PLAYER

Daniel Adamson, OF • Jr., 5-11, 210 • Centerpoint, Ala. • Jacksonville State
Adamson hit .417 (5-for-12) with three runs, a double, two home runs and six RBI in three games last week. In the Gamecocks win over No. 6 Georgia (the second win over the nationally-ranked Bulldogs in a week), Adamson was 3-for-5 with a double, home runs and four RBI. His two-run homer in the third inning cut the UGA lead to one run and his double in the eighth cut the lead to 8-7. An inning later he drew a bases loaded walk as Jax State scored nine runs in the final frame to win 16-8. Adamson added a two-run home run in a 3-0 win over Morehead State on Saturday.

PITCHER

Paul Duncan, LHP • So., 6-4, 190 • Northfield, Ill. • Eastern Kentucky
Duncan tossed the first no-hitter in the OVC this season and sixth no-hitter in Eastern Kentucky history on Saturday against Chicago State. Duncan walked the first batter he faced and then cruised the rest of the way, walking only one additional batter while striking out eight. Duncan struck out four of the last five batters he faced. Of the seven complete games by ECU pitchers this year, Duncan now has three of them. He was the first ECU pitcher to toss a no-hitter since Christian Friedrich did so in 2006.

TEAM NOTES

Austin Peay (20-28, 6-10 OVC): Austin Peay compiled a 2-3 record last week, losing non-conference games at Western Kentucky and Middle Tennessee and taking two of three Conference games at UT Martin. The two OVC wins were key, as the Governors are now just outside of sixth place in the league standings with six OVC contests to play. Austin Peay is hoping to avoid missing the OVC Tournament for the first time since the 1998 season. The series win over UT Martin was the first this season for the Governors in Conference play. Junior hurler Daniel Tenholder made three appearances last week, picking up a win as well as posting his seventh save of the season; he pitched 5.1 total innings and did not allow a run. Sophomore Greg Bachman recorded his second multi-home run game of the season, doing so against UT Martin this past weekend; he now leads the team in home runs (10), RBI (43) and slugging (.624). Freshman shortstop Jon Clinard ran his stolen base streak to 20 without being caught last week. As a team APSU recorded its 100th stole base of the season in the first game at UTM; it marks the ninth time in Governor history the team has more than 100 swipes in a season (and first time since 2002). Austin Peay will look to continue its OVC success this weekend when league-leading Eastern Illinois comes to town.

Eastern Illinois (34-10, 12-3 OVC): League-leading Eastern Illinois remained atop the OVC standings by winning two games at second-place Southeast Missouri over the weekend; a third game was cancelled due to rain, marking the third OVC contest of the year the Panthers have been unable to play due to poor weather. EIU has now clinched a spot in the six-team OVC Tournament which will be played May 20-24. It marked the first time since 2003 that the Panthers had won a series in Cape Girardeau. In non-conference action last week the team lost 7-4 in a neutral site game against Missouri; that game was played with wooden bats. Senior Jordan Kreke hit .545 (6-for-11) with three runs, three doubles and three RBI last week; he also pitched an inning of scoreless relief against Mizzou and closed out game two of the doubleheader against Southeast. Kreke is now hitting .557 (34-for-61) with 32 RBI in Conference play this season. Eastern hit six home runs in game one of Saturday's doubleheader with SEMO. Mike Recchia picked up his team-leading eighth victory of the season on Saturday. Eastern Illinois will look to take another step closer to its first OVC regular season crown since 2001 this weekend when its plays at Austin Peay. The Panthers enter this week having won six of its last seven games overall.

Eastern Kentucky (24-20, 7-10 OVC): Eastern Kentucky stepped out of Conference play last week, losing at Miami (Ohio) mid-week and then hosting Chicago State for three games over the weekend. EKV was able to snap out of a mini-slump by sweeping Chicago State, winning games by scores of 15-3, 15-0 and 10-1. The highlight was the first game of the day on Saturday, when sophomore lefty Paul Duncan tossed the sixth no-hitter in Eastern Kentucky history, allowing two walks and striking out eight in seven innings of work. The no-hitter was the first for the program since 2006 when Christian Friedrich tossed one in 2006. Freshman shortstop Richie Rodriguez hit .500 (6-for-12) with eight runs scored, four doubles, six RBI and three stolen bases in four games. In game two against Chicago State, Rodriguez was 3-for-4 with two runs scored and four RBI. Eastern Kentucky, who currently sits in sixth place in the OVC standings, will look to move up in the standings with three home games against second-place Southeast Missouri State this coming weekend.

Jacksonville State (27-16, 10-7 OVC): For the second week in a row Jacksonville State topped nationally-ranked Georgia. Last week the Gamecocks topped then No. 1 ranked Georgia at home, and this past week JSU went to Athens and won 16-8 over then No. 6 Georgia. It marked the fourth straight victory over a nationally-ranked opponent for the Gamecocks. Jax State scored nine runs in the ninth inning to come from behind and secure the win over the Bulldogs. Junior outfielder Daniel Adamson was named OVC Player of the Week after hitting .417 (5-for-12) with three runs, two home runs and six RBI last week. He was 3-for-5 with four RBI and a home run in the UGA victory. He also added a two-run homer in the team's 3-0 victory over Morehead State on Saturday. That win came after the Gamecocks had lost game one of the series to the Eagles by a 6-2 margin. Morehead State was winning 12-5 in the top of the fifth on Sunday before rains came and forced the cancellation of the game. The leaves JSU 10-7 in OVC play, which is fourth overall, just percentage points out of third place. Junior closer Bill Henke picked up the win over No. 6 Georgia, holding the Bulldogs hitless over the final two innings, and followed that with a save in the 3-0 shutout over MSU over the weekend; Henke's nine saves is the most in the school's Division I history. Kyle Bluestein has reached base safely in 23 straight games and leads the team in hitting in OVC-only games (.426). JSU is the one of two OVC teams playing mid-week non-conference games this week, as they host UAB on Tuesday and playing at UAB on Wednesday. This weekend the Gamecocks will play at Tennessee Tech.

Morehead State (16-26, 9-10 OVC): Morehead State dropped a rain-shortened game at West Virginia to open the week and then split a pair of Conference games at Jacksonville State over the weekend. Morehead State won game one 6-2 before losing the second game of Saturday's doubleheader 3-0. The Eagles were winning 12-5 in the top of the fifth inning on Sunday before rains delayed and ultimately cancelled the game. Junior shortstop Drew Lee hit .333 during the week and upped his league-leading hit total to 77, just eight hits shy of the MUS single-season record. In the latest

The first official OVC Tournament was held in 1980; prior to that only playoff series between divisional winners were played.

set of NCAA statistical rankings, Lee is second nationally in batting average (.463). Quentin Morgan picked up the win at JSU, tossing six innings of three-hit baseball before Michael Bottoms came on for the final three innings to record his fourth save of the season. The Eagles are currently in fifth place in the league standings, a game ahead of sixth place Eastern Kentucky. The Eagles, who will play non-conference games this coming weekend, have only three OVC games left on their schedule (at Southeast Missouri next weekend). This week the team will host future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville.

Murray State (28-16-1, 9-6-1 OVC): Murray State has taken over as the hottest team in the league, suffering only one loss over its last 10 games. The Thoroughbreds are 4-0-1 in their last five Conference contests which was vaulted them into third place in the standings with two weekends of play left. The 'Breds are just one game behind second place Southeast Missouri (a team they won two of three from earlier this season) and three games out of first place. Last week's results included a non-conference win at Belmont (12-3) and two wins and a tie against Tennessee Tech. The tie came on Sunday when the score was tied at 1-1 in the fifth inning and rains prevented the game from going farther. Junior lefty Daniel Calhoun tossed another complete game (his eighth of the season) in game two on Saturday. He allowed one run and five hits while striking out nine (without walking anyone). He is one of just six batters nationally to reach double-digit victories (10) on the season. Calhoun lowered his E.R.A. to 1.80 on the season and he has 74 strikeouts and just six walks in 75 innings of work. Calhoun's eight complete games are now third most in Murray State single-season history; he is just one win shy of tying Kirk Rueter's single-season record. Murray State now has 28 wins on the season, the best under head coach Rob McDonald. The team's 19 home victories are just two shy of the single-season record set in 2001. This week the Thoroughbreds will travel to UT Martin for three league games.

Southeast Missouri (25-18, 11-6 OVC): Southeast Missouri played just twice last week as three of its games were cancelled due to poor weather. The team was scheduled to play two games at Central Arkansas during the middle of the week, but did not even make the trip due to a poor weather forecast. The Redhawks then dropped a Saturday home double-header to Eastern Illinois, losing by identical 8-7 margins. Southeast was unable to try to make up ground on first-place EIU on Sunday, as rain cancelled the final game of the series. Louie Haseltine led the team in hitting last week, going 3-for-5 (.600) with a double, home run and two RBI in two games. Matt Wagner added a home run and three RBI for the Redhawks. Despite losing the two games to Eastern Illinois, the Redhawks are still in second place in the Conference standings, just two games behind the Panthers. Southeast Missouri State will play at Eastern Kentucky in OVC action this coming weekend.

SIU Edwardsville (11-32): SIU Edwardsville won a pair of games last week, sandwiching them between a trio of losses. The week began with a 2-1 road win over Bradley. Mike Hurt hit a two-run home run in the first inning and that proved to be the only runs the Cougars would need. On the mound Mitchell Fairley did not allow a run over seven innings in picking up his third victory of the season. SIUE then lost a pair of 1-run games at Evansville, falling 3-2 and 7-6 in extra innings. The third game of the series also went to the Purple Aces, as UE no-hit the Cougars in a 9-0 win. Despite that setback the SIU Edwardsville rebounded with a 10-9 win in 13 innings on Sunday. Zach Hawkins drove in the game-winner for SIUE with a single. Aren Cummings earned the victory for the Cougars, throwing 10.1 innings of relief, allowing just two runs (one earned) and six hits while striking out seven. Cummings threw 140 pitches in the outing. This week the Cougars will travel to Morehead State for a three-game series.

Tennessee Tech (22-20-1, 7-11-1 OVC): Tennessee Tech began last week with a win and ended it with a tie as the Golden Eagles are now 7-11-1 in OVC play, which puts them in seventh place in the standings, just a half game out of the final spot for the OVC Tournament field with two weekends of games left. Tech topped Alabama A&M 7-1 and lost to Western Carolina before traveling to Murray State. The Golden Eagles lost the first two games of the OVC series 10-7 and 4-1 before tying 1-1 in Sunday's finale. It marked the team's second tie in as many seasons; the squad tied Middle Tennessee 6-6 in Feb. 2008. A.J. Kirby-Jones hit his 14th home run of the season last week, placing him fourth on the school's single-season list. Junior lefty Chason Choate pitched 14.2 innings in two games last week, allowing three earned runs while striking out eight total batters. Against Alabama A&M, he went eight strong innings, allowing one run on four hits while striking out five and picking up the victory. Tennessee Tech will play three games at home against Jacksonville State this weekend.

UT Martin (16-27, 5-13 OVC): UT Martin hosted Austin Peay this past weekend, losing the first two before taking the finale by a 6-1 margin. The win on Sunday ended a four-game slide for the Skyhawks. That game was called after five innings due to rain. The teams were lucky to play all three contests over the weekend, as 6.1 inches of rain fell in Martin over the weekend. UTM is the only OVC team not to lose a conference game due to weather this season. Senior Scott Gladstone hit .714 (5-for-7) with four runs, two doubles, a home run and two RBI. He now has a seven-game hitting streak after seeing his season-best 31-game streak recently come to an end. Senior Tanner Hensley picked up his fourth victory of the season on Sunday, pitching five innings and allowing five hits while striking out two batters. UT Martin will play at Arkansas State on Wednesday before hosting Murray State for three games over the weekend.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: With two weekends of play left in the regular season, Eastern Illinois is the only team that has locked itself into the six-team OVC Tournament which will be held in Paducah, Ky. from May 20-24...Eastern Illinois finds itself in first place, two games ahead of Southeast Missouri, a team it won two games from this weekend (the third game was rained out)...Southeast Missouri is alone in second place ahead of Murray State, who has won or tied in seven of its last eight games...The Thoroughbreds are percentage points ahead of preseason favorite Jacksonville State, while Morehead State is fifth and Eastern Kentucky is sixth...Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay are just outside the top six while UT Martin is slightly behind each of those teams...EKU's Paul Duncan was named National Player of the Week after tossing the sixth no-hitter in Colonel history on Saturday; he walked two and struck out eight in a 15-0 victory over Chicago State...The non-conference slate is light this week, as only Jacksonville State and UT Martin will play games mid-week...This weekend Morehead State will play host future OVC foe SIU Edwardsville...In OVC action, Southeast Missouri plays at Eastern Kentucky, Eastern Illinois plays Austin Peay, Jacksonville State is at Tennessee Tech and Murray State plays at UT Martin.

EKU's Duncan Tosses No-Hitter; Named National Pitcher of the Week: Eastern Kentucky sophomore lefty **Paul Duncan** tossed the first no-hitter in the OVC this year (and sixth in EKU history) on May 2 against Chicago State. The performance earned him National Pitcher of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball News. Duncan walked the first batter of the game and then walked only one other the rest of the way while striking out eight batters over the seven-inning game. The performance was his third complete game of the season. It marked the first no-hitter for EKU since Christian Friedrich's did so in 2006.

Rain Wrecks Havoc on OVC Schedule: So far this year Mother Nature has not been kind to OVC contests, as seven Conference games have been cancelled due to rain. Every team except UT Martin has had at least one game cancelled with league-leading Eastern Illinois being effected the most (3 cancelled games). This past weekend two games were cancelled and two others ended after only five innings due to rain (including the Murray State/Tennessee Tech game which ended in a tie).

Lee and Kreke Named to Brooks Wallace Award Watch List for Nation Best Shortstop: Two Ohio Valley Conference shortstops have been named to the initial watch list for the 2009 Brooks Wallace Award, given to the country's finest shortstop, and announced by the College Baseball Foundation and Mizuno. The two players are Eastern Illinois' **Jordan Kreke** and Morehead State's **Drew Lee**. For the first time since its creation in 2004, the Wallace Award will honor the country's finest shortstop. Previously, the Wallace Award was given to the national player of the year. The change was made following the creation of the College Baseball Awards Show, in collaboration with the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and the Dick Howser Trophy Committee. The Howser Trophy has recognized the best overall player in the country for 23 years and will continue to do so. Both the Wallace Award and the Howser Award will be presented as part of the College Baseball Awards Show on July 2 in Lubbock. The College Baseball Awards Show will recognize the top players in college baseball as part of the CBF's annual celebration, which also includes the National College Baseball Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony. In addition to the Brooks Wallace Award, other awards presented during the show will include the Dick Howser Trophy for the national player of the year, and the National Pitcher of the Year Award.

Calhoun and Recchia Named to CBF's National Pitcher of the Year Watch List: Two Ohio Valley Conference pitchers - Eastern Illinois' **Mike Recchia** and Murray State's **Daniel Calhoun** - have been named to the College Baseball Foundation (CBF) first watch list for the inaugural presentation of the Pitcher of the Year Award. Sponsored by Mizuno, the Pitcher of the Year is a new award that will be presented at the July 2 College Baseball Awards Show. The CBF's annual celebration also includes the National College Baseball Hall of Fame Ceremony, and the announcement of the winners of the Brooks Wallace Award (national shortstop of the year) and the Dick Howser Trophy (national player of the year).

JSU Knocks Off No. 1 Georgia: On April 22 Jacksonville State topped No. 1 ranked Georgia (USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll) 9-7 in Jacksonville. It marked the first time the Gamecocks had knocked off the No. 1 team in the nation and is believed to be the first time an OVC school has topped the a topped-ranked team. Austin Peay had the last great chance to beat the nation's No. 1, losing in extra innings to No. 1 Vanderbilt in the NCAA Regional in 2007. Overall this season OVC teams are 6-8 against nationally-ranked non-conference foes. Below is a list of OVC teams who have beaten ranked squads this season.

EIU's Nommensen Out 4-6 Weeks With Wrist Injury: Eastern Illinois baseball senior center fielder **Brett Nommensen** will undergo a medical procedure on April 21 after suffering a fracture to the "hook" of the hamate bone in his right wrist. A complete recovery is expected in 4-6 weeks. Nommensen was hitting .521 with 13 doubles and 11 home runs prior to the injury. As of April 13, he was leading the nation in on-base (.649) and slugging percentages (1.021) while ranking second in batting average.

ALL-TIME OVC COACHING VICTORIES

Three current OVC coaches rank among the Top 10 in total number of wins in OVC history (total wins at OVC schools only were counted). The all-time OVC leader is Murray State's Johnny Reagan (776). The three current coaches who rank in the Top 10 include Austin Peay's Gary McClure (2nd), Southeast Missouri's Mark Hogan (5th) and Eastern Illinois' Jim Schmitz (8th). McClure, in his 22nd season at APSU, has a chance to become the OVC's all-time leader, as he is just 129 wins behind Reagan.

Right Side of Plate: In a doubleheader split against UT Martin on April 18, Morehead State junior shortstop **Drew Lee** hit three home runs in the first game and two home runs in the second game of the twin-bill. The interesting fact is that all three home runs in the first game came from the left-side of the plate while the two home runs in the nightcap were from the right-side of the plate.

Nommensen Named a Mid-Season All-American by Baseball America: Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** has been one of 10 position players in the nation named to Baseball America's Midseason All-America Team. At the time of the honor, Nommensen entered the week leading the country in on-base and slugging percentages, while also ranking second in batting average. Baseball America's lead college writer Aaron Fitt selected a nine-player lineup based on positions along with a utility player (pitcher and hitter). The pitching staff featured six hurlers. Fresno State's Tom Mendonca (third base), San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg (starting pitcher) and Nommensen were the only three players among the 15 recognized that play for universities not affiliated with the big six BCS conferences.

Eastern Illinois Spends Two Weeks in Collegiate Baseball News National Polls: Eastern Illinois became the first OVC school in a long time (believed to be since the 1996 season) to break into the national polls when they entered the Collegiate Baseball News poll at No. 27 on April 6. It marked the first time the Panthers have been ranked at the Division I level. The Panthers were No. 29 a week later but dropped out of the national polls on April 20 after losing two of three games to Jacksonville State. Eastern Illinois is still among the teams receiving votes in several of the polls. EIU has a win over then No. 15 ranked Oklahoma (the Sooners are No. 10 in this week's NCBWA poll) and key road win over in-state rival Illinois. The Panthers still rank among the Top 40 (No. 39) in the latest RPI rankings.

OVC Hitters Among the Best Nationally: In the latest NCAA statistical rankings (April 28), the OVC has three players who are among the Top 10 nationally in batting average. Morehead State's **Drew Lee** is second nationally (.463), Eastern Kentucky's **Matt Davis** is sixth (.452) while teammate **Jayson Langfels** is eighth (.450). EIU's **Brett Nommensen**, who is currently injured, has a batting average of .521 and would be the nation's leader but does not currently have enough at-bats.

OVC Players/Teams Among National Leaders: Through last week's NCAA rankings, EIU's **Matt Davis** is first nationally in runs per game (1.63). Teammate **Jayson Langfels** is fifth nationally in RBI/game (1.59). Murray State's **Daniel Calhoun** is third in victories (9). Morehead State's **Drew Lee** is second in batting (.463), second in total bases (144), third in slugging (.900) and ninth in hits (74). As for the teams, Eastern Illinois is second in batting average (.368) and slugging (.606) and eighth in scoring (9.7). Eastern Kentucky is 11th (.349) in batting, 12th in scoring (9.4 runs/game) and second in triples (0.63). Morehead State currently leads Division I in double plays per game (1.38).

OVC Players in the Pros: Entering the 2009 season, there were five players from OVC schools on Major League Baseball Opening Day rosters. Austin Peay has the distinction of having three former players on teams including 2008 All-Star reliever **George Sherrill** (Baltimore), reliever **Jamie Walker** (Baltimore) and rookie pitcher **Shawn Kelley** (Seattle). Former Morehead State pitcher **Jon Rauch** is a setup man in Arizona while former Eastern Kentucky outfielder **Josh Anderson** is a backup in Detroit. Two other former OVC players are on 40-man rosters but will not begin the season with the major league club. Those two players are Austin Peay catcher A.J. Ellis (L.A. Dodgers) and pitcher **Ehren Wassermann** (who played for Samford when they were in the OVC). One OVC school - Eastern Illinois - has two alumni who are coaching at the highest level of professional baseball. Former Panther **Kevin Seitzer** is the Kansas City Royals hitting coach with **Tim Bogar** is the Boston Red Sox first base coach.

Austin Peay's Tenholder on NCBWA's Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List: Austin Peay relief pitcher **Daniel Tenholder** has been named to the updated midseason National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Tenholder, who was also on the preseason list released in February, has five saves in 20 total appearances in 2009. He has 29 strikeouts in 31.1 innings of work. Last season Tenholder posted a 4-1 record and an OVC-best 11 saves. He ranked 18th nationally in saves and compiled a 2.72 ERA in 36.1 innings over 30 appearances, striking out 41 batters. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts will be selected as finalists and released Wednesday, May 27, prior to start of NCAA regional tournament competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee will then select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced in early June.

The awards are presented by the CBF and Diamond Sports and are nominated by college coaches, staff and baseball media relations contacts. He hit a two-run home run in game one against Murray State and knocked in the first run in the second game of that doubleheader (a 2-1 EIU victory). The NCBWA Board reviews candidates from every NCAA Division I conference each week and names winners on Tuesdays throughout the season. Founded in 1962, the NCBWA is dedicated to the advancement of college baseball. Membership is open to writers, broadcasters and publicists of the sport.

Murray State's Hill Named Louisville Slugger & Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week: Murray State junior outfielder **Daniel Hill** was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and the Pro-Line Athletic National Player of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on March 9. Hill (Germantown, Tenn.) helped the 'Breds to a 5-1 week by going 15-for-26 (.577) with two doubles, five home runs, 18 RBIs and nine runs scored. He had a slugging percentage of 1.231 and an on-base percentage of .633. He started the week by going 3-for-4 with a pair of RBIs in a mid-week victory over Freed-Hardeman and followed it up the next day by going 3-for-5 with a home run and three RBIs against Arkansas State. Hill stepped up his game in the four-game series against North Dakota State as he led school-record 28-hit attack in the series opener by going 5-for-7 with a double, three home runs and eight RBIs in the 20-9 victory. He tied the MSU single-game record for hits and home runs in a game. In the first game of a doubleheader on Saturday, Hill did not get much to hit at the plate as he walked twice and was hit by a pitch in four plate appearances. The Bison did not fare so well in the second game as Hill was 2-for-4 with a double and two RBIs. The series finale turned into a classic slugfest as the 'Breds rallied twice and survived a ninth-inning rally. Hill hit his fifth home run of the week and drove in three runs in the 13-11 victory.

EIU's Morrell One of 30 Student-Athletes Up for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: For his all-around excellence as a student-athlete, **Brian Morrell** of Eastern Illinois baseball has been named one of 30 candidates nationally for the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Morrell is a senior pitcher for the Panthers and has served as the bullpen's long-relief ace each of his upperclassman seasons. The Quincy native carries a 4.0 GPA while majoring in biological sciences. He was an ESPN the Magazine Second Team All-America honoree as a junior. The list of 30 candidates in baseball will be trimmed to a group of 10 finalists in April. Those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote beginning April 15 and concluding May 31. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award. The award, given annually to senior student-athletes across nine NCAA Division I sports, has become one of the most prestigious honors in college athletics. The candidates were selected based on their dedication and achievement in four areas: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition. The Lowe's Senior CLASS Award is distinctive from many other honors in that on-the-field performance is only one factor in determining candidacy – a major emphasis is placed on off-the-field commitments and personal character. An acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college basketball players leaving college early to turn professional.

JSU's Tootle Named to Golden Spikes Watch List: Jacksonville State's **Ben Tootle** has been named to the 2009 Preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List by USA Baseball, marking the organization's first step toward identifying the top player in college baseball. The watch list features 50 of the nation's top collegiate talents and will be presented in 2009 for the 32nd time. The award is sponsored by Major League Baseball. Last season Tootle was named first-team All-OVC after leading the conference with an impressive 10-2 record with two shutouts in 2008. He finished the season with 79 strikeouts, which was the second most in the OVC, and had a 3.87 earned run average. He was named OVC Pitcher of the Week three times during the season after going a perfect 8-0 against conference members. Baseball America named Tootle as the fourth-best prospect from this summer's Cape Cod League, while ESPN's Keith Law has named the Gamecock pitching ace as the 13th best prospect in the country for the 2009 season.

JSU's Tootle Named to Numerous Preseason All-American Teams: Jacksonville State junior pitcher **Ben Tootle** was named to four pre-season All-American lists this year. Tootle was a first-team NCBWA selection, second-team Louisville Slugger pick and a third-team choice by Ping! and Baseball America. Eastern Illinois' **Brett Nommensen** was a third-team pick by Ping! while Southeast Missouri catcher **Jim Klocke** was a honorable mention pick by Ping!.

Five OVC Coaches Coaching at Their Alma Mater: This season five of the nine OVC head baseball coaches are currently coaching at their alma maters, including first-year head coach **Jason Stein** at Eastern Kentucky. Stein played at EKV from 1992-95 and graduated in 1997. He played against Morehead State head coach **Jay Sorg** who was at MSU from 1992-94. Ironically in the 1994 season, Sorg was named OVC Player of the Week on April 11 while Stein earned the same honor on May 2. The other coaches currently at their alma mater are Austin Peay's **Gary McClure** (1987), Murray State **Rob McDonald** (1984) and Southeast Missouri's **Mark Hogan** (1977).

Jacksonville State Picked as Preseason Favorite For Second Straight Season: For the second year in a row, Jacksonville State has been picked as the preseason favorite for the nine-team league in a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head baseball coaches. The Gamecocks claimed the 2008 regular season championship with a 23-4 record last season but came up just short in the OVC Tournament. The overall voting in the preseason poll was close as Jacksonville State, who received five first-place votes, edged Eastern Illinois, who had the other four first-place votes, by just one total point. Eastern Illinois swept through four games at the OVC Tournament last season on its way to team's first title since 1999 and a berth in the NCAA Regionals. Those two teams were followed by Austin Peay (48 points), Southeast Missouri State (42), Tennessee Tech (38), Murray State (23), Morehead State (22), Eastern Kentucky (20) and UT Martin (10).

Nommensen and Tootle Named Preseason OVC Player/Pitcher of the Year: Jacksonville State junior right-hander **Ben Tootle** was tabbed the OVC Preseason Pitcher of the Year while Eastern Illinois senior outfielder **Brett Nommensen** was picked the OVC Preseason Player of the Year in a preseason vote of league head coaches. Nommensen produced gaudy numbers last year in earning All-OVC first-team honors as well as being selected to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. He hit .402 with 82 hits, 56 runs, 18 doubles, five home runs and 36 RBI. His slugging percentage was .603 while his on-base percentage was a league-best .518. Nommensen also stole 18 bases. Tootle, who was named a preseason All-American by numerous outlets has been great in his first two seasons at JSU. In two years with Jax State, Tootle has compiled a 16-5 overall record, including an unblemished 8-0 mark against Conference opponents a season ago. Last season he struck out 79 batters and walked only 29 in 86 innings of work.

SIU Edwardsville Joins the OVC: On July 1 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville became the 11th member of the Ohio Valley Conference. SIU Edwardsville, who is in the reclassification process to Division I, will begin regular season competition in the OVC during the 2011-12 academic year and will be eligible for postseason competition in 2012-13. The exception is the SIUE softball program, which will be eligible for both regular season and tournament competition in 2010-11; the softball program was the department's women's sport designee to be fast-tracked to Division I, making it eligible to compete at Division I prior to other SIUE sports. SIUE is located in Edwardsville, Ill., which is just northeast of St. Louis (the 18th largest media market in the United States).
