week, the Eagles were outscored 27-8 in a pair of setbacks at Kansas State...Junior RHP Adrian Duran has completed all eight of his Conference starts and ranks among the nation's leaders in complete games...Senior RHP Casey Campbell tossed 5.1 innings of scoreless ball last week, allowing only two hits and no walks with two strikeouts...Switch-hitting freshman C Donald Cheney is batting .356 with five doubles and six home runs in Conference play... Junior OF Travis Rima is the only Eagle to have played in all 50 games so far this season. He is batting .327 with only 23 strikeouts in 223 plate appearances...Sophomore utility player Robert Dittrich leads the team with a .372 hitting average... Tied for ninth in the OVC standings, the Eagles close out the 2004 campaign with a five-game homestand, entertaining Belmont for a pair and OVC rival Eastern Kentucky for a three-game set.

MURRAY STATE (16-32, 10-14 OVC): Murray State snapped a four-game slide with a doubleheader sweep of Jacksonville State. The 'Breds, who lost the series finale, also dropped a close 4-3 decision in 10 innings at Illinois State...Murray State's 3-0 shutout of Jax State in game two marked the first time this season the 'Breds had been involved in a shutout, either for or against...Senior RF Scotty Scott posted a .438 batting average with three RBI and a run scored....Sophomore RHP Billy Fares made the most of his last-minute start in game two at JSU, working the completegame, seven-inning shutout while allowing only two hits and no walks with four strikeouts. The Gamecocks hit just .083 in the contest...Freshman CF/LHP Tyler Pittman hit .400 with four runs scored in the JSU series, but didn't fare as well on the mound, allowing four runs on seven hits over six innings in the 9-2, game three loss...Junior SS Alex Stewart batted .300 over the weekend while junior 1B Josh Foreman had a double and four RBI. Sophomore C Bo Baxter had Murray State's only other extrabase hit of the weekend, a triple in game three...Junior RHP Craig Kraus pitched well in the series opener, allowing three earned runs on eight hits in nine innings for the complete-game win. The 'Breds staff held Jax State to a .211 batting average, while the offense hit .268... Murray State visits Kentucky before closing out the regular-season at home against Samford.

SAMFORD (21-29, 13-11 OVC): Samford outscored Tennessee-Martin 25-5 as the Bulldogs swept their fourth straight OVC series. Earlier in the week, Samford lost an 8-0 decision at Vanderbilt...Senior 2B Michael Collins batted .600 and slugged 1.000 with six runs and three RBI in the UTM series...Senior RHP Karl Huch gave up just two runs in his complete-game victory over the Skyhawks in game one of Saturday's twinbill...Sophomore OF Matt Alling leads the team in batting average (.376), hits (71), triples (6) and RBI (45). He is hitting .407 with 20 RBI in OVC action...After opening the Conference schedule with 11 straight losses, the Bulldogs have reeled off 13 consecutive OVC victories and sit sixth in the league standings...After wrapping up the home portion of its schedule with a midweek contest against UAB, Samford closes out the regular season at Murray State.

**SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (24-24, 13-10 OVC):** Southeast Missouri is tied for fourth in the league standings after taking two of three from Tennessee Tech over the weekend. The Indians also defeated Arkansas State, 6-4, in a midweek contest...Sunday's loss to Tech halted Southeast's six-game winning streak...Junior OF **Frankie Montiel** batted .600 for the week, rapping out four doubles with four RBI...Junior closer **Brad Smith** broke the

school's single-season mark and tied the Indians' career record for saves, earning his ninth and 10th saves of the season last week. Six of his 10 saves have come off appearances of two or more innings. He is averaging 10.88 strikeouts per nine innings and boasts a 4-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio...Southeast closes out the regular season on the road, visiting Missouri and OVC foe UT Martin.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (15-35, 6-18 OVC): Tennessee-Martin dropped out of contention for an OVC Tournament berth after getting swept at Samford...The Skyhawks' 4-1 loss to Lipscomb was a five-inning affair due to rain...Senior 2B Bryant Jones saw his nationally-ranked batting average fall from .449 to .417 after going 0-for-15 last week...Junior RHP Dustin Summers tossed 3.2 scoreless innings while setting a new UTM record for single-season appearances (27). He also owned the previous best of 25, set in 2003, and now ranks second on the school's all-time chart (65), five short of the record...Senior OF Adam Salter went 5-for-13 for the week, hitting two doubles and a home run, while freshman SS Douglas Nicodemus was 5-for-12 with a dinger...Tied for ninth in the OVC standings, the Skyhawks wrap up the 2004 campaign with a road trip to Memphis and an OVC series at home against Southeast Missouri.

**TENNESSEE TECH (15-28, 10-14 OVC):** Tennessee Tech dropped two of three at Southeast Missouri over the weekend...Junior OF **J.D. Druckenmiller** batted .583 for the series, posting a 1.000 slugging percentage with two doubles, a homer and three RBI...Junior C **Britt Clubb** leads the team with a .333 batting average after going 5-for-13 with two RBI versus the Indians...The Golden Eagle position players were errorfree for the series. Tied for seventh in the league standings, Tech has been mathematically eliminated from the OVC Tournament. The Golden Eagles travel to East Tennessee State, then close out the regular-season at home against Eastern Illinois.

OVC RACE HEATS UP: Several key OVC series are on tap heading into the final week of regular-season action. Austin Peay sits three games ahead of Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State, needing just one win in its series against Jax State to claim the OVC regular-season title outright. However, should the Gamecocks sweep the Govs and should EIU win all three in its series with Tennessee Tech, APSU could find itself in a three-way tie for the crown. Five teams (APSU, EIU, JSU, Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri) have already qualified for a berth in next week's OVC Tournament in Paducah, Ky. Samford and Murray State will be duking it out for the sixth and final spot when they meet in Murray. The 'Breds have to win all three in order to unseat sixth-place Samford.
