

GARY GILBERT • 3B, SR. • ALBUQUERQUE, NM • SE MISSOURI

Gilbert registered multiple-hit efforts in each of his four outings as Southeast Missouri posted a 2-2 record last week. In the Indians' OVC series at Tennessee-Martin, the senior third baseman went 8-for-14 with four RBI and five runs scored. He also drove in three runs with a 4-for-7 performance in Southeast's 13-inning loss at Missouri. For the week, Gilbert batted .571 (12-for-21) with three doubles, one homer, seven RBI and seven runs scored. He registered 18 total bases while slugging .857 and posting a .609 on-base percentage.

AROUND THE DIAMOND ...

AUSTIN PEAY (35-19, 20-7 OVC): Austin Peay closed out the regular season by splitting its final four home games. The Govs lost their third consecutive game with a 9-2 setback to Evansville, but halted the slide and clinched their second straight OVC regular-season crown with a twinbill sweep of Jacksonville State on Friday. APSU was unable to finish the slate on a winning note, however, dropping game three of the JSU series...The Govs' back-to-back OVC titles are the first in school history and mark the first time a team has claimed consecutive crowns since Eastern Illinois managed the feat in 1998 and 1999...APSU's 20 Conference wins are an OVC record, eclipsing the previous mark of 19 held by EIU (19-1 in 2001) and Tennessee Tech (19-4 in 1988)...Sophomore LHP Rowdy Hardy went the distance in Saturday's game one win over JSU to earn his school-record 12th victory. He enters OVC Tournament play two shy of the Conference mark for single-season victories... Freshman RHP Shawn Kelley made a last-minute start for an ailing Jeff Mault and held the Gamecocks to one run on three hits for the win in game two. After giving up a game-opening home run and then a single and a double, Kelley retired 17 of the next 18 batters he faced...The Govs hold the top seed for OVC tourney play and will take on No. 6 Samford at 7 p.m. Wednesday.

EASTERN ILLINOIS (25-28, 17-9 OVC): Eastern Illinois enters OVC tourney play on a five-game winning streak after defeating Chicago State and sweeping an OVC twinbill with Tennessee Tech...Game three of the TTU series was rained out...Freshman 1B Kevin Carkeek's suicide squeeze bunt in the ninth inning at CSU proved to be the game-winner as the Panthers pulled out a 6-5 victory. He batted .417 for the week with two runs scored and three RBI...Junior LHP Ted Juske threw his second straight complete game, allowing two runs with seven strikeouts and one walk in seven innings of the game two victory...Picked to finish fifth in the league's preseason poll, the Panthers posted their second runner-up finish in three years with a squad half comprised of freshmen and junior college transfers...Freshman C Joe Hernandez and senior OF Marcus Jackson each hit .375 last week, with Jackson also driving in three runs...Junior RHP Kyle Widegren won his seventh straight decision, picking up the game one victory at Tech...Sophomore RHP Alex Chapple earned his first-ever EIU win with the victory at CSU, while freshman RHP Brian Long posted his first save...Freshman 3B Ryan Campbell delivered his team-leading 22nd double, one off EIU's single-season mark...The No. 2 Panthers play fifth-seeded Southeast Missouri at 11 a.m. Wednesday.

EASTERN KENTUCKY (33-15, 15-11 OVC): Eastern Kentucky closed out its regular-season slate winning two of three in its OVC series with Morehead State...Senior 3B Neil Sellers went 8-for-16 in the three games, finishing with a double, two home runs, eight RBI and five runs scored. He collected 15 total bases, recording slugging and on-base percentages of .938 and .500, respectively...Sellers is batting .362 on the year with a team-high 63 RBI while also collecting 12 homers, 18 doubles, 57 runs scored and a 7-for-7 performance in stolen base attempts...Junior LHP Dan Bachman picked up the game one victory, giving up five earned runs on eight hits with three strikeouts...EKU currently has a team batting average of .379, the highest in school history...Senior OF Stephen Carter (.466), senior 2B Jonathan Woodard (.429) and junior OF Derrick Bussell (.408) are all hitting .400 or above...Sellers and Woodard are the only two EKU players to start all 48 games this season...The No. 4 Colonels take on third-seeded Jacksonville State at 3 p.m. Wednesday.

JACKSONVILLE STATE (27-26, 16-11 OVC): Jacksonville State went 2-2 in its final week of regular-season action, edging Troy State, 5-4, and salvaging its OVC series at Austin Peay with an 11-10 victory in Saturday's finale...Senior 3B/2B Bobby Hicks has led off four games this season with a home run, including each of the last two contests. Hicks is the only JSU player to start all 53 games this season. He leads the club in batting (.367), runs (57), hits (80) and doubles (18), and enters postseason play

riding a five-game hitting streak...Senior 1B/RHP **Robby Goodson** has belted a team-high 13 homers so far, and leads a trio of players with 10 or more dingers (Goodson, Hicks and **Austin Stein**), a feat that has happened for just the second time in school history...The Gamecocks have rapped out 96 doubles in 2004, the eighth-highest total in school history, and have also launched 58 home runs this season, a far cry from last year's tally of 26. Both totals are the most under head coach **Jim Case...**The third-seeded Gamecocks take on No. 4 Eastern Kentucky at 3 p.m. on Wednesday.

MOREHEAD STATE (14-40, 7-20 OVC): Morehead State went 1-3 last week to close out the 2004 campaign, dropping a 9-5 decision to Belmont and winning one of a three-game OVC set to Eastern Kentucky... Sophomore Paul Rhodes launched a three-run walk-off homer in the bottom of the eighth inning to lift the Eagles to a 10-7 victory in game two of the EKU series on Saturday...For the second season in a row, Morehead State has established a school record for most times being hit by pitches. Eagle batters were plunked 68 times this season after being hit 54 times in 2003...Switch-hitting freshman C Donald Cheney had an impressive rookie campaign, recording a .308 batting average with eight doubles, nine home runs and a slugging percentage of .600...Junior OF Travis Rima started all 54 games this season, finishing with a .325 hitting average while striking out only 25 times in 238 plate appearances.

MURRAY STATE (17-35, 11-16 OVC): Murray State halted Samford's 13-game OVC win streak with a 3-0 shutout in game one of their final Conference series, but couldn't win the final two contests to earn a berth in the OVC Tournament. The Thoroughbreds also dropped a 9-1 midweek decision to Kentucky...Sophomore 2B Derrick Newton led the 'Breds with a .500 batting average last week, including a 4-for-6 effort in two games against Samford...Junior RHP Craig Kraus went the distance to record the five-hit shutout in game one of the Samford series. He struck out five without issuing a walk in nine innings...Kraus' shutout was the team's second in as many weeks...The 'Breds were not on the losing end of a shutout all season...Freshman OF Austin Swain went 5-for-10 over the weekend with a triple and two runs scored...Senior RHP Bart Peach and OF Scotty Scott were honored prior to Sunday's game... Peach pitched well in the series finale, but was hampered by six 'Breds errors, including three in the ninth inning, that allowed seven unearned runs. He fanned a career-high 10 batters in his final game at Murray State.

SAMFORD (23-31, 15-12 OVC): Samford had its 13-game OVC win streak snapped in game one of its series at Murray State, but the Bulldogs rallied to take games two and three, securing the sixth and final spot in the OVC Tournament field. Earlier in the week, Samford lost a 16-4 outing against UAB...Freshman 1B Garrett Rice led the Bulldogs with a .357 effort at the plate, rapping out a double and a homer while driving in two runs and scoring five more...Freshman RHP Joseph Edens gave up just two runs on six hits to earn the game two victory on Friday. He struck out six batters and walked one...After losing their first four Conference series, the Bulldogs closed out their regular-season slate on a tear, winning 15 of their final 16 league tilts...Sixth-seeded Samford squares off against top seed Austin Peay at 7 p.m. Wednesday.

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (26-26, 15-11 OVC): Southeast Missouri went 2-2 to wrap up the regular-season portion of its schedule. Both of the Indians' losses last week were one-run heartbreakers in extra innings as Southeast fell to Missouri, 12-11, in 13 frames, and lost game three of its OVC series at UT Martin, 17-16, in 10 innings...Senior 3B Gary Gilbert recorded multi-hit efforts in each of the four games, finishing the week with a .521 batting average and seven RBI. Due to a depleted staff, Gilbert was also pressed into pitching duties for the first time since April 4, recording eight strikeouts in five innings on the hill...Junior RHP Anthony Maupin worked his sixth complete game of the season as he went the distance in the game one victory at UTM. He struck out three, allowing

two runs off nine hits...Southeast has won eight of its last 11 games, posting a .338 team batting average with 19 homers and 8.7 runs per game during the stretch...The Indians, who tied for fourth with Eastern Kentucky in the league standings, lost the head-to-head tiebreaker to the Colonels and will be seeded fifth when they take on No. 2 Eastern Illinois.

TENNESSEE-MARTIN (16-38, 7-20 OVC): Tennessee-Martin ended a six-game slide on the final day of the season with a 17-16 victory over Southeast Missouri. Earlier in the week, the Skyhawks lost a 9-2 outing at Memphis before dropping both ends of Friday's twinbill against the Indians...Freshman OF Nick Luper's pinch-hit, two-run double in the bottom of the 10th inning on Saturday capped off a five-run rally and gave UTM its first win over Southeast since 2001...Senior 2B Bryant Jones wrapped up his collegiate career in fine fashion, batting .533 for the week. He went 7-for-11 with five RBI in the SEMO series, including a fifth-inning grand slam in Saturday's victory...Freshman Scott McLean (.324) and junior Nick Bruner (.314) closed out their first seasons at UTM with both hitting above .300...Senior OF Adam Salter went 5-for-7 against Southeast and closed out his career with a .325 batting average...Junior hurler Dustin Summers made three appearances last week, bringing his season total to 30, a new school record. He will enter his senior season with 68 career appearances, two shy of UTM's all-time mark.

TENNESSEE TECH (15-31, 15-31 OVC): Tennessee Tech ended its 2004 campaign on a three-game slide with a midweek loss to East Tennessee State (10-1) and a pair of setbacks to Eastern Illinois in OVC action...Tech's lone senior, RHP **Collins Hughes**, was honored before his start in game one versus EIU on Friday...Sophomore RF **Josh Eye** went 3-for-4 with a walk and two runs scored in game one...Junior SS **Brandon Selvog** finished as Tech's batting leader for the season with a .339 average. He drove in 30 runs and stole seven bases while rapping out 62 hits, including 18 doubles and two triples.

OVC TOURNEY FIELD SET: The 2004 OVC Tournament gets underway Wednesday, May 26 at Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky. The four-day event runs through Saturday, May 29, with the tournament champion earning the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Fans will notice some new faces this year as first-year members Jacksonville State and Samford both qualified for the six-team field. Number two seed Eastern Illinois and fifth-seeded Southeast Missouri kick things off at 11 a.m. Central on Wednesday, with No. 3 seed Jacksonville State and fourth-seeded Eastern Kentucky following at 3 p.m. Regular-season champion and top seed Austin Peay squares off with No. 6 seed Samford in the 7 p.m. game.
