## THIS WEEK'S OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### PLAYER

**Jayson Langfels, 3B • So., 6-2, 205 • Lexington, Ky. • Eastern Kentucky**  
Langfels hit .545 (6-for-11) with six runs scored, a double, home run and nine RBI in three games last week. He now leads the OVC with a .458 average and 68 RBI on the season. In a 14-13 victory over Southeast Missouri on Saturday, Langfels was 3-for-5 with four RBI including a three-run home run that tied the game at 13 in the ninth inning. In the series finale he was 2-for-3 with two runs and three RBI including the game-tying score in the bottom of the seventh that tied the game and capped EKU's comeback.

Craycraft earned his second OVC Pitcher of the Week honor of the season after tossing a complete-game shutout in a 12-0 road victory over UT Martin. Over the nine innings Craycraft struck out a career-high nine and did not walk a batter while scattering five hits. Craycraft did not allow a runner to reach third base and set down the side in order four times. He moved to 9-2 on the season with the victory.

## TEAM NOTES

**Austin Peay (20-28, 6-10 OVC):** Austin Peay did not play last week as rain washed away its home Conference series with Eastern Illinois. That left the Governors at 6-10 in Conference play with just three games on the schedule (at Murray State this weekend). Austin Peay will need to win at least two games and hope for some help this weekend to avoid missing the OVC Tournament for the first time since 1998. Austin Peay finished the home season with a 16-11 record at Raymond C. Hand Park, its fewest wins since a 14-victory campaign in 2001. Junior Trey Lucas continues to lead the Gobs in hitting (.380) while Greg Bachman is tops on the squad in RBI (43) and home runs (10). To prepare for its weekend matchup with Murray State, Austin Peay will travel to Lipscomb for a Tuesday afternoon showdown.

**Eastern Illinois (34-10, 12-3 OVC):** Although its three-game Conference series at Austin Peay was cancelled due to rain, Eastern Illinois managed to clinch its fourth OVC regular season championship (1998, 1999, 2001, 2009). The Panthers have been hit hard by weather this spring, having lost a league-best six games (the equivalent of two series) including its last four games overall. EIU is 12-3 in OVC play with three games to be played this weekend. As regular season champions, Eastern will be the No. 1 seed in next week's OVC Tournament; the Panthers are looking to defend their title from a season ago. No team has repeated as OVC Tournament Champions since Middle Tennessee in 1994/1995. At 34-10 overall, Eastern Illinois is just three victories away from tying the program's single-season victory total of 37 in 1998. This week the Panthers will play at Butler (Tuesday) before hosting Eastern Kentucky for three games on Friday/Saturday. It will be the first home game for the team since April 26.

**Eastern Kentucky (26-21, 9-11 OVC):** Eastern Kentucky won two of three home games from Southeast Missouri this past weekend to keep its hopes of its record 26th OVC Tournament appearance (and first since 2007) alive. The Colonels enter this week seventh in the standings, but in a grouping of five teams fighting it out for the final three playoffs spots. EKU must win one more game than rival Morehead State this weekend to secure the tournament berth. Sophomore third baseman Jayson Langfels was named OVC Player of the Week after hitting .545 (6-for-11) with six runs, a double, home runs and nine RBI in three games. He hit a three-run homer in the first game over Southeast Missouri, tying the contest at 13 as EKU would go on to win 14-13. In the rubber match of the series Langfels tied the score at eight in the bottom of the seventh as Eastern would go on to win 11-10. The Colonels will host Dayton in non-conference action on Tuesday before traveling to regular season champion Eastern Illinois this weekend.

**Jacksonville State (28-20, 10-10 OVC):** Jacksonville State traveled to Cookeville last weekend and was swept by Tennessee Tech as the Gamecocks slipped to 10-10 in OVC play after having lost four of its last five Conference contests. In non-conference action last week the team split a home-and-home series with in-state foe UAB. Sophomore outfielder Todd Cunningham hit .524 (11-for-21) with seven runs, a double, home run, three RBI and two stolen bases in five games last week. He had a four-hit performance on Tuesday against UAB, including leading off the game with a home run. He was the first Gamecock to lead off the game with a round tripper since May 2004. Cunningham is now second on the team with 20 multi-hit games, trailing only Steven Leach's 21 multi-hit contests this year. Freshman Kyle Bluestein continues to play well and has reached base safely in each of his past 28 games. Bluestein leads the squad with a .403 batting average in OVC-only contests. Bill Henke now has nine saves on the season, which set the Jax State Division I record (previously eight by Alex Jones). The Gamecocks will play at No. 10 Alabama on Tuesday. JSU has won four-straight games (all this season) against nationally-ranked clubs. This weekend the team will host UT Martin in its final OVC series. Jax State is currently fourth in the standings and would clinch a spot in the tournament field with two wins over UTM.

**Morehead State (16-29, 9-10 OVC):** Morehead State took a step out of Conference play last week to host future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville in its final home series of the season. The Cougars took all three games from the Eagles, winning 8-5, 10-9 and 10-8. Shortstop Drew Lee, who entered the week as the nation's No. 2 hitter, was limited to just two hits on the weekend. He is, however, just six hits shy of the school's single-season record of 85. Lee also only needs 13 more bases to break the MSU single-season total bases mark (162). Freshman Luke Bainer hit .583 (7-for-12) with a run, double, home run and three RBI in the three games. The Eagles will play at in-state rival Kentucky on Tuesday before traveling to Southeast Missouri for its final Conference series on Friday/Saturday. The Eagles can clinch a spot in the field with two wins over SEMO.

**Murray State (30-17-1, 11-7-1 OVC):** Murray State took two of three road games over UT Martin last weekend to improve to 11-7-1 overall in OVC play and clinch a spot in the six-team OVC Tournament field. The Thoroughbreds also reached the 30-win plateau over-

Last season the Eastern Illinois Panthers went undefeated in the event and topped Southeast Missouri in the finals to claim the championship.

The first official OVC Tournament was held in 1980; prior to that only playoff series between divisional winners were played.

all for the first time since the 1999 campaign. The squad has is 10-2-1 in its last 13 games overall and 6-1-1 in its last eight OVC contests. MSU has won its last five Conference series, the first time that has happened since the 1991 season, which was the last time the T'Breds captured the OVC regular season title. The team can secure the No. 2 seed and a first-round bye in the tournament by winning at least one game and also winning one more game that Southeast Missouri does. Junior righty Chris Craycraft was named OVC Pitcher of the Week for the second time this season after tossing a complete game shutout in a 12-0 win over UT Martin on Saturday. Craycraft matched his career-high with nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter in nine innings of work. He scattered five hits and did not allow a runner to reach third base. Craycraft improved to 9-2 on the season with the victory. His fellow pitcher Daniel Calhoun was the loser in the team's 3-2 loss in the second game of that doubleheader; Calhoun is now 10-2 on the season with a 2.00 E.R.A. The pitching staff did not walk a batter in the three games at UTM. Junior outfielder Daniel Hill hit .545 (6-for-11) with five runs scored, two doubles, a home run and four RBI last week. He now has a MSU record 61 RBI this season and needs just two home runs to tie the Thoroughbreds single-season record in that category. Catcher Daniel Miller has started all 48 games this season for Murray State, making him one of just three players at the Division I level to accomplish that feat. MSU will play at Arkansas State on Tuesday before hosting Austin Peay this weekend.

**Southeast Missouri (26-20, 12-8 OVC):** Despite losing two of three games at Eastern Kentucky this past weekend, Southeast Missouri locked up its record 14th-straight OVC Tournament appearance. The Redhawks have made the tournament every year under current head coach Mark Hogan. SEMO can clinch the No. 2 seed in the tournament by winning two or three games this weekend, and winning at least one more contest than Murray State does. In the squad's 12-2 victory in game two of Saturday's doubleheader, James Leigh tossed a seven-inning complete game, striking out seven while allowing two earned runs. Leigh is now 7-1 on the season with a 4.54 E.R.A. in 10 starts (14 total appearances). Offensively, Jim Klocke hit .600 (6-for-10) with a home run while Matt Wagner added a home run and seven RBI. The Redhawks will have the mid-week off in preparation for Morehead State at Capaha Park on Friday/Saturday. Southeast can finish as high as No. 2 in the standings after this week's play.

**SIU Edwardsville (14-32):** SIU Edwardsville went on the road and took a three-game series from future OVC foe Morehead State, winning by margins of 8-5, 10-9 and 10-8. That marked the last contest against an OVC team this season, as SIUE played six of its nine future foes during the season. SIUE finished 5-12 in those games, picking up the three wins against Morehead State and a single win against each Murray State and UT Martin. In Sunday's come-from-behind victory, the Cougars scored eight total runs in the seventh and eighth innings to pull out the win. That came after managing just two hits over the first six innings of the game. Dustin Quattrocchi earned the victory in relief on Sunday while Aren Cummings picked up his first save. Josh Street finished the three-game series 8-for-12 (.667) at the plate with two home runs and four RBI. SIUE has a neutral site game (Sauget, Ill.) with Saint Louis University on Wednesday before heading to Normal, Ill. for a three-game set with Illinois State this weekend.

**Tennessee Tech (25-20-1, 10-11-1 OVC):** Needing wins for a chance to make the six-team OVC Tournament field, Tennessee Tech did just that, sweeping preseason favorite Jacksonville State at home this past weekend to improve to 10-11-1 in Conference play. That is key for the Golden Eagles who are idle from league play this weekend. Tech currently sits in fifth place in the standings and will clinch a spot as long as Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky do not each win twice and Jacksonville State wins once this weekend. Senior Michael Alcorn had one of his best performances on Sunday, tossing a complete game in the 6-4 win over JSU. Alcorn struck out a career-high 12 batters and walked only one over the nine innings. Offensively A.J. Kirby-Jones hit two more home runs last week, both of which came in the series opener, a 5-1 Tech victory. Kirby-Jones now had 16 round trippers on the season, four shy of the single-season Golden Eagle record. His next home run will tie him for second in TTU single-season history. As Tennessee Tech does not play an OVC series this weekend, the Golden Eagles will instead play a three-game set with Southern Miss from Thursday through Saturday. TTU is just 5-11-1 away from home this year.

**UT Martin (17-29, 6-15 OVC):** UT Martin dropped two of three games to Murray State over the weekend at home. The losses mathematically eliminated the Skyhawks from the OVC Tournament field. Mark Hartsfield hit .500 in the Murray State series, going 5-for-10 with three RBI. In the Skyhawks 3-2 victory in game two of Saturday's doubleheader, Coty Green tossed a complete game en route to his fourth victory of the season. Green scattered eight hits and gave up two runs in the seven-inning contest. Scott Gladstone enters the final week of the season 18 hits away from the school's single-season record (96). UTM will play a non-conference game at Belmont on Tuesday before traveling to Jacksonville State this weekend.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** Rain figured into the OVC slate of games once again this weekend, completely raining out the Eastern Illinois at Austin Peay series in Clarksville...And despite not playing Eastern Illinois clinched its fourth OVC regular season title as no team can catch the Panthers in the standings even if EIU loses all three games to Eastern Kentucky this coming weekend...Eastern Illinois will be the No. 1 seed in the 2009 OVC Baseball Championship which will be held at historic Brooks Stadium in Paducah, Ky. May 20-23 (24)...Eastern Illinois is also making a case for itself for an NCAA Tournament at-large berth should it not win the OVC Tournament; the Panthers were No. 39 in last week's NCAA RPI rankings...Murray State and Southeast Missouri have also locked up berths in the six-team OVC field...Five other teams will compete for the final three spots; only UT Martin has been mathematically eliminated from tournament consideration...Murray State will host Austin Peay this weekend; the Governors need at least two wins and then some help this weekend to avoid missing the OVC Tournament for the first time since 1998 (the 10 straight appearances is the fourth longest in OVC history)...Southeast Missouri will be making its 14th-straight OVC Tournament appearance (every season under head coach Mark Hogan), which is the longest consecutive streak in league history (passing a 13-year streak by Eastern Kentucky from 1981-93)...Southeast Missouri will host Morehead State this weekend; the Eagles are looking to close strong and make its first OVC Tournament appearance since 2005...Preseason favorite Jacksonville State will host UT Martin this weekend; the Gamecocks needs to win a few games to keep from missing the tournament for the first time since joining the OVC...Tennessee Tech, who swept Jax State last weekend, has finished OVC play for the season and are 10-11-1 overall; the Golden Eagles, currently in fifth place, will have to wait to see which teams win this weekend before its fate is known.

**Eastern Illinois Claims 2009 OVC Regular Season Championship:** Despite having its last four OVC games rained out Eastern Illinois claimed its fourth OVC regular season championship on May 10 as no team can catch it in the league standings. The Panthers also won OVC Championships in 1998, 1999 and 2001. The Panthers are 12-3 in the league with three games with Eastern Kentucky this weekend remaining. It marks the fourth straight year the OVC has had a different regular season champion (Samford, Austin Peay, Jacksonville State). The Panthers were picked second in the preseason coaches poll. But winning the regular season title does not guarantee success in the OVC Tournament; over the last six years only Austin Peay in 2007 has claimed both championships in the same calendar year.

**Rain Wrecks Havoc on OVC Schedule:** So far this year Mother Nature has not been kind to OVC contests, as 10 Conference games have been cancelled due to rain. Every team except UT Martin has had at least one game cancelled with league-leading Eastern Illinois being effected the most (6 cancelled games).

**Six OVC Players Named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District First-Team:** Six Ohio Valley Conference baseball student-athletes have been named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District first-team as selected by CoSIDA. The selections included four players from District IV (Morehead State's **Drew Lee** and **Michael Bottoms**, Murray State **Wes Cunningham** and Jacksonville State's **Todd Cunningham**), one player from District V (Eastern Illinois' **Brian Morrell**) and one player from District VII (Southeast Missouri's **Jim Klocke**). For making the first-team each player will have his name appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American later this month. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average.

**OVC Hitters Among the Best Nationally:** In the latest NCAA statistical rankings (May 3), the OVC has four players who are among the Top 12 nationally in batting average. Morehead State's **Drew Lee** is second nationally (.456), Eastern Kentucky's **Jayson Langfels** is fourth (.451) while teammate **Matt Davis** is ninth (.438) and UT Martin's **Scott Gladstone** is 12th (.434). EIU's **Brett Nommensen**, who is currently injured, has a batting average of .521 and would be the nation's leader but does not currently have enough at-bats.

**OVC Players/Teams Among National Leaders:** Through last week's NCAA rankings (May 3), EIU's **Matt Davis** is first nationally in runs per game (1.62). Teammate **Jayson Langfels** is second nationally in RBI/game (1.64), eighth in slugging (.824) and third in triples (0.17). Another EIU player - **Aaron Barrows** - is second in triples (0.18) while JSU's Todd Cunningham is sixth (0.16). Morehead State's **Drew Lee** is third in slugging (.870) and fifth in total bases (147). Murray State's **Daniel Hill** is seventh in RBI (1.54/game) and teammate **Daniel Calhoun** is third in victories (10), eighth in E.R.A. (1.80) and third in walks allowed (0.72 per 9 innings). As a team Eastern Illinois is second in batting (.366), third in slugging (.604), seventh in home runs (1.93/game) and ninth in scoring (9.5 runs/game). Eastern Kentucky ranks ninth in hitting (.350), fifth in scoring (9.6) and second in triples (0.66/game). Morehead State ranks first in double plays per game (1.36).

tucky sophomore lefty **Paul Duncan** tossed the first no-hitter in the OVC this year (and sixth in ECU history) on May 2 against Chicago State. The performance earned him National Pitcher of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball News. Duncan walked the first batter of the game and then walked only one other the rest of the way while striking out eight batters over the seven-inning game. The performance was his third complete game of the season. It marked the first no-hitter for ECU since Christian Friedrich's did so in 2006.

#### **Lee and Kreke Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List for Nation Best Shortstop:**

Two Ohio Valley Conference shortstops have been named to the initial watch list for the 2009 Brooks Wallace Award, given to the country's finest shortstop, and announced by the College Baseball Foundation and Mizuno. The two players are Eastern Illinois' **Jordan Kreke** and Morehead State's **Drew Lee**. For the first time since its creation in 2004, the Wallace Award will honor the country's finest shortstop. Previously, the Wallace Award was given to the national player of the year. The change was made following the creation of the College Baseball Awards Show, in collaboration with the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and the Dick Howser Trophy Committee. The Howser Trophy has recognized the best overall player in the country for 23 years and will continue to do so. Both the Wallace Award and the Howser Award will be presented as part of the College Baseball Awards Show on July 2 in Lubbock. The College Baseball Awards Show will recognize the top players in college baseball as part of the CBF's annual celebration, which also includes the National College Baseball Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony. In addition to the Brooks Wallace Award, other awards presented during the show will include the Dick Howser Trophy for the national player of the year, and the National Pitcher of the Year Award.

**Calhoun and Recchia Named to CBF's National Pitcher of the Year Watch List:** Two Ohio Valley Conference pitchers - Eastern Illinois' **Mike Recchia** and Murray State's **Daniel Calhoun** - have been named to the College Baseball Foundation (CBF) first watch list for the inaugural presentation of the Pitcher of the Year Award. Sponsored by Mizuno, the Pitcher of the Year is a new award that will be presented at the July 2 College Baseball Awards Show. The CBF's annual celebration also includes the National College Baseball Hall of Fame Ceremony, and the announcement of the winners of the Brooks Wallace Award (national shortstop of the year) and the Dick Howser Trophy (national player of the year).

**JSU Knocks Off No. 1 Georgia:** On April 22 Jacksonville State topped No. 1 ranked Georgia (USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll) 9-7 in Jacksonville. It marked the first time the Gamecocks had knocked off the No. 1 team in the nation and is believed to be the first time an OVC school has topped the a topped-ranked team. Austin Peay had the last great chance to beat the nation's No. 1, losing in extra innings to No. 1 Vanderbilt in the NCAA Regional in 2007. **EIU's Nommensen Out 4-6 Weeks With Wrist Injury:** Eastern Illinois baseball senior center fielder **Brett Nommensen** will undergo a medical procedure on April 21 after suffering a fracture to the "hook" of the hamate bone in his right wrist. A complete recovery is expected in 4-6 weeks. Nommensen was hitting .521 with 13 doubles and 11 home runs prior to the injury. As of April 13, he was leading the nation in on-base (.649) and slugging percentages (1.021) while ranking second in batting average.

**Lee Hits Five Home Runs in Doubleheader; Three From Left Side of Plate and Two From Right Side of Plate:** In a doubleheader split against UT Martin on April 18, Morehead State junior shortstop **Drew Lee** hit three home runs in the first game and two home runs in the second game of the twin-bill. The interesting fact is that all three home runs in the first game came from the left-side of the plate while the two home runs in the nightcap were from the right-side of the plate.

**Nommensen Named a Mid-Season All-American by Baseball America:** Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** has been one of 10 position players in the nation named to Baseball America's Midseason All-America Team. At the time of the honor, Nommensen entered the week leading the country in on-base and slugging percentages, while also ranking second in batting average. Baseball America's lead college writer Aaron Fitt selected a nine-player lineup based on positions along with a utility player (pitcher and hitter). The pitching staff featured six hurlers. Fresno State's Tom Mendonca (third base), San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg (starting pitcher) and Nommensen were the only three players among the 15 recognized that play for universities not affiliated with the big six BCS conferences.

**Eastern Illinois Spends Two Weeks in Collegiate Baseball News National Polls:** Eastern Illinois became the first OVC school in a long time (believed to be since the 1996 season) to break into the national polls when they entered the Collegiate Baseball News poll at No.

27 on April 6. It marked the first time the Panthers have been ranked at the Division I level. The Panthers were No. 29 a week later but dropped out of the national polls on April 20 after losing two of three games to Jacksonville State. Eastern Illinois is still among the teams receiving votes in several of the polls. EIU has a win over then No. 15 ranked Oklahoma (the Sooners are No. 10 in this week's NCBWA poll) and key road win over in-state rival Illinois. The Panthers still rank among the Top 40 (No. 39) in the latest RPI rankings.

**OVC Players in the Pros:** Entering the 2009 season, there were five players from OVC schools on Major League Baseball Opening Day rosters. Austin Peay has the distinction of having three former players on teams including 2008 All-Star reliever **George Sherrill** (Baltimore), reliever **Jamie Walker** (Baltimore) and rookie pitcher **Shawn Kelley** (Seattle). Former Morehead State pitcher **Jon Rauch** is a setup man in Arizona while former Eastern Kentucky outfielder **Josh Anderson** is a backup in Detroit. Two other former OVC players are on 40-man rosters but will not begin the season with the major league club. Those two players are Austin Peay catcher A.J. Ellis (L.A. Dodgers) and pitcher **Ehren Wassermann** (who played for Samford when they were in the OVC). One OVC school - Eastern Illinois - has two alumni who are coaching at the highest level of professional baseball. Former Panther **Kevin Seitzer** is the Kansas City Royals hitting coach with **Tim Lincecum** is the Boston Red Sox first base coach.

**Austin Peay's Tenholder on NCBWA's Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List:** Austin Peay relief pitcher **Daniel Tenholder** has been named to the updated midseason National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Tenholder, who was also on the preseason list released in February, has five saves in 20 total appearances in 2009. He has 29 strikeouts in 31.1 innings of work. Last season Tenholder posted a 4-1 record and an OVC-best 11 saves. He ranked 18th nationally in saves and compiled a 2.72 ERA in 36.1 innings over 30 appearances, striking out 41 batters. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts will be selected as finalists and released Wednesday, May 27, prior to start of NCAA regional tournament competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee will then select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced in early June.

**Nommensen Named National Hitter of the Week by the NCBWA:** Eastern Illinois outfielder **Brett Nommensen** was named the Pro-Line Athletic National Hitter of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association on April 6. Nommensen hit .769 (10-of-13) with seven runs scored, two doubles, three home runs and nine RBIs in the four EIU wins last week. He reached base safely in 14 of his 17 plate appearances, including in each of his first 13 trips to the plate. Nommensen homered twice in a 12-8 road win over Saint Louis, including leading off the game with a home run for the fourth time this season. He hit a two-run home run in game one against Murray State and knocked in the first run in the second game of that doubleheader (a 2-1 EIU victory). The NCBWA Board reviews candidates from every NCAA Division I conference each week and names winners on Tuesdays throughout the season. Founded in 1962, the NCBWA is dedicated to the advancement of college baseball. Membership is open to writers, broadcasters and publicists of the sport.

**Murray State's Hill Named Louisville Slugger & Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week:** Murray State junior outfielder **Daniel Hill** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and the Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on March 9. Hill (Germantown, Tenn.) helped the 'Breds to a 5-1 week by going 15-for-26 (.577) with two doubles, five home runs, 18 RBIs and nine runs scored. He had a slugging percentage of 1.231 and an on-base percentage of .633. He started the week by going 3-for-4 with a pair of RBIs in a mid-week victory over Freed-Hardeman and followed it up the next day by going 3-for-5 with a home run and three RBIs against Arkansas State. Hill stepped up his game in the four-game series against North Dakota State as he led school-record 28-hit attack in the series opener by going 5-for-7 with a double, three home runs and eight RBIs in the 20-9 victory. He tied the MSU single-game record for hits and home runs in a game. In the first game of a doubleheader on Saturday, Hill did not get much to hit at the plate as he walked twice and was hit by a pitch in four plate appearances. The Bison did not fare so well in the second game as Hill was 2-for-4 with a double and two RBIs. The series finale turned into a classic slugfest as the 'Breds rallied twice and survived a ninth-inning rally. Hill hit his fifth home run of the week and drove in three runs in the 13-11 victory.

**EIU's Morrell One of 30 Student-Athletes Up for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award:** For his all-around excellence as a student-athlete, **Brian Morrell** of Eastern Illinois baseball has been named one of 30 candidates nationally for the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Morrell is a senior pitcher for the Panthers and has served as the bullpen's long-relief ace each of his upperclassman seasons. The Quincy native carries a 4.0 GPA while majoring in biological sciences. He was an ESPN the Magazine Second Team All-America honoree as a junior. The list of 30 candidates in baseball will be trimmed to a group of 10 finalists in April. Those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote beginning April 15 and concluding May 31. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award. The award, given annually to senior student-athletes across nine NCAA Division I sports, has become one of the most prestigious honors in college athletics. The candidates were selected based on their dedication and achievement in four areas: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition. The Lowe's Senior CLASS Award is distinctive from many other honors in that on-the-field performance is only one factor in determining candidacy - a major emphasis is placed on off-the-field commitments and personal character. An acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college basketball players leaving college early to turn professional.

**JSU's Tootle Named to Golden Spikes Watch List:** Jacksonville State's **Ben Tootle** has been named to the 2009 Preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List by USA Baseball, marking the organization's first step toward identifying the top player in college baseball.

The watch list features 50 of the nation's top collegiate talents and will be presented in 2009 for the 32nd time. The award is sponsored by Major League Baseball. Last season Tootle was named first-team All-OVC after leading the conference with an impressive 10-2 record with two shutouts in 2008. He finished the season with 79 strikeouts, which was the second most in the OVC, and had a 3.87 earned run average. He was named OVC Pitcher of the Week three times during the season after going a perfect 8-0 against conference members. Baseball America named Tootle as the fourth-best prospect from this summer's Cape Cod League, while ESPN's Keith Law has named the Gamecock pitching ace as the 13th best prospect in the country for the 2009 season.

**JSU's Tootle Named to Numerous Preseason All-American Teams:** Jacksonville State junior pitcher **Ben Tootle** was named to four preseason All-American lists this year. Tootle was a first-team NCBWA selection, second-team Louisville Slugger pick and a third-team choice by Ping! and Baseball America. Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** was a third-team pick by Ping! while Southeast Missouri catcher **Jim Klocke** was a honorable mention pick by Ping!.

**Five OVC Coaches Coaching at Their Alma Mater:** This season five of the nine OVC head baseball coaches are currently coaching at their alma maters, including first-year head coach **Jason Stein** at Eastern Kentucky. Stein played at ECU from 1992-95 and graduated in 1997. He played against Morehead State head coach **Jay Sorg** who was at MSU from 1992-94. Ironically in the 1994 season, Sorg was named OVC Player of the Week on April 11 while Stein earned the same honor on May 2. The other coaches currently at their alma mater are Austin Peay's **Gary McClure** (1987), Murray State **Rob McDonald** (1984) and Southeast Missouri's **Mark Hogan** (1977).

**Jacksonville State Picked as Preseason Favorite For Second Straight Season:** For the second year in a row, Jacksonville State has been picked as the preseason favorite for the nine-team league in a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches. The Gamecocks claimed the 2008 regular season championship with a 23-4 record last season but came up just short in the OVC Tournament. The overall voting in the preseason poll was close as Jacksonville State, who received five first-place votes, edged Eastern Illinois, who had the other four first-place votes, by just one total point. Eastern Illinois swept through four games at the OVC Tournament last season on its way to team's first title since 1999 and a berth in the NCAA Regionals. Those two teams were followed by Austin Peay (48 points), Southeast Missouri State (42), Tennessee Tech (38), Murray State (23), Morehead State (22), Eastern Kentucky (20) and UT Martin (10).

**Nommensen and Tootle Named Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year:** Jacksonville State junior right-hander **Ben Tootle** was tabbed the OVC Preseason Pitcher of the Year while Eastern Illinois senior outfielder **Brett Nommensen** was picked the OVC Preseason Player of the Year in a preseason vote of league head coaches. Nommensen produced gaudy numbers last year in earning All-OVC first-team honors as well as being selected to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. He hit .402 with 82 hits, 56 runs, 18 doubles, five home runs and 36 RBI. His slugging percentage was .603 while his on-base percentage was a league-best .518. Nommensen also stole 18 bases. Tootle, who was named a preseason All-American by numerous outlets has been great in his first two seasons at JSU. In two years with Jax State, Tootle has compiled a 16-5 overall record, including an unblemished 8-0 mark against Conference opponents a season ago. Last season he struck out 79 batters and walked only 29 in 86 innings of work.

**SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC:** On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).
