## THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### PLAYER

#### Elliot Frey, OF • So., 6-1, 180 • Edwardsville, Ill. • Murray State

Frey hit .667 (12-for-18) with nine runs scored, three doubles, a home run, seven RBI and a stolen base in four games last week as Murray State compiled a 3-1 overall record. He hit safely in all four games including setting a school record by going 6-for-6 in the series opener against Morehead State. In that contest Frey had a home run and three RBI and scored four runs in the 13-8 MSU victory. His six hits in the game broke the school mark of five hits held by 10 different players. Frey closed out the week with a 3-for-4 performance with a double, two RBI and three runs scored as he extended his hitting streak to a career-best 12 games.

### PITCHER

#### Tyler Kehrer, LHP • Jr., 6-3, 210 • New Baden, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Kehrer pitched a one-hit complete game shutout in the Panthers 5-0 victory over future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville on Sunday. Along the way he struck out a career-high 14 batters. Kehrer did not allow a fair ball to be hit out of the infield and the only hit he allowed was a two-out infield single in the third inning. Kehrer did not issue a walk and retired the final 19 batters of the game to improve to 4-3 on the season. He has a team-high 68 strikeouts in 56 innings of work this season.

## TEAM NOTES

**Austin Peay (18-25, 4-9 OVC):** Austin Peay compiled a 2-3 record in games last week, splitting a pair of non-conference games before losing two of three OVC games at home to Southeast Missouri. The team's best win of the week came against in-state rival Vanderbilt, as the Govs claimed a 9-8 victory. Junior center Trey Lucas hit .529 (9-for-17) with four runs scored, a double, three home runs and eight RBI. For the week he had a 1.118 slugging percentage and a .600 on-base percentage. Overall the Governors are 4-9 in Conference play, three wins behind Tennessee Tech and Eastern Kentucky who are in sixth and seventh place in the standings. APSU has not won any of its first five Conference series this season; the 4-9 start is the worst for the team this decade. On the mound freshman Lucas Anderson made two relief appearances and went 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA in six innings pitched. The Govs play all five games on the road this week, playing at Western Kentucky and Middle Tennessee before traveling to UT Martin for a weekend OVC series. Austin Peay will play nine of its final 12 games on the road this series with the lone home games being a three-game set with league-leading Eastern Illinois.

**Eastern Illinois (32-9, 10-3 OVC):** Eastern Illinois continued its hot streak, winning five of six games last week to become the first OVC team to reach 30 wins on the season. EIU has now won 22 of its last 26 games dating back to mid-March. Eastern beat Saint Louis and Illinois College mid-week and lost to Bradley. Over the weekend the team played future OVC opponent SIU Edwardsville, winning all three games by a combined 19-2 margin. Junior pitcher Tyler Kehrer was named OVC Pitcher of the Week after tossing a one-hit complete game shutout and striking out 14 batters. He did not allow a fair ball out of the infield and retired the final 19 batters of the game. Kehrer did not issue a walk. EIU started the week by hitting six home runs against SLU, but only hit one long ball the rest of the week. In the first game of the SIUE series (a 10-0 EIU win) Josh Mueller (7 innings) and Brian Morrell (2 innings) combined for a shutout victory. With All-American Brett Nommensen sidelined with an injury, Zach Borenstein is currently hitting in the leadoff position. The freshman is 8-for-21 with a team-high 10 runs scored last week. Eastern Illinois has two key non-conference neutral site games this week, when they take on Missouri and Southern Illinois. The game with Mizzou will be played at T.R. Hughes Ballpark in O'Fallon, Mo.; the site is home of the Independent Frontier League River City Rascals. On Wednesday the SIU contest is in Mattoon, Ill. at Grimes Field. After two big games the Panthers will travel to Cape Girardeau to battle Southeast Missouri State in a key three-game OVC series. EIU hold a .031 percentage points lead in the Conference standings.

**Eastern Kentucky (21-19, 7-10 OVC):** The Colonels split non-conference games with Xavier and Western Kentucky last week before traveling to Jacksonville State and going 1-2 against the preseason favorite Gamecocks. Eastern Kentucky lost the first two games of the JSU series by a combined 27-6 margin but rebounded with a 9-3 victory in the finale, marking only the team's third road victory in 15 tries this season. Sophomore lefty Paul Duncan pitched seven strong innings, allowing just three runs on five hits to win for the fifth time this season. Offensively five different players each had two hits to lead a balanced attack. The win snapped an eight-game Conference losing streak for the Colonels dating back to April 4. In the most recent NCAA statistical leader ranking, EKV was ranked seventh nationally in batting average (.353); new leaders will be released on Tuesday. This week the Colonels will play three of four games at home. The team starts the week with a road game against Miami (Ohio) but returns to Richmond for a three-game series with Chicago State over the weekend.

**Jacksonville State (25-15, 9-6 OVC):** Jacksonville State won three of four games last week including becoming the first OVC team to ever knock off the No. 1 ranked team in the land when they defeated Georgia 9-7 in Jacksonville on Wednesday. The game drew a record crowd of 2,887 fans to Rudy Abbott Field. Kyle Bluestein had three hits including a two-run home run in the game. Jordan Beistline scattered three hits and had three strikeouts in middle relief to pick up his seventh victory of the season. Bill Henke struck out the final two batters to pick up his eighth save of the season. Over the week Jax State won two of three games from Eastern Kentucky, marking the 16th time in their last 17 OVC series they have come away with the series victory. Todd Cunningham extended his hitting streak to 16 games during the week, which is now the longest active streak in the league. During the hitting streak he is hitting .366 with 22 runs scored and 14 RBI. Bluestein is riding a 10-game hitting streak and has reached base safely in 20 straight games. For the week outfielder Daniel Adamson hit .467 (7-for-15) with two home runs and 10 RBI. He had a pair of hits and drove in two in the win over UGA. The Gamecocks will get another chance at the nationally-ranked Bulldogs this week when they travel to Athens to face UGA. This weekend the team will host Morehead State for a three-game series.

**Morehead State (15-24, 8-9 OVC):** Morehead State opened the week with three straight losses, falling in non-conference action to Cincinnati and dropping both ends of a doubleheader to Murray State. But the Eagles rebounded in the final game of the series, winning 18-9 to improve to 8-9 in OVC play, which puts them in fifth place with three weekends of play remaining. The Eagles have not qualified for the six-team OVC Tournament field since 2005. Junior shortstop Drew Lee hit .438 (7-for-16) with eight runs scored, three home runs and nine RBI in four games last week. He had a slugging percentage of 1.000 and an on-base percentage of .526 for the week. The switch-hitter homered from both side of the plate in Sunday's win. J.D. Ashbrook tied a school

record with three doubles in Sunday's contest. Earlier this year he also set the MSU record for career hit by pitches. For the week, the junior hit .444 with five runs scored and four doubles. Freshman Andrew Deeds hit .412 last week. The Eagles will play at West Virginia in non-conference action before traveling to Jacksonville State for a three-game OVC series.

**Murray State (25-16, 7-6 OVC):** Murray State won three of four games last week, topping Memphis in non-conference action before taking two of three at Morehead State. The Thor-oughbreds have now won seven of their last 11 games after a five-game losing streak. MSU is 7-6 in Conference action, which places them in fourth place in the standings. Sophomore outfielder Elliot Frey was named OVC Player of the Week after hitting .667 (12-for-18) with nine runs scored, three doubles, a home run and seven RBI. He set a new Murray State record by going 6-for-6 with a home run and three RBI in the series opening against Morehead State. On the mound junior Daniel Calhoun continued to impress, improving to 9-1 on the year (with a 1.85 E.R.A.). Only two players nationally (Kansas State's A.J. Morris and Arizona State's Mike Leake who each have 10 wins) have more victories than Calhoun does this season. In his outing this week he allowed scattered nine hits and struck out four (without a walk) in a seven-inning complete game victory. Calhoun now has seven complete games (including four in a row) this season in 10 total starts. He is just two wins away from tying Major Leaguer Kirk Rueter's school record of 11. Wes Cunningham has now reached base safely in 44 games and 81 of his last 82 contests dating back to last season. As a team the T'Breds have 40 home runs, the most since the 1997 season. MSU will play at Belmont in non-conference action this week before hosting Tennessee Tech this weekend.

**Southeast Missouri (25-16, 11-4 OVC):** Southeast Missouri split non-conference games with Evansville (9-4 win) and Arkansas State (17-11 loss) last week before taking two of three league games at Austin Peay. That moved the Redhawks to 11-4 in the OVC, mere percentage points (.769 to .733) behind league-leader Eastern Illinois. Those two teams will meet for a three-game series this weekend in Cape Girardeau with the winner taking over sole possession of first place in the standings. Senior outfielder Tyrell Cummings hit .522 (12-for-23) last week with five runs, two doubles, a triple, home run and 10 RBI in five games. In the series finale on Sunday he was 4-for-5 with a double and four RBI to raise his season average to nearly .400. DH Louie Haseltine hit .474 (9-for-19) with five runs, four doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and three stolen bases. Justin Wheeler hit a team-best .609 last week while Jim Klocke hit .571 with a home run. James Leigh improved to 6-1 on the year with a season-best eight inning outing on Sunday. Southeast will play two games at Central Arkansas this week prior to hosting EIU for the big weekend OVC series.

**SIU Edwardsville (9-29):** SIU Edwardsville lost all five of its games last week, falling in home games to Division II powers Central Missouri and Indianapolis and getting swept in a three-game series with Eastern Illinois. The Cougars have now played five different OVC schools this season, compiling a 2-12 record in those games (with wins over UT Martin and Murray State). SIUE still has a three-game set with Morehead State before the series is over, meaning the team will have played six of the other nine teams in the league before they start playing a full OVC slate in a few seasons. Overall the Cougars have lost eight games in a row since winning three in a row during the middle of the month. SIU Edwardsville will play at Bradley and then host Missouri-St. Louis midweek before playing a four-game set this weekend at Evansville.

**Tennessee Tech (21-17, 7-9 OVC):** Tennessee Tech won three of five games last week, splitting a home non-conference doubleheader with Georgia State and then taking the final two of three from UT Martin at home over the weekend. A.J. Kirby-Jones hit .375 (6-for-16) with two runs, two doubles, a home run and three RBI last week. The home run was his 13th of the season which moved him into fifth place in TTU single-season history (the record is 20). In addition to his .688 slugging percentage, he pitched seven innings in two total appearances, going 1-0 and not allowing an earned run. He struck out six batters and held opponents to a .115 batting average. Junior pitcher Lee Henry had a seven-inning complete game shutout in game two of the UT Martin series, a 1-0 win for the Golden Eagles. He scattered five hits and struck out seven in picking up the victory. He had a key strikeout in the top of the seventh inning with the bases loaded and the scored tied at zero; Tech would go on to win with a walk-off double in the seventh inning. Tennessee Tech will play five games this week, starting on Monday night with a home game against Alabama A&M, a makeup game from March 30. The team will then travel to Western Carolina and play a three-game OVC set at Murray State over the weekend.

**UT Martin (15-25, 4-11 OVC):** UT Martin compiled a 2-3 record during the week, beating Arkansas State and taking one game (of three) from Tennessee Tech and losing a neutral site game in Jackson, Tenn. to Memphis. Senior Miles Hartsfield continued his torrid pace, hitting .474 (9-for-19) with six runs, a triple, two home runs and six RBI last week. He extended his hitting streak to 32 games in the second game of the Tennessee Tech series, a game in which UTM was shutout 1-0. Teammate Scott Gladstone also saw his hitting streak come to an end last week; after hitting safely in 31 straight games he failed to get a hit against Arkansas State to begin the week. The duo had been the only teammates with hitting streak of 29 or more games at the same time this season. UT Martin hit 10 total home runs last week, five more than their opponents. The home game with Arkansas State last week was the first played under lights at UT Martin; the Skyhawks lost 6-4. This week they can gain some revenge when they travel to the Red Wolves for a game on Tuesday. This weekend the Skyhawks will host Austin Peay.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** With three weekends of regular season play left the OVC race is heating up with two teams nearly deadlocked atop the standings and only two total games separating third place and seventh place...Eastern Illinois remains in first place after stepping out of Conference play this past weekend (the Panthers swept SIU Edwardsville); EIU is 10-3 in OVC action and their .769 percentage is just ahead of Southeast Missouri who is 11-4 overall and has a winning percentage of .733...Those two teams will meet in Cape Girardeau for a three-game series this weekend with the winner taking over sole possession of first place in the standings...Jacksonville State, at 9-6 in the league, is in third place, followed closely by Murray State, Morehead State, Tennessee Tech and Eastern Kentucky...The league continued its non-conference success this season this past week, winning both of its games against Southeastern Conference schools; the OVC is 118-96 in non-conference games this year.

**JSU Knocks Off No. 1 Georgia:** On April 22 Jacksonville State topped No. 1 ranked Georgia (USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll) 9-7 in Jacksonville. It marked the first time the Gamecocks had knocked off the No. 1 team in the nation and is believed to be the first time an OVC school has topped the a topped-ranked team. Austin Peay had the last great chance to beat the nation's No. 1, losing in extra innings to No. 1 Vanderbilt in the NCAA Regional in 2007. Overall this season OVC teams are 5-8 against nationally-ranked non-conference foes. Below is a list of OVC teams who have beaten ranked squads this season.

**EIU's Nommensen Out 4-6 Weeks With Wrist Injury:** Eastern Illinois baseball senior center fielder **Brett Nommensen** will undergo a medical procedure on April 21 after suffering a fracture to the "hook" of the hamate bone in his right wrist. A complete recovery is expected in 4-6 weeks. Nommensen was hitting .521 with 13 doubles and 11 home runs prior to the injury. As of April 13, he was leading the nation in on-base (.649) and slugging percentages (1.021) while ranking second in batting average.

**Lee Hits Five Home Runs in Doubleheader; Three From Left Side of Plate and Two From Right Side of Plate:** In a doubleheader split against UT Martin on April 18, Morehead State junior shortstop **Drew Lee** hit three home runs in the first game and two home runs in the second game of the twin-bill. The interesting fact is that all three home runs in the first game came from the left-side of the plate while the two home runs in the nightcap were from the right-side of the plate.

**Nommensen Named a Mid-Season All-American by Baseball America:** Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** has been one of 10 position players in the nation named to Baseball America's Midseason All-America Team. At the time of the honor, Nommensen entered the week leading the country in on-base and slugging percentages, while also ranking second in batting average. Baseball America's lead college writer Aaron Fitt selected a nine-player lineup based on positions along with a utility player (pitcher and hitter). The pitching staff featured six hurlers. Fresno State's Tom Mendonca (third base), San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg (starting pitcher) and Nommensen were the only three players among the 15 recognized that play for universities not affiliated with the big six BCS conferences.

**Eastern Illinois Spends Two Weeks in Collegiate Baseball News National Polls:** Eastern Illinois became the first OVC school in a long time (believed to be since the 1996 season) to break into the national polls when they entered the Collegiate Baseball News poll at No. 27 on April 6. It marked the first time the Panthers have been ranked at the Division I level. The Panthers were No. 29 a week later but dropped out of the national polls on April 20 after losing two of three games to Jacksonville State. Eastern Illinois is still among the teams receiving votes in several of the polls. EIU has a win over then No. 15 ranked Oklahoma (the Sooners are No. 10 in this week's NCBWA poll) and key road win over in-state rival Illinois. The Panthers still rank among the Top 40 (No. 39) in the latest RPI rankings.

**OVC Hitters Among the Best Nationally:** In the latest NCAA statistical rankings (April 21), the OVC has five players who are among the Top 10 nationally in batting average. Eastern Illinois' Brett Nommensen (who is currently out with an injury) is the nation's leader (.521) while Morehead State's Drew Lee is sixth (.465), Eastern Kentucky's Jayson Langfels is seventh (.459) and Matt Davis is eighth (.459) while Murray State's Wes Cunningham is 10th (.452).

**OVC Players/Teams Among National Leaders:** Brett Nommensen (who is injured but currently the nation's leader in on-base and slugging percentage) is not the only OVC player putting up impressive numbers this season. Through last week's NCAA rankings,

EKU's **Matt Davis** is first nationally in runs per game (1.70). Teammate **Jayson Langfels** is second nationally in RBI/game (1.67). Murray State's **Daniel Calhoun** is third in victories (8). Morehead State's **Drew Lee** is third in total bases (128), fourth in slugging (.889) and sixth in hits (67). As for team's, Eastern Illinois is first in batting average (.375) and slugging (.623) and third in scoring (9.9). Eastern Kentucky is seventh (.353) in batting, ninth in scoring (9.7 runs/game) and third in triples (0.63). Morehead State currently leads Division I in double plays per game (1.40).

**OVC Players in the Pros:** Entering the 2009 season, there were five players from OVC schools on Major League Baseball Opening Day rosters. Austin Peay has the distinction of having three former players on teams including 2008 All-Star reliever **George Sherrill** (Baltimore), reliever **Jamie Walker** (Baltimore) and rookie pitcher **Shawn Kelley** (Seattle). Former Morehead State pitcher **Jon Rauch** is a setup man in Arizona while former Eastern Kentucky outfielder **Josh Anderson** is a backup in Detroit. Two other former OVC players are on 40-man rosters but will not begin the season with the major league club. Those two players are Austin Peay catcher A.J. Ellis (L.A. Dodgers) and pitcher **Ehren Wassermann** (who played for Samford when they were in the OVC). One OVC school - Eastern Illinois - has two alumni who are coaching at the highest level of professional baseball. Former Panther **Kevin Seitzer** is the Kansas City Royals hitting coach with **Tim Bogar** is the Boston Red Sox first base coach.

**Austin Peay's Tenholder on NCBWA's Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List:** Austin Peay relief pitcher **Daniel Tenholder** has been named to the updated midseason National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Tenholder, who was also on the preseason list released in February, has five saves in 20 total appearances in 2009. He has 29 strikeouts in 31.1 innings of work. Last season Tenholder posted a 4-1 record and an OVC-best 11 saves. He ranked 18th nationally in saves and compiled a 2.72 ERA in 36.1 innings over 30 appearances, striking out 41 batters. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts will be selected as finalists and released Wednesday, May 27, prior to start of NCAA regional tournament competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee will then select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced in early June.

**College Baseball Foundation National All-Star Lineup:** Each week during the season the College Baseball Foundation (CBF) will release its "National All-Star Lineup" giving accolades to the week's top performers. The awards are presented by the CBF and Diamond Sports and are nominated by college coaches, staff and baseball media relations contacts. **Nommensen Named National Hitter of the Week by the NCBWA:** Eastern Illinois outfielder **Brett Nommensen** was named the Pro-Line Athletic National Hitter of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association on April 6. Nommensen hit .769 (10-of-13) with seven runs scored, two doubles, three home runs and nine RBIs in the four EIU wins last week. He reached base safely in 14 of his 17 plate appearances, including in each of his first 13 trips to the plate. Nommensen homered twice in a 12-8 road win over Saint Louis, including leading off the game with a home run for the fourth time this season. He hit a two-run home run in game one against Murray State and knocked in the first run in the second game of that doubleheader (a 2-1 EIU victory). The NCBWA Board reviews candidates from every NCAA Division I conference each week and names winners on Tuesdays throughout the season. Founded in 1962, the NCBWA is dedicated to the advancement of college baseball. Membership is open to writers, broadcasters and publicists of the sport.

**Murray State's Hill Named Louisville Slugger & Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week:** Murray State junior outfielder **Daniel Hill** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and the Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on March 9. Hill (Germantown, Tenn.) helped the 'Breds to a 5-1 week by going 15-for-26 (.577) with two doubles, five home runs, 18 RBIs and nine runs scored. He had a slugging percentage of 1.231 and an on-base percentage of .633. He started the week by going 3-for-4 with a pair of RBIs in a mid-week victory over Freed-Hardeman and followed it up the next day by going 3-for-5 with a home run and three RBIs against Arkansas State. Hill stepped up his game in the four-game series against North Dakota State as he led school-record 28-hit attack in the series opener by going 5-for-7 with a double, three home runs and eight RBIs in the 20-9 victory. He tied the MSU single-game record for hits and home runs in a game. In the first game of a doubleheader on Saturday, Hill did not get much to hit at the plate as he walked twice and was hit by a pitch in four plate appearances. The Bison did not fare so well in the second game as Hill was 2-for-4 with a double and two RBIs. The series

**EIU's Morrell One of 30 Student-Athletes Up for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award:** For his all-around excellence as a student-athlete, **Brian Morrell** of Eastern Illinois baseball has been named one of 30 candidates nationally for the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Morrell is a senior pitcher for the Panthers and has served as the bullpen's long-relief ace each of his upperclassman seasons. The Quincy native carries a 4.0 GPA while majoring in biological sciences. He was an ESPN the Magazine Second Team All-America honoree as a junior. The list of 30 candidates in baseball will be trimmed to a group of 10 finalists in April. Those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote beginning April 15 and concluding May 31. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award. The award, given annually to senior student-athletes across nine NCAA Division I sports, has become one of the most prestigious honors in college athletics. The candidates were selected based on their dedication and achievement in four areas: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition. The Lowe's Senior CLASS Award is distinctive from many other honors in that on-the-field performance is only one factor in determining candidacy – a major emphasis is placed on off-the-field commitments and personal character. An acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college basketball players leaving college early to turn professional.

**Tootle Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List:** Jacksonville State junior pitcher **Ben Tootle** has been named to the preseason Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award Watch List as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award is dedicated to the memory of former Texas Tech player and assistant coach Brooks Wallace. Wallace was a slick-fielding shortstop at Texas Tech from 1977 to 1980. A four-year starter, he was named All-Southwest Conference and All-District his senior year. He led the Red Raiders to their first-ever appearance in the Southwest Conference Tournament in 1980. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player in conjunction with the College Baseball Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. The 2009 award banquet will be at 7 p.m., Thursday, July 2, in the United Spirit Arena on the campus of Texas Tech University.

**JSU's Tootle Named to Golden Spikes Watch List:** Jacksonville State's **Ben Tootle** has been named to the 2009 Preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List by USA Baseball, marking the organization's first step toward identifying the top player in college baseball. The watch list features 50 of the nation's top collegiate talents and will be presented in 2009 for the 32nd time. The award is sponsored by Major League Baseball. Last season Tootle was named first-team All-OVC after leading the conference with an impressive 10-2 record with two shutouts in 2008. He finished the season with 79 strikeouts, which was the second most in the OVC, and had a 3.87 earned run average. He was named OVC Pitcher of the Week three times during the season after going a perfect 8-0 against conference members. Baseball America named Tootle as the fourth-best prospect from this summer's Cape Cod League, while ESPN's Keith Law has named the Gamecock pitching ace as the 13th best prospect in the country for the 2009 season.

**JSU's Tootle Named to Numerous Preseason All-American Teams:** Jacksonville State junior pitcher **Ben Tootle** was named to four preseason All-American lists this year. Tootle was a first-team NCBWA selection, second-team Louisville Slugger pick and a third-team choice by Ping! and Baseball America. Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** was a third-team pick by Ping! while Southeast Missouri catcher **Jim Klocke** was a honorable mention pick by Ping!.

**Five OVC Coaches Coaching at Their Alma Mater:** This season five of the nine OVC head baseball coaches are currently coaching at their alma maters, including first-year head coach **Jason Stein** at Eastern Kentucky. Stein played at EKU from 1992-95 and graduated in 1997. He played against Morehead State head coach **Jay Sorg** who was at MSU from 1992-94. Ironically in the 1994 season, Sorg was named OVC Player of the Week on April 11 while Stein earned the same honor on May 2. The other coaches currently at their alma mater are Austin Peay's **Gary McClure** (1987), Murray State **Rob McDonald** (1984) and Southeast Missouri's **Mark Hogan** (1977).

**Jacksonville State Picked as Preseason Favorite For Second Straight Season:** For the second year in a row, Jacksonville State has been picked as the preseason favorite for the nine-team league in a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches. The Gamecocks claimed the 2008 regular season championship with a 23-4 record last season but came up just short in the OVC Tournament. The overall voting in the preseason poll was close as Jacksonville State, who received five first-place votes, edged Eastern Illinois, who had the other four first-place votes, by just one total point. Eastern Illinois swept through four games at the OVC Tournament last season on its way to team's first title since 1999 and a berth in the NCAA Regionals. Those two teams were followed by Austin Peay (48 points), Southeast Missouri State (42), Tennessee Tech (38), Murray State (23), Morehead State (22), Eastern Kentucky (20) and UT Martin (10).

**Nommensen and Tootle Named Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year:** Jacksonville State junior right-hander **Ben Tootle** was tabbed the OVC Preseason Pitcher of the Year while Eastern Illinois senior outfielder **Brett Nommensen** was picked the OVC Preseason Player of the Year in a preseason vote of league head coaches. Nommensen produced gaudy numbers last year in earning All-OVC first-team honors as well as being selected to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. He hit .402 with 82 hits, 56 runs, 18 doubles, five home runs and 36 RBI. His slugging percentage was .603 while his on-base percentage was a league-best .518. Nommensen also stole 18 bases. Tootle, who was named a preseason All-American by numerous outlets has been great in his first two seasons at JSU. In two years with Jax State, Tootle has compiled a 16-5 overall record, including an unblemished 8-0 mark against Conference opponents a season ago. Last season he struck out 79 batters and walked only 29 in 86 innings of work.

**SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC:** On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).
