THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Jordan Kreke, SS/P • Sr., 6-2, 200 • Bartelso, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

In five games last week, Kreke hit .579 (11-for-19) with seven runs scored, a double, triple, three home runs and 12 RBI as the Panthers compiled a 4-1 record. He was 10-for-15 (.667) with three home runs and 12 RBI in a three-game sweep of Morehead State in the Conference opener for both teams. He also delivered a clutch two-out, two-run single with EIU trailing 4-3 in the seventh inning of game two; the team went on to win 6-4. He homered and collected multiple hits and RBI in each of the MSU games, including four hits in the series opener and finale. Kreke tied his career-high with five RBI in Sunday's finale. Against Indiana mid-week, Kreke earned his first victory on the mound, pitching 2.1 inning of one-run relief and closing out the game by retiring seven of the final eight batters he faced.

PITCHER

Austin Lucas, RHP • Jr., 6-5, 200 • Alabaster, Ala. • Jacksonville State
Lucas did not allow an earned run in 14 innings of work last week, posting a 2-0 record and Jacksonville State went 5-1 overall as a team. Lucas pitched a complete-game shutout in the Gamecocks 10-0 win over Bradley last Tuesday in Florida and followed that up with seven solid innings in a 14-3 Conference win over Murray State. Against Bradley he allowed just five hits with five strikeouts and only one walk. He followed that with a four-hit, five-strikeout, no-walk performance against MSU. He lowered his season E.R.A. to a team-best 2.22.

TEAM NOTES

Austin Peay (9-12, 1-2 OVC): Austin Peay dropped a non-conference game to Iowa last week before hosting Eastern Kentucky in the OVC opener for both teams over the weekend. APSU won the opener 2-1 behind a strong pitching performance from Ryne Harper but were defeated in each of the final two games, losing 10-7 and 11-6. Harper struck out a career-high nine batters in the opener, allowing six hits (all with the bases empty) and walking only one in 7.2 innings. His only mistake was a solo home run in the third inning. Junior Trey Lucas has a seven-game hitting streak and has raised his batting average 90 points over that span. Lucas now has eight multi-hit games this year. Austin Peay has had trouble when it gets behind this year, as they are 0-9 when trailing after the sixth inning. APSU will play at Vanderbilt and host Evansville this week and then play at Jacksonville State for three games this weekend.

Eastern Illinois (13-5, 3-0 OVC): Eastern Illinois now leads the OVC in team batting (.358) after exploding for 42 runs in a three-game sweep of Morehead State this past weekend. That followed the conclusion of the team's Spring Break trip to Florida which saw them top Indiana and lose to Bradley to open the week. The Panthers were 7-1 on their swing through Florida, including claiming the championship at the USF Bulls Baseball Classic. After sweeping Morehead State this past weekend, the team has won 17 straight games against the Eagles. Jordan Kreke was named OVC Player of the Week after hitting .579 (11-for-19) with seven runs scored, three home runs and 12 RBI last week. On the mound, Mike Recchia improved to 4-0 on the season by pitching eight innings of four-hit baseball on Sunday against Morehead State. MSU did not score against him until the seventh inning. Sophomore Josh Mueller also stayed perfect on the season, moving to 3-0 with a win in the series opener. Richie Derbak stretched his hitting streak to 16 games (second longest active streak in the league) last week. Derbak has hit safely in every game he has batted this season and tops the OVC with a .500 batting average. Derbak also did it on the mound, picking up the win in game two of the Morehead State series. OVC Preseason Player of the Year Brett Nommensen has hit safely in 12 games and was 11-for-19 with five extra base hits last week. He tripled home the go-ahead run in the eighth inning of the Indiana victory last week. After 18 games away from home, Eastern Illinois will finally play a home game this week. The Panthers play at Chicago State on Tuesday but then entertain Illinois State before hosting Tennessee Tech this weekend.

Eastern Kentucky (11-6, 2-1 OVC): Eastern Kentucky continued its hot streak by winning four of five last week, including topping in-state rival Western Kentucky in walk-off fashion, beating Berea College 32-4 and then winning two of three in its Conference-opening series at Austin Peay. Sophomore third baseman Jayson Langfels hit .500 (11-for-22) last week and drove in 10 runs for the Colonels. Langfels smashed four home runs and had a 1.227 slugging percentage for the week. Against WKU he hit a two-run walk-off in the bottom of the ninth inning. In the second game of that day (against Berea), he added two more home runs. Langfels also stole three bases last week. His .429 batting average currently ranks sixth in the OVC. Langfels also tied the EKU career triples mark during the week, netting his 12th in just two seasons against Western. Overall Eastern has won eight of its last nine games and hit an amazing 15 home runs over their last five games. The Colonels will play at Ohio and then host Marshall in mid-week non-conference play before hosting Morehead State in OVC action this weekend.

Jacksonville State (13-8, 2-1 OVC): Jacksonville State won five of six games last week including taking two of three games at Murray State to open the OVC season. With those wins, the Gamecocks improved to 6-1 on the road this year. The week also saw Jax State score neutral site wins over Hartford and Bradley in Florida and win at Troy. Junior Steven Leach hit .417 (10-for-24) last week by posting four multiple-hit games and adding five extra-base hits. In game one Saturday against MSU, Leach hit a three-run home run to tie the game at eight in the top of the ninth inning; JSU would add another run later in the inning and win 9-8. Junior Austin Lucas was named OVC Pitcher of the Week after not allowing an earned run in 14 innings of work last week. That included a complete game shutout win over Bradley and seven solid innings against Murray State. Against the Thoroughbreds he allowed four hits while striking out five and not walking a batter. He lowered his season E.R.A. to 2.22, which ranks fourth in the league. The series win over MSU marked the 13th straight OVC series win for Jax State dating back to the final three series of the 2007 season. The team did see its 15-game OVC winning streak snapped by Murray State on Saturday; that had been the second-longest winning streak in league history (trailing a 17-win streak by Eastern Illinois in 2001). Jacksonville State finally returns home after playing nine straight games away from home. The team will host Troy and then Austin Peay for games this week.

Morehead State (6-15, 0-3 OVC): Morehead State dropped all five of its games last week and has now lost eight games in a row entering this week's competition. The

Eagles lost 13-9 to West Virginia at home and then lost in walk-off fashion at No. 27 Louisville (11-10) during the week. MSU hosted Eastern Illinois in OVC play over the weekend, dropping those three games by a combined margin of 42-21. Junior shortstop Drew Lee hit .450 (9-for-20), had a .500 on-base percentage and a .800 slugging percentage in last week's games. He also handled 31 chances in the field without committing an error and was part of seven double plays. He has a hit in 15 of the team's last 16 games overall. He is hitting .451 in 21 games this season, a mark that is third-best in the OVC. The Eagles will not play any mid-week games this week but instead be off until playing at Eastern Kentucky this weekend.

Murray State (14-7, 1-2 OVC): Murray State split a pair of non-conference games at Central Arkansas last week before dropping two of three OVC contests to Jacksonville State over the weekend. Junior pitcher Daniel Calhoun improved to 5-0 on the season with a complete game three-hitter to top Jacksonville State ace Ben Tootle on Saturday. Calhoun allowed just one earned run and struck out nine as the 'Breds won 3-2. In mid-week action, he struck out two to earn a save against Central Arkansas. His 1.54 E.R.A. on the season currently ranks second in the league. Freshman second baseman Jonathan Craycraft hit .368 (7-for-19) with four runs, a double and two RBI last week. Wes Cunningham has now hit safely in 20 of 21 games this season and reached base safely in every contest on the year. Dating back to last season he has reached base safely in 65 of 66 contests. Murray State will continue its eight-game home stand by hosting Mid-Continent for two games this weeks and then future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville for three games this weekend.

Southeast Missouri (13-8, 3-0 OVC): Southeast Missouri went on the road to battle in-state rival Missouri State during the mid-week and dropped both games in Springfield. But the team rebounded at Tennessee Tech, sweeping the Golden Eagles to put themselves in a tie with Eastern Illinois atop the OVC standings. Sophomore designated hitter Louie Haseltine hit .429 (6-for-14) last week. That included going 3-for-3 with a grand slam, two-run home run and RBI-double in game one against Tennessee Tech on Saturday. In total Haseltine accounted for seven RBI in that game. Junior catcher Jim Klocke has also turned into the team's closer, as he accounted for two more saves last week and now has five on the season, tops in the OVC. He has a 1-0 record and 1.69 E.R.A. on the mound while ranking third on his team in batting average (.365). Outfielder Nick Harris moved into a tie for sixth place in school history with his ninth career triple on Sunday. The Redhawks will play at Arkansas State this week before returning home to host UT Martin in OVC action this weekend.

SIU Edwardsville (3-12): After completing its Spring Break trip to Florida, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville compiled a 1-3 record last week. The Cougars lost 4-1 at Missouri, then 10-3 against Purdue at a neutral site in Martin, Tenn. The week ended with two games against UT Martin, as SIUE won 9-7 and lost 12-5. Josh Street and Adam Eggemeyer each lead the team with a .391 batting average. The team will play regional rival Saint Louis on Wednesday at a neutral site in Sauget, Ill. and then play three games at Murray State this weekend.

Tennessee Tech (10-8, 0-3 OVC): Tennessee Tech dropped a mid-week game to in-state foe Tennessee before being swept at home by Southeast Missouri this past weekend. After starting the season 10-3 overall the team has dropped five straight. Sophomore A.J. Kirby-Jones hit .438 (7-for-16) with three home runs and six RBI last week. He had two home runs and drove in four RBI in the team's 7-5 loss to Tennessee. Kirby-Jones is batting .352 on the season and has a 3.32 E.R.A. in six appearances on the mound. This week the Golden Eagles will play at Belmont and host Middle Tennessee State before traveling to Charleston, Ill. to play three OVC games with Eastern Illinois.

UT Martin (7-10, 0-0 OVC): UT Martin bookended a pair of wins around five total games last week, beating in-state rival Memphis 9-2 to start the week and topping future OVC opponent SIU Edwardsville 12-5 to close the week. The Skyhawks also lost games to Iowa, Purdue (in 10 innings) and SIUE during the week. Senior outfielder Miles Hartsfield hit .450 (9-for-20) with eight RBI last week. He hit safely in all five games and had three multi-hit contests. That included a 2-for-5 performance with a home run and four RBI in the win over Memphis. Hartsfield currently has an 11-game hitting streak. On the mound, junior Coty Green tossed a complete game against Memphis and then struck out eight against SIU Edwardsville as he was 2-0 on the week. The team's 2-through-5 hitters (Scott Gladstone, Mark Hartsfield, Wes Patterson and Miles Hartsfield) each hit .400 or better and accounted for 37 of the team's 72 hits and 23 of the squad's 40 RBI on the week. UT Martin hosts Arkansas-Little Rock for two mid-week games before traveling to Southeast Missouri for three OVC games this weekend.

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: OVC play began this past weekend with two teams sweeping their opponents and taking an early lead in the Conference standings...Eastern Illinois went to Morehead State and scored 42 runs in three games in topping the Eagles...Southeast Missouri State went to Cookeville and swept three games from Tennessee Tech to also improve to 3-0 after one week of Conference play...Preseason favorite Jacksonville State won two of three games at Murray State while Eastern Kentucky went on the road and won two of three from Austin Peay...UT Martin was the only OVC school not to play a Conference game this past weekend; the Skyhawks instead hosted future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville for a pair of games in Martin with each team winning once...This weekend's games include Morehead State at Eastern Kentucky, Austin Peay at Jacksonville State, Tennessee Tech at Eastern Illinois and UT Martin at Southeast Missouri...Murray State will host SIU Edwardsville in non-conference action.

EIU's Morrell One of 30 Student-Athletes Up for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: For his all-around excellence as a student-athlete, **Brian Morrell** of Eastern Illinois baseball has been named one of 30 candidates nationally for the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Morrell is a senior pitcher for the Panthers and has served as the bullpen's long-relief ace each of his upperclassman seasons. The Quincy native carries a 4.0 GPA while majoring in biological sciences. He was an ESPN the Magazine Second Team All-America honoree as a junior. The list of 30 candidates in baseball will be trimmed to a group of 10 finalists in April. Those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote beginning April 15 and concluding May 31. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award. The award, given annually to senior student-athletes across nine NCAA Division I sports, has become one of the most prestigious honors in college athletics. The candidates were selected based on their dedication and achievement in four areas: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition. The Lowe's Senior CLASS Award is distinctive from many other honors in that on-the-field performance is only one factor in determining candidacy – a major emphasis is placed on off-the-field commitments and personal character. An acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college basketball players leaving college early to turn professional.

Murray State's Hill Named Louisville Slugger & Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week: Murray State junior outfielder **Daniel Hill** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and the Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on March 9. Hill (Germantown, Tenn.) helped the 'Breds to a 5-1 week by going 15-for-26 (.577) with two doubles, five home runs, 18 RBIs and nine runs scored. He had a slugging percentage of 1.231 and an on-base percentage of .633. He started the week by going 3-for-4 with a pair of RBIs in a mid-week victory over Freed-Hardeman and followed it up the next day by going 3-for-5 with a home run and three RBIs against Arkansas State. Hill stepped up his game in the four-game series against North Dakota State as he led school-record 28-hit attack in the series opener by going 5-for-7 with a double, three home runs and eight RBIs in the 20-9 victory. He tied the MSU single-game record for hits and home runs in a game. In the first game of a double-header on Saturday, Hill did not get much to hit at the plate as he walked twice and was hit by a pitch in four plate appearances. The Bison did not fare so well in the second game as Hill was 2-for-4 with a double and two RBIs. The series finale turned into a classic slugfest as the 'Breds rallied twice and survived a ninth-inning rally. Hill hit his fifth home run of the week and drove in three runs in the 13-11 victory.

Tootle Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List: Jacksonville State junior pitcher **Ben Tootle** has been named to the preseason Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award Watch List as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award is dedicated to the memory of former Texas Tech player and assistant coach Brooks Wallace. Wallace was a slick-fielding shortstop at Texas Tech from 1977 to 1980. A four-year starter, he was named All-Southwest Conference and All-District his senior year. He led the Red Raiders to their first-ever appearance in the Southwest Conference Tournament in 1980. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player in conjunction with the College Baseball Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. The 2009 award banquet will be at 7 p.m., Thursday, July 2, in the United Spirit Arena on the campus of Texas Tech University.

JSU's Tootle Named to Golden Spikes Watch List: Jacksonville State's **Ben Tootle** has been named to the 2009 Preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List by USA Baseball, marking the organization's first step toward identifying the top player in college baseball. The watch list features 50 of the nation's top collegiate talents and will be presented in 2009 for the 32nd time. The award is sponsored by Major League Baseball. Last season Tootle was named first-team All-OVC after leading the conference with an impressive 10-2 record with two shutouts in 2008. He finished the season with 79 strikeouts, which was the second most in the OVC, and had a 3.87 earned run average. He was named OVC Pitcher of the Week three times during the season after going a perfect 8-0 against conference members. Baseball America named Tootle as the fourth-best prospect from this summer's Cape Cod League, while ESPN's Keith Law has named the Gamecock pitching ace as the 13th best prospect in the country for the 2009 season.

Austin Peay's Tenholder Named to NCBWA's Stopper of the Year Watch List: Austin Peay relief pitcher **Daniel Tenholder** has been named to the initial 40-player watch list for the fifth annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Tenholder returns after posting a 4-1 record and an OVC-best 11 saves in 2008. He ranked 18th nationally in saves last season and is one of the nation's top seven returning relievers. Tenholder compiled a 2.72 ERA in 36.1 innings over 30 appearances, striking out 41 batters. The initial list will be updated with a mid-season release the week of April 16, including the national saves leaders. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts will be selected as finalists and released Wednesday, May 27, prior to start of NCAA regional tournament competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee will then select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced in early June.

JSU's Tootle Named to Numerous Preseason All-American Teams: Jacksonville State junior pitcher **Ben Tootle** was named to four preseason All-American lists this year. Tootle was a first-team NCBWA selection, second-team Louisville Slugger pick and a third-team choice by Ping! and Baseball America. Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** was a third-team pick by Ping! while Southeast Missouri catcher **Jim Klocke** was a honorable mention pick by Ping!.

Jacksonville State Picked as Preseason Favorite For Second Straight Season: For the second year in a row, Jacksonville State has been picked as the preseason favorite for the nine-team league in a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches. The Gamecocks claimed the 2008 regular season championship with a 23-4 record last season but came up just short in the OVC Tournament. The overall voting in the preseason poll was close as Jacksonville State, who received five first-place votes, edged Eastern Illinois, who had the other four first-place votes, by just one total point. Eastern Illinois swept through four games at the OVC Tournament last season on its way to team's first title since 1999 and a berth in the NCAA Regionals. Those two teams were followed by Austin Peay (48 points), Southeast Missouri State (42), Tennessee Tech (38), Murray State (23), Morehead State (22), Eastern Kentucky (20) and UT Martin (10).

Nommensen and Tootle Named Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year: Jacksonville State junior right-hander **Ben Tootle** was tabbed the OVC Preseason Pitcher of the Year while Eastern Illinois senior outfielder **Brett Nommensen** was picked the OVC Preseason Player of the Year in a preseason vote of league head coaches. Nommensen produced gaudy numbers last year in earning All-OVC first-team honors as well as being selected to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. He hit .402 with 82 hits, 56 runs, 18 doubles, five home runs and 36 RBI. His slugging percentage was .603 while his on-base percentage was a league-best .518. Nommensen also stole 18 bases. Tootle, who was named a preseason All-American by numerous outlets has been great in his first two seasons at JSU. In two years with Jax State, Tootle has compiled a 16-5 overall record, including an unblemished 8-0 mark against Conference opponents a season ago. Last season he struck out 79 batters and walked only 29 in 86 innings of work.

SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC: On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).
