THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Clay Whittemore, OF • Sr., 6-1, 180 • Cullman, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Whittemore hit .600 (9-for-15) last week with a run scored, double, triple and five RBI in leading Jacksonville State to a 2-2 overall record. The preseason All-American raised his season batting average by 78 points on the week (to .333) and had a slugging percentage of .800 and an on-base percentage of .625. He was 4-for-4 in a win over Kennesaw State as he tied his career-high for hits in a game, and then had back-to-back two-hit games against Appalachian State. He has now driven in a run in seven consecutive games and moved into the Jax State career top 10 list for RBI (124).

CO-PITCHER

Christian Friedrich, LHP • Jr., 6-3, 208 • Evanston, Ill. • Eastern Kentucky

Friedrich picked up his second Pitcher of the Week honor of the young season after a seven-inning, two-hit, 12-strikeout performance against Illinois during the Colonels Spring Break trip to Bradenton, Fla. last week. The preseason All-American took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before allowing two hits and a run during the inning. He left the game following the inning and garnered a no-decision as his team eventually lost 8-6. Friedrich has 37 strikeouts (13.5 per nine innings) and a 2.19 E.R.A. in four total games this season.

CO-PITCHER

James Leigh, LHP • R-Jr., 6-4, 215 • Bryant, Ark. • Southeast Missouri

Leigh picked up a pair of victories last week while compiling a 1.12 E.R.A. and striking out 13 in eight total innings of work. In a game at Memphis, Leigh struck out 10 Tiger batters over six innings to improve to 3-0 on the season. To begin the week he came into the Lyon College game in relief, tossing two scoreless innings as he helped combine with five other Redhawk pitchers to the shutout. Leigh currently has a 3-0 record and 1.06 E.R.A. on the season and is averaging 14.82 strikeouts per 9 innings.

TEAM NOTES

Austin Peay (8-7, 0-0 OVC): Austin Peay completed a busy week as they played seven games in seven days. After poor weather played havoc on their scheduled baseball classic last weekend, the Governors played both Bradley and Dayton last Monday, dropping decisions to both. The next two days saw a home win over Lipscomb and a road win at Belmont before UW-Milwaukee came to town for a three-game weekend series. The Panthers took the first two games from Austin Peay before APSU claimed the final game 6-4 on Sunday. For the week, senior outfielder Rafael Hill hit .444 (12-for-27) with 10 runs scored, a double, triple and three RBI. He had a .571 on-base percentage for the week and was 4-for-4 against UWM on Saturday afternoon. Hill saw his nine-game hitting streak come to an end at Belmont on Wednesday. The Govs are currently 5-7 at Raymond C. Hand Park this year but 3-0 on the road. Starter Ryne Mantooth has a 3-0 record in four starts this season. The Governors have converted each of their six save opportunities this season, with Daniel Tenholder leading the way with three saves. This week Austin Peay hosts Middle Tennessee before beginning Conference play at Eastern Kentucky this weekend.

Eastern Illinois (5-9, 0-0 OVC): Eastern Illinois has played its first 14 games of the year on the road after seeing its March 4 home opener snowed out. The Panthers just completed an eight-game road trip to Bradenton, Fla. where the team compiled a 5-3 overall record. The Panthers had wins over Bucknell (twice), IPFW, Vermont and Northern Iowa and losses to Akron, Illinois State and Western Michigan. In the six games this past week, sophomore Richie Derbak hit .391 (9-for-23) with four runs scored, two doubles and six RBI. He also did not strike out in his 24 plate appearances. On the mound, senior lefty Tristan Facer two a pair of games, topping IPFW and Bucknell. Facer pitched 15 total innings and struck out four. Jordan Tokarz hit safely in all eight games during the trip and has a nine-game hitting streak heading into this week. EIU will finally get to play a home game this week when they begin a five-game home stand. The Panthers host Monmouth College of Illinois on Tuesday and then open OVC play by hosting Morehead State this weekend.

Eastern Kentucky (7-7-1, 0-0 OVC): Like Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky also finished up a Spring Break trip to Bradenton, Fla. The Colonels won three of their eight games in Florida, topping IPFW, Vermont and UMBC and losing to Central Michigan, Bucknell, Illinois State, Akron and Illinois. Overall it completed a nine-game road swing which had followed six games at home to open the 2008 season. The team will now play the next six and 10 of the next 13 at home. Junior pitcher Christian Friedrich was named OVC Co-Pitcher of the Week after throwing a gem against Illinois. Friedrich, the preseason OVC Pitcher of the Year, had a no-hitter into the seventh inning before allowing two hits and a run to the Illini. He finished the game with a no-decision and 12 strikeouts, which were a season-high. Sophomore 3B Anthony Ottrando hit .524 (11-of-21) during the week while driving in seven runs for EKU. Eastern begins its home stand this week with a non-conference game against Western Kentucky and its OVC-opening series with Austin Peay.

Jacksonville State (7-10, 0-0 OVC): Jacksonville State played four home games last week, topping Kennesaw State and winning one of three against Appalachian State. Senior outfielder Clay Whittemore, the preseason OVC Player of the Year, was named OVC Player of the Week after hitting .600 in the four contests. Whittemore raised his batting average 78 points during the week (to .333 on the season) and had a .800 slugging percentage. He was 4-for-4 against Kennesaw State and has now driven in a run in seven consecutive games. Junior reliever Alex Jones, last week's OVC Pitcher of the Week, earned his fifth consecutive decision, posting a 2-0 record with wins over Kennesaw State and Appalachian State. Prior to this week he had two wins and a save; he has allowed just two runs over those five games, recording 12 strikeouts in 10.1 innings of work. Sophomore Steven Leach leads JSU with six multiple-hit games. The Gamecocks are 4-0 this season in one-run games and 2-0 in two-run affairs. They also have a pair of wins in their last at-bat. This week then play a home-and-home series with Georgia State and then host Murray State in the OVC-opening weekend. JSU was picked as the preseason OVC favorite in a vote of head coaches.

Morehead State (6-9, 0-0 OVC): Morehead State ended its 12-game home stand (which was suppose to be five games longer but those five were cancelled due to poor weather) by dropping six of its seven games last week. The Eagles topped Cleveland State 4-0 to begin the week and then lost two more to CSU and four straight to Western Michigan. In the victory, junior Tyler Bess pitched five innings and combined with two relievers for the shutout. He allowed only three singles in his time in the game. He also saw action against Western Michigan and finished the week with a 2.45 E.R.A. and 11 strikeouts

2008 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2008 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Championship will be held May 21-24 (25) at historic Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky. Every game of the event can be seen live and on-demand at OVCsports.TV.

It marks the eighth consecutive year that the event will be held at a neutral site in Paducah. Prior to the 2001 season, the event was held at campus sites. The competition at the event has been incredibly close over the past eight years, as five different teams have claimed a tournament championship in that time frame.

Last season the Austin Peay Governors won the championship by defeating Jacksonville State 3-2 in the title game.

The first official OVC Tournament was held in 1980; prior to that only playoff series between divisional winners were played.

against only four walks. Junior catcher Eric Parker added some offensive punch for first year head coach Jay Sorg, as hit .438 during the seven games. MSU also fielded .974 during the week and turned six double plays during the seven contests. This week the Eagles head to the road to battle the nation's No. 2-ranked team Kentucky (18-0) before beginning OVC play at Eastern Illinois.

Murray State (6-6, 0-0 OVC): Murray State played five home games last week, splitting a two-game set with Central Arkansas and taking one of three from Bowling Green State over the weekend. Sophomore lefty Daniel Calhoun struck out 10 and did not walk a batter in eight innings of work in a 1-0 win over Central Arkansas. He also pitched in the win over BGSU and had a 1.26 E.R.A. and 14 strikeouts (vs. 2 walks) for the week. Sophomore SS Kyle Tiernan hit .412 (7-for-17) during the week. Tiernan scored three runs, drove in four runs and stole a pair of bases. After opening the season hitless in 25 at-bats, Tyler Owen is now 4-for-4 with a pair of doubles. Chris Craycraft got a seven-inning complete game victory in the 6-2 win over Bowling Green. He allowed just two runs on six hits in the win of the Falcons. Murray State will begin a five-game road swing this week by first playing at Southern Illinois and then opening OVC play at Jacksonville State.

Samford (9-6, 0-0 OVC): Samford enters the week as one of the hottest OVC teams, having won three in a row and six of its last seven. The lone loss was a 9-5 decision at Alabama last week; the team rebounded with a three-game home sweep of Rider. Prior to that the Bulldogs swept a three-game home series against Miami (Ohio). Senior 3B Michael Rutledge hit .467 (7-for-15) with five runs scored, four doubles and six RBI. In Sunday's 8-4 win over Rider, he was 3-for-4 with two doubles and four RBI. Junior hurler Jonathan Stephens pitched a complete game in the Bulldogs 3-1 win over Rider on Friday. He allowed eight hits and walked one while striking out three in nine innings. Samford will play a pair of games at Memphis mid-week before opening Conference play with a three-game home stand against UT Martin.

Southeast Missouri (6-6, 0-0 OVC): After not playing two weeks ago due to poor weather, the Redhawks got back in action this past week with a pair of home games and a three-game set at Memphis. Southeast Missouri shutout Lyon College (6-0) and lost to Saint Louis (9-5) and then won two of three against the Tigers. In the Memphis series, Southeast outlasted the Tigers 9-8 in a 14-inning marathon affair that lasted 4-hours and 50-minutes. Junior James Leigh was named OVC Co-Pitcher of the Week after picking up a pair of victories last week. Leigh combined with five other pitchers in the shutout of Lyon College, pitching two scoreless innings. Against Memphis he struck out 10 batters in six innings to improve to 3-0 (1.06 E.R.A.) on the season. He is averaging 14.82 strikeouts per 9 innings this season. Junior OF Tyrell Cummings hit .318 (7-for-22) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs and seven RBI. He had four hits in the 14-inning game, including a three-run home run, two doubles and four RBI. This week the Redhawks will host SIU-Edwardsville as well at Tennessee Tech, in the OVC opener, at Capaha Field.

Tennessee Tech (12-4-1, 0-0 OVC): Tennessee Tech enters the first week of OVC play with a league-best 12 victories. The Golden Eagles had won five in a row before losing its series finale 3-2 to Butler. Last week the team also topped Belmont, East Tennessee and took two from Butler. TTU has played 15 of its 17 games at home this season, only playing two road games at Georgia State so far this season. Five of the team's next seven games, however, are on the road. Junior infielder Chris King, who has a OVC-best 16-game hitting streak, hit .429 (9-of-21) for the week, scoring six runs, hitting a home run and driving in seven runs. He hit a two-run homer in the team's 7-4 victory over Belmont and had a .435 on-base percentage and .571 slugging percentage for the week. King also leads the OVC with 10 multiple-hit games this season. Senior Jake Edwards pitched 8.0 innings against Butler, striking out a career-best 10 in Tech's 3-2 victory. TTU will host Dayton for two games this week and then travel to Southeast Missouri to open OVC play this weekend.

UT Martin (1-13, 0-0 OVC): UT Martin played all five of its games last week on the road, compiling a 1-4 overall record. The week began with a 2-0 victory over Arkansas-Little Rock, as the Skyhawks snapped a nine-game losing streak to start the season. In that contest junior lefty Eric Walker pitched 5.2 innings, allowing six hits and a walk to the Trojans. Walker also saw action over the weekend at Louisiana Tech, allowing three hits, a walk and an earned run in 3.1 innings. For the week he compiled a 1.00 E.R.A. in nine innings of work, striking out seven and walking only two. Junior Scott Gladstone hit .350 (7-for-20) during the week while freshman Drew Mason added a .400 average (6-for-15). Another freshman, Wes Patterson, added four hits and four RBI on the road trip. UTM will not play a non-conference game this week, but will instead be off until this weekend when they travel to Samford to begin OVC play.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: After four weeks of non-conference play the 10 OVC teams will open Conference play this weekend...The matchups include Austin Peay at Eastern Kentucky, Morehead State at Eastern Illinois, Murray State at Jacksonville State, Tennessee Tech at Southeast Missouri and UT Martin at Samford...After four weeks of play Tennessee Tech has the most non-conference victories, having won 12 of its first 17 contests...Samford, who has won six of its last seven, is second at 9-6, Austin Peay is one-game above .500 at 8-7 and three other schools (Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri and Murray State) are at .500.

Whittemore Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior Class Award: Jacksonville State outfielder **Clay Whittemore** is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior Class Award, which is awarded to a senior baseball player who excels both on and off the field. Presented annually to NCAA Division I student-athletes in eight sports, the award focuses on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. Whittemore was named the 2008 Ohio Valley Conference pre-season Player of the Year and is also a pre-season All-American by Collegiate Baseball. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award was launched in 2001 to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who fulfill their entire athletic eligibility and pursue their degree. Since that time, Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA, has expanded the award to include other NCAA sports including baseball. From the list of 30 nominees, a national media committee will select 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in mid-April. Those ten names will be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote that will include coaches, media and fans. The award winner will be announced and recognized at the 2008 NCAA Men's College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska. Whittemore becomes the first player in Ohio Valley Conference history to be listed as one of the 30 Baseball Nominees.

Jacksonville State Picked as Preseason Favorite: In a preseason vote of league head coaches, Jacksonville State was picked as the favorite in the 10-team OVC. The Gamecocks finished second in both the regular season and tournament last season. The overall voting for the preseason poll was balanced and close, as three teams received first-place votes and only two points separated the favorite, Jacksonville State, from second-place, defending champion Austin Peay. Jacksonville State received four of the first-place votes and 76 total points, which put them ahead of the Governors, who actually received one more first-place vote (5 in total) but finished two points behind the Gamecocks in their overall points total (74). Eastern Kentucky received the other first place vote and was predicted to finish third (61 points). The Colonels were followed closely by Southeast Missouri State, who was picked fourth (59), and Samford, who was predicted to place fifth (55). Eastern Illinois was tabbed sixth (38), followed by Murray State in seventh (30), Tennessee Tech in eighth (29), Morehead State in ninth (15) and UT Martin in 10th (13).

Whittemore and Friedrich Named Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches Jacksonville State senior outfielder **Clay Whittemore** was picked as the Preseason Player of the Year while Eastern Kentucky junior left-handed pitcher **Christian Friedrich** was named the Preseason Pitcher of the Year. Whittemore claimed the Player of the Year award at the end of last season after hitting .391 with 93 hits, 53 runs and 69 RBI in 60 games. Whittemore was named a preseason All-American by several outlets (including *Collegiate Baseball News*) and is one of three OVC players on the Brooks Wallace National Player of the Year Watch List. Friedrich compiled a 5-4 record and 2.09 ERA in 81.2 innings pitched last season. He also tossed three complete games, limited opponents to a .155 batting average and struck out 101 batters. He also enjoyed a successful summer with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in the Cape Cod League where he compiled a 4-1 record, 2.68 ERA and struck out 52 in 37.0 innings of work (7 starts). Friedrich is also on the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List and has been named a preseason All-American.

OVC Baseball Championship to Once Again Be Held in Paducah: For the eighth consecutive season the Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Championship will be held at historic Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky. The top six teams from the Conference will meet in Paducah for games May 21-24 (25). The event has seen five different teams win a title in the last seven years with Austin Peay capturing the championship a year ago.

OVC Players in the Pros: Entering the 2008 season, there are currently seven players from OVC schools playing Major League Baseball. Those players include: Eastern Kentucky's Josh Anderson (Atlanta); Jacksonville State's Todd Jones (Detroit), Morehead State's Jon Rauch (Washington), Austin Peay's George Sherrill (Baltimore) and Jaime Walker (Baltimore), Samford's Ehren Wassermann (Chicago White Sox) and Jacksonville State's Bill White (Texas).
